MISS KELLER HEADS TATTS MARES OPENER

The highpoint of day one of the Tattersalls December Mares Sale at Park Paddocks in Newmarket Monday came courtesy of **Miss Keller (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), winner of last month's GI E. P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. The 5-year-old, offered by Three Chimneys Sales, realised 625,000gns when knocked down to agent Michael Goodbody, acting for Australian owner Paul

Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds. Tomoyuki Nakamura of Japan's K I Farm, accompanied by agent Takai Murayama, was the underbidder.

"She's been bought for Waratah Thoroughbreds and won't race again," said Goodbody, who was seated with Fudge while bidding. "She'll be going to stud."

Case Clay was overseeing a select draft sent over from Three Chimneys, which was selling for a second year at the Tattersalls December Sale. Another member

of the draft, **Daneleta (Ire)** (Danehill), the dam of G1 Dewhurst S. winner Intense Focus (Giant's Causeway), was bought in for 400,000gns.

"We thought Miss Keller might make a bit more, but that was the price the market decided," said Clay. "We were pleased overall with our draft and there was a fair trade."

Clay added, "We first came to Tattersalls because, two years ago, when we sold Diamond Diva (GB) (Dansili {GB}) [for \$400,000 at FTKNOV in 2009], we thought she would have realised more in Newmarket with her European pedigree. So, we sold at Tattersalls last year, and when Miss Keller won the E. P. Taylor, we thought we'd bring her here. Daneleta throws beautiful foals and we'll get more babies out of her." *Cont. p2*

The mare is a full-sister to the dam of her buyers' Japanese Group 1 winner Eishin Apollon (Giant's Causeway).

Kemble Jumping for Joy...

Stephen Kemble may be better-known in jump racing circles, but his Northamptonshire-based Elms Stud holds the record for a broodmare sold at auction and he was once again one of the main players when selling **Dorcas Lane (GB)** (Norse Dancer {Ire}) for 475,000gns

to Bjorn Nielsen.
Consigned through Lucy
Wadham's Trainer's House
Stables, Dorcas Lane was
bred by Kemble's Elms
Stud Co Ltd and raced for
her breeder in partnership
with Richard Keeley, who
has had horses in training
with Wadham for a
number of years. With her
connections all closely
associated with the
National Hunt game, the

first-crop daughter of Norse Dancer, whose dam Waqood had already produced the high-class hurdler Faasel (Ire) (Unfuwain), was originally pencilled in to pursue a career over jumps herself.

"I bought [her dam] Waqood because of Faasel," says Kemble, who gave 30,000gns for the Shadwell-bred daughter of Riverman at this sale in 2005.

"The idea was for Dorcas Lane to go to France to run in the first 3-year-old fillies' hurdle race at Auteuil, but she needed flat experience, so we started at Lingfield in January and she won." *Cont. p3*

Sent off at 50-1 for the mile maiden on Lingfield's Polytrack Jan. 19, Dorcas Lane ensured she would never again be overlooked in the betting when scoring by four lengths on debut. Just over three months later, she won the Listed Pretty Polly S. at Newmarket's Guineas meeting and was subsequently placed in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot, the G2 Lancashire Oaks and G3 Prix de Psyche.

"Even in her 2-year-old year, Lucy [Wadham] said she was good, but she got sore shins, so she came home," said Kemble. "Then, obviously, she didn't go jumping and we realised she didn't handle soft ground. It rained heavily before her last run at Deauville [in the G2 Prix de la Nonette] and that was the only time she finished unplaced."

Unsuprisingly, after showing so much early promise, Dorcas Lane, who was the subject of several private bids from overseas throughout the season, will now remain in the U.K. to be trained by David Lanigan, who is in the process of moving from Newmarket to Bjorn Nielsen's Kingsdown Stables in Lambourn.

"There were offers early on from Australia for her, but we decided to wait for this sale," Kemble added. "People say Dorcas would be so much more valuable if she was by a different sire, but I want to breed a racehorse first and foremost. She has neither Danehill or Sadler's Wells in her pedigree, so she can go to both those sirelines."

Waqood died last year after conceiving to Sir Percy (GB), but Kemble--whose wife Louise is chief executive of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association--has a yearling half-sister to Dorcas Lane by the current champion National Hunt sire in Britain, Midnight Legend (GB).

"Our main interest is National Hunt, but we're very happy to have mares for flat breeders too," said Kemble, who consigned Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) for the late Con Wilson for a record 4.6 million guineas at Tattersalls' 2006 December Sale.


Dorcas Lane's co-owner, Richard Keeley, was also present at Park Paddocks and admitted to mixed feelings about the filly's sale.

