"We knew Helleborine was good after she won her first two races so well, and she has taken this next step in her stride," said trainer Criquette Head-Maarek. "She's a totally different filly than her full-sister African Rose as she settles better and stays better. All being well, she will now return in the [Oct. 3 G1] Prix Marcel Boussac [over this course and distance]." 

Unraced as a juvenile, Eastern Aria bounded through her sophomore campaign, claiming seven victories, including Saint-Cloud's Listed Prix Joubert, and closed last term with a fourth in the GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. She opened this semester with three off-the-board efforts before taking out the Listed Aphrodite S. at Newmarket July 17, and the G3 Lillie Langtry S., in course-record time, at Goodwood July 29. The bay lined up here off a fourth in the G2 Prix de Pomone at Deauville Aug. 14, and bagged a career top in battling fashion. Positioned in fourth until making smooth headway in the long straight to lead at the two pole, she was headed by Rumoush approaching the final eighth, but rallied gamely under a drive to deflate that rival, with G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up Meeznah staying on well to hit the board. "She's very tough and you know if something comes to challenge, you are going to find plenty when you're on a Mark Johnston [-trained] horse," said jockey Frankie Dettori. "She has kept her form all year and was a good winner today. They went plenty fast enough and I wanted to wait a bit longer rather than kicking on three [furlongs] out. She stayed on really well." Deirdre Johnston, wife of the victorious trainer, added, "She broke the track record at Goodwood over much the same trip, so we knew she stayed. She's unbelievably tough and she will not give in." Meeznah's trainer was far from downcast with the performance of his star distaffer. "We were a little bit short of room and the winner had first run on us," David Lanigan told PA Sport. "Meeznah's run another good race and we have a couple of engagements in France, but we will see how she is after this." WALTER HAEFNER - THE MOYGLARE LEGACY

A Word Apart (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) will carry the renowned red, black and white silks of Walter Haefner's Moyglare Stud in Saturday's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. at the Curragh. The Dermot Weld-trained colt,

a half-brother to the talented Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Ire}), bids to add yet another chapter to the Moyglare legacy. Profound Beauty (Ire) (Danehill) will also go to post, for the same connections, in the G1 Irish Field St. Leger later that day. Victory for either horse would be a fitting tribute to Haefner, who celebrates his 100th birthday on Sept. 13. A gifted entrepreneur and talented rider, Haefner

developed a passion for Thoroughbred breeding, and set about acquiring a boutique broodmare band in 1962. The Swiss-native purchased Moyglare Stud in Ireland with the aim of breeding commercially however, the decision was made in 1980 to race all homebreds. This shift in emphasis was no doubt encouraged by his long-serving trainer Dermot Weld, a keen advocate of international racing. "Walter Haefner was always a man of great vision, and he gave me the confidence and encouragement to travel horses like Moyglare-breds Go and Go (GB) [1990 GI Belmont S. winner by Be My Guest] and Additional Risk (Ire) [1991 Hong Kong Bowl winner by Ahonoora {GB}]. These horses traveled long distances by air before it became the norm, and their success was due in large part to Walter Haefner's influence," explained Weld. The audacious plan to send Go and Go across the Atlantic was revolutionary, and he remains the only European-trained horse to win an American Classic, Haefner has shunned the media spotlight and remained extremely humble, despite experiencing sustained success in both the racing and breeding spheres.

Although, Mr. Haefner officially handed over the reins of Moyglare to his daughter Eva-Maria Bucher Haefner in 2008, his passion has not abated and he continues to take pleasure from seeing his famous colors compete at the highest level. With the transition from father to daughter almost complete, the Moyglare legacy appears to be in safe hands.

Ladbrokes St Leger cont.

