LATE BLOOMERS IN LEXINGTON

Three years ago, Charismatic used a victory in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. as a springboard to success in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. and was subsequently named Horse of the Year. This year's renewal seems unlikely to produce a Derby entrant, but the Preakness is another story. Trainer Steve Asmussen will send Easyfromthegitgo (Dehere) postward and indicated that the bay colt could target the second jewel of the Triple Crown. "This is a lovely three-yearold," Asmussen told Daily Racing Form. "He does everything we ask him, lays everything on the line. But even if he runs big Saturday, I don't think we want to try the Derby. We're looking forward to having a nice, long year with him." Winner of the Lecomte S. at Fair Grounds, Easyfromthegitgo lost by just a nose to Repent in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 10. Trying his hand at two turns for the first time is Ethan Man (Glitterman), who defeated Easyfromthegitgo in his

career debut at Churchill Oct. 28. The speedy bay colt captured the seven-furlong GIII Swale S. Mar. 16. A half brother to Albert the Great, Crimson Hero (Capote) finished fourth in the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity over course and dis-

tance Oct. 6, a race in which Siphonic and Harlan's Holiday ran 1-2. The bay colt comes from the connections--owner Tracy Farmer and trainer Nick Zito-who campaigned his multi-millionaire sibling and was a good second in his seasonal debut, a seven-furlong allowance at Gulfstream Mar. 16. The consistent Tails of the Crypt (Regal Classic) ships in to Kentucky off a pair of solid efforts at Tampa, including a second in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 17. The 8-5 morning-line favorite, Officer (Bertrando) was scratched with a tendon injury (story, p2). Click here for brisnet.com PPs.

2003 CUP TO OAK TREE

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has announced that the 2003 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships will be hosted by the Oak Tree Racing Association at Santa Anita Park Oct. 25, 2003. The Arcadia, California oval had previously hosted the 1986 and 1993 editions of the Breeders' Cup. "We are delighted to reunite with the Oak Tree Racing Association in returning to Santa Anita for our 20th Breeders' Cup," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., Breeders' Cup president. "Santa Anita is an outstanding facility with a great tradition of showcasing top flight international racing for both its horsemen and its fans. As with the previous two runnings of the Breeders' Cup during the Oak Tree Meets at Santa Anita, we look forward to another excellent presentation of the World Thoroughbred Championships." Santa Anita had originally been scheduled as the 2002 site, but renovations at the track forced the Breeders' Cup to shift to Arlington Park this year. "In the past three years, we have had two false starts; therefore, it is with particular pleasure to learn that Oak Tree has been selected to host the 2003 Breeders' Cup," said Sherwood Chillingworth, Oak Tree Racing Association executive vice president and director.

Perfect Drift Derby Preparations Continue:

GII Lane's End Spiral S. winner **Perfect Drift** (Dynaformer) continues to train up to the first Saturday in May in good form. The bay gelding went three-quarters in 1:13.60, handily, over the Churchill Downs training track yesterday morning. "It was impressive," said jockey Joe Deegan, who was aboard for the drill. "The horse worked as good as you could expect him to work. He settled nice behind the other horse [stablemate Slough Creek] and then when I let him run, he blew by him and finished real strong."

Throat Surgery for Saarland:

Fourth in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 13, Saarland (Unbridled) displaced his soft palate during the race and underwent minor throat surgery Wednesday morning to correct the problem. Dr. Mark Cheney performed the 10-minute procedure, which took place in the colt's stall at Belmont Park. "The procedure doesn't always work, but I've had good success with it, especially with Coronado's Quest," trainer Shug McGaughey told *The Blood Horse*. If all goes according to plan, Saarland would be McGaughey's first Derby starter since the Kentucky native ran second with Easy Goer in 1989.

Officer Out with Injury:

The Thoroughbred Corporation's **Officer** (Bertrando) has been scratched out of today's GII Coolmore Lexington S. with injury to his left front leg. Trainer Bob Baffert said that a slight filling had been discovered after the colt galloped on Thursday; he termed the injury "minor" and said that it was not career threatening. "We'll give him 90 days off," he said. "We don't want to take any chances." Winner of the GI Champagne S. last season, Officer returned this year to take the Zany Tactics S. for Cal-breds Apr. 7.

Take Charge Lady Breezes:

Undefeated in three starts this year, **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) tuned up for the GI Kentucky Oaks by breezing five-eighths in 1:00.40 Friday morning at Churchill Downs. "It was a piece of cake," said trainer Ken McPeek. "Nice maintenance work. She's as good as she's ever been, so we're on dead aim for everything." The three-year-old filly seems likely to be favored in the Oaks, which could attract as many as 12 runners. "I think Bella Bellucci and my filly are the two horses that probably stand out in my mind," he added.

