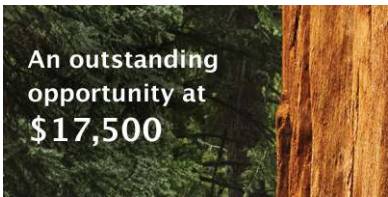

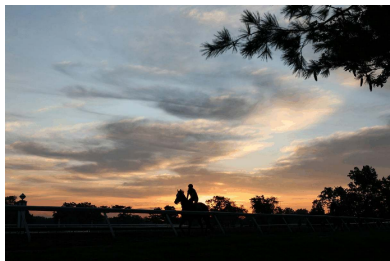

NEW DAY DAWNING ON JERSEY SHORE

At a press conference presented at Monmouth Park yesterday in advance of the Oceanport oval's \$1-million-a-day unveiling Saturday, the mood was

upbeat and the excitement palpable.

"This is a big deal," stated Assemblyman John Burzichelli. "This is a challenging time for the industry, both nationally and locally. We in New Jersey are very committed to making this a success. America loves horseracing, and we have

to get their attention back and make each horse race a big event."

Monmouth Park's 2010 season runs through Nov. 21, while the 50-day 'Elite Summer Meet' extends through to Labor Day, Sept. 6.

According to Monmouth Park Vice President of Racing and General Manager Bob Kulina, the idea for the 'Elite meeting' was conceived after the 2007 edition of the Breeders' Cup, hosted by Monmouth Park.

"We started working on this right after the Breeders' Cup and it's been a long two years," explained Kulina. "We are very fortunate. We have the best horsemen in America and they had the courage and the wisdom to go out there and try this. We have great expectations for this year. I hope the estimates for opening day are true."

Several of the Jersey Shore's biggest supporters were on hand yesterday afternoon to help launch the initiative,

including New Jersey-based trainer John Forbes, who also serves as president of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.

"This is a bold experiment," said Forbes. "And a lot of the credit goes to our former president and now chairman of the New Jersey racing commission, Dennis Drazin. Dennis and Bobby [Kulina] have worked tirelessly on this for two years."

"The number of stall applications this year has reached an all-time high," said Monmouth Racing Secretary Michael Dempsey. "Obviously, when you offer this type of money at a summertime resort, you draw interest from all parts of the country."

Other notables making their debuts at Monmouth are jockeys Garrett Gomez and Johnny Velazquez. "We're getting a lot of calls for the first few days of the meet," said Angel Cordero Jr., the Hall of Fame jockey who acts as agent for Velazquez. "We're planning on staying there for the season. We can't wait until Monmouth opens; it's going to be a very exciting time."

N.Y. GOVERNOR OUTLINES NYRA BAILOUT

New York Governor David Paterson offered his assurance yesterday that his office would not allow the financially-strapped New York Racing Association to close down after the June 5 GI Belmont S., reports *Daily Racing Form*.

"We have a plan to loan NYRA, in the short term, money to get through Saratoga, and we're looking on a long-term plan to help beyond that," Paterson said. "I think they'll pass it," said Paterson of the new bailout plan. Earlier this week, NYRA President Charles Hayward indicated that NYRA would not be able to see out the remainder of the Belmont meeting without assistance. During a press conference Tuesday, Paterson stated that he expected the legislature to approve a \$17-million loan to run the association, but didn't offer any specifics. Many of NYRA's woes are stemming from the bankruptcy filing of the NYC Off-Track Betting Corporation, which owes NYRA \$17 million, and the inability of the state to select a casino operator for Aqueduct. NYRA has been operating under a budget that includes funding from the Aqueduct racino, which is not expected to open its doors until at least 2011.

Lady on Target for Classic Test...

