

Monmouth Announces Stakes Schedule:

Officials at the New Jersey Sports and Exhibition Authority have released the graded-stakes portion of the Monmouth Park meeting, encompassing 14 races and combined purse money of \$3.25 million. The stakes program is highlighted, as usual, by the \$1 million GI Haskell Invitational H. to be run this year Sunday, Aug. 3. The other Grade I race on the New Jersey racing calendar, the GI United Nations H. for older turf horses, receives a \$250,000 increase in purse money to \$750,000. The GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. for older fillies and mares has also received a healthy boost and is worth \$400,000 this year, up from \$300,000 a year ago.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a will will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

Tax Break for Foreign Bettors?

A military tax-break bill with an attached provision to eliminate the 30-percent withholding tax for foreigners who wager on horses races in the U.S. is set to be addressed today by the House of Representatives, reports the Washington Post. Brought forward by Republicans, the bill would, presumably, make American Thoroughbred pari-mutuel wagering more attractive to out-of-country handicappers. Few foreigners currently bet on American races because of the stiff levy on wagers coming in from abroad. Proponents of the bill argue that the elimination of the tax would actually increase money taken in by the Treasury, as the result would most likely be an increase in American betting pools. Tim Smith, commissioner of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, said, "It would almost certainly increase foreign wagering on U.S. horse racing. It would boost both the entertainment side of our business and the agribusiness side."

ASIAN FEDERATION CREATES GRADING AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE The Asian Racing Federation (ARF) announced the creation of the Grading and Race Planning Committee (GRPC) Wednesday at the 29th Asian Racing Conference in Auckland, New Zealand. Primarily operating in an advisory capacity, the GRPC was created to assist the International Cataloguing and Standards Committee (ICSC) with the grading of International races. "Pattern races should be comparable and this advisory body will harmonize the process by which races are graded," said Hong Kong Jockey Club Executive Director of Racing Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges. Engelbrecht-Bresges, who was chairing Wednesday's session, has been appointed chairman of the newly created GRPC. "One of the main goals is to consider the terms of reference of the Federation's GRPC," added Engelbrecht-Bresges. "That is, to establish the criteria on how member countries formulate

their pattern races, and how we can raise these to a

higher profile internationally."

PAOLINI PRIMED Paolini (Ger) (Lando {Ger}) warmed up for the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29 with a solid breeze at the Pisa San Rossore training center Tuesday morning. Conditioner Andreas Wohler, who supervised the six-year-old as he worked with stable companion Sabiango (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) over a straight five furlongs, expressed himself satisfied. "Here the temperature has been mild and today is nearly 20 degrees (Celsius)," Wohler explained. Paolini will work again on Tuesday before being shipped back to Germany Mar. 17 en route to Dubai. Wohler is convinced that last year's runner-up in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup and G1 Hong Kong Cup will be suited by the likely fast tempo of the Duty Free.