Part of a Gary Tanaka-owned entry, **Golden Apples** looms a strong favorite in this event providing she starts. The four-year-old has been fighting a bruise in her right foot even before she charged from off the pace to defeat a quality field in the GII Santa Ana H. in her seasonal bow Mar. 23. "It was a lot worse then," trainer Ben Cecil told *Daily Racing Form*. "I think our chances are good to have her right [for today]." The bay has done little wrong in five starts since coming to the U.S. last year, including a first-out win in the GI Del Mar Oaks. Among the vanquished four Saturdays ago was **Astra**, a three-length winner of this event a year ago before adding the GI Beverly Hills H. Sidelined off a last-of-nine finish in the GI Beverly D. last August, the bay was third, beaten 3 1/4 lengths in the Santa Ana.

Queen's Logic was an outstanding two-year-old, remaining unbeaten in four starts which included the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June, G2 Lowther S. at York in August and G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October. Her rating of 122 pounds, just four pounds below Johannesburg, in the 2001 International Classifications reflected that and was the highest awarded to a juvenile filly since Ravinella in 1988. She looks to have a straightforward task here and should underline her claims for the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5. Purple Haze impressed when taking a Kempton maiden on her debut in September before finishing a creditable fifth behind Protectress (GB) in the Listed Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket the following month.

Trainer Bede Murray is upbeat about his chances with Universal Prince (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}) on Sunday. "We always said we would look for international races for this horse and hopefully we will be rewarded. His form is great and I have raced him lightly this time in with this race as his target. The mile trip was never going to suit him first up, but he ran well to be third to Tie The Knot [in the G1 Chipping Norton S.] in February. He pulled up really well after winning the G1 Ranvet over the QE II distance and I knew then that he was ready for this. Last time over the 2400 meters I think we were just beaten by a fitter horse in The G1 BMW and let's face it, the winner Ethereal is one of the best mares around at the moment, and to be run down by the Caulfield and Melbourne Cup winner is not bad form. It is clearly important for his stud value to run well on Sunday, but it will also be a big moment for Australia as well if he could win this race. Australia has had success with Falvelon here over the past two years and Sunline has been wonderful, but our horses over longer ground still have to do something. If he runs well and pulls up fine we will think seriously about Singapore. It's been a great season at home and this would make it a season to remember," the highly respected trainer said. "He is the same body weight now that he was when he won the AJC Derby and I can't wait to see how he does on Sunday."

KEENELAND CHANGES SEPTEMBER FORMAT

Keeneland's board of directors have approved format changes to the September Yearling Sale, including a one-day break on Friday of the first week to give buyers a greater opportunity to inspect horses who sell in Book 3. "Horses in Book 3 of the September Sale have averaged more than \$50,000 and deserve better attention," explained Geoffrey Russell, director of sales. "With a dark day on Friday, buyers will be able to inspect these yearlings at their respective barns and it will give consignors a better opportunity to market them." In addition to the extra day, Keeneland announced that consignments to the selected sessions of the sale will be divided equally between the two days, as is done at Keeneland's July Sale.

NEW JERSEY DATES DISPUTE RESOLVED GOV.

James McGreevey was at a press conference at Monmouth Park yesterday afternoon to unveil an agreement between the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which runs Monmouth and the Meadowlands, and the state's horsemen that ensures 141 days of Thoroughbred racing in New Jersey for each of the next three years. The 2002 Monmouth meet will start with three weekends of racing, May 11-12, May 18-19 and May 25-27, then begin its regular Wednesday through Sunday schedule May 29. The 78-day meeting will run through Sept. 1. The 63-day Meadowlands meet will run Sept. 2-Nov. 23, with live racing Tuesday through Saturday. The 2003 season will include an extended Monmouth meet, with the Oceanport track opening for a 92-day stand Apr. 26. The Meadowlands will hold a 49-day meet running Sept. 1-Nov. 8. The following year, Monmouth will hold its traditional Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day Sunday schedule and the Meadowlands meet will stretch from Labor Day Monday through Dec. 7. Now that the agreement has been reached, telephone account wagering and offtrack betting can go forward, but will not become available immediately. "Our goal [for account wagering] is to be up and running in time for the Breeders' Cup [Oct. 26]," Bruce Garland, senior vice president of racing for the NJSEA, said. As for the opening of off-track betting facilities, he added, "Realistically, we are looking at late 2003 at best." The agreement is not a complete winwin situation for the Thoroughbred horsemen. As one of his budget cuts, McGreevey did away with the purse supplement which boosted New Jersey purses to record levels last year. That fact, combined with the extended season, will mean a lot less money for purses in 2002. The NJSEA, admitting to an underpayment in 2001, will contribute an additional \$3.3 million to the purse account this year. Monmouth purses will get the bulk of that money and are expected to remain at \$300,000 per day, but the Meadowlands is likely to offer just \$150,000 in daily purses. Senate Democratic Leader Richard Codey warned lowering purses to sustain a longer meet at the Meadowlands could damage the quality of racing at the track, in turn leading to lower handle and less revenue for the industry and the state. "Unless the money is there to sustain the quality of the horses, this is a prescription for disaster for thoroughbred racing in New Jersey," Codey said. Codey turned down Zoffinger's invitation to join yesterday's press conference.

