BETFAIR AND BREEDERS' CUP REACH DEAL

For the first time, wagers placed on the Breeders' Cup races through the betting exchange Betfair Group Limited will be commingled with the Breeders' Cup

pools. Under terms of the agreement, announced Thursday, Betfair will pay Breeders' Cup an undisclosed percentage of the tote and exchange betting on their events, and will be able to offer a live video stream of the races on its website. "Our agreement with Betfair is an important milestone in our ongoing effort to grow the international simulcast wagering market for the Breeders' Cup World Championships," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO,

Greg Avioli. "As more and more international horses participate in our championships, interest levels and wagering handle from around the world continue to increase, allowing us to maintain the highest possible purse levels for the event." Betfair's Director of Horseracing Stephen Burn, speaking at a luncheon in London at which the announcement of the Breeders' Cup deal was made, said, "We expect massive interest in the Breeders' Cup Pick 6s and other exotic bets, while there will be trading opportunities between the U.S. pools and exchange betting which will boost turnover." He added, "We are very committed to racing worldwide and want to see that it thrives, rather than just survives." More To The Story, p8

NO BREEDERS' CUP FOR DUBLIN

Dublin (Afleet Alex), hero of the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. at Saratoga, will bypass the GI Breeders'

Cup Juvenile at Oak Tree, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The \$525,000 KEESEP graduate was last seen finishing a disappointing fifth as the 3-5 chalk in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 10. "Artificial surfaces turned the Breeders' Cup upside down," trainer D. Wayne Lukas told *DRF*. "He might go out there

and love it, but we'd rather not subject him to the uncertainty." Owned by Robert Baker and William Mack, Dublin returned to the work tab with a five-furlong move in 1:01 4/5 at Churchill Downs Oct. 19.

RADIOHEAD BAGS BC GIG

IEAH Stables, co-owner of 2008 GI Kentucky Derby hero Big Brown (Boundary), has acquired a controlling interest in the G2 Norfolk S. winner **Radiohead (GB)** (Johannesburg) for an undisclosed fee, and will point its new purchase at the Nov. 7 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile,

according to Racing Post. Current owners Carmen Burrell and Jonathan Harvey are reported to have retained a minority stake in the chesnut, who was a fast-finishing second in the Oct. 2 G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in his latest outing. Trainer Brian Meehan will continue to oversee the colt's im-

mediate future, but long-term plans have yet to be announced. Connections, who will also have to pay a \$100,000 entry fee because Radiohead was not nominated to the Breeders' Cup as a foal, will hope he can emulate sire Johannesburg, a champion in Europe prior to capturing the 2001 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Belmont. "IEAH has been keeping a close eye on Radiohead ever since Ascot, specifically with the Breeders' Cup in mind," agent Andy Smith, who helped broker the deal, told Britain's trade daily. "He reminds me of Wilko--the horse Jeremy Noseda won the Juvenile with five years ago--a feisty, well-built sort who should do well in America."

REPORT OF MARES BRED IN '09 RELEASED

The Jockey Club has reported that 2,409 stallions covered 45,317 mares in North America during 2009, according to the Report of Mares Bred statistics received through Oct. 13. The number of stallions declined 8.9 percent from the 2,643 reported at this time last year. The number of mares bred fell 13.5 percent from 52,410 reported at this time in 2008. Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) and Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) led all stallions with 194 mares bred in 2009. Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride the Rails) (182), Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) (180), and Corinthian (Pulpit) (171) round out the top five. The only region to realize increases was Pennsylvania. The percentage of mares bred soared 29.6 percent in the Keystone State; stallions were up nine percent as well. "Our mid-August projection of 30,000 registered foals in North America for 2010 was based on initial RMB returns, and these latest statistics reinforce that estimate," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services. Iuliano added that the largest decline in breeding occurred at the top of the market, where the number of stallions covering 100 or more mares declined for the fourth consecutive year from 113 in 2008 to 85 this year. The Jockey Club expects to receive more RMBs for the 2009 breeding season.



