Still underrated despite his exploits in 2014, **Kool Kompany (Ire)** (Jeremy) enters today's G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. with another point to prove as he continues

his relentless progress up the ranks. Already successful in the Listed Rochestown S. at Naas June 2, G2 Railway S. over this track and trip June 28 and Maisons-Laffitte's G2 Prix Robert Papin July 20, Middleham Park Racing's latest bargain buy has far fewer question marks than the majority of his rivals. His last two starts on fast ground here in the Railway and very soft in

France were won in different fashion, with an all-theway aggressive performance in the former complemented by a professional effort taken on for the lead next time. Supplemented earlier in the week, the owning syndicate's Racing Manager Tim Palin is happy with that decision as the crunch-time nears. "The Robert Papin run shows that we don't have to lead, he just doesn't want settling out the back like we did at Ascot [when 12th in the June 17 G2 Coventry S.]," Palin told PA Sport. "He can handle any type of ground but being by Jeremy, we know he will handle cut as well as quicker ground. It's going to be fascinating to watch on Sunday, and after really bringing together the English, Irish and French form last time, we're kind of doing that again with the colts and fillies coming together. We will see if he's really a Group One horse on Sunday, and after that we will have to work out what to do." Of the strong trio of fillies in this line-up, Noel O'Callaghan's Anthem Alexander (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) already enjoys lofty status based on her authoritative success in the G2 Queen Mary S. over five furlongs at Royal Ascot June 18. "The filly has trained well, but there would have to be a question mark about her with the weather forecast," trainer Eddie Lynam told PA Sport. "We've had some heavy rain in Ireland this morning and if the word 'soft' was in the going, I don't think she would run. We'll do what's right for the filly and I'll be discussing it with the owner. We'd be happy enough with the good-toyielding it was at declaration time, but we will see with the weather. We're stepping her up to six furlongs and I would feel she might not get the trip and she wouldn't enjoy the ground if it were soft. She's as good as we can get her and if she can get some nice ground, I think she will run well."

ANGELA RENEE LOOKS 'TO HONOR' FAMILY

Trainer Todd Pletcher is a three-time winner of the GII Adirondack S., and in Siena Farms' homebred Angela Renee (Bernardini), he will have an outstanding opportunity to add to that mark. A full-sister to MGISW To Honor and Serve, the bay was only the 3-1 third choice in her June 27 debut down at Belmont Park, but turned in a thoroughly professional effort, coming from just off the speed for a 2 1/2-length defeat of Sunday Sonnet (Any Given Saturday), with favored High Dolla Woman (Super Saver) another six lengths back in fifth. The form of the event has been franked by the two latter runners, each of whom returned to graduate over a muddy Saratoga strip July 27. "She has a pedigree that suggests that she wants to run further, yet she was able to win going short," Pletcher stated. "I think that speaks of her quality and class, and the added distance should only be to her benefit." Cont. p4





Seek Again, winner of last December's GI Hollywood Derby while making his first start in this country, overcame some traffic trouble in the stretch to post a dramatic win while lowering the course record here. The Juddmonte homebred nearly got up the pine to knock off Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs May 3, but the dual Horse of the Year called on his class to get home just in front. Faced with a similar scenario in the eighth and final furlong in this one, the handsome chestnut colt was blocked in

behind horses with nowhere to go, and that allowed Canadian raider Grand Arch to get the jump. But Joel Rosario managed to keep his cool and drove Seek Again through in the waning strides for a narrow decision. The final time of 1:33.25 broke the previous course record held by L'Oiseau d'Argent by 0.17 seconds.

Favored Silver Max (Badge of Silver) was forced into a suicidal speed duel with Sayaad (Street Sense) and was torched by the time the real running began. Seek Again, cutting back in distance off an alibi-free third behind Real Solution (Kitten's Joy) in the GI Manhattan H. June 7, was a three-time winner in Europe while under the care of John Gosden, including a handicap

win at York last October.

