The runner-up in the GI Kentucky Derby, Ice Box bids to rebound after

finishing ninth in the GI Belmont S. and sixth in the GI Haskell Invitational S. Fly Down rallied to an impressive six-length success in the GII Dwyer S. in May and came running late to be second by 3/4 of a length in the Belmont. The 9-5 favorite in the Jim Dandy, he made up some ground in the lane, but wasn't threatening when he steadied in

MID UNVEILS \$5.5M PREAKNESS BONUS

Bull S. or GII Fountain of Youth S. AND

MI Developments yesterday announced that, beginning in 2011, it will introduce a bonus program for the GI Preakness S. that could be worth \$5.5 million to the winning connections. In order to qualify for the program, dubbed Preakness 5.5, a horse must win two designated races at one of MID's other tracks, and then capture the second leg of the Triple Crown. The qualifying races are as follows: the GIII Holy

the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park; the GII Bob Lewis S. or the GII San Felipe S. AND the GI Santa Anita Derby at Santa Anita; or the GIII El Camino Real S. at Golden Gate AND the Santa Anita Derby. The purse for the Florida Derby will be increased from \$750,000 to \$1 million. The program will award the winning owner \$5 million and the winning trainer \$500,000. In the event that the Preakness winner was not eligible for the bonus, but competed in one of the early qualifying races AND ran first, second or third in the Florida Derby or the Santa Anita Derby, the connections will earn the Xpress Bet .55 consolation prize that awards \$500,000 to the winning owner and \$50,000 to the winning trainer. The winning rider, if also aboard for a victory in a qualifying race, will receive the \$100,000 AmTote Jockey Bonus. In addition, a bonus program for fillies racing in the GII Black Eyed Susan S. will be announced by the Maryland Jockey Club Oct. 1.




PAC-10 CLASSIC

A wide-open field of 10 are slated to do battle in today's GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar. Defending champion Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid), a close seventh in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 27, enters off a pair of third-place finishes in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup H. July 10 and GIII Cougar II H. July 30. The Zabeel Racing colorbearer has posted a trio of bullets since, including a four-furlong move in :46 4/5 at Del Mar Aug. 23. "He's training well for it," trainer Bob Baffert told Daily Racing Form. "He likes the distance. A mile and a quarter is his deal." Seven-year-old Awesome Gem (Awesome Again) makes his fourth straight appearance in this rich event off the heels of a career high in the Hollywood Gold Cup. All four of Hold Me Back (Giant's Causeway)'s career wins have come over the allweather, including Woodbine's GIII Dominion Day H. last out July 1.



The chestnut placed third behind champion Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) over this track in last term's GII Best Pal S. and GI Del Mar Futurity. **Crown of Thorns** makes his first start since losing by a whisker in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 7. The lightly campaigned five-year-old has been training smartly for his return, working six furlongs in a bullet 1:11 at Del Mar Aug. 8. Canadian invader **El Brujo** was fourth behind Smiling Tiger in the Bing Crosby in his local debut. The blinkers come off for this.

The globe-trotting sprinter Scenic Blast returns to grass following a strong second-place finish in the GI Bing Crosby S. Aug. 1. The six-year-old gelding, second in his only other attempt at this distance in the 2007 G1 Age Caulfield Guineas in Australia, seeks his first victory since the 2009 G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot. California-bred Bruce's Dream steps up to the big leagues after winning five of his first six starts. The gray enters off a narrow success in the restricted California Dreamin' H. July 25. Enriched earned a gaudy 111 Beyer Speed Figure in an impressive allowance victory over the Hollywood turf May 22, and subsequently rolled a pair of three's in the GI Eddie Read S. July 24 and the GI San Diego H. over the Del Mar Polytrack seven days later.

the GII Woody Stephens S. at Belmont June 5 to go with earlier triumphs in the GII Swale S. and GII Hutcheson S. However, the burly chestnut was upended at 1-10 when he returned to his original Calder base for the GII Carry Back S. July 10 and got caught in the final strides. Discreetly Mine has secured morning-line favoritism here off two sharp victories in the GIII Jersey Shore S. at Monmouth July 4 and the GII Amsterdam S. over this strip

