THREE-WAY GO IN THE GOTHAM

The cast of characters for Saturday's GIII Gotham S. was slightly different than it was in the GIII Withers S. Feb. 1, but in the end the results were the same, as My Meadowview Stable's Samraat (Noble Causeway) and his fellow New York-bred, Wounded Warrior Stable's Uncle Sigh (Indian Charlie), slugged it out through the final quarter mile, with Samraat earning a hard-fought neck decision and 50 points along the road to the Kentucky Derby in nine weeks' time. In Trouble (Tiz Wonderful), making his first start around two turns and first since taking the GII Futurity S. Sept. 29, set the pace from the fence and was dour in the stretch, finishing just a half-length behind in third and well clear of Financial Mogul (Street Boss) in fourth. "This is a real horse now," enthused winning trainer Rick Violette Jr. "We knew he had a shot to be a real horse after the Withers; he proved he is a real horse today." Cont. p3 Share this result.

'Sam' Old Story...

One of just 34 foals from this current crop of his sire, raced by My Meadowview to a runner-up effort in the 2005 GI Florida Derby, **Samraat** wired a field of state-bred maidens by 3 1/2 lengths at Belmont Oct. 23 and was a 5 1/2-length winner of a first-level allowance Nov. 22 before coasting to a 16 3/4-length success when trying a route of ground for the first time in the Damon Runyon S. Dec. 18. He was trying opens for the first time in the Withers and was the second favorite by less than \$1,000, but stalked the free-running Uncle Sigh from the outside and was able to get just the better of that entertaining battle by a length. Samraat was the co-top weight and was forced to give all but one of his rivals three or seven pounds, but was able to get the job done.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

The comebacking In Trouble won the break, allowing Uncle Sigh--a touch eager beneath Corey Nakatani--to do the chasing this time around, as Samraat raced three wide and just to that duo's outside entering the backstretch run. In Trouble raced--mouth open against the bit--through an opening quarter in :23.85 with

Uncle Sigh at his saddle towel and Samraat right there from the three path. The pace quickened noticeably after a half in :48.30, and the trio began to put some real estate between them and the rest of the field entering the second turn. The stage was set at

the head of the stretch after three-quarters in 1:12.30, as In Trouble still led narrowly from his two more-seasoned rivals, who came to make it a line of three with a furlong from home. Samraat worked his way to the front with 100 yards to race and was able to find the wire just in front from Uncle Sigh, who raced tightly between horses, and a game In Trouble not far back in third. Violette Jr. admits to a case of Derby fever. "This was a good field. I'd be lying if I said we weren't already thinking [about the Kentucky Derby]," he commented. "At this stage, we didn't want to do anything that would prevent us from going to the Derby. A couple of races before the Derby probably toughens him, but this was another stretch-long hard duel, but [jockey] Jose [Ortiz] never hit him." The conditioner said Samraat will train in the interim in Florida. "The Wood [Memorial, GI, \$1 million, Apr. 5] is a real possibility," he explained. "That would be our best option as long as the horse cooperates and tells us that we should get on a plane and come up for it."

Gary Contessa, trainer of Uncle Sigh, was philosophical in defeat. "Samraat is a nice horse," he offered. "Now I'm a believer. We closed the gap on him a little bit today, and my horse is still very young. He was intimidated and he got bumped, and he might have been a little bit cautious down in there, but we're getting better. He's certainly developing."

Contessa said a Wood rematch is a strong possibility, a race which is also likely to attract In Trouble.

"Coming off a layoff we were concerned he might need a race, but he ran very game," said his rider Joe Rocco Jr. "Very game. He really dug in well and we're looking forward to see what he can do next time.



Trained for Green by Jimmy DiVito on the Chicago circuit at two, Spot was runner-up on his June 2 debut over the Arlington Poly, but trailed in a one-mile turf maiden Aug. 22. Fifth to subsequent SW Coastline (Speightstown) in a seven-furlong test over the Keeneland synthetic Oct. 5, he finally got the job done with a switch to conventional dirt, romping home by 8 1/2 lengths at Hawthorne Oct. 24. Though there are plenty of first-level allowance races and despite the fact that DiVito calls Tampa Bay Downs his winter home, Spot trekked down to South Florida for the GIII Hutcheson S. Feb. 1, but he was never a factor when fifth to subsequent GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Wildcat Red (D'wildcat). No Nay Never jumped well and led them out of the chute, but was displaced on the front end by the rail-skimming Can't Stop the Kid (Montbrook) and the two locked horns through an opening couple of furlongs in :22.24. Spot was a distant fifth and double digits behind for the opening four furlongs. No Nay Never loomed upsides Can't Stop the Kid with ears pricked leaving the three-eighths marker and appeared to have the race at his mercy, but Spot, inside on the turn, appeared on the scene and was switched out under a full head of steam entering the stretch. Racing on his incorrect lead, he struck to the lead at the eighth pole and edged clear. Cont. p5

"He broke good and the speed went very good in front of him," said winning jockey Jose Lezcano. "When I asked him, he came running and he gave me the kick that I needed to win the race. The horse that finished second had to go on the pace the whole way and gave me the opportunity to win the race. When I really asked him, he took off very good."

