





IT'S SHOWTIME

Contrary to the steady build-up to Tuesday's session-topping yearling on the opening day of the Inglis Easter Yearling sale in Sydney, day 2 at the Newmarket complex kicked off with fireworks only a few lots into the sale. In the moments leading up to lot 200--a Redoute's Choice (Aus) half-sister to Australian sensation Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus})--entering the arena, the crowd quickly expanded and the excitement mounted with every passing moment. The

battle got underway briskly, with an opening A\$1-million bid. Reality quickly set in and the bidding eased back to A\$100,000 volleys through much of the remainder of the exchange. Among those involved in the protracted battle was Bill Vlahos of BC3

Thoroughbreds, stationed among the crowd under the famed fig tree; and Japanese trainer Toshiaki Shirai, representing a Japanese client. When all was said and done, the gavel came down with a final bid of A\$2.6 million from Vlahos--flanked by Victoria-based trainer Danny O'Brien-who outlasted Shirai. Both highly regarded in their own right, the purchase represented the first purchase for Vlahos and O'Brien.

"I think at about A\$2.5-million I got a little bit wobbly," said Vlahos, a well-known pinhooker in the U.S. and Australia. "But we pretty much stuck to our price. We think she is worth exactly what we paid for her; too much more, and it might not be us owning her, but I think that's exactly I think she's worth and, hopefully, more by the end of her racing career."

O'Brien, who is probably best known for recent star performers two-time Group 1 winner Star Witness (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) and Shamrocker (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), winner of the G1 Australian Derby and G1 Australian Guineas, added, "Fillies like this would generally be retained by their breeders, so this really was a once-ina-generation opportunity to buy a filly like this. She not only has an outstanding pedigree, but she is an outstanding individual herself." *Cont. p3*

HANSEN FAVORED IN BLUE GRASS

Eclipse champion juvenile **Hansen** (Tapit) drew post four in a 13-horse field for Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland and was promptly installed the

6-5 morning-line favorite. Trainer Mike Maker was satisfied with the draw for the gray champion, who is coming off an impressive victory in the Mar. 3 GIII Gotham S. "It's better than the 1 or 13," Maker said. As for race strategy, Maker added, "I'll leave it in Ramon [Dominguez's] hands. That's what we're paying him for." Donegal Racing's **Dullahan** (Even the Score) returns to the site of his win in last year's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity after a runner-up effort over the Gulfstream turf in the Mar. 11 GIII Palm Beach S. The chestnut

breaks from post six and is the 6-1 co-second choice in the Blue Grass. "Post six is a good spot for us to be inright in the middle so you don't have to worry about sending him," remarked trainer Dale Romans. "Kent [Desormeaux] can put him pretty much where he wants to be." *Cont. p7*

11 ENTERED IN ARKANSAS DERBY

Bob Baffert, who already swept both divisions of Oaklawn's GIII Southwest S., as well as the track's GII Rebel S., saddles the top two choices in Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby. Zayat Stable's Bodemeister (Empire Maker), coming off a runner-up effort behind Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway) in the Mar. 10 GII San Felipe S., is the 9-5 morning-line choice and breaks from the outside in the 11-horse field. Stablemate and Rebel winner Secret Circle (Eddington) breaks from post five and is the 5-2 second choice for owners Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman. "This'll be a good race with some nice horses in there," Baffert said. "I think Bodemiester will be tough. These are two really good horses and, even though I don't like to get ahead of myself, it's always special just to have a horse that has a chance in the Kentucky Derby, so hopefully we wind up with one of those on Saturday." Of their newest purchase, Vlahos added, "This family is just out of the box and this will probably be the last chance to buy into it. Being a filly, she always has her residual value, so I think that's a bit of a safety net."

Vlahos, who has often broached the million-dollar mark in pursuit of a top-rung youngster, admitted he had to pull out extra for the Redoute's Choice filly.

