F-T MIDLANTIC SALE STARTS MONDAY by Jessica Martini

The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, which continues to churn out an impressive roster of graduates, begins its two-day run at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium Monday morning at 10 a.m. Last year's auction produced three GI Kentucky Derby runners, led by multiple Grade I winner Dortmund (Big Brown) and GI Florida Derby winner Materiality (Afleet Alex), both 'TDN Rising Stars'.

Consignors are hopeful that the auction's recent successes will encourage potential buyers over the next two days.

"I would hope that the momentum that we've seen in recent years will continue," said consignor Nick de Meric. "I think a lot of nice horses are coming out of this sale every year and that fact is not wasted on the more sophisticated buyers." Cont. p

AN 'EXCEL'-LENT REPEAT IN SINGAPORE

When Tommy Berry hopped off **Dan Excel (Ire)** (Shamardal) following his pacesetting third to Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) in the G1 Champions Mile at Sha Tin May 3, he told trainer John Moore that the horse was in great shape--better, in fact, than he was 12 months prior when he parlayed a similar finish in

that event into a victory in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup at Kranji Racecourse. The conditioner exuded confidence in the parade ring and that bullish attitude was validated when the veteran galloper found the line a half-

length to the good of fellow Hong Kong raider Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) to become the first to record back-to-back successes in the premier event on the local racing calendar. Quechua (Arg) (Pure Prize) fared the best of the local runners in third. Dan Excel's win last year came just weeks after the tragic passing of Berry's twin brother Nathan in Singapore, and Tommy Berry knew he had some extra wind in his sails Sunday evening. "It's pretty unbelievable winning this again," the Aussie commented. "It's hard to describe how I feel right now. Brother Nathan was with me again, and it's significant to win here in Singapore." Baffert has returned to Belmont in the same position three times previously, with Silver Charm in 1997, Real Quiet in 1998 and War Emblem in 2002.

"It's slowly starting to sink in," he stated. "I can't believe that I've done this four times, that I've got a fourth time to do it. How lucky I've been with all the horses I've brought here. It usually takes a little while to sink in that we're on this journey. For me, New York, I've already been through all that. I know what to expect going in there. I know it's a little hectic. I don't want to take him up there unless he's really doing well. I can tell. If I put him on that plane, that means he's doing really, really well."

Baffert continued, "It's hard for me to imagine that I'm going through this again, with a horse like this that just makes my job a lot easier. All I can do is rely on my experience of going to the next one and what to do with him. I learn something about him every time I run him. He's still a really lightly raced horse. Things that he likes and what he doesn't like. He does have a good appetite. I'll just keep him eating and hopefully try to keep that weight maintained."

The trainer explained that American Pharoah will return to Churchill Downs Monday and will most likely ship to Belmont June 3.

"We'll take him back [to Churchill] and give him a light week, just let him get his feet under him a little bit and let him relax," Baffert said. "It's like going to the spa for a week. Let him lie down all day and relax, eat and try to get his weight back on him. He's a pretty fit horse. He doesn't need a lot. As long as he keeps moving like he does on the track. When he got here you could tell. He was wanting to do something, ready to do something.

"I liked the way he acted. He was really quiet and relaxed in the paddock. He didn't use himself up. In Kentucky he had a meltdown. They got him stirred up. The Belmont is not that. The paddock scene won't be like that."

Baffert noted that 'TDN Rising Star' Dortmund (Big Brown), who finished fourth in the Preakness, will get a needed break.

"I'm going to get him back," Baffert said of the Kaleem Shah colorbearer. "I think he could maybe use a break. He's getting a little light. I knew he was going to have trouble in the mud. He's had a pretty tough campaign."

What They're Saying the Morning After

GI Xpressbet S. Preakness longshot runner-up **Tale of Verve** (Tale of Ekati) looked to be doing well Sunday morning.

"He looked good," trainer Dallas Stewart offered. "We got him out and gave him a couple of turns [around the shed row] and grazed him. He's going to go to Belmont [Monday]. We're looking forward to getting it done next time. We think this horse will love a mile and a half."

Divining Rod (Tapit), who completed the Preakness trifecta, shipped back to his base at Fair Hill Training Center after the race.

"I was very happy with that," trainer Arnaud Delacour said. "At the quarter pole, it looked like he would be able to try and come by American Pharoah. Obviously, American Pharoah is a special horse, so there is no shame in finishing a little bit behind those horses. As far as the future with him, I'm not quite sure. We'll see how he comes back. I don't think he wants to go a mile and a half anyway, so I'm not considering the Belmont S. There will be plenty of other nice races in the summer for him."