Havana was withdrawn from the Swale earlier in the morning by trainer Todd Pletcher.

"When he came out this morning, he was a little tender in his right front foot," Pletcher said. "I went ahead and took him to the racetrack to see how he was, and he actually trained fine. When he came back, he had a little bit of blood on the inside quarter of his front foot and we saw a little quarter crack there. I don't anticipate it's going to be a big deal but the timing couldn't have been much worse, especially for today's race." Share this result.

Strapping Groom was something other than an abject failure while racing for his breeder and trainer Carl Domino in the first segment of his career, winning five of 17 trips to the post. But he has really turned the corner since joining this barn and took his batting average since a \$35,000 claim this past May to .500 with a second career graded stakes success. A 15-1 winner of a sloppy renewal of the GI Forego S. at Saratoga Aug. 31, the chestnut was a respectable third behind Private Zone (Macho Uno) in the GI Vosburgh S. at Belmont Sept. 28 ahead of a below-par fourth in the GIII Bold Ruler H. in Elmont Oct. 26. He bounced back to round out the exacta underneath an in-form Palace (City Zip) as the 135-pound topweight in the GIII Fall Highweight H. over this main track Nov. 28 and posted a career-best 110 Beyer in turning the tables on Palace in the Dec. 21 Gravesend H. last time out. Drawn on the fence for this, Strapping Groom was only fairly away and was as far back as third for the first time in seven starts as Dads Caps and longshot Jake N Elwood (During) showed the sharpest early speed. Still third, but with aim and the length of the stretch to reel in the top two, the even-money choice began to find his best stride entering the final furlong and was along close home for the victory. "He came out [of the gate] a little slow and [Jacobson] told me to put him in the race," winning jockey Irad Ortiz commented. "When I got clear in the stretch, he took off. He was ready today. 

In 2012, Currin celebrated one of his finest hours as a breeder when a yearling colt by Bernardini out of his productive mare Wilshewed (Carson City) fetched \$1.55 million at the Keeneland September sale, the second-highest priced offering at the auction. Making his third career start in Saturday's GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Park, that colt, now named Gala Award, paid tribute to his late breeder with a pacepressing victory. Possessed of an each-way sort of pedigree, Gala Award debuted over 8 1/2 furlongs of this turf course Dec. 7, falling 3/4 of a length short in second after racing prominently. With Gary Stevens hanging around post-Mucho Macho Man and post Eclipse, the Triple Crown nominee came from just off the speed to graduate by three-parts of a length Jan. 20, but was let go at juicy odds in this class test. Away in good order after dislodging John Velazquez pre-start, Gala Award hounded favored Storming Inti from a three-wide perch in third and punched the breeze as they raced down the backstretch. Given his cue while still wide on the bend, he grabbed the stubborn pacesetter a sixteenth from home and held sway. Mr Speaker, well back early, made a bold middle move and finished well to round out the exacta.

Plenty of punters were willing to take a stance against 3 "TDN Rising Star" 3 Awesome Baby in the Santa Ysabel on the evidence of a disastrous first distance attempt in the GI Chandelier S. last September. But the Kaleem Shah-owned filly proved her doubters wrong, taking advantage of the 'wet-fast' [i.e. sloppy] main track and carrying her speed successfully from wire to wire. A smashing 4 3/4-length debut winner en route to Rising Star honors at Del Mar Aug. 4, the attractive dark bay was used up on the pace after drawing the rail in the GI Del Mar Debutante Aug. 31 and finished seventh of eight behind fellow TDN Rising Star" She's a Tiger (Tale of the Cat). Connections pressed on to the 1 1/16-mile Chandelier, but she'd run her race after four furlongs and was beaten 23 lengths by her ill-fated stablemate Secret Compass (Discreet Cat). That was it for the season, and she made her return to action in the Jan. 4 GII Santa Ynez S. over 6 1/2 panels, where she led throughout as the 5-1 third choice in a field of four. Soon in front in this scratched-down group, Awesome Baby sped to the front and led from Swiss Lake Yodeler and a ground-saving Artemis. The latter went for a run up the fence at the five-eighths, but Awesome Baby repelled that challenge, cut the corner into the stretch and was comfortably in front for the remainder. "That was real impressive to me since I didn't know if she was going to get the distance at all," winning rider Mike Smith said. "And, not only did we get it, but she was well within herself at the wire.

