#### **CIGAR TOPS 1995 INTERNATIONAL** CLASSIFICATIONS The 1995 International Classifications, which included North American horses for the first time, have rated Cigar (Palace Music) tops on two continents, weighted at 132 pounds in the Mile (7.5-9f) and Intermediate (9.5-11f) categories. The five-year-old of 1995 was weighted two pounds higher than the foremost European runner, three-year-old Lammtarra (\*Nijinsky II), who earned 130 pounds in the Long Distance (11.5-13f) division. The weights, based on a horse's best race of the year in each division, were determined by the International Classification Committee Handicappers and a panel of North American racing officials. Two older horses were rated at 129 pounds: Inside Information (Private Account), Mile; and Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Long Distance. Freedom Cry (GB) (Soviet Star), Long Distance; Halling (Diesis (GB)), Intermediate; and Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold), Intermediate; all rated 128 pounds in the Classifications for four-year-olds and up. Despite just one victory in 1995, Holy Bull (Great Above) tied with July Cup winner Lake Coniston (Ire) (Bluebird) as older top weights in the Sprint (5-7f) division at 127 pounds each. Strategic Choice (Alleged) topped the Endurance (13f and up) category for older horses at 120 pounds. Bahri (Riverman), 129, was the highweight three-year-old at the Mile, while Americans Serena's Song (Rahy), Mile; and Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Intermediate; tied with European three-yearolds Ridgewood Pearl (Ire) (Indian Ridge), Mile; and Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest), Long Distance at 126 pounds; Serena's Song was the top three-year-old

JAMES E. BASSETT III HONORED WITH '95 ECLIPSE AWARD OF MERIT James E. "Ted" Bassett III, chairman of the Keeneland Association and president of Breeders' Cup Limited, was named the 1995 recipient of the Eclipse Award of Merit. Bassett, a 74-year-old Kentucky native, has served in a variety of official leadership positions for various racing groups during his 28 years in the industry and has come to be recognized internationally as the unofficial ambassador of American racing. Bassett joined Keeneland in 1968 as assistant to President Louis Lee Haggin II; he was promoted to general manager in 1969 and appointed to president upon Haggin's death in 1970. Since 1986, Bassett has served Keeneland as chairman of the board; he was elected a Keeneland trustee in 1993. In 1988, Breeders' Cup Ltd. named Bassett its president. Two years later he became president of Equibase. A member of the Jockey Club since 1985, Bassett has also been honored by the New York Racing Association's Turf and Field Club, Thoroughbred Club of America, Knights of Columbus, National Turf Writers Association and the HBPA; he received the 1987 William C. Colman Humanitarian Award and Keene Daingerfield Award. The 1995 Eclipse Awards presentation will be held Friday, February 9 in San Diego.

#### GULFSTREAM MAY BID FOR EXTENDED

MEET IN '97 Gulfstream President Doug Donn has applied for the same 64 dates for his 1997 meet as he is running this year. Donn has asked the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering for the January 3-March 16 dates next year, but he held a press conference Thursday, the date the application was due, to explain why his '97 dates proposal might be amended. "We need at least two-to-three weeks more to generate a profit," he said. "And unless there is the repeal of the tax penalty and the repeal of the (dates) act we're currently running under, we will have to extend our meet." Under current Florida law, the track which runs during the choice winter dates, set by the dates act, pays three percent in taxes, as opposed to 1.15 percent for the spring dates and 2.4 percent for the summer/fall dates. A two-tothree week extension at the end of Gulfstream's meet would put the track in head-to-head competition with Hialeah. Donn hinted that the tax reductions couldn't be accomplished without Hialeah's assistance but added, "I'm not optimistic we'll be able to get together on this." In response, Hialeah owner John Brunetti said, "I offered to consolidate the three tracks, with each track having a minor interest. Then we could make decisions on the future of racing in Florida. But both (Calder President) Ken Dunn and Doug rejected the idea." Brunetti said he might seek the intervention of the Division to prevent a Gulfstream extension. "We could ask for a 90day emergency exemption against Gulfstream running on our dates, I don't know," he said.