"We are not a syndicate and never will be, we actually have big clients who want to jump into her," confirmed Vlahos. "We obviously already have backers in her at the moment, because at that price we wouldn't be going out on a limb. She will going through the basic pre-program, and in about July or August she will be going to Danny's property."



Back in Black...

The talking horse in the week leading up to the sale, the bay is out of the Desert Sun (GB) mare Helsinge (Aus), who became famous for her first foal, the undefeated Australian Horse of the Year Black Caviar who has accounted for an astounding 17 group races, including nine at the Group 1 level. The star mare is trained by Peter Moody, who was among the underbidders on yesterday's session topper. The 11-year-old's third foal, All Too Hard (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}), topped the Easter sale with a A\$1.025-million last season. Also undefeated, the juvenile recently won the Mar. 31 G2 Pago Pago S. and is likely to be favored for Saturday's G1 Sires' Produce S. The second foal out of the mare is three-time winner Moshe (Aus), a full-brother to Black Caviar.

"The mare [Helsinge] is still quite young and this is her fourth foal, but she has shown us what an outstanding producer she has been with the three foals that have already raced--Black Caviar, Moshe and All Too Hard--and this filly is by arguably the best stallion she has ever been to."

Rick Jamieson, who bred those individuals through his Gilgai Farm, currently owns the budding blue-hen Helsinge. A native of Australia, Jamieson is well known for his success with the entertainment equipment rentals company, Harry the Hirer. The Sydney resident has been in the game for over two decades, and his broodmare band totals 20 mares. *Cont. p4*

"The breeding thing for me was just a hobby, and it has sort of been blown out of control," admitted Jamieson. "It was just fun and I was fortunate to start breeding some really good horses."

When asked about the final figure, Jamieson admitted, "I didn't really know what to expect, to be honest with you. "I am very happy with the result. She was always going to sell, but I didn't have a number."

The unraced Helsinge has a Redoute's Choice weanling colt and is carrying a full-sibling to Black Caviar.

"I think the big story here is that we are starting to see the evolement of a dynasty," Jamieson admitted. "There is definitely something special with this family. I'm pleased this filly is going to stay in Australia, and let's cross our fingers that she is as good as the others."

Upping the Ante...

BC3 Thoroughbreds' Bill Vlahos, who pinhooks with John Brocklebank both in the U.S. and here, owns an unnamed, 40-acre tract of land on the Bellarine Peninsula in Torquay. Currently, BC3 owns a total of 30 head, 16 of those yearlings. Since the pinhooking game is not as structured in Australia as in the United States, BC3 Thoroughbreds trains its juveniles at the farm and presents them to prospective clients through trials between races at neighboring racecourses or conducted through its own sale.

Trainers currently employed by BC3 Thoroughbreds is Kevin Newby, David Hayes and Mick Price. Despite having achieved plenty of success in the pinhooking ranks, Vlahos hopes yesterday's purchase will help the operation branch off into a different direction than the native Australian had been formerly associated with.


"We've had a very good history developing horses, and with Danny O'Brien, we really look to get the Bellarine on the map, and we think think this is the kind of horse to do it," Vlahos commented.

Shortly following the purchase, Vlahos confirmed O'Brien will train the filly.

"We were both looking to get involved with this filly," said O'Brien, explaining the joining of forces for yesterday's top prize. "We already have a couple of horses with Bill; he's probably only a kilometer from us, and the BC3 program has been very successful in getting their horses up and running and see them through right through their racing career. It seemed like a good fit and for things to come together like that, I think it's a good start."

Top Choice on Day 2...

When Black Caviar's little sister strode out of the sales' ring during Wednesday's second session of the Easter sale, she made history by becoming the highest-priced filly ever for her sire, Redoute's Choice. Through nine crops offered at the Easter sale, Redoute's Choice has had 340 yearlings sell for an aggregate of A\$187.6 million and an average of A\$551,853. Yesterday's sale represented the 60th seven-figure horse for the Arrowfield stallion. Among his best offspring to pass through the Easter ring are Samantha Miss (Aus), Nadeem (Aus) and Miss Finland (Aus).