Rangers Lead the Way

Shamus Award (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) has won just twice in 12 starts, but he knows how to win when it counts. The 3-year-old made history in October by becoming the first horse to break his maiden in the A\$3 million G1 Cox Plate, and yesterday he added his

second lifetime score in Flemington's G1 Australian Guineas. Bounding to the lead from the start as he did in the Cox Plate, Shamus Award carved out strong fractions while racing keenly under jockey Craig Williams. Kicking clear at the top of the lane, Shamus Award comfortably

held off a fast-finishing Criterion (NZ) (Sebring {Aus}) and Thunder Fantasy (Aus) (Lucky Owners {NZ}) to win by a length. Favored Hucklebuck (Aus) (Elvstroem {Aus}) made up ground late after meeting traffic trouble at the top of the lane, but could manage only eighth. Trainer Danny O'Brien suggested Shamus Award could back up in next week's A\$1 million G1 Australian Cup.

"At the end of the day he beat all those horses [Fiorente (Ire), Green Moon (Ire), and Foreteller (GB)] in the Cox Plate," O'Brien told *RacingNetwork.com.au*. "We will have a serious think about it. I can't see any reason why he has anything to fear from them next week."

An A\$230,000 Inglis Easter yearling of 2012, Shamus Award was clearly well-regarded from the beginning. He made just one start in maiden company-finishing third--in October 2012 before being thrust into stakes competition. He finished third in both the G3 Maribyrnong Plate and the Listed Chairman's S. before a fifth in the G1 Blue Diamond S. He checked in second in the G2 Henry Bucks Sires' Produce S. to wrap up his 2-year-old campaign, and resurfaced with a runner-up effort in Moonee Valley's G2 McKenzie S. last August. Off the board in the Listed Best Dressed S., he finished second by a short head in the G2 Bill Stutt S. prior to his second shot at the highest level-the G1 Caulfield Guineas-where he claimed third behind Long John (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}). Drawing into the Oct. 26 Cox Plate as a result of the late withdrawal of favored Atlantic Jewel (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Shamus Award rode the rails to a shocking victory under 17-year-old apprentice Chad Schofield, besting the likes of Fiorente (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), It's A Dundeel (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), Long John and Puissance de Lune (Ire) (Shamardal). Shamus Award failed to show the fire of that victory first up in the G1 C.F. Orr S. three weeks ago, lugging in in deep stretch to manage only third behind Moment of Change (Aus) (Barely A Moment {Aus}), but he justified his Cox Plate victory

"We really wanted to come and win this," trainer

Danny O'Brien told Racing and Sports. "He's done what very few 3-year-olds have done--win a Cox Plate--and to back it up with a Guineas, it puts him in very rare air. This was his big one but certainly we have the option next week of the Australian Cup, or then wait two weeks to the [G2] Alister Clark. There's only two races to get us to Sydney, and that would be the [G1] Rosehill Guineas [Mar. 29] and the [G1 A\$4 million] Queen Elizabeth [S. at The Championships Apr. 19]."

O'Brien confirmed that Shamus Award will race on as a 4-year-old with an eye to a second Cox Plate.

"It's not often you get a chance to win a second one as a 4-year-old," the conditioner said. "We saw So You Think do it, and we'd be keen to be back there later in the year."

Could Puccini be the next It's A Dundeel? The sophomore certainly has lofty expectations to live up to if he is to reach the heights of that five-time Group 1winning New Zealand import, but he is nonetheless on track to emulate It's A Dundeel with a victory in the G1 Australian Derby following his rousing score in the G1 NZ Derby yesterday. Puccini did not set himself an easy task, fighting jockey Michael Walker while racing fourth last early. Switching to the outside on the run into the turn, Puccini was up with the leaders in a matter of strides, and in front by a length at the top of lane. Kicking clear thereafter, he was never in danger, winning by a wrapped up two-lengths from the fastfinishing filly Rising Romance. "He's gone up 10 levels and he's the best horse in New Zealand," Walker told Breednet.com.au. "If they backed him up next week in the weight-for-age [G1 NZ S.] he'd beat [2012 NZ Derby winner] Silent Achiever," said Walker.

Co-trainer Peter McKay confirmed a crack at the G1 Australian Derby at Royal Randwick's The Championships is in the cards. "He's dominated them here, so we'll go over and have a crack at the Derby," McKay told *Breednet.com.au*. "That was huge and sometimes he can walk out of the gates and from wide draws he can work his way across, but from the inside Michael didn't panic. He dragged his own way forward and he's got an enormous heart--there were no excuses for anything else."

