Round 2. He was following up on Ihtimal (Ire) (Shamardal)'s UAE 1000 Guineas victory and providing his conditioner with a 10th win in this 1900-meter race in courserecord time, Prince Bishop stalked the pace about two lengths off the lead along the rail before switching out to the three path along the backside. He made the lead within a matter of strides when released by Kieren Fallon approaching the quarter pole and had already run the opposition off their feet by the top of the lane.





A two-time group winner in France as a sophomore, Prince Bishop has been a regular on this circuit over the past two seasons. He recorded a handicap victory at Meydan two seasons ago, and last year was twice third behind stablemate Hunter's Light (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), in this event as well as the G1 Al Maktoum Challenge-Round 3. He rounded off that campaign with a 10th place finish in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and returned to the winner's circle when next seen in the G3 September S. at Kempton Sept. 7. He was a long last over heavy ground in the G3 St. Simon S. at Newbury Oct. 26 and was subsequently put away for the season. He showed no signs of rust when recording a smart first-up victory last night.

ORR KICKS OFF AUSSIE AUTUMN

Group 1 racing returns to Australia for the autumn tonight with the running of the G1 C.F. Orr S. at Caulfield. As per usual, the 1400-meter contest boasts a handful of heavyweights resuming and early favoritism goes to **Moment of Change (Aus)** (Barely A Moment {Aus}). The Peter Moody charge looks for his

first victory since claiming the G1 Sir Rupert Clarke S. over this track and trip in September 2012, although he has not been disgraced recently. The 5-year-old gelding made five starts in the Australian spring, never finishing worse than fourth. He checked in third in the G1 VRC Sprint Classic Nov. 9, and was second in the G1 Winterbottom S. Moment of

Change boasts a fitness advantage, having last raced in the Australia S. at Moonee Valley Jan. 24, finishing second. He tries 1400 meters for the first time since his Rupert Clarke victory. **Cont. p4**

Shamus Award (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) became a household name in October when breaking his maiden in his ninth outing in the G1 Cox Plate. The 3-year-old, also third in the G1 Caulfield Guineas, has been on the sidelines since that effort, but trainer Danny O'Brien expressed his confidence in his charge. "He's had a faultless preparation from the time we brought him home from the Cox Plate," O'Brien told Racing and Sports. "He's been down at our Barwon Heads property all summer and he's just thrived. We brought him back to Flemington a couple of weeks ago to have those two jumpouts the last two Fridays, and they've both been excellent. We're going there expecting him to run very well." As a 3-year-old, Shamus Award gets eight pounds from his rivals, as does Eurozone (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}). The winner of the Sept. 28 G2 Stan Fox S. at Rosehill when last seen, Eurozone was good enough to beat the highly regarded Bull Point (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) as a juvenile. Hawkspur (Aus) (Purrealist {Aus}) looked like one to watch in the Spring after winning the G2 Chelmsford S. in September, he ran a game fourth when hung wide thereafter in the G1 George Main S. He had the misfortune of a handful of bad trips thereafter and was last seen finishing 20th of 24 in the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 5. He finished fifth of six in a Jan. 16 Randwick trial.

READY TO RUMBLE

Hopefuls for Australia's A\$1-million G1 Blue Diamond S. take the next step towards that Feb. 22 contest in a pair of G3 Blue Diamond Preludes at Caulfield tonight, with the fillies taking the stage first. This race has a strong record for producing standout fillies, with the 2012 winner Samaready (More Than Ready) going on to take the G1 Blue Diamond and last year's G1 Moir S., and last year's winner Guelph (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) recording four Group 1 victories thereafter, including the second two legs of the Sydney 2-year-old Triple Crown. This year, Guelph's stablemate Earthquake (Aus) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) is the heavy choice to give Darley and trainer Peter Snowden backto-back renewals. Currently the 4-1 second choice for the Blue Diamond, Earthquake was a stylish first-out winner at Randwick in her lone start Nov. 9. She bolstered the confidence of her connections with a sharp gallop at Flemington Tuesday. Earthquake gets the services of jockey Damien Browne, with Darley stable jockey Kerrin McEvoy out with an injury. Eloping (Aus) (Choisir {Aus}) looks to extend her record to three straight off the back of a victory in Caulfield's Listed Blue Diamond Fillies Preview two weeks ago. Top Dolly (Aus) (Choisir {Aus})'s connections thought enough of her to debut her in the G3 7News S. at Flemington May. 11, where she finished second to the highly regarded Oakleigh Girl (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) in her lone outing.

