she earned \$7,304,580 on the track, with 13 Grade I victories. According to Daily Racing Form, plans are being finalized to parade Zenyatta at Hollywood Park Dec. 5. Breeding plans have not been finalized.

This year's European leading first-season sire Iffraaj (GB) (Zafonic) was prominent again during yesterday's middle session of the Goffs November Foal Sale, when his Airlie Stud-consigned colt topped proceedings when selling for €62,000. Hip 347's half-sister is the listed scorer Maid For Music (Ire) (Dubai Destination), whose immediate family features a host of Normandie Studbred black-type performers of which the latest to add luster is this year's listed-winning and Group 2-placed stayer King of Wands (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). David Murray-Smith was the name on the docket. He said, "He's going to be reoffered next year. He's a good colt from a decent family and by a stallion that's doing very well. MORE HEADLINES FOR SHAMARDAL Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) has enjoyed an excellent 2010, and that success continued at Goffs November Wednesday when his filly from the draft of Springwell Stud, offered on behalf of Michael O'Mahony, sold to Summerhill Bloodstock for €60,000. Hip 296 is a March-foaled half-sister to the 2008 Listed Hilary Needler Trophy winner Knavesmire (Ire) (One Cool Cat), out of a half to the talented sprinter Splice (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), later the dam of Cheveley Park Stud's starlet Soar (GB) (Danzero {Aus}). Shadwell's 2008 G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois hero Tamayuz (GB) has his first foals on the ground now and one to create a stir yesterday was hip 401 from Oak Lodge Stud. His half-brother is the 2006 G3 Gallinule S. runner-up Mon Michel (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Under the second dam is the champion and sire Legal Case (Ire) and the 2000 Epsom Oaks winner Love Divine (GB) (Diesis {GB}), responsible for Sixties Icon (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). He was knocked down to Pier House Stud for €57,000. That establishment's owner Ger Morrin explained, "He's a very good-looking horse and he's by a very good racehorse. It's a good family and he has a Galileo (Ire) two-year-old to run for him. He'll be coming back for resale." That price was later matched by Yeomanstown Stud for Harcourt Stud's hip 442, another son of Iffraaj whose dam is a half to the 2001 GIII Will Rogers S. dead-heater Media Mogul (GB) (First Trump {GB}). Yeomanstown stand the 2007 G1 Middle Park S. winner Dark Angel (Ire), who kicked off a recent trend for retiring high-class twoyear-olds, and his first runners appear in 2011. His Naas-based Stud gave notice that they are expecting a successful first season when paying €52,000 for hip 352, a colt consigned by Conna Stud from the extended family of the 2002 Epsom Oaks third Shadow Dancing (GB) (Unfuwain). Selling continues tomorrow at 11:30 a.m. Full results can be found on www.goffs.com.



READY TO RUN SALE Nov. 16-17, 2010

BEEFED UP CATALOGUE AT KARAKA


The biggest change from last year's Ready To Run Sale was the total of 494 entries in this year's catalogue, the largest since 2001, with 200 horses more than last year. "It's a strong catalogue, with the top horses getting good prices, and it has definitely been a buyers' sale this year, which has suited me," Chris McAnulty said. The leading buyer of the two-day sale was Queensland-based agent John Foote, with six purchases totaling NZ\$895,000. Foote was buying on behalf of a selection of Hong Kong and Australian clients, and his top bid was the NZ\$210,000 paid for lot 343, a gelding by My Halo out of the O'Reilly mare Just Polly. "The sale was very, very good for the right horses," said Foote. "A big factor in how horses sold was how they worked and how they looked. If they breezed well and then had the pedigree to match they sold very well." Commenting on the view of many buyers that statistics belied the overall strength of the market, he added, "There was nothing wrong with the market, there were a good number of buyers here, and the quality was definitely as good as previous years; there were just too many horses."

In the final analysis, 257 of the 494 catalogued lots were sold for an aggregate of NZ\$14,215,250, up 35 percent on last year's turnover of NZ\$10,511,000 for 175 sold. The final sale average was NZ\$55,312, down eight percent from NZ\$60,063 last year, with a median of NZ\$32,000 (down 20 percent on \$40,000 last year). The clearance rate improved to end the sale at 59 percent. NZB Co-Managing Director Petrea Vela said the company is satisfied with the results of the past two days. "There's been a recurring message from buyers that they're happy with the quality of young horses that they've had to choose from, and there's been some good competition," Vela said. "It seems that there just wasn't sufficient demand to absorb the quantity of horses we had to sell."

New Zealand buyers, who increased their presence from the first to the second day of selling, spent a total of NZ\$3,470,250 on 77 horses, with David Ellis, Graeme Rogerson, Peter Williams, Murray Baker and Kevin Myers among the local training stables most active. Additionally, the international buying bench was out in force at Karaka, with the majority of their juvenile aquisitions heading offshore. Neighboring Australia also had a big impact on the results, with buyers Lee Hope, Mark Casey of Surf Coast Racing, John Morrisey, Luke Campbell and Mick Kent signing tickets and contributing to Australian buyers spending NZ\$4,639,500 for 69 two-year-olds. "It was very pleasing to see the local buyers more active today and, once again, Australia has been a great support to our sale," added Vela. "The sale owes much of its success each year to those international buyers that take the time to make the trip to Auckland, and we're grateful for their support and wish them well with their purchases." 