Trainer Paul Deegan was yesterday looking forward to saddling a first Classic contender in **Lady Springbank (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) in Sunday's G1 Etihad Airways Irish 1000 Guineas. Mark Gittins' G3 C L Weld Park S. and G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. winner featured among the 20 fillies remaining in the mile Curragh Classic at yesterday's five-day stage. Deegan told *PA Sport*, "Lady Springbank is in great form, it's a tough race, but I'm looking forward to having my first Group 1/Classic runner on Sunday. Jim Crowley will ride her for owner Mark Gittins. Clifton Lodge Stables already has a record of a Guineas winner, with Frances Crowley training Saoire (Ire) out of the yard, so the pressure is on."

Two fillies were added at the supplementary stage, with Godolphin's G3 Prix de la Grotte winner **Anna Salai (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and the G3 Athasi S. winner **Lolly for Dolly (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) set to represent

Mahmood Al Zarooni and Tommy Stack. Jackie Bolger and Harry Dobson's G1 1000 Guineas third **Gile Na Greine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and Jorge Vasicek's G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner and **"TDN Rising Star"** **Termagant (Ire)** (Powerscourt {GB}) boost the home team, along with a five-strong Ballydoyle representation that includes the Moyglare runner-up **Lillie Langtry (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}). In the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup on the same card, Godolphin's G1 Prix Ganay winner **Cutlass Bay (UAE)** (Halling) will take his place in the line-up after being supplemented yesterday.

GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf at Oak Tree Nov. 6, the classy five-year-old mare was sent to Rood and Riddle in Lexington, Kentucky, after refusing to train at Churchill in early May. She posted five workouts at Oaklawn Park earlier this year, including a bullet five-furlong move in :59 3/5 Apr. 7. "We've got to give her a little time," Holthus revealed.

"She's going to Mr. Lakin's farm. As soon as she gets better, hopefully, we can get her ready for the Breeders' Cup. We hope to have her back in training by no later than the first of July." According to Holthus, the MGISW will be aimed at a title defense in Belmont's GI Flower Bowl Invitational S., which is typically run in early October. Pure Clan's record stands at 16-8-4-3; she has amassed \$1,987,498 in earnings.

'One' to Watch for Second Half of Season...

Gary and Mary West's unbeaten sophomore **Tiz the One** (Tiznow), last seen extending his record to two-for-two in a one-mile Gulfstream allowance test Mar. 14 ([video](#)), has been sidelined with an ankle issue, according to trainer Chad Brown. "He's

turned out at Dell Ridge Farm," Brown told *TDN* yesterday. "He had a little problem with a hind ankle, and just needed a break. He needs two-to-three months--he's probably going to come back to me some time in July." The \$375,000 KEESEP graduate earned a 101 Beyer Speed Figure while clearing his first condition over next out allowance winner Allez Reef (Indian Ocean) in wire-to-wire fashion. "He's a *really* nice horse with a lot of

potential," Brown continued. "We're pretty high on him. Although he had a set back, he didn't require any surgery. He has such a big career ahead of him. We were really disappointed that we missed all the big three-year-old races with him." In his only other career start, Tiz the One shot through an opening along the inside at the top of the stretch to impressively annex his six-furlong Gulfstream debut by 2 3/4 lengths Feb. 13 ([video](#)). The son of SW & GSP Abundantly Blessed (Phone Trick) was bred in Kentucky by Tommy Ligon.

Oxx Realistic about Keredari Challenge...

John Oxx yesterday confirmed His Highness the Aga Khan's **Keredari (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) on course for Saturday's G1 Abu Dhabi Irish 2000 Guineas, but he was not getting carried away. Third in the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October, the homebred returned to win the seven-furlong Listed Loughbrown S. by four lengths at the Kildare venue Apr. 11, and his trainer was far from bullish yesterday. "Keredari is an intended runner at this stage," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "He's a nice horse, but strictly on the ratings, he has a fair bit to find." The Classic remains in a state of flux currently, with the ante-post favorite and **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Steinbeck (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) not yet confirmed a definite runner by Aidan O'Brien. "We will wait a few days before deciding if he will run on Saturday," the Ballydoyle conditioner told the *Racing Post*. "He is only a possible runner at this stage."