COURT ORDERS PROMPT HEARING ON GULFSTREAM SIMULCASTING The First District Court of Appeal in Tallahassee, Florida issued a Writ of Mandamus yesterday to the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. The writ directed the Division to "promptly provide" Gulfstream Park an evidentiary hearing on its request for full-card simulcasting. Last week, the Division refused a previous order from the same court for a hearing, saying the Third District Court of Appeal made an error in its ruling on Calder's simulcasting request. The Division said it would wait until January 17 to hold a hearing on Gulfstream's request. This ruling vesterday by the court is in response to the Division's delay. Presently the Division is under three separate court orders to promptly provide administrative hearings on full-card simulcasting to Gulfstream, Calder and Tampa Bay.

**QUALITY ENTRIES FOR 1997 EPSOM DERBY A** 

total of 554 yearlings were nominated to the 1997 Epsom Derby in England and the value of the mile-and-ahalf Classic is expected to top the £1-million mark for the first time. Included in the list of entries were half-brothers to previous Epsom Derby winners Quest For Fame (1990), Dr. Devious (1992) and Lammtarra (1995), while Stavros Niarchos has entered a full-brother to his dual Breeders' Cup Mile heroine Miesque, Quest For Fame's half-brother, owned by Prince Khaled Abdullah, is by Sadler's Wells, who is also the sire of Robert Sangster's half-brother to Dr. Devious, while Sheikh Maktoum al Maktoum's half-brother to the 1995 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond Stakes winner Lammtarra is a son of his former Champion European Miler Zilzal, now based at Kirsten Rausing's Lanwades Stud near Newmarket. The 554-strong entry is, however, well down on the number, 620, who were entered for the 1996 running of the race, but there is another entry stage in April 1997, at a cost of £8,000. Inevitably the Maktoum family is strongly represented, with Sheikh Mohammed holding no less than 80 entries, Sheikh Hamdan 37 and Sheikh Maktoum 33. The Aga Khan, who has resolved his disagreement with the English Jockey Club and will have horses trained in Britain again

CIGAR BREEZES Trainer Bill Mott confirmed yester-day that Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cigar (Palace Music) had his first breeze of the year Tuesday at Payson Park. Clockers at Payson did not consider the move a work and Cigar did not show up on the work tab. "He went slow," Mott admitted. "I didn't have my stopwatch with me. He went a half-mile." Exercise rider David Wallace was aboard for the breeze. Mott maintains that Cigar will arrive at Gulfstream sometime after Jan. 10 to continue preparation for the \$300,000 Gl Donn H., to be run Feb. 10.

#### BRITISH RACETRACKS TO SUBSIDIZE PURSES

According to a report in Wednesday's Racing Post, British racecourses are expected to make up all but about \$155,000 of the purse money lost when the Levy Board announced it would cut its contribution to British purses by more than \$5.2 million. RCA Managing Director Stanley Jackson told the Racing Post, "The message we have given to the British Horseracing Board is that, all things being equal, we could produce up to (\$1.5) million) in extra executive contributions in 1996. Had the Levy Board been able to maintain its planned contribution, a further (\$4.6 million) would have been available (for purses) this year, but the anticipated increase from the racecourses will help to balance the lesser input from the Levy Board." Two factors which could effect racecourse purse supplements are if race sponsorship for the Epsom Derby and Grand National were to drop, or if the adverse weather this past December has a major impact on racecourse finances. It is estimated that, should the racecourses contribute the full amount expected, British purses would decrease just 1.17 percent for 1996, from \$9.20 million in 1995 to \$9.18 million in 1996, while minimum purses will decrease an average of 5.2 percent.

PINCAY BACK IN THE SADDLE Hall of Fame jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. was back at work Thursday morning exercising several horses at Santa Anita, and said he will resume riding in races Wednesday. Pincay suffered three fractured ribs at Hollywood Park Dec. 17 when Kris's Intention (Kris S.) clipped heels on the clubhouse turn, lost her balance and threw him to the ground, "It was great to see Laffit back out here," said trainer Bill Spawr yesterday. "I wanted to put him on a nice easy horse to gallop, and I thought Corky's Pal (\*Habitony) would be perfect." Corky's Pal, a four-yearold colt, is undefeated in two starts and usually one of the best-mannered horses in Spawr's barn. "But not today," Spawr said. "He kicked and squealed; he was a real handful. But Laffit got off the horse and said he felt fine. I guess he passed his first test."
