#### SOUTHWEST HOPEFULS WORK AT OAKLAWN

Six likely runners for Saturday's rescheduled GIII Southwest S. worked at Oaklawn Park yesterday, including Conveyance (Indian Charlie). The unbeaten GIII San Rafael S. winner covered four furlongs in :48.40 beneath Calvin Borel. He will be ridden by Martin Garcia this weekend. "I think it's been fine for Conveyance," trainer Bob Baffert told DRF of the Southwest being postponed. "It's probably been harder on [assistant trainer] Jimmy [Barnes]. He ran out of underwear the third day." Dublin (Afleet Alex), hero of last year's GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S., worked a bullet four furlongs in :48.20. Dryfly (Jump Start), last seen annexing Oaklawn's Smarty Jones S. Jan. 18, covered four furlongs in :48.60. Domonation (Maria's Mon), third in the San Rafael, posted a four-furlong move in :51.80. Graded-stakes placed Mission Impazible (Unbridled's Song) and multiple-stakes placed Kitty's Turn (Langfuhr) also turned in four-furlong breezes in :48.60 and:49, respectively.

Castleton Lyons's **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), last year's champion older male and champion male turf horse, will kick off his five-year-old campaign in Saturday's \$150,000 Tampa Bay S. on grass. 

Contested over 1900 meters for the first time this year, Michael de Kock sends a pair postward, including 2008 Horse of the Year in Mauritius Mr. Brock, who took his most recent start over course and trip Feb. 4. The South African trainer will also saddle the sole threeyear-old in the field, Mr Crazy Boy, who finished seventh in his seasonal debut over 1400 meters Feb. 4. "Mr Brock won well last time over course and distance and deserves this step up in class," said de Kock. "He has a bit to find in a tough race, while Mr Crazy Boy will relish the step up in trip, but it is a big ask on the ratings." Godolphin and Saeed bin Suroor are well armed in this event and are represented with a strong trio, including French listed winner and MGSP Allybar. "All three should run well; Allybar is obviously race fit and came out of that win in very good form," said bin Suroor of the four-year-old who scored last time out in a 2000-meter handicap Feb. 5. As for his other entries. bin Suroor added, "Jalil will be better for the outing, but is a horse we have always liked, while [MGSW] Calvados Blues is a new horse who has been training well." ## SONS, DAUGHTERS, FATHERS, FRIENDS, AND JACK WERK

Jack Werk, founder of Werk Thoroughbred Consultants, Inc., passed away in his sleep at 3:30 a.m. Sunday morning with his daughter, Kris Werk, watching over him. Friends Tom Gamel and Gary Mariani were asleep upstairs in other rooms at Jack's place. Gary called me in New York with the news about an hour later, with many hours to go before my flight was scheduled to depart JFK for San Jose. I was too late, and I had the rest of the day and a cross-country trip to remind me that I'd never see Jack again.

Actually, Jack--J-Dub to me--and I never saw each other that frequently because I lived in New York and he was in California, but we spoke often between actual visits, and our relationship as friends spanned 20-years plus, from the late 1980s to 2010. I last spoke to him several times--four or five calls--on the Friday before he died, when it was apparent that he didn't have much time left. And each time I spoke to him, I was struck by his dignity in the face of death, and by his enthusiasm that I'd be running his baby, WTC. "Sid, I'm so happy that you are going to be running the company," Jack told me. "We're gonna kick ass!" Then he said, without skipping a beat, "My only regret is that I'm not going to be around to see it."

He maintained his high spirits through each of the phone conversations, which spanned the day. On our last conversation Friday, with fatigue setting in, he said, referring to me as only he did by the initials of my first and middle name, "S.H., it's been a great day. Tom [Gamel] and Brenda [Gamel's girlfriend] are here, Kris [Werk] is here--she's my ace. We had a great day. And guess who's here?" Cont. p5

It was his son, Steve, with whom he'd been estranged for years. It meant a lot to Jack that Steve was there, and Jack knew it meant something to me to hear it. Years ago, in the late 1990s, when my oldest son was five and his brother was two, Jack made a comment to me that changed my life almost instantaneously. Noting that I was doing a lot of traveling and putting in late nights, he'd said, "You remind me a lot of me when I was young. Working, traveling, away from your family. It goes by pretty fast, and you're not around for your kids. You only get one chance. My son doesn't speak to me now, and I wish I could have changed it."

