{Ger}) took some exception, drifting several paths towards the outside, but that would rank as his biggest scare, as last year's G1 Durban July Cup H. hero waltzed home an easy 1 1/2-length winner from Godolphin's Spring of Fame (Grand Slam) in vesterday's G3 Maktoum Challenge R2.

It was another gap back to reigning G1 Carlos Pellegrini hero Interaction (Arg) (Easing Along), who edged last year's G1 Dubai Duty Free victor Al Shemali (GB) (Medicean {GB}) out of third. "This was the plan for his comeback, but I did not expect him to win that well," winning trainer Mike de Kock told Racing Post. A private purchase by the C R K Stable of Lee and Susan Searing after breaking his maiden by 17 1/4 lengths going a mile at Calder, Gladding makes his stakes debut Sunday. After joining John Sadler's string, the gelding made a successful transition to Southern California when winning an optional claimer by 2 1/4 lengths Dec. 29 at Santa Anita despite being bumped in deep stretch. Rafael Bejarano will be back aboard the four-year-old Sunday.

Driven along by Olivier Doleuze at the quarter pole, the veteran put a couple of lengths on the field within a few strides and was never threatened the remainder, as Alazeyeb outstayed Mutheeb for the runner-up spot. Fourth in the 2010 G1 Cape Derby, Bold Silvano resumed with a neck score in the G2 Greyville 1900 S. May 21, then went down by a neck in the G1 Greyville Daily News 2000 June 5. Well-backed when fourth in the G1 Champions Cup at Clairwood July 3, the bay successfully negotiated 11 furlongs for the first time, stalking from close range for a one-length tally in the prestigious G1 Durban July Cup July 31. He'd been off since, but had reportedly trained well over the Tapeta and was the clear international favorite. A half-step slow from the stalls, Bold Silvano took control of a paceless affair until allowing Spring of Fame to lead approaching the half-mile pole. Bold Silvano never gave up the fence, though, countered to reassert nearing the stretch and strode home a comfortable winner despite his late-race antics. Iffraaj (GB), who led Wednesday's opening session with the top offering at the New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale in Karaka, was back on top Thurs-

day when another member of the Trelawney Stud consignment realized the top price of NZ\$170,000 (US\$131,473). Out of French Flute (Aus) (Jugah {NZ}), Lot 867 was purchased by Walter and Kathy Altieri's Newlands Thoroughbreds. A half-brother to winner Bee Jean (Elusive City), the Nov. 21 foal is a half to listed-placed Vanny Fair (NZ)

(Van Nistelrooy). Thus far, Iffraaj has been represented by 27 sold for an aggregate of NZ\$2,230,500 and average of NZ\$82,611. Top priced filly of the session was Lot 710, who brought NZ\$130,000 from A Sharrock. Offered from the draft of Westbury Stud, the daughter of Postponed--who is a half-sister to GS1P Booming (NZ) (Don Eduardo {NZ})--is out of the unraced Beautiful Sea (NZ) (Grosvenor {NZ}). The leading individual buyer Thursday was West Australian agent John Chalmers, who secured six yearlings for a total of NZ\$377,000. Among them was Lot 913, a filly by Iffraaj out of Honeymoonzova (NZ) (Volksraad) who brought NZ\$110,000. At the conclusion of Thursday's second session, a total of 294 yearlings have been sold for a gross of NZ\$13,717,500. The average after two days of selling closed out at NZ\$46,658, while the median was NZ\$38,000. The clearance rate through the first two sessions was 73 percent. The third and final session of the Select sale, which features 190 yearlings, begins today (Friday) at 11 a.m. (local time). Trickmeister, unbeaten in four career starts, including a devastating 11 3/4-length tally in Saratoga's Pleasant Colony S. last out Aug. 27 (video), is on the comeback trail at the Randy Bradshaw Breaking and Training facility in Williston, Florida. The IEAH Stables colorbearer was freshened after posting an unsatisfactory workout in preparation of the \$1million GII Pennsylvania Derby last September.

"He had some minor issues, and by giving him time, we were just being sure that the issues would only be minor and be a thing of the past," Michael lavarone, president of IEAH Stables, revealed. "Randy Bradshaw is very happy with him in Florida right now, will be able to get him under tack in early-March, and I'm sure we will have him back to [trainer Rick] Dutrow [Jr.] shortly thereafter. We remain very hopeful that Trickmeister will be an important horse in 2011."