RETIRED

ALFRED NOBEL JOINS COOLMORE ROSTER

(Edited Press Release) Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's Alfred Nobel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}--Glinting Desert {Ire}, by Desert Prince {Ire}), winner of last year's G1 Phoenix S. and G2 Railway S. at The Curragh, has been retired and will join the



Approach (Ire) (Galileo). He cost 220,000gns at Tattersalls' 2008 October Yearling sale, and retires with a record of 10-3-1-2, and earnings of £244,633. Alfred Nobel's final start was a third-place finish, to subsequent G1 Haydock Sprint Cup victor Markab (GB) (Green Desert), in the May 22 G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh. "Alfred Nobel was one of the fastest horses that I've ever bred," said Burns. "Being such a fast and early maturing son of Danehill Dancer makes him an ideal stallion for the commercial market, especially as he was such a good-looking yearling when we sold him." Coolmore's Christy Grassick added, "Alfred Nobel was a very fast two-year-old and is a fine looking horse with great presence. He's also from a great family and we're very encouraged by the fact that two of Danehill Dancer's first sons to retire to stud [Choisir {Aus} and Monsieur Bond {Ire}] sired Group 1 winners in Europe this year."

NOT BOURBON TO STUD Canadian champion Not Bourbon (Not Impossible {Ire}--Bourbon Belle, by Storm Boot) has been retired and will head to Norse Ridge Farm near King City, Ontario, to stand stud for 2011. His fee will be C\$5,000. Bred and raced by Charles Fipke and trained by Roger Attfield, the five-year-old won seven of his 16 career starts, and was named the Sovereign Award-winning three-year-old after taking the 2008 Queen's Plate, one of four black-type victories that season. He earned \$1,085,309. "I am really looking forward to racing Not Bourbon's sons and daughters," said Fipke. "I am confident that he is going to be an outstanding stallion, and we have selected several Grade I winners and producers for his first book. He loved the Polytrack and, with his outstanding race record, conformation and pedigree, he should sire some outstanding Canadian runners."



KISS THE KID TO JOURNEYMAN MGSW Kiss the Kid (Lemon Drop Kid--Black Tie Kiss, by Danzig) will stand his first season at stud at Brent and Crystal Fernung's Journeyman Stud in Ocala in 2011. A fee has not yet been announced. The winner of the 2008 GIII Cliff Hanger S. and 2009 GIII Appleton S., the seven-year-old goes to the breeding shed with a record of 40-8-7-7 and earnings of \$820,873. He was owned by Hardacre Farm and trained by Amy Tarrant. "Kiss the Kid is a throwback," said Brent Fernung. "He was fast, honest and sound for so long as a racehorse, and he ran on absolutely anything. He also has a sire's pedigree, and is part of a sire line that you can't get to in Florida. We're excited to have him at Journeyman."

BREEDERS' CUP RATINGS A RECORD The 2010 Breeders' Cup earned its highest cable rating in the history of the event, with an overall increase of 74 percent on the rating for the coverage on ABC, ESPN and ESPN2. The share for Saturday's ESPN broadcast

was up 144 percent, and the last 45 minutes of programming, which included Zenyatta's quest for perfection in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, shot up 163 percent over 2009, to a record cable rating of 2.9 (which equals a network rating of 2.5). Over the two days of the Breeders' Cup, 24.3 million viewers tuned in for some or all of the nine hours of coverage. In comparison, it has not been the best year for baseball, with regards to TV ratings. The Breeders' Cup telecast on ESPN outpointed every single

Major League baseball game shown on the network last year. The ratings for the recently completed five-game World Series between the San Francisco Giants and the Texas Rangers on FOX were down 28 percent from the 2009 Series between the New York Yankees and the Philadelphia Phillies. The Breeders' Cup also, beat out the broadcasts of four of the seven Chase for the Cup NASCAR races on ESPN.

Zayat Stables' GI Norfolk S. hero **Jaycito** (Victory Gallop) has been transferred from trainer Mike Mitchell to Bob Baffert, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Second to J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal) in the GI Del Mar Futurity while still a maiden, the bay graduated with a one-

length score over that rival in the Norfolk. Off at 5-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, his first try on conventional dirt, he finished seventh. Zayat already had a string with Baffert that includes GI Frizette winner A Z Warrior (Bernardini). Mitchell told *DRF* that

he no longer had any horses for the owner, adding, "It's the business we're in. I've gotten horses like that, and I've lost horses like that. It's Mr. Zayat's decision, and 'Il leave it at that. You hate to lose a horse like that, but it comes with the territory." As for future plans for the colt, Baffert told DRF, "He needs a little freshening. I'll know more in a week. He's not in training right now." The Dec. 18 GI CashCall Futurity at Hollywood Park has not been ruled out.



COMMITTEE CHANGES LIKELY FOR CONGRESS

Competition for Congressional committee assignments continues as Congress re-convened this week for the lame duck session. Lawmakers will fill these committee spots over the next few weeks, in time for the start of the next Congress in January.

