





ONE NEW GRADE I FOR 2011

The American Graded Stakes Committee, which met Wednesday in Lexington, yesterday unveiled its list of U.S. graded stakes for next year. A total of 689 stakes races were reviewed, with 474 earning graded status, down from 485 in 2010. Five races were upgraded, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, which achieved a Grade I ranking for the first time. An additional five were elevated to Grade III events for the first time. Sixteen races were downgraded, with 10 losing Grade III status for next year. The Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship was the lone Grade I downgraded, and will be run as a Grade II next year. It was also revealed that Charles Town in West Virginia would be running its first graded race this year, and the Charles Town Classic was awarded a Grade III. "It's an achievement that our entire team and all those associated with Charles Town Races should be proud of," said Erich Zimny, director of racing operations for the track. "The Charles Town Classic is a great example of leveraging the lucrative purses provided by slots and now table games at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races into drawing more attention to racing in the eastern panhandle of West Virginia. TATTERSALLS WRAPS IN NEWMARKET

Tattersalls' December Sale finished in Newmarket last night with a turnover of 55,610,800gns, down two percent on last year, although the 17,000gns median jumped up by 13 percent. The 39,779gns average dropped by two percent and the 74- percent clearance rate fell from 79 percent in 2009. Yesterday's events were a far cry from the highs seen earlier in the week and the top lot made just 35,000gns.

Manor Stud for the session topper, four-year-old Phoenix Rising (GB) (Dr Fong), offered in foal to Compton Place (GB). "If the foal is nice enough we'll hope to sell it in our draft next year and Compton Place is a stallion that's always been good to me. We should have plenty of choice for a future sire next year as she's virtually free of Northern Dancer," commented Thorman. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "At the end of last week's December Foal Sale we referred to the continuing economic turbulence which has dominated the news in recent weeks and marvelled at the extraordinary resilience of the foal market in the face of such uncertainty. I think it would be fair to say that the demand for broodmares and fillies this week has also exceeded expectations." Cont. p2



Sales officials were pleased with the results at Tattersalls December. "The general consensus prior to this week was that, despite two quality dispersals, the catalogue was a little short of obvious stars and that the sale might fall short of last year's levels, but the figures tell another story," Edmund Mahony said. "Turnover and average showed a slight increase, and, similar to the December Foal Sale, the median has risen significantly. The clearance rate has not guite matched last year, which reflects the larger number of lots offered, but it still compares favourably with the 2007 and 2008 Tattersalls December Breeding Stock Sales." Mahony lauded the international appeal of the sale, adding, "It was particularly gratifying to see consignors, not only from Britain and Ireland, but also from throughout Europe being so well rewarded for their continued confidence in the Tattersalls December Sale. The feature of the sale, as with so many sales at Tattersalls, was the extraordinary level of participation from overseas buyers. With buyers from almost 40 different countries, it is hard to single out individuals, but we were delighted to see Indian buyers returning to Tattersalls in such numbers after the lifting of import restrictions and we believe that they have purchased more than 50 lots this week. Other countries which have also made important contributions include Argentina, Libya, Malaysia, Qatar and Russia, and we will continue to explore as many emerging markets as possible in conjunction with British Bloodstock Marketing."

SWEDEN GETS 'GLORIA' Gloria de Campeao (Brz) (Impression {Arg}--Audacity {Brz}, by Clackson {Brz}), the 2010 G1 Dubai World Cup hero, will begin his breeding career in 2011 at Alebacks Stuteri in Sweden,

according to published reports. The seven-year-old, owned by Swedish businessman Stefan Friborg, was retired this summer after sustaining a tendon injury. He is expected to shuttle to his native Brazil for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season. In addition to his epic victory

at Meydan, Gloria de Campeao captured the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup and G3 Al Maktoum Challenge - Round 1 in 2009, and was also runner-up in the Dubai World Cup that year when it was contested at Nad Al Sheba. He heads to stud with a record of 25-9-6-3 and earnings of \$9,258,355.

JUST WILD ABOUT RACING

Harry Rosenblum likes to get to the races as often as he can, and he fully intended to be in the seats cheering when two-year-old Crown Princess (Elusive Quality) made her debut at Churchill Downs Nov. 21. But Mother Nature had other ideas.

"It was really really foggy in Little Rock," Rosenblum explained. "I was going to fly [to Louisville] on a private plane, but the weather was iffy, so I didn't want to chance it. I've regretted that I didn't make the trip."

