





BLOOMING MARVELLOUS!

Flying under the radar ahead of yesterday's G1 Etihad Airways Irish 1000 Guineas, Derrick Smith's **Marvellous** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) emerged clear best in what amounted to a war of attrition for the fillies in testing ground to forge a sixth renewal for Aidan O'Brien's Ballydoyle stable. Racing at the back throughout the early stages,

the 10-1 shot, who came into this off a lengthy break having finished sixth in the Mar. 30 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial, steadily wore down Lightning Thunder (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) and, after gaining the lead passing the furlong marker, strode away for a three-length

success. "You would have to be very pleased, as it was only her third run and was in deep ground," jockey Ryan Moore commented. "She was drawn towards the outside and was a long way back, so had to do it the hard way. I was taken off my feet after a furlong and couldn't really hold my spot, but when I asked her she did pick up and I think she was just pretty inexperienced during the race. She should get further and I'm sure she'd be a better filly on nicer ground." Cont. p3

Ballydoyle appeared to possess a clutch of above-average fillies at the start of the year, with Tapestry (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Bracelet (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) leading the way before failing to make any impact in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. In the background, Palace (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Wonderfully (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Marvellous were working towards this Classic with no obvious stand-out form claims, and the latter had the least to offer in that respect. Seen just twice so far, the relative of Giant's Causeway had followed an encouraging if labored debut win over the subsequent Listed scorer I'm Yours (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), with a less-than-auspicious first sophomore start in the seven-furlong Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial.

By halfway, the portents were hardly strong that she was going to produce the type of performance at the business end that would make her an authoritative Classic winner as Ryan Moore niggled to close on the leaders. Answering every call as the race came down to a dour staying test, she made ground on the outside and as the yards wore on she was gradually coming into her own, as Lightning Thunder became the final target. Grinding past her passing the furlong marker and into the clear, she entered the June 6 G1 Epsom Oaks picture with the field strung out again as they had been in the colts' race 24 hours earlier. John Magnier revealed that she was far from a forlorn hope beforehand. "Aidan fancied her and, in fact, I think he even asked Joseph to ride her but Joseph picked the

other one," he explained. "It wasn't that much of a surprise and her pedigree would indicate there could be more to come. She will probably get a mile and a half and I couldn't see any reason why she shouldn't run in the

Oaks if all goes well, but we'll have to listen to what they all say over the next few days." The trainer backed up that plan. "She coughed a bit after Leopardstown and had a bit of a break, but had been working nicely and with the ground looking like it would be nice at declaration time Joseph decided to ride Palace," he said. "When it turned, it went in her favor and she looks like she'll get further than a mile. The plan was to come here and then on to Epsom and she'll definitely get a mile and a quarter and maybe a mile and a half. I would imagine she won't ever want firm ground, as for them to handle ground like that they must like a little ease."

Always highly regarded by Sir Henry Cecil without showing the same dynamism as his full-sibling, Noble Mission had no Classic on the agenda in 2012 but still managed to best the subsequent G1 St Leger hero Encke (Kingmambo) in Goodwood's G3 Gordon S. over 12 furlongs. After a series of defeats, he was allowed a confidence boost in the Listed Tapster S. back over that

track and trip last May, but could not step up when fourth in Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. in June and Longchamp's G2 Prix Dollar in October either side of a third in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. over an extended 10-furlong trip at Haydock in August. After another eclipse on his seasonal bow in the G3 John Porter S. over a mile

and a half at Newbury Apr. 12, he was asked a different question by James Doyle in the 10-furlong G3 Gordon Richards S. at a rain-soaked Sandown Apr. 25. cont. p5

Sent straight to the lead there, the hooded bay ground down the much-lauded Telescope (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to win by nine lengths, and while it was down to 2 1/4 lengths when they met again in the G3 Huxley S. at Chester May 8, there was a further eight lengths back to last year's winner Danadana (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), which marked it as a performance out of the top drawer. Always in complete control under James Doyle here, he upped the ante at the head of affairs on the home turn with Joseph O'Brien already sending out distress signals on Magician in his wake. Left alone to idle and gawk at the open expanse of the Kildare venue, he let his sizeable advantage be dwindled by Ballydoyle's representative and the game mare Euphrasia. Teddy Grimthorpe commented, "We fell upon the plan to go from the front at Sandown because of needs, but it worked again at Chester so we thought we must try it again here. We need to sit down and have some good thoughts about him now, but he's had four quite tough races so we have to give him a little bit of a breather but that's up to Jane." For Lady Cecil, the result was predictably emotional following the previous win for the stable supplied by Shiva (Jpn) (Hector Protector) when it was first promoted to its current