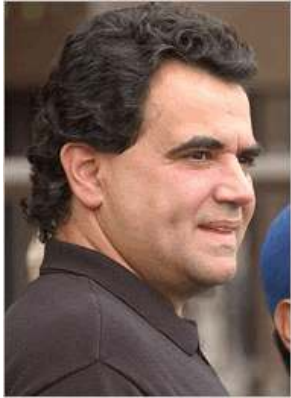

PARAGALLO GUILTY ON 33 COUNTS OF CRUELTY; GETS TWO YEARS IN JAIL Thoroughbred owner Ernie Paragallo was convicted on 33 counts of animal cruelty and sentenced to two years in jail in Greene County, New York, Tuesday. The sentence was the maximum allowable under New York law. Paragallo was also ordered to pay restitution of \$1,000 for each of the 33 counts. "Our office is very pleased that Judge (George) Pulver (Jr.) recognized the seriousness of these offenses and agreed with us that the defendant should receive the maximum sentence permissible by law," said Terry Wilhelm, the Greene County District Attorney. Said Ron Perez, the President and Investigator for the Columbia-Greene County S.P.C.A., "I think that this was a very just sentence. I think that the Greene County district attorney's office and D.A. Terry Wilhelm did a brilliant job prosecuting this. I think this is an appropriate punishment for this guy. This sentence, which is one of the highest that has ever been handed down in the state, will have a ripple effect which will go from coast to coast in ensuring that these horses get appropriate care." *Cont. p6*

Ron Perez led the effort to care for and rehome the 177 horses who were seized on Paragallo's Center Brook Farm in Climax, New York, after they were found to be seriously malnourished during an April, 2009 raid.