A maiden winner over the Woodbine turf last Aug. 25, Stylelistick was second in her first try against winners north of the border Oct. 4 before shipping south to annex this track's Green River S. Oct. 25. Ninth of 10 in the GIII Miesque S. at Hollywood Park to close the season last November, the dark bay returned to action with a handy 1 3/4-length victory over Lush Soldier on the Gulfstream lawn Mar. 20. Settled in behind horses for the run up the backstretch, jockey Pat Day asked his filly for run around the final bend, rallied wide into the stretch and charged down the center of the track to win by a widening margin. Lush Soldier finished well to gain the place from pacesetting August Storm. "She was a lot more settled that when I rode her in the fall," the winning rider commented. "She's a very fine filly. It was a fine performance."



CLASSIC PICTURE CLEARING

Newmarket offered serious clues for both its forthcoming Classics this week after a series of trials. On Tuesday it was the turn of the fillies as Misterah (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) took the G3 Nell Gwyn S. Quoted at 50-1 for the May 5 1000 Guineas beforehand, the filly met with mixed reaction from the bookmakers afterwards, but is generally 16-1 at present. Also quoted at 16-1 is Alasha (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), who caught the eye with her fast-finishing fourth placing in that trial. She heads back to Newmarket in two weeks' time but Henry Cecil, who has dominated that Classic in recent years, has yet to make a decision over the participation of fifth placed Half Glance (GB) (Danehill {USA}). Revealing (GB) (Halling {USA}) is unlikely to make the race. Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}), who runs in today's G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury, and Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells {USA}), still hold sway at the fore of the betting for the mile fillies' Classic.

For the Colts...

Although the Listed European Free H. success of Tumbleweed Charm (Ire) (Zafonic {USA}) met with a muted response from the bookmakers on Wednesday, Brian Meehan's colt is also due to line up in the G1 2000 Guineas back at the track May 4. Thursday's G3 Craven S. witnessed a stronger trial, with Sir Michael Stoute's King of Happiness (USA) (Spinning World {USA}) impressing under Kieren Fallon. Stoute was understated afterwards, however, remarking that he expected there would be "a few better ones at Ballydoyle" than the runner-up Della Francesca (USA) (Danzig {USA}) in the mile Classic. That is reflected in the betting, as Aidan O'Brien's Hawk Wing (USA) (Woodman {USA}) remains the 6-4 favourite. Godolphin will be represented by their private trial winner Naheef (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) in the mile Classic, while Mark Johnston's once-raced but well-backed Love Regardless (USA) (Storm Bird {USA}) also heads straight to the race having missed the traditional trials. Newbury today offers the final piece in the jigsaw for the 2000 Guineas, as the G3 Greenham S. is run over the straight seven furlongs. Epsom clues were also on the ground as Gerard Butler's Playapart (USA) (Theatrical {Ire}) impressed in winning the Listed Fielden S. on Thursday and is quoted at odds of 25-1 by Coral Eurobet for the June 8 Derby.

WATERHOUSE DISQUALIFIED

The NSW Thoroughbred Racing Board handed down a four-year-old disqualification and A\$78,000 fine to beleaguered bookmaker Robbie Waterhouse yesterday, according to racenet.com.au. On Monday, stewards found Waterhouse guilty of 13 charges of entering transactions which were not legitimate wagers, two counts of giving misleading evidence to the stewards and one count of conduct prejudicial to the image of racing. He was charged A\$6,000 for each wagering infraction, was disqualified for three years for the misleading evidence and an additional year disqualification for harming racing's image. Waterhouse lodged an appeal against his disqualification and fine and has been granted a stay pending a hearing by the Appeals Tribunal Board.
