3-WAY DERBY TRIAL'BOB' DECIDED BY DQ

Martin Cherry homebred **Embellishing Bob** (Northern Afleet) went from maiden winner to graded winner with the help of the stewards in a thrilling renewal of the GIII Derby Trial S. under the lights at Churchill Downs Saturday. Glued to the right flank of odds-on choice

Bayern (Northern Afleet) through splits of :23.23 and :46.62, the 9-2 shot stayed right with that foe at the head of the lane. They pin-balled off each other several times in upper stretch, and Brian Hernandez, Jr. gave Embellishing Bob a firm tug of the reins and he righted the ship. There was plenty of daylight between the leaders past

the eight pole until Bayern began to drift out on Embellishing Bob in the final sixteenth as Myositis Dan (Istan) rallied resolutely on the far outside. 

Go Indy Go completed a sweep by fillies of Sydney's 2-year-old Triple Crown with this popular victory for her South Australian connections. Racing as a homebred for breeder Harry Perks and partners, Go Indy Go finished second in her first two outings--the Listed Cinderella S. and the G3 Breeders' S.--both at South Australia's Morphettville Park Mar. 10 and 29, respectively. She displayed her need for added distance while breaking her maiden at third asking when stretched to 1400 meters for the G3 SA Sires' Produce S. three weeks ago, and was let go the third choice here. Traveling near the rear of the field with only G1 Sires' Produce S. heroine Peggy Jean (Aus) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) behind, Go Indy Go and jockey Chad Schofield followed Peggy Jean as that rival made a bold move to circle the field leaving the turn. Tipped widest of all at the 400-meter mark, Go Indy Go used the length of the stretch to reel in her rivals, hitting the lead inside the final 50 meters to win cozily. Go Indy Go is a full-sister to the useful group-placed sprinter Essay Raider (Aus), and their dam Elegant Eagle is a full-sister to the dam of G1 Caulfield Cup winner Southern Speed (Aus) (Southern Image), also bred by Perks and partners. "It's unbelievable to win a race like this with a horse you've bred and you liked so much you've kept," Perks, who was on hand for the victory, told Breednet.com.au. "I've always thought she might be the best filly I've bred and I race her with all of my children, so it's wonderful for the family."

Patience and persistence have certainly paid off for the connections of Hana's Goal, who yesterday earned her first Group 1 victory in her third Australian outing. A multiple stakes winner going 7 1/2 furlongs in her native country, Hana's Goal was targeted towards Royal Randwick's The Championships early by her connections, and shipped over for a prep run in the G1 Coolmore Classic Mar. 22. Nothing went right that day, as the 5-year-old found herself hung wide and in traffic, winding up a disappointing 14th of 16. She was able to give a much better account of herself when coming from last to be a fast-finishing sixth in the G1 Doncaster Mile two weeks ago, and put it all together yesterday. Traveling last once again, Hana's Goal used the fancied Weary as a target, and was steered widest of all leaving the turn by jockey Nash Rawiller. She responded to strong urging in midstretch to thunder down the middle of the track, blitzing her rivals in a strong performance. It was the first victory by a Japanese-owned horse in Australia since Delta Blues (Jpn) took the 2006 G1 Melbourne Cup. Hana's Goal is owned by Australian Michael Tabart, who resides in Japan.

"It is probably the best she has jumped today, but I still brought her straight back underneath me," Rawiller told *Breednet.com.au*. "I was a little bit concerned because Weary took me a few lengths farther back than I wanted. But I bit the bullet and stayed on his back because I knew her finish would take care of most of these. It's a tough ask bringing a mare all the way out here. There will be more of it next year. It's only going to get tougher from now on. The Japanese are very special horses."

May's Dream had been knocking on the door in stakes company throughout her career, and she broke through in black-type company in a big way yesterday, providing her European champion sire with a first Group 1 winner Down Under in the process. A smart second to Guelph (Aus) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) in the G1 Thousand Guineas last October, May's Dream filled the same position in the G2 Wakeful S. before finishing 8th in the G1 Crown Oaks. She won second up at the handicap level at Moonee Valley Mar. 29, and was most recently third in the G3 Schweppervescence S. here two weeks ago. A chilly ride by Brad Rawiller likely helped seal the deal yesterday. The pair were blocked worse than midfield on the home turn, but sat patiently until a narrow opening appeared inside the final 200 meters. May's Dream will now be spelled in preparation for a spring campaign.