Aug. 2 (video). But the connections of D'Funnybone-who announced himself a year ago with a big win in the GII Saratoga Special S .-- are confident their charge can get back on top in the division. "I've got to figure we're as live as [Discreetly Mine] is," said trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. "I'm not afraid of running against him again. He's probably a better horse than when D' Funnybone beat him, but I would expect he would beat him again." Owner Paul Pompa Jr. added, "He was a big favorite at Calder and wasn't able to get it done. Maybe it was the weather, but since he's gotten up to Saratoga, he's really been on his toes." Hurricane Ike faces the starter for the first time since capturing the GIII Derby Trial S. in the slop at Churchill Apr. 24. Bulldogger, sidelined following an impressive maiden win on the Travers undercard last season, bounced back from another hiatus to land a local first-level allowance Aug. 14 (video). "He came out of his race really well," said trainer Bob Baffert. There's no secret to Bulldogger's tactics. "He's speed--he's one-dimensional," Baffert pointed out.

Third in this event over a muddy strip last year, champion Informed Decision will have her preferred fast track this time around. The grey was six-for-seven during her Eclipse Award-winning season, then opened 2010 with third-place finishes in the Apr. 8 GI Madison S. and May 1 GI Humana Distaff S. A head in front at the wire as the 1-5 chalk in the July 4 GIII Chicago H., she went gate to wire to take the July 27 Windward S. on the Presque Isle synthetic last time out. Phola, a half-length behind Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) when second in the GI Just a Game S. at Belmont Park June 5, was beaten just 1 1/4 lengths by that rival when sixth in the GI Diana S. July 31. The dark bay filly kicked off the year with three straight victories, including the May 1 GII Distaff Turf Mile S. at Churchill, and should have enough pace in front of her to maximize her late kick. Maram, a half-length from the win when fifth in the Diana, pressed the pace in that nine-panel test. She is three-for-four at the Ballston Spa distance, and two-for-three on the Saratoga spinach. Miss Keller took a Keeneland allowance in April before running third in the Distaff Turf Mile. Second in the GII Nassau S. June 5 at Woodbine, she comes off a one-length score in the one-mile De La Rose S. at the Spa Aug. 4.

CAL BETTING BILL STALLED According to Daily Racing Form, the bill that would increase the takeout on some exotic wagers in California and legalize exchange wagering in the state is currently stalled in committee. The California legislature is scheduled to adjourn Aug. 31, but the session could be extended, as the state budget has not yet been passed. There are factions from the racing industry on both sides of the legislation, with the horsemen, the California Horse Racing Board, Del Mar, Hollywood Park and Oak Tree Racing Association voicing their support. Santa Anita and Churchill Downs, both of which are owned by companies that operate advance-deposit wagering platforms, have issued statements in opposition to the exchange wagering component of the bill. DRF reported that the bill could be divided to allow a separate vote on exchange wagering and the takeout increase.

'EXCHANGE' RATES A CHANCE

A fight is brewing in California over AB2414, a bill currently before the state's legislature that would, among other things, bump up the percentage of takeout on certain exotic bets. More significantly, AB2414 could pave the way for a new type of wagering platform in the U.S.: exchange wagering. Made popular in Great Britain and Australia by operations like Betfair, exchange wagering is a system in which bettors can wager against each other on things like which horse will win--or even lose--a race (click here for a detailed description of betting exchanges).

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC), and California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) all support the bill. But the measure has its opponents, too. Magna Entertainment, which owns Santa Anita Park and Golden Gate Fields, as well as the advanced deposit wagering (ADW) service XpressBet, and Churchill Downs, Inc., which owns the ADW TwinSpires.com, have come out against it.