Rosenblum had to watch on TV as Crown Princess came running late to break her maiden by a length (video). He might rue the fact that he wasn't able to



join her in the winner's circle, but he certainly doesn't regret getting involved in the sport of horse racing, a decision he made some three decades ago.

The son of a cavalryman who numbered President Harry S. Truman as one of his close friends, Harry T. Rosenblum was born and raised in



Arkansas. (The T. stands for Truman, and the former leader of the free world was Rosenblum's godfather). He was barely into his teens when he was introduced to racing.

"When I was growing up in Little Rock, the former governor of Arkansas and his family lived two blocks from us," he recalled. "His wife would take their son, who was a friend of mine, and me to Oaklawn to the races on weekends, and she would teach us to read the *Daily Racing Form*. I had been around horses early in my life, but I fell in love with racing. I was really enamored with the sport."

The love affair continued after he left for college. Rosenblum was, at the time, studying to be a doctor, but he found time to educate himself on the finer points of picking winners as well.

"A friend and I read all these books on handicapping, then on Friday and Saturday we would go to the races at Oaklawn," he said. "I loved everything about it."

Rosenblum decided against a career in medicine, and instead turned his attention to the business of invest-



ing, working as a managing director for the investment banking firm Crews and Associates in Little Rock. He also had the good fortune of falling for none other than Miss Arkansas, Marilyn Kay Allen, and they married in 1975. "I married over my head," he offered with a chuckle.

It was after he joined forces with Kay that he

made the leap from racing fan to horse owner. "When I had been married a few years, a friend told me that a trainer from Nebraska, Jack Gardes, had a horse for sale," Rosenblum remarked. "I bought half and, first time out for us, just two weeks later, he went out and won by many at Oaklawn. I was hooked."

If his experience with that runner, the moderate claimer Sylvester Road, hadn't done the job, his success with the talented turf horse Vilzak (Green Dancer) most definitely would have. A listed winner in France, Vilzak was offered at the Matchmaker Sale of horses of racing age at Hollywood Park in October of 1986.

"I picked him out because I loved Green Dancer," Rosenblum said. "Jack Van Berg, who was my trainer at the time, and I went out to look at him at what must have been 5:30 in the morning--it was pitch black. I ended up buying him, and he did very, very well."

The bay, acquired for \$155,000, would take the Rosenblums on a thrill ride in 1987. Vilzak made 18 starts at 11 different racetracks, riding the coattails of Van Berg's stable star.

"He was following Alysheba," Rosenblum explained. "Wherever Alysheba ran, he ran, too. It was a phenomenal experience for us."

Vilzak ran second in the Early Times Turf Classic at Churchill the day before the GI Kentucky Derby, and third in the GII Dixie H. at Pimlico seven days before the GI Preakness. Third in an allowance test two days before the GI Belmont S., he came back to contest the GII Nassau City S. at Belmont the day after the final leg of the Triple Crown (but trailed in last). The well-traveled runner also accompanied Alysheba to Monmouth Park and Louisiana Downs, albeit without landing a blow in his races.

It wasn't until the end of the season that Vilzak really got good. Second in a Keeneland allowance test Oct. 16, he came back seven days later to be third in the Keeneland Breeders' Cup S., then filled out the triple as a 39-1 shot in the Col. F. W. Koester H. going a mile at Santa Anita Nov. 8. That was deemed the perfect prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Hollywood. Wild About Racing cont. p6

"I tell you, we absolutely thought he had a legitimate chance, or we wouldn't have entered him," Rosenblum insisted. "He hadn't been given any credit. He might have run a few times too many that year, but he had run some pretty decent races, and he didn't start to do better 'til he got blinkered."

The crowd had none of the owner's faith, and sent Vilzak off as the 147-1 outsider in the field. But he didn't run to his odds. Fanned five wide into the stretch under jockey Jorge Velasquez, he closed on the dueling leaders Theatrical (Ire) and Trempolino at the top of the lane. The two favorites proved too much to catch, but Vilzak ran on gamely and ended up fourth, beaten a neck for third and 4 1/4 lengths for all the money. He'd prove the effort was far from a fluke when capping off the year with a win in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup.

"I'll never forget it," Rosenblum said of the Breeders' Cup. "I was pretty nervous when he ran; I about dropped my binoculars, my hands were shaking so much. At the top of the stretch, I was thinking, 'I hope he gets there!' I don't know that he could have beaten Theatrical and Trempolino, but I thought he could be right there with them--I thought he could be third."

What did it mean to the young couple to be a part of the Breeders' Cup spectacle?