A consistent performer for the Gai Waterhouse stable since being plucked from the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale for A\$75,000, Driefontein earned a belated first Group 1 victory yesterday. The winner of the Magic Millions 2YO Classic two years ago, Driefontein did not win again until last September's G3 Sheraco S. at Rosehill, despite finishing second in stakes company four times. She just missed the board in her next three outings, but began the season with a victory on the Gold Coast on the anniversary of her richest win. She added another victory when visiting Morphettville for the first time for the G3 R N Irwin S. two weeks ago, and made it two-from-two in South Australia yesterday. Attending the pace under Vlad Duric, Driefontein found the lead in the early straight and continued to draw clear. "She hasn't done a great deal, but she came back here very well and she was dominant today," stable foreman Roger Elliott told Racenet.com.au. "Gai had wanted to win a Group 1 race with her, so it's great for the owners and great for the mare. She tries hard and when she gets a race run to suit, she's very hard to beat, as she showed today."

Louis the King has done little wrong in his brief career, losing just once in six career starts, and yesterday he became South Africa's second Triple Crown hero with a victory in the G1 SA Derby. The winner of his first two outings at the Vaal last November, the bay checked in second over very soft going in the G3 Secretariat S. here Dec. 22. He rebounded to take the Listed Sea Cottage S. Jan. 12 prior to the first two legs of the Triple Crown: the G2 Gauteng Guineas Mar. 1, and the G1 SA Classic Mar. 29. Traveling midfield on the rail, Louis the King tipped out a few paths at the top of the lane and powered to the lead in midstretch. He had to hold off a stubborn As You Like for the victory, but he did so amidst the cheers of the Turffontein faithful. The victory was a Group 1 double on the card for trainer Geoff Woodruff, who saddled Yorker (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}) to win the co-feature, the G1 President's Champions Challenge, a race earlier. It was also the second Group 1 win on the card for Black Minnaloushe, who stands at Maine Chance Farms.

Reaffirming his affinity for the Turffontein lawn, Yorker burst to the fore in midstretch and was a clear-cut winner.

Repeat Attack?...

Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) is the second high-profile entrant from the Moore barn and looks to join Japan's Eishin Preston (Green Dancer) as the only back-to-back winners of the QE II. The 6-year-old dominated his rivals in the Hong Kong Gold Cup over today's track and distance Feb. 22, but is coming off a troubled, but never-in-it 10th as the international betting favorite in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29. Moore admits to being surprised with how fresh the gelding remains. "Military Attack looked to work very well to me on Thursday, but when I spoke to [jockey] Joao Moreira, I had to take a step back--he said he thinks the horse is better than when he won the Gold Cup, before he went to Dubai," Moore told SCMP. Dominant (Ire) (Cacique {Ire}), upset winner of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase over 12 furlongs, and Same World (GB) (Hawk Wing) close out the Moore quartet.

Trainer Katsuhiko Sumii sent out Rulership (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) to win the 2012 QE II and is back with a formidable foe in the form of G1 Japanese St Leger hero **Epiphaneia (Jpn)** (Symboli Kris S). Runner-up

to G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe fourth Kizuna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Japanese Derby, he defeated his peers in the G2 Kobe Shimbun Hai in September before scoring by five as the 3-5 chalk in the St Leger. He was a running-on third to Kizuna in the G2 Sankei Osaka

Hai Apr. 6. "I'm very happy with the horse," said Sumii, who also won the 2006 G1 Hong Kong Mile with Hat Trick (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). "He's in good condition and I am expecting very much from him on Sunday. This race has been a target for him for some time." Sumii will give a leg up to Yuichi Fukunaga, who guided Eishin Preston to his two QE II scores.