Trickmeister kicked off his career with three straight impressive wins for co-owners/breeders Brereton C. Jones and Timothy C. Thornton and trainer Cindy Jones at Delaware Park, led by a front-running score in the 1 1/16-mile Barbaro S. over a sloppy track July 10 (video). Subsequently purchased privately by IEAH and turned over to Dutrow, the bay turned in a tour-deforce at the Spa in his debut sporting the red, white and blue. Favored at even-money, the son of Afternoon Trick (Afternoon Deelites) exited stall one running, rattled off sharp fractions of :23.47 and :46.58, opened daylight in the stretch after a couple of taps from Garrett Gomez's whip, and was geared down late, stopping the clock for nine furlongs in 1:48 4/5. He earned a 104 Beyer for the effort.

"Trickmeister has obviously already shown us that he is a tremendous raw talent," lavarone continued. "His race at Saratoga was a good test for him, and he easily handled Our Dark Knight (Medaglia d'Oro), a nice colt, in a race that gives you chills if you watch it. From there, we aimed for the Pennsylvania Derby, and it just wasn't meant to be." -SS



♥ "TDN Rising Star" ♥ Trappe Shot, hero of last July's Long Branch S. at Monmouth Park (video) and runner-up behind champion Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) in a very deep renewal of the GI Haskell Invitational S. at the Jersey Shore track Aug. 1 (video), earned a vacation following a puzzling ninth-place finish as the 7-2 favorite in the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 28. The flashy chestnut took his first step toward a return to the races with an easy three-furlong breeze at Vinery Stable Wednesday, according to Steve Young, who acquired the Florida-bred on behalf of Nicholas and James Brady's Mill House for \$850,000 at the 2009 FTMMAY two-year-old sale.

"He was electively turned out with nothing really wrong with him after the Travers," Young explained of Trappe Shot, who ran out of gas in the stretch to finish 23 lengths behind Afleet Express (Afleet Alex) and Fly Down (Mineshaft) in the Midsummer Derby. "He'll breeze again next week, then the plan is for him to go down to Kiaran McLaughlin at Palm Meadows some time in the middle of the month."



Young added, "He has matured as you would expect a horse going from three to four."

A troubled fifth in his lone start at two at the Spa, Trappe Shot kicked off his sophomore season in style at Gulfstream with a pair of visually impressive double-digit wins versus overmatched state-breds Feb. 21 (video) and Mar. 21 (video). Freshened, the half-brother to millionaire Miss Shop (Deputy Minister) stole the show before a packed house on the GI Belmont S. undercard, soundly defeating the highly regarded Tahitian Warrior (Maria's Mon) in a seven-panel first-level allowance by four lengths (video). He punched his ticket to the Haskell and Travers after passing his initial two-turn test by 2 1/4 lengths in the 1 1/16-mile Long Branch.

"He's a Grade I caliber horse," Young continued of the son of Shopping (Private Account), who outkicked the multiple Classic-placed First Dude (Stephen Got Even) and GI Kentucky Derby one-two Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and Ice Box (Pulpit) in Monmouth's centerpiece. "There are plenty of opportunities for him. In a perfect world, races like the [GI] Carter [H. at Aqueduct Apr. 9] and [GI] Met Mile [at Belmont May 30] would be on his schedule. He's one of those horses that always gets ready quicker than you think, but it's a tick early to think about [when he'd be ready to return]." -SS

Donegal Racing's Paddy O'Prado, winner of the GI Secretariat S. in addition to three additional Grade I placings in 2010, is soon to complete his winter's vacation and resume serious training, said Jerry Crawford, the principal of Donegal Racing. "We gave him 90 days off at WinStar Farm and he will fly to Florida Feb. 7 to join Dale Romans," Crawford commented. "The rule of thumb is a day of training for every day off, so he could make his first appearance on Derby Day [in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic]. Or, if he's ready, he could have a prep race late at Gulfstream or early at Keeneland. Dr. John Garrity, who watched over him at WinStar, says he has done great, that he's a more mature-looking animal and we expect great things from him this year." Despite four graded-stakes wins on the grass last season, Crawford says Paddy O'Prado is likely to make at least a start or two on dirt this term. "I think he's the most versatile horse in the world today," he offered. "He has great figs on dirt, Poly and grass," he stated, adding that races such as the GI Stephen Foster H. and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic are squarely in the crosshairs. In any event, Crawford said, a return trip to the Windy City is a near certainty. "Dick Duchossois put on a great show and welcomed us to Arlington last year. We received some spectacular hospitality around the country, but I think my partners would shoot me if we didn't go back there for the [GI] Arlington Million," he commented .- AC