Ed Dunlop yesterday gave the green light for Cristina Patino's dual Oaks heroine Snow Fairy to take her place in the line-up for tomorrow's G1 St Leger. Unfavorable forecasts early in the week had prompted connections to cast doubt on the participation of the Epsom and Curragh Classic heroine, but, with the weather improving, it has been decided that she will take on the boys. "Following Monday's heavy rain, the weather has done a u-turn on Town Moor and things are looking much more favourable, though they are talking of a possible eight millimetres of rain on Friday night, so we will have to hope that they have got that wrong," Dunlop commented. With regular pilot Ryan Moore on Khalid Abdullah's longshot Total Command, Eddie Ahern will take over on the homebred who bids to become the first of her sex to win since User Friendly (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) in 1992. Oaks winners Ramruma (Diesis {GB}) and Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) have failed in the interim. "Snow Fairy is in great form, and, while it's disappointing that we can't have Ryan Moore, who has been claimed by Sir Michael Stoute for Total Command, Eddie Ahern is a more-than-able deputy," Dunlop added. "Eddie did the job for us on Native Khan in the Solario S. at Sandown, and let's hope we get lucky together again." Colm O'Donoghue will be on board Ballydoyle's main hope Midas Touch, as Johnny Murtagh is on duty at The Curragh, while Jamie Spencer resumes his partnership with the operation's Joshua Tree after they were third in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York last time Aug. 17. Britain's leader in the jockeys' championship Paul Hanagan has been booked to partner Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's June 18 G3 Queen's Vase runner-up Theology. Subsequently sixth in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood July 27, the Jeremy Noseda trainee needs to improve to feature here. "Paul Hanagan, who rode the Highclere Thoroughbred-owned colt at Goodwood, will remain at the helm," a statement on www.highclereracing.co.uk read. "Jeremy reports him in great shape, having worked really well this past week and is confident that he will be spot-on for the big day."





While the former was eighth in Ascot's G1 Sagaro S. when last seen Apr. 28, Godolphin's recruit Darley Sun has slipped in the rankings and comes here on the back of a disappointing 12th behind Dirar reverting to top handicap company in York's Ebor Aug. 18. Askar Tau's trainer Marcus Tregoning has been hard at work attempting to revitalise his charge. "He's got used to the visor, and he needs a bit more of a surprise, perhaps," Tregoning told PA Sport. "He's quirky, but a lot of the breed are. He's by Montjeu out of a German staying mare. He doesn't like soft ground, but possibly a lot of that could be he doesn't want things too difficult. This two-miletwo trip suits him best of all because it gives him a long time to get into the race." Electrolyser was third in the Sagaro and runner-up in the July 29 G2 Goodwood Cup before filling fourth spot behind the winner Opinion Poll and runner-up Samuel in the G2 Lonsdale Cup at York last time Aug. 18. Trainer Clive Cox said, "He has really done well this year and is a worthy Group 2 performer. He is still progressive and comparatively lightly raced and Opinion Poll has a penalty here."

He's joint-top rated on the figures with Zebedee and you'd have to have huge respect for him with what he's done this year." Meow, who was runner-up in the June 16 G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot, recorded a narrow verdict over Ladie's Choice in The Curragh's Listed Grangecon Stud S. last time Aug. 21 and trainer David Wachman expects improvement. "I think she needed the run the last day, Johnny [Murtagh] said she had a good blow a furlong out," Wachman told PA Sport. "She's very quick and we'll know where we stand after tomorrow. Time will tell if she stays further next year."

Do Not Go Gently...

The 2010 Keeneland September Sale will draw a curtain on one of the most successful commercial runs in yearling sales history. The great Storm Cat, sire of more million-dollar yearlings than any other stallion, finds the remaining two members of his diminutive three-horse final crop slated to go under the hammer during Book 1.


On opening night Sunday, John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigns hip 47, a full-brother to Marino Marini, runner-up in the G1 Phoenix S. in Ireland as a juvenile and second again in the GI Malibu S. in the U.S. at three. The Feb. 25-foaled colt, also a half to MGSP Quick Temper (A.P. Indy), is a son of the hard-knocking millionairess Halo America (Waquoit), whose wins included the GI Apple Blossom S. at Oaklawn.