Veteran sprinter Lucky Nine (Ire) (Dubawi (Ire)) will try to earn the opportunity to defend his title in the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint May 18 in today's Sprint Cup at Sha Tin. Seventh behind the top-class Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) after a slow start in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 8, the 7-year-old bounced back to best Charles the Great (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) in the Chairman's Sprint Prize Feb. 16. He was no match for the G1 Champions Mile-bound Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup over 1400 meters last time Mar. 16, but gets back to his favored trip this afternoon. Charles the Great, one of two in here for John Moore, was a longshot third behind Gold-Fun six weeks back, but was vying for favoritism overnight with Lucky Nine. Frederick Engels (GB) (Iceman {GB}) has run well, but just hasn't been able to get over the hump of late. Fourth, but beaten only a half-length by Lucky Nine in the Chairman's Sprint Prize, he was an excuse-free fourth last time in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup. He is taking plenty of action on the tote overnight, perhaps owing to the fact that red-hot Joao Moreira is taking over at the controls.

Once the local horses had all headed back to their stables, it was the turn of the five internationals in the Quarantine stables to make their appearance. Actually, there are now six horses in quarantine, with the Japanese Champions Mile contender **Meiner Lacrima (Jpn)** (Chief Bearhart)

and Sanshaawes (SAf) (Ashaawes) were first out under race riders Anthony Delpech and Olivier Doleuze, Both went round at a trot before proceeding to a steady canter. While

Vercingetorix was a model of consistency under Delpech, Sanshaawes displayed some of the nervous energy that caused him to put a leg over the starting stalls in Dubai, likely diminishing his World Cup chances. The gelding wears a hood, but it seemed to have little effect and he returned sweated up and fighting Doleuze. The proximity of the crowd and the accompanying noise come raceday could be a real problem for the tricky gelding.

Delpech, who rode Vercingetorix to victory in the G1 Daily News 2000 before his departure to Dubai, was delighted to be reunited with the solid colt. Vercingetorix, who was unbeaten until coming up against Japanese superstar Just A Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the G1 Dubai Duty Free, cantered hard held and looked to be in superb conditions despite all his travels.

After yesterday's empty turf, the Sha Tin track suddenly became a hive of activity as the South Africans, on their way back to quarantine, met the incoming Japanese contenders, with Gordon Lord Byron (Ire) (Byron {GB}) also appearing just for good measure. Epiphaneia (Jpn) (Symboli Kris S) and Uncoiled (Fr) (Giant's Causeway) continued their steady workouts on the all-weather, with both doing a lap at a walk before proceeding at a steady canter for the second circuit. Epiphaneia's trainer Katsuhiko Sumii was on hand to watch his colt's final workout. Sumii, who trained Epiphaneia's dam

Cesario (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) to victory in the GI American Oaks, was satisfied with his charge, explaining that he prefers to do all the work at home before traveling with his horses. With victories in the U.S., Dubai, Hong Kong and Australia, Sumii is no stranger to

winning big international events, and hence Epiphaneia is considered to be the main danger by most of the rival trainers.

The Audemars Piguet QE II Cup may only sport a field of 10 runners, but with the four main contenders drawn side-by-side in barriers three to six and Uncoiled likely to set a fast pace up front, a scintillating contest awaits. Bloodstock South Africa hosts its annual Emperor's Palace National Yearling Sale today and tomorrow in Johannesburg, South Africa, and the timing could hardly be better. The sale comes a month after South Africa's dual Horse of the Year Variety Club (SAf) (Var) and the country's juvenile champion of 2011/12 Soft

Falling Rain (SAf) (National Assembly) made a poignant advertisement for their nation with a 1-2 showing in the G2 Godolphin Mile at the Dubai World Cup, just a few hours before National graduate Vercingetorix (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}) put on a courageous display to be second to Just A Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), the world's highest-rated horse, in the G1 Dubai Duty Free. Vercingetorix

looks to add his second international Group 1--in addition to Meydan's G1 Jebel Hatta--when he lines up in today's G1 QEII Cup in Hong Kong.

The strong showing by the South Africans would not have come as a surprise to any dedicated follower of global racing. Instead, it serves as a reminder that the country continues to produce sound, tough horses--in the mold of international Group 1-winning sprinters J J The Jet Plane (SAf), Ato (SAf) and Shea Shea (SAf); GI Matriarch S. heroine Gypsy's Warning (SAf) and G1 Singapore Cup and G1 Dubai Duty Free winner Jay Peg (SAf)--who can compete on the global stage.