"I just can't tell you," Rosenblum added. "I hope I have another opportunity to get there. It was really gratifying for us. We were new to the business, and it really was a thrilling experience. We met a lot of people back then that are still our friends. It was just fantastic."

The Rosenblums primarily raced in California in the early years, necessitating frequent flights to the West Coast. They also built up a large string quickly, finding runners at the sales and through private purchases, and occasionally breeding their own. But they have consolidated their stable, and now have just a dozen or so horses.

"This is a good size stable for us," Rosenblum said. "It's not as much fun when it gets bigger. We have eight or nine of racing age and three or four yearlings turning two-year-olds that we can look forward to."

They also have a lot to look forward to with Crown Princess. The bay filly was originally snapped up for \$6,500 by Lee Christian and partner John Shaw at the 2009 Keeneland September Sale.

Christian, a resident of North Carolina who also heads up the South Carolina Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, got his start in racing when he moved to Maryland in 1968 to work for the National Security Agency. He lived across the street from Laurel Park and, "ventured over there way more than I should have." The Georgia native eventually wrote to the Maryland Racing Commission, trying to get information on becoming an owner.


"They wrote back, 'buy a horse, get a trainer, get a license.' Not helpful," Christian recalled.

It wasn't until 20 years later, when his travels had taken him to Arizona, that he finally had his chance to break into the business. A co-worker who happened to be a former jockey in South America floated the idea of getting a racehorse.

"It was just a matter of, 'how fast can I write the check?" Christian said, adding, "When we started out, it was just a group of us that wanted to have some fun. When it became more serious, I tried to make it a commercial enterprise. Most years, it is."

Christian pinhooks, but privately, breeding a few and buying as many as a dozen yearlings at the sales, then selling off the farm. He currently has 25 horses, including eight at the track with trainer Hamilton Smith.

"We race our mistakes--the ones we can't convince anyone to buy," he said with a laugh.

The theory with the yearlings is to buy "inexpensive horses that look like they can do something," Christian said. "We buy where there's room to make a little money, and the end users have a shot to make money, too."

Crown Princess fit the bill.

"At the sale, the filly had good size and a great walk," Christian said. "We were surprised that we got her at the price we did. The filly was so attractive that I originally named her Eye Candy."

Christian sent the yearling to Shaw in Ocala, and it wasn't long before the partners realized just what a bargain they'd landed. Shaw, a close friend of Rosenblum's, picked up the phone.

"We have bought a lot of horses from John over the last 10 years, and we've gotten a lot of good horses from him," Rosenblum said. "He told me she hadn't been outworked on the farm, and she had a nice pedigree, so I bought her."

The price was admittedly higher than the \$6,500 she brought at Keeneland.

"We paid significantly more, but, obviously, they knew she could run," Rosenblum said.

Christian, a fellow stock broker who now serves as chief financial officer for a company that supplies temporary workers to the food and beverage industry, was pleased that Crown Princess came out running for her new owner.

"I recognize how tough it is to make money in this business, even to win a single race," he said. "It is great to have someone do so well with a horse that you sold them--and it's good for business."

Rosenblum wouldn't argue.

"This filly boosted our spirits," he said, adding, "What was impressive to me about the race was that she showed the ability to rate--she rated like an older horse. Rosemary Homeister Jr. rode her, and she moved her out at just the right time and made a really nice run. She did it like she'd done it 100 times before. That's a good quality in a young horse, to have a mind like that."

Crown Princess is trained by Eric Reed. Reed and his wife (also named Kay) run Mercury Training Center in Versailles, Kentucky, where they break babies and train older horses. But the Reeds will head south for the winter, as will Crown Princess.

"Last year, they stabled at Tampa, and they did pretty well," Rosenblum said. "So the present plan is to go to Tampa and either run Crown Princess in an allowance race [on the grass] at Tampa or, if she trains exceptionally well on the dirt, in the Tropical Park Oaks at Calder. Then we will probably bring her to Oaklawn to run in a route race. But first steps first."

The Rosenblums' primary residence is still in Little Rock, but they built a house in Hot Springs last year, and plan to spend weekends during the racing season at their new home.

"They call Oaklawn 'the Saratoga of the South,'" Rosenblum enthused. "It's a really beautiful place to race, we're fortunate to have it. You will see huge crowds at Oaklawn--it's nothing to have 20,000 people at the races, and even more. It's incredible."

The Rosenblums have been gracing the grandstand at Oaklawn since the days of Sylvester Road. Times have changed, but their enthusiasm for the sport has not.