Sixth-place finisher **Danzig Moon** (Malibu Moon) exited the race with a decent amount of dirt in this throat, according to trainer Mark Casse. The Ontariobred colt, who was coughing after the race, will regroup and aim for the Queen's Plate at Woodbine July.

"He seems fine," Casse commented. "There were a lot of horses coughing in the stakes barn after the race. We scoped him and the vet said he had half the race track in his throat." cont. p4





Although Danzig Moon will skip the GI Belmont S., Casse plans on sending out stablemate **Conquest Curlinate** (Curlin) for the 1 1/2-mile test.

Kentucky Derby runner-up **Firing Line** (Line of David) stumbled at the start of the Preakness and never factored, finishing seventh. Carlos Santamaria, assistant to trainer Simon Callaghan, said that the Zetcher colorbearer exited the sloppy affair in fine form.

"At the break, after the stumble, he was pretty much done. He wasn't comfortable on the track," Santamaria said. "There was nothing we could do about it, weather-wise. I'm not disappointed in him. I'm pretty sure he would have run his race if the track was good. If you look at him today, he looks terrific. He's happy. It just wasn't his day. He'll be back." cont. p4

Despite being eased, eighth-place finisher **Bodhisattva** (Student Council) looked well the morning after the Preakness.

"He's doing good," said owner/trainer Jose Corrales. "[Jockey] Trevor [McCarthy] said as soon as he stepped out of the gate he had nothing. He just gave up the whole thing completely. I had trained him once on a wet track and he didn't like it. I thought he got hurt or something, but nothing happened. I wish he could have run his race in the Preakness. We had a great week except for the race. That was disappointing, but it's just racing. What can you do? Sometimes things work out and sometimes they don't. American Pharoah is a great horse."



MATERIALITY WORKS TOWARD BELMONT

Alto Racing's 'TDN Rising Star' Materiality (Afleet Alex), winner of the GI Besilu Stables Florida Derby and GI Kentucky Derby sixth-place finisher, worked Saturday in preparation for a possible next start in the GI Belmont S. Materiality, who was under consideration for a start in Saturday's GI Xpressbet.com Preakness S., worked a half-mile in :49.03 (5/24) at Belmont Park Saturday instead.

"With those kinds of decisions you just never know, but with the downpour and everything [at the Preakness], I was happy we were safely at home and got a good work into him," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He went well, 49 [seconds] with a good gallop out; we were very happy with it."

Pletcher also plans on sending stablemates Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) and GII Peter Pan S. winner Madefromlucky (Lookin At Lucky) in the Belmont.

Umgiyo (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and trainer Mike de Kock's assistant Trevor Brown, Mubtaahii, who was eighth in his North American debut in the GI Kentucky Derby, is being pointed towards a start in the GI Belmont S. He fired a five-panel bullet in 1:01.11 (1/22) over the Belmont Turf course Saturday. Umgiyo, who is a possible for the GI Manhattan S. on the Belmont undercard, went the distance in 1:01.15 (2/22).

[horses], we'll gallop them on the turf," said Brown.

ATTRACTING YOUNG FANS TO THE PREAKNESS: A REPORT FROM THE INFIELD

Editor's Note: This week, we asked our college intern to attend the Preakness and report on it for us from a younger fan's perspective, and to produce content for the TDN's various social media feeds; Twitter, Facebook and Vine. Her report follows.

The Preakness S. on Saturday was a prime example of the racing industry's push to invite young people into the excitement. This is an incredibly tough task, and in my

opinion a vital one if we want to see racing thrive over the next 50 years.

It is a task that America's Best Racing is taking head on and other parts of the industry are beginning to follow suit. The Preakness S. has the reputation of being more of a party than a great horse race. This in retrospect is good for the race day numbers and is good for the income of the people involved. The larger issue with the school buses filled with rowdy partiers is the fact that this is probably the first and only race they will see--if they even saw it.

In the infield at Pimlico on Saturday, there were two main concerts: Childish Gambino and Armin van Buuren. Standing in and around the concert venue for the day I would have had no idea that there were races going on. There were no TV's, no loud speakers, only tents of beer and rowdy teenagers.