A DIAMOND AMONGST BOYS

Tonight's G1 Blue Diamond Colts & Geldings Prelude marks the next stepping stone to Australia's greatest juvenile contest for TDN Rising Star" Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), the early favorite for both the G1 Blue Diamond S. at Caulfield Feb. 22 and the G1 Golden Slipper, the world's richest juvenile race, at Randwick Apr. 5. Highly regarded after a smooth trial win at Rosehill Jan. 7, Rubick justified the lofty expectations with a three-length score on debut at Randwick Jan. 25. The colt completed a work left-handed--the "Melbourne way"--in Sydney Monday, and left trainer Gerald Ryan feeling confident in the chances of his charge, who is owned by a partnership including Stallion Racing, Teeley Assets and Werrett Bloodstock.

"We worked him over 800 meters this morning the reverse way, and he's clocked :51.57 for the trip," Ryan told *Racenet.com.au*. "He's run :35.95 for his final 600 meters, 400 meters in :22.82 and last 200 meters in :11.33 without ever coming off the bit."

The last Prelude winner to go on to Blue Diamond-and Golden Slipper--glory was Darley homebred Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality) in 2011 and Sheikh Mohammed's operation will be hoping to recapture the magic with Mohave (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who graduated in his second outing in the Listed Blue Diamond Colts & Geldings Preview over this strip Jan. 25. In his only prior appearance, Mohave was second to the highly regarded Law (Aus) (Denman {Aus}) in the Listed Breeders' Plate at Randwick Oct. 5. Nostradamus (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) was a sparkling first Australian winner for his sire at Flemington Jan. 18, and is the current 9-1 fourth choice for the Blue Diamond.

Fountain of Youth for Conquest Titan...

Conquest Stables's Conquest Titan (Birdstone) will make his next start in Gulfstream's Feb. 22 GII Besilu Fountain of Youth S., trainer Mark Casse revealed yesterday. The \$475,000 OBSMAR 2-year-old closed from last to finish second in the GII Holy Bull S. behind Cairo Prince (Pioneerof the Nile) Jan. 25. "I thought [the Holy Bull] was great and a really good learning experience for him," said Casse. "Right now our goal is to keep him happy and healthy, and that's one of the reasons we're going to stay and run in the Fountain of Youth." He continued, "We maybe would have a better shot going to New Orleans with the longer stretch, with speed not holding as well there. But we felt it was better to keep him home for right now. We know he loves Churchill Downs, so we're trying to get him there happy and healthy. I think he proved the other day that he can run with the best of them." Conquest Two Step, winner of Woodbine's Swynford S. last August, annexed a Churchill Downs optional claimer Nov. 30 to conclude his juvenile campaign. Other runners expected for the Fountain of Youth include 3 "TDN Rising **Star"** Top Billing (Curlin), an impressive optional claimer winner on the Holy Bull undercard; Commissioner (A.P. Indy), who beat Top Billing in a Jan. 3 optional claimer; and Wildcat Red (D'wildcat), an impressive winner of last Saturday's GIII Hutcheson S. "Obviously, it's not going to be an easy race," Casse said. "We're just looking for him to run another good race."



Secret Gesture, runner-up in the G1 German Oaks and third behind The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks following her Epsom exploits, wrapped up her season with a ninth place finish in the G1 Prix de l'Opera in October. Her early season target will be at York. "Secret Gesture has done particularly well for her winter break," Beckett told PA Sport. "She likes York as we saw in the Yorkshire Oaks, so an obvious starting point would be the [G2] Middleton S. [May 15]. Hopefully we can have a good swing of the bat with her."