"He's a unique horse," said Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale co-bred the bay along with Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds, Rancho San Miguel and NETP. "The mare was a Grade I winner, a wonderful racemare, and she's also been a wonderful producer. We bred, foaled and raced Marino Marini. He was a very good two-year-old over in Europe, and a very fast, Grade I-calibre horse in California. And this is his full-brother. It's the end of an era, the last Storm Cat colt out of a major racemare and major producer. It makes him special."

Monday's second session features hip 108 (walking video), a filly consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud. Bred by Earle Mack, the filly is a daughter of the New York stakes horse Western Princess (Gone West), and hails from a family that has shown an affinity for Storm Cat blood. Under the third dam is the sister-and-brother combo November Snow and Scatmandu, both by the former Overbrook stallion. The latter was a Grade III winner and sire, while the former pulled off the rare GI Test S./GI Alabama S. double.

"She's a nice filly," said Craig Bandoroff. "She's got good size and good leg, and a little bit of stretch for a Storm Cat. And she's correct--Storm Cats are not always that way. Her knees are good, and overall I think she's a nice, quality filly. As advertised, she's unique. Not only is Storm Cat a great sire, but he's also a top broodmare sire. I think she's attractive from both those perspectives."

Bandoroff talked about Mack's good fortune, owning one of the only three mares to get in foal to Storm Cat in the spring of 2008, the year in which he was pensioned from stud duty.



"We always talk about being unlucky in this business, but you can be lucky, too," he said. "She went to Storm Cat, had one cover, and in a year that there weren't many who did--got in foal. And here we are."

The third yearling from Storm Cat's final-crop triumvirate, a filly out of Richwoman, was offered at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga, but bought back for \$220,000.

While Storm Cat's rise to prominence has been well documented and his stats well known, the grandson and chief flagbearer of Northern Dancer, along with Danzig, still has the capacity to awe when certain figures are considered. According to Brisnet, for instance, there have been 457 yearlings by Storm Cat to sell at public auction (a figure that may not include some European sales in the 1990s and early 2000s). The gross of the group? A staggering \$318,349,351. That's good for a \$696,607 average. This, from a sire who had just one six-figure yearling from his first crop, the \$160,000 Keeneland graduate Blue Tiger, who would go on to become one of his sire's first stakes winners. Cont. p12

Eaton Fully Loaded at Keeneland...

The September sale just wouldn't be the same without the presence of consignor Eaton Sales, who once again is well represented at Keeneland. With just over

two dozen yearlings on offer over the course of the first two select sessions, Reiley McDonald, who operates Eaton with Archie St. George, is confident that this year's consignment offers a broad range of yearlings that should prove attractive to all levels of buyers.

"In terms of the big hitters, there are any one of 10 horses than can break \$500,000 and possibly kick on," said McDonald. "We are pretty solid as we go through each day

pretty much through to the end. So we have somebody in there for everybody."

Among those likely to headline the consignment is hip 46, a Distorted Humor half-brother to 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner and champion Halfbridled (Unbridled).

"He is just exceptional," confirmed McDonald. "He is, physically, as nice a colt as I think we have. He obviously has the pedigree, and I'd say if we have a breakout horse in the consignment, I think it's him."

Sure to keep buyers around through to the end of the second day of Book 1 is hip.207, a colt by leading sire A.P. Indy. Bred by Eaton Sales, the dark bay is out of Take Charge Lady (Dehere), winner of GI Ashland S. and GI Overbrook Spinster S. (twice), and over \$2 million in earnings on the track. A \$175,000 Fasig-Tipton July sale graduate, the 11-year-old mare was knocked down for \$4.2 million at Keeneland's November sale in 2004.

"He is a big, strapping colt who looks a lot like his mother, just from that standpoint," McDonald said of the youngster. "He is a very dominant yearling."

Also offered late in Monday's session is hip 205, a daughter of Pulpit. Purchased by Brushwood Stable for \$275,000 from the Overbrook dispersal at Keeneland last November, the bay is a half-sister to GIII Holy Bull S. winner Winslow Homer (Unbridled's Song), a ninelength winner in his most recent appearance in the Aug. 1 Curlin S. at Saratoga.