The Makybe Tradition...

Tony Santic knows a good horse when he sees one. Famed for breeding and campaigning three-time G1 Melbourne Cup winner Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}), Santic, one of Australia's leading tuna fisherman, purchased the former Roxby in 2003 and renamed the property in honour of his champion mare.

Under the Makybe banner, Santic is best known for breeding Australian and European champion sprinter Starspangledbanner (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}, who won the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and G1 July Cup in Britain, as well as the G1 Caulfield Guineas and Oakleigh Plate S. in his native Australia. Makybe, spanning 3,200 acres in the foothills of the Barrabool Hills facing the Barwon River, is a multi-service commercial operation, including yearling preparation, foaling down facilities, weaning, handling and bloodstock management



LUCKY 13 IN THE BLUE GRASS

Dullahan tuned up for the Blue Grass with a bullet five-furlong drill in :57.40 at Keeneland Sunday. "It's a big field, but he fits in there great, especially after that last work," Dale Romans continued. "Even though he's only had one start this year, that work told me he's tight enough to run with anybody. He was in hand and galloped out strong. And he really likes this track."


Team Valor's **Howe Great** (Hat Trick {Jpn}), who held on to defeat Dullahan in the GIII Palm Beach S., began his career on the dirt at Parx, has made his last three starts on the lawn, and tries a synthetic surface for the first time Saturday. The dark bay colt breaks from post 10 and is 6-1. "I'd rather be in the six if I could get it," admitted Team Valor's Barry Irwin. "The farther out you are here the worse it is.

"This can be a very tactical race," Irwin continued.
"Even though there looks like there's a lot of speed on paper, I think the field is going to be within seven or eight lengths of each other. If it's a spread out race, the post doesn't matter for any of them. But if it's compact race, then it's bad because you can have trouble saving ground."

"Secret Circle has been getting the distance so far," said Baffert. "He hasn't shown me he can't get it--they can all get it until they show you they can't." Jockey Jon Court will look for a third straight Arkansas Derby victory aboard Bluegrass Hall's Optimizer (English Channel) -- a closing second in the Rebel. He breaks from post seven and is 30-1.



RUSSELL BAZE ELECTED TO CANADIAN HALL OF FAME Jockey Russell Baze was among five 2012 inductees into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame

inductees into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. The Vancouver-born rider, already a member of the U.S. racing Hall of Fame, has won more races than any jockey in history. Ontario breeder Aubrey Minshall will join the hall in the builder category. The Guyana native, who died in 1993, was posthumously recognized by the industry when his Minshall Farms was named both leading owner and breeder in Canada in 1996. He campaigned Horse of the Year Mt. Sassafras. Elected in the equine category were: Robert Costigan's 2006 Horse of the Year Arravale (Arch); Catherine Day's 2007 GI Arlington Million winner Jambalaya (Langfuhr); and Jean Louis Levesque's 1977 champion 2-year-old filly and Horse of the Year L'Alezane (Dr. Fager). The induction ceremony for the Hall of Fame's class of 2012 will be held Aug. 16 at the Mississauga Convention Centre.



THE NEW GENERATION: WHY MY SON DOESN'T LIKE HORSE RACING

by Sue Finley

Last week, during our school's spring break, I took my son to Seattle to visit the Boeing airplane factory. My son is a bit of an aviation junkie, and going to an airport or on a plane with him generally provokes discussion that goes like this:

Ryan: "Mom, do you see that 737-800 over there?"

Me: "The US Airways plane, right there?"

Ryan: "Oh, my god, Mom. That's an Airbus A-319."

Me: "How can you tell?"

Ryan: "How can you tell? It's a completely different style of engineering. Do you see how the wingtips on the 737 are advanced blended winglets? They reduce lift-induced drag and are now available as a standard production line option for all 737s, except of course, for the 600 series, where they're still assessing the applicability."