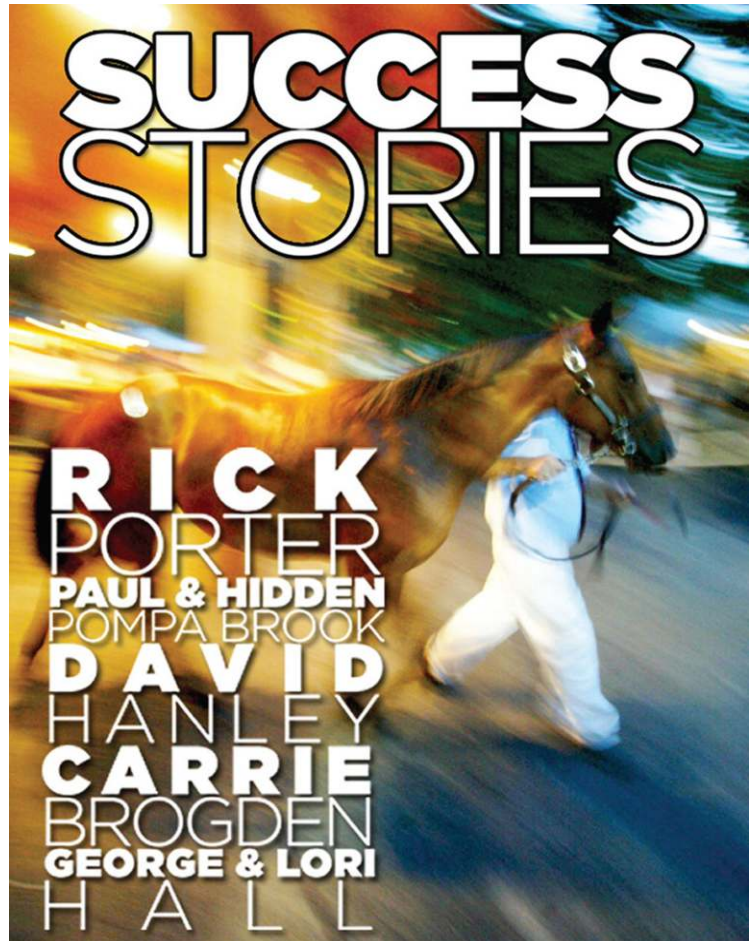

Wilhelm said that Paragallo was also ordered to pay additional restitution in a yet-to-be determined amount to the Columbia-Greene S.P.C.A. and another non-profit organization which bore some of the burden for caring for the horses. Wilhelm said that Paragallo was ordered to serve one year in jail for each of the 33 counts, to be served consecutively, but that the maximum allowed for multiple misdemeanor convictions was two years. Said Wilhelm, "He was handcuffed, removed from the

courtroom and placed in jail."

Shortly after the sentencing, New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman John D. Sabini announced that the Board had initiated administrative action to prevent Paragallo from ever returning to racing, adding that they may impose civil fines in connection with the cruelty convictions. According to legal papers prepared by the Board staff, Paragallo has been directed to show cause as to why the Board should not bar him from New York racing, and from attending racetracks, and fine him up to \$5,000 for each of the 33 criminal convictions. "The proper care and welfare of the equine athletes running on New York tracks is a top priority for this Board, and the vast majority of Thoroughbred and Standardbred owners and trainers in New York share this same objective," Sabini said. "The fact that Mr. Paragallo neglected his responsibilities to his horses under the criminal law has been decided during the recent trial culminating with his conviction in Greene County Court. Our action today will initiate a hearing into whether he violated his responsibility as a Board licensee to racing and the welfare of horses and, if so, what may be the appropriate administrative penalties." Paragallo has also been directed to show cause why he should not be assessed with additional fines for knowingly racing horses whose owners were not all properly licensed and for concealing his role as an actual owner of numerous horses that participated in races in New York. A press release from the NYSRWB read, "The charges allege 1,584 races were conducted that included horses whose owners were unlicensed or concealed. Paragallo could face additional fines for these alleged violations if it is determined that he ran the horses in the names of unlicensed or sham owners."

WHO GOT LUCKY?

Almost nobody begrudged Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) finally getting a clean trip and winning last Saturday's GI Preakness; he deserved it. He's been the most consistent member of this crop from the word go, and he's another great advertisement for his sire. Who knows, had he had a clean trip in the GI Kentucky Derby, he might even be a contender right now to win the Triple Crown. He's an admirable colt with an excellent record. But....

The 'but' is that his winning Beyer figure of 102, coupled with the proximity of the first four, clustered within two lengths, confirms two things: that those North American three-year-olds left standing are going to have to improve markedly to hold their own against older horses later on; and that the now-retired Eskendereya stood head and shoulders above the survivors. The case for the latter assertion is based on Preakness third Jackson Bend, by Carson City's formerly obscure son Hear No Evil being beaten under a length by Lookin at Lucky; he was blown out by an average of nine lengths when twice running second to Eskendereya earlier this year; in the GII Fountain of Youth S. and the GI Wood Memorial. Preakness fourth Yawanna Twist, by Yonaguska (now standing in Turkey, but also sire of last year's Preakness third, Musket Man) had run Beyers of 96 and 94, respectively, when second to Awesome Act in the GIII Gotham S., and to American Lion in the GIII Illinois Derby. Though Jackson Bend and Yawanna Twist improved to the 99-101 range, along with pacesetter and second-place finisher First Dude (Stephen Got Even), the overall profile of this crop of North American three-year-olds is not so impressive.