"They went along and set an honest pace, and you have to set an honest pace to set the track record," Hall of Famer Bill Mott said. "I thought he got away well, and going into the first turn, I was hoping Sayaad would eventually put a little pressure on Silver Max, which he did. When he left the half-mile pole, he started to turn it up, and he was looking for his best chance to win the race, and it amounted to a good fast pace for us. The only tense moment was when our horse was trying to find his room at the eighth pole."

As for choosing this spot over next Saturday's GI Arlington Million, Mott

said, "He can obviously run fast at a mile, but he did win a Grade I at a mile and a quarter, and he was third in the Manhattan. I wouldn't have passed up the Arlington Million if I didn't think he could [succeed at a mile1."

Moved up to second via DQ after tiring to third in her two-turn debut beneath the Twin Spires last September, the gray returned from the bench with an authoritative maiden win going six furlongs at Fair Grounds Jan. 9. Sidelined once again, Cassatt returned in style with another tourde-force after a tardy beginning in a Delaware off-theturfer July 16. Making her stakes debut in this return to two turns, Cassatt was a bit slow into stride, but zipped through from between rivals to head them off into the clubhouse turn. She took some pressure to her outside through the middle stages, but was still in front entering the final three furlongs. Aqua Regia, forwardly placed throughout, came through to try Cassatt on the rail nearing the stretch, but the Fox Hill filly punched back and found the wire first. Aqua Regia crossed the line a length ahead of Saintly Joan, but those placings were reversed after stewards ruled Agua Regia interfered with Saintly Joan at the three-eighths marker, ultimately costing her a position.

Cassatt gave trainer Larry Jones--with an assist to wife Cindy--a fourth win in the event. "We love running in that race," Jones said. "It's been very kind to us. I thought we would be on the lead, she was in her first race. That's kind of why we put her in sprinting, just to get her to run behind horses, but she's out there galloping when other horses are running and we don't want to take her out of her game."

Jones continued, "I'm just so glad to get her back to the races. I told everyone last year that she might be the best 2-year-old I ever trained. We're tickled with this. We might be a little too late getting her to the Breeders' Cup, but you never know. The [GI] Cotillion at Parx [Sept. 20] is a possibility and see if she can put herself into the Breeders' Cup picture, but we'll see how she comes out and let her tell us."

Cassatt is the first foal from the unraced Justenufftime, a half-sister to champion Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) and graded winners Lewis Michael (Rahy) and Justenuffhumor (Distorted Humor). The 7-year-old produced an Afleet Alex colt in 2012; a Tapit colt in 2013; and a Discreetly Mine filly in 2014.

GREGORIAN'S CHANCE

So often a nearly horse at the top level, Princess Haya of Jordan's **Gregorian (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) is presented with an ideal opportunity in today's G1 Prix

Maurice de Gheest at Deauville. At his best on his last two starts at Newmarket, when successful in the sevenfurlong G3 Criterion S. June 28 and third in the G1 July Cup over a panel shorter July 12, the 5-yearold has ideal trip and ground here as he bids to better four

previous placings at the highest level. Jockey William Buick summed up the general feeling as to the quality of this renewal. "There have been much stronger Group 1s than this," Buick commented. "Six and a half furlongs looks a very good trip for him and he's certainly got quicker as he's got older, as he showed when he was 1 1/2 lengths third to Slade Power in the July Cup over six. Before that, he beat one of Sunday's opponents, Garswood (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), over seven in the mud at Newmarket in a Group 3 in June." One who needs the ground to dry is Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Aljamaaheer (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) after he disappointed on rain-soaked ground when ninth in the July Cup. "Aljamaaheer was too free at Newmarket in the July Cup and if you put a line through that and look at his Golden Jubilee form, he would have a very strong chance," trainer Roger Varian said of the 4-year-old, who was third in the June 21 Royal Ascot sprint. "Ideally, we would have preferred faster ground but he goes there in good form." Freddie Head has already registered an astonishing seven editions in his relatively short training career, and relies on another Shadwell representative in Thawaany (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}). The chestnut showed she was on the upgrade when annexing the G3 Prix de Ris-Orangis over six furlongs here last time June 28, and her conditioner is happy with conditions. "She's a nice filly," Head told PA Sport. "She didn't run much at two, as she had some problems, but she is over them all now. Last time she won her Group Three nicely, so she has certainly earned her place in this." He added, "Soft ground won't be a problem for her, she handles it fine. She'll probably handle it a lot better than most of the others. Unfortunately, she hasn't got a good draw [in 15], but there's nothing we can do about that." Of the 3-year-olds, last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Vorda (Fr) (Orpen) is of interest going back sprinting, but she has significant ground to make up on the ultraconsistent Sommerabend (GB) (Shamardal) after finishing fourth behind that rival in Longchamp's G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot over seven furlongs last time July 5.

