LASIX-FREE RACES AT GULFSTREAM IN '15

In his quest to eliminate race-day medication and improve integrity, Frank Stronach said Wednesday that Gulfstream Park will begin carding some races in 2015 that will be restricted to horses

that are not running on Lasix.

Stronach, chairman of the Stronach Group, which owns Gulfstream, Santa Anita and three other tracks, flew in from Austria to be the keynote speaker at the Saratoga Institute on Racing and Gaming Law in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. The annual two-day program is presented by the Government Law Center and the Institute for Legal Studies at Albany Law School.

During his remarks, Stronach talked about the need to tighten the rules to change the perception that Thoroughbred racing tolerates cheating through the use of medication.

"My inclination is that we not have race-day medication," he said. "I don't want to shoot from the hip and bully anybody, but when we write races in our condition book, most of them will be Lasix-free. Together I think we can learn and hopefully demonstrate that Lasix would not be needed and race-day medication not be used. It's not used in most of the racing countries in the world, except America.

"We have a public out there and we owe it to them. We need to have a measured and logical approach. We're together in this. The horse owners and the trainers have to realize that we have to work together, we have to demonstrate to the public that this is a great place to be. Racing should be a fun place, it should be a family affair and no cheating." Cont. p3

NEW GROUP 1 FOR ROYAL ASCOT

Next year's Royal Ascot meeting will include a new Group 1 sprint restricted to 3-year-olds over six furlongs, the European Pattern Committee revealed vesterday. The announcement was amongst a number of changes to the European pattern schedule intended to address the current lack of opportunities for highclass 3-year-old sprinters. The changes also include upgrades to races in Britain, Ireland, France and Germany for both sophomore and older sprinters. Most notably, the QIPCO British Champions Sprint S. will also be upgraded to Group 1 status next year from Group 2. The as-yet unnamed new race at Royal Ascot will take place on the Friday of the meeting, and will be worth £375,000. The Buckingham Palace S. will be removed from the program. Cont. p4

Stronach Calls for Lasix-Free Races (cont. from p1)

Stronach said that a program is being developed that will require veterinarians to purchase medication for horses at Gulfstream Park at a track pharmacy.

"We announced a couple of months ago that we're going to use Gulfstream Park as a prototype," he said. "What can we do that racing will get a great reputation that it's a level playing field that there is no cheating and that the horses are well taken care of? That's not an easy task to do, but we did say that we made a commitment and that we will start with Gulfstream Park very shortly.

"No. 1 we want to make sure that there is no cheating going on so we have developed a program. Any program needs a little fine tuning."

Stronach said that hopes the programs developed at Gulfstream could be adopted at his company's other tracks in 2016.

Alon Ossip, CEO of the Stronach Group, said the Lasix-free races are likely to start when next year's group of juveniles reach the racetrack.

"We're going to have them for 2-year-olds," Ossip said. "We're going to write Lasix-free races. We'll have Lasix races as well, but we're going to start with Lasix-free and we're going to try that. That's assuming that the industry doesn't come together and say we're going to ban Lasix for 2-year-olds."

On Aug. 1, 25 prominent trainers, including a number of Hall of Fame members, released a statement saying they support the elimination of the race-day use of Lasix, beginning with the 2-year-olds of 2015. "Part of the issue with Frank being a horseman, he feels very strongly that Lasix is not good for the horses, but you have to educate people," Ossip said. "The way to educate people is to show them that a 2-year-old [that hasn't run on Lasix] comes out as a stronger 3-year-old."

Ossip said that it will be up to Gulfstream Park president Tim Ritvo when to introduce the no-Lasix races into the condition book at the track.

Stronach went into great detail during his speech about the need for a pharmacy on the premises that can be monitored by track officials. He said the track could negotiate with drug companies for better pricing, which would benefit horse owners.

"We want to work together and come up with a different model," he said. "If we don't come up with a different model this industry will not survive."

Stronach said there will be strict enforcement of the policy limiting medication on the grounds to prescriptions from the pharmacy. He said an individual found to have violated the rules a second time would be ruled off the track.

