Notably absent from the list is champion and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike), who was sidelined following her dominant score at Churchill Downs. Trainer Bob Baffert,

who won last year's Oaks with Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro), has six nominated this time, including GI Las Virgenes S. heroine Eden's Moon (Malibu Moon) and recent **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O**s Princess Arabella (Any Given Saturday) and Mamma Kimbo (Discreet Cat).

Todd Pletcher, who took the Oaks with Rags to Riches (2007) and Ashado (2004), led all trainers with eight nominated fillies. Among them are Grade II winners **Disposablepleasure** (Giacomo) and **Broadway Alibi** (Vindication).

Also inominated are GI Hollywood Starlet winner Killer Graces (Congaree), Grade II winner



143 LEFT IN EPSOM DERBY

Epsom racecourse yesterday announced 143 entries remain engaged in the June 2 G1 Investec Derby following Tuesday's confirmation stage. The £1.25-million contest is the first official event to mark The Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations, and the day's card will also play host to the G1 Diamond Jubliee Coronation Cup.

Current ante-post favorite **Camelot (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), impressive winner of last term's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster, is one of 25 possibles trained by Aidan O'Brien, who was last successful with High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in 2002. Team Godolphin boasts a collective entry of 26, with equal representation from Saeed bin Suroor and Mahmood Al Zarooni. John Oxx--who claimed a second "Blue Riband" with Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in 2009--has five still engaged, including Sea the Stars' half-brother **Born to Sea (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Their dam, Urban Sea (Miswaki), was also responsible for 2001 hero Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

All 143 nominees were entered as yearlings in December 2010, but, for those who missed the initial entry deadline, there is an £8,000 second entry stage Apr. 3, and a £75,000 supplementary stage May 28.




victory in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S., has been retired from racing. Stud plans have yet to be finalized. The attractive bay was purchased at the 2009 Keeneland September yearling sale for

\$230,000 by agent Ben McElroy on behalf of the Hamiltons' Silverton Hill LLC and first emerged on the scene in a maiden at The Curragh on Irish Oaks day when easily defeating a field of highly touted maidens by four lengths. Pathfork then went on to win the G2 Futurity S. ahead of the National S., in which he defeated subsequent G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), with a further seven lengths back to favored Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}). Pathfork returned to action as the joint second-favorite behind Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the 2011 G1 English 2000 Guineas, but was sidelined thereafter. He joined the California barn of John Sadler in 2012, but X-rays taken Mar. 6 revealed an injury to the back of his left knee called an osteochondroma. Sadler said the colt appeared fine immediately after a Mar. 2 allowance race, but he noticed his was slightly off the next day and decided to have an X-rays taken. "It's a tremendous shame, because this horse had the ability to match his great looks and he had a tremendous mind," Sadler commented. "I think he would have needed considerable time off, and I think Mr. Hamilton decided it was time to retire him." Pathfork, produced by a stakes-winning half-sister to champion and GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Spinning World, hails from a deep Niarchos family. "When you look at the list of past champion 2-year-old colts in Ireland, it definitely makes for impressive reading," stated Tommy Hamilton. "I think it certainly helps his credentials to become an attractive proposition for breeders wherever he may stand."



An \$800,000 yearling purchase at the 2009 Keeneland September sale, the filly won her first two career starts at Oaklawn last season, before finishing second in the GII Fantasy S. According to Peitz, breathing problems, wet tracks and other ailments plagued Arienza throughout her racing career and kept her from her true potential. "We were hoping she would come back and develop into a really nice 4-year-old," he said. "She just never came back to the good form she had last year and she had the breathing issue last year too. We just got to the point where we knew it was time to go home."

RACING RETURNS TO MONMOUTH MAY 12: *Edited Press Release*


Live racing will return to Monmouth Park May 12, it was announced yesterday by the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. With a lease extended from the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority to the NJTHA expected in early May, the latter will take over at the Oceanport oval for this year's 67th season. The 2012 calendar will feature 65 days at Monmouth Park and 10 all-turf days at the Meadowlands in East Rutherford. The Monmouth calendar closely mirrors the 2010 and 2011 schedules, with one notable change: four twilight cards on Thursdays in August, with a first post of 4:00 pm.

