FULL FIELD FOR FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

A full field of 12 will take to the gate for Sunday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. **Court Vision** (Gulch), making his first start since taking the Nov. 24 GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct, is the likely favorite for the nine-furlong test,

but he will not have an easy time of it. Also making his sophomore bow is **Anak Nakal** (Victory Gallop), who capped off his 2007 season with a half-length tally in the Nov. 24 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill. **Halo Najib**

(Halo's Image), on the other hand, makes his third start of the year in the Fountain of Youth. The Zayat Stables colt followed up on a third-place finish in the Jan. 5 GII Hutcheson S. with a win in the Feb. 11 OBS Championship S. His connections had originally planned to await the Mar. 22 GII Lane's End S. at Turfway, but changed course. "He came out of his last race in such good shape, and there's still a month until the Lane's End," trainer Dale Romans explained. "He's here [at Gulfstream] and just doing so well right now, we figured we'd try and get some graded earnings while we can." Halo Najib had to be supplemented to the race, as did fellow Zayat runner **Z Humor** (Distorted Humor), who was fifth in the Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa in his seasonal opener and comes back off eight days' rest. **Field, p2**

SANTA ANITA TO REPLACE TRACK

Following a day-long meeting at Santa Anita, officials from the track announced that they will be replacing the existing Cushion Track after the winter/spring meeting ends Apr. 20. Santa Anita has lost a total of 11 days during the current meet due to the drainage problems. "This is a surface that will only last us until the end of the meet," Santa Anita President Ron Charles told *Daily Racing Form*. "We'll have to make a major change at the end of this meeting. It's going to be critical. I've got an open mind. We're going to go back out and weigh everything. Hopefully, we'll make the best decision possible." No announcement has been made on which surface will be installed. Wednesday's forum was attended by a wide cross-section of horsepeople, from trainers and jockeys to racing secretaries to synthetic track representatives. Paul Harper, who was supposed to attend the meeting on behalf of Cushion Track, did not participate. The special meeting was called Feb. 15 in light of the recent problems with Santa Anita's Cushion Track and its failure to properly drain during torrential rainstorms. Opinions varied on the effectiveness of Cushion Track. Trainer Bob Baffert has been a vocal critic of synthetic surfaces, and transferred several prominent horses from Del Mar to Saratoga last summer. "We're in a crisis or we wouldn't be having this meeting," Baffert said. "I think these vendors sold us a bill of goods that didn't do what they were supposed to." While Baffert was among the dissenters, a majority of his colleagues, including David Hofmans, Doug O'Neill and Ron Ellis, praised the surfaces. Said Ellis, "I can unequivocally say that horses stay a lot sounder." Hofmans added that his Grade I-winning sprinter Greg's Gold, who suffered from tendon issues in the past, would not be around without the synthetic tracks. Officials from California's other Thoroughbred tracks were nearly unanimous in their support. Said Tom Robbins, racing secretary at Del Mar, "In my over 25 years at Del Mar, in terms of the lowest number of catastrophic and noncatastrophic injuries, 2007 was the best year ever." He added, "Our average field size increased as the meeting went along, which is almost unheard of, and with the low attrition rate, we sent a lot more horses on to race at the Los Angeles-area tracks later in the year."

Undefeated **War Pass** (Cherokee Run), the reigning champion two-year-old, will make his sophomore debut in the 10th race at Gulfstream Park Sunday. Off since taking the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the Robert LaPenta colorbearer will face five rivals in the one-mile allowance test. He drew post 5, and regular rider Cornelio Velasquez will have the mount.

Turf War Pointing for Lane's End or WinStar Derby...

Turf War (Dixie Union), ninth in Monday's GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park, grabbed his quarter in the race. "That compromised him," trainer Mark Casse said. Casse added that the full brother to GSW Grasshopper will be pointed for either the Mar. 16 WinStar Derby at Sunland Park or the Mar. 22 GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park. Turf War has won three of his six starts to date, dead-heating for the victory in the Dec. 7 GIII Delta Jackpot S., and has earned \$518,548.

In town for the Calder 2yo sale and looking for some insider tips on where to dine? We've got you covered.