status in 1999. "It's great for all the staff at Warren Place and we've achieved our aim to win a Group 1 and raise the flag for Henry. I've almost 30 horses for Prince Khalid and without them you can't do it. We hadn't thought past this, but he's in

the [July 5] G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown." Aidan O'Brien was not disappointed by the effort of Magician afterwards and suggested he would have preferred not to put him through the slog in the testing ground. "The reason we ran is the race got a yellow card from the Pattern Committee last year and was in trouble of losing its Group 1 status," he said. "A Group 1 for older horses is seriously important for us in Ireland and so he had to run. The ground meant he was going to be far from his best and I told Joseph to look after him with one eye on Royal Ascot and fast ground for the [June 18] G1 Prince of Wales's S. It served a purpose in that respect and I don't think it bottomed him, so we'll look forward to him next time. He's a beautiful mover who doesn't rise his feet at all and Joseph said after a halffurlong he was beaten. It was pure guts and determination that kept him going, so we're delighted and there are plenty of other days."

Oaks d'Italia cont.

Final Score took an unbeaten record into yesterday's G2 Oak d'Italia, and she emerged with that record firmly intact in her first black-type attempt. Racing prominently while wide through the early stages, the chestnut produced a kick in midstretch, hit the lead and won comfortably despite running slightly green. A sixlength debut winner in Rome in November, Final Score was not seen again until Apr. 20, but she showed no signs of rust, running away with an allowance over this strip. Final Score wrapped up a group double on the card for her trainer, Stefano Botti. Holy Moon is the only mare in history to produce three winners of this event, while owner Scuderia Effevi is the first owner since 1969 to have his silks on the Italian Derby and Oaks winners in the same year.

Introduced at the French provincial track of Amiens at the end of October, Ajaxana flaunted her obvious talent with a 10-length success in a Course G conditions event over an extended mile before debuting in Cologne's G3 Schwarzgold-Rennen last time Apr. 21. Splitting Meerjungfrau (Ger) (Manduro {Ger}) and the subsequent G3 Chartwell S. winner Emerald Star (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}) in that prize, the bay took advantage of the absence of that winner to make all here. Quickly sent to the inside by Anthony Crastus from the outset, she was able to negotiate the sharp first turn with aplomb, running freely before cruising uphill into the final bend. Tackled by Indian Rainbow passing the quarter pole, she showed tenacity to ward off that threat in the final meters and assert for Classic glory. "Following her facile victory at Amiens as a 2-year-old, we planned for the Guineas all the time and came here with great confidence," trainer Waldemar Hickst explained. "She also holds an entry for the [Aug. 3] G1 Preis der Diana here at Dusseldorf and we will see whether or not she will have a start in between."

Priore Philip established himself as Italy's best juvenile last term, culminating in a four-race winning streak with a victory in the G1 Gran Criterium, and the chestnut appears to have retained his form as a sophomore. He picked up where he left off with a victory in his seasonal debut in an allowance here Mar. 16, but had the streak snapped last out in the G2 Italian 2000 Guineas Apr. 27. Allowed the opportunity to run in yesterday's G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp due to his current state of rude health, Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) made easy work of his task by leading all the way under Christophe Soumillon to bag a fifth top-level success. Sent off the 3-5 favorite, the 8-year-old was never in any danger and only needed to be kept up to his work to score by 1 1/2 lengths from Anodin (Ire) in what amounted to a picnic in the Bois de Boulognes. "I wake up every morning and go to his stable not to see if he is okay, but to see if he is really there and it is not just a dream," trainer Corine Barande Barbe commented. "He is quite exceptional and I don't know if there has ever been one like him. He gives us so much fun and pleasure and this was only really a workout for him."

