JOCKEY CLUB GOLD CUP CANDIDATES

WORK Jockey Jerry Bailey spun superstar Cigar (Palace Music) through six furlongs in 1:14.38 over the Belmont Park training track Thursday morning, and the pair galloped out seven furlongs in 1:28.67 in what will be the six-year-old's next-to-last breeze for the October 5 Gl Jockey Club Gold Cup. Winner of the Gl Woodward for the second straight year last time out, Cigar seeks his second straight Gold Cup victory as well. Down at Keeneland yesterday, three-year-old Skip Away (Skip Trial) went the same distance in 1:13 1/5 with jockey Shane Sellers in the saddle. "He went awesome--just like the champion he is," said Sellers. "He loves to train."

HIALEAH REACHES AGREEMENT WITH

HORSEMEN After years of trying, the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and Hialeah Race Course have reached a contract agreement that will cover two and possibly three years. Starting with Hialeah's 1997 racing season March 17, the track has agreed to pay a minimum of \$105,000 a day in overnight purses and \$107,000 in 1998. A third year is optional for both parties at \$109,000 in 1999. The contract came in the shadow of four Federal lawsuits and one state suit by the horsemen against Hialeah. One of the Federal suits was due to go to court next week. As part of the agreement, however, the horsemen dropped all of their lawsuits. In addition, Hialeah owner John Brunetti agreed he had underpaid the horsemen by \$300,000 over the last couple of years, and that money will be distributed over the next two years as part of the total overnight purses. Scott Savin, president of the FHBPA, and Stanley Ersoff, president of the Florida Breeders' and Owners' Association, held a press conference along with Hialeah Vice President John Van Lindt and Director of Racing Steve Brunetti to announce the new contract. All agreed that hopefully, with the contract struggle behind them, they can work together toward advancing racing in Florida in the coming years.

ILLINOIS RACING BOARD APPROVES

INNOVATIVE 1997 CALENDAR The Illinois Racing Board yesterday approved the state's Thoroughbred racing schedule for 1997, adding some intriguing innovations to the calendar. As is its custom, Sportsman's Park is scheduled to host 74 live racing cards from Feb. 14 through May 10, racing six days per week. Arlington International Racecourse then takes over on the Chicago circuit, running May 11 through October 10, dates that mirror this year's. However, while Arlington raced six days weekly in 1996, the track had asked for a five-day week in its 1997 application. In response, the Board made an unprecedented move and divided Arlington's meeting into three segments, permitting five-day weeks from May 11-July 5 and September 2-October 10, but stipulating that the track must race six days weekly from July 6-September 1. Arlington owner Dick Duchossois and his CEO Scott Mordell were disappointed with the schedule. "We have to go back to the drawing board," said Mordell, who had requested the five-day week in an attempt to raise the daily purses. "It doesn't matter how I feel, though. This decision was made by the Board and the members thought it was in the best interest of racing. We'll try to make it work." Hawthorne Race Course will run Mondays and Tuesdays only (Arlington's dark days) from Sept. 8 through Oct. 7, then switch to a six days per week schedule from Oct. 11 to Dec. 31. Also, Fairmount Park in Collinsville, Illinois has been awarded 127 racing dates from March 29 through Oct. 5.

GOLDEN GEAR RETIRED Record-setting sprinter Golden Gear (Gulch), a stakes-winner at three, four and five, has been retired and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Mill Ridge Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Winner of the GIII Equipoise Mile H. at Arlington in his final outing July 21, the five-year-old stallion won 12 of 26 career starts for earnings of \$634,009 and set a track record at Remington Park, going seven furlongs in 1:20 2/5 in the 1995 Centennial H. Owned by Barry Golden, Golden Gear will stand for a fee of \$5,000, live foal.

