JHRA JULY BEGINS AMIDST UNCERTAINTY

After enduring the unthinkable national tragedies of earthquake, tsunami and nuclear meltdown crises this year, Japanese breeders could be expected to face their most high-profile sale of young stock with trepidation. With more than 22,000 reported dead or missing after the tsunami of four months ago, with the national economy struggling, and with government-imposed electricity restrictions in effect due to power shortages, the demand for expensive young horses would not seem to be a priority.

But the resilience of Japan--as well as the emergence of the nation's runners, led by G1 Dubai World Cup winner Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}), as

underway today.

Potential buyers, including two groups of prominent Australians, busily scoured the Northern Horse Park sale grounds on the island of Hokkaido for yearling prospects on Sunday, following several weeks of visitor traffic to nearby farms.

Teruya Yoshida, JRHA vice chairman and master of Shadai Farm, reported that the number of buyers who had registered for the sale was significantly higher than last year. "It is amazing--we are surprised," said Yoshida, who has consigned 63 yearlings and 44 foals under the Shadai banner. "People may think it is a good time to buy and that the prices will be down. I am very happy to hear that the number of owners registered to buy is more than 20% over last year, so I hope to sell well." *Cont. p5*

The ultra-consistent **Never Retreat** (Smart Strike) had twice made the trip up to Canada, coming away with



runner-up efforts both times, but the Team Block runner made it to the winner's circle vesterday with a 1 1/4-length victory in the GII Dance Smartly S. at Woodbine. Sent off at 4-1 in the nine-furlong turf event, the dark bay broke alertly, but was taken in hand to stalk longshot pacesetter War Tigress (War Chant) through fractions of :24.87 and :48.37. Never Retreat inherited the lead in upper stretch and got first run as favored Bay to Bay (Sligo Bay {Ire}) struggled to find racing room in a packed field. The favorite was flying at the finish, but couldn't catch the winner. "The biggest asset for this

filly is that she's a class act," said co-owner David Block. "Nothing bothers her, she can do anything. In the final analysis, she never retreats." Winning rider Shaun Bridgmohan never had an anxious moment. "She's such an honest filly and she broke sharply and wanted to put herself in the game," Bridgmohan said. "She's an old pro. She does everything right and I just felt I was a winner because she was so comfortable at every point that I just let her do her thing." *Cont. p2*

Vanjura was a convincing winner of the valuable International Trophy at Istanbul's Veliefendi track Sept. 4 and followed up by closing last term with a second in the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at Milan. She regained the winning habit in the Apr. 22 Listed Bremen Oster Stuten-Cup at this venue on seasonal return and was a last-out runner-up to Worthadd (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the May 29 G2 Premio Carlo Vittadini back at Milan's San Siro. Tracking the leaders in third after heading them up through the first furlong in this, Vanjura took the initiative at the quarter pole and was driven clear before holding the fast-and-late rush of Rockatella.






RACETRACK Round-Up

Jacqueline Quest Transferred to Ian Williams... Jacqueline Quest (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), disqualified from a first-place finish in last year's G1 1000 Guineas, has left Sir Henry Cecil's Warren Place yard to be conditioned by Ian Williams, according to Racing Post. Demoted to second after passing the post ahead of Special Duty (Hennessy) in that distaffers' Classic, she blotted her copybook by refusing to race in last month's G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot and has had to undergo an obligatory stalls test since then in order to be allowed to run. "We have no firm plans for Jacqueline Quest, and it all depends what [owner] Mr. [Noel] Martin wants to do with her later on in the season whether she runs again [this year] or not," Williams told the trade daily. "She's in good nick and certainly seems to be enjoying herself here." Martin has resisted offers for his star performer from Australia, but has yet to decide on her long-term plans. He added, "We can't find out what the problem has been, but they say a change of environment can help horses, so I sent Jacqueline Quest to lan.

"After just three days, she was a completely different horse, so I've decided to leave her there. I had been thinking of retiring her and sending her to stud, but she seems back to her old self and I would like to run her again. If everything goes well, I could then bring her back into racing. She has passed a stalls test since Royal Ascot, so that wouldn't be a problem. Everybody knows she's a talented filly--she showed that in the 1000 Guineas--and it's a shame she hasn't progressed as we would have liked, but she just hasn't had her day. Hopefully, it's not too late for her."

Mott Sophomores Gear Up for Spa...

Palides Investments' GII Black-Eyed Susan S. heroine Royal Delta (Empire Maker) fired a five-furlong bullet in 1:00.65 at Belmont yesterday morning as she works her way back from a foot bruise that forced her out of the GI Mother Goose S. June 25. Conditioner Bill Mott is hoping for big things from the homebred at the upcoming Saratoga meet if she continues to train the way she did Sunday. "With any luck, we'll make both races up there--the [July 23 GI TVG] Coaching Club American Oaks and the [Aug. 20 GI TVG] Alabama S.," said Mott. "I think it will be enough."

