she took the 2008 GI Apple Blossom H., and the second biggest--4 1/4 lengths--came as she posted the easiest kind of success as the 1-20 chalk in the 2010 edition of the event at Oaklawn yesterday. Jockey Mike Smith admitted the big mare was climbing a

bit as she tracked her three overmatched rivals from a position closer than her norm, but when he edged her to the outside to escape the kickback, the race was over. "When I moved her out, she took off on me," Smith said with a grin. "That's why she hit the front so soon. She ran dynamite--she was really on her game." The win was a fitting tribute to fellow perfectionist Personal Ensign, who died Thursday at age 26. Cont. p5

PERSONAL ENSIGN DIES

The Phipps family announced Friday that Personal Ensign (Private Account--Grecian Banner, by Hoist the

Flag), who capped her unbeaten career with a memorable dash to victory in the 1988 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff (video) before becoming a stellar producer, died Apr. 8 of natural causes at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. She was 26. The bay mare had been pensioned in 2006. "Personal Ensign was the Personal Ensign (1984-2010) first Breeders' Cup winner for my grandfather and for [trainer] Shug [McGaughey], and she was

just a very special horse to everyone in our family," said Daisy Phipps Pulito. "After her racing career ended, she was a big part of our broodmare operation. It's a very sad day for all of us." McGaughey added, "She was a wonderful filly who overcame injury to win 13 straight races. She certainly was one of my all-time favorites. She was a career-maker." Cont. p4

Front-running **Super Saver** broke his maiden by seven lengths at Belmont Park in his second appearance last September, and came back to be fourth after setting the pace in the GI Champagne S. the following month. The homebred capped the campaign with a win in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., giving him a race over the Churchill Downs surface. He enters the Arkansas Derby off a third in the Mar. 13 GIII Tampa Bay Derby. His connections are confident he will handle the nine panels this afternoon--and the 10 he'll need to negotiate the first Saturday in May. "We think he'll handle it," Walden said. "He's bred on the same cross as [champion] Wait a While, and she liked to run a mile and a quarter. Distance shouldn't be a problem."


His sire Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) was a disappointing sixth as the odds-on chalk in the GIII Rebel S.

in 2005, but followed up with an eight-length romp in the Arkansas Derby. Can **Dublin** follow in the exalted hoofsteps of his two-time Classic winning Dad? The winner of the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. at Saratoga last summer, he was off the board in his last two outings of 2009, but came back to be second in the Feb. 20 GIII Southwest S. The chest-

nut was third behind champion Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) and fellow Arkansas Derby candidate **Noble's Promise** (Cuvee) in the GII Rebel S. Mar. 13. He looks to give D. Wayne Lukas his first win in the race since the Hall of Famer took back-to-back runnings with Althea and Tank's Prospect in 1984-85.

Odysseus was tabbed a TDN Rising Star" after a 15-length laugher in an optional claimer at Tampa Bay Feb. 17, and got up in the last jump to take

the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. Asked why he opted to try the colt on the Keeneland Poly, rather than staying on conventional dirt for the GI Arkansas Derby for his final Kentucky Derby prep, trainer Tom Albertrani explained, "There was always some concern about the way he came in from his last

race. He looked a little tired for a couple days, and right now we were thinking about putting the least amount of stress. We thought, looking at both races, the Bluegrass may have been coming up a little lighter and maybe he wouldn't have as stressful a race as he would if we went to Arkansas. So that was the route we took, knowing that the Polytrack could be a concern." Interactif made his synthetic bow in the Mar. 13 GII San Felipe S. on the Pro-Ride last time out and just missed, finishing second by a half-length to subsequent GI Santa Anita Derby hero Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}). Aikenite showed his affinity for the Keeneland surface in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity S. last October, where he came running late to be second behind Noble's Promise (Cuvee). The dark bay was a distant third behind Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway) in the Feb. 20 GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. last out.

A 12 3/4-length winner at first asking, Personal Ensign posted a narrow score in the GI Frizette S., but soon found herself on the sidelines with a hind-leg fracture. She returned from surgery in September of her sophomore season to post a pair of allowance tallies at Belmont, then, in an eight-day span, added the GII Rare Perfume S. and GI Beldame S. to her trophy case.