"I never believed I'd own a horse as good as she is," he admitted. "I'm not looking forward to seeing her go. I can't even go into her box to say goodbye."

There was some consolation for Keeley, however, as Super Directa (Ger), a jumper he has in training with Wadham, won a beginners' chase at Ffos Las earlier in the afternoon.

Raffles Rejoicing after Major Updates...

Another outfit keen to secure Dorcas Lane, but who found themselves outmatched, was New Zealand's Raffles Farm, whose representative Bruce Sherwin was nonetheless delighted to have signed for the Sadler's Wells mare Gipsy Countess (Ire) -- in foal to Fastnet Rock (Aus)--for 300,000ans.

"This time last year, we bought six mares and we were really happy with the quality of mare we were able to buy and the value for money," said Sherwin. "Since then, two have had really good upgrades in the pedigree with [GSW & MIGSP] Pachattack (Pulpit) in particular, and Nephrite (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), who beat Sea The Stars' half-brother at Leopardstown [Oct. 30]."

Raffles Farm bought El Laoob (Red Ransom)--the dam of Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic-placed Pachattack--in foal to Azamour (Ire) for 100,000gns last year and Gabriella (GB), a Cape Cross (Ire) half-sister to Nephrite, in foal to Marju (Ire), for 50,000gns.

"We feel that the European mares are superior to what we've got in Australasia and the case has been proved with the dominance of the Europeans in the Melbourne Cup," said Sherwin. "For us, it all stems back to when Raffles Farm was initiated by Grant Stubbings 15 years ago. They came up here and bought seven mares on a much tighter budget and two produced Group 1 winners and one a Group 2 winner--that's a terrific strike rate from just seven mares."

Sherwin does not expect to take as many mares back home this year, but is looking to add a racing prospect to his list of purchases.

"We're very pleased with Gipsy Countess--she was our top pick in the sale and the Fastnet Rock covering was very appealing as he's been a superstar in Australasia," he explained. "We didn't think we had a big enough budget to get her."

Sherwin added, "There are a couple of others we're interested in later in the sale and we'd quite like to get a racemare. We really liked Dorcas Lane--she had a great attitude and a great walk."

Gask's a Fan of Anne...

Every trainer needs a tough and reliable campaigner to advertise their talents and, in the Oasis Dream (Ire) mare Anne Of Kiev (Ire), who sells today as lot 1783, ex-pat Australian Jeremy Gask has had just that this year. Since last November, she has won five times, including two listed contests, and was beaten a short-head in the Listed Boadicea Fillies' S. at Newmarket in October.

"It will be sad to see her go," said Gask, who has been training for three years for Horses First Racing at Beeches Farm in Wiltshire and currently has a string of around 60. "She's been a great mare and you need those kind of horses. At the same time, I'll be looking forward to seeing what she can do as a broodmare and seeing her offspring race."

The 6-year-old sprinter became Gask's first stakes winner in Britain since relocating from South Australia after eight seasons training in his home country.

"She's one of those mares that trainers love training-she eats well, she has her little habits that all good fillies have, but she's really tough and gives her all," he added.

Anne Of Kiev is no stranger to Park Paddocks. Purchased as a yearling for 250,000gns, she started her career from the stable of John Gosden, racing in the colours of Princess Haya of Jordan. She was subsequently purchased by Horses First Racing for 36,000gns as a 3-year-old at Tattersalls' horses-in-training sale and failed to find a buyer at 9,500gns when offered by her owner Philip Bamford's Dandys Farm at this sale last year. With a significant improvement in her racing record in the last 12 months she is unlikely to be led out of the ring unsold later today. -- Emma Berry







VEITCH FIRED AS KHRC CHIEF STEWARD

John Veitch, chief steward for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC), was fired yesterday during a meeting at the Commission's offices in Lexington. Veitch has been battling charges leveled against him by the KHRC following the controversial non-scratch of Life at Ten (Malibu Moon) in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic.

"John was called into the Racing Commission offices today, and when he got there, he was discharged," Veitch's lawyer Tom Miller confirmed Monday evening. "They told him he was discharged without cause. They didn't give him any explanation at all, and that was it." The dismissal is effective immediately.

Veitch was told that, because he was fired without cause, he could not appeal the decision. "We don't know if that's correct or not; we're going to look at the law and see what his rights are," said Miller. "But we're certainly going to do what we can to get him legal relief."


Prior to last year's Ladies' Classic, Life at Ten's jockey John Velazquez told ESPN during a live, pre-race interview that the 7-2 second choice in the wagering wasn't warming up like normal. Velazquez did not inform any of the 11 attending veterinarians or on-call stewards, however, and after Life At Ten broke last and trailed the field throughout, angry fans and bettors called for action.