Me: "Oh."

Ryan: "The A-319s have wingtip fences. And of course, the new Boeing 747-8i and 8f, as well as the 787-8 and 787-9 have raked wingtips."

Me: "Of course." Ryan is 13.

So, for five days, we spent every minute of every day trolling through a half-dozen museums dedicated to aviation history. We hit the Heritage of Flight collection, where Rvan showed me the oh-so-obvious difference between the B-25 Mitchell and B-26 Marauder (which

happened to be the plane that bombed my father's POW train during World War II in a friendly fire incident). It had something to do with two side thingees on the tail...and a 75 millimeter

cannon...l think.

We saw the Future of Flight center, where we designed our own aircraft; went to the Museum of Flight, where we climbed aboard the original Air Force One; and took the Boeing factory tour twice, where there's some chance Ryan knew as much if not more than the tour guide. No sooner

When I called friends at home to report all of this, one friend said to me, "I wish I had spent my youth being obsessed with something productive like aviation, instead of horses."

And it made me start to wonder...why isn't Ryan obsessed with horses? It's certainly not his upbringing. He has been to the Haskell and the Breeders' Cup, to our box at Monmouth, to horse farms to see mares and

> foals, and the retired racehorse we sponsor.

Had my parents taken me to Seattle when I was 13, I would have coaxed them into taking me to Longacres, where I would have obsessed over Kenny Skinner's ROI on the turf, compared to his dirt stats. When I was a kid, we used to go to Hialeah on spring break.

Furthermore, Ryan is an animal lover, as I was as a child. He participates in the family's dog rescue efforts, and can't bear to watch any film in which an animal might be harmed. I had to promise him that Secretariat would make it through a whole career unscathed, as would all of his

competitors, before we could go see that film.

And the sad realization I have come to is that racing, for many reasons, no longer feels like a sport that attracts the animal lover, as it did when I was a child.

As a teen, I would wander around Belmont, looking at the huge, beautiful posters comparing the Thoroughbred racehorse to the cheetah. "Hay, oats and water" was a gigantic selling point to someone like me, one which I continued to use through my days as a NYRA PR flack to assure visiting media that the people in New York cared for horses like nowhere on earth.

Today, I'd have a hard time justifying raceday medication to my son. I'd have a hard time explaining why jockeys whip the horses if they love them so much. I'd have a hard time telling him that with a national catastrophic breakdown rate of 1.91 per 1,000 starts (about double what it was at NYRA when I was a teenager), that statistically, every 12 days he would see a horse break down and die on the track, but that it was part of the game. I know he'd feel if that happened, and I know I'd have no answer for him.

There is a whole generation of Ryan Finleys out there, more sensitive to animal suffering than we ever were. As parents, we'd prefer to say to them that horses don't run when they don't feel up to it, and they only run as fast as they're able without being hit to run faster, and

that everything is being done to make sure they don't get hurt. But in our hearts, we really can't.

We're spending a lot of money right now as an industry to market our product to people who might not know about it. But really, some of us know a lot about it, and aren't finding enough to recommend about it, which leads me to believe that we don't have a marketing problem; we have a product problem.

If we're not willing to take a hard look at fixing it, we're going to let a whole generation of Ryan Finleys grow up being obsessed about something else.

In its statement, NYRA said, "United Tote is going to determine the variance between Keeneland's correct prices and the incorrect prices that were paid at NYRA and NYRA will adjust relevant NYRA Rewards accounts, previously cahsed tickets involving W2-G's and currently outstanding winning tickets that are presented for payment. NYRA expects this adjustment to be accomplished on or before Apr. 30."