"We have to do it," Stronach said. "We have to demonstrate to the public that there is no cheating going on." *Cont. p4*

"It's going to be a massive undertaking, but it can be done," O'Neill said. "We've done basic research and we'll see when Mr. Stronach wants to proceed with it. We're going to have our own pharmacy to do what he wants to do, which can be done with no problem. Everything is in the pipeline. It's just a matter of when we want to execute it."

Stronach said that at some point all veterinarians on the property might be track employees, but O'Neill said that for the time being the longstanding program of private vets working for trainers will continue.

Stronach did not give a direct answer to a question about whether he would bid on New York Racing Association tracks if they are privatized and sold at the

end of the re-organization period in 2015. He did say that states should not be in the racing business and that NYRA ought to reduce its purses a bit and re-invest in the venues.

"You've got to make great facilities, make it so that it's a cool place to go to," he said.

NYRA does receive a percentage of money from video lottery terminal revenue from the casino at Aqueduct that must be used for purses and another

percentage for operations and track improvements. During an afternoon session on on-line gaming, Brad Cummings of Equilottery said that the proposed venture to create a joint lottery and live racing product has been well received since it was unveiled on July 9.

"Since our launch, we have had 26 different states and provinces with racing and lottery interests reach out to us," he said. "In very serious conversations, we've targeted that down to nine states and a province and we've had serious conversations across five continents. While we are young publicly, we feel very good about the initial response."

Cummings said a six- to nine-month compliance process with the lottery will follow after any deals are completed. He did not want to predict when the Equilottery might move from concept to reality.

"I don't want to give a timeline, but we're much further along than we were a month ago," he said. "We're really pleasantly surprised with the response. It certainly exceeded our expectations. We've had to restructure our internal budgets to reflect the response in a very dramatic way. We're happy to do that because we feel that the opportunity is very strong."

The European sprint program was identified as an area of weakness at the EPC's meeting in January, and the proposal for change was developed in consultation with committee members and discussed at a specially convened meeting at the end of July. It received the required unanimous approval of all member countries.

EPC Chairman Brian Kavanagh noted the changes will bring Europe's sprinting calendar more in line with other divisions. "For horses performing at every distance other than sprinting, the European pattern provides a 3-year-old only program until midsummer, when the Classic generation is considered ready to take on the older horses," Kavanagh explained. "The Committee believes it is no coincidence that when it comes to milers and middle-distance horses, Europe can genuinely lay claim to having the best in the world. However, there is a definite lack of top-class European 3-year-old sprinters." Kavanagh continued, "We have introduced a limited number of pattern races restricted to 3-year-olds in the first half of the European season, culminating in a new Group 1 race at Royal Ascot. Secondly, we have sought to deliver a more balanced overall sprint program providing better opportunities and greater incentives to run high-class sprinters in Europe." The other sprint races receiving upgrades are, to Group 3 level: the Prix Sigy, the Pavilion S., the Prix Texanita and the Lacken S. at Naas in June (all for 3year-olds). New Group 2s will be the Greenlands S. and the Sandy Lane S.; the Sapphire S., the Golden Peitsche and the Flying Five S.



COLLMUS TO TAKE OVER FOR DURKIN

Larry Collmus will take over for the legendary Tom Durkin as the New York Racing Association announcer starting in April 2015, NYRA CEO and President Chris Kay announced Wednesday.

"The New York Racing Association was privileged to have one of the greatest voices in professional sports calling our races for more than two decades," Kay said. "With our addition of Larry Collmus, we have another. Larry's highly acclaimed work for *NBC Sports*, including with the Triple Crown and the Breeders' Cup has inspired excitement and generated lasting memories for horseplayers and racing fans

everywhere. We are fortunate that Larry has chosen to bring his talents and passion back to New York, and I would like to extend a warm welcome on behalf of the men and women of this great organization."

Known as the voice of both the Breeders' Cup and Triple Crown on *NBC*, Collmus held the announcer position at Monmouth Park for 19 years before moving to Churchill Downs this past spring. He has also been the announcer for Gulfstream's elite winter meet since 2007 and will continue to hold that position. Collmus will call the fall meet at Churchill and spend the winter at Gulfstream before starting his five-year contract with NYRA at Aqueduct in April. "I am so excited and honored to become the next voice of New York racing," said Collmus. "The racing in New York is second to none--Belmont Park has such a rich history of championship racing and Saratoga has the best racing in the world and an atmosphere unlike any another place. I have some enormous shoes to fill as Tom Durkin raised the bar of our profession very high over the course of his brilliant career with the New York Racing Association."