Rated 106 and catalogued as lot 177, the 5-year-old gelding is a half-brother to G3 Fred Darling S.

winner Puff (Ire) (Camacho {GB}). His most recent victory came in July 2012, but he has been a consistent campaigner for Michael Bell, with multiple stakes placings and will race on for Dandy Nicholls.

"He's a tough horse, like his new trainer," joked Nicholls. "But when they're that good they don't lose their ability. I'll look at all the big races in England and Ireland for him. I'd sooner buy him than a yearling." Cont. p9

Surpassing last year's top price of 100,000gns, the day's figures were up across all sectors for the first sale of the year at Park Paddocks, with the aggregate improving by 24% to 2,166,600gns for 172 lots soldaclearance rate of 80%. The average of 12,597gns and median of 6,750gns represented increases of 37% and 35%, respectively.

Top of the breeding prospects sold on Thursday was the once-raced 3-year-old filly Enharmonic (E Dubai), who fetched 90,000gns to a bid from Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock. The Juddmonte consignee, lot 171, is a half-sister to G1 Dewhurst S. winner Distant Music (Distant View) and to the dam of dual Group 1 winner African Rose (GB) (Observatory).

"She's a very nice filly with a proper page," said Goff, who couldn't name his client. "I've seen quite a bit of her at John Gosden's, where she was in training, and she definitely had ability."

Goff later snapped up four-time winner Sharaarah (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), going to 52,000gns for

lot 225 while standing alongside Timmy Hyde, and confirmed that the 4-year-old half-sister to G2 Flying Childers S. runner-up Burwaaz (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}) will also be heading to the paddocks.

Like the sale-topper, Verglas (Ire), entire Duke Of Clarence (Ire) is another to remain intraining, and lot 131

will switch from Richard Hannon's stable to Richard Fahey's, having been knocked down at 70,000gns. The 5-year-old half-brother to multiple group winner Special Kaldoun (Ire) (Alzao) has been pretty prolific himself, winning five of his 17 starts and placing on a further six occasions to earn a rating of 95.

"He'll go to Richard Fahey eventually," said purchaser Robin O'Ryan, assistant to the Yorkshire-based trainer. "With that sort of rating he can run for good money."

Victoria and Anthony Pakenham have supported their Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) with a decent array of mares since his retirement to Lanwades Stud in 2008 and added Famusa (GB), a daughter of Medicean (GB) sold with a mid-June cover to Cape Cross (Ire), to his list of mates for the future. Bidding on the Pakenhams' behalf, Stephen Kemble went to 60,000gns to secure lot 67, and she will now join the boarders at his Northamptonshire-based The Elms Stud.

"I liked her as a racehorse--she was speedy with a decent rating, and I like Cape Cross," said Victoria Pakenham. "We thought she was quite a stand-out in the catalogue so we're pleased to get her. She was covered late so she'll have to have this year off but she'll go to Sir Percy next year."

A six-time winner, Famusa is a daughter of the Oaks d'Italia runner-up Step Danzer (Ire) and gained listed black-type herself in Italy, while her half-brother Fanunalter (GB) (Falbrav {Ire}) won the G2 Summer Mile at Ascot.

The Coral Champions Club racing syndicate will have a new representative on the racecourse this season after trainer Jeremy Gask went to 42,000gns to claim Authorized (Ire) 4-year-old Al Jamal (GB) (lot 72) from the Darley consignment. Previously trained by Saeed Bin Suroor, the daughter of the Dubai Millennium (GB) mare Kydd Gloves won on her sole start at two and struck again over a mile at Windsor last season.