France's two one-mile Classics on Sunday, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains for colts and the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches for fillies both yielded interesting results with a twist. The first three in the colts' race were all from their sires' first crops: winner Lope de Vega, by Shamardal (and, interestingly, inbred 3x3 to Machiavellian through Shamardal's dam and Vettori, an untypical son of Machiavellian); second Dick Turpin, previously runner-up in the G1 English 2000 Guineas and a great flagbearer for his formerly obscure sire, Arakan; and third-placed Shamalgan, a Czech-trained, Kazakh-owned son of Footstepsinthesand--who could get a further boost this weekend if the highly touted Steinbeck can overcome hold-ups, several stablemates, and English 2000 Guineas third Canford Cliffs (Tagula) and fourth Xtension (Xaar) in Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. No Dubawis last week! ...*Cont. p8*

In the fillies' race, the 'Pouliches', the margins for the first six across the line were a head, a neck, a head, a head, and a neck. The winner, Liliside, by Bering's son American Post, was disqualified to sixth for creating a gap where one didn't exist and setting off a chain reaction which hampered at least three other fillies. So, miraculously, G1 English 1000 Guineas winner Special Duty (Hennessy), got a second Guineas in the Stewards' room--a million to one shot, somebody calculated. Baine, from the first crop of a well-bred son of Danzig called Country Reel, was promoted to second, with Joanna (High Chaparral), who had upset Special Duty in their Guineas prep, the G3 Prix Imprudence, promoted to third. Rosanara (Sinndar), last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner, was promoted to fourth, and Lady of the Desert (Rahy), winner of last season's G2 Lowther S., was promoted to fifth. They're a pretty competitive bunch, and the 'Pouliches' received a *Racing Post Rating (RPR)* of 115, up from 111 for Special Duty in the G1 English 1000 Guineas. Lope de Vega received an RPR 121 in the 'Poulains', as Dick Turpin repeated his 120 from Newmarket, behind Makfi (Dubawi), who won the English 2000 Guineas with an RPR of 123.

Lope de Vega's win catapulted his sire Shamardal into a clear second behind Dubawi in 2010 progeny earnings among European second-crop sires (F2007, first crop are three-year-olds). Dubawi, as you can see from the other table, is actually the leading sire in Europe in 2010 progeny earnings. But Shamardal--like Dubawi a Darley stallion--is now a clear second among European F2007 sires in 2010 progeny earnings. Footstepsinthesand, Country Reel and Arakan all had runners place in the two French Guineas races, and are now third, fourth, and fifth in this group. Also over £200,000 in 2010 progeny earnings are Whipper, Oratorio and Azamour, who has now had six different horses from his first crop run RPR's of 98+ at 10 furlongs or more in the last six weeks. He's nominally Northern Dancer-line, being by Night Shift; but his dam was by Roberto's son Lear Fan. He looks like a Roberto/Hail to Reason type, he won Group 1 races from a mile to 12 furlongs, and, so, far, his sire record reads like a Roberto--and maybe like one of those good Robertos--Lear Fan, Silver Hawk, Red Ransom (speedier), and Dynaformer.

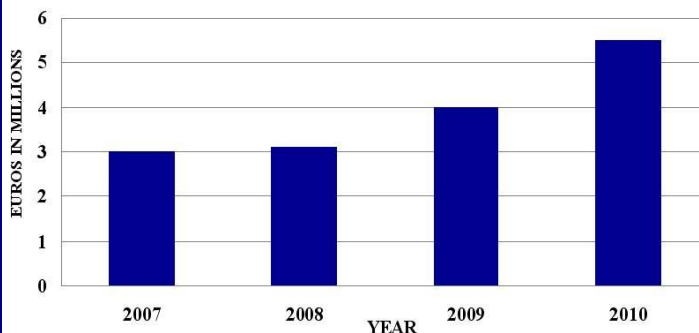
Weekly Sales Ticker

"Well, will you look at this: two sales, both showing significant improvement from 2009; maybe we're not bumping along quite on the floor any more. Arqana, particularly fueled by Irish consignors (who made up two-thirds of the catalogue) continues to go from strength to strength - gross up 37 percent from last year, and up over 80 percent from 2007. And look at Fasig's Mid-Atlantic sale: eight percent more sold than last year even though 19 percent fewer catalogued; gross up 24 percent, with 87.5 percent through the ring and over 67 percent of the catalogue sold. Actual good news for once!"