"She is quite pretty, and since she's by Pulpit, she's not as big as Winslow Homer, but she's quite nice," confirmed McDonald. "We were hoping Winslow Homer was going to go to the GI Travers S., but he was caught short because of injury. He was probably one of the most talented three-year-olds in the country this year." Also likely to appeal to U.S. buyers are a pair of fillies by the American-based sires Dynaformer and Street Sense, offered as hip 118 and hip 130.

The first through the ring is a daughter of multiple graded stakes winner Bank Audit (Wild Rush). The Apr. 29 foal was bred by Ian Banwell's St. George Farm.

"She is quite special physically," said McDonald. "She looks exactly like Dynaformers are supposed to look. There probably won't be very many more of them, and he is probably one of our more well-rounded sires around today."

Set to enter the arena soon afterward is Hip 130, a

filly by juvenile champion and GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), who is represented by his first crop of yearlings this year. The Jan. 30 foal is out of Cat's Fair (Sir Cat), already responsible for GI Santa Anita Oaks winner Crisp (El Corredor). The bay is from the family of MGSWs Whywhywhy (Mr. Greeley) and Spellbinder (Tale of the Cat).

"She is a big, tall, leggy filly that is very athletic," said McDonald. "She also is a half to a very talented horse in Crisp. She is in a bit of a growthy stage right now, which is kind of what I like to see when I'm buying horse, because

you can kind of see what they are going to become."

A Taste for the International...

Adding international flair to the consignment's select offerings is a trio of yearlings. Early in session 1, Eaton presents hip 15, a son of Mr. Greeley, out of the unraced mare Balistroika (Nijinsky II). The Feb. 16 foal is a half-sister to European champion three-year-old filly and G1 1000 Guineas heroine Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo); Group 2 winner Perfectperformance (Rahy); and GSP I've Gota Bad Liver (Mt. Livermore).

"Physically, this yearling is really quite special," said McDonald. "She certainly has the pedigree to match."

Also sure to attract some overseas interest on day two is hip 140, a chestnut filly by Giant's Causeway, out of the Unbridled's Song mare Diamond Necklace. The six-year-old mare is a daughter of Helsinki (GB) (Machiavellian)--herself a full-sister to Grade I/Group 1 winner Street Cry (Ire)--and a half-sister to champion and MG1SW Shamardal (Giant's Causeway). A \$1.15-million weanling purchase at Keeneland November in 2004, stakes-placed Diamond Necklace was purchased by a partnership of BBA Ireland & Dean Fleming's Tyreel Stud at that venue in 2008 for \$1.3 million.

"We sold A.P. Warrior for [\$1.3 million at KEESEP in 2004 on behalf of BBA Ireland], and they have been good clients for us for a long time," said McDonald. "[BBA Ire and Tyreel] stepped out when they bought Diamond Necklace, and they asked us to sell this filly. She has a marvelous pedigree, and is great for somebody who is in the market for a potential broodmare, that also has racing potential. In this case, the residual value is all over her, and then you're hoping to get some racing out of her." Cont. p14

"This is the kind of filly that anybody would want with that pedigree," McDonald added.

And according to McDonald, this September's Eaton consignment should stack up well with the current selection of yearlings.

WHY CALIFORNIA WILL GET AWAY WITH THIS CRIME


Horseplayers are stupid.

That's what they are counting on in California, where the California Horse Racing Board is about to push through an exorbitant increase in takeout. Starting Dec. 26, the take on trifectas, superfectas, Pick Threes and Pick Fours is going up to 23.68 percent (an increase of 3 percentage points). Exactas and daily doubles are going to go up to 22.68 percent (an increase of 2 percentage points), which will be the highest takeout rate on such bets among any major racing jurisdiction. Only the irrelevant racing states of Massachusetts, Colorado and Minnesota will have a higher take on the doubles and exactas.

The day after Christmas, they're going to start robbing you blind. And they're going to get away with it... because horseplayers, as a lot, are, indeed, stupid.