FASIG-TIPTON FEBRUARY

With Scherzinger, Litt Keeps Streak Going... By Lucas Marguardt

How hot a streak is bloodstock agent Jason Litt and his partner Alex Solis on? Two years ago, at the Fasig-Tipton February Winter Mixed Sale, Litt signed for the unbroken 2-year-old **Scherzinger** (Tiz Wonderful) for just \$16,000 and two weeks ago watched as the upstart filly captured her stakes debut, the GII Santa Monica S. at Santa Anita, in re-rallying fashion. (The 2014 renewal of FTKFEB which will be held this Sunday and Monday in Lexington.)

"It was pretty tremendous," said Litt, who with Solis operates Solis/Litt Bloodstock.

As it turns out, though, Scherzinger isn't even the second-biggest storyline of Litt and Solis's recent run. That's because the pair can also boast of the brilliant

finalist Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast), who successfully defended her title in last November's GI Breeders' Turf Sprint over the boys before selling for \$2.7 million at Fasig-Tipton November.

For the Kentucky-based Litt, it's been quite a journey from a kid growing up in Northern California who spent mornings at the track visiting the claiming horses his father owned.

In fact, it wasn't until one of those claiming horses broke out that Litt even really considered a career in racing. Back in 1997, his father, Howard Litt, joined with a rising trainer named Jerry Hollendorfer to claim King Slewie (Slewdledo) for \$20,000. A few months later, King Slewie romped by over five lengths in the GIII California Juvenile S.

"It was one of those awesome moments, that feeling you get when you're around a nice horse," Litt said, remembering that day at Bay Meadows.

Two years later, Howard Litt, Hollendorfer and another partner, George Todaro, won the California Juvenile again, this time with the \$80,000 yearling Globalize (Summer Squall), who later captured the GII Spiral S. and earned over \$620,000.

In the meantime, Jason Litt got his B.A. from UC Berkeley and his M.S. from Wake Forest. But racing was never far from his mind. In 1998, he received a report from his father, who had just returned from the Kentucky yearling sales: "It's a whole other world out there," the elder Litt said. Cont. p12



The following year, Litt made the trip himself. "I was like, 'Oh man, what is this?'" he said as he watched Dubai to Dubai (Kris S.) top the sale at \$3.9 million. "When you're used to claiming horses at Bay Meadows and running for \$15,000 pots, you recognize the magnitude, not just of the money, but of the whole process. It was awe-inspiring."

Drawing on that inspiration, Litt left a promising business gig in California for a slot in Taylor Made's groom program in 2000. It was a big leap of faith. "I was making minimum wage and living on a trailer on the farm," said Litt. "I was 28 at the time, and everyone else was like 18. You get your first check and you're like, 'Whaaat?!'"

But Litt knew the program would give him an excellent foundation going forward. After the internship was through, he landed a spot with the popular veterinarian Doc Cheney at Gulfstream. During a memorable 30-minute stretch one morning, he helped examine the Classic winners Monarchos and Red Bullet. and the champion Macho Uno.

"Doc Cheney is amazing," said Litt. "He's got this strong southern accent and plays the cards perfectly, like he's some hillbilly. But he is brilliant. He can do some surgical procedures right in the barn, and you're wondering what just happened. Some really phenomenal stuff."

From there, Litt began a seven-year stint at Three

Chimneys Farm in Lexington. He recruited fillies, recruited clients, sold seasons, and learned from a terrific but slightly eclectic stallion roster that good horses can come in all shapes and sizes.

"You had Rahy, who was 15.1 hands, you had Dynaformer, who was 17 hands, and you had Wild Again and Capote, both of whom sired very specific types," said Litt. "They were horses who didn't always get the

commercial world fired up, but you learned that good horses don't always need to be big and imposing and powerful. The good Rahys didn't need to be 16.2, but they did need to have certain qualities."