Summer Bird (Birdstone), last seen defeating older horses in Belmont's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup S. Oct. 3, will work between races at Santa Anita Sunday. "A couple people have told me the Pro-Ride is a little different in the morning than the afternoon, I don't know," trainer Tim Ice explained. "He'll get a feel for it," he added of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic hopeful. "Whether it's different or not, it's still going to be a good work, and he'll be by himself. I won't have to worry about other horses interfering with the work." The Dr. K. K. Jayaraman & Dr. V. Devi Jayaraman homebred worked five furlongs in 1:02 at the Great Race Place Oct. 17.

Dettori Gains Fleeting Spirit Mount...

Racing Post reported yesterday that Frankie Dettori will replace Tom Queally aboard the fast filly Fleeting

Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who will be pre-entered in both the \$2-million GI Sentient Jet Sprint and \$1-million Turf Sprint at Santa Anita. Fourth in the latter event in 2008, the four-yearold filly captured the G1 July Cup this summer, and will ship to California following a close second in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp Oct. 4. "Nothing against Tom, who I'm sure will be champion jockey one day, but we have been thinking of Frankie for some time," coowner Andy Stewart told the

Post. "He rode Fleeting Spirit when she won first time at Nottingham and, since we have confirmed he won't be required by Godolphin, we booked him today." The Sprint, contested on Pro-Ride, will be the first choice for the filly. "She's never run on an artificial surface, but she trains on it at home, and we're going where the money is," Stewart added. Jeremy Noseda trains Fleeting Spirit for The Searchers.

Team Valor Colorbearer for Juvenile Fillies Turf...

Team Valor's unbeaten Junia Tepzia (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) is slated to contest the \$1-million Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 6. Produced by a half-sister to G1 2000 Guineas winner Footstepsinthesand (GB) (Giant's Causeway), but purchased for just 3,000gns at Tattersalls October, the bay filly captured her Aug. 15 debut at Merano for Stall Litex, which caught the eye of Team Valor. She went on to land the Listed Premio Coolmore in Milan Oct. 3 for trainer Peter Schiergen. Kieren Fallon will be in the irons at Santa Anita. Junia Tepzi is not currently nominated to the Breeders' Cup.

Bullsbay Looking Like a Classic Go...

Bullsbay (Tiznow), whose Breeders' Cup status was indefinite at best as late as early September, looks to be California and GI Breeders' Cup Classic bound, trainer Graham Motion told Daily Racing Form yesterday. Winner of the GIII Alysheba S. on the Kentucky Oaks undercard earlier this year, the four-year-old upset Commentator (Distorted Humor) in the GI Whitney H. in August and was third to Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Woodward S. Sept. 6. He emerged from that event with foot soreness. Motion told DRF that Bullsbay will be entered for the Dirt Mile as well, but that they are "leaning towards the Classic."







Racing Round-Up

Oaks Heroine Look Here Retired...

Julian Richmond-Watson's homebred Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}--Last Look {GB}, by Rainbow Quest) has been retired following a seventh-place finish in last Saturday's GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. Last year's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine, who also ran third in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster, has not prevailed since her Classic win, despite showing a consistent level of form this term. Third in the blanket finish of the June 5 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom in her seasonal return, she hit the board again in the June 27 G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh. Look Here then ran sixth in the July 25 G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot and was denied by a nose in the G3 Dubai Duty Free Arc Trial at Newbury in her penultimate start Sept. 18. "Look Here won't run again; she will go back to her owners [Wakefield Lodge Estate] in Northamptonshire, and we will make plans to cover her in the spring," trainer Ralph Beckett told PA Sport.

"She was brilliant for us and she did us the power of good, but things just didn't go her way this year. We

were in front two hops from the line in the Coronation Cup, and got mugged on the line in the Group 3 at Newbury." Beckett added, "We never expected [her Oaks win]. I remember having lunch beforehand, and we said if she could finish in the first six that would be great. That was genuinely what we thought because she had never been a flash worker. We never had an inkling she would win like she did, and it all worked out so well. We then had a choice between the Vermeille and the Leger, and went for the Leger,

which turned out to be probably the best Leger of recent times." Look Here retires to the paddocks with a career record of 9-2-2-3, and earnings of £349,705.

