DUBAI WORLD CUP DRAWS 538 NOMINATIONS

Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Pleasantly Perfect** (Pleasant Colony), owned by Diamond A Racing and trained by Richard Mandella, topped 84 early nominations for the 2000-meter G1 Dubai World Cup, sponsored by Emirates Airlines. The Dubai World Cup meet-

ing will be held at Nad al Sheba Mar. 27. "We are very excited by the quality of the horses from around the world who have been nominated for all the races on Dubai World Cup evening," said Ali Saeed Bilhab, chairman of the Dubai Racing Club and the Dubai World Cup Commitee. "We look forward to welcoming all our international visitors to Dubai for what promises to be a spectacu-

lar evening of horse racing." Also nominated to the \$6-million feature are Classic runner-up Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}); GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness hero Funny Cide (Distorted Humor); and GI Hollywood Gold Cup winner Congaree (Arazi). Among European representatives for the event are G1 Champion S. and G1 Derby Italiano victor Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent) and G1 Prix Ganay winner Fair Mix (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}).

Ipi Tombe Looks for Repeat in Duty Free

Ipi Tombe (Zim) (Manshood), who won last year's G1 Duty Free, is among 104 nominations for the the 2004 renewal edition of the 1,777-meter event. Paolini (Ger) (Lando {Ger}), who finished three lengths behind lpi Tombe last year, Canadian Triple Crown champion Wando (Langfuhr) and Adoration (Honor Grades), upset winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, may also make a start in the \$2-million turf race.

BC Turf Champion Johar Heads Sheema Classic

The G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, which will be contested over 2,400 meters on the Nad al Sheba turf course, has attracted 86 nominations from 14 countries, including dead-heat winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf **Johar** (Gone West), also trained by Richard Mandella and **Mubtaker** (Silver Hawk), runner-up in this year's G1 Prix de I'Arc de Triomphe.

Top Three Finishers in BC Sprint Nominated to Shaheen Cajun Beat (Grand Slam), Bluesthestandard (American Standard) and Shake You Down (Montbrook), the first three horses across the wire in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, are among the early nominees for the G1 Golden Shaheen, contested over 1,200 meters on the dirt.

Grey Memo Eyes Mile; Milk it Mick to Derby

Six-year-old **Grey Memo** (Memo {Chi), Mile winner in 2002 and second in 2003, will try for another success in the 2004 G2 Godolphin Mile, sponsored by Jebel Ali International Hotels, while G1 Darley Dewhurst S. winner **Milk it Mick (GB)** (Millkom) is among 57 nominees for the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby. A HUEVO SIDELINED A Huevo (Cool Joe), who completed a return to the races after a nearly four-year absence with a win in Saturday's GI Frank J De Francis Memorial Dash S., will be sidelined again after suffering a tendon injury. The seven-year-old gelding will be out of action for at least six months, trainer Michael Dickinson said Tuesday. "There is no thought of retiring him," Dickinson told *Thoroughbred Times*. "But he'll be out for six months minimum. It's tough, but at least we got a Grade I win for him." A Huevo has won five of seven starts for earnings of \$253,500. The De Francis was his third start of the year and followed a two-length victory in a Sept. 21 Delaware Park allowance.

GODOLPHIN SNAP UP SNOW RIDGE Godolphin has purchased G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) for an undisclosed sum, it was announced yesterday. The Weinstock Family's colt, who took the Ascot contest Sept. 27 before disappointing when ninth in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket Oct. 18, will leave conditioner Marcus Tregoning's stable for Godolphin's Dubai base at Al Quoz Stables. "We have bought the colt and he will be coming over to Dubai in the next few weeks before he returns for a European campaign which will probably begin in the 2000 Guineas," Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager, told PA Sport yesterday. "His plan has not really been discussed at this point, but his initial race will be the Guineas. He's a very exciting prospect and he's a good colt for us to look forward to."

FLORES GETS CALL ON MAIDEN TOWER IN

MATRIARCH According to agent Jim Pegram yesterday, jockey David Flores will ride Darley Stable's Maiden Tower (GB) (Groom Dancer) in the \$500,000 GI Matriarch S. Nov. 30. The winner of the G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly in June, the three-year-old filly finished second by a nose last time out in the GI Queen Elizabeth S. at Keeneland Oct. 11. Ken and Sarah Ramsey's Nothing to Lose (Sky Classic) has joined the barn of trainer Bobby Frankel in preparation for his four-year-old campaign, according to Thoroughbred Times. With trainer D. Wayne Lukas, the bay colt won the GIII Tropical Park Derby and GIII Palm Beach S. last winter. He has been sidelined since February with a stress fracture. In his first work for Frankel, Nothing to Lose went three furlongs at Hollywood Park on Nov. 14 in :36.60. "To me, Frankel right now is probably the greatest trainer in the world, so this was an opportunity to put one in his hands," Ken Ramsey told Thoroughbred Times. "I didn't want the horse to go back to Gulfstream. He got hurt there last year, along with a couple of my other horses. Lukas is going to have his horses at Gulfstream, so we needed to make a change." The Ramseys have two juveniles with Lukas, but have not decided if their three-year-old Ten Cents a Shine (Devil His Due) will rejoin the Hall of Fame conditioner when he returns from a tendon injury suffered in a ninth-place finish in the Preakness S.

The British Horseracing Board has announced revised terms for the Owners' Premium Scheme due to commence on New Year's Day. British-bred foals which were purchased at a public auction in Britain for export have been afforded eligibility under the scheme and will qualify for payment when running in a race in Britain. "The Board has moved to address the real concerns expressed by some British breeders and foal sellers that the attractiveness of these animals would be much reduced by their exclusion from the Scheme," BHB Industry Marketing Manager Paul Struthers said yesterday. "They were anxious that Irish customers, in particular, would be less likely to buy these foals and take them abroad as this would make them ineligible. This would lead to an undesirable fall in both demand and prices for these horses. The Owners' Premium Scheme is going to be a major boost for British Racing and Breeding and we are greatly looking forward to the start of its operation." British Report cont.

McAnulty purchased the colt on behalf of the San Luis Partnership, which also raced the star colt San Luis. During the select session, 183 horses sold for NZ\$6,400,00 and an average of NZ\$52,459. Last year, 114 lots sold for NZ\$5,738,500 and an average of NZ\$50,338. The clearance rate Tuesday was 75.31, up from 64 percent a year ago.