CASA TUA, 1700 James Avenue, Miami Beach, FL. (305) 673-1010. www.casatualifestyle.com

Casa Tua is set in an old Mediterranean-style house, and serves Italian food--Northern Italian rather than Southern. It's very understated from the outside, there's no signage indicating that it's a restaurant; just a house with a lot of foliage. When you walk in, to the left, which used to be the house's dining room, they've put one huge table which seats about 30 people, and you're sitting right in the kitchen and can see the chefs working. The upstairs is a private club, available to members only. The downstairs is available to the public. When you go through to the outside dining area, it has Moroccan lamps with candles inside, which makes the light very soft. There's a lot of foliage and it gives you the feeling of being lost on a little island. It has a great wine selection, with literally hundreds of different bottles. On the appetizer menu, the orecchiete with seafood is outstanding, and the Casa Tua tuna tartare is stunning, the Taylor Bay scallops with Ligurian olive oil and the grilled octopus are very good. When I go there, I try to eat something light, so I haven't had many of the meats, but the pappardelle with lamb ragu is quite good, the beef tenderloin is good, and I like the spaghetti with ricotta.

The diver scallops with artichokes are also excellent. For those who are still smokers (I'm not), you can be outside and puff. For somebody who knows the way down to South Beach, with no traffic, it's a half-hour from the sales grounds, and it's quite simple. Take 95 South to 395 to 5th Street. Now you're on South Beach, and you go up to 17th Street, and turn east. One block short of the ocean, James Avenue cuts across 17th, and it's on the corner of James and 17th.

Living in South Florida, we have access to many fabulous restaurants from Miami to Boca. My favorite local spot is an Asian restaurant named Coco's which is right off of 17th St. about a mile from Ft. Lauderdale Beach. It has become one of my family's favorite hangs. The sushi is remarkable, especially the shrimp tempura hand roll, and they have a steamed white fish with ginger sauce that is off the chart. Don't miss it.

Le Tub is located on the Inter-Coastal waterway in Hollywood. A shirt and tie will not fly in this laid-back joint. It is home of the "it will take an hour burger", but it is well worth the wait and in the meantime you can enjoy several cold beverages of choice. The majority of the hand-built seating is outdoors. The tropical landscaping of flowers and plants growing out of sinks and tubs adds a bit of the keys to your experience. This place hit the trifecta for its great burgers, cold beer, and relaxing Intercoastal views.

GARCIA'S SEAFOOD GRILLE & FISH MARKET, 398 NW North River Dr., Miami, FL. (305) 375-0765. Open for lunch & dinner.

Garcia's is a family owned and operated seafood restaurant and fresh seafood market right on the banks of the Miami River, offering the freshest of seafood with a Latin flair. How fresh is the fish? The seafood is delivered by the family boats to the dock in the back of the restaurant. The smoked fish dip will start your culinary experience with a bang. You will certainly ask for more! Their grilled seafood is prepared in many ways (plain, lemon-pepper, or blackened). The yellow rice is delicately flavored with tender fish to create a signature Caribbean taste. My favorite is the grilled or blackened conch. They tenderize the conch first (it can be a little chewy), grill it to perfection, and serve it with two side dishes. You can enjoy views of the Miami River at the picnic tables out back, or sit inside. A newly completed upstairs pub has a comfortable setting that will only enhance your meal. One of the Garcia clan, Luis, is running the restaurant now. He enjoys going to the racetrack occasionally, and he was a pitcher at LSU before a brief minor league career. *Click [here](#) for Google Map directions.*

If you've emptied your wallet at the sales grounds, and are looking for a great dinner at a reasonable price, along with a view of the Intercoastal and entertainment by traditional bellydancers, this is the spot. The Greek restaurant gets the Bossinakis seal of approval for its authentic renditions of kefalotiri saganaki (fried cheese), keftedes (Greek meatballs), spanakopita (spinach pie) and lamb ribs, but it's hard to go wrong on the menu. And be sure to start out with a Trela (Greek for madness) martini. That's what we always order, and, if you're lucky, you might find a couple members of the TDN crew up on the tables along with those bellydancers.