Days later, with Jack's comments resonating in my mind, I left *Daily Racing Form*, and I spent the next 12 years raising my two sons--both accomplished baseball players, musicians, and film buffs, now 16 and 13.

Jack frequently sent the guys gifts, ranging over the years from massive water machine guns to baseball stuff to art house foreign films. If you didn't know it, Jack had one of the greatest private film collections-including every issue from Criterion--and was especially a fan of foreign cinema.

During this time I did some significant consulting for Jack on the side, so we had business reasons to speak, but many conversations always came back to the boys, and I knew he got a vicarious thrill listening to the stories about them. "I envy you," he'd say.

I guess I hadn't realized how much my relationship with my two sons had affected Jack, until the end. "Hey, Sid, do me a favor," he said over the last month of his life. "Tell Kris the story of how you left *DRF* after what I said."

"You never told Kris all these years?" I asked. "How come?"

"Ahh, I don't know. I guess it wouldn't sound right," he'd said.

But his son did come to his bedside when it mattered, and that, along with the presence of his loving daughter, I'm sure, sent him away in peace. Take care, J-Dub. 


## OAKS DAY FUNDRAISING PARTNERSHIP


sale (video) and was knocked down to these connections for \$250,000. Odysseus debuted in a Halloween maiden at Aqueduct, finishing runner-up in a key event, was rested, and returned with a good-looking halflength graduation at Gulfstream Jan. 14 (video). That was an

on-pace effort, and trainer Tom Albertrani was looking for something a little bit different yesterday. "We wanted to get him some two-turn experience and try to give him an easy race where we could get him to settle and let him get into his own rhythm," he explained. 

# NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

## UNITED STATES SENATE DEVELOPMENT

The special election last month in Massachusetts to fill the U.S. Senate seat vacated by the death of Sen. Edward Kennedy proved to be historic. The winner, Republican State Senator Scott Brown, became the first Republican U.S. Senator from Massachusetts in more than 30 years.

How this result ultimately will affect the current Congress is to be determined. Brown's victory makes him the 41st Republican in the 100-member Senate, an important development for the <u>GOP</u>. Because the <u>Democratic Caucus</u> now contains 59 members and not 60, it has lost the ability to thwart a Republican filibuster.

A filibuster is a tactic followed by one party to delay or prevent action in a legislative assembly. The Obama Administration's health care legislation may suffer as a result of Sen. Brown's election now that Republicans can filibuster this legislation and other parts of the administration's agenda.


#### Horse Protection Bill Passed in Kentucky:

The Kentucky House Agriculture and Small Business Committee unanimously passed House Bill 398 yesterday to create the Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Board. The bill was sponsored by Rep. Tom McKee, a Democrat from Cynthiana. McKee chairs the aforementioned committee. "This bill will move the horse industry forward," said McKee, a Harrison County farmer. "We are concerned about the health and welfare of the house, and this bill helps address those concerns." The bill, which will now go before the entire Kentucky House of Representatives, is an initiative from a new organization, the Equine Health and Welfare Alliance (EHWA). "While Kentucky is recognized worldwide for its equine industry, many horses and other equids in the Commonwealth, particularly those outside of Thoroughbred racing circles, may be subject to inhumane treatment, and some horse-rescue operations in the state lack the standards of quality needed or lack sufficient oversight," said Georgetown-based veterinarian Doug Byars, a founding member of the EHWA. "This legislation will help protect the equine, who cannot take care of themselves, and help make Kentucky a leader in the nation in the area of care and welfare for all equine." The newly created Board will be responsible for:

The Kentucky Equine Health and Welfare Board will have responsibility for the following:

- Undertake research, conduct public hearings, and collect data to determine prevalent equine health and welfare issues;
- Strive to develop regional centers of care for unwanted, abused, neglected, or confiscated equines;
- Create a system of voluntary certification of equine rescue and retirement operations that meet industry-accepted standards for care of equines;
- Research and offer suggestions for statutory changes affecting equine health, welfare, abuse, and neglect issues;
- Assist veterinarians and others in maintaining the health and welfare of equines by identifying and referring to the appropriate authorities critical areas of need.