"I was really pleased with his race," said trainer Tom Albertrani Thursday morning at Palm Meadows training center. "I was just hoping to get a good race out of him. I loved the way he finished that day, and

two turns is definitely going to help him for the next race. We're coming back a little quick, but we've been aiming at the Donn for a long time now, so we're going to take our chance and see how he does." The bay was formerly conditioned by Tom Amoss for owner/breeder Jack Hammer. "He came back in great condition," the trainer confirmed. "The first race was a really good start. Hopefully, there are good things to come with him this year." The Florida-bred colt will be ridden by Jose Lezcano. "He's a big scopey horse," added Albertrani. "He had a good three-year-old campaign; he won three out of his six races and looked like a horse on the Derby trail. He's definitely a horse that wants a mile-and-a-quarter, so I think maybe if he stayed healthy he would have been a contender in there. As an older horse, this could be a good year for him."

Western Winter, a son of Gone West who is little known to North American breeders, had two three-year-old Group 1 winners in South Africa--What a Winter (SAf) won the G1 Cape Flying Championship Jan. 22, while Covenant took the G1 Klawervlei Majorca S. Jan. 29. (Western Winter also concluded South Africa's recent Cape Premier Yearling Sale as the fifth-leading sire, with 11 of 13 sold for R591,818--roughly \$82,500.)

And Northern Afleet, third by a length in the '97 Met Mile, landed a lucrative trifecta during last weekend's Sunshine Millions event. At Santa Anita, his four-year-old daughter Evening Jewel, in a return to form, won the \$300,000 Distaff, while the gelding Amazombie captured the \$200,000 Sprint S. Back east at Gulfstream, his daughter Aegean upset the \$200,000 Filly & Mare Sprint.

The result of this \$385,000 aggregate payday? Northern Afleet now sits atop the *TDN*'s Year-to-Date General Earning List with \$595,885 in earnings.

The big purses of the Sunshine Millions put two other sires in the mix. **Trippi**, sire of \$300,000 F/M Turf heroine Trip for A. J., is ranked second. **Montbrook**, whose progressive four-year-old Tackleberry dropped a 27-1 bomb on the \$500,000 Classic, is fourth. A former resident at Ocala Stud, Trippi now stands at Drakenstein Stud Farm in South Africa. Between that pair is **Grand Slam**. His son Apriority was second in the SM Sprint at Santa Anita. Four weeks earlier, Grand Slam's Dilemma won that track's grassy GIII Daytona S. Completing the top five is **Mineshaft**, who could enjoy a big spring thanks to Dialed In, who remained unbeaten in a last-to-first win in the GIII Holy Bull S. Sunday.

The Deets On Northern Afleet...

Northern Afleet, in many ways, has been a horse of contrasts dating back even to his racing days. He was regarded primarily as a sprinter/miler, but he showed plenty of versatility in four starts at a mile or beyond on

the main track. In those four starts, he won two graded events (the GII San Fernando BC S. at nine furlongs and GIII San Diego H. at 1 1/16 miles), finished third in the Met Mile, and ran a decent fifth in the GI Strub S. at 10 furlongs. (He didn't fare nearly as well in four grass starts at a mile.)


Northern Afleet entered stud in 1999 at Double Diamond Farm in Florida and stood there for the next six seasons. His

early runners, bred on a \$5,000 fee, included the likes of G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen winner Big City Man; Grade II winner Saint Afleet, who himself stared on Sunshine Millions Day, winning the SM Dash S. in 2004; Grade III winner G P Fleet; and Unforgettable Max, a SW and MGSP son of Maggy Hawk (Hawkster).

It was the latter's full-brother, however, that would really bring Northern Afleet to prominence. Afleet Alex, from Northern Afleet's third crop, zigzagged his way to victory in the 2004 GI Hopeful S. and finished second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He was even better at three, earning divisional honors after winning the GI Preakness S., GI Belmont S. and GII Arkansas Derby.