"We had a lot of fun back then," Rosenblum said. "We still do."

FIRST WATCH

In a time when the proven stallions, rather than the newest, brightest stars, are commanding the top fees and attracting the best mares, the already substantial gamble of breeding to an unproven sire is intensified. No longer does the breeder, consignor, or pinhooker have the luxury of the buyers actively trying to buy the stock of unproven sires--now, they have to earn it, because the presumption is those buyers of future racehorses, like everybody else when times are tough, will look first at the stock of sires he or she knows can throw a good horse. Three years ago 'they' liked the unproven horses because, as yet, they had done no wrong. Now, nobody likes them because, so far, they haven't done anything right. So prices drop faster on unproven sires than the proven ones, and that, potentially, creates value--if you guess right.

For stallions whose first yearlings have sold this year, and will be two-year-olds of 2011, it can be the toughest sell of all in a down market, because there's a big temptation just to wait and see what happens. By the dreaded fourth year--the year their first two-year-olds run--the stud fees for sometimes even the hottest stallion prospects will have dropped by half or, in the case of some of this year's candidates, up to two-thirds: Teofilo (Galileo), for example, the top F2009 (first foals 2009) sire by yearling average (\$162,037, per *Insta-Tistics*), will be standing for \in 15,000 in 2011, just three-eighths of his original 2008 \in 40,000 stud fee; Street Sense (Street Cry), tops in North America, (\$129,933) will stand for \$40,000 in 2011, down from \$75,000.

This F2009 crop is a unique sire crop, because, of the 14 sires with 20 + yearlings sold in 2010 and averages over \$50,000, seven of them are Darley stallions, and another--Shadwell's Invasor (Candy Stripes)--makes it eight Maktoum stallions, over half the contenders. It was in 2007 that Sheikh Mohammed's operation splashed out an estimated \$200 million to buy most of the top three-year-olds on both sides of the Atlantic-five of the seven Darley stallions in this group were foals of 2004, though Teofilo, the European champion two-year-old of 2006, never actually ran at three. The others were GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense (from Street Cry's first crop), Hard Spun (Danzig), and Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor) in the U.S.; and G1 Epsom Derby winner Authorized (Montjeu) in Europe.

It's ironic--and great news for Darley--that even before this battalion of stallions gets the acid test, their operation has developed new top sires in Dubawi and Shamardal, and inherited Medaglia d'Oro, to go with Cape Cross, Elusive Quality, and their then-new star, Street Cry, since they bought this new intake of stallions. So the busiest people in the business for the next month or so are sure to be the Darley nomination selling teams, who have to convince breeders to roll the dice that the new Darley sire of their choice (insert name here) with first two-year-olds 2011 will be next season's Iffraaj (Zafonic) or Congrats (A.P. Indy), even with the gamble costing just half what it would have to breed to the stallion in its first season.


First Foals 2010...

It's a completely different mission for the sire group right behind them, those which had their first foals in 2010 (designated F2010 stallions), and which therefore have had their first weanlings selling at the mixed sales. With this group, the dominance is not so much Darley as it is Europe. We've spoken before about how, in recent sire crops, the top emerging stallions have tended to alternate: among the F2006 sires, the American quartet of Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado), Tapit (Pulpit), Speightstown (Gone West), and Candy Ride (Ride the Rails) have emerged as that sire crop's World Top 30 sires; of the F2007 sires (first foals 2007, or three-yearolds this year), the top two by a wide margin are Darley's European pair, Dubawi (Dubai Millennium) and Shamardal (Giant's Causeway). There's no definitive word yet on the F2008 sires (though you have to be impressed with Bernardini {A.P. Indy}), with their first two-year-olds this year; but it will be a real upset if Darley sires, whether American or European, don't dominate among F2009 sires, because there are so many of them.

It seems to me very striking that the top five F2010 sires, by weanling average to date, were all Europeanbased as racehorses; only Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo), at Coolmore's Ashford base in Kentucky, doesn't stand in Europe. Moreover, they're not just the top five--they're the top five by a wide margin: Duke of Marmalade (Danehill) ranks fifth, with a \$90,930 average, and it's a fair way back to the leading American F2010 sires, Big Brown (Boundary, \$62,153) and Curlin (Smart Strike, \$61,000).