Live Oak Plantation's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) is also expected to resurface at the Spa. He was sidelined due to a suspensory injury that was discovered after the two-time Grade II winner finished third in the GI Florida Derby Apr. 3. The bay worked five furlongs in 1:00.70 at Belmont Sunday. Mott is still weighing his options for To Honor and Serve's comeback race. "The [Aug. 1 GII] Amsterdam is 6 1/2 furlongs and that's pretty short," said the Hall of Famer. "They say there are a lot of good sprinters around. I'm considering [shortening him up], just to see how it goes. If you come back at Saratoga, you're going a mile-and-an-eighth, and the horse has enough speed where he doesn't have to go a mile-and-an-eighth."

Mott also has the up-and-coming **Raison d'Etat** (A.P. Indy) in the barn. The son of MGISW Sightseek (Distant View) broke his maiden by 7 3/4 lengths in his third attempt at Belmont June 18, earning a 94 Beyer Speed Figure. He worked four furlongs in :50.02 over the Oklahoma Training Track Friday. "He could very well go in the [July 29 1 1/8-mile] Curlin S.," said Mott. "He'll be nominated for that and the [July 30 GII] Jim Dandy, but the Curlin would probably be the spot."

Arlington Million Likely Next for Gio Ponti...

Three-time Eclipse champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat), second in Saturday's GI Man o'War S. at Belmont, could still make his next start in the Aug. 13 GI Arlington Million as scheduled. "Yesterday I thought the horse ran a good race--he was second best," trainer Christophe Clement said of his charge's runner-up effort behind Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). "I did think the Irish horse had everything his way, but we had the chance to get to him and we couldn't get to him in the stretch." The Man o'War was Gio Ponti's third race this term. He was also fifth in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March and third in the June 11 GI Manhattan H. As for a third straight start in the Arlington Million, Clement added, "It's tough to pass on the Million--we won and finished second the last two years. Yet again, it's a mile and a quarter and, yet again, you are subject to weather and luck, but that's the way it is. The fall is obvious--I will be in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile and the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. What do I do between now and then? At the moment, I will train him for the Million and we'll keep all of our options open." Clement added that last year's GI Manhattan H. winner Winchester (Theatrical {Ire}), sidelined since last December, could also make his next start at Arlington Park. "Winchester is going to work [Monday] on the turf and then I'm going to decide, do I bring him back in two weeks [in the July 23 GIII Stars and Stripes] at Arlington or just train him to the [Aug. 13] GI Sword Dancer]."

Katsumi Yoshida, whose Northern Farm has reigned as a perennial leading consignor and who has 76 yearlings and 70 foals in this year's catalog, also was upbeat.

"I thought the sale might be bad after the earthquake, but there are many, many people coming to inspect the horses," he said. "The clearance rate will be better than last year. There seem to be better horses this year and more buyers. Many big names have been coming to the farm.

"The general economy in this country may not be very good. But once buyers come here, they have to change their mindset," Yoshida added with a smile.


Smaller breeders may not be as optimistic as the Yoshida family, whose Shadai Group of farms dominate the JRHA sale annually, as well as the entire Japanese racing and breeding industry.

"It's going to be very tough other than for the Shadai Group, which has 63% of the yearlings consigned here," observed Harry Sweeney of Paca Paca Farm. "It will be tough for them, too, but they'll do OK. For the rest of us, it will be a disaster, but relative to the other disasters we've had in Japan this year, it will be minor. For those of us who have survived the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear meltdown, hopefully we'll survive this, too."

Paca Paca has seven yearlings in the catalogue, including four from the last crop of the late champion sire Agnes Tachyon (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), along with four foals.

Uneasiness about possible radiation from the Fukushima Daiichi nuclear plant may limit attendance from buyers based in some other Asian countries. However, some clearly undaunted and enthusiastic Australians were ready to take a plunge into the Japanese market, buoyed by the strength of the Australian dollar.

Phil Sly, co-owner of this year's G1 Golden Slipper runner-up Mosheen (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), said he looked at virtually every yearling on the grounds while accompanied by Troy Corstens, manager of the Malua Racing partnership venture, and Justin Bahen of Hong Kong-based Bahen Bloodstock.

"In a nutshell, we see it as an opportunity to spread our international wings," Sly said, adding that he is working to obtain an owner's license through the Japan Racing Association's program allowing foreign owners to race for the world's most lucrative purses. "We haven't seen horses like this in Australia."