Swift Temper Doubtful for Breeders' Cup...

Mark Stanley's five-year-old mare Swift Temper (Giant's Causeway), who disappointed when 10th as the tepid favorite in the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 11, will likely bypass the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic Nov. 6. Swift Temper entered the Spinster off a breakout win in the GI Ruffian H. at Belmont Sept. 12, but seemed to not handle Keeneland's Polytrack and finished second last. The Ladies' Classic will be contested over Santa Anita's synthetic Pro-Ride. Stanley said the mare could go next in the one-mile GII Chilukki H. at Churchill Nov. 7, or just head straight to the Keeneland November Sale, where she's scheduled to sell as hip 97 on the first day through the consignement of Taylor Made Sales Agency. She will be offered as a racing or broodmare prospect. "I just hate for her to end her career off that last race," said Stanley. "We've discussed going out to the Breeders' Cup, but it's awfully expensive to go out there, especially with the entry fee being as high as it is." Stanley added that he thinks Swift Temper probably didn't like the underfoot conditions in the Spinster, which was her first try on a synthetic surface. "She missed a couple of days of training with a little respiratory thing, but I think it was more the surface than anything else," he said.

Libaud Has Hong Kong Vision...

Last term's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero Vision d'Etat (Fr) (Chichicastenango {Fr}) will sidestep next month's Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita in favor of a tilt at Hong Kong's International meet in December, trainer Eric Libaud revealed yesterday. Jacques Detre and Mme Eric Libaud's four-year-old, who also garnered this year's G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Prince of Wales's S., will now point to the Dec. 13 G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin, following a last-out 10th in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 4. "It was never really our intention to run in America, so we will run at Sha Tin instead," Libaud told PA Sport. "The Hong Kong Cup will be run over 2000 metres, so the shorter trip will suit him. The Arc distance was probably too far for him, so he should be happier in Hong Kong. He's in very good form and has come out of the Arc very well.'

Operation Red Dawn, winless in seven starts since annexing a \$75,000 optional tagger at Belmont last June, began his seven-year-old campaign with a thirdplace finish in the GIII Fort Marcy S. at the Big A May 2. Fifth in the GIII Poker S. at Belmont June 14, he entered off a close third-place finish in a \$100,000 claimer at the Spa Aug. 24. Sitting a stalking trip along the inside as Lemon Cream Pie led through fractions of :23.75 and :49.51, Operation Red Dawn was swung off the rail at the top of the stretch and reeled in the pacesetter in the lane to win going away. "He's like good French wine--he gets better with age," trainer Christophe Clement commented. "He went cruising all the way. He's been knocking on the door for three years." Jockey Rajiv Maragh added, "Throughout the whole race he was pretty much in striking position behind the eventual runner-up and never had a lot of ground to make up. He really got going around the eighth pole and was pulling away at the end. He's an old pro, and seems to handle any footing. HOW MIGHT EXCHANGE WAGERING AFFECT U.S. RACING?

First, Betfair Ltd.--which introduced the first successful betting exchange in 2000 and has more than 2.5 million subscribers--made its mark on North American racing by acquiring TVG, the largest advance deposit wagering platform in the U.S. Earlier this month, Betfair announced an initiative to expand its British-based business with North American tracks. The company negotiated a deal with the Scientific Games Corporation that now allows its customers to wager into the parimutuel pools of Belmont Park, Keeneland and Oak Tree, among others. In addition, an agreement was reached with four tracks--Del Mar, Charles Town, Penn National and Zia Park--whereby Betfair will offer exchange betting in return for a share of the revenue. Now comes the deal with Breeders' Cup.

This is a move in the right direction. Chris Scherf, executive vice president of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations, offered his insight into the issue.

"Betfair already had an active betting market on U.S. races, but the tracks and the horsemen received nothing," explained Scherf. "Now they're going to receive a portion of [the revenue]."

The initial economic impact, however, is likely to be limited.

"Betfair has very low commission [on exchange betting]," Scherf continued. "The commission rate on U.S. win, place and show wagering ranges from 15 to 19 percent. The commission rate on exchange wagering is usually 2 to 5 percent, and that is on winning bets only. [There is no commision on losing wagers]. By the standards of what we get on pari-mutuel takeout, it's a very small amount--but it's still more than zero."