At one point, one of the performers had confetti that blew all the way onto the turf course. The separation of the concert goers from the racing fans was evident and impossible to ignore. Walking from one side of the infield to the other was like walking through a music festival and somehow ending up at the Preakness. The attendance was there and the effort was there but the execution was poor. It seems as if racing has just given in to the fact that racing itself cannot appeal to young people and it has to have added perks in order to get the numbers it desires. With this, there should be some way in which there was a visible effort made to get young people to watch the race. The race carries its own excitement and its own energy that can translate to young people. There was no easy access for people at the infield concerts to get to the rail or anywhere they could see the race. In order to watch the race live easily, I had to use my press pass to get into the very nice, very reserved turfside terrace.

Though despite these ailments, there was a noticeable effort in certain areas of the infield to impact the larger goal. The best part of the infield was the Wagering 101 tent. This tent was packed nearly all day with teenagers and young adults listening to the handicappers teach them how to bet. This definitely helped to create an atmosphere where young people can make money and truly feel like they are part of the game. cont. p6

Jack D'anna of Boston College agreed, saying it "helped to create the same excitement around betting as the older generations." D'anna's group of friends emphasized that their favorite part of this attempt to bring younger generations into the sport was the help they were getting with betting. They believed that tents like these were a great way to get people to understand and care about betting. There need to be a mass of these tents throughout the infield. This will at least give people the option to bet and to root for their horse without being packed into a small tent with 50 other people. The lack of TV's and loudspeakers in the infield was truly appalling. Taking away the main reason we

are all in Baltimore for the weekend is incredibly counterintuitive for the means of creating young fans. There should be an abundance of TV's and loudspeakers all showcasing the true heart of racing, the race.

The Preakness truly raises the question of what it is that we are aiming

for? There will be a time where racing has to decide if it wants to book great concerts for a day and reach their numbers for that day, or create lasting racing fans and have people to carry the sport through the years. There has to be a balance between the newfound party scene of the Preakness and the traditional high-class Preakness in order to create young racing fans.

One other note: part of my job for the *TDN* was supposed to be Tweeting and posting Vines on their feeds, which was made virtually impossible by a lack of cell phone connectivity. If racing hopes to lure young people to their events, not being able to share the fun on social media is a big negative.









F-T MIDLANTIC SALE STARTS MONDAY

Consignor Becky Thomas said the auction's recent success makes it a must-do on the busy juvenile sales calendar.

"The sale's success inspires us to come," Thomas said. "I don't think you can miss this sale."

Still Thomas expects the polarized market seen at recent juvenile sales to continue in Timonium.

"We've seen the same things at each of our sales," she said. "We've actually gotten more than we thought we would for our nice individuals. But anything mid- to lower-end was very, very tough."

David McKathan, whose Grassroots Training and Sales was represented by the co-fastest furlong worker of last week's under-tack show in hip 131, is optimistic the Midlantic sale's growing reputation will lead to a strong 2015 renewal. cont. p7





"This has always been a pretty good sale, there are always buyers here and it's always been a pretty strong sale," McKathan commented. "I don't know if there is going to be any increased interest this year [because of the success of last year's graduates], but I hope there is."

The catalogue of 490 head was whittled down to 351 with 139 outs as of Sunday evening. The first 244 hips are scheduled to sell Monday.

During last year's Midlantic sale, 329 juveniles sold for \$19,601,000. The average was \$59,578 and the median was \$31,000. Bloodstock agent Steve Young signed for the sale's top-priced lot, going to \$520,000 to secure a colt by War Front from the Eisaman Equine consignment.



Given some down time following his defeat of Smoking Sun (Smart Strike) here last May, Dan Excel was programmed for an Australian campaign targeting a run in the G1 Cox Plate in October, but he fell ill and connections were forced to regroup. He resumed only this past February and was clearly in need of his first few runs back, but showed he was rounding into better form in his last two, both defeats at the hands of

world-class Able Friend, including his 1 1/2-length defeat last time out in the Champions Mile. Moore and Berry felt that he'd peak in the two weeks between that race and this spot and so it proved.

With his draw in barrier 10, tactics

were telegraphed for all intents and purposes, and Berry bounced Dan Excel away to lead fairly easily from a handier-than-usual Military Attack and the well-backed third choice Meiner Frost (Jpn) (Black Tide {Jpn}).

The latter was his grey shadow down the backstretch and that allowed Military Attack and Zac Purton the run of the race, while Quechua, winner of Singapore's prestigious Gold Cup last season, stationed just to the outside of that one. They lined up three across at the head of the stretch, with Quechua looming a bold threat three wide, but there was still gas in Dan Excel's tank and he repelled the race-long challenge of Meiner Frost once and for all at the 300-meter mark. Military Attack came away from the fence and split the Japanese horse and Quechua three off the inside before setting his sights on Dan Excel. It looked as if he had the momentum in the final half-furlong, but Berry kept Dan Excel alive for the victory.

