



DETTORI HAS ROYAL ASCOT VISION

Colour Vision (Fr) (Rainbow Quest) easily disposed of G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in last month's rescheduled G3 Sagaro S. at Kempton, but was forced to pull out all

the stops under a vintage Frankie Dettori ride, and survived a stewards' inquiry, to claim glory in Royal Ascot's G1 Gold Cup yesterday. Dettori, who had switched allegiance from fellow Godolphin colorbearer **Opinion Poll (Ire)** (Halling), was handily placed throughout the marathon

test and drove the 6-1 chance into a slender lead entering the final eighth. Colour Vision exchanged bumps with Opinion Poll soon after, as that rival loomed large with 150 yards remaining, before asserting for a half-length success. Defending champion **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) was last off the bridle inside the final half mile, but was unable to feature at the business end and finished seventh. "It takes the whole year to prepare for this race and it made the blood boil to see them finishing together," commented Sheikh Mohammed. "They are two brilliant horses and both jockeys rode great races." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "Frankie gave the horse a magnificent ride. Sheikh Mohammed gave him the choice and he made a judgement call based on the fact Colour Vision would stay better than Opinion Poll. He is such a gritty little stayer." *Cont. p3*

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Fresh from a win in last month's G3 Blue Wind S. at Naas, in which she defeated G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), **Princess Highway** (Street Cry {Ire}) continued in the winning vein, and emulated her dam Irresistible Jewel, by capturing Royal Ascot's G2 Ribblesdale S. yesterday. Patiently ridden in rear for most of the 12-furlong contest, the 17-2 chance made relentless headway into second off the home turn and extended clear once taking over inside the final quarter mile to easily defeat Epsom placegetters **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili) and **Shirocco Star (GB)** (Shirocco {Ger}) by six lengths and a short head, respectively. "Ascot has always been lucky for me and I thought Epsom might come a little too soon for a late-developing filly such as her," explained trainer Dermot Weld. "It's nice to come back and win the same race I won a number of years ago with her dam." *Cont. p4*

PLAY IT AGAIN, SAM

Classic form abounds for today's G1 Coronation S., and West Ilsley conditioner Mick Channon, who has yet to win the Friday feature, is double handed in a hot edition of the one-mile test for distaffers. Martin

Schwartz's **Samitar (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who bolstered her winnings in last semester's £300,000 Tattersalls Millions 2yo Fillies' Trophy at Newmarket, improved off a ninth in the May 13 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp to claim a first Classic win for Channon in the G1 Irish

1000 Guineas two weeks later. That form received a hefty boost when runner-up Ishvana (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) scooted to victory in Wednesday's G3 Jersey S. "I'm not worried how Samitar does it, but you've got to be positive one way or another," said Channon. "Although we made the running [in the Pouliches], we were always waiting for the lead horse to come, and we were stuck in front. Everything went wrong, but that's horse racing. You need a bit of luck, and Martin [Harley] got it spot on at The Curragh. There was good pace in the race which took her along, and from halfway you knew if she picked up she was going to win." *Cont. p9*

Colour Vision served his apprenticeship in the handicap ranks, but stepped out of that company to run fourth in August's Listed Prix Michel Houyvet at Deauville before failing to make a dent in minor events at Salisbury and Chester. Successful at Pontefract in an Oct. 3 conditions event, the grey hit the board in the marathon Cesarewitch H. at Newmarket five days later, and occupied the same berth behind Fame and Glory in the Oct. 15 G3 British Champions Long Distance Cup going two miles here in his final start representing the Mark Johnston yard. He opened up for Godolphin with a bloodless victory in the rescheduled G3 Sagaro S. at Kempton last time May 2, and dug deep in the mud to register a career high here and remain unbeaten in the blue silks. Colour Vision occupied a prominent role in second early as former Johnston stablemate and eventual fourth-place finisher **Gulf of Naples (Ire)** (**Dubawi {Ire}**) set sensible fractions in the prevalent conditions. Allowed to surrender one spot going down the backstraight, he was stoked up on the home turn as the lactic build-up bit hard and came under sterner urging to challenge at the quarter-mile marker. He took a slender advantage into the final eighth, but was joined by Opinion Poll soon after and, having traded barges with that rival, dug deep for every ounce of stamina to assert nearing the line. "This was my best chance of the week, I had a very difficult decision to make when choosing between the two, and I'm delighted to get it right," admitted Frankie Dettori, who registered a fifth victory in the marathon contest. "Both are great warriors and I finished off best, but it was only by a short margin. It's great for the team, as it's been a very hard week and I'm glad this one came up. First and second is a great result for us. Mickael [**Barzalona**] and myself are good friends, but when you are out there you are by yourself. It doesn't matter who is in the finish because you always try to win."