"The key message we want to get across is that [South Africa produces] strong, tough, well-built horses," said Tom Callaghan, CEO of the Thoroughbred Breeders Association. "We don't really breed precocious. We breed more classic-type horses; that's how our racing program is structured. But people love our horses because they're strong and they're tough. We don't race on drugs, like Lasix, and we have some very good breeding stock here."

The National Sale catalogue boasts 529 youngsters by both proven and promising young sires, with pages that will jump out to international visitors. Callaghan said he expects the progeny of leading sires Var, Silvano (Ger) and Captain AI (SAf) to be as popular as ever, while

21 youngsters from the final crop of champion sire Western Winter (Gone West) will also be a highlight. First season sires represented include GI Northern Dancer Turf S. winner Just As Well (A.P. Indy) and GI King's Bishop S. winner Visionaire (Grand Slam).

International sires represented include Medaglia d'Oro, Exceed and Excel (Aus), High Chaparral (Ire), Stormy Atlantic and Tiger Hill (Ire).

"This is a country that is taking its breeding and racing very seriously."

"Some of the

pedigrees are quite internationally recognized now," Callaghan said. "We've imported a lot of bloodstock, and this is a country that is taking its breeding and racing very seriously. It's investing and it's improving year upon year, and the results overseas prove that. Dubai was a fantastic result for us. We're competing overseas and we're holding our own, as we've done over the years."

Callaghan noted the challenges and lengthy quarantine periods that the well-chronicled endemic African Horse Sickness places on the exportation of South African horses, claiming "we're working on relaxing [the export protocols], so hopefully in the next year or two we'll have an easier route out of South Africa."

The stronger presence of internationally recognized pedigrees has likely spurned the growing influx of international buyers at the National sale in recent years. South Africa has developed into a successful testing ground for identifying horses to send abroad, a tactic that has been employed with success by Sheikh Hamdan and his cousin, Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum, in Dubai. Callaghan said he is expecting buyers to jet in from Germany, Sweden, the U.S., Hong Kong, Singapore, Dubai, Abu Dhabi and the UK.

"One of the things that is happening a lot now is that foreigners are buying here, testing the horse out by racing here, and if the horse is good enough they'll export it," Callaghan explained. "We pride ourselves on being a very good nursery. We have good conditions for racing, good horsemen, and it's a good test of horses here. That's something that's a big selling point for buying in South Africa."

Callaghan noted the National sale has drawn increased attention from Hong Kong buyers. Cont. p16

"Some of our clients in the East, what they love about us is they can buy a horse from us at a fifth of the price that they would spend in Australia, race it for a year or two, and if it's good they'll export it," Callaghan said. "But it's so cheap to race here that they're not spending huge amounts of money testing a horse. So that's one of our big selling points."

There is, of course, also strong incentives for the faithful local buyers. Bloodstock South Africa is entering the second year of its revamped Added Value Stakes Bonus Series, which will see R7.5 million (about US\$708,547) available to this year's Bloodstock South Africa sales graduates across 78 feature races restricted to 2- and 3-year-olds. The buy-in for the scheme is R5,000, selected at the time of purchase.

"It's a buy in at the sale, and horses will be eligible for 78 feature races," Callaghan said. "If they win, they get a bonus that starts at R75,000 for a listed race, up to R150,000 for a group race, and that's for an R5,000 buy in. We're just trying to give back, and reward owners for excellence on the track. Especially because we're a sales company that's aligned with a breeders' association, we're very focused on trying to improve the breed and awarding quality on the racetrack."

Barry Irwin of Team Valor International has been a longtime supporter of South African bloodstock, and the Kentucky-based horseman has seen his faith rewarded over the years. He has campaigned a number of international Grade/Group 1 winners bred in South Africa, such as GI Matriarch S. heroine Gypsy's

(Caesour). Irwin has also reaped
the benefits of maintaining some
of his classiest South African
fillies for his American broodmare
band, as was the case with Secret
Heart (SAf) (Fort Wood), whose
first foal was Pluck (More Than
Ready), winner of the (then G2)
Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf in
2010. Team Valor has even
entered into the South African

stallion market, sending it's GI King's Bishop S. winner Visionaire (Grand Slam) to stand at Summerhill Stud. Members of that standout sprinter's first crop go through the ring at the National sale this weekend.