The 47-year-old added, "I'd like to thank everyone at Churchill Downs who treated me very well during my brief time there. I am trading one dream job for another. I'm also very happy that the New York Racing Association is also giving me the opportunity to continue my work at *NBC* and to call the winter at Gulfstream."

NYRA's back-up announcer and Director of TV Production John Imbriale will call the Belmont fall meet and be the Aqueduct announcer until Collmus arrives in April. With 15 years under his belt at the Big A, Imbriale will continue to be the main announcer at Aqueduct each year through the end of March.

In May, Durkin announced that his 24-year stint as the NYRA announcer would come to an end at Saratoga Aug. 31. NYRA will devote the majority of that final day to honoring Durkin's 43-year career.

"I would like to congratulate Larry and wish him the very best," said Durkin. "It has been a tremendous privilege to serve the loyal racing fans of New York for all of these years. I am confident that Larry will find New York racing as exciting and rewarding as I did."

Trainer Richard Hannon has left in the Al Shaqab pair of **Toronado (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) and **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}), while top-class fillies **Rizeena (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}) and **Esoterique (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) are still under consideration.

HOOTENANNY REROUTES TO DEAUVILLE

Listed Windsor Castle S. winner **Hootenanny** (Quality Road), originally slated for a return to Europe for the G2 Gimcrack S. at York Aug. 23, will instead contest the following day's G1 Prix Morny at Deauville, according to trainer Wesley Ward. Ward noted that the decision came down to travel plans, citing that the

route to York would have been much more complicated.

"I was really looking forward to seeing him run at York and I'm told it's a great meeting, but we can get a direct flight to Paris for the Morny and to run at York would have added another

10 hours on to his journey," Ward

The Blind and the Deaf Eugenio Colombo

The vast majority of owners, breeders and 100% of the public want ZERO medication on racing days. The major reason is to show to our society we are not animal abusers, but horse lovers and civilized sportsmen.

The total transparency of the races will give more credibility to bettors, who will be more supportive of betting and then more will come. No more cheaters, trainers and smart asses with exotic juices.

For the breeders, zero medication will show the true class of the horses and the correct financial value.

But to achieve this we MUST give American trainers better conditions to be competitive/equal with Euro and Australasian colleagues. How? Read on...

The track managements are responsible for some of our unsoundness issues. I am not referring to the track surface, but to the training and racing issues. First of all, in America we only have 3 1/2 hours, after breaks, to train in the morning versus the six hours of European trainers, forcing sets of 30 minutes versus 1 1/2 to 2 hours of Europe. Our horses do not have time for a proper warm up and cool down, everything is done under very stressful conditions, with negative consequences.

The condition book is more and more boring: 6f, 6f, 6f, 6f, 1 1 /16...we must add more distance to races. Fast food does not leave emotional memories. Add more 1 1/8, 1 1/4, 1 1 /2 distances, not only in graded races but at all racing levels. Our young trainers will have no idea how to train a real Thoroughbred versus a quarter horse.

STRAIGHT LINE training and racing (is the egg of Colombo) to build and keep the soundness, especially in young horses. The Mickey Mouse spins of 5/8ths-6 furlongs are the foundations of unsoundness. The first breeze on such tight turns is the favorite for vets and pharmaceutical companies. Adding swimming pools at the major racecourses would also be very helpful.

There are several reasons to move in this direction, besides protecting the soundness of the horses and the owners' investment; racing in a straight line will allow fields of 15/20 runners, making more spectacular races and more interesting betting.

Without fundamental changes in training and racing conditions/facilities, the battle for zero medication is an academic battle, a waste of time. These are not revolutionary ideas, but the evolution we need to give us a better chance to run on zero medication. They are not personal inventions, just suggestions of proven winning systems.

