TERRE A TERRE TOPS SINGAPORE FIELD

A full field of 14, headed by the talented Terre a Terre (Fr) (Kaldounevees {Fr}), will line up for Satur-

day's G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji. The five-yearold mare, a winner in four of her last five starts, capped a three-race winning streak in France last season with a 1 1/2-length success in the G1 Prix de l'Opera Oct. 7. Shipped to Sha Tin for the Dec. 16 G1 Hong Kong Cup, the gray was third, just a neck behind Agnes Digital, despite the fact that jockey Christophe Soumillon lost an iron 200 yards from the finish. She rebounded to post a game win in the Mar. 23 G1 Terre a Terre & jockey Dubai Duty Free H., holding off Noverre for a 3/4-length score. The morning line has Terre a Terre at 6-1 behind 7-2 favorite Grandera

(Ire) (Grand Lodge), who was fifth in the G1 Audemars Piguet QE II Cup last time out. Singapore Airlines announced yesterday that it will continue its sponsorship of this race, now part of the World Series Racing Championship, for an additional three years.

St Expedit followed up his success in this race last year with a battling display from the front here. Twelve months ago he had his nearest rival 10 lengths back, but this time he had to show different qualities to ward off three persistent challengers in the straight. Taken to the front early by Darryll Holland, he was allowed to dictate the pace. The five-year-old quickened entering the straight and stayed on well as Sagittarius, Ovambo and 2000 winner Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) closed and gained the victory. "He goes round there like he's on rails and it helps him, as he's a keen horse," Holland said. "He didn't win as well as last year, but he probably took on better opposition today. He's a horse that's got a big stride and you've got to let him use it." St Expedit followed last year's success at Chester with a close second-place finish to Egyptband in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly, but was a distant seventh in the July 10 G2 Princess Of Wales S. It was discovered he had suffered a fractured pastern in the race, and he was done for the season. He came back in the Apr. 20 G3 John Porter S. at Newbury and finished second by a neck. His next start had not yet been decided.

CONTROVERY SURROUNDS WAR EMBLEM

BONUS The fact that War Emblem (Our Emblem) won a \$1 million bonus for completing the Illinois/Kentucky Derby double is not in dispute, but exactly who will cash the bonus check may have to be decided by the courts. Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation purchased 90 percent of War Emblem from Russell Reineman just after his Illinois Derby win. While the Illinois Derby bonus was not specifically mentioned in the contract signed to complete the sale, a spokesman for The Thoroughbred Corporation said the colt was sold "without any encumbrances or obligations." But Reineman will file suit against Sportsman's Park, where the Illinois Derby was run, unless he receives 50 percent of the \$1 million. "What choice do I have now?" Reineman told the Thoroughbred Times. "I owned the horse when he won the first race, so my lawyers think I should actually get 100 percent." Neil Papiano, the attorney for The Thoroughbred Corp., said he has not been contacted by Reineman. Sportsman's Park is expected to receive the \$1 million payment from their insurance company in the next 30 days and are supposed to have the final say as to where the money goes, but stated they will not pay out the bonus until the Prince and Reineman come to an agreement.

NYRA HONORS PHIPPS The New York Racing Association has announced that the GI Hempstead H. will be renamed the Ogden Phipps H. Phipps passed away Apr. 22. "Mr. Phipps was a founder of NYRA and an icon in the industry," said NYRA chairman and CEO Barry Schwartz. "We thought it was most appropriate to rename a Grade I stakes after a man who has done so much for New York racing and racing nationwide. Mr. Phipps was renowned for his fillies and mares, so we thought this would be an appropriate manner in which to honor him." Phipps won the Hempstead twice, with homebred champion Personal Ensign in 1988 and with Fantastic Find in 1990. The \$300,000 event will be run June 22 at 1 1/16 miles on the main track.

FINAL DERBY RATINGS DROP The final television ratings for Saturday's Kentucky Derby were down 12 percent, dropping from an 8.1 rating and a 21 share in 2001 to a 7.1 rating and an 18 share. But the figures were still the second highest since 1996. "Last year, in our first Derby telecast, we posted a 40-percent increase over the previous year's ratings," NBC Sports President Ken Schanzer said. "Considering this year's Derby had a wide-open field with no 'superhorse,' we are pleased to have retained a sizeable number of those viewers and, in fact, exceeded our expectations."

KUDOS SIDELINED Kudos (Kris S.), who cruised to a 4 3/4-length score in the Apr. 6 Gl Oaklawn H. last time out, will be sidelined for the rest of the season due to a chip in his left ankle, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The five-year-old also captured the San Marino H. and was third in the Gl Santa Anita H. during this campaign and last year set a record on the Hollywood turf course, going a mile and three-sixteenths in 1:51 4/5. Overall, the bay has a record of 19-6-4-1 for earnings of \$708,935. He will undergo surgery next Thursday. "He might make it back by fall to start training," trainer Richard Mandella told *DRF*. "We'll point for next year."

Snowflake was second, beaten only a length and a half by Lailani (GB), in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood last August while still a maiden, but failed to get her first win in two subsequent European starts, running seventh in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and a distant second in a maiden test at The Curragh Sept. 2. The bay made her U.S. bow at Santa Anita Feb. 10 and has been unbeatable since crossing the Atlantic. After polishing off a field of fellow now-winners, she posted a Santa Anita allowance victory Mar. 10 and added another Apr. 18. The second choice to make it a perfect fourfor-four in America, Snowflake settled in sixth while on the bridle early, made a four-wide move on the far turn, took over at the top of the stretch and repelled the challenge of longshot Monrow to keep her streak alive. Favored Reine de Romance (Ire) (Vettori {Ire}), winner of the GII San Clemente H. at Del Mar last summer, was making her first start since finishing sixth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup last October. The chestnut set the pace, but tired to be fourth.



Meanwhile, Godolphin's Grandera (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}), drawn well in seven, will not wear the visor he sported last time when fifth in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 21. Stable companion Atlantis Prince (GB) (Tagula {Ire}), was drawn in four yesterday, with Godolphin's traveling head lad Ross Campbell commenting: "Before the draw I thought between three and eight would be ideal. 