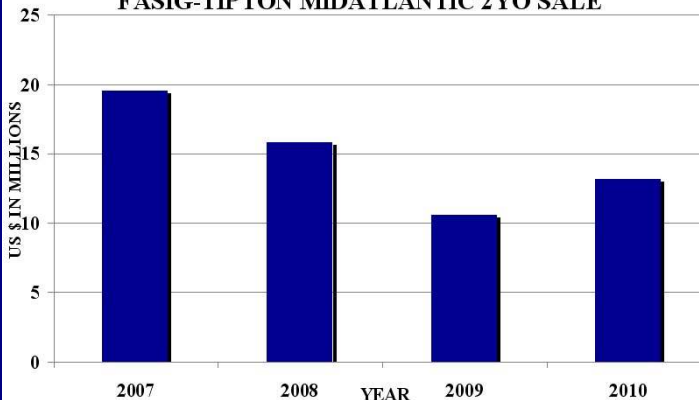

Judd-Gernaut...

Special Duty may have got lucky, but her inherited Classic wins are just the tip of the iceberg for Saudi Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms this year. Already in 2010, through Sunday, Juddmonte has had 33 individual runners compete in black-type races. Juddmonte runners have competed in 53 black-type events, winning 14 (26 percent), and placing in another 17. They have already had 11 individual black-type winners--33 percent of starters, with another 12 black-type placed, making 23 horses which had won or placed in black-type races from 33 starters--70 percent. Of their 11 individual black-type winners in 2010, nine have won graded races. Every one a homebred, by the way.

The Juddmonte 2010 roll of honor is likely to be expanded in the next few weeks. A revived Henry Cecil has three possible Juddmonte runners for the June 4 G1 Epsom Oaks: Timepiece (Zamindar); G3 Musidora S. winner Aviate (Dansili); and last week's listed victress Principal Role (Empire Maker). Cecil also houses G3 Lingfield Derby Trial winner Bullet Train (Sadler's Wells) as a possible for the G1 Epsom Derby, as well as new G1 Ascot Gold Cup favorite Manifest (Rainbow Quest), who did a demolition job on the opposition in last week's G2 Yorkshire Cup; G1 Prince of Wales's S. (also Royal Ascot) contender Twice Over (Observatory); and Midday (Oasis Dream), heroine of last year's G1 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. Sir Michael Stoute has Derby contender Workforce (King's Best), second in last week's G2 Dante S., for Juddmonte, as well as the good four-year-old sprinter Main Aim (Oasis Dream), and the evergreen mile-and-a-half campaigner, Spanish Moon (El Prado {Ire}). Also in training in England are Showcasing (Oasis Dream), a leading candidate for three-year-old sprint honors trained by John Gosden; and Redwood (High Chaparral), trained by Barry Hills.

In France, besides Special Duty, with Criquette Head-Maarek, Prince Khalid's forces also include the Pascal Bary-trained Ice Blue (Dansili), winner of the G2 Prix Greffulhe and one of the leading contenders for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby); and Andre Fabre houses the 2010 G2 winner Byword (Peintre Celebre), and the highly promising Deluxe, no less than a half-sister to Dansili, etc., by Storm Cat. She is pointing for the G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

In Ireland, Dermot Weld's string for Prince Khalid includes Famous Name (Dansili), winner of seven Group 3 or listed races and placed in three Group 1's, including the 2008 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby). In the U.S., where the Juddmonte string is now with Bill Mott, following the death last year of Bobby Frankel, their flagbearer is Proviso (Dansili), who beat colts in the G1 Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita this spring. This team has always been good, but they could just be poised for their best year ever--and that's saying something.