distance Mar. 16 and dropped a neck decision to that rival in the Apr. 13 GIII Santa Barbara H. going 10 panels. She cut back to the mile and an eighth for the GI Gamely S. May 26 and picked a good spot for her first North American victory, defeating Emollient (Empire Maker) right on the money. Cozze Up Lady (Cozzene), a Grade III winner on Polytrack, took an offturf renewal of the Mardi Gras S. while under the care of Bret Calhoun earlier this winter, but was only seventh in defense of her title in the GIII Chicago H. June 28. The bay made a favorable impression in her first start for this barn, overcoming a high draw to post a game half-length success in the restricted Osunitas S. July 19. She should be able to sit up on a moderate pace and is a major factor. Wishing Gate (Indian Charlie) won the GII San Clemente S. and was runnerup in the GII Del Mar Oaks at this meet last year before adding the GIII Autumn Miss S. at Santa Anita in October. Likely in need of the run when fourth in the one-mile GII Royal Heroine S. June 28, the Glen Hill homebred can do better at this slightly longer distance.

FOAL CROP OF 22K PROJECTED

Edited Press Release

The Jockey Club is projecting a 2015 North American registered Thoroughbred foal crop of 22,000. The projections for the 2013 and 2014 foal crops were 23,000 and 22,000, respectively. "The projection for the 2015 foal crop is based on reports of mares bred received to date, and we estimate that approximately 80% of those reports have been received," The Jockey Club Executive Vice President and Executive Director Matt Iuliano said. Additional foal crop information is available in The Jockey Club's Online Fact Book at jockeyclub.com/factbook.asp and in the online state fact books. The foal crop projection, traditionally announced in mid-August, is computed by using Reports of Mares Bred (RMBs) received to date for the 2014 breeding season. RMBs are to be filed by Aug. 1 of each breeding season.

Morton Fink's two-time reigning Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) took to the Saratoga main track Saturday morning in preparation for a possible start later in the meet. Working in tandem with a

stablemate, the two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero covered six furlongs in 1:13 1/5. "I thought he went really well," trainer Charlie LoPresti said. "We broke a horse off about six lengths ahead of him and he caught him, went to the wire with him and galloped out real good. I guess the time was good. He got a

really good blow out of it, so that told me I was probably a couple breezes short of the [GII] Fourstardave. Maybe we could have won it, but I think we did the right thing by giving him a little more time." LoPresti continued, "We worked him pretty hard today. He's had two five-eighths [of a mile breezes] and two halfs [since May 16 colic surgery]. I pressed on him today because he needed that kind of work."

"If he's going to start getting ready for some of these races I want to see how he comes out of this," LoPresti said. "He's not tired, I can tell you that." Wise Dan may return in either the grassy GII Bernard Baruch H. miles or the GI Woodward S. on the main track. Both races are Aug. 30. He was last seen successfully defending his GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. at Churchill Downs on GI Kentucky Derby day. "The only way I'm going to know [which spot to go in] is in a few weeks time when I see how he progresses," LoPresti concluded.

Pletcher Duo on Worktab...