Afleet Alex was too good going around two turns not to target the big-money prizes as a three-year-old, but it's interesting to note that he was undefeated in five sprint starts, including the Hopeful and the GII Sanford S. at two, and a visually impressive win in the six-furlong Mountain Valley S. at Oaklawn at three (where the comment line reads: "bothered, out in 1:22.3").

Afleet Alex's success earned Northern Afleet a spot on Taylor Made's roster in Kentucky, where he's gone on to sire Negligee, winner of the 2009 GI Darley Alcibiades S.; and Evening Jewel.

Ben Taylor, vice president of Taylor Made Stallions, said the best may be yet to come for Northern Afleet, who bred 126 mares last year at a fee of \$10,000. Taylor made special note of the stallion's two seasons at Stud TNT in Brazil.

"Since we moved him up from Florida, his books have gotten better, and his books have gotten bigger," he said. "We actually shuttled him to South America, too, so he has two crops of foals there. And we specifically chose [Stud TNT] because they have a good track record of sending horses up here to run. I think they've had seven group stakes winners down there that then came up here and won stakes. So, basically, the pipeline for Northern Afleet looks pretty good."

The versatility displayed by Afleet Alex has been mirrored by Northern Afleet's latest star, Evening Jewel, whose exploits last season helped justify a bump in Northern Afleet's stud fee, to \$12,500, in 2011. A modest \$8,000 KEESEP yearling, Evening Jewel has won Grade I stakes on synthetics (Keeneland's Ashland) and turf (Del Mar Oaks). She was beaten just a nose by Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the GI Kentucky Oaks in her first start on dirt. And she lost little in defeat when third to Dubai Majesty (Essence of Dubai) and the emerging star Switch (Quiet American) in the seven-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint.

"They're a versatile bunch, for sure," said Taylor.
"They'll go on any surface, and they go a lot of different distances."

Northern Afleet is by Afleet, a son of Mr. Prospector who was exported to Japan early in his career. Before shipping out, however, he sired Grade I winners Flat Fleet Feet and Twist Afleet, and to date, according to brisnet.com, has no fewer than 63 black-type winners on his resume.

Taylor said that Northern Afleet's female family is plenty strong, too. And that's not just a stallion manager talking his sire up. A half to GISW Tap to Music (Pleasant Tap), Northern Afleet was produced by Nuryette, herself a half-sister to GISW Cuddles (Mr. Prospector) and a daughter of GSW Stellarette (Tentam). His third dam is champion Square Angel (Quadrangle), dam of Broodmare of the Year Kamar, and granddam of Swain (Ire), Gorgeous, Seaside Attraction, etc. cont. p10

"If you look at his pedigree, you can see where the quality comes from," said Taylor. "He had the ability, and it is a blue-blooded pedigree. He's out a Nureyev mare, and he's got a lot of things in there that I love. You know, we stood the stallion Afleet, and he was a real good-looking horse. I remember when we bred [Nuryette], I thought, 'Man, I just love this mare.' I think some people don't realize what kind of mare he's out of."

Pedigree-wise, Taylor says Northern Afleet matches up pretty well with any sire line. Of his four Grade I winners, three are from distinct lines: Afleet Alex from Hail to Reason/Roberto, Big City Man from In Reality/Valid Appeal, Negligee through In Reality/Relaunch, and Evening Jewel from Storm Cat. Of last weekend's stakes winners, Amazombie was produced by a mare by In Excess (Ire), a grandson of Caro (Ire); and Aegean was produced by a mare by A.P. Indy's son Aptitude.

Taylor said there are some physical traits to watch out for, though. "A big mare is what you need," he said. "He'll cross with about anything. He's gotten runners out of every type of mare, but what you need is a big, strong mare. And you don't want long pasterns. He has longer pasterns himself and tend to throw it sometimes. I wouldn't breed a real small mare to him, but if you breed an average or real big mare to him, he'll put a body on them. Physically, you want size and short pasterns."

Taylor said the current market climate has put an emphasis on sires with a proven track record, and that has helped stallions like Northern Afleet. "I think more people are gravitating toward horses like him, who they know they can get a runner by if they keep it, or they can bring it to a sales, too," he said. "If you get one out of the right mare and breed them right and get the right physical, you can sell one for a lot of money. He fits a lot of mares, and he'll get you a good physical. And people know he can get a good horse. Big City Man was a good horse, Afleet Alex was something. He can get a Grade I horse, and you're talking a \$12,500 stud fee. I think he's a steal." -LM