In the House, Congressman <u>Hal Rogers</u> (R-KY) may become the next Chairman of the <u>Appropriations Committee</u>, replacing retiring Chairman <u>David Obey</u> (D-WI). Rogers is competing with <u>Jerry Lewis</u> (R-CA) for the top spot. With the ratio between Republicans and Democrats shifting on every House committee to give Republicans the majority, Democrats with the least amount of committee seniority are most likely to lose their seats in the changeover.

Senate Agriculture Committee Chairwoman Blanche Lincoln (D-AR) will be replaced by either Debbie Stabenow (D-MI) or Kent Conrad (D-ND). Lincoln was defeated in her re-election bid by John Boozman (R-AR). The Agriculture Committee will be working in 2011 to draft the next Farm Bill. The 2008 Farm Bill authorized accelerated depreciation for young racehorses.

NJ HORSEMEN REJECT HANSON REPORT Responding to a recommendation by New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie's advisor Jon Hanson that Thoroughbred dates in the state be reduced from the currently legislated minimum of 141 days to 59 days, the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Thoroughbred Breeders Association of New Jersey issued a press release late Tuesday that "resoundingly rejected" the plan. "The most recent recommendations from Chairman Hanson would destroy Thoroughbred racing and breeding in New Jersey," said John Forbes, president of the NJTHA. "A solid live-racing calendar with ample racing opportunities is the foundation this industry is built on. Live racing is the life blood of our industry. To reduce our calendar from the statutory requirement of 141 days to 59 would take away too many jobs from New Jersey citizens working in the horse racing industry. For this reason, these workers would have no choice but to leave New Jersey and live/work/race in surrounding states that schedule year around Thoroughbred racing with solid purses supported by numerous revenue streams, including casino wagering and slot machine wagering at racetracks." According to the NJTHA/TBANJ statement, if Gov. Christie accepts Hanson's recommendation regarding the Thoroughbred dates, there would be grounds for a lawsuit, as the legislation on the books mandates 141 live Thoroughbred racing dates through 2016, and no less than 120 thereafter. Forbes added that, while the number of live racing dates was not up for discussion, the New Jersey horsemen have been open to the concept of running both Thoroughbred and harness meets at Monmouth Park. "We were willing to embrace the idea if it was done correctly, and providing that it did not negatively impact either breed," said Forbes, but added, "In no way did it mean we would accept a reduction of the statutory 141 days of live Thoroughbred racing. We are willing to work with Gov. Christie and Mr. Hanson to further study this concept, as long as the overall result is in no way detrimental to New Jersey's racing and breeding industry." Forbes concluded, "No one in the Thoroughbred industry wants any of this to happen. In fact, we are saddened by the lack of commitment to our long term viability shown by the appointees of the Executive Branch. Hopefully, the Governor will not accept this recommendation by the Hanson Commission as it would be the last nail in a coffin labeled New Jersey Thoroughbred racing and breeding." "Vinery stallions Posse and Repent were relocated to New York, and they have been very well received by the New York breeders. We have seen benefits from operating in a regional market and, with casinos boosting the New York program, we think that there will be more a lucrative market for New Yorkbreds." Ludt also confirmed that the new operation will be supported by a group of Vinery-owned mares that will be sent to be bred and foaled there. Jamie LaMonica, former president of Empire Stud, will continue to be involved with Vinery New York.



RACING NSW GAINS WIN IN FEDERAL COURT

Racing New South Wales secured a key legal victory over corporate betting agencies Betfair and Sportsbet in an Australian Federal Court Wednesday, reports *Racing and Sports*. The court handed down a unanimous rul-

ing, allowing the NSW racing authority to impose a 1.5-percent tax on turnover from all wagering operators covering NSW racing. The court's decision upheld an earlier finding that the legislation under which the tax is imposed is valid. The court also decided that Racing NSW had not engaged in a conspiracy to allow Tabcorp and NSW bookmakers to avoid paying turnover tax. The race fields legislation enabling Racing NSW to charge

a product fee based on turnover was introduced in September of 2008. Sportsbet and Betfair, who had argued that the fees were discriminatory, have 28 days to appeal yesterday's ruling to a High Court.

"This is the biggest payday for the 50,000 participants in the NSW racing industry," Racing NSW Chief Executive Peter V'Landys told Racing and Sports.

According to V'Landy's, the ruling will release A\$120 million in back payments received from corporate bookmakers pending the result of the court appeals and the money would go to increased purses, infrastructure and increasing wages of industry workers.

"We wanted certainty and this was the only way to get it," Racing NSW Chairman Alan Brown told *Racing and Sports*. "This is a win for the NSW racing industry and a blueprint for the rest of Australia."

"We have a couple of options," Betfair's Australian Chief Executive Andrew Twaits told *Racing and Sport*. "One is to run a fresh case on appeal [in High Court], another option is to go to the ACCC [Australian Competition and Consumer Commission] with some compelling evidence of anti-competitive conduct. We do think we have a strong claim and the fee is manifestly unfair."