Proud of the Placegetters...

Opinion Poll, who has not been out of the first two in eight runs since chasing home Fame and Glory last year, had to settle for the bridesmaid's role again. "Opinion Poll ran very well and there are no excuses today," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni told *PA Sport*. "They are two nice horses, and it doesn't matter who won as we are one team. As for future plans, we will see what Simon [Crisford] and Sheikh Mohammed want to do." Saddler's Rock stayed on resolutely in the straight to be third. "The race was a bit of farce for him, as they went too slow early on, which meant he pulled for the first mile or so," trainer John Oxx told *PA Sport*. "It was then a sprint for the last mile, and he couldn't quicken on the soft ground. Johnny [Murtagh] said he got a bit unbalanced and he was struggling, but then he finally got going when it was too late." Oxx indicated the Aug. 2 G2 Goodwood Cup is an option for the colt. Reigning title holder Fame and Glory (GB) (**Montjeu {Ire}**) was none the worse for his exertions, according to trainer Aidan O'Brien, who added, "Fame and Glory has come back fine and seems to be fine after the race. It was an interesting race."

Princess Highway enjoyed a largely uneventful introduction, running eighth in a seven-furlong Leopardstown maiden, in her only juvenile outing last October. She hit the ground running when opening her sophomore campaign with a decisive victory in a 10-furlong heat back at the Foxrock venue Mar. 28,

and continued her rapid rise through the ranks next time. That latest effort yielded an impressive win in the May 16 G3 Blue Wind S. at Naas, where she accounted for Aaraas (GB) (Haafhd {GB}) and subsequent G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Was (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

Moyglare Stud's homebred bay, a daughter of 2002 Ribblesdale victress Irresistible Jewel, was steadied in rear from the outset. Easing into fifth on the home turn, she was sent in pursuit as Shirocco Star established a clear advantage off the home turn and, having taken over approaching the final furlong, surged clear to win with elan. "She has been a backward filly, but has progressed well during the Spring and beat the winner of the Epsom Oaks convincingly last time out," explained winning trainer Dermot Weld. "I thought this was a really excellent renewal, and I knew she would have to improve to win today, and she's gone and done it. I was concerned the ground would be a little bit slow for her, but they went a true pace and Pat [Smullen] wisely took his time on her. He rode a brilliant race as always."

Weld's patient approach may yield further dividends and enable Princess Highway to better her dam's eighth-place finish in this year's G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh July 22. "Missing Epsom gave us a little more time to come here and then go on for an Irish Oaks," Weld added. Said Smullen, "She's a beautiful mare to ride. She's uncomplicated, she travels, she quickens and has it all. Our only fear was that the ground had gone too soft. It wasn't that bad, but she still handled it extremely well." Runner-up The Fugue's chances were compromised by overnight rain, and the John Gosden incumbent will now point to the Aug. 23 G1 Yorkshire Oaks. "The winner is very smart, and we were beaten fair and square, but I'm disappointed it rained, because my filly is much better on good-to-firm ground," the trainer told *PA Sport*. "We'll freshen her up for the Yorkshire Oaks." Reflecting on the performance of Shirocco Star, who just failed to confirm Epsom form with The Fugue, trainer Hughie Morrison added, "We all had hard races in the Oaks, but she kept going and it was a brave performance. She is obviously one of the best fillies, and the Irish Oaks in four weeks' time would be the plan."