The full-sister to Grade I winner Personal Flag was freshened for a four-year-old campaign, which saw her notch the GI Shuvee H., GI Hempstead H. and GII Molly Pitcher H. against her peers before facing males in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. Only Gulch and King's Swan turned up for that event, but Personal Ensign kept her perfect record intact under regular rider Randy Romero. She faced off against GI Kentucky Derby heroine Winning Colors in the one-mile GI Maskette S. back at Belmont and edged the big grey by 3/4 of a length, then successfully defended her Beldame title.

Shipped to Churchill for the Breeders' Cup, she seemed uncomfortable over the sticky surface as Winning Colors rolled along on the front end through six furlongs in 1:12, but, shifted to the outside, summoned every ounce of class to get up by a nose.

That made her a perfect 13 for 13, and she became the first major horse since Colin to retire undefeated, with \$1,679,880 in earnings. Personal Ensign was honored with an Eclipse Award as the nation's top older mare, and was later inducted into the Hall of Fame in her first year of eligibility.

Her first foal, Miner's Mark (Mr. Prospector), captured the 1993 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. Her second was Our Emblem (Mr. Prospector), who placed in three Grade I events before eventually siring 2002 GI Ken-

tucky Derby winner War Emblem. Bred to fellow Phipps standout Easy Goer, Personal Ensign produced My Flag, who numbered the 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies among four top-level scores, and bankrolled \$1,557,057 before becoming the dam of champion and 2004 BC Juvenile Fillies heroine Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat). Personal Ensign was named Broodmare of the Year in 1996. She later produced GI Oaklawn H. victor Traditionally (Mr. Prospector) and the grade-stakes-placed Proud

and True (Mr. Prospector) and Salute (Unbridled), and she was pensioned after foaling a Forest Wildcat colt in 2006. She is also the third dam of Interactif (Broken Vow), who runs today in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S.

Personal Ensign has been buried at Claiborne's Marchmont Cemetary, along with Phipps colorbearers Easy Goer, Private Account, Numbered Account and Relaxing.

Just ask trainer John Shirreffs, who saddled champion Zenyatta to yet another tour de force triumph yesterday. "We were really proud to be bringing her to Hot Springs," Shirreffs said. "They treated us fabulously here." Bidding for a sixth straight Grade I success, Zenyatta, who trailed the leader by as many as 13 lengths in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, was just seven off it after an opening half in :48.19. Her stride lengthened noticeably when Mike Smith edged her outside approaching the final bend, and the dark bay was already in front at the top of the lane. Smith tapped her a time or two and then sat motionless, enjoying the ride. "She was thinking about turning [at midstretch], taking a bow and then continuing on," Smith jested. As for what's next, Dottie Ingordo Shirreffs, racing manager for Jerry and Ann Moss, told Daily Racing Form, "I have every condition book from around the country lined up on a desk at our house." 

of New York City Off-Track Betting met Friday afternoon, and voted unanimously to keep the doors open on the operation for at least one more week. NYC OTB filed for Chapter 9 bankruptcy in December, and have been awaiting action from the state legislature that would afford them some economic relief, including a deferment of the payments made to the racing industry. When the legislature failed to act by Mar. 26, NYC OTB sent out termination notices to all of its employees, and announced it would shut down at the end of business

on Sunday, Apr. 11. But, hopeful of good news from Albany this week, the board opted to extend the deadline for closure. Still, with just \$6.5 million in the bank at the end of last month, NYC OTB gave the legislature until no later than Sunday, Apr. 18, to work out a deal. "We have been told that there is good-faith, constructive dialogue going on between the executive branch and the legisla-

