

Turfway Park has something for everyone. John C. Oxley's Uncaptured (Lion Heart), winner of six of seven starts at two, including Churchill's GIII Iroquois S. Oct. 28 and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 24, kicks off his much-anticipated sophomore campaign here. The dark bay, four-for-five over Woodbine's Polytrack, has been



As always, the jovial Victorian public was out in full force to support their hometown hero in what could have been her final Melbourne start. The 6-year-old will head to Sydney next for the G1 T.J. Smith S. at Randwick Apr. 13. However, Moody has not ruled out

a return to Melbourne for Black Caviar next year as a 7-year-old, and co-owner Neil Werrett made the storyline all the more intriguing when stating he would like to give the mare another crack at Royal Ascot, where she recorded her narrowest career victory last year when winning the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. by a nose.

Off for almost eight months following that effort, Black Caviar returned to serious training at Moody's Caulfield base earlier this year, appearing so well that her conditioner declared her to be in better shape than ever. The dark

bay confirmed that statement with an electrifying victory in the appropriately-named G1 Black Caviar Lightning S.--her third consecutive win in that race--at Flemington Feb. 16, where she set a track record of :55.42 for 1000 meters.

Moody has always used the mantra of "one race at a time" for the brilliant, yet fragile super mare. With the Lightning test emphatically passed, it was on to Moonee Valley to add a second William Reid to her resume--she won this event in 2011, and skipped it last year. Settling just off the pace of stablemate Karuta Queen (Aus) (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) before a soldout and adoring crowd of 25,000, Black Caviar crept alongside that foe approaching the short straight. With that the race was over, as the champion bounded clear in a matter of strides to win by four geared-down lengths over her six overmatched rivals.

"I am lost for words," Moody said after the race. "What do you say? There aren't many that can sit down and sprint when she says go."

Moody said he still believes Black Caviar is in the best form of her career.

"I've thought that for a while, and she's proved me right twice now. It was just great to see the people out here and to see her put on a wonderful show."

CLASS EDGE FOR 'FUN' IN BOURBONETTE OAKS

With eight starts to her credit as a juvenile, Magdalena Racing's **Pure Fun** (Pure Prize) is one of the





most experienced of the 12 runners scheduled to go postward in today's GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Park. The chestnut broke her maiden over the turf at Kentucky Downs in career start number four, and, after a seventh in Keeneland's GIII Jessamine S. Oct. 11, was second in an allowance at that track nine days later. The Ken McPeek runner torched a field of allowance

rivals over the Churchill main track Nov. 24, then shipped on short rest to California for a one-length success in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 8. She sports an abbreviated, but strong worktab at Palm Meadows and is strictly the one to beat here. Broken Spell (Broken Vow) rates a longshot look, though she figures at a price shorter than her 10-1 morning line. After graduating over the Saratoga turf Aug. 19, she missed by a neck in the Aug. 29 P. G. Johnson S. ahead of a strong runner-up effort to Spring in the Air (Spring Venture) in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Oct. 5. The Calumet colorbearer has a pair of thirds from six subsequent tries on the main track, but can be a factor here in her return to the synthetic surface. Awesome Mama (Awesome Again) overcame the 12 hole to win by a widening 4 1/2 lengths in her six-furlong debut Dec. 8 and cleared her first allowance condition last time by a smooth two lengths at Oaklawn Park Jan. 27. She'll have to go hard from the far outside, but may be this good.

My Name Is Michael (Macho Uno), second in the Diplay S. over the Woodbine synthetic Dec. 1, rallied to finish third as the 8-5 favorite while making his first start for Bill Mott in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Feb. 2.

"I thought it was a good race," Mott said. "The dirt hit him in the face with all the spray from the kickback there, but I thought he was finishing as well as anyone in the race." Mott added that My Name Is Michael was forced to sit out the GII Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Feb. 23 after missing a few days of training due to a fever. Local hopeful Mac the Man (El Corredor) rides a three-race winning streak. He was last seen wiring the 96ROCK S. going a mile Feb. 2. "I wanted to give him a little break," trainer Jeff Greenhill said. "We breezed him twice since the 96 ROCK. The second breeze, last Friday, he went [five furlongs in 1:02 2/5] in company. The other horse broke off in front and then Mac the Man caught him about the eighth pole and drew off. The other horse was trying to win, but I told the rider, "If your horse beats Mac the Man, just keep on riding."