Four-time Grade I winner Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) worked four furlongs in :49 3/5 Saturday morning in preparation of the GI Personal Ensign Invitational Aug. 22. The Ed Stanco homebred was upset when second at 1-5 in the GI Delaware H. July 12. She will race with blinkers on for the first time in the Personal Ensign. "She's very focused with them, so we'll plan on running her in them, but she doesn't need them every time she breezes," Pletcher said. "She worked very well. It seemed like she was in good form." Pletcher also worked GI CCA Oaks heroine Stopchargingmaria (Tale of the Cat) four furlongs in 47.52 seconds. The Mike Repole colorbearer is targetting the GI Alabama S. Aug. 16. "She worked great, very well," Pletcher said. "It seems like she's in super form at the moment. She's really just had a great summer and just seems like she's getting better all the time."

'Beast' Mode for King's Bishop...

Alex and JoAnn Lieblong's **The Big Beast** (Yes It's True), tabbed as a **3 "TDN Rising Star" 3** off a powerful first-level allowance win over older horses at

the Spa July 26, dazzled with a five-furlong bullet workout in :58.92 Saturday morning. Trained by Tony Dutrow, The Big Beast will start next in the GI King's Bishop Aug. 23. "That may have been the most impressive workout that I have ever seen in my whole life," Dutrow

said. "I really don't think I've ever seen a horse go so fast, so easily. And, we didn't get paid for that out there today, so I'm not trying to impress." Dutrow continued, "He's seven or eight months into his 3-year-old year now. You see what a big horse he is. He's such a big horse, so maybe he's just maturing and coming around and now's his time. It certainly looks like now's his time. He's figured it out and he looks like he's looking to build on it."



Fast Anna Settles in at Saratoga...

Unbeaten Fast Anna (Medaglia d'Oro), a son of champion Dreaming of Anna (Rahy), worked seven furlongs in 1:28 2/5 at Saratoga yesterday. The Frank Calabrese homebred, a 13-length allowance winner at Gulfstream July 6, will be tested for class in the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 23. "He had a good work," trainer Kathy Ritvo said. "It was his first work over the surface, so we just took it easy and had a nice, easy work. He was very professional. He just does his business; not too much bothers him at all. Now that he got that underneath him, he'll have one more work and be set for the race." Ritvo continued, "This horse just seems to get better all the time. We're going to take a big swing, but he's doing so good there's no reason not to run him. I don't think it's going to make a big difference, the traffic or the people or anything that happens. He's professional. He's smart. He couldn't be doing any better."

ZITO RETURNS TO ICE BOX EARLY AT FASIG

Trainer Nick Zito, who trained Ice Box (Pulpit), was forced to \$230,000 to secure a yearling from the first crop of the 2010 GI Florida Derby winner during Saturday's first session of the Fasig-Tipton New York Sale. The yearling was consigned by Chris Shelli's Fort Christopher's Thoroughbreds. Shelli purchased the unraced Fear This (Ghostzapper), with this foal in utero, for \$5,000 out of the 2012 Keeneland November sale.

"Obviously, I'm partial to Ice Box," Zito admitted. "I think he is going to make it as a stud--that's number one. He's a nice horse, he has all the qualifications."

Of the price tag, Zito commented, "Unfortunately, Lee Einsidler was bidding on the horse, too. So I probably had to pay a lot for him. I think that was my last bid, but I wanted to have the horse."

Zito said the colt's ownership was still up in the air. "I don't know, yet, but we're ok," he said. "I had somebody ask me about him, so he'll get first shot."

The yearling (hip 302) is out of Fear This, a daughter of graded stakes winner Susan's Angel (Cape Town).

Ice Box stands at Three Chimneys. His 2014 fee was \$7,500.

Tale of the Cat Colt to Blue Bison

David Greenhouse and Chris Boehning, who race as Blue Bison Stable, were on hand when a horse named Sioux (Awesome Again) romped by 5 1/4 lengths in an allowance at Saratoga Saturday afternoon. The two men were in action Saturday evening at Fasig-Tipton to purchase the 3-year-old's half-brother by Tale of the Cat for \$225,000.

"Our trainer Mike Hushion trains the half-brother who won today in the seventh race and he was very, very impressive," Greenhouse explained. "Mike loves that horse."

Sioux brought \$200,000 from John Fort when selling at the Fasig-Tipton New York sale in 2012.