"We're taking what we know worked in the past and coupling it with some new and innovative ideas," said John Forbes, president of the NJTHA. "It will no longer be business as usual at Monmouth Park. We will not shy from new ideas and events that we hope prove popular with fans and horsemen alike. Our 2012 schedule is the first step in ensuring Monmouth Park's prominence within the racing industry as we strive to enhance our simulcast appeal, develop a more fan-friendly atmosphere and provide all patrons with world-class Thoroughbred racing."

Dennis Drazin and Bob Kulina, executives with Monmouth Park's new management company, expressed optimism for the future of New Jersey racing.

"We're excited that the horsemen will control their own destiny and look forward to working with them to build a long-term, sustainable racing industry in the Garden State," according to a joint statement issued by the men.

Monmouth will race Saturdays and Sundays for the first three weeks, after which Fridays will be added to the schedule beginning June 1 continuing through the first week in September. The Saturday and Sunday schedule will return Sept. 8 and continue through Oct. 7. Three holiday cards will also be offered: Memorial Day Monday, May 28; Fourth of July Wednesday, July 4; and, Labor Day Monday, Sept. 3. Thoroughbred racing at the Meadowlands will be kicked off May 4 and 5. Following Monmouth's last live card Sunday, Oct. 7, Thoroughbreds will head back to the Big M for racing on Fridays and Saturdays from Oct. 12 through Nov. 3. Thoroughbreds have not raced at the Meadowlands since 2009. All racing dates are pending approval by the New Jersey Racing Commission.



JOCKEY CLUB REPORTS ON PROGRESS

The Jockey Club issued a second update of its efforts to implement initiatives recommended by McKinsey & Company last August. Several of the initiatives are due to be launched in the near future. The project is being overseen by Jason Wilson, vice president of business development for The Jockey Club, with assistance from several other consultants. McKinsey will be re-engaged in the coming months to update their initial report.

The main initiatives are as follows:

- In an effort to engage new and casual fans, The Jockey Club has developed the brand "America's Best Racing," which will focus on the two seasons of racing--the Triple Crown trail into the Classics, and the Breeders' Cup approach in late summer and fall. Social media is expected to be a major part of this campaign, and a fan-centric website will be launched Apr. 4.
 - Having more racing televised nationally was a major goal, and there will be a 63% increase in the number of Grade I races on television from July 23, 2011 to June 9, 2012 than during the same timeframe 12 months earlier. Most of this is due to the expansion of programming on NBC and NBC Sports Network.
 - Expanding the types of television programming offered was also suggested in the McKinsey study. Reality television, which attracts many viewers across varied demographics, is one avenue, and The Jockey Club has set aside \$100,000 to assist in funding preview reels that would be pitched to networks. The organization is also in discussions with a major cable network that produces and televises sports reality shows and documentaries.
 - The development of a more fan-centric site called followhorseracing.com for "America's Best Racing" will be launched the week of Mar. 11. As of Apr. 4, traffic from the ntra.com site will be redirected to the new site.
 - NTRA Communications has been attempting to find, develop and pitch stories to mainstream media, while engaging fans through social media. Media placements are anticipated in Sports Business Daily, espn.com, Huffington Post, Bleacher Report, Big Lead Sports, Yahoo, and Askmen.com, among others. There is also a coordinated effort to to engage all racetrack publicity and/or marketing departments and bloggers to help support and drive the campaign.

The establishment of a central resource to encourage racehorse ownership and to provide accurate information about trainers, racing syndicates, owner licensing and racehorse retirement. "Thoroughbred OwnerView" is in the process of being developed to fill this void.