RECKLESS BY NAME, RECKLESS BY NATURE

Reckless Abandon (GB) (Exchange Rate) gave some indication of steering issues when prevailing in a Doncaster maiden last month, and that trait was in evidence again as he denied **Gale Force Ten (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) in a thrilling renewal of the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot. Sharply away to stalk a strong early pace, the 4-1 chance veered left soon after taking over inside the two pole and was returned on an even keel just in time to

maintain his perfect tally by 3/4 of a length. "He's just a big baby, who runs around a lot, and I half expected him to do something," admitted rider Adam Kirby, who was registering his first Royal meet success. "As soon as I went for him, he ran left straight away, but he is very special. He gives a lot of ground away by doing it, but we'll get it sorted."

Clive Cox's two Royal Ascot scores have come courtesy of dual winner **New Seeker (GB)** (**Green Desert**), and he bridged a seven-year gap since a last success with **Reckless Abandon** in this furious five-furlong dash. However, the victory did not come without incident, as the eventual winner veered left when set fair for a cozy victory. Having showed a tendency to wander when defeating the re-opposing **Annunciation (GB)** (**Proclamation {Ire}**) and 16 others at Doncaster May 19, his inexperience resurfaced in the closing stages here. The eventual winner was slick from the gate and was soon in a stalking role, just behind with the stands' side group. Making ominous progress from halfway, he took control with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, but veered left once confronted by Ascot's expanse soon after. Straightened up with no time to spare, he kept the high gears turning as the line loomed and found a late surge to deprive **Gale Force Ten**, who led home those on the far side of the track. "He did it in his first start, and he was clearly still quite green here," opined Cox. "In a perfect world, we would have had a normal spring and he'd already have had a couple of runs under his belt by now, but we've been forced here undercooked, really. He is very talented and [jockey] Adam [Kirby] has done a grand job in both his races. I'm over the moon and especially delighted for owners Julie Deadman and Steven Barrow." **cont. p6**

often run a horse back in the [G2] Railway S. [at The Curragh June 30] after this, so he would be a possible for that." Jeremy Nosedá, trainer of third placegetter Ian's Dream added, "I think Ian's Dream would prefer faster ground, but considering that was the second start of his life, you'd have to be delighted with him. I think we will go for a maiden now, and then something like the [G2] Richmond S. at Goodwood [Aug. 2]."

Sting in the Tail for Kirby...

Adam Kirby's winning ride aboard Reckless Abandon was deemed worthy of further inspection by the stewards, and they found the rider guilty of using his whip above the permitted level. "The Stewards employed discretion owing to the horse hanging left, but found that Kirby had used the whip above the permitted level," the BHA tweeted. "As this was Kirby's fifth offence of two to six days in a six-month period, he has been referred to the BHA Disciplinary Panel. The date for the hearing is to be confirmed. The penalty range is from 14 to 60 days, with an entry level of 21 days."

ENERGIZER HAS THE POWER

Nailed on the line to be deprived of third in last month's G2 German 2000 Guineas at Cologne, Gestut Schlenderhan's **Energizer (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) gained some measure of compensation in yesterday's G3 Tercentenary S., becoming the first German-trained winner at Royal Ascot. Restrained at the back of the peloton until angled wide for his bid off the home turn, the 15-2 chance surged to the front approaching the final furlong and drew off late to easily best **Stipulate (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) by 2 1/2 lengths for a career high. "I felt the trip of the [German 2000] Guineas was too short for him, so I looked at the program book for a suitable engagement and found this race," explained trainer Jens Hirschberger. "He definitely loved the [good-to-soft] ground and, as a Monsun colt, it was perfect for him. It's a great feeling to win here."

G3 Tercentenary S. cont.

Energizer's entire career has taken place at stakes level, and his potential was such that he debuted with a victory in September's Listed Junioren-Preis at Dusseldorf. Fourth next time in Germany's most prestigious juvenile event, the Oct. 16 G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten at Cologne, he slipped to fifth in the Nov. 6 G3 Herzog von Ratibor-Rennen at Krefeld before returning there to run second in the Apr. 22 G3 Dr Busch-Memorial in his sophomore return. Jens Hirschberger then pitched the homebred bay into the May 28 G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen German 2000 Guineas, but he was nabbed on the line for third by Red Duke (Hard Spun) in that Classic test back at Cologne last time. Energizer was fitted with a hood for this first try at 10 furlongs, and it had an immediate effect as he settled into a smooth rhythm in rear. Easing to the outside turning for home, a telling surge carried him to the fore entering the final eighth and he opened up to win decisively. "He was too keen when we sat out with him in his last start, and we wanted to step him up in trip," explained winning rider Adrie de Vries.