Tracks will get a fraction of Betfair's 2-to-5 percent commission on exchange wagering, and horsemen will also get a piece of the pie, but it is expected to be no more than a sliver.

"Any racetrack that is dealing with Betfair is doing so in accordance with their agreement with their horsemen, and the horsemen are getting their normal percentage of the revenue," Scherf added. "But that's going to be a relatively small number."

The Betfair customers' contribution to North American pari-mutuel pools, where the takeout is on par with other simulcasting contracts, could also be minimal.

"Betfair, through exchange wagering, doesn't have a market for exotics," Scherf said. "That's really what they're able to offer people now who come to the Betfair site. [Betfair customers] can place win bets through exchange wagering, but now they can also, if they want, chase trifectas or superfectas or Pick 6s, through the pari-mutuel system.

"But most of their money is not going to be in our pools, because most of it's still going to be bet on the exchange wager."

Exchange wagering is not a new topic in North American racing circles.

"This came up in industry committees five or six years ago--what do you do about it?" Scherf said. "And the decision then was, generally, you wish it away. That there won't be exchange wagering--but that's not going to happen."

Betfair is now reaching out to American tracks, and the tracks are receptive to the deals. The revenue generated may not be significant, but there is potential for far greater profits.

"The thing that might have an enormous impact is if there is ever exchange wagering in the U.S.," Scherf said.

Currently, U.S. bettors are not allowed to place wagers with Betfair.

"Betfair have taken wagering on our races without any permission in the past, but they have been pretty good, from the industry's standpoint, in that they've also been very stringent about not allowing U.S. bettors to bet with Betfair," Scherf said. "Canadian bettors can, by law, although apparently they won't be allowed to on Breeders' Cup, which is a little bit of protectionism somehow for the pari-mutuel market in Canada."

If Betfair can open the exchange wagering market to U.S. customers, it could produce serious revenues.

"I think that exchange wagering has a lot of allure to American bettors," Scherf said. "And if you're going to be customer-centric, as an industry, you have to pay attention to your players. If they think it's desirable, it's something that has to be looked at. And, obviously, Betfair would love to tap the U.S. market of bettors.

"I would think there would be a better revenue stream from that, but that would all have to be negotiated," he added. "Exchange wagering is built on a different business model with a different commission rate. But it might produce a boost in business, a volume increase, that would make it all worthwhile."

But it's not something that will happen overnight.

"[Exchange wagering] has not specifically been addressed in legislation," Scherf remarked. "The question is--is it pari-mutuel or not, because the only legal wagering we have [on racing] in this country is pari-mutuel. You can make the argument that it is pari-mutuel, but it's a different breed of pari-mutuel, and how that would be received in every state is an open question at this time, I guess.

"I really don't know how it would be developed, but at some point, somewhere, it would have to be deemed pari-mutuel in nature, or laws would have to be changed to allow exchange wagering. One of those ways could possibly allow exchange wagering in this country."

That is not the only obstacle to offering exchange wagering in the U.S.

"That's the legislative or regulatory hurdle," Scherf said. "There's also the business hurdle of stepping off the cliff into a drastically different business model. Contracts would have to be negotiated between Betfair and the tracks and the horsemen.

"Don't underestimate the degree of difficulty of all that. We don't have a good history of dealing with new things, because we tend not to know where we're going, and nobody really wants to commit to anything semi-blindly."

Indy) and GI Belmont S. hero Jazil (Seeking the Gold), and he also hails from the family of champions El Gran Senor (Northern Dancer) and Xaar (GB) (Zafonic). Thewayyouare may have only raced overseas, but it wasn't a difficult decision for him to stand in Kentucky, according to Ryan. "With Kingmambo [getting on in years], you want to keep the bloodline going," Ryan explained. "His female side of the pedigree speaks for itself--there are a lot of very famous American horses. It's family that goes way back, and it never seems to go to sleep. It'd be hard to get a better pedigree--you might equal it, but you wouldn't get a better one."