"I've done yearling sales around the world, and the bone on the Japanese horses is second to none," added Corstens, who was instrumental in the purchase and eventual sale to Coolmore of Australian champion sprinter and Royal Ascot Group 1 winner Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}). Cont. p6



Bahen initiated the group's Japan venture about six months ago after studying Japanese racing statistics and prize money. "I was introduced to Katsumi by [trainer] Michael Freedman. When I saw the facilities and the program here, I was excited--there is nothing like it," Bahen said. "The three of us came here with the intention to purchase. And the horses--wow!"

Another Australian, Paul Fudge of Waratah Thoroughbreds, also was inspecting yearlings the day before the JRHA sale was to begin. Ranked as one of Australia's top 40 wealthiest individuals, Fudge was accompanied by Australian veterinarian Treve Williams.

Last November, Fudge's Waratah spent \$3 million on horses at Keeneland, including \$1.2 million for Elusive Sparkle (Elusive Quality), a half-sister to Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) in foal to that champion's sire.

Nathan Tinkler of Patinack Farm in Australia, who bought several Japanese-breds at the 2008 JRHA sale, is not due to attend this year.

Among Japanese owners, former leading buyers such as Riichi Kondo and Takaya Shimakawa are expected to be back in action, although Shimakawa is dealing with the loss of key facilities connected to his natural foods business in Sendai following the tsunami.

Last year's sale saw the emergence of new buyers in the lower and middle segments of the market and sales officials project that that trend will continue.

Buyers on the scene will notice some changes at the sale, including the addition of five new corporate partners joining last year's sponsor, Porsche. The new sponsors, including Fendi and Damiani jewelers, appeal to those seeking luxury goods and have paid a fee to the JRHA to be part of the sale event.

Looking at sires represented by offspring in the catalog, Neo Universe (Jpn) is the leader with 18 yearlings and 17 foals, including one of the likely sale leaders in Hip 336, a three-quarter brother to Japanese Triple Crown winner, two-time Horse of the Year and 2010 leading freshman sire Deep Impact (Jpn). Northern Farm consigns the bay colt, who was delivered on March 7 by German Group 1 winner Wind in Her Hair (Ire) (Alzao).

King Kamehameha, leading sire in Japan last year and currently back on top of the general sire list by progeny earnings, ranks next by total number of offspring: 11 yearlings and 22 foals for a total of 33. His yearling son out of phenomenal broodmare My Katies (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), is another potential big seller, as he is a half-brother to Horse of the Year Admire Moon (Jpn) (End Sweep). Out of a winning full-sister to the highest earning racehorse in history, T.M. Opera O (Jpn), who banked \$16,200,337 and was honored as Japan's Horse of the Year in 2000, this colt is from the second crop of champion sprinter and miler Daiwa Major (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). That strapping chestnut son of the legendary 13-time leading sire has leaped to a good start with his first offspring and currently ranks second among Japanese freshman sires and all sires of juveniles by progeny earnings.

Hip 51, f, Deep Impact (Jpn)--Air Groove (Jpn), by Tony Bin (Ire)

Consigned by Northern Farm

By a two-time Horse of the Year and Triple Crown winner and out of another Horse of the Year and Classic winner, this filly boasts one of the most



impressive pedigrees in the catalog. She is a three-quarter sister to champion Admire Groove (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and to GSW Forgettable (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}). Her half-brother Rulership (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) is a MGSW in Japan who ran respectably in the

\$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic in March, and she has a promising 3-year-old full-sister Gullveig (Jpn) who has won half her starts and is stakes placed. Another half-sister, Portofino (Jpn) (Kurofune), is a stakes winner. "This is the star of the sale," predicted JRHA international consultant Naohiro Goda. Northern Farm's reserve price is ¥100 million (or about \$1,219,512, believed to be the highest in the sale).

They are the 3-year-old multiple winner Donau Blue (Jpn) and the juvenile Gentildonna (Jpn), and thus the family could be positioned for advancement. Her 3-year-old Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) colt, named Pray (Jpn), is Group 2-placed and a winner after topping the 2009 yearling session at ¥145 million (\$1,526,315). His reserve price is ¥80 million (\$975,610).

VANMETER, ST. GEORGE LAUNCH VENTURES

Tom VanMeter and Arthur "Archie" St. George spent years working together at Eaton Sales, and now find themselves shoulder to shoulder once again, though this time, not as part of the same organization. Both

VanMeter and St. George have begun new consignments, and both are celebrating their respective maiden voyages at Fasig-Tipton July. VanMeter Sales and St. George Sales are located just feet from each other in Barn 8. That's not coincidence, though. While the men are selling under separate banners, they are sharing support staff and computer equipment, and lending each other a hand whenever possible. "We've worked together for as long as I've been here [in the U.S.], and it's nice for me to have someone like Tom, who is a shoulder to lean

on," said the Irish-bred St. George. "He's been selling horses for a long time and has seen a lot, and he's a very knowledgeable horseman. It's nice for me to be able to bounce ideas off him."