"He settled well today and showed a really good turn of foot. It was testing ground and they struggled in the final furlong, but I think it helped him, as he likes soft going. He was too keen when we ran him over a mile, but we put the hood on him and he settled perfectly.

He gets this mile-and-a-quarter trip easy now. That was only my second ride here and it's an amazing feeling to win." Of future plans, Hirschberger added, "We'll now prepare him for the [G1] Grosser Dallmayr-Preis [at Munich July 29] and then we might come back to England for a Group 2 race over 10 furlongs." Connections of the placegetters were far from downcast, and Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager for the runner-up, told *PA Sport*, "It was a good run. He could have done with the ground a bit quicker, but it was still a decent

race and he's going to be all right. There's probably more races in France for a mile-and-a-quarter horse like this." Reflecting on Rewarded's personal best, trainer James Toller added, "It was quite a jump in class, but he ran a good race and he hasn't let us down. He probably wants a bit further really."

RECKLESS ABANDON LIVES UP TO HIS NAME IN NORFOLK-G2!

Undefeated two-year-old **RECKLESS ABANDON** veered to the outside and lost all momentum, but came back and dug in for the final strides of the Norfolk S. (G2) to win by $\frac{3}{4}$ of a length.

Danzig and his descendants are no strangers to Royal Ascot success--already this year, Most Improved (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), Joviality (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Ishvana (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) hail from the former Claiborne stallion's male line--but Thursday's G2 Norfolk S. victor **Reckless Abandon (GB)** is the first European group winner for his sire Exchange Rate (Danzig), who plies his trade in Kentucky at Three Chimneys. Reckless Abandon, who lived up to his name on his way to victory, distantly hails from the female family of Storm Cat and Royal Academy; his fourth dam is Chapel of Dreams (Northern Dancer--Terlingua). Chapel of Dreams' daughter Wiener Wald (Woodman) was a \$210,000 purchase at KEENOV in 1995 while in foal to Silver Hawk and made her way to Nicholas and Jane Forman Hardy's Car Colston Hall Stud. The filly she was carrying at the time, Argent du Bois, didn't do much on the racecourse, but she later produced Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), who became a multiple Grade I winner in the States. Wiener Wald herself was later represented by 2008 G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Crowded House (GB) (Rainbow Quest). Argent du Bois's 2003 Efisio (GB) filly Sant Elena (GB) signed off on her career with a second in Woodbine's Flaming Page S. in 2007 for Car Colston Hollow. She was bred to El Prado (Ire) the following spring and after producing the colt Jumbo Prado, was bred back to Exchange Rate before returning to Britain. Sant Elena has a yearling Dansili (GB) filly. Trainer Clive Cox signed the £24,000 ticket for Reckless Abandon last fall at Doncaster.

Like Reckless Abandon, Thursday's G2 Ribblesdale S. heroine **Princess Highway** (Street Cry {Ire}) also descends from American forebears. Her third dam Aptostar (Fappiano), a \$295,000 FTSAUG yearling, captured the G1 Acorn S. in 1988 for Centennial Farms and sold for \$750,000 the following autumn at Fasig-Tipton's Night of the Stars sale. Her foals were a bit disappointing on the track for Moyglare Stud, but her Sadler's Wells daughter, In Anticipation (Ire), has made some amends. In Anticipation is the granddam of Moyglare's good staying filly Profound Beauty (Ire) (Danehill), and her daughter Irresistible Jewel (Ire) (Danehill) captured the Ribblesdale a decade ago. Irresistible Jewel's first foal was Mad About You (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), a Group 3 winner who also finished second in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Pretty Polly S., and third in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. Princess Highway is Irresistible Jewel's fourth foal; the mare has a 2-year-old Henrythenavigator filly named Midnight Thoughts, and produced a full-sister to the Ribblesdale heroine this spring. Princess Highway is the fifth group winner bred on the Street Cry-Danehill cross; the list also includes 2009 G1 Melbourne Cup hero Shocking (Aus).