After a three-month investigation, the KHRC reached a deal with Velazquez and fined him \$10,000, which the jockey paid without conceding guilt. Half of Velazquez's fine went to the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund. Veitch, whom the KHRC cited for five possible rule violations and for failing to request a post-race drug test, fought the charges. As the controversy dragged on, there was talk of friction between Veitch and KHRC executive director Lisa Underwood. Underwood has since left the commission to join a Lexington-based law firm.

On Nov. 14, a hearing officer in the investigation requested and was granted a 30-day extension to complete his report to the KHRC. The officer, Robert Layton, is drafting the report based on hearings conducted over the summer and is expected to issue recommendations on the case before the end of the year.

"We were already looking at our legal options based on the way John's been treated, as it appears that there was an interest in forcing his resignation or discharge based on the Life at Ten investigation," said Miller. "We'll continue to explore all options."

Miller said Veitch had not been asked to resign before today's dismissal. Veitch is a retired Hall of Fame trainer who conditioned, among others, Alydar, Our Mims and Sunshine Forever.



Snow Fairy will remain in training next year. "It is with great disappointment that we report Snow Fairy suffered an injury this morning at Sha Tin racecourse whilst doing a routine canter," revealed trainer Ed

Dunlop. "We have therefore withdrawn her from the Hong Kong Vase and she will return to England when she is fit to travel. Although this is a major disappointment for us, we are enormously proud of what she achieved in Japan earlier this month and we will advise everyone of her progress, as soon as she has returned home."

I suppose we should be thankful when a stallion lives to be 20 and leaves behind more than a thousand foals. But when the stallion is as potentially important as El Prado, it is only natural to wish that this champion sire had enjoyed similar longevity to his sire Sadler's Wells, grandsire Northern Dancer and broodmare sire Sir Ivor, all of whom were 26 when their last foals were conceived.

By the time El Prado succumbed to a heart attack in September 2009, he was already experiencing declining fertility. Having achieved a live foal percentage of 80% with his coverings in 2006, when he was 17, his figure fell to 65% in 2007 and then to only 30% in his last two years of activity. This means he is credited with only 26 2-year-olds this year, with his last crop numbering only 18 yearlings.

Of course those 26 2-year-olds include O'Prado Again, who justified his \$350,000 yearling tag by defeating some highly regarded youngsters in Saturday's GII Remsen S. Another of the 26 is Liquidity Trap, who failed by only half-length to land the King Cugat S. *Cont. p9*

I have pointed out before that the Remsen is often an important stepping stone. For a start, it has supplied four winners of the Kentucky Derby in the last 50 years, namely Northern Dancer, Pleasant Colony, Go for Gin and Thunder Gulch. Since 1985 Aqueduct's nine-furlong contest has also fallen to performers of the caliber of Java Gold (Travers S., Whitney H.), Pine Bluff (Preakness S.) and Coronado's Quest (Haskell Invitational and Travers S.).

Even though the Remsen was downgraded from Grade I to Grade II as long ago as 1987, its recent roll of honor also makes impressive reading. The winners from 2005 include Bluegrass Cat (Haskell Invitational and second in the Kentucky Derby and Belmont), Nobiz Like Shobiz (Wood Memorial), Court Vision (Hollywood Derby and Breeders' Cup Mile) and To Honor And Serve (the recent Cigar Mile winner who defeated the future Kentucky Derby third Mucho Macho Man in last year's Remsen).

O'Prado Again therefore has plenty to live up to, all the more so because he shares the same sire as two of Kentucky's hottest young stallions. Medaglia d'Oro, who was represented by his seventh graded winner of the year when So Brilliant took the GIII Hollywood Prevue S., currently ranks sixth on the sires' list by North American earnings.

One place below him is Kitten's Joy, who also holds second place among the juvenile sires and the sires of turf performers. Kitten's Joy has Stephanie's Kitten among his five graded winners--a total which has helped propel his fee up to \$50,000 next year.

El Prado now has six graded winners among his nine stakes winners this year, which come from a total of only 91 runners in North America. The other five comprise three turf winners and two all-weather performers, which rather conforms to the stereotype that dirt generally doesn't bring out the best in Sadler's Wells's American descendants. It's true that Artie Schiller, Kitten's Joy, Paddy O'Prado, Spanish Moon and Winter Memories were turf specialists, but Medaglia d'Oro thrived on the main track and Borrego earned more than \$2 million on dirt.

El Prado was bred in Ireland, where he won three group races as a 2-year-old, including the G1 National S., and where both his parents, Sadler's Wells and Lady Capulet, were Guineas winners. Further generations of his pedigree also owed a lot to Europe, as he was inbred 5x5x4 to the Epsom Derby winner Mahmoud and 5x4 to the Irish-bred Turn-to. Of course both these imports exerted a powerful influence on American bloodstock and El Prado's pedigree contains plenty of top-notch dirt performers.