Just as educational was the sales scene. "You'd go out to the November sales and see 200, 300 stakes-winning mares in the first few days," he said. "Over time, you begin to learn what things you can accept, in terms of flaws. And that's really what it comes down to. It's often not hard to find the five best-looking horses in a sale. It's locating the ones after that, and deciding what you can live with and what you'll pay." Cont. p13



The mix of his track and sales experience provided Litt an advantageous perspective. "There's sometimes a huge disconnect between the racing and sales world," he said. "What people will accept as a sales horse, and what you need as a package to present to potential buyers, is often very different from what you need to be successful on the track. From the side view, you always need something that's very athletic. But as far as front-end conformation goes, if you're off a little bit in the sales world, they can crucify you, whereas if you go to the track, you see a lot of good horses who are offset through the knees, toe out or toe in, who are runners. Being on the track, and dealing with the vets and visiting a lot of barns, you realize what you can live with."

First Grade I Winner...

Litt made his first major yearling purchase for a client in 2006, a daughter of Street Cry (Ire) from the mare Please Sign In (Doc's Leader) who cost \$150,000.

"It was huge money for me," he said. "But I saw this filly in Book 2, and I thought she was just amazing. I remember telling my dad, 'Listen, if this filly can't run, then I probably don't need to be doing what I'm doing."

The filly was **Cry and Catch Me**, who ran second on debut for Litt's client, was sold privately and transferred to Bob Baffert, and won the GI Oak Leaf S. two starts later.

"It was a really defining moment, in my mind," said Litt.

Not all was rosy, however. In 2009, Litt's father fell seriously ill. Litt began making extended trips to California to spend time with him. Ultimately, he decided it was time to strike out on his own.

"The people at Three Chimneys were amazingly supportive, but it got to the point where I was gone so often that I didn't want to put them in a bad spot," he said. "I didn't really have any aspirations to go out on my own, but the timing was right, as far as being able to spend time with my dad."

Around that time, Litt met a college student named Alex Solis II at a party at Del Mar. Solis, the son of respected rider Alex Solis, looked even younger than he was, but Litt had learned to take everybody seriously in the business, and he was impressed by Solis's drive and smarts. The two began doing some work together, with Solis, based in California, focusing on the West Coast and Litt the East.



Success came quickly...but in a somewhat circuitous fashion. Litt bought Mizdirection at the 2009 Keeneland September Sale in 2009, but the client for whom her purchased her ran into financial difficulties, and early in her 2-year-old year it was decided to prep her for the juvenile sales. "We gave her to Justin Casse to get her ready for the sale, and he did a great job, because she was waaay behind the eight ball," said Litt. "He only had her for two months before she went to Fasig-Tipton [May Midlantic Sale]."

The filly, unrefined, sold with no reserve. Uninspired bidding prompted Litt and Solis, aware of her raw talent, to jump in and buy her for themselves for \$50,000.

Mizdirection was a Murphy's Law-type of horse initially, suffering a frustrating series of minor setbacks. But when, in May of her 3-year-old year, she won her turf debut by 11 1/2 lengths, Litt and Solis knew they had a good one on their hands. Not long after, they sold their share to a group of partners led by Jungle Racing's Jim Rome, the popular TV and radio personality. Trained throughout her career by Mike Puype, Mizdirection won 11 of 17 starts and earned over \$1.7 million.



Sharing Is Good...

Litt and Solis have maintained a strong relationship with Rome, now the majority owner in Shared Belief. That one arrived too late on the scene last fall to himself be a Breeders' Cup player, but nonetheless put together a championship campaign with some lateseason heroics. Litt and Solis purchased Shared Belief privately after the gelding won off by seven lengths in his first start at Golden Gate in October. Bought for a partnership including themselves, Jungle Racing, Kevin Nish, Hollendorfer and his longtime partner George Todaro, Shared Belief took the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. by 7 3/4 lengths, then aired by 5 3/4 lengths in the GI CashCall Futurity to remain unbeaten.

"He's got such a good mind," said Litt. "In the CashCall, when Gary Stevens and Candy Boy [Candy Ride {Arg}] made that move before the 3/8th pole and went right past us, a lot of young horses want to go with the horse. But he just sat chilly and waited for Corey [Nakatani] to tell him to go. It's a testament to the horse's mental state in his third career start."