- The Jockey Club has engaged Lloyd Melnick, the executive producer of "Gardens of Time," one of the most popular social games to date, to oversee development of a social game for horse racing. The initial phases of design have been completed, and a May launch is expected.
- InCompass, with the assistance of McKinsey, is developing a tool and enhancing its Race Track Operations (RTO) system to help racing secretaries make informed decisions on writing race schedules and the best races to maximize field size and wagering handle. Beta testing for the scheduling tool will begin at two racetracks in mid-March, and InCompass personnel will be reaching out to other racetracks for additional testing in the near future.

CRANACH SCRATCH OPENS CUP

The task facing 2010 G1 Melbourne Cup hero Americain (Dynaformer) in Saturday's G1 Australian Cup became that much easier when it was learned



Americain Horsephotos yesterday that Lucas Cranach (Ger) (Mamool {Ire}) has suffered an injury and will be sidelined through the winter. Americain, now trained permanently in Australia by Hall of Famer David Hayes, took the G2 Moonee Valley Cup ahead of a gallant fourth in defense of his Melbourne Cup title Nov. 1.

Connections squeezed one more start out of him, and the popular 7-year-old validated favoritism in the G2 Sandown Classic Nov. 12, besting Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) by 3/4 of a length. The latter, owned in partnership by Earle Mack, was winner two back of the G2 Lyon Cup Feb. 11 and exits a third to Lucas Cranach in the G2 Peter Young S. at Caulfield Feb. 25.

HAY LIST THE MAROUEE IN THE NEWMARKET

Widely regarded as the best sprinter in Australia not named Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), Hay List (Aus) (Statue of Liberty) gets his shot at the spotlight in Saturday's G1 Newmarket H. at Flemington. The 6year-old has remarkably won two-thirds of his 21 career appearances, and, of his five runner-up efforts, four have come at the hands of the supermare. Hay List, second in the G1 BTC Cup May 14, was spelled thereafter and returned in the G1 Lightning S. Feb. 18, a race that was not originally to include Black Caviar. Much to the dismay of connections, she was there and Hay List finished 1 3/4 lengths adrift. Six of the last seven winners of this prestigious affair have either won or finished second in the Lightning S. Hay List will have a chance to add to that record, though he must shoulder top weight of 129 pounds.

"He's just a fast horse," said Davis, who last year consigned the :9 4/5 breezer and \$400,000 grad A Shin Blaster (Scat Daddy). "He does it very easily, and he galloped out very well today. He's got some size and stretch to him, as well."

The colt was the lone horse to shade :10 on a day when times were tightly grouped. Fourteen horses went in :10 flat, while a full 41 juveniles breezed in :10 1/5.

Two colts shared the fastest time for a quarter-mile breeze. <u>Hip 44</u>, by Bluegrass Cat out of Mesmerizing Lady (Unbridled's Song), went in :20 4/5 (<u>video</u>) for consignor Derby Dreams, agent. The Feb. 11-foaled bay was produced by a half to GSW & MGISP Spring Meadow (Meadowlake).

Matching that time (<u>video</u>) was <u>Hip 58</u>, a dark bay colt by Montbrook out of SP My Golden Quest (Coronado's Quest). The Florida-bred dark bay, an Apr. 6 foal, is consigned by Ocala Stud.

Conditions yesterday were ideal. The thermometer read 60 degrees at the 8 a.m. start time before



creeping up to around 80 by the conclusion past 1 p.m., and there was a mild tailwind down the stretch. Times on the day seemed to get a tick slower as the show progressed, but it might simply have been a case that the faster horses were grouped in the morning.

"I think it played very fair all day,"

Shari Eisaman

said Eisaman Equine's Shari Eisaman, who sent out 11 youngsters yesterday. "All the

horses we expected to work fast did, and some of the others ran how we thought they would. This track can be affected by heat, but I don't think it was today. If those latter breezes were at 4 p.m., and the track had been in the sun all day, then maybe, but I thought it was consistent. The only thing was that I thought it was a little loose on top--you could see that with the kickback--and I think it made some horses scramble a little bit."

They're not getting those baby injures--shins and things like that--and they're not suffering fractures. Sometimes they can get a little muscle sore, but you can work with that. All our horses today came out great."