When there are so many better betting opportunities out there, why would any rational person continue to bet on California racing? Not only is it a product plagued by small fields, overwhelming favorites and a lot of unplayable races, but it's going to be one of the worst values in the game. The same exacta that would pay \$81.40 in New York and \$81 in New Jersey will pay just \$76.20 in California. That's a big bite to begin with and the type of thing that turns into a huge number over time.

The CHRB, track owners and horsemen should be quaking in fear that such an onerous takeout increase will destroy their business. After all, what other slumping business would dare try to improve the bottom line by increasing prices, especially when the competition gives its customers such a better deal?



One of the biggest problems racing faces is that the casinos, which have become the sport's biggest competition, offer their customers far lower takeouts on its many games of chances. Betting in a casino makes a lot more sense than betting at the track.

In a logical world, the house would be slashing takeout prices and coming up with all sorts of incentives to get the customers coming back through the doors. In a logical world, with such a hefty takeout increase, the customers would flee from the California product and bet only on the tracks that give them a better deal. Handle would then fall so precipitously that the California tracks would be forced out of business.

That's what should happen, but it won't. And they know it.

Very few horseplayers ever react to takeout increases, or decreases, for that matter. If history is any kind of guide at all, there will hardly be a single horse-player who will decide on Dec. 26 that because the takeout is so high in California they will boycott the first at Santa Anita and instead bet on the seventh at Aqueduct because their money will go a lot farther playing New York races. The vast majority of horseplayers won't change their betting habits one bit. Cont. p15




The result will be that whatever changes there are to the total betting handle in California will be marginal and this legalized robbery will go off without any serious penalties being inflicted on those committing the crime. California is raising the takeout in an effort to find more money for purses. They'll get just what they are looking for, because most horseplayers won't fight back.

That's why they keep doing this to us. They know they will get away with it. Even when racetrack operators or racing commissions have tried to do the right thing, the players haven't done their part. Keeneland and Laurel both tried dramatic takeout decreases in recent years, hoping that would spur bettors to bet more on their races. In both cases, it didn't happen and those tracks soon went back to the old takeout levels.

I have written hundreds of articles over the years blasting tracks that have raised their takeouts and predicting they will eventually pay for it with smaller total handles. I thought I was right. After all, when you continually take so much money out of the players' pockets, handle will fall. A broke customer is not a good customer.

The problem I overlooked is simulcasting. If players had only the California tracks as a betting option, the handle at those tracks would eventually decline and decline by a lot because so much betting money would eventually be taken out of circulation.

The problem is that most players are playing tracks all over the map. If they go home with \$20 less in their pockets at the end of the day because they were ripped off by the new California takeout rate, that probably means they'll be betting less on not just Santa Anita but on Aqueduct, Fair Grounds, Calder, Hawthorne and whatever other signals they might be playing. That limits the hit California takes.

Tracks just keep digging deeper into our pockets. Who's to say that a takeout increase to 30 percent won't be next in California? The only way to put a stop to these things is for the customers to rebel, for them to stop betting on the tracks that gouge them and support the ones that don't. But horseplayers have never looked out for their best interests and I don't hold out any hope that that will change.

Tired of getting fleeced at the track? You have no one but yourself to blame.

RCI Forms Regulatory Attorney Group:

Racing Commissioners International has formed a special committee of racing regulatory attorneys, and Susan Speckert of Lexington, Kentucky, is the new committee's first Chair. Speckert currently serves as General Counsel to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. "This committee will provide a forum where racing regulatory legal issues can be discussed among the various attorneys who support the work of the commissions," said RCI Chairman Dan Hartman. "In the coming months, we anticipate this committee will assist in creating a library of racing regulatory case decisions which would be available to commission legal staff." RCI is currently engaging with the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) to develop a uniform way in which treatment overages and drug violations are issued and ultimately communicated to the public. "There is a tremendous amount of misunderstanding that exists when a medication rule infraction is issued," said RCI President Ed Martin. "Many accidental treatment overages are perceived by the public as deliberate attempts to cheat. It's time we look at how these matters are handled to see if we can help the fans better understand that there is a major difference between a deliberate attempt to drug a horse for fraudulent gain, and an accidental treatment overage of a substance prescribed by a veterinarian for no other reason than to protect a horse's health." 
The Horse Farm Workers Education Assistance Fund Awards 32 Scholarships