Mare Owner Advocate Garrett Redmond:

Byron Rogers's view (TDN, Wednesday, Feb. 20) might be opposed on several points, but I concede in order to raise another consideration. The rule requiring actual physical cover by a stallion was instituted to avoid many or all of the concerns and possible problems that Rogers now dismisses. If enough breeders share his opinion, what is there against allowing artificial insemination? If huge books are not a problem, artificial insemination cannot be opposed on genetic grounds. It would place less physical demands and stress on stallions. It would reduce the cost of breeding to the select few stallions. Mares could be kept in climatically kinder and financially economical locations. Five-hundred vials of sperm from a \$100,000 stallion could bring the price down to, say, \$50,000 a cover. Five-hundred owners could breed their mares to a horse they could not previously afford. The stallion owner would rake in 2 1/2 times his previous fee revenue. Economists would rate it highly as a perfect example of the benefit of increased productivity. Mind you, the experience of the Standardbred fraternity might be repeated. Young stallion prospects would bring far less money, and, because prospective bonanzas would be somewhat harder to achieve, young racing prospects would bring much less money. Would that matter? Of course not, because our production costs would drop significantly. It would not be necessary to pay \$16 million for a racing/stallion prospect; he could be bought for actual cash value. If young prospects cost less, ordinary people could afford to buy a racehorse. Tracks would be packed with owners new to the game. Slot machines would generate millions to improve purses. It sounds like Utopia. What is holding us back?

After posting a banner year in 2007, Terry Finley's West Point Thoroughbreds has its sights set on the Triple Crown trail with the promising three-year-old and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Saratoga Russell** (Trippi).

Acquired for \$170,000 as an OBSMAR juvenile, the Florida-bred clicked off fast fractions of :21 4/5 and :44 4/5 in his Big A debut last November before tiring late to place a solid second behind the highly regarded National Pride (Video). That son of Macho Uno earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status following that performance, and was subsequently purchased privately by Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation.

Racing over Aqueduct's inner surface in his second career start in mid-December, Saratoga Russell was hammered down to 1-2 and didn't let his supporters down. Breaking from the seven hole, the bay was fourth in the early going, but quickly ran into some traffic woes after being guided to the inside by Eibar Coa. Caught behind a wall of horses entering the lane, he shot through an opening toward the rail in the stretch and drew away to win in hand by a dominating 7 1/2 lengths (Video).

Freshened by trainer Rick Violette Jr., the West Point colorbearer was equally as impressive in his next start, splashing his way home to a 10 3/4-length victory in a \$62,500 optional claimer versus Florida-breds at Gulfstream Park Feb. 9 (Video).

"He's a very cool horse," Finley said of Saratoga Russell. "He had real bad shins coming out of the two-year-old sale. Rick got him very early last summer and just kind of nursed him along. He really didn't act like a star until the middle of Saratoga one morning when he breezed a half mile. I remember being on the backside and turning to Rick. We kind of looked at each other and said, 'Wow.' He's very exciting. He's the kind of horse that everyone at these two-year-old sales is looking for."

The son of the unraced Theatrical (Ire) mare Prologue is expected to make his first start beyond six furlongs in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct Mar. 8.

"In all likelihood, we go to the Gotham," Finley said. "There's an outside shot we take a look at the [GII] Rebel [S., Mar. 15] or [GIII] Tampa Bay Derby [Mar. 15]. But right now, if we were pressed on it, we'd go to the Gotham."

There were several factors that led to the purchase of Saratoga Russell at OBS.

"He had a little bit more leg than the normal Trippi," Finley recalled. "We just thought he was very racey and very athletic. He had a real good frame. He's not a horse that carries a lot of weight, but we just thought he was really, really, athletic, and a pretty cool horse to be around. We watched him all week and thought that he was the kind of horse that we would like to take a shot on."

It's no secret that West Point has enjoyed a tremendous amount of success at the two-year-old in training sales. Working with bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, recent profitable acquisitions include MGISW Dream Rush (\$285K OBSFEB), GISW Flashy Bull (\$205K OBSFEB), GISW Irish Smoke (\$285K OBSMAR), GISW Lear's Princess (\$110K OBSMAR) and GSW & MGISP Awesome Gem (\$150K BESMAR).

"We do prefer the two-year-old sales, but we don't totally disregard yearling sales," West Point's founder and president explained. "We feel the most comfortable at the two-year-old sales. It's just a matter of knowing the players. We feel that we've got a shot to get the inside edge because we know the players. I believe that we're going to get the straight scoop from people, from the consignors. It's just the market that we're very familiar with. We will continue to do what we think we do best until our record dictates that we do something else."