SIX SHARE TOP BILLING AT FASIG PREVIEW

Six juveniles shared the fastest furlong breeze of :10 flat during Friday's under tack preview of the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale at Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach. "I thought we saw some very, very nice horses on the racetrack today," commented Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning, Jr. "Consistently from beginning to end horses seemed to really work well and the breeze show was really well attended."

Trainers were well-represented at the breeze show, with Barclay Tagg, Gary Contessa, Eddie Kenneally, Michael Matz and Kiaran McLaughlin taking in the works from the temporary grandstand set up across from the finish line and Mark Hennig, Chad Brown and Rick Violette among those finding viewing spots along the rail and Todd Pletcher taking up residence in the clocker's stand.

Also in attendance were Stonestreet's Barbara Banke, sitting alongside advisor John Moynihan and with George Bolton; WinStar Farm's Elliott Walden; West Point's Terry Finley and Hidden Brook's Mark Roberts and Dan Hall; as well as bloodstock agents Doug Cauthen, Lincoln Collins, Patti Miller, Pete Bradley, Alex Solis Jr. and Jason Litt.

"It's all the right faces," Browning said of Friday's attendance. "We've been encouraged by the pre-sale response and encouraged by the attendance today and I think we will have a good sale on Monday."

The preview got underway with temperatures hovering near 70 degrees and a slight breeze, but winds picked up noticably during the day. Workout times slowed throughout the preview, with five of the six :10 flat works coming in the first two of four sets and the final bullet drill coming in the third set. No horse worked faster than :10 2/5 in the day's final set.

"It's hard to tell," Browning responded when asked about the slower times later in the day. "The factors change and you don't ever know where the horses are slated in terms of positioning from the consignors. It not implausible to think the track slowed down, the wind certainly picked up later in the day. That's why we have wind gauges and so forth, so people can see the variations in conditions throughout the under tack show. It's impossible to have a completely sterile, consistent environment from beginning to end."

A pair of bullet workers came from the Wavertree Stables consignment; <u>Hip 102</u>, a colt by Exchange Rate out of Bubbly Baily (Dixie Union); and <u>hip 103</u>, a son of Lemon Drop Kid out of graded stakes placed Burnish (Menifee).

Also sharing the bullet: hip 16, a filly by Malibu Moon out of Miz United States (Valid Appeal), from the consignment of de Meric Sales, agent; hip 43, a colt by Malibu Moon out of Right Place (Petionville), from the consignment of Danzel Brendemuehl's Classic Bloodstock; hip 77, a son of Indian Charlie out of Trusty Lady (Deputy Minister) consigned by Eddie Woods; and hip 124, a filly by A.P. Indy out of Foxy Danseur (Mr. Greeley), from the consignment of Stephens Thoroughbreds.

The preview show was briefly suspended when hip/24, a son of Street Sense, broke down shortly after completing his furlong drill. The colt was vanned off the track in a horse ambulance.

The Fasig-Tipton Florida sale begins at noon on Monday.

Triple Threats

Vyjack Preps for the Wood Memorial...

GIII Gotham S. winner **Vyjack** (Into Mischief) breezed five furlongs in :59.07 seconds (<u>video</u>) over Aqueduct's inner track in the company of GIII Toboggan H. winner

Head Heart Hoof (Intidab) on Friday in preparation for the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 6.

Vyjack was two lengths behind at the start, drawing even at the five sixteenths, and reaching the wire a half-length in front. Head Heart Hoof was clocked in 59.72 seconds.

"He seemed very relaxed today

in the work and before the work," said David Wilkenfeld, Vyjack's owner. "I was watching him on the track. He kind of sat outside the other horse, and when [exercise rider] Gustavo [Rodriguez] set him down, he was very relaxed. Usually after the works he kind of waits on the other horse, but it looks like he kind of kept going."

Vyjack is undefeated in four of his starts, all at Aqueduct. The gelding won the GII Jerome S. Jan.5 in front running fashion, but came from 10th to win the Gotham S. by 2 1/4 lengths Mar. 2.