CHRB Holds Public Meeting at Santa Anita:

At a special meeting of the California Horse Racing Board's medication and track safety committee Wednesday at Santa Anita, one of the topics discussed was the use of the drug clenbuterol in Thoroughbreds. Trainer John Shirreffs, a member of the committee's advisory board, said he believes the drug, which theoretically is supposed to be used to relieve breathing problems, should be banned because it is being abused as a builder of muscle mass. Shirreffs complained it is too difficult to control the administered doses of the drug. "It is unfair to the horses," he said.

Rick Arthur, the CHRB's equine medical director, said a study he did with Scott Stanley, associate professor of veterinary medicine at UC Davis, showed that 58% of Thoroughbreds were found to have clenbuterol in their system.

Craig Shoemaker, a veterinarian who works for the company that he claims manufactures the only FDA-approved form of clenbuterol, asked that his company's product not be grouped with versions of the drug not approved by the FDA.

Actress Bo Derek, a CHRB comissioner who is chair of the medication and track safety committee, recommended that further discussion of banning clenbuterol be put on the agenda for the next CHRB meeting Apr. 26 at Hollywood Park. The CHRB has already agreed to suspend the use of clenbuterol for quarter horses for one year, beginning last Oct. 14.

Another issue that will be passed on to the CHRB will be the banning of zilpaterol and ractopamine, two drugs grouped with clenbuterol but, according to Arthur, used strictly for weight gain among livestock prior to slaughter.

Arthur said there is no evidence of use of zilpaterol and ractopamine in Thoroughbreds, but he believes banning these drugs would be an effective tool to prosecute anyone who used them in Thoroughbred racing.

The committee also discussed the Racing Commissioners International (RCI) recommended model for having independent veterinarians administer race-day Lasix rather than trainers' vets. There will be further discussion of this issue at the next CHRB meeting.

Veterinarian Sue Stover of UC Davis made a slide presentation on a trainers' education module designed to educate trainers about how and why racing and training injuries occur. Kirk Breed, executive of director of the CHRB who is a member of the committee along with new CHRB commissioner Chuck Winner, said the mission of the program is to reduce horse injuries and fatalities. However, Breed said, "Old habits are hard to break."

The committee also discussed the issue the impact of large purses for lower-level claimers and the advisability of raising the minimum claiming price or limiting purses for the lower-level claiming races in order to encourage responsible horse management practices. The committee took no action on that issue, but revisited the issue of allowing a claim to be voided at the request of the claimant if the post-race sample contains a prohibited drug substance. The CHRB already has a rule in place voiding a claim if a horse is euthanized on the track.

Another topic Wednesday was a proposed amendment that would require six months of veterinary records prior to a horse's death be submitted within 48 hours after submission of the necropsy submission form. There was objection to this proposed amendment by one veterinarian who claimed it violates doctorpatient privilege.

Arthur pushed for a rule prohibiting the racing of pregnant mares beyond 120 days of gestation. Arthur said it would only affect two or three mares per year. The rule will be proposed to the CHRB.

Besides Shirreffs, the two other members of the committee's advisory board are Lou Raffetto, executive director of the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and Santa Anita steward Scott Chaney.

SANTIVA (c, 4, Giant's Causeway--Slide, by Smarten)

Owner Tom Walters has announced the retirement of Santiva from the races owing to "complications from an ankle" issue. Runner-up in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity S. at two, Santiva graduated in the

GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., defeating the subsequently Classic-placed Astrology (A.P. Indy) and becoming the first of his successful sire's sons to win a graded stakes going two turns on the main track in the United States as a juvenile. He affirmed his status as a legitimate threat for the GI Kentucky Derby with a strong runner-up effort in the GII Risen Star S. in his sophomore debut, then ran a respectable sixth in the Run for the Roses, leaving a half-dozen Grade I

winners behind him. Bred in Kentucky by Paget Bloodstock, Santiva is out of a half-sister to champion Safely Kept (Horatius). "We are very excited and confident about Santiva's future as a potential influential sire and look forward to this next stage of his career by siring some of the best future progeny," Walters said.