One company keeping a close eye on the proceedings is Betfair, which established a presence in the U.S. when it purchased TVG, the television network and ADW, in January of 2009 for \$50 million. Earlier this week, the *TDN's* Lucas Marquardt sat down to a phone interview with Stephen Burn, director of Horse Racing at Betfair and CEO of TVG, to talk about AB2414, funding purses through exchange wagering, and his personal feelings on racing.

AMERICAN GRADED STAKES COMMITTEE RULING

LAKE PLACID S.: In accord with American Graded Stakes
Committee policy, the Aug. 22, 2010, renewal of the Grade II Lake
Placid S., scheduled for the Saratoga turf course, but switched to the
main track, was automatically downgraded to Grade III status and was
conducted as a Grade III stakes race. The American Graded Stakes
Committee has reviewed the off-the-turf renewal and has determined
that the original Grade II status will NOT be reinstated for this renewal.

This bill has caused a good deal of controversy, including a strong denouncement by Magna and Churchill Downs.

I think it's important to keep in mind that this is a consensus bill, first and foremost. There's been a lot of

work put into it by an awful lot of people, starting a significant time ago. And there's really only one organization that has any kind of California base at all that is objecting to the bill as it currently stands, and that's Magna. The only other opponent that I'm aware of is Churchill Downs. Magna, throughout the process, have been involved in helping to draft the bill, and

have seen earlier versions of it and various amendments to it since probably April, I think, when they were first circulated. So it feels a little scurrilous and disingenuous to try and suggest something's being crafted at the last minute.

All the bill is, AB2414, is an enabler for a betting exchange to be brought into California at such a time when the racing establishment and the operator can come together and agree on the particulars. It doesn't matter if the legislature authorizes a betting exchange; nothing can happen if the CHRB isn't comfortable with the rules and regulations, without the owners agreeing to terms that suit them, without the track operators or fairs agreeing to terms. Lots of factions in the industry will have to come together subsequently on the commercial and regulatory model.

The thing is, if Magna doesn't want this at their tracks, they never have to have it. Not only do they have a full veto on their own tracks, but they could stop exchange betting in the state when their track is operating. There are a number of safeguards built in. Their main motivation is to secure their business model as much as possible. I don't blame them for it, and we certainly understand what they're doing--I just wish they were being honest about what they're doing. Churchill just paid a significant amount of money for YouBet, and they have TwinSpires, and that's the main competitor to TVG's ADW business. And obviously Magna has XpressBet.

Can you talk about Betfair's roll in helping put it together?

We've been working on what became AB2414 probably since February with the California racing establishment. We were invited to participate. I happened to be at a meeting in Sacramento in February; initially I went as an observer. But one of the people suggested a betting exchange might be a good idea. In fact, the first person to speak and propose a betting exchange in California was Ron Charles, who at the time was the president of Santa Anita and the representative of Magna on the ground. So the idea of a betting exchange didn't come from anyone at Betfair or TVG at that meeting in Sacramento, it came from Ron Charles, who was the first person to articulate it as an interesting idea.

It was just one of several ideas thrown out there. There were ideas about slots, or variants on slots or a casino game, that were always going to be non-starters because there were too many people that would object to that. Over the course of the spring and early summer, different factions of the racing industry talked about what they'd like to see happen.

I think it was primarily the CHRB and TOC that nurtured these through the various bits of the process. All through, the only involvement we had, really, was two-fold. We were approached two months ago or so and asked what our position would be if there's a price hike (increase in takeout on wagering)--if they were to put up exotics by two or three percent--what percentage would TVG be looking for for its ADW business. And I made it absolutely clear that if the motivation for putting up the price for consumers was to redirect that money to purses, that all of the money that was being leveraged from consumers should go directly to purses. I couldn't speak for the rest of the ADW businesses, but TVG wouldn't be looking to take any slice out of that action at all.

On the betting exchange side, it's something we've obviously worked on independently for a considerable amount of time within different states at different times. In this instance, we worked very closely with the racing establishment to try and craft something the industry could feel comfortable with and confident about.

One of the biggest concerns in the U.S. about exchange wagering is how tracks and horsemen will be compensated. How does it work in Britain, for instance?