Besides GII Tampa Bay Derby winner **Verrazano** (More Than Ready), Wilkenfeld sees **Normandy Invasion** (Tapit) and **Elnaawi** (Street Sense) as tough competitors in the Wood.

"[GII Remsen Runner-up] Normandy Invasion is also a very nice horse," said Wilkenfeld. "He needs to win a big race just to get into the Derby, so he's going to be fully cranked and ready to go. There are some other tough horses, also. The McLaughlin horse who ran against us in the Gotham [Elnaawi, third by 2 3/4 lengths] is also a nice horse."

Verrazano Gears Up for the Wood Memorial...

Verrazano (More Than Ready) will continue training in Florida before flying to New York Apr. 3 for the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 6.

Trainer Todd Pletcher said the undefeated colt, who won the GII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 9 by three lengths

under a hand ride, will return to the worktab on Sunday.

"Looking at his schedule, we felt Tampa put him in a position that opened up a lot of options, with the Wood always being our first choice," said Pletcher. "Assuming he trains accordingly, we'll stick with that plan. We'll have four weeks' spacing between the

Tampa Bay Derby and the Wood and the Kentucky Derby."

Pletcher feels the sandy main track of Tampa Bay Downs, that the Tampa Bay Derby was run on, should give Verrazano stamina.

"It's a demanding surface and provides a good foundation," said Pletcher of the Tampa Bay Downs main track. "The fact he was able to go there and win first time over it gives us encouragement that we can ship him just about anywhere and that he'll run well."

Verrazzano's other two starts were at Gulfstream Park where he won by 7 3/4 lengths on Jan. 1 and 16 1/4 lengths Feb. 2.

Are You Kidding Me to Florida Derby...

Are You Kidding Me (Run Away and Hide) will be aiming for the GI Florida Derby Mar. 30, according to trainer Roger Attfield. After breaking his maiden over the Woodbine turf in July, he won an allowance there the following month and was runner-up in the GII Summer S. in September. He was fifth in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity over the Keeneland synthetic in October. Entered for the GII Swale S. at Gulfstream Mar. 2, he scratched and instead made his seasonal debut when second in a Tampa Bay turf allowance Mar. 9. The Florida Derby would be his first start over dirt. "He's run well on the Polytrack and turf, and trained well on dirt here all winter at Payson Park," said Attfield. "Of course, you really don't know how they'll handle it until you try it. We've always thought he could be good enough to be thinking of him as a Derby horse and this is where we'll find out. He drew the far outside for the Swale [post 13] and we didn't like that," Attfield explained of the scratch. "So, we went to Tampa and he got beat a nose on the turf. I was pleased with the race and he got what he needed from it for his next race. We considered the [GII] Louisiana Derby [Mar. 30], but I was concerned that he it might be over-subscribed and we might not get in. This way we don't have to worry about shipping and we'll find out where we are."


Frac Daddy Preps for Florida Derby...

GI Jockey Club S. runner-up **Frac Daddy** (Scat Daddy) worked five panels in 1:00 1/5 with jockey Corey Lanerie at Gulfstream Park Friday morning in preparation for a start in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 30. "He worked super," said trainer Ken McPeek. "I've never changed my mind about thinking he was a good colt. In fact, the extra time I had to give him may have done him a lot of good," his conditioner said of the colt's issues staying healthy. Frac Daddy grabbed a quarter in his last effort, finishing sixth in the Holly Bull S. at Gulfstream Jan. 26, and a throat ulcer was found shortly thereafter. "I think Corey fits him very well and I'm looking forward to the race."

Pletcher Takes Aim on New Orleans...

Trainer Todd Pletcher will send out two for the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 30. Both GIII Withers S. winner **Revolutionary** (War Pass) and **Palace Malice** (Curlin) will make their next starts at Fair Grounds. "After that last

race in New York [the Withers S. Feb. 21 we decided to ship Revolutionary to South Florida because of the better weather and the easier ship from South Florida to just about anywhere this time of year," said Pletcher. "We decided a while back that the Louisiana Derby would make the most sense for him because he has a tendency not to break real sharply and that the long stretch at Fair Grounds would help overcome that. He's not a bad gate horse; he just doesn't do it very quickly."