By the time Cirrus des Aigles confronted So You Think (NZ) in the inaugural running of the G1 Qipco Champion S. at Ascot in October 2011, he had already garnered seven pattern-race successes but his eclipse of that dual-hemisphere giant pitched him into new territory. Proving it was no flash in the pan, he traveled to Meydan the following March to best St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic before returning to France to enjoy what only amounted to a homecoming parade in the G1 Prix

Ganay. Following that emphatic eight-length success of the subsequent Group 1 winner Giofra (GB) (Dansili {GB}), his momentum was halted as he was beaten by the filly that Andre Fabre regards as the best he trained in Golden Lilac (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in

this race. After making the Juddmonte colossus race a bit, he was absent for eight months and only truly regained some of his old form with another win in the Prix Dollar prior to another second in the Champion and a third placing in the G1 Hong Kong Cup. Even a second placing to Gentildonna (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic did not completely fire the imagination, but the veteran then managed the implausible by upstaging Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}) in the Apr. 27 G1 Prix Ganay and after this relatively easy follow-up it is hard to say that he will not add something special to his laurels this term. cont. p9

"She was well in hand and relaxed up to the straight, which was why we were able to win. I heard Harp Star catching up and just desperately drove her to the line. She is a well-settled filly, which is an important factor for a winner."

A second-out winner over this strip in November, Nuovo Record took a Chukyo allowance Dec. 8 before being shelved for three months. She finished second to Harp Star in the Mar. 8 G3 Tulip Sho in her seasonal debut, and again found that rival too tough when checking in third in the G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) Apr. 13.

Nuovo Record becomes the second Group 1 winner for her sire, Heart's Cry. The first was G1 Tenno Sho Autumn and G1 Dubai Duty Free victor Just A Way (Jpn), currently the world's highest rated horse on the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings.

The former bested Up With the Birds (Stormy Atlantic) in Keeneland's GIII Transylvania S. some 13 1/2 months ago, but was third in his next four tries, capped by a local run behind Up with the Birds in the Oct. 5 GI Jamaica H. His sophomore season concluded with a sixth-place run in the GI Hollywood Derby Dec. 1, but the Todd Pletcher trainee returned sharp with a decisive May 1 optional claiming score at Churchill May 1 going this distance. Jack Milton figures to get plenty of pace to close into, with Peace and Justice and main source of heat up front. The John Shireffs trainee looked good running away from his competition first up here last June, but the mentally immature speedster was eighth in his next two tries. He resurfaced to set impossible splits and keep going at Santa Anita Jan. 5, and garnered the **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** seal of approval before adding another Arcadia allowance Feb. 14. The dark bay could not properly ration his speed in his stakes debut in Santa Anita's Apr. 6 Thunder Road S., settling for fifth, but there's little doubt where he'll be early here under new rider and recently named Hall of Famer Alex Solis. Live Oak Plantation's **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper) figures to take some beating as he drops out of Grade I company for just the second time in his last seven tries. A winner of the GIII Knickerbocker S, here in October last time he dropped in class, the grey nearly upended Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 2. He was a close fourth as the favorite in a strong running of Santa Anita's GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile Mar. 8, and endured a less-than-ideal trip when filling the same spot behind Wise Dan in Keeneland's GI Maker's 46 Mile Apr. 11. cont. p12

The reduction sale of Teeley Assets, one of Australia's most influential breeders and the curators of the line of influential broodmare Shantha's Choice (Aus), drove substantial increases across the board during the opening session of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale yesterday. With 62 more horses offered than this session 12 months ago, the gross nearly doubled at A\$8,276,500. The average climbed 26% to A\$43,561, while the buyback rate remained steady at 17%.

The Teelev Reduction was responsible for three highest priced lots-and four of the top five-including the session-topping Lot 222, which brought a final bid of A\$600,000 from Stonestreet Stables LLC and Coolmore Stud. By Coolmore's leading sire Fastnet Rock (Aus), the October foal is out of Your Life Style (Aus) (Hussonet {Aus}), herself a daughter of Monsoon Wedding (Aus) (Danehill), the dam of two stakes winners and a daughter of Shantha's Choice. Monsoon Wedding is therefore a full-sister to champion racehorse and sire Redoute's Choice (Aus) and Platinum Scissors (Aus), and a half to promising young sire Manhattan Rain (Aus) and Sliding Cube (Aus), the dam of **3 "TDN** Rising Star" Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). The bidding on the bay youngster opened at A\$300,000, and in the end it was John Moynihan, representing Stonestreet, and Coolmore's Tom Magnier who emerged victorious.

The G1 Golden Slipper-winning and producing sire Stratum (Aus) enjoyed a profitable run when a pair of fillies from the Teeley Reduction fetched A\$425,000 and A\$400,000 just moments apart. The fillies are closely related, like the session topper being out of daughters of Monsoon Wedding. Lot 213, the first through the ring, realized A\$425,000 from Arrowfield Stud. The September-foaled miss is the second foal out of the Group 3-winning Precious Lorraine (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). Lot 215, sold to New Zealand's Jamieson Park for A\$400,000, is the first foal out of the winning Quench the Thirst (Encosta de Lago).

Teeley Assets, owned by Sri Lankan businessman Muzaffar Yaseen, has made its own advertising, especially over the past season, with 12 stakes victories by the nursery's graduates. The undisputed highlight this year has been Lankan Rupee, the winner of three Group 1s and the world's current highest-rated sprinter.

"The obvious story of the day was the success of the reduction of weanlings from Teeley Assets," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said. "Their weanlings sold extremely well with the top priced lot at \$600,000 selling to

Stonestreet Stables from the U.S. and Coolmore, which is exciting news for the Australian industry. It's been an honor to have conducted this sale and a pleasure to run it. Every horse was for genuine sale as is evidenced in the results."

Crashing the Teeley party in fourth on the results sheet as Lot 2, which got the sale off to a strong start when fetching A\$260,000 from agent James Harron on behalf of Dr Edmund and Belinda Bateman. One would not have blamed the Batemans for extending for this first crop son of Group 1-winning sprinter Foxwedge, whom they campaigned. cont. p15



Consigned by Eliza Park International, the August foal is out of Call Me Paris (Aus) (Hotel Grand {Aus}), a winning half-sister to a pair of stakes winners.

"He's a cracking colt," said Harron. "Very physical, great maturity. He had a great attitude through the sale and he looks like a nice running type of horse."

Dr Bateman added of the progeny of Foxwedge: "They're great types. Obviously we have some great types at home. We're really pleased at this stage it's going the way it is. They're really impressive foals. It's really encouraging."

Foxwedge stands at Newgate Farm for a fee of A\$27,500, and shuttles to Whitsbury Manor Stud in Britain.

It would hardly be a horse sale in Australia without Redoute's Choice (Aus) getting his name amongst the top prices, and that happened when Gerry Harvey's Baramul Stud signed for Lot 206, a filly by that champion sire, for A\$230,000. Another from the Teeley reduction, the bay is the second foal from the Group 2-winning and Group 1-placed Fritz's Princess (Aus) (More Than Ready).

The session enjoyed a diverse buying bench, with buyers from the UK, New Zealand and South Africa joining a diverse group of buyers from across Australia, as well as Moynihan's big splash from the U.S. The British-based Blandford Bloodstock went to A\$220,000 for Lot 249, a Coolmore-consigned colt by Fastnet Rock out of a daughter of Group 1 winner Credit Account (Aus) (Imposing {Aus}). "We have the most diverse buying bench we've seen at a National Weanling Sale with strong international participation," said Vin Cox. Tonalist Breezes at Belmont

Robert Evan's GI Belmont S. hopeful **Tonalist** (Tapit) registered his penultimate breeze for his Classic test Sunday morning. The Christophe Clement trainee covered five panels in 1:01.63 (video) with exercise rider Lee Vickers in the irons. "He looked good, was willing, and came back in good order," Clement commented. "It was not the most aggressive work, but it was what we wanted. He galloped out in :13 and 3/5 this morning, so it was a strong gallop out. The plan is to bring him back this coming Saturday or Sunday and work him in company with Life In Shambles. It will probably be a touch more aggressive. I just hope we can keep him sound and life is good."

Wicked Strong Works a Mile

GI Twinspires.com Wood Memorial S. winner and GI Belmont S. probable **Wicked Strong** (Hard Spun) worked a mile in 1:39.59 (video) over the Belmont training track Sunday morning. The Centennial Farms colorbearer galloped out 1 1/8 miles in 1:55.22 with regular rider Kelvin Pahal aboard. "I thought it was good. A nice, good stamina work," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens. The trainer also explained that the colt will likely breeze again next weekend and have a blow out the week before the Belmont S.

"It's what got him here, so we figured we wouldn't change the format," Jerkens said of the training regiment. "He worked last week; he worked faster than I wanted. He was a little too edgy [last week], so we decided we'd keep him [on the training track] and work him two turns just to simmer him down a little bit. He worked [on the training track last week], but he was really on the muscle. If you're on the muscle [on the training track] you'll be doubly on the muscle [on the main track]. He went nice and easy the first part and finished up nicely [today], I thought."

Samraat Tunes Up for Belmont

Samraat (Noble Causeway) breezed a mile in 1:41.28 (video) Sunday in preparation for a start in the third leg of the Triple Crown. "It was terrific, exactly what we wanted," said trainer Rick Violette. "He made a long sustained run around the turn and straight through the wire. He ran his last three-eighths in 36 flat and cooled out like he was King Kong."

Violette noted that the work would be the last serious breeze for the New York-bred multiple graded stakes winner. "Saturday would be the right day, or Sunday, we'll watch the weather next week," he explained. "It will just be an exercise to blow off a little steam and let him feel really good."



Social Inclusion Arrives at Big Sandy

GI Preakness S. third-place finisher **Social Inclusion** (Pioneerof the Nile) arrived at Belmont Park Sunday. Owner Ronald Sanchez said that the colt will be aiming for either the GI Belmont S. or the GII Woody Stephens on the Belmont undercard. Although the connections had originally though about the GI Metropolitan H. a possibility, Sanchez said that option is no longer in consideration. "[Trainer Manuel Azpurua] wants breeze the horse before we make a decision [on which race to enter]," said Sanchez.

KINGMAN FINE AFTER GUINEAS ROMP

Khalid Abdullah's **Kingman (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) emerged from his five-length romp in Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas in good form, and is firmly on course for his next target, the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 17.

"He's fine this morning, and the win gave us a lot of pleasure," Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager for Khalid Abdullah, told *PA Sport*.

Kingman is expected to meet Night of Thunder (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}), the colt who handed him his lone defeat when second in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3, in the St. James's Palace. The pair are now on even terms, as Kingman defeated the Richard Hannon

trainee in the G3 Greenham S. Apr. 12.

"Hopefully it will revert to the Greenham form [at Ascot]," Grimthorpe added.

Grimthorpe also noted that there are no firm plans yet for Khalid Abdullah's **Joyeuse (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), a **3 "TDN Rising Star" 3** and half-sister to Frankel (GB), who took a listed contest at Haydock Saturday.

"It was nice to see her back on form," he said. "There aren't many options for sprinting fillies and we'll be studying the programme book."



EBANORAN MUST IMPROVE: OXX

The Aga Khan's homebred **Ebanoran (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), first past the post but demoted to second in Leopardstown's G3 Derby Trial S. May 11, is training smoothly in his preparations for the G1 Investec Derby June 7, although trainer John Oxx noted his charge must improve to find the winner's circle in Europe's most famous Classic.

"He came out of the last race well, we still have two weeks to go but at this stage, we're happy," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "There was nothing between him and [promoted winner] Fascinating Rock at Leopardstown and, at this time of year, it's all about how horses improve. Both of them have six pounds to find with [ante post favorite] Australia on official ratings."

Oxx added that he expects Ebanoran to handle the Epsom course.

"I don't think the track should be a problem for our horse and hopefully the atmosphere shouldn't bother him. He was very calm at Leopardstown, but you never really know with Epsom until you get there."

ZOUSTAR SHUTTLE CAREER ON HOLD

Australia's dual Group 1-winning sprinter Zoustar (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}), retired after injuring himself while preparing for the G1 Diamond Jubilee at Royal Ascot, will not shuttle to the Northern Hemisphere for 2015, David Redvers told ANZ Bloodstock News. Sheikh Fahad bought into the 3-year-old colt after he won last year's G1 Coolmore Stud S., and his racing manager said: "I'm sure he would have blitzed the Diamond Jubilee field and heralded a dual-hemisphere stallion career, but now I expect it would be difficult to establish him here."

Zoustar will begin his stud career at Widden Stud for a fee of A\$44,000.

"We will just send him back down to Australia so he can establish himself at Widden Stud first and see what happens in the future," Redvers told the trade daily.