You saw Dansili's name a few times in that review, and he is sure having just about his best year yet; as the accompanying table of 2010 leading sires in Europe shows, Juddmonte sires Oasis Dream and Dansili are currently two-three on the list, behind (who else?) Dubawi. Dansili actually has nine black-type winners so far this year, eight in Europe and Group 1 winner Proviso in the States. He had, I believe, six group winners in three weeks from the end of April; besides Aviate, Ice Blue, and Famous Name for Juddmonte, he also had Harbinger (two Group 3 wins), G3 Dahlia S. winner Strawberrydaiquiri; and G3 Sagaro S. winner Illustrious Blue. Not bad for a horse who was unlucky not to win a Group 1, but still went into the books as a Group 2 winner, just as Distorted Humor and Pulpit were when they went to stud. Guess not winning a Group 1 doesn't totally rule out becoming a successful sire!

Just behind the current European top three of Dubawi, Oasis Dream, and Dansili are the Coolmore trio of Montjeu, Galileo, and Rock of Gibraltar; the three have just seven black-type winners so far this year among them, but another 24 black-type placed runners. It's still very early in the season--two-year-old king Danehill Dancer, for example, has just one 2010 European black-type winner, but he has 11 black-type placed horses. So there's no reason to go out on too many limbs, but one thing we can say for sure: Dubawi couldn't be off to a better start, and the Juddmonte duo of Oasis Dream and Dansili are both having very good years. Dansili's three-year-olds were sired when he was still standing for £12,500, too; the promising Aidan O'Brien-trained two-year-old Zoffany (two-for-two and no doubt on his way to Royal Ascot) is from his first crop sired (£30,000) at a fee higher than £12,500.

RON CHARLES RESIGNS AT SANTA ANITA Ron Charles, president and chief executive officer of the Los Angeles Turf Club, which operates Santa Anita Park in

Arcadia, California, has tendered his resignation from the track, effective with the end of business Wednesday, May 19. Charles, who joined parent company Magna Entertainment Corp. in November 2004, reportedly met with Magna Chairman Frank Stronach this past Sunday in a meeting in Toronto to advise him of his decision. "It's something I've been thinking a little bit about for a while," Charles commented. "It just seemed like it was the right time to make a change. I waited until after the meet and after the bankruptcy closed, and it just seemed like the right time." A longtime fan of Thoroughbred racing and, for 25 years a horse owner, Charles was a founding member of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, before leaving that organization to become the executive director of California operations at Santa Anita and Golden Gate Fields for Stronach's Magna Entertainment Corporation. He became the director of the Los Angeles Turf Club in 2007 and a year later was named its CEO. Charles plans on taking it easy for a while, but foresees a return to the game. "It becomes a seven-day-a-week job here, and I am really looking forward to taking some time off," he said. "I'm sure at some point I'll get back in racing. We're struggling right now and I'm sure at some point I'll get back."

SNOW CHIEF DIES Snow Chief (Reflected Glory--Miss Snowflake, by Snow Sporting), the 1986 GI Preakness S. winner and that year's champion three-

year-old colt, died Saturday at Eagle Oak Ranch in Paso Robles, California after suffering an apparent heart attack. In addition to his Preakness triumph, the 27-year-old stallion also won the 1985 GI Hollywood Futurity and GI Norfolk S., 1986 GI Florida Derby and GI Santa Anita Derby and the 1987 GI Charles Strub S. Trained by Mel Stute for owners Ben Rochelle and Carl Grinstead, Snow Chief went off favored in the 1986 GI Kentucky Derby, but tired to 11th as Bill Shoemaker and Charlie Whittingham captured the roses with Ferdinand. Connections gave the California-bred dark bay a shot at redemption two weeks later in the Preakness and Snow Chief responded with a resounding four-length victory in Baltimore. Retired to stud in 1987, Snow Chief sired graded stakes winner College Town, as well as stakes winners Mimi's Cafe, The Morris Monroe, Arp, Snow Blink, Booklore.