Pletcher continued, "Palace Malice is a horse we've always liked a lot," the conditioner

commented on his other starter. "We've had high hopes for him from the beginning, and hopefully there is more to come. He got a little further back than I would have liked in his first two-turn race [when he finished third in the GII Risen Star S. Feb. 23], but we did finish in front of Oxbow (Awesome Again) in that race, and he went on to run real well when a close second in Oaklawn's [GII] Rebel [S. Mar. 16].

Pletcher will also send the unbeaten GIII Rachel Alexandra S. heroine **Unlimited Budget** (Street Sense) for the GII Fair Grounds Oaks; and GI Donn H. hero **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song) for the GII New Orleans H.

"Unlimited Budget has run really well in all three of her races and since that last race, she's been training better than ever," Pletcher added. "Graydar is a big colt who has always been very talented but has been sidelined by a lot of minor things that kept interrupting his training. Over the years we've had a lot of luck in this race [winning the New Orleans H. four times] and after the Donn we wanted to keep him stretched out so this race made a lot of sense for us."

Unbridled Command Arrives in England...

Unbridled Command (Master Command), winner of last year's GI Hollywood Derby, arrived last night at new trainer Ed Dunlop's yard in Newmarket, England. "We are delighted to welcome Unbridled Command,

who arrived last night from America," said Dunlop. "He is settling in well and I would like to thank his owners, Mr. and Mrs. Bamford, Mr. Bernsen and Mr. Lakin, who also bred the horse, for kindly sending him to us. He is a very exciting addition to the stable."

The 4-year-old, most recently third to Point of Entry (Dynaformer) and Animal Kingdom

(Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 9, was sold to a group including Kevin and Colleen Bamford, who raced G1 Melbourne Cup hero Americain (Dynaformer), following his Hollywood Derby victory. He is expected to prepare for an international campaign, including trips to Royal Ascot, Australia's G1 Cox Plate, and the Hong Kong International meeting in December. Trained in the U.S. by Tom Bush, Unbridled Command is the winner of six of 11 starts. He also took last year's GIII Saranac S. at Saratoga.

Dunlop has been successful traveling horses worldwide, most recently finishing second in the 2011 Melbourne Cup with Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), and winning last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase with that 7-year-old, who will contest the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 30.

STEVE SHERACK:

<u>Last Week</u> - Treasury Bill took much more money than anticipated at 4-1 in the Rebel and just never fired despite a nice assist from the other part of the entry setting an honest early pace. Kicking myself for not going with the other horse that I liked a bit in **Den's Legacy**, who completed the trifecta at a very generous 14-1.

GIII Spiral S. - If Balance the Books' grass form translates to Turfway's Polytrack here--hard to believe that it won't; he breezed an eighth in a good-looking :9 4/5 (video) at last year's KEEAPR sale over the synthetic and half-bro by Giant's Causeway was a multiple winner and stakes-placed on the all-weather--the rest of this field is running for minor awards. A debut second after closing into slow fractions over the speed-favoring Saratoga grass, Balance the Books overcame a wide trip and sound bump at the top of the stretch to annex the GII With Anticipation S. at the Spa in late August. Heavily favored in Keeneland's GIII Bourbon S., the bay was bumped hard again, this time in midstretch, and was also carried out several paths, but he still came flying to get up by a nose. The Klaravich/Lawrence colorbearer makes his first start since another troubled adventure in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita, where he finished up like a rocket to place third after racing in a ton of traffic throughout. Chad Brown is more than capable of getting them ready to fire first time off a layoff, and Balance the Books has the works to back it up, including a best-of-52 four-furlong breeze in :48 at Palm Meadows Mar. 3. It doesn't look like he's going to get a ton of pace to close into here, but that hasn't stopped him from running his eye-balls out before. Selection: #1 Balance the Books (7-2).