Gestut Schlenderhan's G3 Tercentary S. winner **Energizer (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) is another of Thursday's Royal Ascot stars from U.S. bloodlines on his bottom side. Back in 1985, his third dam Magic of Life (Seattle Slew--Larida) established a world record of \$2.5 million when selling as a weanling as part of the Newstead Farm dispersal. Magic of Life captured the 1988 G1 Coronation S. for the Niarchos family, and her 1998 Seeking the Gold filly Enthused landed the G2 Lowther S. and G3 Princess Margaret S. for the same connections. Enthused's Theatrical (Ire) filly Erytheis won two of five starts at three in 2005 for trainer Sir Michael Stoute. The following year, she sold for 185,000gns to Charlie Gordon-Watson at Tattersalls December. Put in foal to Cape Cross (Ire), Erytheis went for 460,000gns at the same venue in 2007. Energizer is her second foal for Baron Georg von Ullmann. Erytheis has a pair of full-sisters to the Tercentary hero, a 2-year-old named Examinee (Ger) and the yearling Extravaganza (Ger).

Jockey Martin Harley, who will partner Samitar in today's G1 Coronation S., is upbeat about her chances. "She hasn't done anything wrong, and she didn't run a bad race in France, but did it the way I thought she would last time," said Harley. "She was only coming to herself at The Curragh, and she's been in good form since. She has to have a big chance as long as the ground stays on the better side of good." Stablemate **Laugh Out Loud (GB)** (Clodovil {Ire}), who gets the services of Frankie Dettori for the first time, lines up on merit and backed up a win in the May 18 Listed Michael Seely Memorial S. at York with an impressive score in the June 3 G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly. "Laugh Out Loud has always had speed and we always knew she was pretty good," said Channon. "They had a fair bit of rain overnight [at Chantilly] and it just loosened up the ground, but good going would be perfect for her." Haras de Saint Pair's lone French raider **Bugie d'Amore (GB)** (Rail Link {GB}) was fourth in the Sandringham by the Chateau, but was making her seasonal return there. She is the only one to have lowered the colors of star Italian distaffer Cherry Collect (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire})--who bagged last month's G2 Oaks d'Italia--when garnering last term's G3 Premio Dormello at Milan's San Siro track in her penultimate out, and bids to follow in the hoofprints of Immortal Verse (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) for back-to-back Gallic triumphs. With the participation of **Maybe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) remaining in doubt, Aidan O'Brien may have to rely on just **Homecoming Queen (Ire)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) to add to the wins of Sophisticat in 2002 and Lillie Langtry in 2010. Susan Magnier's race-hardened bay romped to a nine-length score from **Starscope (GB)** (Selkirk) in the May 6 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, but was unable to double up when slipping to fourth behind Samitar last time when attempting to make all again. Teruya Yoshida's **Elusive Kate** (Elusive Quality), who bagged Longchamp's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac for Magnolia Racing and Rachel Hood in October, left most in her wake in a six-race juvenile campaign. She dropped to eighth, just over five lengths off Stephanie's Kitten (Kitten's Joy), in the Nov. 4 GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Downs last time, and faces another stiff test back among the European set. She forms part of a John Gosden trio, which also includes Starscope and **Fallen For You (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), and Olivier Peslier steps in for the prized mount.

Stable number one William Buick is aboard the latter, fifth in last year's G1 Fillies' Mile at Newmarket and sixth in the May 12 G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. at Lingfield. Mahmood Al Zarooni trainee **Irish History (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) registered a six-length maiden score at Windsor May 21, but met with trouble in running when seventh in the Listed Heron S. at Sandown in her only other go 10 days later. Godolphin has taken the noteworthy step of supplementing her for £25,000.

extremely lucky that we decided to run on Tuesday in the King's Stand S., as with heavy overnight rain and more expected before Saturday, the ground would certainly not have suited him," Charlton said. Black Caviar's conditioner Peter Moody yesterday told www.heraldsun.com.au, "I've been watching the straight races closely this week and they seem to be winning from everywhere. I don't think it really matters where she draws. She's got the tactical speed to put herself in the right spot."

