CIGAR BREEZES; EYES DUBAI Horse of the Year Cigar (Palace Music) had his first breeze since suffering a stone bruise February 20, going an easy half-mile in :51 1/5 at Gulfstream yesterday under regular exercise rider Judy Nicks. "It was about what I expected to see," said trainer Bill Mott. "He went off easy and went evenly. I was just trying to do a little bit more with him and see how the foot was. He passed the first test alright. I just felt his legs and feet, and everything was cool. We'll go right back and gallop him (today) and probably breeze Monday. Then he'll breeze again Saturday morning before he leaves for Dubai."

NORTHERN SPUR BACK ON COURSE Champion turf horse Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who was scratched from today's GII Crown Royal Pan American H., returned to the racetrack for a jog Friday and seems to be recovered from a slight temperature and a bout with colic. Trainer Ron McAnally attributed the Eclipse Award winner's troubles to a 10-hour flight from Los Angeles, which included a four-hour stopover in a hot hangar in Tennessee. "It looks like we are out of the woods now," said McAnally. "He is eating good and back to his old self--biting at us and eating sugar." Northern Spur will return to California--on a non-stop flight--in four days; he will be pointed for the San Luis Rey S. March 24.

CAESARS SWEEP WORTH \$1 MILLION The Caesars East-West Challenge, which links the \$500,000 International at Atlantic City to the \$700,000 Caesars Palace Turf Championship at Hollywood, will offer a bonus of \$280,000 to the horse which can sweep both races, so that the winner of both events would bankroll a total of \$1 million. Last year, Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun (Ire)) met the Challenge and earned a total of \$750,000. "Once again, Caesars is pleased to be associated with the sport of horse racing in general, and two of the country's finest racing facilities in particular," said Rich Rose, president of Caesars World Sports. "We had two tremendous races last year...and are looking forward to continuing the momentum of the series long into the future." The mile-and-three-sixteenths GI Caesars International moves to Saturday night, June 22, this year and will be featured live on ESPN, with post time set for 6:40 p.m. EDT. TOP STALLIONS TO AUSTRALIA Following a number of approaches from abroad. The National Stud and Mr. Henri Chalhoub, the joint owners of the 1991 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and French Derby winner Suave Dancer (Green Dancer), have agreed, subject to contract, to stand the stallion at the Muranna Stud in Victoria, Australia, for the 1996 Southern Hemisphere season. Suave Dancer, who was fully booked in his first four seasons at stud, will be represented by his first crop of runners this year. He is expected to travel to Australia in August and return to The National Stud in December. Suave Dancer is the first Arc winner and the highest-rated European-trained runner to go to stud in Australia. Muranna Stud Pty Ltd., Roulston MacDonald Bloodstock Pty Ltd. and the Independent Stallion Station at Toolern Vale, Victoria, have agreed to lease Suave Dancer for one season, but with an option to renew for 1997. The fee is private. Suave Dancer will join Ashford Stud's Thunder Gulch (Gulch) and Eagle Eyed (Danzig) as new stallions in Australia for 1996. The Ashford duo, standing their first seasons this year, will travel from the Versailles, Kentucky farm to the operation's Australia division, Coolmore Australia in New South Wales. The two will return to Kentucky at the end of the Southern Hemisphere season.

FLORIDA DERBY HOPEFULS ON WORK TAB

Jockey Chris McCarron flew in from California to guide Cobra King (Farma Way) through a six-furlong workout in 1:13 1/5 at Gulfstream yesterday. "He worked just the way I wanted. He put in a good, strong finish," said trainer Mike Puype. "That will be it for him until the Florida Derby. He'll gallop into the race." As for how the colt, probable favorite for the March 16 Florida Derby, is coming into the race, Puype said, "He is relaxing better and he has put on weight since his last race. He was never doing bad, but he is doing better now than before the Holy Bull." Also working for the Florida Derby yesterday, Skip Away (Skip Trial) went six furlongs in 1:12 3/5 from the gate with jockey Shane Sellers in the saddle. "I wanted to give him a wake-up call," said trainer Sonny Hine. "It has been four weeks since he ran. He has had a little trouble breaking. He got knocked down leaving there last time. I wanted to see if that bothered him and if he was going to shy from horses. It didn't seem to have affected him."

TURFWAY RAISES PURSES AGAIN Turfway Park officials announced Friday that they are increasing purses by 10 percent, effective immediately, and are substantially raising the value of several Winter/Spring stakes races. The increases, the third of the current race meet, resulted from strong business levels and from two unexpected cancellations because of snow and cold weather Thursday and Friday. Turfway's minimum purse will be \$7,700 for \$4,000 claimers going six furlongs. while the top allowance purse will be \$56.800 in money-conditions allowance races at a mile or longer. Saturday's Valdale S. and Sunday's Marigold S. have been increased to \$75,000 from \$60,000. Also increased to \$75,000 are the March 17 Wintergreen S. and March 23 Pioneer S. The March 16 John Battaglia Memorial S. will be run for a \$125,000 purse, up from \$100,000. Purses will also be increased for five stakes on Turfway's March 30 Jim Beam Day program. The Bourbonette S. will rise to \$125,000 from \$100,000 the Queen Breeders' Cup will be increased to \$110,000 from \$100,000, the Rushaway S. and Fairway Fun S. will be increased to \$100,000 from \$75,000, and the Hansel S. will carry a \$75,000 purse, up from \$60,000.
