

#### **OHIO SLOTS IN DOUBT**

A week after Governor Ted Strickland announced he would support slots at Ohio racetracks as a way to balance the state's budget, expanded gaming in the state took a hit when the Senate rejected the Governor's budget. The Senate is required to present the Governor with a balanced budget by today, but the

deadline looks unlikely to be met and, in a release Sunday, the governor put the blame on Senate Republicans and Senate President Bill Harris. "There are now only two days remaining until the legislature must send me a balanced budget," Strickland said in the statement. "Senate Republicans refuse to support my

balanced budget framework that invests in our schools while avoiding a tax increase on Ohio families and businesses. We have heard the objections, but unfortunately still no solutions. I believe that the Senate Majority understands the gravity of the situation before them. I continue to wait for them to say what taxes they would increase or what services they would further reduce to address the budget gap." Ohio faces a \$3.2-billion budget deficit. According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, Harris has said that a slots bill should be presented to the state's voters, who have already rejected the measure four times.

The catalog for the Deauville August Yearling Sale is now available online. The sale runs from Aug. 14-17 and features 502 yearlings. Graduates of the sale have won a pair of European Classics in 2009. Le Havre (Ire) (Noverre), bought for €100,000, captured the G1 Prix de Jockey Club, while Silver Frost (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), a €95,000 purchase, took the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. Yearlings bought at Deauville have also landed the last three editions of the G1 Prix du Jockey Club, as well as last year's English 1000 Guineas, won by Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}). #### STUDY: LASIX EFFECTIVE

Furosemide, the controversial drug given to more than 92 percent of North American racehorses on raceday in an attempt to control bleeding, does, in fact, result in a significant decrease in exercise-induced pulmonary hemorrhaging, scientists revealed in a press conference in South Africa Monday morning.

A groundbreaking joint study released Monday by Colorado State University, the University of Melbourne and the University of Pretoria, which involved 167 horses racing in South Africa, found that horses under typical racing conditions were three to four times more likely to bleed when not using furosemide and were seven to 11 times more likely to have severe bleeding when not using the drug.

"The message is we have a clear-cut answer relative to whether or not this drug is effective in controlling bleeding. It is," said Dr. Paul Morley, a Colorado State veterinarian who was among the leaders of the study. "The results of this study do not eliminate debate about the use of this medication in racehorses, but it does provide evidence needed to aid making sound policy decisions. Decisions are always easier when you have data."

Furosemide, sold under the names Lasix or Salix, has been used to treat pulmonary hemorrhaging in racehorses in North America since the 1970s, but few studies have examined whether furosemide is effective in preventing the development of EIPH, and no studies had examined the issue under actual racing conditions.

The study took place under otherwise routine races at the Vaal Racecourse near Johannesburg, South Africa in November, 2007. Each horse involved in the study raced twice, in races one week apart and under similar conditions. In the first group of races, half the horses in the study group were given Lasix and the other half a placebo of saline solution. In the second set of races, the groups were switched, with the horses given Lasix initially given saline and vice versa. An endoscopy was performed within 30-90 minutes of the race to identify the presence of blood in the airways. The study will be released in the Journal of the American Veterinary Medicine Association July 1.

MINE THAT BIRD BACK TO WORK GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird (Birdstone) returned to the work tab yesterday at Churchill Downs for the first time since running third in the June 6 GI Belmont S. The bay



gelding worked a half-mile in:51 over a fast main track, the 30th fastest of 42 at the distance yesterday. With jockey Calvin Borel in the irons, Mine That Bird cut out fractions of :12.80, :25.20, :38.20 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:04.40. He is expected to make his next start in the Aug. 1 GII West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer, "He came off the track bouncing just like he was before the R Palmer Derby," Borel said. "He's ready. He doesn't need much. He's playful

and happy and back to right where he was before the Derby." Trainer Chip Woolley added, "I thought he'd go in :49 or :50 because he's a little fresh, the freshest he's ever been. I thought he'd be in the bridle a little more, but he looked good and came back cool as a cucumber. He was a little more into the bridle at Belmont and got a little shook up. Believe me, I like it a lot better this way."

#### DEVOTEE RETURNS FRIDAY AT BELMONT

Godolphin's **Devotee** (Elusive Quality), third in last year's GI Darley Alcibiades S. in just her second start,

makes her return to U.S. racing in Friday's eighth race at Belmont Park. The chestnut filly wintered in Dubai, where she captured the Feb. 26 UAE Oaks over the dirt. She has been off since running 13th in the May 3 G1 English 1000 Guineas at Newmarket in her first try on turf. Devotee will be back on the dirt Friday

when she tackles eight rivals in a one-mile optional claiming event. Also in the field is G1 Argentinian Oaks winner Miss Match (Arg) (Indygo Shiner), making her U.S. debut for trainer Bobby Frankel and Lael Stables. D. Wayne Lukas sends out Color Me Up (Aptitude), second in the May 16 GII Shuvee H.