Irwin will be on hand in Johannesburg to see 10 of his South African-bred yearlings go under the hammer, and he experienced any seller's dream yesterday when his homebred She's A Pippa (SAf) (Var), a half-sister to Lot 44, a filly by Western Winter, became a stakes winner in Fairview's Listed East Cape Oaks. The 3-year-old is the first foal out of multiple graded winner and Grade 1-placed She's On Fire (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}). Further down the page is Champion South African Stayer Devon Air (GB), as well as Grade 1-winning sprinter August Rush (SAf) (Var).

"A lot of people were surprised that [She's A Pippa] was able to get 1 1/4 miles, because she's by Var, who was a sprinter, but she comes from a family that has a ton of stamina," Irwin explained. He noted that She's On Fire also has a 2-year-old filly named Bountiful Harvest (SAf) (Kahal {GB}), also retained for Team Valor, but that "she's a big filly, she won't run for a while."

Also amongst the Team Valor-breds in this weekend's sale is Lot 92, a regally-bred colt out of Champion Broodmare Sunshine Lover (SAf) (Badger Land), whose first two foals, Captain's Lover (SAf) (Captain Al {SAf}) and Ebony Flyer (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}) both won the G1 Cape Fillies Guineas. Ebony Flyer went on to win two more Grade 1s. During the sale's second session Monday, Team Valor will send out Lot 490, the first foal out of Grade 1 winner On Her Toes (SAf) (Western Winter), who Irwin purchased as a yearling and campaigned. Lot 490 is a filly by Captain Al (SAf). The above mentioned horses are all consigned by Klipdrif Stud.

Team Valor has already experienced success as a seller in the South African market this year, having sold a filly they owned in partnership with Drakenstein Stud,

by Giant's Causeway out of Captain's Lover, at January's Cape Premier Yearling Sale for R3,200,000 (US\$300,285)-the cohighest price of the sale.

"I'm hoping to top the sale here, too, so I can retire undefeated," Irwin quipped. He noted that Team Valor's South African operations

have come full circle.

"We have two things we do here," he explained. "One is we buy yearlings and horses that have run a time or two for our racing stable. That's one operation. And then if we like the mares and they have black-type, we keep them and breed to sell from them. When we put them in the sale, we put very light reserves on them, usually about 60% of what we think their value is. If nothing happens, we'll buy one back, but it hasn't happened yet. We sell everything, and that operation is a for profit operation."

Irwin indicated his plans to be active as a buyer over the next two days.

"I saw four I really liked, and I'm going to try to get them," he said. SCLICH HERE TO SHARE THIS STORY

KEENELAND SPRING MEET CONCLUDES

Keeneland closed out their 15-day spring meet, held Apr. 4-25, with record attendance totaling 270,093 and increases in on-track wagering.

"Keeneland has the best fans in the world, and we are very grateful for their support," said Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason. "Their passion for Keeneland, and appreciation of quality racing, creates an energy that makes this a truly special place."

With daily average attendance at 18,006, the total on-track handle increased to \$18,931,643, as opposed to \$18,890,584 last year. The daily average on-track handle also increased 6.9% to \$1,262,110. Keeneland Select, the track's advance deposit wagering platform, saw a handle increase of 15% from last season. All-sources wagering on Keeneland totaled \$138,033,442 compared to \$158,640,589 last year.

In addition to high quality racing, Keeneland offered several special events this meet, such as College Scholarship Day, Maker's Mark Day and a visit from GI Kentucky Derby winner Mine That Bird and the cast of the movie "50 to 1."

"It's all about creating a memorable experience for our guests," Thomason said. "The highest-quality racing, customer service that goes above and beyond, fan-friendly initiatives for our casual players--everything we do is with the goal of building lifelong racing fans."

The meet offered some of the country's highest purses, averaging \$549,937 compared to \$512,336 last term.

"We owe our thanks to our great horsemen, who continually elevate the quality of racing here at Keeneland," Vice President of Racing W.B. Rogers Beasley said.

Julien Leparoux edged out Stewart Elliott for the jocket title with 19 wins compared to Elliott's 15. Conditioner Mark Casse captured the trainer title for the first time with 11 wins. John Oxley's five wins earned him his fourth owner's title.

"It's good to be back in Kentucky and to get the title here against a lot of very good jockeys," Leparoux said. "It's always a tough meet in April here, so good to be on top for sure."