STAYING ALIVE

Just One Player remains eligible for the top prize in the TwinSpires Road to the Derby Showdown

BRIAN DIDONATO:

Last Week - The Rebel result wasn't a particularly good one for me on a couple levels. For one, contest pick Treasury Bill couldn't benefit from his entry-mate Title Contender's hard work early, and he checked in eighth. I suppose his start and some traffic trouble didn't help matters, but he was surprisingly dull. To add insult to injury, Super Ninety Nine, who I announced last week was my Derby horse and humbly bragged about having at 47-1 in futures, came up empty after chasing an above-average pace. I'm pretty sure he's better than he looked last Saturday, but I'm a whole lot less confident about his potential impact come May 4. Interestingly, my original Derby horse runs today, so maybe it'll all come full circle.

GIII Spiral S. - My Name Is Michael first caught my eye up at Woodbine last year, where he seemed to improve with each of his first four starts, culminating in a runner-up effort in the 1 1/16-mile Display S. in December. According to Trakus data, the then-David Cotey trainee covered 47 feet more than winner Avie's Quality--that's equal to about 5 1/2 lengths, but he was only beaten 1 1/4 lengths (Avie's Quality came back to run terribly as the favorite in the GIII Lecomte S., but Display third-place runner Clearly Now did recently turn back to take Gulfstream's GIII Swale S. after finishing a distant third in the GIII Holy Bull S.). Wachtel Stable subsequently purchased a majority interest in My Name Is Michael and transferred him to Bill Mott for a Derby trail try. The new acquisition was reportedly training up a storm for Tampa's GIII Sam F. Davis Feb. 2, and he was backed all the way down to 17-10 in his first start for the new connections. The dark bay caboosed the field early, and put in an eye-catching rally on the turn, but had to settle for third. Note that the top two finishers were on or near the lead, and that My Name Is Michael didn't seem to be loving the quirky Tampa track. He was forced to miss the GII Fountain of Youth because of a fever, but fired a five-furlong bullet at Payson Park a week ago. It wouldn't be any sort of surprise to see a Mott runner improve in his second start for the Hall of Famer, and the return to Polytrack couldn't hurt. I'm not expecting 10-1 like the morning line predicts, but I anticipate a nice run from My Name Is Michael at a decent price. Selection: #5 My Name Is Michael (10-1).

Showdown Record: 6-1-3-0. Show Pay-off Totals: \$193.

Canada Changes Income Tax Act Pertaining to the Horse Racing Industy: Edited Press Release

The Federal Budget released on March 21, 2013 contains two changes to section 31 of the Income Tax Act. The Jockey Club of Canada Tax Committee Chair, John Unger, has released the following statement regarding Section 31 of the Income Tax Act pertaining to the horse racing industry in Canada:

"First, the wording of section 31 is being changed so as to in effect reverse the Court decision in the Craig case for future years. As a result, the restricted farming loss rules will apply to you unless farming is your predominate source of income. If you have a non-farming source of income that is not subordinate to farming as a source of your income, any losses suffered from farming will be subject to the restricted farming loss rules.

Second, the restricted farming loss limit is being increased from \$8,750 (being \$2,500 of losses plus one-half of further losses up to \$12,500) to \$17,500 (being \$2,500 of losses plus one-half of further losses up to \$30,000)."

These changes are proposed to take effect for taxation years that end on or after March 21, 2013. The Jockey Club of Canada has maintained an active focus on changing the tax rules governing the owning and maintaining of racehorses in Canada. Section 31 of the Income Tax Act had been described by many as outdated and unfair.

"Section 31 has remained substantially unchanged for 25 years," commented Jockey Club of Canada Chief Steward, James Lawson. "Although the increase is not as much as we had hoped for, it is still progress."

OWNERS HIT BY EUROPEAN TAX RULING

Owners in Ireland face a significant increase in the costs of purchasing and keeping racehorses after a ruling by the European Court of Justice found the country's Government in breach of a European Union value added tax (VAT) directive. The court's decision, which found racehorses were not essential to agricultural production or the foodchain, will see the rate of VAT rise from 4.8% to 13.5%. "We will study it and engage with the [Irish] Department of Finance and Agriculture, as well as the owners' and breeders' associations," HRI chief executive Brian Kavanagh told Racing Post. "In England they have created a VAT structure where owners of racehorses are deemed to be in the business of owning horses and therefore have certain entitlements to claim money back. That's something that has worked in other countries, and all of those options will be looked at. On a positive note, there is no sense that there will be any backdating [of the ruling]."
