Franny Freud Injured, Retired...

The likely favorite for Saturday's GI Test S. at Saratoga, Grade I winner Franny Freud (Freud--Frankly Fran, by (D'accord), has been retired because of injury, according to Daily Racing Form. Trainer John Terranova detected some filling in the three-year-old filly's ankle,

and an ultrasound performed Thursday morning revealed a torn ligament in her left front ankle. "We noticed some filling on the outside of her ankle," Terranova explained to DRF. "She never had anything wrong with her. But we decided there's no sense risking her. She's proven enough to everybody.

She doesn't need to prove any more. It's a dangerous injury to come back from." Owned by Paul Pompa Jr., Stephen Yarbrough and Winter Park Partners, Franny Freud won eight of 11 starts and banked \$686,029. She took her first graded stakes in the GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland Apr. 7, then, after two facile wins against Empire-breds, won the GI Prioress S. at Belmont July 4, defeating the GI Acorn S. winner Champagne d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro). Her defection leaves the Test a wideopen event. The second choice on the morning line at 7-2 is Pica Slew (Pico Central {Brz}), who is undefeated this season after winning the GIII Azalea S. at Calder by two lengths.

Dr. Bernie Dowd is attending veterinarian at Monmouth for the Bob Baffert-trained colt, who is in the care of longtime Baffert head traveling groom Roberto Luna. "He ran a temperature Tuesday morning," Dowd said, "and we're treating him for that. It's a pretty hot time of year. We Lookin at Lucky last week want to make sure he's totally stable and normal, and then he can travel. He's a very healthy horse. He's bright and alert. He's

doing well, and he's in good hands." Lookin at Lucky was treated with penicillin.

Adirondack Attracting Plenty of Talent...

The field for the 6 1/2-furlong GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga is beginning to take shape. Starlight Partners' Position Limit (Bellamy Road), who romped by 6 3/4 lengths in the mud at Belmont July 14, is likely for the Todd Pletcher barn. "I thought that with the way she broke her maiden that she could handle stakes competition," said Pletcher. "She's a big, scopey filly, and she'll prefer the added distance." Gatewood Bell and Wesley Ward's Nina Fever (Borrego), who won by eight lengths at first asking before running last of five in the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. Apr. 30, has been working very well in the mornings. She recently posted a four-furlong drill in :46 4/5 over the main track Aug. 1. "Her debut race was great, because she really isn't bred to do that," said Ward, who trains the filly. "She sort of had a bad trip in the race at Churchill. She broke like a rocket, and [jockey] Robby Albarado sent her over to the rail after he saw that the favorite [Lou Brissie] didn't break well. But then [Lou Brissie] rushed up and kept us in a pocket." Ward said he wasn't set on running in the Adirondack, but "then she worked sensationally." Also probable for the Adirondack is Gold Mark Farm's Silvislip (Forestry). She won by 1 1/4 lengths in her first start, a 5 1/2-furlong maiden in the slop at Saratoga July 23. "She was always quick from the gate, and when I breezed her with other fillies," said her trainer, John Kimmel. "The track was sloppy that day, and that can help speed horses because they can avoid the kick back. But she doesn't need a sloppy racetrack to run well. With a little improvement, hopefully we'll be in position to be competitive."



Woodward On Tap for Convocation...

Centennial Farms' Convocation (Pulpit) will return to stakes company after a hard-fought allowance victory at Saratoga Wednesday. Trainer Jimmy Jerkens said the four-year-old is being pointed toward the GI Woodward S. at the Spa Sept. 4. Sent off the 3-10 pick dropping into a nine-furlong optional claimer Wednesday, Convocation outfought the pacesetting Glenwood Canyon (Silver Deputy) to the wire to win by a neck. He stopped the clock in 1:48.78 for the nine furlongs. "He's a little funny," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "He's not going to do more than what he has to. As soon as [the other horse] pulled up next to him, right up close to him, he surged again." Convocation, fourth in the GI Met Mile two back, was coming off a runner-up effort to Haynesfield (Speightstown) in the GII Suburban H. at Belmont July 3. He had been among those invited to tomorrow's \$750,000 GI Whitney, where he would have faced Haynesfield again, as well as the likes of Quality Road (Elusive Quality) and Blame (Arch). "We were toying with running in the Whitney, but it looks like the best he could have done is run the race of his life and finish third, and he's tired of that," Jerkens said. "That's what he had been doing the last couple of times. We hoped he'd get a race like this under his belt and get a little boost in his confidence, and then run him back in the Woodward."