tive branch," said NYC OTB Chairman Sandy Frucher. "Ideas have been put on the table, and those ideas are being worked into language for legislation, and that legislation hopefully can be passed in the early part of the week. That being the case, it would be irresponsible for us to go forward with shutting the doors, because that is an act that can't be reversed." Frucher added that NYC OTB wants to work with the industry to ensure the success of racing in New York. "New York City OTB is not in conflict with the industry," he remarked. "We have been put into conflict because of a bill that stuctured us separate and apart from this industry at its inception, and set up a structure that is, in fact, designed, perhaps inadvertently, but nonetheless, to fragment." He continued, "We recognize that the business we run is essentially a conduit for resources to be provided to the industry, and...we want to work with every aspect of this industry to make it more efficient, more cohesive, more together and more constructive than it has been. We have to have one Tote, one internet telephone operation; we have to have coordinated marketing. It's time that people start working together, rather than casting aspersions." Frucher also unveiled a plan for NYC OTBs future that, "calls for, literally, a 50-percent downsizing and the shuttering of two-thirds of our centers and the replacement of that by technology. The future of this enterprise--and all enterprise like it--really rests in technology." NYC OTB also vowed to work with the unions to assist the workers affected by the downsizing. Frucher concluded, "I truly appreciate the fact that we will be getting a temporary lifeline, if we succeed next week, but it is temporary. It's not going to be a long-term solution, it's going to be an interim solution. God willing, we'll have a permanent solution during that interim period of time. This really requires surgery--and it also requires unity."

It's a far cry--not to mention a three-hour drive--from Riverside Downs, a former Quarter Horse facility across the Ohio from Ellis Park, to Lexington. She'll Heir boarded a van at 2:30 Friday morning for the cross-state journey, carrying the hopes of trainer William Dorminy and trainer John Hancock, who'd never before won a race at the boutique meeting. Hancock, who is based at Riverside Downs and runs most of his stock at Beulah, Hoosier and Turfway, had but one victory from 13 starters this season, a Jan. 8 score in a \$7,500 maiden claimer at the Florence oval. That would all change in the span of about 51 seconds Friday afternoon.

She'll Heir was being prepared by two-year-old consignor Ricky Leppala and had a date as hip.567 in the OBS April Sale in a little over a week. Dorminy and Hancock had some history with Leppala, having purchased a now three-year-old Vindication filly named Nurse Donna after she failed to meet her reserve at the OBS June sale last year. Leppala said She'll Heir and Nurse Donna were essentially body doubles, if not exactly commercially appealing.

"They are both small and light-boned fillies," he explained. "I really did like [She'll Heir] a lot. She had been

working great, was sound and had a lot of miles in her. Her pedigree and her conformation say speed, speed, and it was perfect timing for her to run early. She was a beautiful filly that looked like a rocket ship, but

wasn't going to sell very well."

The private transaction was completed in early March, and soon after, She'll Heir was breezing three-eighths of a mile at Hancock's base at Riverside Downs. She got her gate card Mar. 31 before tuning up with a half-mile breeze at Churchill Downs Apr. 5.

"A lot went right for us over the last three or four weeks," Hancock explained. "She'd been training really well and she's just a really nice filly."

The conditioner admitted that winning a race of this caliber at a storied track like Keeneland is overwhelming.

"It's tremendous, it really is," Hancock admitted. "I especially want to thank Mr. Dorminy. He gives me a lot of rein to do what I want to do with the horse and is a great guy to have. He's like a dad to me."

Connections were keen to press on for a possible appearance in the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. at Churchill in the week leading up to the Derby, but those plans just might be on hold.

"My phone has rung several times since the race, so we'll have to see what happens," he commented.

Hancock also confirms that he did put a little bit through the windows.

"I told anyone who would listen about this horse," he stated. "We're all small-time bettors, but yeah, we had a little bit of money on her."--Alan Carasso

NYRA Scrapping Belmont Overnight Stakes Program:

In an effort to keep overnight purses at the upcoming Belmont spring/summer meeting competitive with those that will be offered during the rich Monmouth meeting, officials at the New York Racing Association have announced that there will be no overnight stakes program at the Long Island oval. The money that will be saved-\$2.2 million-will be used to increase purses for open-company races. Unrestricted maiden and allowance races will see their purses increase by \$10,000 versus what they were at Aqueduct and will be \$7,000 above the comparable meet in 2009. Claiming purses will increase by \$5,000 and maiden claimers will rise by \$3,000 from Aqueduct levels. Purses for New Yorkbred races will fall by \$2,000 from current levels and represent a \$5,000 decrease from last spring. NYRA Racing Secretary P. J. Campo told Daily Racing Form that NYRA will assess the situation in mid-June before deciding on the overnight stakes program at Saratoga.