It took Puccini eight starts to break his maiden, which he accomplished in October, and he has since been nearly unstoppable. His only two losses since have come at the Group 1 level--in the NZ 2000 Guineas and the Levin Classic--both over 1600 meters. He won the G2 Great North Guineas over that distance, and seems to have enjoyed stretching out, winning the G2 Waikato Guineas over 2000 meters and the G2 Avondale Guineas going 2100 meters prior to yesterday's score.

Mossfun kept her perfect record intact and boosted her credentials for the Apr. 5 G1 Golden Slipper, the world's richest juvenile race, with a dominant score here. Mossfun was shelved after breaking her maiden Dec. 14 at Randwick, and resurfaced in the G3 Widden S. here two weeks ago, scoring by a cozy length. Attending the pace a half-length to the outside of the front-running Breeders' Plate winner Law (Aus) (Denman {Aus}), Mossfun sprinted past Law when given the cue approaching the 200 meter mark, and was well clear at the line. "I've always loved this filly, and she smashed them," co-trainer Michael Hawkes told Racing and Sports. "From day one she just kept improving. Some people under-rated her on the [maiden] win, but she is exposed now. There is no decision on whether she will have another start before the Slipper. She may go straight there. She is an athlete and may not need to run again." Mossfun was promoted to second choice for the A\$4 million Golden Slipper behind G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Earthquake (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}).

NINE LOOK TO BE DRESSED IN WHITE

An evenly matched collection of nine sophomore fillies is set to face the starter in today's GIII Herecomesthebride S. at Gulfstream Park, With each of the entrants in search of a breakthrough graded-stakes victory, Valseuse (Kitten's Joy) looms as good a chance as any of these and should offer fair value. The chestnut turned in a promising debut going a half-furlong shorter over this turf course Feb. 2, overcoming a sluggish pace and closing from midfield to score a decisive 1 1/4-length graduation. Connections are demonstrating a fair bit of confidence in throwing her into the deep end while trying winners for the first time. Candy Kitty (Lemon Drop Kid) is one of two in the race for the always-dangerous Todd Pletcher barn and brings arguably the best credentials into the race. The Starlight colorbearer took an off-turf renewal of the Wait A While S. over a sloppy main track Nov. 30, but returned to the infield for her latest, a one-length defeat of **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** Miss Besilu (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Ginger Brew S. Jan. 5. Any improvement off that effort makes her very tough to beat in here. Merry Merry Bee (Purim) ships down from her Tampa base off a fourth in the Ginger Brew. She got unusually far back off a very slow pace in that one and did well to be fourth, beaten 2 1/4 lengths. A more truly-run race works in her favor this afternoon.



McLaughlin noted that Saturday's workout resembled the works Cairo Prince put in ahead of the Holy Bull.

"He is just doing very well," McLaughlin said. "I did put him in company, and he always works better in company, a little faster. It was really a great day. It was a great work, and we're all thrilled. It was perfect, really, just a little bit faster than maybe I wanted but that's been him. Going into the Holy Bull, too, he went in 59 and three, 59 and four. That's a good sign."

This past Friday, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Darley operation purchased a majority interest in Cairo Prince from owners Terry Murray, Paul Braverman, Harvey Clarke and Craig Robertson. The colt will continue to be trained by McLaughlin.

"I'm very happy that they ended up with Darley because I love the horse, and I'm hopeful that we're one of the favorites for the Florida Derby and also the Kentucky Derby," McLaughlin said. "It would be fabulous to be standing in the winner's circle with these four owners plus the new partner in Sheikh Mohammed. It's just a perfect case scenario for Team McLaughlin and, hopefully, for Cairo Prince."

Apr. 12 or could ship out of town for the GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 23.

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

March 2, 1940...Beaten by a nose in both the 1937 and 1938 Santa Anita H., Seabiscuit finally won the Big 'Cap in his final race. He retired the then-leading-moneywinning horse in the world.

March 2, 1966...Kelso, Horse of the Year 1960-64, ran his last race, finishing fourth at Hialeah Park.

March 3, 1966...Ogden Phipps' Buckpasser won the Flamingo S. by a nose, under the guidance of Bill Shoemaker. The colt was such a prohibitive favorite among the field of nine that the race was declared a non-wagering contest and was dubbed "The Chicken Flamingo."

March 3, 1985...Bill Shoemaker became the first jockey in history to win \$100 million in purses after he won the Santa Anita H. aboard Lord at War (Arg).

March 3, 1985...85,527 are on-track on Santa Anita H. Day, the all-time Santa Anita single-day attendance record.

March 3, 1993...Russell Baze had his 4,000th career win, with Frank Musso, at Golden Gate Fields.

March 5, 1988...Carl Gambardella had his 5,000th career winner, aboard John's Goldenapple, at Suffolk Downs.