Plans for this weekend's GII Robert B. Lewis S. were derailed when Shared Belief popped an abscess following his last official work, a five-furlong breeze at Santa Anita Jan. 3. Showing no signs of Derby fever, Litt says he's unsure where Shared Belief will reappear next.

"Honestly, I have no idea," he said. "Like Jerry said, you don't take a horse to the Kentucky Derby, he takes you. Everyone's very realistic and recognizes we're

fortunate to have a champion 2-year-old in our possession. That alone is an amazing feat. Now, we'll just sit back and let Jerry do his thing."

While they wait for Shared Belief to make his sophomore bow, and with Mizdirection now retired, Litt and Solis still have a rooting interest at

present in the form of Scherzinger, who emerged from Darby Dan's draft at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton February Sale.

"Robert Hammond at Darby Dan called me two weeks before the sale and said they had three unraced 2-year-olds in their consignment and that one of them was really nice," said Litt. "I went over to the barn, and she was just beautiful. The other two were nothing like her, but she was really powerful and just a specimen. But it was one of those things where not many people where going there looking for racing prospects, especially a 2-year-old that hadn't been broken."

Litt, in partnership with Solis, bought Scherzinger for \$16,000 and sent her to Rick Lopez in Ocala to be broken. Lopez liked her. The filly moved on to Juan Arias at Calder, and he liked her, too. Scherzinger ran a nice closing second in her debut, and Solis called Hollendorfer and said that they had a filly with some talent. Hollendorfer bought her with Dr. Mark Dedomenico, and Scherzinger has now won four of her last five, including the Jan. 25 Santa Monica.

The 4-year-old, out of Dancinandsingin (A.P. Indy), is named after the comely lead singer of the girl group Pussycat Dolls, Nicole Scherzinger. "I said to Alex when we were naming her, 'Listen, what if she can run? Maybe we'd get a chance to meet *Nicole Scherzinger*," Litt laughed.

It hasn't happened yet, but Litt is optimistic that his and Solis's good luck could continue. Meanwhile, they'll be back shopping for their next star on Sunday and Monday at Fasig-Tipton. Click here to share this story.

Yet again, Bill Oppenheim has managed to tell the breeders on both sides of the Atlantic that if one does enough research, one does not need to be wealthy to breed a good horse. As a small breeder in France, I have been aware of the fact that where I live, I have a great advantage over other breeders in other parts of Europe, indeed the world.

What is more striking in the *TDN* of Feb. 5 is that with relatively small means, breeders can breed a good horse without paying a fortune, as long as one is not breeding for the commercial market.

To breed for that particular market, one has to invest in fashionable stallions and fancy mares--a high-risk game.

I am very grateful for the APEX and ABC indices, which give any breeder a very good indication of where value is to be found.

One particular stallion on your list today, that I personally was very sorry to see going to Ireland and not staying in France was Clodovil, who was trained in France and had his whole career there, but was deemed by stallion masters in France as being "too small, not much." French breeders lost a Classic winner with just the type of speed and class everyone is looking for. Clodovil will most probably be a good broodmare sire, as well, considering his pedigree.

From a very personal aspect, I dare say that for small breeders in France, we have a very large choice of stallions available at very reasonable prices if one is not commercially minded.

Lastly, I would like to relate an aphorism told by Maurice Zilber. "A good horse, by a donkey out of a donkey, has a value as long as it is good."

It was such a shock and great sadness to learn of Joy Gilbert's death. I had the great pleasure to work with her a few times on posed conformation shots of stallions/prospects purchased by clients beginning in 2005, after admiring her work done for Walmac in their stallion register listings.

Joy, in my opinion, was the best. She never failed to capture the horse accurately, as it naturally was and as best as it could be.

When you went to inspect stallions on the farms, the living horse looked like Joy's photo of it. Her eye for knowing how to capture that with her camera was what set her apart.

She was also the most pleasant, fun person to deal with. It can be exasperating work that can take hours to get the perfect shot of just one horse. From the wind and weather to explaining to the handler how to position the horse (sometimes with a language barrier), the horse's attention span or lack thereof, to working around a yucky background or the perfect lighting.