Lady Capulet was a three-parts-sister to Drone. Unbeaten during an abbreviated four-race career, Drone went on to sire the dams of two Kentucky Derby winners (Charismatic and Grindstone), as well as the dams of Princess Rooney and Dancing Brave.

It is surely significant that O'Prado Again produced his best effort when returned to dirt for the first time since his debut in June. His only previous victory came in a race forced off the turf onto Polytrack.

Kent Desormeaux was impressed, commenting that: "He's a horse you can move into a spot and sit again, which is characteristic of a serious horse. He's got gears. He's silky smooth, like [Fusaichi Pegasus] was. You can't tell his feet hit the ground. He's really, really smooth."

The colt's handler, Dale Romans, commented that the further O'Prado Again goes, the better he gets. This is a little surprising, as the youngster's dam Leh She Run is inbred 3x3 to Mr. Prospector, through his daughter Preach and son Fappiano.

Leh She Run retired without earning a single dollar in three starts and she sold for only \$25,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November Sale. However, 2003 was the year that Leh She Run's stakes-winning half-sister Freddie Frisson produced a colt by Giant's Causeway. Named First Samurai, he proved himself one of the best juveniles of 2005, with a pair of Grade I victories.

Although none of O'Prado Again's first four dams earned black-type, this shouldn't be interpreted to mean that this isn't a fine family. The colt's third dam, the 2-year-old winner Mavera, now has seven graded winners descending from her, others being A Huevo (GI Frank J de Francis Memorial Dash), Kantharos (GII Saratoga Special S.) and Jeranimo (a multiple Grade II winner at up to a mile and an eighth).

Other major winners whose dams are closely inbred to Mr. Prospector include the fast filly Dream Rush (dam inbred 3x2) and this year's Acorn S. and CCA Oaks winner It's Tricky (3x3).

I recently read online that NBC will be televising the prep races for the Kentucky Derby. So, here is my opinion on that topic.

Televising the prep races is a good idea. Being familiar with the runners and forming personal favorites of horses with the racing fans is a great idea. But aside from the idea of televising the races, my objection is with the televising production, referencing most recently to the Breeders' Cup races.

As a horseplayer for many years, I like watching the race. Don't impress me with aerial views from the blimp during the actual running of the race, or head-on camera angles with cameras under the track-rail as the approaching horses "thunder at the camera," give me a break, show me the race, from start to finish. The cameras should be utilized to bring my eyes closer to the "action," like in days gone by.

Years ago, nearly any serious racing fan had a pair of binoculars strapped around his/her neck. Then as technology progressed, the television cameras were brought into the scenario and the racing fans had an option of the binoculars or finding a spot at the racetrack, in front of a monitor and watch the race. The television monitors at the track show you the "race" without trying to impress anyone. The cameras follow the horses from "they're off" to announcing the horse crossing the finish line.

Look, don't get me wrong, I am impressed with the camera technologies, but listen to me as a horse player, show me the "race," without confusing me with all the camera angles that flash across my television screen during the race. I lose the concentration as to where the horses are in relation to the actual race. All the glitz of the blimp overhead shot or the head-on or tail-up, I get confused as to how far they have run and how much is left in the race. All of that should be reserved for the post-race replays and not used during the actual running of the race. The camera should be locked on the starting gate and follow the horses as they run the entire race, using the "binocular" technology to put us closer to the action like the horse players viewed in years gone by.

JOCKEY DIES FOLLOWING FALL

Apprentice jockey Benjamin Boutin has died of his injuries following a fall at Argentan Saturday. He was 21. Boutin was involved in a four-horse incident at the Normandy track and had been in a coma on a lifesupport machine since being transferred from a hospital in Argentan to an intensive care facility at Alencon, where he passed away yesterday morning. Boutin was riding Pascal Bary trainee Game of Legs (Fr) (Hernando {Fr}) when the accident occurred during the second division of the apprentices' maiden. Before joining Bary, he had been attached to the stables of Joel Remy, Didier Prod'homme and namesake Cedric Boutin, and had ridden eight winners this year. Riders at yesterday's Lyon Parilly meet wore black armbands in honor of their colleague. "Benjamin was well-liked, he always wanted to improve and he never did anything that made him disliked by anyone," said trainer Cedric Boutin. "He was well-educated with simple values." Jockey Ronan Thomas added, "Nobody in our profession can fail to be affected by Benjamin Boutin's death at just 21 years of age. What has happened will spur us on to develop better safety measures and better emergency services. It is the only light to come out of this situation."