In Britain, we're obliged to pay 10 percent of our revenues to British racing. That's by statute. It's not unique to Betfair--we pay the same as all the rest of the horse racing betting industry there. But we go a little further than all of the rest of the betting industry in the UK. We're the only major UK betting company that voluntarily pays its international revenues that are struck on bets on British horse racing back into the sport directly.

We also put money back into racing. We're the second biggest sponsor of the sport in Britain. The Totethe state-owned pari-mutuel business that has a monopoly and is obliged to put all their profits back into the sport--is the biggest sponsor of UK racing, and we're the next biggest sponsor. We sponsor things like the G1 King George V S. at Royal Ascot, and in a two-year period every single race track in Britain, because we have a grassroots commitment to racing. And we want to do the right thing by the sport.

We own a racing club and have a string of race horses that our customers get to have a stake in. We try to find imaginative and creative ways to boost the brand, but also to support racing.

We want to find the optimal pricing model that works for the sport, for the horse owners, ultimately the breeder, so that the right money goes back into purses or wherever it's required in order to help the sport prosper. Because without a healthy sport, we don't have a business. But also, crucially, we need to make sure something is competitively priced for the customer, the bettor. In the U.S., we're probably only talking about the win wagers. We're not talking about cannibalizing the Pick 6 pools or whatever. It's a model that works on the win, place and show markets. It's not very good going into other markets beyond that.

Perhaps from a lack of understanding, some here in the U.S. look at exchange wagering as something that could attract an undesirable element to the windows.

Betfair is particularly proud of its audit trail. We've been pioneers in the world on trying to shine a spotlight on nefarious activities in the horse racing industry, or indeed in any other sports betting industry. It is absolutely paramount to us that cheats aren't allowed to prosper, so we developed something called the Bet Monitor with British Racing, and we give access to the regulators to our trading when they have any concerns about betting patterns. There is a full and explicit audit trail, and that data can be shared with them.

Ironically, on the integrity side, it's the sort of thing I want to bring to more pari-mutuel wagering in the U.S. I have some concerns about the origin of money that is being put into tote pools. For instance, there's no audit trail right now. Anyone could effectively walk about to a track window with \$100,000 in cash, and no one is going to ask where that money came from. We take issues like fraud and money laundering incredibly seriously. We welcome regulation, because we think, ultimately, customers get a degree of comfort when that happens.

Parting thoughts?

Honestly, passionately, looking you in the eye over a telephone, I'm a horse bettor and an owner of very bad horses. I've kept them going for a very long time and they're absolutely hopeless, but I do it enthusiastically and I completely love it. And I don't ever want to be in a situation where I do things underhandedly with racing. I want to do something for the long-term good of the sport. This is not a silver bullet. It's not going to cure or kill or fix all the problems that we have in the U.S. and elsewhere, but it is potentially an exciting tool that I think is worth a shot. It might just galvanize people and give them the same buzz about racing that I get every time I go to the track by offering the kind of product and innovation that younger people seem to be attracted by. It was a real sense of excitement to it. and I think we have a proven track record in markets where we've operated, and not cannibalizing the "oldfashioned" betting products. The UK totes sitting alongside us have grown 54 percent since Betfair came along, and that was an ailing, dying business.

multiple fractures as well as a dislocated fetlock during a Keeneland workout in mid-July. Dr. Larry Bramlage performed the lengthy surgery on the gelding. "If I handed Karelian a script to follow from the beginning he could not have done better,"

Bramlage told the publication. "He responded well to treatment, regained the blood supply to his foot, and has progressed without complications. Though not totally out of the woods, his fetlock joint fusion is progressing well. His pastern support is holding up nicely, and he is getting more comfortable day by day." Bramlage continued, "Also importantly the [left front] foot shows no evidence of overload laminitis, which we always worry about. This is truly a humanitarian mission for his owners. He was good to them and they are just anxious to have him around to live out his days in his home paddock." Karelian won 10 of 22 starts and bankrolled \$788,675 for trainer Rusty Arnold.