The Horse Farm Workers Education Assistance Fund has awarded 32 scholarships for the 2010-2011 academic year to children of full-time workers on Central Kentucky Thoroughbred farms. Scholarships for tuition are granted for education after high school and are based upon need, merit, essays and personal interviews. To date, 416 annual scholarships (averaging nearly \$2,000 each) have been awarded since the Fund's inception in 1996. Two of the current recipients are Pollard Scholars at the University of Kentucky. (For a complete list of the scholarship recipients and the schools they're attending, click here.) Scholarships are also available for full-time horse farm workers who wish to take equine or training related courses to work more effectively with horses in their current farm jobs. Rob Whiteley, president of the Fund, said, "Year after year, hard-working, extraordinary young people continue to impress the board with their ability, accomplishments, and enthusiasm. They have internalized the work ethic of their parents and most of them help pay their way through school by working one or more jobs in addition to attending classes. Thus the goal of the Fund is to provide enough money to these deserving students so that their schoolwork can be their number one priority. In many instances our scholars are the first in their families to pursue a post-secondary education, and in some cases, they would not be able to attend without our financial assistance." Whiteley cited a number of organizations responsible for helping to fund the effort, including the Carl Pollard Foundation, the Crafty Prospector syndicate, the Kentucky Farm Managers' Club, Kentucky Owners and Breeders and KTA, Fasig-Tipton, Keeneland and individual donors, including William Marguard of Eaglestone Farm and William T. Young of Overbrook. "Horse Farm workers are the backbone of the Thoroughbred industry, and these scholars are a source of pride to their parents who have worked so hard in order for their children to enjoy a fulfilling and productive quality of life," said Whiteley. "Several graduates are distinguishing themselves in the industry, one having served as the director of racing at a major North American race track." INCREASES AT LEGER SALE

Doncaster's St. Leger Festival Sale showed the benefit of being cut to one session yesterday, with the end result being substantial increases on its two-day equivalent of 2009. After revealing an average of £10,644, which represented a 30-percent hike on its predecessor, and median of £8,000, which was up by a third, Doncaster Bloodstock Sales' Managing Director Henry Beeby was understandably pleased. "It is never easy for an auction house to take the decision to cut a sale in terms of numbers, as that inevitably means a lower turnover and that is what pays us," he commented. "However, we feel vindicated on this occasion as, although the turnover is down as predicted, contracting the sale to one good evening has resulted in a sale of relative strength. We feel this sale has a proper role to play and have been heartened by the depth of the trade over the three hours [of] selling, to the extent that we anticipate building on these results next year."

It was the last yearling into the ring who stole the headlines, with Wheelersland Stud's Royal Applause (GB) filly making the highest price at £65,000. Hip 96 is a half to numerous winners including former DBS graduate Kyllachy (GB), one of the best sprinters of recent times and now a successful sire. After seeing off Ed Sackville, David Armstong and Bobby O'Ryan, Peter Doyle prevailed for owners Chris and Julie Wood. Monsieur Bond (Ire) has enjoyed a furtive spell with his runners of late including the Group winners My Name Is Bond (Fr) and Gilt Edge Girl (GB), and Jamie Railton's colt by the 2004 G2 Duke of York S. winner was snapped up by his former trainer Bryan Smart.

Hip 19, whose dam is a sister to the dual Group winner Tropical Star (Ire) (Machiavellian) and who has already produced another Smart trainee in Weatherbys Super Sprint third-place getter Move In Time (GB), was sold for £44,000. Doncaster regular Bobby O'Ryan paid £32,000 for The National Stud's hip 68, a son of the 2007 G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas hero Cockney Rebel (Ire) from the extended family of Mr Brooks (GB) and First Trump (GB). 