MOON HAS CUP AGENDA Khalid Abdullah's Spanish Moon (El Prado {Ire}) could be targeted at the Breeders' Cup following his first Group 1 success in Sunday's Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. After the Sir Michael Stoutetrained five-year-old's 1 1/2-length defeat of Alpine Rose (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) in the mile-and-a-half contest, connections are looking at other international options as a result of the six-month ban in England due to his failure to enter the starting stalls in the G2 Jockey Club S. in May. "Obviously, we have to go where it makes most sense for him, and we are slightly restricted," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport. "The main thing that came out of yesterday was the trouble they went to to get him in. He doesn't give any trouble at all at home, he's a bit of an enigma. I went to see him do an unofficial stalls test the other day, and he went in 10 times without a bother. He races genuinely, too, so there is no questioning his attitude. We'll sit down and give it some thought, and I don't see why the Breeders' Cup should not come under consideration, along with Hong Kong and Dubai again."


G2 Summer Mile victory at Ascot in July. "He's doing well and his preparation so far has been as much as we could ask of him," trainer Mike de Kock's representative Juan Nel told PA Sport vesterday. "He's ready to take his chance, but it's quite a strong field, with the likes of Conduit and Sea the Stars--it's probably his toughest challenge to date." John Oxx committed to running Christopher Tsui's G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Derby hero in the 10-furlong contest following the heavy rain that hit The Curragh ahead of Sunday's G1 Irish Derby, and he could meet Ballymacoll's G1 St Leger and GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Conduit. He may be joined by stablemate Lang Shining (Ire) (Dr Fong), who would be used for pace-setting duties by Sir Michael Stoute. If allowed to take his chance, Conduit will be renewing rivalry with Teruya Yoshida's Cima de Triomphe (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), who beat him by a nose when in receipt of seven pounds in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over course and distance last time May 28. Aidan O'Brien has four to choose from, including Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) and the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club third Westphalia (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), while Henry Cecil has left in Khalid Abdullah's G1 Lockinge S. third Twice Over (GB) (Observatory).

#### PRIDE OF THE YANKEES

Prioress (\*Sovereign--Reel, by \*Glenco) was the first American-bred and -owned Thoroughbred to travel to England and win a race. Bred in 1853 by General Thomas Jefferson Wells, the bay was a half-sister to the talented Lecomte (Boston), who became the only runner to ever beat the great Lexington when he took the four-mile Jockey Club Purse in a then American record 7:26. Lecomte was purchased by Lexington's owner, noted horseman Richard Ten Broeck, for \$10,000 when Wells dispersed his bloodstock in 1856. Sent to England, Lecomte ran third in his only start across the pond, and died of colic shortly thereafter. The three-year-old event at Fair Grounds is named in his honor.

Ten Broeck had also bought Prioress--for \$2,500--and she was on the ship that sent Lecomte to Britain. Her foray was considerably more successful. The filly had set records in one-mile heat racing while competing at Metairie Race Course in Louisiana, and the experience would stand her in good stead in England. Carrying 93 pounds, Prioress finished in a triple dead-heat with \*El Hakim (under 93 pounds) and \*Queen Bess (66 pounds) in the 1857 Cesarewitch S. at Newmarket, forcing a run-off. Her rivals had never raced in heats, and the task proved too much for them--Prioress won handily and made history. She captured three more races in England, but made little impact in the breeding shed, and died while foaling in 1868.

Ironically, Prioress is best known for her milestone performance in the 2 1/4-mile Cesarewitch, while the Grade I test that honors her is just six furlongs.

First contested in 1948, it has been won by champions such as Next Move (Bull Lea), Grecian Queen (\*Heliopolis), Primonetta (Swaps), What a Treat (\*Tudor Minstrel), Dark Mirage (\*Persian Road II), Ta Wee (Intentionally), Dearly Precious (Dr. Fager), Xtra Heat (Dixieland Heat) and Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie).

Also on the winner's roll is Broodmare of the Year Fall Aspen (Pretense), the dam of champions Timber Country (Woodman) and Bianconi (Danzig), G1SWs Hamas (Ire) (Danzig) and Fort Wood (Sadler's Wells), and GISW Northern Aspen (Northern Dancer).

Xtra Heat set the stakes record of 1:08.26 in 2001. Jockey John Velazquez boasts the most Prioress winners with four--Penny's Reshoot (Turkey Shoot), Capote Belle (Capote), Carson Hollow (Carson City) and Indian Blessing.