Joy had a great sense of humor and took it all in stride, sometimes under time constraints if there was a van ride to catch.

I will always be grateful to her for tips she generously shared regarding camera selection when digitals became available and time of day for best lighting, which have helped me enormously as a bloodstock agent to provide my clients with photos accurately depicting horses they are considering for purchase.

My deepest sympathy to her family, friends and clients. Joy was just that and a true camera artist.

CHURCHILL RELEASES SPRING SCHEDULE

Churchill Downs will offer 24 stakes and \$7.675 million in purse--an increase of 2.7--during their spring meet, anchored by the \$2 million GI Kentucky Derby and the \$1 million GI Kentucky Oaks. Racing Apr. 26 to June 29, Churchill has six Grade I races scheduled. Besides the two 3-year-old classics, the Louisville oval will hold the Stephen Foster H., La Troienne S., and the Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. and Humana both on May 3 prior to the Derby. Derby Day 2014 will be the richest day of purses in track history at \$3.75 million. The GII Churchill Downs S., GII Churchill Distaff Turf Mile, and the GII American Turf will also shore up the Derby Day card. Oaks Day May 2 will feature the La Troienne, and four additional stakes, the GII Alysheba S., GIII Eight Belles S., GIII Twin Spires Turf Sprint S., and the Edgewood S. The top "Downs After Dark" night racing program is slated for Saturday June 14, with the Stephen Foster as the main attraction. The GII Fleur De Lis H., GIII Matt Winn S. and the GIII Regret S. will also go off that evening. The spring stakes schedule will kick off with the GIII Derby Trial S. as the highlight of the "Opening Night" celebration under the lights Apr. 26. For the full schedule click here.

MONMOUTH ANNOUNCES STAKES SCHEDULE

Monmouth Park has announced their stakes schedule for the 2014 season which totals \$5.8 million in purses. The feature event is the \$1 million GI William Hill Haskell Invitational July 27. Monmouth will host 17 graded stakes during its 57 day meet beginning on May 10. Highlights include the GI United Nations S. which will now run in conjunction with the GIII Salvator Mile S. July 6. Both races will be broadcasted live on Fox Sports 1 as part of The Jockey Club Series. The cadre of the GII Molly Pitcher S., GII Monmouth Cup S., GIII Matchmaker S., and the GIII Oceanport S. will support the Haskell Day undercard. Both the GIII Violet S. and the GIII Boiling Springs S. return to the schedule after a year hiatus.

things up a little bit," Hill admitted. "Mrs. Weber has never had any issues starting against softer competition before working your way up. And Christophe is very good about shipping and uses Tampa quite a bit, it's just as simple as that, really.

He continued, "We weren't really surprised that she improved with the surface switch. She had some nagging little things like so many racehorses do, but Christophe is patient and Mrs. Weber is patient and so hopefully this is the beginning of some nice wins."

Forever Loyal hails from a family familiar to Live Oak, as the operation purchased Scoop (Gone West), a half-sister to first dam Kings Lynn, for \$2.1 million at Keeneland November back in 2005. Despite the obvious attraction to the filly's pedigree, Hill said their decision to go to \$360,000 for Forever Loyal at Keeneland September in 2012 was based on her appearance.

"We're always just looking for balance in racehorses," Hill offered. "So much of this is gut feel and the whole team liked her. All three of us on the team were very pleased with her, and Mrs. Weber put her final stamp of approval on it and that was it. She was just very, very balanced, beautiful long neck and a good shoulder."

Hill admits that Mrs. Weber have augmented their approach to purchasing horses over the years.

"We're just looking for athletes," he stated. "[Well-pedigreed] fillies used to be [Mrs. Weber's] M.O., but we've kind of shifted gears a little bit, and we're certainly not opposed to the Brilliant Speeds and To Honor and Serves, given the success we've had with those colts. So, we just try to find racehorses and we're looking for a depth of quality, that's all." --Alan Carasso