Added VanMeter,
"We're stabled
together here and will

be at Keeneland, too, and we're good partners. We may all fold in together in the future, but we'll work through this year and see how it goes." *Cont. p9*





For years, VanMeter was partners with Reiley McDonald and Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds in Eaton Sales. He retired from Eaton two years ago, selling his stock in the company to St. George, who had risen in the ranks of one of the country's largest and most successful consignors. Earlier this year, it was announced that McDonald was buying out St. George and Gaines-Gentry to focus on a slimmed-down Eaton that would stress quality over quantity.

In the meantime, VanMeter decided to jump back into the game with longtime friend and associate Olin Gentry, and together they started VanMeter Sales. "We needed a venue to market our horses, and that's how it started," explained VanMeter. "As we got going, some old friends called, and here we are. It's tough to jump in when the market's like this, but we're just putting this together, and I think we'll be very successful. We have three [yearlings] here, another three in [Fasig-Tipton] Saratoga, and 66 for [Keeneland] September."

While VanMeter has plenty of experience being at the helm of his own ship, St. George is striking out on his own for the first time. "Of course I was nervous getting in during this market, but I was excited at the same time, and still am," said St. George. "We're selling horses for less money these days, but I have some really solid clients behind me and look forward to the future."

Born and raised in Ireland, St. George is a third-generation horseman. "My family bred National Hunt horses in Ireland," he explained. "I used to ride horses--I actually managed to ride in a few jump races, point-to-point races. During one school break, I came over here and I liked it, so when I was done with school I came back. And I've been here since."

St. George's first job in the U.S. was at Eaton Sales. He started at the bottom, mucking stalls and such, but quickly worked his way through the ranks to become one of the public faces of Eaton. "I really enjoyed every moment of it," said St. George. "I was at Eaton for 10 years, and learned a lot. It gave me the stability to be where I am. I was around some wonderful horses there--Curlin and Hard Spun and the like--and met a lot of wonderful people. I just thought the time was right to go out on my own."

St. George said he expects to do most of the major yearling and bloodstock sales on the East Coast this year. "I'll do all the major sales I can," he said. "I don't have any at Saratoga--of course I'd like to--but I have just under 40 at Keeneland September, and I plan on doing both Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky and Maryland sales, and then the Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton November sales."

In today's business climate, versatility can be a key component to success, and St. George keeps busy with a number of other ventures. He does some private bloodstock work, and was involved in the purchase of the current California grass star Cambina (Ire) (Hawk Wing), winner of three black-type events this year, including Santa Anita's GII Providencia S.

He also leases a portion of Overbrook with his wife Michelle that they run under the name Brookstone Farm. Michelle manages the farm, which, among other things, boards mares for clients and offers sale prep services.

"But my primary focus is the

sales--that's what I really enjoy," said St. George.


Among the standouts of St. George's July draft is hip 159, a filly from the third crop of the good young sire Pomeroy. Out of Willie Brook (Montbrook), the filly is a half-sister to SP Peachy Kiss (Impeachment). "She's a big, scopey filly who has a nice walk and a good depth of shoulder," said St. George. 



'DRAGON' CROWNED HONG KONG HORSE OF THE YEAR This season's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup hero Ambitious Dragon (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) was crowned Horse of the Year for the 2010/2011 season at the Hong Kong Jockey Club Champion Awards presentation ceremony, held yesterday during the final race meeting of the season at Sha Tin racecourse. The 4-year-old gelding also claimed the titles of champion Middle Distance Horse and Most Improved Horse In addition, he was voted Most Popular Horse by members of the public. The battle for the trainer's title, eagerly watched by the local fans, saw John Moore stage an improbable rally to best Tony Cruz. Moore was still two winners behind Cruz at the start of Sunday's races, but dramatically captured four of the last five races on the card to surpass Cruz with 74 wins in total against the latter's 72. He regained the champion trainer title for the first time since the 1994/95 season. Cruz didn't walk away empty-handed, though, as his charge Beauty Flash (NZ) (Golan {Ire}) was named champion miler. The 5-year-old's victories included the Cathay Pacific G1 Hong Kong Mile. The Ricky Yiutrained Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) earned the title of champion sprinter for the fourth year in succession. Last season's Horse of the Year survived a life-threatening colic attack in March last year, but returned to form to land a season-best victory in the Kent & Curwen Centenary Sprint Cup in January. Rocket Man (Aus) (Viscount {Aus}) was elected the inaugural most admired overseas horse of the year with 75,522 votes. The Singapore hero won the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen and the KrisFlyer G1 International Sprint. Douglas Whyte collected the jockeys' premiership for the eleventh consecutive year with 96 wins. He was also elected most popular Jockey of the Year for the sixth time with 103,913 votes. Vincent Ho became champion apprentice jockey for the first time in his second Hong Kong riding season with 39 wins.
