BILL FINLEY WINS ECLIPSE AWARD FOR NEWS/ ENTERPRISE WRITING IN TDN

Bill Finley has won the 2010 Media Eclipse Award for Writing in the News/Enterprise category for "Do We Need a Sturdier Racehorse? Racing Grapples With Smaller Fields, Fewer Starts," which was published by the *Thoroughbred Daily News* as its November magazine story. Read the complete story at

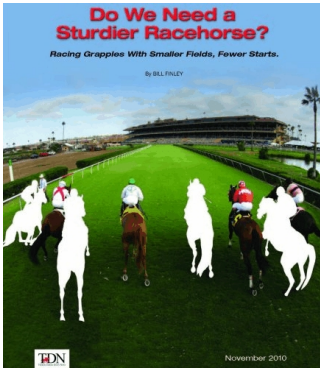
This is the first writing Media Eclipse Award for Finley, 49, a veteran writer of the New York metropolitan newspapers, and the first for the *TDN*. Finley was also a part of the Sirius Satellite Radio broadcast team of the 2005 Breeders' Cup which won the Audio and Multimedia Internet award for its Breeders' Cup World Championships program.

"I'm thrilled to win this honor," said Finley. "This is the most prestigious award that you can win in Thoroughbred racing, and I am glad to have my name added to the list of individuals who have won this award. It is a subject that has always fascinated me. I love the sport. The horses are the stars, and they are not racing as much as they used to. I thought it was detrimental to the sport. I wanted to do an in-depth study and examine why horses raced 25 times in a year 40 years ago, and not five or six like today. I know I didn't solve it, but I tried to shed light on the problem and really tried to examine what's going on."

The *TDN* magazine series was launched in the fall of 2009, and has since offered six in-depth articles on topics of interest in racing. Finley has written all six.

Said *TDN* co-publisher Barry Weisbord, "We set out to deliver some *New Yorker*-style, in-depth journalism on issues that affect the industry, so it's great to be recognized by our peers for being successful in doing so, particularly in our first full year in our magazine venture."

Added Finley, "The Jockey Club was an indispensable source when it came to producing this story. Not only was their Vice President of Communications, Bob Curran, a great sounding board and help when it came to directing me as to who to interview, but the work that they and their subsidiaries are doing when it comes to research and data compilation was extremely helpful, and a long time coming in an industry that didn't typically do the comprehensive job that the sport needs to do in order to address many of its issues." INVINCIBLE SPIRIT SETS 2YO WINNERS MARK

Irish National Stud stallion **Invincible Spirit (Ire)** (Green Desert) has established a new record of 42 juvenile winners in the Northern Hemisphere, according to Julie Lynch, the nursery's stallion nominations manager who is currently on leave.

"Naturally I have had extremely limited access to information on the stallion since going on leave, and only realised the new record-breaking feat on Dec. 26, scanning a list of winners and races which I got my hands on," Lynch said. "I immediately informed the CEO and Board of the INS." The previous mark of 39 winners was jointly held by Chapel Royal (Montbrook) and Wildcat Heir (Forest Wildcat). Invincible Spirit, who will stand for €60,000 in 2011, set a new mark when Soir de Lune (Ire) scored in Milan Nov. 5, and was represented by the 42nd winner from his 2008 crop when Maundays Bay (Ire) prevailed at Ireland's Dundalk racecourse Dec. 4.

This race was previously known as the San Gorgonio, under which name it was won by the late Bobby Frankel a record eight times. Dan Ward, currently an assistant to trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, had previously worked with Frankel from 1976-1998. Ward recalled some of his memories of the Hall of Famer to the Santa Anita notes team.

“Bobby had a full barn at Santa Anita, and I was at Hollywood Park,” Ward said. “This was 1993, after the Breeders’ Cup. Some horses that came in from Europe would stay with us in the U.S. after the races. Bobby didn’t know anything about them.

“So we’re training them a while, taking our time, and Bobby says, ‘You know, that horse is all right. We’re gonna run him in the Baldwin, so have him ready.’ I said, ‘OK.’

“So we’re working him slow and he’s working okay. He gets a few three-quarter works and Bobby says, ‘Is he gonna be ready?’ I said, ‘Yeah, he’s gonna be ready.’ The race is on a Wednesday in late March and the horse is at Hollywood. We send him to Santa Anita Tuesday for the race on Wednesday.

“Bobby’s looking at the *Form* and says, ‘Do you like this horse? He’s got no [bleeping] chance.’ I said, ‘Bet your money.’ His name was Future Storm. Back then, there was no TVG, no HRTV, so I’m in the kitchen at Hollywood Park watching the race on a monitor. A guy comes over and asks Bobby if he likes the horse.

“Bobby says, ‘It’s the first time I’ve ever seen him, but my man over there told me he was ready. Bet your money. The horse gallops.’

“That was Bobby. He would give you credit if you did something very well.”

"As soon as the colt hit the wire on Sunday, we initiated contact with O'Reilly's production staff and they were very receptive," said Santa Anita Director of Publicity Mike Willman. "I knew there were some horseracing-friendly people involved with the show, and the fact that this horse is a bona fide Derby prospect made it an easy sell. When they saw The Factor's race from the three-eighths pole home and they heard Trevor's [Denman] call, it was a done deal. We were hoping they'd use it on their Pinheads and Patriots segment, and they did. It's up to [trainer Bob] Baffert now to keep this horse right of center and out of trouble on the Derby trail. 


KENTUCKY JUDGE BACKS INSTANT RACING
Franklin Circuit Court Judge Thomas Wingate ruled in favor of "Instant Racing" machines at racetracks in the Commonwealth of Kentucky Wednesday. Instant Racing terminals, similar to slot machines, use historical races as random number generators. Along with the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, Kentucky's five Thoroughbred and three Standardbred racetracks sought the ruling. The Racing Commission approved regulations regarding Instant Racing earlier this summer. The Instant Racing machines are also currently in place at Oaklawn Park in Arkansas. Kentucky Governor Steve Beshear applauded yesterday's ruling. "We are very pleased with the court's decision," he said in a statement. "We feel strongly that the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has the statutory authority to regulate historical horse racing, and we expect revenue produced from these games will help support our trademark racing industry." According to published reports, Kentucky-based the Family Foundation, which is opposed to expanded gambling, plans to appeal the ruling to the Kentucky Supreme Court.



After the conclusion of NYRA's live races, the channel will highlight select simulcast signals from tracks around the country. On NYRA dark days, usually Mondays and Tuesdays, the channel will exclusively show simulcast signals from around the country.

Keeneland has issued an advisory to consignors and buyers that the Kentucky Department of Agriculture has waived the requirement for equine piroplasmosis testing for horses entered in the 2011 January Horses of All Ages Sale, which will run Jan. 10-14. Horses may be shipped to the sales grounds without the disease test. However, if a purchased horse is immediately shipped to a racetrack in Kentucky, it will be required to have a negative test for equine piroplasmosis before entering the track's grounds.