Greenhouse admitted Sioux's victory prompted him to bid more than he had originally planned.

"We went a little more than we expected, but I think we're happy," he said.

Of the yearling, Greenhouse added, "He's a beautiful horse. He's just a really, really nice-looking horse and correct. Hopefully he will stay sound and we'll have some luck."

Greenhouse and Boehning are both 1983 graduates of Shaker High School in nearby Latham. They named their racing stable, which currently includes eight head, after the high school's mascot. Greenhouse owns a food distribution company in Denver and Boehning is a New York attorney.

Blue Bison Stable, along with Hoffman Thoroughbreds, campaigned stakes winner Shine Upon (Congaree). The two operations join forces in Sunday's first race at Saratoga with the mare's first foal, firsttime starter Tiz Time to Shine (Tiznow).

The Tale of the Cat yearling, hip 226, is out of Andraste (Pulpit), a half-sister to Grade I winner Vicar (Wild Again) and to the dam of multiple Group 1 placed Astronomer Royal (Danzig). He was bred by Waterville Lake Stables and was consigned by Winter Quarter Farm.

Malloy Splurges for Medaglia d'Oro Filly

Vivien Malloy, sitting alongside bloodstock agent Mike McMahon, went to \$210,000 to secure hip 247, a filly by Medaglia d'Oro Saturday at Fasig-Tipton's New York sale. Malloy, owner of Edition Farm and a longtime director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeders, admitted the stallion's most famous daughter was a major factor in the purchase.

"She vetted out very, very well, that was number one," Malloy said of the youngster. "Number two is [Horse of the Year] Rachel Alexandra. We had her measured, we had her cardio done. She had very good cardio, very good biomechanics. Her temperament was good. She is beautiful."

Edition Farm in Hyde Park, New York currently has a broodmare band of 10 head.

"I was shopping for a filly to increase and enhance my broodmare band and she checked all the boxes on that," Malloy explained.

The yearling, consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, is out of Blush (Menifee) and is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Derby Kitten (Kitten's Joy) and to multiple graded stakes-placed William's Kitten (Kitten's Joy). She was bred by Newtown Anner Stud.

Blush was claimed by Ken and Sarah Ramsey for \$30,000 in 2006. In foal to Kitten's Joy, she sold for \$390,000 at the 2011 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale to the bid of bloodstock agents Nick Sallusto and Hanzly Albina.

Gulfstream Presents Check to PDJF:

Edited Press Release

Following Saturday's second race, Gulfstream presented a check for \$6,183 to the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDJF), a public charity that works to provide financial assistance to former jockeys that have suffered severe, career-ending injuries on the racetrack. Incorporated in 2006, the organization supports approximately 60 former riders.

On hand to receive the check was former jockey and PDJF representative Gary Donahue. Donahue rode for six years and won 564 races before a riding accident at Suffolk Downs ended his racing career and left him paralyzed from the waist down.

"It means a lot," Donahue said. "It goes a long way and it helps--I believe it's 63--permanently disabled riders. It just helps them so much. It helps them to have a better life."

Saturday marked the second time in the past two weeks that Gulfstream acknowledged the work of the PDJF. On July 26, Gulfstream participated in the PDJF's Taking the Reins day, an event created to educate about and fundraise for the organization. Current Gulfstream riders signed posters for fans that afternoon and donations were taken.

Team Europe captain Italian Frankie Dettori commented, "Olivier has been my good friend for more than 20 years. Just a wonderful natural jockey, cooler than a cucumber when it mattered, as cool as an iceberg. In truth we did have the most experienced team. And we just had to beat those girls." Dettori added, "But that's the great thing about the Shergar Cup, it gives people a chance to see these top riders. It's great fun for us and I hope is great fun to watch."

Wilson, who was winless in two previous Shergar Cups added, "It means absolutely everything, I'm elated. It's not just winning the Shergar Cup for the team, winning a race over here means a lot to me personally.

Australian rider Craig Williams gained his first Shergar Cup victory aboard Goldream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) for trainer Robert Cowell and the International Team in the opener.


