### TATTERSALLS JULY OPENS TODAY

There are 505 lots catalogued for this year's secondlargest ever Tattersalls July Sale, with breeding and racing prospects to suit most budgets on offer. The top horse in training looks set to appear just before the close of play Thursday when the two-year-old Clifden (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}), Lot 498, is sure to make considerably more than the 8,000gns he cost as a yearling at Doncaster. Trained in Newmarket by first-season handler Mark Wallace, the colt is now one of the highest-rated juveniles in Britain following his success in last month's G3 Premio Primi Passi in Milan. Avorado (Ire) (Royal Academy), Lot 234, is offered on the back of a handicap success at The Curragh on June 29 while the pick of several lots consigned from Aidan O'Brien's Ballydoyle Stables looks set to be Lot 157, Sparkling Glitter (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a three-parts sister to the Group 1 winner and sire Revoque (Ire) (Fairy King).

### Women in the Workplace

Today's business also features a number of fillies and mares from top breeders such as Cheveley Park Stud, the various Maktoum entities and Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte operation. The Cheveley Park team includes Lot 62, Time to Dream (GB) (Gone West), an unraced daughter of G1 Vodafone Oaks runner-up Dance A Dream (GB) (Sadler's Wells). She is in foal to Pivotal (GB), as is Lot 53, Dance to the Music (GB) (Red Ransom), a three-year-old who made 100,000gns on her last appearance at Tattersalls, at the 2001 Houghton Yearling Sale. Jimmy George, Tattersalls' marketing director, said yesterday, "Last year's record-breaking July Sale demonstrated how much this sale has grown in stature in recent years, and this is another very solid commercial catalogue that has been well received. Significant consignments from the major owner-breeders have given the catalogue great strength in depth, and enormous global appeal." ### THE SUN AND THE HEIR

The final crop by Japan's supersire Sunday Silence (Halo) dominated the first session of the 2003 Japan

Racing Horse Association Select Foals Sale, held yesterday in Tokyo. Six of the top 10 lots were by Sunday Silence, including the sale's best seller, a brown colt out of Australian Group 3 winner Seto Flowerian (Aus) (Bellotto). Consigned by Shadai Farm, he was bought by Fusaro Sekiguchi for ¥330,000,000. "I would have gone as high as necessary to get that colt," Sekiguchi, who took the 2000 Kentucky Derby with \$4 million KEESEP yearling Fusaichi Pegasus, told The Blood-Horse. "I

don't like to set limits when I buy, though, of course, I have a rough idea of what I'll spend. If I have my heart set on something, I go to whatever price I have to to get it. Winning is life." Underbidder Shigeyuki Okada of Big Red Farm added, "I really wanted that colt...I just don't have the funds to lay out that kind of money." The sales-topping foal is a full brother to 2002 Japanese 2000 Guineas runner-up Tiger Café (Jpn). His dam had been purchased by the Australian Bloodhorse Club of Japan for just A\$35,000 during the 1992 Magic Millions January Yearling Sale. The aggregate on opening day at the JRHA sale was a record ¥3,792,000,000. Sales Toppers, p3.

Attraction, who was imperious in the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18, bids to defy a three-pound penalty for that success and become the first filly since Forest Flower in 1986 to follow up here. Like that top-class performer, Attraction has stamped her authority on her peers from an early part of the season. She turned the Listed Hilary Needler Trophy into a procession in defeating Tolzey by 21/2 lengths at Beverley June 4 before beating Catstar by three lengths at the Royal meeting. Unlike the favorite, Pearl Grey is not an imposing type physically, but lacks nothing in toughness, based on her impressive success in the Listed Empress S. over course and distance last time June 28. Birthday Suit followed a debut score in a York maiden May 15 with a workmanlike success in a conditions race at Beverley last time June 19 and could emerge as the main threat.