Black Caviar was put through her paces on the Al Bahathri gallop in Newmarket yesterday morning and Moody was happy with what he saw. "She's the fittest I've had her in the past 24 months," he continued. "Her work has been very pleasing since arriving here. I couldn't be happier."

Part-owner Neil Werrett added, "Unfortunately, the rain has come, but Peter is confident she can handle the wet track. Peter says he has got her in the best condition she has been in for 12 months and he is very excited. I have a fear of the track, as she's never run on it before, and there are a couple of very smart local horses who handle the wet, who will be hard to beat. I think Moonlight Cloud is the danger, but we are here to give it a go. My understanding is that six or seven thousand are coming from Australia to see her."

Whether he is more of a stayer than his sibling remains to be seen, but on the formbook, he looks clear second-best after failing by only a neck to give five pounds to the subsequent Derby fourth **Thought Worthy** (Dynaformer) in Newmarket's Listed Fairway S. over 10 furlongs May 19. Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Lord Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*, "Noble Mission and Frankel are two totally different types of horse. He was giving Thought Worthy five pounds last time at Newmarket, but we hope he's still a progressive horse, although this is a big step up. Cecil has a second string in the form of Sir Robert Ogden's June 8 Newmarket handicap winner **Thomas Chippendale (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}). "We thought he was a bit better than handicap company, so we took the decision to run in the Group 2 rather than the King George V H.," the owner's racing manager Barry Simpson told *PA Sport*. "It's a step up for him, but we think he's up to it, as he's a progressive horse. He handles soft ground and he's won on it, so it wouldn't be a concern for him, but he's a good-actioned horse so he may be better still on good ground."

MARATHONERS AT THE READY

Royal Ascot's marathon G3 Queen's Vase has been the domain of four trainers since the turn of the century, but, with Saeed bin Suroor and six-time winner Mark Johnston lacking representation this year, it falls to Aidan O'Brien and Sir Michael Stoute to maintain that exclusive club's domination. O'Brien, successful with Mahler (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in 2007 and Mikhail Glinka (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in 2010, saddles **Athens (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}), a close fifth in the G2 Prix Hocquart at Longchamp May 13, but 11 lengths back when third in the May 27 G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh last time. Stoute's last winner came courtesy of Patkai (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) in 2008, and he sends out The Queen's stoutly-bred distaffer **Estimate (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) with Ryan Moore up. The Aga Khan-bred bay was given a tender introduction when seventh at Leicester in September, and broke through in style by easily winning a 12-furlong Salisbury maiden in her only other start May 6. Connections still hold **Minimise Risk (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) very much in high regard, despite recent reversals in the May 10 G3 Chester Vase and June 2 G1 Epsom Derby, and he has the opportunity for redemption in this stamina sapper. Although he found the Epsom undulations not to his liking, he exhibited a measure of improvement in the Blue Riband last time, but his chances will be hindered by further rainfall. "Minimise Risk didn't handle the track very well at Epsom and we're a bit hopeful of him," Dr. Jim Hay explained. We think a lot of him, and the distance of the race will suit him down to the ground. He has only had four runs, and will go from strength to strength if the ground dries out."

Peter Chapple-Hyam is renowned for his touch with juveniles, although his name is missing from the honor roll of the G3 Albany S., and he saddles Fitri Hay's **Agent Allison (GB)** (Dutch Art {GB}) here in bid to remedy the matter. Ascot's incline will not inconvenience the bay daughter of Chapple-Hyam's 2006 G2 Norfolk S. winner, as she has already conquered Pontefract's notorious slope when storming to a seven-length debut success last time June 11. "Peter thinks a great deal of her, and she won convincingly first time out," commented Dr. Jim Hay. Other Newmarket challengers include Princess Haya of Jordan's **Newfangled** (New Approach {Ire}), who makes her second start for the John Gosden yard and goes postward off an impressive 4 1/2-length win in a Newmarket maiden two weeks ago; and Godolphin's **Kosika** (Hard Spun), who overcame greenness to prevail at Haydock first up May 25. Team Hannon numbers three, as the Wiltshire conditioner bids to supplement the wins of Jewel in the Sand (Ire) (Bluebird) in 2004 and Memory (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in 2010. Richard Hughes has chosen Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Tassel (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}), who has to bounce back from running lame and finishing last of seven at Salisbury May 6, and she is better judged off a bristling Apr. 19 debut score at Newmarket. **Equitana (GB)** (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}) is the mount of Ryan Moore and returns off a debut second to **Premier Steps (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), who crosses swords again, in a five-furlong maiden here May 11. **Light Up My Life (Ire)** (Zamindar), a once-out winner at Newbury May 26, completes the trio with Jimmy Fortune in the plate. *Albany field p13*

Frankel Best Since Brave...

Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was yesterday handed an official rating of 140 pounds, leaving him just a pound shy of Dancing Brave. Following the Juddmonte star's 11-length procession in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, British Horseracing Authority's Mile Handicapper Dominic Gardiner-Hill said, "Frankel's win in the Queen Anne was one of the most visually stunning I have seen in my time as a handicapper and I'm sure was a superior performance to his win in the Lockinge, and therefore his rating will rise to 140. In the modern era, Dancing Brave is the highest rated horse we have had on 141 and I wouldn't want to put Frankel above him on what he achieved on Tuesday. If you look at the quality of the field that Dancing Brave beat in the 1986 Arc, it was chock-full of Group 1 winners, and although Frankel finished a long way clear, beating Side Glance, Indomito and Windsor Palace does not entitle him to be considered the superior horse at this stage in my opinion." Reacting to the announcement, Rod Street, Chief Executive of the British Champions Series, said, "Frankel has led the way in the QIPCO British Champions Series at every stage, ever since the very first race last year when he blitzed his rivals in the QIPCO 2000 Guineas. It looks like he has three Series races left in his career to try to achieve the highest official rating ever, the [G1] Coral-Eclipse or the [G1] QIPCO Sussex S., followed by the [G1] Juddmonte International and then either the [G1] Queen Elizabeth II S. or the QIPCO Champion S. on QIPCO British Champions Day."

Monami DQ'd From Diana-Trial Win

Gestut Etzean's homebred **Monami (Ger)** (Sholokhov {Ire}), who won the May 27 G2 Diana-Trial at Hoppegarten, has been disqualified from the 10-furlong race entirely after it was ruled an administrative error incorrectly allowed her late supplementary entry to the race to stand. Supplementary entries for the 10-furlong contest should have been made May 22, but the Direktorium fur Vollblutzucht und Rennen (German Jockey Club) official website erroneously listed the date as May 23. The matter was further complicated when Etzean's Christiane Weil-Dassbach was reassured by officials that the entry would stand. Dr Christiane Otto, owner-breeder of the runner-up Wasimah (Ger) (Desert Prince {Ire}), subsequently lodged a protest, claiming Monami's entry was submitted late, and this was upheld at a ruling in Cologne on Wednesday evening. Gestut Etzean's connections are now considering the consequences and the possibility of an appeal.

Team Valor's Animal Kingdom back to work

Last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner **Animal Kingdom** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) is back to galloping following a 60 day hiatus due to a hairline fracture in his ilium. The injury was discovered a week before the colt's scheduled departure for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 31. "What happened to him was really just a blip on the radar, not a serious injury at all, the timing was just horrible," said Barry Irwin, Team Valor International's chief executive officer. "We're excited to get him back. We have a goal in mind for him at the end of the year, but we don't want to say what it is just yet." The Team Valor colorbearer won impressively in his lone start of the season in an allowance over the Gulfstream turf Feb. 18.

In related news, stablemate **Went the Day Well** (Proud Citizen) is scheduled to work Saturday for the first time since a disappointing 10th-place finish in the May 19 GI Preakness S. The bay, who was fourth in the GI Kentucky Derby, is slated to start in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga July 28. Irwin noted of his training "We've given him some time to recover and will get him ready now for Saratoga."

NEW YORK STATE TAKING OVER NYRA

New York's Assembly and Senate have approved the bill allowing for the state takeover of the embattled New York Racing Association. The New York State Racing Franchise Accountability and Transparency Act of 2012, which permits state control of NYRA for three years, was introduced on June 16 and moved through both houses in the final days of the session, which ended yesterday. It passed the Senate by a vote of 58-1 with three Senators excused and received unanimous approval from the Assembly.