What They're Sayingat the Sales

Doug Cauthen, on a busy few weeks at the juvenile sales:

"I didn't go to Barretts [March]--I've been here all week. I'd rather do this sale really well, then do two sales moderately. You've got to have a team to do all of



them, and I have two people, Katie [Cauthen's wife] and another person, and it would have been a challenge. But with this sale, the sale at Palm Meadows [Fasig-Tipton Florida] and in Kentucky [Keeneland April], that's a pretty good piece of the pie.

"I bought Right To Vote (Political Force) in here last year, and he's a nice horse. There were a lot of good physicals in here last year, and so far, I've seen probably 60-

70% of them on the end of a shank this year. I think the reduction in number is going to make things more competitive, but I've been pleased with what I've seen. There are some interesting finds." Note: Right to Vote, a \$20,000 OBS March grad, broke his maiden in his second career start at Belmont last September before running third, beaten 5 1/2 lengths by Union Rags (Dixie Union), in the GI Champagne S. in October. He hasn't raced since, but breezed five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 at Palm Meadows Mar. 1. He's owned by Casner Racing LP and Sam Pollock and trained by Eoin Harty.

West Point Thoroughbreds's Terry Finley, who said he doesn't mind the reshuffling of sales dates that occurred this year:

"For the last couple of years, with Barretts in the middle of everything, you had to take the red-eye, which I don't like anymore. We didn't have to do that, and I was able to go back to New Jersey to repack and then came down here. But all that's stuff you can't control. It's just the schedule, and you can fret about it."

Editor's Note: For the record, 16 more letters were sent to TOBA and other racing officials yesterday from TDN readers in reaction to Bill Oppenheim's Wednesday column (click <u>here</u>), which means the current count stands at 58 for banning race-day medications, either entirely or at least in 2-year-old graded stakes, and two opposed to the ban.

To whom it may concern,

It would be against my nature generally to interfere in the rules of racing of another nation but the reputation of American bred and raced stock has dropped so much internationally that I feel I have no choice.

Most Europeans of my generation who love racing and breeding grew up in awe of the quality of American-bred greats such as Sir Ivor, Mill Reef, Nijinsky, Secretariat, Sunday Silence, Cigar and Sadler's Wells to name but a handful. But currently on my travels to the races and sales in Ireland, Great Britain and France a frequently discussed topic is the demise in the quality and endurance of American horses because they are so dependant on drugs for racing and it is a widely held belief that chronic bursting/bleeding is endemic in American-bred horses. Much of this belief stems from people's first hand experience of U.S.-bred stock when they were put into a racing environment with zero tolerance of lasix. We are all aware too of horses which couldn't compete in Europe because they bled so badly, but went on to achieve success at a high level in America with the assistance of medication.

The effects of this for your breeders is that many European purchasers who annually traveled to Kentucky to purchase U.S.-bred weanlings, yearlings or broodmares no longer do so because they believe your bloodstock is now inferior and unsound. It's going to take a lot of work to turn this mindset around but if you don't do something about it soon the commercial breeders in Kentucky will be left with a product the major international racing community no longer wants.

I was relieved to read in Wednesday's TDN a more balanced and complete accounting of the entire process and time line involved with the AGSC's recent activities which have been so widely disparaged in recent days. When Dr. Richardson and his fellow AGSC members initiated the plan to ban medications in 2YO graded stakes, I think they believed in their hearts it was the right thing to do. Their attempt was to strengthen the integrity of our sport-for the benefit of the horses, owners, breeders, trainers and handicappers. My read of Bill Oppenheim's further exploration and explanation of the process, coupled with TOBA President Dan Metzger's statement, is that it hopefully represents an appropriate retraction of some of the sharp criticism. I found it disrespectful to call out Dr. Richardson personally for a situation beyond his control. He has put in tireless hours on the industry's behalf as a horseman, owner and respected leader. He is only representing the committee's wishes but is not empowered to make the changes our industry requires. The message should be clear to us all that our sport has a global attraction and relies on the quality of our U.S. horses and the caliber of racing we have. If we fail to recognize this, we risk losing it all.