Bollin Eric has not had it easy after picking up a penalty for his success in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September. Nevertheless, he has been far from disgraced in finishing fourth behind Warrsan (Ire) in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 12, third behind Mamool (Ire) in the G2 Yorkshire Cup at York May 15 and runner-up to Indian Creek (GB) in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot last time June 21. He holds the third-placed Zindabad and fourth-placed Bandari on that form, but faces a stiff task attempting to give 15 pounds to High Accolade. Three-year-olds have found it tough against their elders in this contest, with only three having succeeded since 1988. However, High Accolade may be one of the best of the current crop based on his impressive wins in the Listed Predominate S. at Goodwood May 20 and G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot last time June 20. Gamut hails from a stable with a fine record in this, but may need further based on his win in the Listed Aston Park S. at Newbury May 17, while Millenary needs to bounce back if he is to repeat his success of 12 months ago.

Over the years, no stud has made a bigger investment in Nureyev's stallions sons than Coolmore. With Peintre Celebre, Spinning World, Fasliyev and King Charlemagne at its Irish farms and Stravinsky at Ashford, Coolmore currently has five of the great stallion's sons, with these five representing roughly a quarter of Nureyev's Group 1-winning sons.

The scale of Coolmore's investment could be described as brave in view of the records at stud of some of Nureyev's earlier Group 1-winning sons. Only Theatrical could be described as an unqualified success, while Polar Falcon appears to have made a significant contribution to the breed by siring the remarkable Pivotal. Zilzal and Soviet Star have also had their moments, but some of the others, such as Stately Don, Wolfhound, Alwuhush, Joyeux Danseur and Atticus, have so far done little to help Nureyev's reputation as a sire of sires.

Perhaps it was this mixed record which had the critics poised ready for the attack before Peintre Celebre's first crop had had a realistic chance of proving itself last year.

Admittedly, the early signs weren't too encouraging: his figures in late September stood at only one winner, Override, from his first 16 runners in Europe. Even with Dai Jin winning a valuable prize in Germany at the end of September, Peintre Celebre's record was hardly guaranteed to encourage interest in his second-crop yearlings at the important sales in October. Sure enough, noone was prepared to pay more than €220,000 for any of his yearlings, with his average working out at little more than 41,000 guineas--a poor return on Peintre Celebre's 2000 fee of 65,000 Irish guineas.

Coolmore had little option but to reduce his fee, lowering it to €25,000, which represented a very tempting price for a horse of Peintre Celebre's considerable racecourse achievements. Remember, his three-year-old campaign had established him as the undisputed star of the 1997 season in Europe. He won the Prix Greffulhe, French Derby and Grand Prix de Paris against his own age-group, but it was his performance in the Arc which set the seal on his greatness. Quickening in terrific style, he came home five lengths clear of Pilsudski in record time.

Peintre Celebre's owner Daniel Wildenstein then took the brave decision to keep him in training at four, only to see his colt injure a tendon shortly before he was due to reappear in the 1998 Prix Ganay. That meant that 16 months went by between Peintre Celebre's last appearance and the start of his first Northern Hemisphere season in Ireland. Such a long gap is never helpful in an industry where memories are notoriously short.

Even so, he attracted around 120 mares in his first season, with that figure falling to just over a hundred in his second season. Coolmore promptly leased him to Japan for the 2001 season (which means he has no yearling crop in the West this year). On his return, his fee was set at 37,500 Irish guineas--just over half his original fee--but the size of his book fell once again, to around 90 mares. However, the chances are that his fee and his book will both be on the rise in 2004, now that his progeny are well on the way to proving themselves.

What Peintre Celebre's critics had forgotten was that he hadn't been particularly precocious. Although he made a winning debut in the August of his juvenile season, he raced only twice that year and was rated no higher than 105 by Timeform, who increased his rating to 137 the following year.