NYRA's trustees agreed to the state takeover in May. The bill provides for a 17-member NYRA board, with 12 of the trustees coming from the state: eight by Governor Andrew Cuomo and two each from the Senate and Assembly. The remaining five will be NYRA selections. It cannot go into effect until at least seven of the public appointees have been named. Also, the legislation gives Cuomo the authority to nominate a chairman for the board.

The legislative action comes eight weeks after the New York State Racing and Wagering Board issued a report on its investigation into the improper handling by NYRA of the takeout on its Pick Six wager. A law raising the takeout from 25 to 26% was supposed to sunset in September 2010, but NYRA did not drop the rate back to 25%--costing bettors over \$8 million--until a state audit discovered the error in December 2011.

Within a week after the Racing and Wagering Board report was released, NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward and counsel Patrick Kehoe were dismissed by the trustees of the non-profit racing association. Cuomo began the takeover move through the reorganization board when NYRA elected its Chief Operating Officer Ellen McLain to replace Hayward. McLain was the Chief Financial Officer when NYRA was overcharging Pick Six bettors.

The legislative action was completed one month prior to the opening of the very popular meeting at Saratoga Race Course.

"It's important that we work with the new NYRA organization to restore public faith in the racing industry here in New York," said Senator Roy McDonald from Saratoga County. "It's especially significant that we continue to promote the Saratoga race meet due to the positive economic impact it has on the Saratoga region."

The bill says that the takeover of NYRA will come at no cost of the state and that a plan be put in place to return control of the board to NYRA six months prior to the end of the three-year term. In addition, the bill delays the formation of the New York State Gaming Commission by four months to February 2013.

"After conferring with two different doctors in New York, we've learned that Johnny will not have to undergo surgery on his broken collarbone," Velazquez said in a statement. "Physicians say his collarbone should heal in four to six weeks. He will go back to the doctor in two weeks for X-rays, so doctors can check the progress of his healing. Assuming satisfactory progress, Johnny will begin physical therapy at that time. Again, we greatly appreciate the many people who have offered well wishes. Johnny will take it easy to let his injuries heal, and he's anxious to get back to the track as soon as possible."

There will also be a jockey meet and greet immediately preceding the tournament. All entry fees, rebuys and add-ons will be donated to the PDJF. June 24, 1977...**Alydar**, at odds of 2.10-1, broke his maiden by 6 3/4-lengths at Belmont Park.

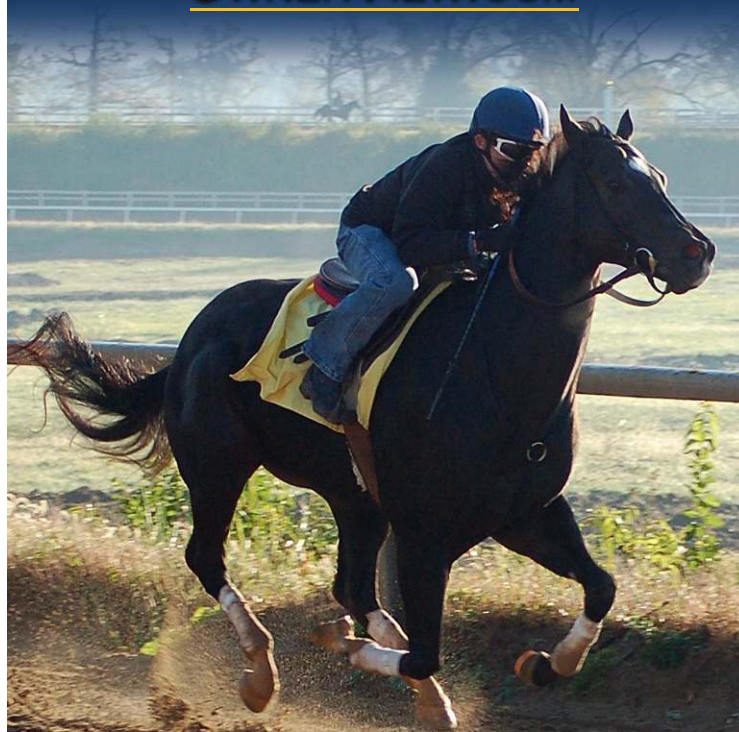