#### That Was Then; This Is Now...

Pointing for this year's edition of the race are **Be Fair** (Exchange Rate), **Cat Moves** (Tale of the Cat), **Gabby's Golden Gal** (Medaglia d'Oro), **Heart Ashley** (Lion Heart), **Light Green** (Pleasantly Perfect) and **Selva** (Forest Wildcat).

Heart Ashley is perfect in three starts this season. The Zayat Stables runner took a Fair Grounds allowance test in February, the GIII Cicada S. at Aqueduct in March and the GIII Miss Preakness S. at Pimlico May 15.

"This is the race she's been pointed towards for a long time," said trainer Steve Asmussen, fresh from his victory with Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Mother Goose S. "She's a very fast filly. In a Grade I sprint on dirt for three-year-old fillies, everyone is going to show up. With those fillies going six furlongs here, the trip will matter."

Rated just off the pace in her first victory this term, Heart Ashley went gate to wire in her last two tries. But, according to Asmussen, she does not need to be on the lead early.

"In her last two races, circumstance dictated she show a lot of speed," he remarked. "Aqueduct on the inner track and then being a solid favorite from the fence at Pimlico, on the lead is where you want to be." Information regarding Prioress courtesy www.tbheritage.com.

#### Study Finds Lasix Effective (cont. from p1)

"We designed this study to provide the highest quality evidence to address the use of furosemide in Thoroughbred racehorses," said Dr. Kenneth Hinchcliff of the University of Melbourne. "This study design was similar to those used to test the efficacy of treatments in human medicine, which, to date, have been uncommon in evaluating treatments for horses."

Though the study provided the most powerful evidence yet that Lasix is an effective treatment of bleeding, the researchers fell well short of recommending that it be legalized in the many racing countries where it is now prohibited. Lasix is allowed only in the U.S., Canada and some South American countries.

"The purpose of this study was to show that the drug affects this condition," said Dr. Alan J. Guthrie of the University of Pretoria. "Obviously, there are whole other issues at stake when deciding whether one should allow the use of the medication. We provided the science. We have some background information and knowledge that could possibly be helpful with some of the issues, and the decisions regulators have to make whether to allow it. But as far as coming up with a resolution on that subject, that's not our place."

The group did not look at the issue of whether or not Lasix is a performance-enhancer, but did find horses using the drug lost an average of 12 kilograms because of the diuretic nature of the medication. Horses not using the drug lost four kilograms. In non-metric terms, the difference is roughly 18 pounds.

"Most jockeys wouldn't say no to taking off eight kilograms," Dr. Guthrie said.

"It's possible that there's more than one thing going on when a horse improves when given Lasix," Dr. Morley said. "We're not sure how much it has to do with one thing versus another. It's possible that it is a mix of effects, including weight loss."

Still another controversial aspect of Lasix is its supposed ability to mask other drugs. The researchers did not believe that was a major problem in an era where drug testing has become extremely precise.

"That comment might have applied back in the seventies when the techniques for detecting drugs in urine weren't as developed as they are now," Dr. Hinchcliff said. "Now, they have techniques that can detect infinitesimal quantities of a drug in urine. I don't believe this is a concern any longer, but I could be corrected by the racing analysts and chemists."

Other than the use of furosemide, which was administered strictly adhering to research project guidelines, all races were under South Africa's standard rules and regulations for the industry. The horses and jockeys raced for purses to ensure competitive racing efforts. The five- to eight-furlong races were on a one-mile straightaway on the turf.



The researchers estimated the study cost at approximately \$1 million. It was funded, in part, by a \$98,000 grant from the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation and a \$45,000 grant from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, in addition to support from South African racing interests and golfer Gary Player.

## **PEDIGREE INSIGHTS**

With victories in four of the weekend's five Group 1 events, we were reminded once again of the rare brilliance of the Sadler's Wells male line in general, and of the El Prado branch in particular.

El Prado, Adena Springs's former champion sire, has been in good form this year, even if he has been rather overshadowed by his own son Medaglia d'Oro, sire of the irrepressible Rachel Alexandra. Once again, the opposition barely saw which way this exceptional filly went when she added the GI Mother Goose S. to her GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Preakness successes.

A day later, El Prado finally recorded his first Group 1 victory in Europe when his son Spanish Moon proved too strong for the opposition in the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. That Group 1 victory might have come a lot sooner had Spanish Moon not suffered a pelvic injury when a leading Derby fancy, following his impressive debut victory at two. A year off the track represents a major obstacle for any horse, but fortunately Spanish Moon is now fulfilling his early promise and his form keeps getting better and better, to the extent that Sir Michael Stoute now describes him as "a serious horse."

Medaglia d'Oro is the first American-based grandson of Sadler's Wells to hit the headlines, but one of his European counterparts, Singspiel, has been making his mark for some time now. In narrowly defeating Sadler's Wells's granddaughter Beach Bunny in The Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S., the four-year-old Da Re Mi became no less than Singspiel's 10th Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winner from his first eight crops aged three or more.