The colt's record was in line with that of his dam, Alydar's daughter Peinture Bleue. Last on her only start at two, Peinture Bleue did well over a mile and a quarter at three in France before travelling to Belmont Park to win the GII Long Island H. over a mile and a half. With many breeders sending stoutly bred mares to Peintre Celebre, he was always unlikely to sire large numbers of early juvenile winners. There is no reason, though, why he can't sire two-year-old winners as the distances lengthen late in the season and he ended 2002 with a flourish, boosting his total of winners to nine, including the Listed winner Vallee Enchantee.

Dai Jin--whose dam tackled distances of up to two and a quarter miles--has become his first Group 1 winner, following up his victory in the G2 Union-Rennen with an even better success in the German Derby. Super Celebre, who became his sire's first group winner when he took the G2 Prix Noailles in April, had made a bold bid to win the French Derby, finishing a clear second to Dalakhani.

Of course, there were some bargains to be had among Peintre Celebre's second crop yearlings. The very shrewd English trainer Mark Johnston told readers of the *Racing Post* in April, "I've put a few of my eggs in the Peintre Celebre basket this year but, with dams like Breyani, who have already proved capable of producing an Irish 1000 Guineas winner, I shouldn't go too far wrong."

Sure enough, he landed the Listed Chesham S. at Royal Ascot with Pearl of Love and he also looks to have another very good prospect in Breyani's son Mister Monet, who won in style at Sandown last week. Johnston also won the valuable King George V H. at Royal Ascot with Fantastic Love, another son of Peintre Celebre.

One of the most interesting aspects of Peintre Celebre's career so far has been his winners out of the high-class mares entrusted to him by the Wildenstein family. Vallee Enchantee, a Listed winner, is inbred 2x3 to Nureyev, Loup Romain, an impressive winner on his debut at Chantilly in June, is inbred 3x2 to Alydar, Precious Pearl, third in the G3 Prix Chloe, is inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer, and Victoire Finale, another impressive debut winner in May, is inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer. Several of these animals have been bred with a view to doubling up on the Nantallah and Rough Shod elements in Nureyev's pedigree.

Then there's Super Celebre, who is inbred 4x4 to Raise a Native, while Dai Jin is inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer through Nureyev and the Kentucky Oaks winner White Star Line. Interestingly, Dai Jin's second dam, Urjwan, is by Seattle Slew, sire also of the dam of Pearl of Love (another inbred 4x4 to Raise a Native).

If Peintre Celebre can continue to sire performers of this calibre, he is going to justify Coolmore's faith in Nureyev as a sire of sires, as is Fasliyev, judging by his very encouraging early results. With Russian Valour winning the G3 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot and Much Faster taking the G3 Prix du Bois, Fasliyev is siring quality as well as quantity (11 winners so far). With Stravinsky also notching up some promising winners from his first crop, it looks as though there are going to be plenty of chapters to add to Nureyev's story as a sire of sires.

### New York Trio Arrested for Milkshaking:

Three men were arrested last week at Belmont Park for allegedly milkshaking a horse that was to run later that day for trainer Gary Sciacca. Sciacca employees Paul Barone, a longtime assistant, and stable foreman Oscar DeLeon, as well as Belmont Park veterinarian Dr. Jack McGuire, were arrested by Nassau County police and charged with tampering with a sports contest. The incident occurred on June 28, when a New York Racing Association investigator allegedly saw the three men administering a milkshake--a mixture of soda bicarbonate and sugar that opens up a horse's capillaries-through a tube into the nostrils of Storm River Kelly, who was slated to run in a maiden special weight event that afternoon. Stewards scratched the horse from the race. Sciacca, who was vacationing at the time, is not facing any criminal charges. NYRA officials are expected to hold a hearing into the matter this morning.

#### Funny Cide Returns to the Track:

Returning to the track to work for the first time since falling short of his bid to sweep the Triple Crown, Sackatoga Stable's Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) breezed four furlongs yesterday in a relaxed :51 1/5 over a Belmont Park surface labeled as fast. The Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner has been resting under the watchful eye of trainer Barclay Tagg since his third-place effort in the GI Belmont S. June 7. 



### Beau's Town to Miss Summit of Speed:
