KEENELAND, DEL MAR TABBED NEW BC HOSTS

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited made it official Tuesday morning, announcing that iconic Keeneland Race Course in Lexington, Kentucky, will play host to the 2015 World Championships. Additionally, the Breeders' Cup confirmed that the 2016 championships will be staged again at Santa Anita Park in Arcadia, California, and that the 2017 event will remain in the Golden State and be held for the first time at Del Mar Racetrack.

“As part of our strategic three-year host site plan, we are very pleased to announce Keeneland as the host venue for the 2015 Breeders' Cup World Championships,” said Breeders' Cup Chairman Bill Farish. “Throughout its storied history, Keeneland has developed

an extraordinary reputation for delivering a first-class racing and hospitality product. We are excited to bring the Breeders' Cup home to Lexington and are energized by the support from the local community and the breeders of Central Kentucky who have been such a vital part of our program since its inception.”

The 2015 renewal will mark the first time that Keeneland will host the Breeders' Cup and will represent the first new venue since 2007, when Monmouth Park became a first-time host. Earlier this year, officials at Keeneland announced that the Polytrack, which was in place at the track since 2006, would be removed in favor of a 'state-of-the-art' conventional dirt surface, a move many saw as a necessary first step towards attracting the Breeders' Cup to Central Kentucky.

“The Breeders' Cup at Keeneland is a homecoming for many of these great champions who were foaled and raised at Central Kentucky farms, and often sold at Keeneland,” said Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason, who noted that 77 Breeders' Cup winners had gone through the Keeneland sales ring. “The Keeneland team feels that sense of connection and history with the Breeders' Cup, and we look forward to offering fans an extraordinary racing and entertainment experience.”

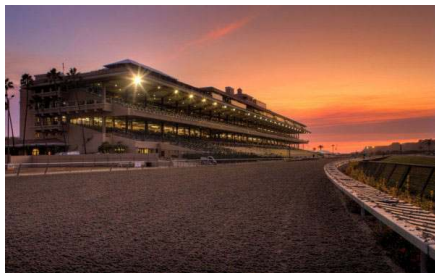
Breeders' Cup Hosts cont. from p1

The 2015 Breeders' Cup will be held Oct. 30 and 31. Del Mar will host its first-ever Breeders' Cup Nov. 3 and 4, 2017. That track has also announced its intention to remove its synthetic main track and is also in the process of installing a new turf course which is being widened to accommodate additional runners.

For Del Mar President and General Manager Joe Harper, bringing a Breeders' Cup to Del Mar is the culmination of a decades-long dream.

"I can't tell you how excited we are," he said. "This is a dream come true for us. I remember back in the 80's when [Breeders' Cup founder] John Gaines actually came out to Del Mar

for a meeting to discuss his idea with a number of owners and breeders who were here at the time. I think I took some notes, because [since then] I kept thinking, 'How can we get a Breeders' Cup here?'

There's been a lot of money spent on this facility--not just the grandstand, but the racetracks and now we've got this opportunity and we're really looking forward to it--especially to be in the company of two such great tracks as Keeneland and Santa Anita. We're proud to be here with them."

Santa Anita, which staged the 2013 Breeders' Cup and will do so again this coming Oct. 31 and Nov. 1, and will host the championships for a record ninth time in 2016.

"We have created a lot of new renovations and there will be a few more new renovations before we host this year," noted Santa Anita President Tom Ludt. "We continue to be a proud partner. We feel like we've shown that we know how to handle this event very well--it goes well and the feedback's great. It's a pleasure to be in a great place where the media and the world likes to come and be entertained."

During an NTRA teleconference yesterday, Craig Fravel, current Breeders' Cup President and CEO and a former Del Mar executive, offered: "Whenever there's an industry need or industry project [Santa Anita Park owner] The Stronach Group, Keeneland and Del Mar are the first to raise their hands. So it's a distinct pleasure for us to be working with these groups. It's very exciting to have two new venues. I can tell you that management and staff are very excited at the challenge of trying something new and think that that infectious enthusiasm will translate no only our horsemen, but fans as well and really show the Breeders' Cup in the best possible way at each venue."

When asked, Fravel downplayed the notion that the move by Keeneland to return to a conventional dirt surface for the fall of 2014 and by Del Mar to switch back to dirt for its 2015 meet influenced the Breeders' Cup's host site decision. **cont. p4**

“The Breeders’ Cup has never taken a position either favoring or disfavoring a particular surface,” he said. “What we’ve taken positions on is favoring safety and

surfaces and adaptations of the surfaces that we think will put on the best racing product. The decisions made by both Del Mar and Keeneland were made independent of the Breeders’ Cup. Obviously, we wanted to know what the timing was and what their plans were and how they were addressing safety concerns and design, but beyond that, our role was informational

only and not part of the decision-making process.”

Temporary seating at Keeneland is expected to accommodate more than 7,000 additional attendees, and will include 250 temporary loge boxes that will hold six people each. There will be a total of 20,813 reserved seats, including seating in the nearby sales pavilion and entertainment center. Keeneland has not yet set a limit on the number of general admission tickets that can be sold for the Breeders’ Cup. Click [here](#) for the Keeneland Breeders’ Cup seating diagram.

“We’ve got a talented racetrack team and a talented team of people who have spent their careers and take such pride in enhancing the patron experience,” said Thomason. “So, the thing that Keeneland is most excited about is taking those values we have in a community that feels so strongly about the horse with fans who understand the industry and the horse and appreciate it unlike any other. To be able to merge those common goals that we both have for enhancing live racing and the experience of our patrons to grow the Breeders’ Cup as a brand, to grow the Thoroughbred industry as a sport, and coming into a community that we know is going to embrace the opportunity with as much passion as we’ve got. So we are really looking forward with great anticipation to 2015.”

Several Breeders’ Cup races will be run at different distances at Keeneland than they have before. The GI Breeders’ Cup Dirt Mile will be contested over Keeneland’s seven-furlong and 184 ft. Beard Course, while the GI Breeders’ Cup F/M Turf--previously held at either 1 1/4 miles or 1 3/8 miles depending on the venue--will be run over 1 3/16 miles in 2015. The GI Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint, having been run at 6 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita and five furlongs at Churchill Downs, will take place over 5 1/2 panels in Lexington.

While the Breeders’ Cup has recently positioned its race cards so that the featured GI Breeders’ Cup Classic takes place in prime time, Keeneland does not have lights to accommodate evening or night racing.

“Our planning for Keeneland contemplates a day-time event,” said Fravel. “We think that it will be very well-suited to the East Coast and that’s where we’re headed in 2015.”

When reached for comment regarding other special events being planned around the 2015 Breeders’ Cup, Thomason said that Keeneland was “already working with farms and downtown establishments on some exciting activities as well as some regional opportunities,” but that nothing had been finalized.

Keeneland typically hosts its November Breeding Stock Sale during the week after the Breeders’ Cup directly after Fasig-Tipton’s November Sale. While neither company has announced dates for their 2015 sales, there is no expectation of a significant date change.

Del Mar will also add additional seating, but exact plans have not yet been announced.

“We have a half-a-million square feet of grandstand right now, so we feel pretty comfortable with what we have,” offered Joe Harper. “We’re obviously going to augment our high-end seating. Our plan is to put in more luxury suites and we have considerable room at the west end for temporary seating.”

Qatari Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad al-Thani's Al Shaqab Racing kicked the week off with a double in Tuesday's first two races, the G1 Queen Anne S. winner **Toronado** (High Chaparral), followed by the G2 Coventry S. winner **The Wow Signal**, the first leg of an unlikely double for his sire, Starspangledbanner (Choisir {Aus}) (completed by **Anthem Alexander** in Wednesday's G2 Queen Mary S.). Al Shaqab got their third winner of the week in Thursday's G2 Norfolk S. with **Baitha Alga**, another by a first-crop sire, Fast Company (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). In fact, four of the six races for 2-year-olds at Royal Ascot were won by the progeny of first-crop sires: two by Starspangledbanner; one by Fast Company, who gave New Approach a scare in the 2007 G1 Dewhurst S. but unfortunately never ran again); and **Hootenanny**, who was the first black-type winner by Quality Road. Trained by America's Royal Ascot 2-year-old specialist Wesley Ward, Hootenanny was one of three winners during the week for the Coolmore triumvirate, which tied Al Shaqab at the top of the owners' table by races won. Coolmore's other two winners--both by Montjeu--came in consecutive races on Thursday: the 3-year-old filly **Bracelet** in the 12-furlong G2 Ribblesdale S.; and the 4-year-old **Leading Light**, who prevailed in what was probably the race of the week, the 2 1/2-mile G1 Ascot Gold Cup, in which Leading Light prevailed in a three-horse photo over The Queen's **Estimate** (Monsun {Ger}), the defending champion, and the 7-year-old mare **Missunited** (Golan {Ire}). Godolphin plus Rabbah interests also won three races; Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell operation scored twice, as did Mrs. Sabena Power, who won both Group 1 sprints, with **Sole Power** (Kyllachy {GB}) and **Slade Power** (Dutch Art {GB}).

Irish trainer Eddie Lynam trains both the Power horses, so, having also won the G2 Queen Mary on Wednesday with Anthem Alexander, he had a dream week as the leading Irish trainer by number of winners, with three (a certain A. P. O'Brien had two). The venerable Sir Michael Stoute and 2012 leading British trainer John Gosden had four winners each, although Stoute edged the training title with three seconds to Gosden's one. Both uncorked impressive winners who could now be heading to the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., namely the Stoute-trained 4-year-old **Telescope** (Galileo {Ire}), owned by a Highclere syndicate, who won the

G2 Hardwicke S. by seven lengths; while among Gosden's winners was Lady Bamford's **Eagle Top** (Pivotal {GB}), a 3 3/4-length winner of Friday's G2 King Edward VII S., for 3-year-olds, in only his third lifetime start. **cont. p6**

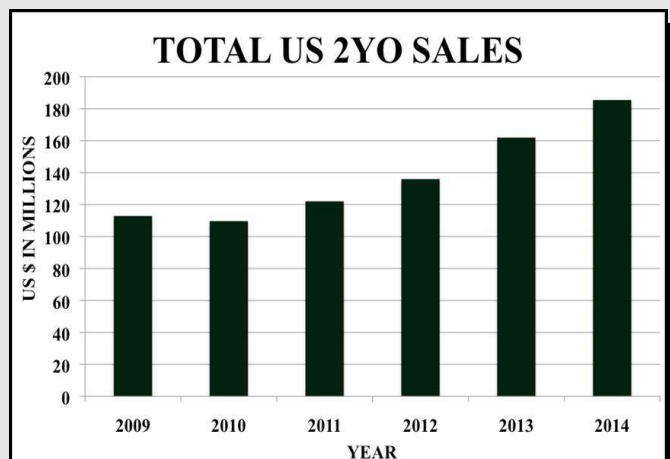

"Expanding to four days from two, OBS June saw a massive 68% gain in the number of horses sold (426 to 716) and a 57% increase in gross (\$14.4m to \$22.7m) from 2013, so a 6% drop in average (\$33,859 to \$31,717) is inconsequential. In the US 2-year-old sales this year, OBS sold 71% of the horses (1,681 of the 2,365 sold - see bottom table) for 64% of the season's gross (\$118,559,000 of \$185m), and their three sales averaged \$70,529. That is serious market dominance".

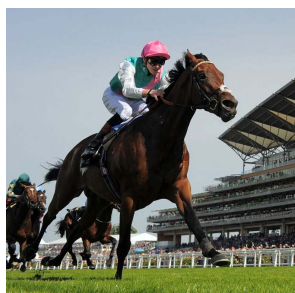

Six sires had two winners each: Cheveley Park's Dutch Art, as noted yesterday by Andrew Caulfield, had a consecutive-race double on Saturday with G1 winner Slade Power and handicap winner **Baccarat**. Coolmore's deceased Montjeu also had a consecutive-race double, on Thursday, as noted above. Starspangledbanner, a past and probably now future Coolmore stallion, also as noted had two 2-year-old Group 2 winners, The Wow Signal and Anthem Alexander. High Chaparral, another Coolmore sire, had G1 Queen Anne S. winner Toronado as well as Listed Wolferton H. winner **Contributor**. Juddmonte's Dansili had a double on Wednesday: the impressive G1 Prince of Wales's S. winner **The Fugue**, winning her fourth Group 1 and her second over colts, as well as the Listed Sandringham H. winner **Muteela**. Darley's Authorized had two 3-year-old long-distance winners, namely Listed Queen's Vase winner **Hartnell** over two miles, as well as the 12-furlong King George V. Handicap winner **Elite Army**.

Prince Khalid Abdullah's 3-year-old colt **Kingman** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), trained by John Gosden, ran the highest speed figure of the week, according to Racing

Post Ratings, with his RPR 128 in Wednesday's G1 St James's Palace S. Gosden also trains The Fugue, who ran an RPR 127 in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. the same day, for Lord Andrew Lloyd-Webber; Coolmore's Magician (Galileo), winner of the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Breeders' Cup Turf last year, came back to his best with RPR 126 when runner-up in the

Prince of Wales's. Telescope also ran 126 in his G2 Hardwicke S. romp Saturday.

Speaking of festivals, one of the worst-kept secrets in racing is finally out with the official confirmation of the Breeders' Cup three-year host site plan: Keeneland 2015, back to Santa Anita 2016, Del Mar 2017. There are plenty of angles about this decision which could be chewed over, but as a member of the Breeders' Cup Board which made the decision for the most part, I will have to leave those to other commentators. But there are three points which can be made about Keeneland's ultimately successful bid which hardly come under the heading of state secrets: (1) Kentucky stallion and foal nominators, which are the largest single group of contributors to Breeders' Cup nomination revenues, overwhelmingly wanted the Breeders' Cup to come back to Kentucky; (2) an excellent component of Keeneland's bid was to point to the success of the World Equestrian Games, held in Lexington in 2010, as evidence that the local community could successfully host an event of this magnitude; and (3) they're not going to try and fit 50,000 people in the building. There is one point on policy I would like to make, though. It's not just me: Breeders' Cup Chairman Bill Farish and Keeneland President Bill Thomson were also at Royal Ascot last week (though I'm speaking only for myself).

The principle of these top racing festivals is very convincingly that one day is not enough. Ascot is a week; when the Breeders' Cup has been at Santa Anita, people try to go into Los Angeles for the week; and, of course, we see it over and over again in other sports. Royal Ascot proves again that not all races in a successful racing festival have to be Group 1's. I believe the view that the Breeders' Cup should go back to one day should be consigned to history. Let's take it off the table.

HOT SIRES: WinStar's **Pioneerof the Nile** (Empire Maker) extended his lead among North American second-crop sires last weekend. The filly Jojo Warrior won the GII Summertime Oaks (the old Hollywood Oaks) to become Pioneerof the Nile's second Grade II winner, after Cairo Prince; and the colt Conquest Top Gun scored his second straight valuable synthetic-track win at Woodbine in Sunday's Victoria Park S. And what about the leading North American Freshman Sire, Spendthrift's **Warrior's Reward** (Medaglia d'Oro)? Four starters, four winners--all on debut, including Bad Read Sanchez, a 10-length debut winner at Santa Anita for Paul Reddam. Two of the four, both fillies--**"TDN Rising Star"** **Unbridled Reward** and **Liatris**--have already run second in stakes. This horse is off to an exceptionally promising start

Sunday, Hanshin, Japan

TAKAMATSUNOMIYA KINEN-G1, ¥274,960,000 (US\$2,692,424), 3yo/up, 2200mT

Sunday's G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen, a "Win and You're In" event for the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf, is the mid-season equivalent of the G1 Arima Kinen, in that the majority of the field is selected by the public. A strong group of middle-distance horses looks headed toward the race, led by **Gold Ship (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}), who looks to become the first horse in the 55-year history of the race to take back-to-back runnings.

The leading votegetter in the field with some 51,000, the 5-year-old has 10 wins from his 18 career appearances, including a popular victory in this track's G2 Hanshin Daishoten going 3000 meters (15 furlongs) Mar. 23. Very little went right in his most recent trip to the post in the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) May 4. As the field approached the gates, one of the assistant starters struck Gold Ship, causing the horse to come unglued. "This horse has a lot of pride and when he got hit going in to the gate, well, he got mad and reared up repeatedly. It really was a shame," trainer Naosuke Sugai explained. Gold Ship missed the break and finished a non-threatening seventh as the 3-1 second favorite.

In order to defend his title, Gold Ship will have to beat some accomplished racemares. **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), who crossed the ¥1-billion mark in career earnings with her victory over Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 29, looms the stiffest competition. The Sunday Racing colorbearer was runner-up in the 2013 Sheema Classic and came into this race with the highest expectations, but couldn't quite seal the deal and finished third. But trainer Sei Ishizaka enters this with the highest of confidence. "Everything looks in order and there's nothing I'm concerned about her physically," he commented. "If the track is fast, I think she'll put in a good run."

Meisho Mambo (Jpn) (Suzuka Mambo {Jpn}) won the G1 Shuka Sho (Japanese Oaks) last October ahead of a success in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup over Sunday's 2200-meter trip. The bay exits a half-length defeat at the hands of **Verxina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the G1 Victoria Mile at Tokyo May 18. "She is running more relaxed and has shown a good late kick," commented trainer Yuji Iida. "She looks in better shape and I'm looking forward to seeing just how well she can do up against top-class male horses."