Chace has been teaming up with West Point for roughly 14 years, according to Finley.

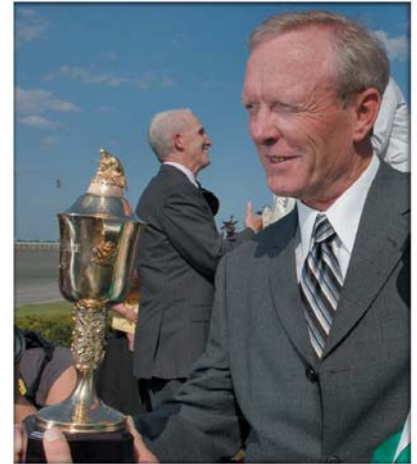
"He has other clients, but we work together with Buzz," Finley offered. "It's really nice because we've been able to form partnerships with some of his clients. It's a good team. We respect each other and we enjoy each other's company. We work hard and it's a game where you got to stay after it."

A close third in the restricted Mr. Leader S. at Aqueduct in November 2006, Saint Daimon returned from a 14-month absence to run fourth in two starts in 2008: a six-furlong allowance over this main track Jan. 19 and sprinting five-eighths over the turf Feb. 3. Catching a sloppy main track for this, the Dreyfus homebred argued a fast early pace from the inside, poked a head in front at the quarter pole and found the wire narrowly better than a fast-closing Bribon.

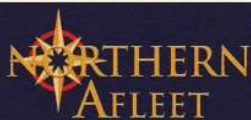

Voice of Finger Lakes, Ross Morton, Dies:

Ross Morton, the only track announcer in the 46-year history of Finger Lakes Gaming and Race Track, died Wednesday night in Hollywood, Florida, after suffering a massive stroke over the weekend, according to the *Democrat and Chronicle*. He was 74. Born in Brooklyn, New York, Morton was a disc jockey in Syracuse in 1962 before making the transition to race call announcer when Finger Lakes opened for business in Farmington. Referred to by many as “The Voice,” he covered Finger Lakes during the regular season and called the races at Gulfstream (for 23 years) and Hialeah (5 years) during the winter months. Morton was sidelined for several weeks in 2005 following bypass surgery and Chris Riegler, President and General Manager of Finger Lakes Gaming and Race Track, recalls receiving many phone calls from OTB and on-track patrons asking where Morton was. “I even received some hate mail from people who thought I’d fired Ross,” Riegler told the *Democrat and Chronicle*. “He was the last person we’d replace. It was his job for life.”

NATIONAL STUD OWNERSHIP CHANGE The National Stud is set to come under full control of the Jockey Club after the British Government indicated an intention to transfer ownership of the stud for the benefit of the horseracing industry, according to *PA Sport*. Currently managed by the Horserace Betting Levy Board, the 500-acre site, situated alongside Newmarket's July racecourse, will continue to offer training in stud management as well as managing the five resident stallions Bahamian Bounty (GB), Cockney Rebel (Ire), Pastoral Pursuits (GB), Phoenix Reach (Ire) and Val Royal (Fr). The latter will resume stallion duties in April after recently undergoing surgery for colic. "I am pleased the Jockey Club has agreed to take on ownership of the National Stud," the Government's Minister for Sport Gerry Sutcliffe told *PA Sport*. "This means first-class training in stud management will continue and, importantly, the facility will be managed by an organisation dedicated to the improvement of horseracing. This move is also part of our wider policy of ending our direct involvement in the administration and financing of horseracing."

DONCASTER SECURE WEATHERBYS SPONSORSHIP Doncaster racecourse will stage the most valuable juvenile race in the North of England after signing a four-year deal with Weatherbys Insurance for sponsorship of the sales-related St Leger Yearling S. "It is very appropriate that Weatherbys, one of the oldest names in racing, will be sponsoring a feature event at the home of the original Classic." 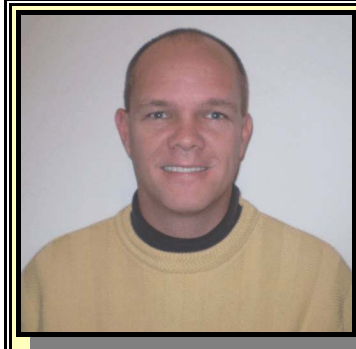