GULFSTREAM UNVEILS FALL STAKES

Gulfstream Park, which will operate a boutique meet at Calder this fall, announced the stakes schedule for the 40-day stand Wednesday. The schedule features 23 stakes races, including 12 turf stakes, worth a total of \$1.775 million in the inaugural Fall Turf Festival. There will be three multi-stakes cards: the Nov. 8 \$600,000 Sunshine Millions Preview Day; the Nov. 22 card highlighted by the \$100,000 GIII Tropical Turf H. and \$100,000 GIII My Charmer S.; and the Nov. 29 card six stakes for juveniles. "We believe the stakes schedule for the first Fall Turf Festival presented by Gulfstream Park will serve as a bridge between the summer and winter meets and benefit local horsemen as well as those shipping to Gulfstream and Palm Meadows for the winter season and championship meet," said Gulfstream's Vice President of Racing P.J. Campo. "Obviously, this will be a new experience for all of us, but we intend to learn from this inaugural meet, get feedback from horsemen and fans, and begin building on what we hope will be a great fall tradition in Thoroughbred racing." The meet runs from Oct. 8 through Nov. 30.

Spring to the Sky, a runaway debut winner in the Belmont mud during his 2-year-old season, continues to fire on all cylinders. Third in last term's GIII Woodford S. at Keeneland, Spring to the Sky ran them off their feet in an optional claimer at Belmont June 29, then added Saratoga's Lucky Coin S. in similar fashion July 20. Making his first start on dirt since a ninth-place finish in the 2012 GIII Bold Ruler H. in this off-theturfer, the second-choice broke from the gate like a shot. With leading rider Javier Castellano in the irons, he zipped through an opening quarter in :21.68, and held off the heavy chalk despite drifting out through the stretch. The result stood despite a claim of foul by the connections of the runner-up and a stewards' inquiry. "It was a last-minute decision [to stay in and run]," trainer Bruce Brown revealed. "When Jason [Servis'] horse [Tightend Touchdown] came out, we figured, 'Let's give it a shot.' He's really been breaking great, and then he can take advantage of his speed after that. When he starts to get tired, he tends to drift a little bit."

Bernstein Flambe (Bernstein), a homebred for the Rosenthal & Bernstein partnership, has shown some talent besting a number of teams and catching our eye. She has a very solid pedigree and looks like she can break maiden early in her first or second lifetime start. She did well at Belmont and may be live second time out and maybe off the rail?

The Lewis Dinner (Posse) caught the eye in the paddock first out here at Saratoga July 18. She ran a winning race, but fell just short. The \$50k OBS April purchase was a tail swisher in her :10 flat preview over the synthetic OBS surface. She is bred to win early.

Go Babe hails from the first crop of <u>Tale of Ekati</u>. She was purchased for \$115k after a good breeze at OBS March. Excellent gate work on Oklahoma training track while best over a workmate, and also bred to win early and best around one turn. This one looked fast at OBS and looks fast here.

Lady Daphne is a well-bred NY filly by Harlan's Holiday out of a Carson City mare. Bought as a weanling for \$55k at the Keeneland November Sale, she has grown into quite the young lady. She has made our ALL-STAR-WORK REPORT and boasts excellent gate works, including Javier Castellano being on board in Aug. 8 gate work with nice filly Fila Primera. Bred for a high turn of speed and a win-early type.

Bar of Gold (Medaglia d'Oro) is most likely the filly to keep an eye in the future. Not saying she can't win today, but has some upside and is likely to be smart down the road with seasoning and more distance. Having said that, she does possess strong speed in her pedigree as well the ability to stretch speed out, and looks like a very solid horse for her 3-year-old season. She has also landed on our ALL-STAR-WORK REPORT.

Saluda (<u>Congaree</u>) is lucky to have escaped injury after going down to her knees and nose in last start. She goes from two rail draws to the far outside. She has shown very good speed for Mike Dilger. She is bred to have excellent early speed around one corner. This is her game, one turn, and with a better start, she could be right there. Bingley (Medaglia d'Oro) has shown speed in the morning, which most likely comes from his Distorted Humor mare. Bred to a good middle-distance runner, he has shown he can run from the gate, especially working with Proven Commodity, who ran fourth to Requite Saturday. Darley spent \$400K on him as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton August Select Sale here at Saratoga last year. Five-furlong race, however, may be too quick.