The number of weanlings sold from sires' first crops, over the last 10 or 15 years, has increased to the point where the commercial performance of sires' first weanlings can be meaningful: both Cape Cross and Montjeu announced themselves on their respective commercial platforms with outstanding crops of first weanlings at the sales and, sure enough, they've both turned out to be World Top 30 sires at worst. **Oppenheim cont. p10** Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"As you can see from the tables, Tattersalls' December Sale took a huge dive in 2008, but recovered to some extent last year and sustained that recovery this year. The gross for the foal section of the sale dropped 13 percent from last year but was still 20 percent higher than in 2008; the average was off five percent from last year but was similarly 21 percent higher than in 2008. Given that the mare catalogues can vary dramatically, the fact that the gross and average were marginally up is good news, though the clearance rate from the catalogue was down. The Tuesday mare session was massively strong." - Bill Oppenheim

I think the best example of it this year is the Spendthrift stallion Tiz Wonderful (Tiznow), who had 19 weanlings sell for an average of \$39,263, off a 2009 stud fee of \$12,500. His totals included seven weanlings which sold for between \$45,000-\$67,000, plus one which made \$200,000! He has got to be throwing really attractive stock.

One thing for sure is the buyers rated Europe's 2008 three-year-old milers very highly indeed: they are the top three F2010 sires by weanling average so far. Henrythenavigator had five foals sell in Kentucky, for an average of \$208,000, with his old adversary, Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality), second in average, with 15 sold of 16 offered, for an average of \$166,079. Tamayuz, from Nayef's first crop and the top threeyear-old miler in France in 2008, ranks third, with 11 sold, averaging an impressive \$111,061. He, in turn, ranks just ahead of New Approach (Galileo), who averaged \$108,127, with just three sold. New Approach, the unbeaten champion European two-year-old of 2007, was beaten at a mile by Henrythenavigator in both the G1 English 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, but came back to win the G1 Epsom Derby, and beat older horses in two 10-furlong Group 1s, first the Irish Champion S., then the Champion S. at Newmarket. Fifth among F2010 sires by weanling average, as mentioned, is Duke of Marmalade, a five-time Group 1 winner as a four-year-old in 2008.

But I'll be surprised if New Approach, like all-time leading North American money-winner Curlin and Big Brown, doesn't do considerably better commercially with his 2011 yearlings.

New Approach was a pretty awesome dude as a racehorse himself, and, in fact, this is a very promising-looking group of sires.

Superstar Sea the Stars was, of course, the best horse to retire to stud in 2010 (or, according to some, the best to retire in any year

since Secretariat). Though we don't have the *Insta-Tistics* figures yet, by my reckoning, eight mares have been sold in foal to him for an average of about \$722,250. I think we can safely say whatever is running second in that category is several miles behind him.

Finally, the Tuesday session at Tattersalls' December mare sale, which by all accounts was extremely strong, proved again that European-based operations bring plenty of firepower and plenty of financial strength to the table. For whatever reasons, international buyers are willing to pay more, on the whole, to buy into the right stuff than are Americans; or maybe it's just that there isn't enough of the right stuff in America any more. With super-strong currencies, both Japanese and Australasian buyers have once again been very prominent at the mixed sales this year and, with their borders again open to bloodstock from the U.S. and U.K., Indian breeders have bought something like 150 mares in the U.S. and at Goffs and Tattersalls. The bloodstock market may be worth 40-percent less than it was three years ago, but, at least if we're operating at 60 percent of previous levels, Tattersalls' Tuesday session proved again that competition is fierce for the right stuff.

NORTH AMERICA

IL STATE SENATE APPROVES SLOTS The Illinois State Senate Wednesday gave its stamp of approval on a bill that would expand gaming in the state, allowing for the installation slot machines at the state's racetracks. By a vote of 31-20, narrowly achieving the required 60-percent approval, four tracks in the greater Chicago metropolitan area--Arlington Park, Hawthorne Race Course, Balmoral Park and Maywood Park--would each be permitted to have 1200 slots, while downstate Fairmount Park and the Quad City Downs near the Iowa border would be allowed to install 900 machines. According to published reports, after-tax gaming revenue would be funneled to the racetracks' purse accounts on a sliding scale depending on receipts. The bill would also clear the way for a land-based casino in downtown Chicago as well as facilities in five other locations around the state. Illinois is already home to several riverboat casinos. Despite the Senate passage, the bill is far from a lock to become law. It faces an uncertain future in the state's House of Representatives and does not enjoy the full support of Governor Pat Quinn.

A respectable fourth when trying the turf for the first time Oct. 10, the \$750,000 FTSAUG yearling went off the 5-2 second choice and was adding blinkers to get off the mark here. 