Oaklawn Announces Third Purse Hike:

Owing to double-digit increases in racing and Instant Gaming/gaming handle during the month of February, officials at Oaklawn Park have announced a third purse hike which will result in \$51,000 maiden allowance races. On-track handle was ahead by 30% last month, while off-track handle advanced by 33%. Increases for Instant Gaming was up by a similar amount. "We have enjoyed a very positive trend this meet," said David Longinotti. "Good weather with no missed days of racing and only one missed day of training has led to large, quality fields and our fans have responded. The Usual Q. T. (Unusual Heat--Lunge, by Western Fame), one of the most consistent turf performers over the last several years, has been retired from racing, trainer James Cassidy said Thursday. "There were too many issues this time," Cassidy said. "He's been a great horse. He's right up there with the best I've ever trained along with any other horse I had, including Evening Jewel, Ticker Tape, Diamond Diva, Singhalese--all of them." Only off the board once in 17 turf tries, the California-bred won the 2009 GI Hollywood Derby and added the GI Eddie Read S. the following season. That year, he was also a very good fourth against some of the world's best in the G1Dubai Duty Free S. and was third, beaten just two lengths, behind Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He faced the starter just once this term, a third in the GII San Gabriel S. Jan. 16. The gelding retires with eight wins from 23 career starts and earnings of \$1,531,240.

SMART MISSILE RETIRED TO ARROWFIELD

Multiple group winner Smart Missile (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}--Comical Smile, by Comic Strip) has been retired and will enter stud later this year at Arrowfield Stud. A stud fee has not yet been announced for the sophomore. Campaigned by breeder Eduardo Cojuangco's Gooree Pastoral Co., the bay colt defeated Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality) in the G2 Todman S. last March and vied for favoritism in the G1 Golden Slipper, but was a late scratch after an incident near the stalls. He returned as a 3-year-old to capture the G3 Run to the Rose S. in August. The following month, Smart Missile missed by a head in the G1 Golden Rose S., and retires with a record of 6-3-1-0 and earnings of A\$540,000. "In our view, he was clearly the best 2-year-old of a stellar generation, with the best of him not seen at three," said Arrowfield chairman John Messara. "Smart Missile made the impossible look easy, and in our view it's that X factor which separates the exceptional from the merely outstanding. [He] is absolutely everything we look for in a stallion prospect. I am delighted that his breeder and owner Mr. Eduardo Cojuangco has entrusted the management of his stud career to Arrowfield." Jon Freyer, the stud's bloodstock manager, added, "Smart Missile is a son of the leading sire Fastnet Rock and he is, in our view, most definitely the best of his sire's male progeny. His turn of foot was visually quite remarkable, and is confirmed by examination of the sectional times he ran. Although he was narrowly and unluckily beaten in the G1 Golden Rose, it was an amazing performance and confirmed to most his status as an elite Group 1 quality horse."

NOVERRE DIES

Noverre (Rahy--Danseur Fabuleux, by Northern Dancer), a Group 1 winner for Godolphin before achieving success as a stallion, died unexpectedly in India, according to published reports. The 14-year-old stallion was standing at Sohna Stud at the time of his death. Winner of the G3 July S. and G2 Champagne S. during his first season on the racecourse, the bay also ran second in both the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Dewhurst S. He was second to Street Cry (Ire) in the UAE 2000 Guineas in his sophomore bow. First past the post in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, the bay later had that title stripped after a post-race test revealed a banned substance. Noverre, runner-up in the G1 St James's Palace S., earned a top-level trophy in the G1 Sussex S. He notched additional placings in the 2001 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., 2002 G1 Dubai Duty Free and 2002 G1 Lockinge S., and retired to Ireland's Kildangan Stud with a record of 21-5-8-3 and earnings of £999,519. Noverre sired Group 1 winners Le Havre (Fr), Enora (Ire) and Music Show (Ire) among his 18 stakes winners before being sold to Sohna Stud in 2008.