ONTARIO TAX REDUCTION BECOMES A

REALITY The long-awaited Ontario government tax reduction on pari-mutuel wagering is about to become a reality, making The Ontario Jockey Club's Thoroughbred and Standardbred customers all winners. The government has said the reduction of the racetrack tax to 0.5 percent will take effect Monday, Sept. 30. This allows the OJC to reduce the win-place-show takeout levels on Thoroughbred racing from 18.3% to 15.2% on-track, the lowest in North America. For triactor wagering, the takeout drops from 29.8% to 28.7% and for other pools, the takeout will be decreased from 27.8% to 26.7%. In addition, the Industry Revitalization Program is being phased out over four years, meaning a further one percent benefit to the customer over that time. The first of the four 0.25% installments will take effect Sept. 30, 1997.

SOUTHERN SPRING TO U.S. Southern Spring (Arg) (Southern Halo), last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly in Argentina and a winner of five of her six starts, has been purchased by Gary Tanaka and will ship to the U.S. after one more start in her native country. In a deal put together by Andy Smith's Havana Horse Ltd., London, the three-year-old filly, who captured the first leg of Argentina's filly Triple Crown in her most recent effort August 31, was sold by her previous owner, Jorge Acevedo, for approximately \$750,000. In addition to her victory in the G1 Gran Premio de Potrancas, Southern Spring also boasts wins in the G1 Gran Premio Jorge de Atucha and in the Argentine equivalent of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, the G1 Copa Pedro Blaquier. The filly, carrying Tanaka's colors, will likely start next in the second leg of the distaff Triple, the Premio Seleccion at a mile and a quarter on the dirt October 12 at Palermo racetrack in Buenos Aires, before traveling to the U.S. She will be trained by Ben Cecil in the States.

FASIG-TIPTON FALL SALE GROWS Fasig-Tipton has expanded its Fall Yearling Sale and will catalogue 475 yearlings for its two-day auction, to be held Monday and Tuesday, October 14-15, at Newton Paddocks in Lexington. Last year's sale saw 380 yearlings catalogued in a one-day format. The leading consignor is the Lexington-based Highclere Farm of Jeffry Morris, which will offer 27 yearlings. There are 232 stallions represented in the 1996 catalogue, including successful freshman sires Deposit Ticket, Salt Lake and St. Jovite. The catalogue will be available from all Fasig-Tipton offices Tuesday, October 1. Sessions for the two-day sale begin at 11:00 a.m.

THREE NEW STALLIONS TO SHADWELL

Nashwan Stud, the stallion division of Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, will be standing three new stallions in 1997--Kayrawan (Mr. Prospector), Dumaani (Danzig) and Muhtafal (Mr. Prospector)--according to an announcement made yesterday by the farm's Vice President and General Manager Rick Nichols. Since breaking his maiden in his first start as a two-year-old in England, Kayrawan has won or placed in seven of 14 starts. This year, the four-yearold won two races in Dubai before being sent to North America, where he won the GII Tom Fool H. at Belmont July 7 and was second in the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. at Pimlico May 18. Kayrawan is out of Group 3 winner Muhbubh (Blushing Groom {Fr}). Dumaani, out of Group 1 winner Desirable (Ire) (Lord Gayle), is a halfbrother to champion and British 1000 Guineas winner Shadayid (Shadeed). The five-year-old won the G2 Keio Hai Spring Cup in Japan and the GIII Keeneland Breeders' Cup S. in 1995. "Kayrawan and Dumaani are extremely genuine horses," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "They raced around the world under a variety of conditions, showing tremendous class and talent." Muhtafal, out of MSW Polite Lady, is a full-brother to Canadian Horse of the Year and leading sire Afleet. The four-yearold broke his maiden by 4½-lengths against allowance company at Fair Grounds first time out. In his second career start, he blazed six furlongs in the fastest time ever run by a three-year-old at Keeneland, going in 1:08 1/5. Contesting the GIII Derby Trial in only his third start, Muhtafal, sent off the 6-5 favorite, led for six furlongs before sustaining a condylar fracture of the cannon bone. "This horse (Muhtafal) had incredible ability," said trainer Neil Drysdale. "He has genuine speed and athleticism that you don't see every day. It's unfortunate that injuries kept him from proving himself." All three of the horses are expected to make their final starts at Keeneland in October. Although the stud fees have not been announced, Nichols said he expects the stallions to stand in the range of \$2,500 to \$7,500.