PALERMO TO INSTALL TURF COURSE Palermo, one of the most prestigious racecourses in South America, is set to begin work on the installation of a turf course. Construction will begin this Monday, and hopes are that the course will be completed by April, 2010. Antonio Bullrich, president of the racing commission, offered some details of the new track. "It will cover what is right now the second [dirt] course of the racetrack, having in consequence a circumference of approximately 2200 meters," explained Bullrich. "The benefits will be great, for the trainers, horses and betting public." A meeting was held by officials last week to address any concerns the local horsemen might have. "We are not going to interfere in the most important thing, the training of the horses," said Bullrich. "We crossed the world to observe many turf courses, studied the logistics, the different species of grass, and the changing ideas on maintenance. We learned a lot."



When did you first get started with Southern Equine Stables? Mike [Moreno, owner] and I have been doing this since 1999.

How many horses do you currently have? Altogether we have about 200. In training I have 65 or so.

This is your first year coming to Saratoga full-time. What prompted that decision? The synthetic tracks in California are like kryptonite to a racehorse.

What do you think of 'The Spa' so far? I love the atmosphere and the weather is a lot better than Southern Louisiana. It's a lot cooler and I love that.

Favorite restaurant in Saratoga? The Wishing Well was pretty good, but I think The Ripe Tomato was my favorite so far.

Champagne d'Oro looks like a major contender in Saturday's GI Test. How has she been training? She's training like a boogie bear lost in the forest. As far as the race itself, there's a lot of speed. That horse from Calder (Pica Slew) is inside of her, so that's good. I think three or four horses can win, so it'll come down to who brings their best race.

SES bred the sale topper from this past week's Fasig-Tipton sale (Hip #102 - A.P. Indy--Maryfield, \$1.2m). What did you think of him? We also bred the sale topper at the July sale in Kentucky (Hip #159 - Medaglia d'Oro--Beright, \$450,000), so I'd say were doing a pretty good job. I thought [the A.P. Indy] would have brought \$3 million in a good economy.

Who was Maryfield bred back to? She has an outstanding Unbridled's Song that I think is better than the A.P. Indy colt, and she's currently in foal to Medaglia d'Oro.

Favorite horse you have ever trained? I'm most proud of what I did with Show Me the Stage. I took her 36,000 miles by trailer and ran her at 10 different tracks in six different states in 28 consecutive stakes races over three years. She beat the boys and won four graded stakes.

If you could change one thing about the sport what would it be? I wish I could wear shorts in the Saratoga paddock.

Favorite track? That's a no-brainer--Del Mar. Every racing fan should go there at least once in their life.

What track would you visit that you have never been to before? I've never been to Arlington, believe it or not. I've heard that it's beautiful. As far as the whole world, I would *love* to go to Dubai. And I think I'll get to go there soon with the types of horses I have now.

Favorite food? Cajun food - especially my brother's famous jambalaya. He won a gumbo cook-off against professional chefs and restaurants in Louisiana.

Trained by Anthony Dutrow, Robert Lake, and others, Bonnie's Poker was a hard-knocking claimer in the 1980s, starting 63 times with 11 wins--including three wins in 10 days at Aqueduct in 1986--and 19 other appearances on the boards. Her earnings totaled \$153,960. She made her real claim to racing fame, however, as the dam of the brilliant Derby and Preakness winner Silver Charm. "She had the biggest heart," said Robbie Davis, one of several jockeys to ride Bonnie's Poker during her four-year racing career. "She gave her best every time." In 2003, Bonnie's owners, Bill and Kristie Jakeman of the Florida-based Latitude 27 farm, opted to pension the aging broodmare after she suffered complications delivering a Fusaichi Pegasus colt. "Bonnie was doing very well until the last few weeks," said Old Friends founder and president, Michael Blowen. "Then she started to develop some problems with rear-end mobility." Added Blowen, "She was one of our big stars. She was proud and dignified until the very end."