It is worth noting that Da Re Mi is out of a Top Ville mare and so is Sadler's Wells's exceptional son Montjeu, who added to his tremendous record in The Curragh's other Group 1 event, the Irish Derby. When Fame and Glory powered away for a five-length victory, he became Montjeu's third winner of this Classic from his first five crops, which, remarkably, also contain two winners of the Derby. There is consequently every chance that the influence of the Sadler's Wells male line is going to extend still further.

Last November, I was asked if I was willing to provide a comment on the Sadler's Wells line for use in promotional material for Medaglia d'Oro. I am often loath to comply with such requests, but in this instance I was happy to preach to any unconverted Americans about the virtues of the 14-time champion sire. I therefore offered the following recommendation:

"Sadler's Wells's sons and grandsons are exerting a profound impact on the breed in Europe, with the champion stallions Galileo and Montjeu leading the way. And the same could happen in the changing American industry, with the help of El Prado. This classically bred horse became Sadler's Wells's first champion sire when he topped the North American table in 2002, with plenty of help from Medaglia d'Oro. And now Medaglia d'Oro is shaping up as another leading torch-bearer for this exceptional male line, which is noted for its soundness."

Despite my considerable faith in this line, I have to admit that Medaglia d'Oro is proving more effective than I ever imagined. Not only has he achieved a top-five position on the general sires' list, but he has also proved the dominant second-crop sire, both by cumulative and by 2009 earnings, even though the opposition includes such talents as Birdstone, Tapit, Candy Ride and Speightstown. *Cont. p7* 





Of course, Rachel Alexandra deserves much of the credit for Medaglia d'Oro's rankings, but he is a long way from being a one-horse sire. The wisdom of Darley's recent move to acquire Medaglia d'Oro was quickly underlined when he came up with his second Grade I winner in the shape of Gabby's Golden Gal, who led throughout to take the Acorn S. That victory made her the fourth graded stakes winner from her sire's 140-strong first crop, the others being C. S. Silk and Payton d'Oro. There are also further talented performers in the stakes winners Renda and Retraceable.

A striking aspect of Medaglia d'Oro's rise is that all seven of his stakes winners are fillies, as are several of his stakes-placed performers. However, these sex biases have a habit of evening themselves out to some extent and there have been some recent signs that this may be about to happen for the Darley recruit. It was only by a head that Warrior's Reward failed to become his sire's first male stakes winner when second in the GIII Northern Dancer S. June 13, and then Arcodoro was a length second in the GIII Cinema H. eight days later. Anaan, another colt, was also second at stakes level in June.

Interestingly, these three stakes seconds were gained on dirt, turf and all-weather, to underline further that Medaglia d'Oro's pedigree will allow him to sire winners on all surfaces. Turf performers, so far, are in a minority, but he has shown he can get European turf winners, thanks to Al Marmoom, Elmfield Boy and last week's juvenile winner Emma Dora. The move to Darley is also likely to result in more of Medaglia d'Oro's stock eventually being given a chance in Europe.

Medaglia d'Oro's career will be helped considerably by the fact that his pedigree is pretty much an outcross for many American mares, with no Raise a Native, Mr. Prospector, Alydar, Hail To Reason, Bold Ruler, Seattle Slew or In Reality anywhere in his pedigree. Even Northern Dancer is back in the fourth generation of his foals, which allows plenty of scope for a second line to this brilliant stallion. *Cont. p8*

Medaglia d'Oro was the first graded winner produced by any of his first four dams, but a rider needs adding to this statement, as his third and fourth dams, Society Singer and Social Position, had only five foals between them. Two of Society Singer's foals were sisters by Silent Screen. One, Voice Over, became the dam of the GI Sapling S. winner Travelling Music, while the other Dubbed In, became Medaglia d'Oro's second dam.

The fact that his fourth dam, Social Position, was a daughter of Ribot tells us that Medaglia d'Oro's female line must have been a big achiever in previous generations. Sure enough, his sixth dam is Sunday Evening, the Eight Thirty mare who produced three notable daughters in Home By Dark, Prayer Bell and Royal Society.

Home By Dark's descendants include such high-class performers as Dark Mirage, Indian Skimmer, Java Gold and Bluebird, while Prayer Bell initially found fame as the dam of the champion juvenile colt Silent Screen. Silent Screen sired Dubbed In from a descendant of Royal Society, which means that Medaglia d'Oro's second dam was inbred 3x4 to Sunday Evening.

Sequoyah has added further to their achievements by becoming the dam of Henrythenavigator, so Medaglia d'Oro's pedigree represents a very proven cross.