"I didn't expect to lead," Berry admitted. "I thought Slew Of Lode (Arg) (Lode) would jump out and lead. He can be a bit keen, but I had the Japanese horse on my outside and I know they normally go from a long way out, but he was 'nice enough' to leave me alone. I knew I would not get a better run and I was like waiting on the count for a horse to run me down. When the Japanese horse came to put a bit of pressure at the home turn, I let him go and he went full speed ahead."

The winning conditioner hinted that the season may not be over yet for Dan Excel.

"We have been approached by Ascot and York," the conditioner reported. "Obviously, we will be there with Able Friend, but we will now have to consider the [G1] Sussex S. at Goodwood in July. I will have to discuss with the owner and think about it."



Krisflyer International Sprint Result cont.

For the fifth time in the last seven years, it is Hong Kong which emerged victorious in the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint, as Aerovelocity proved far too classy and made every yard of the running to win the KrisFlyer Sprint as the long odds-on selection.

It's been nothing short of a phenomenal season for Aerovelocity, who bounced back from the worst of bad

trips in the G2 Jockey Club Sprint in November to streak home an impressive winner of the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint the following month. He was beaten on the square by the ultraclassy Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}) in the

Chairman's Sprint Prize Feb. 15, but showed uncommon character and determination when overcoming footing softer than he likes it in the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen at Chukyo Racecourse Mar. 29.

Assigned an advantageous low draw for this next overseas engagement, Aerovelocity jumped on terms and when the expected speed from the 3-year-old filly Kiwi Karma (NZ) (Fast 'n' Famous {Aus}) and the outposted Hototo (GB) (Sleeping Indian {GB}) did not materialize, Zac Purton decided to take the initiative and put his mount on the engine. The 6-year-old set the pace from Kiwi Karma to his outside and Emperor Max, the 2014 runner-up when ridden by Purton. Hototo came around the field to try to turn up the pressure on the bend, but as they turned for home, Kiwi Karma edged closer to Aerovelocity and looked for a stride or two to be doing the better of the two. But the favorite turned back that bid, pinched a break and was never in serious danger as Emperor Max repeated his finish from last year. A third straight KrisFlyer was not in the cards for Lucky Nine, who was checked off the heels of Kiwi Karma at the 800 meters and again behind Zac Spirit (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) on the turn. He rallied gamely up the fence in the lane, but could do no better than third, with jockey Brett Prebble saying he was a winner, but for the checkered passage.

"It is more a relief than a thrill to win as we are a long way from home," said trainer Paul O'Sullivan, 11 times a champion trainer in New Zealand before moving to Hong Kong in 2004. "He might have won with a little bit in hand as he was sitting pretty, so we are just relieved. It was not really the plan to lead, but he has got very good gate speed. We did not know what to expect from the local horses here. Obviously they were happy to just let him bowl along. Zac knows him very well but I thought he was sitting up a little long on him. At the 300-meter mark, I was like 'let him go for God's sake."

Aerovelocity has now won two legs of the Global Sprint Challenge--a third victory would earn connections a US\$1-million bonus. Up next in the series are the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and the G1 Darley July Cup, however O'Sullivan all but ruled out either of those spots. Future races in the GSC include the G1 Sprinters S. at Nakayama in October and the G1 Darley Classic during November's Melbourne Cup Carnival.



The bay gelding, produced by a half-sister to Grade I-winning turfer Designed For Luck (Rahy), trained brilliantly over this surface for trainer Bruce Headley, with a best-of-53 five furlongs in :58 flat May 4 and a near-bullet five-eighths in :58 1/5 May 11. The bettors weren't biting at the windows, however, and things did not look especially promising through the opening quarter mile, as Stringent wasn't off especially fast and lingered at or near the rear while way out into the middle of the track. With Hall of Famer Alex Solis looking over his left shoulder, he finally dropped down a few paths towards the inside and visibly accelerated as they flew into the turn. Picking off rivals inside leaving the three-eighths, he was steered out full of fun and four wide into the stretch, and, despite being asked nearly a half-mile from home, managed to sustain that big run and raced away to score by 2 1/4 lengths.

Hook Em Kurt (Tale of the Cat) was second best. Stringent also hails from the female family of Grade II-winning 3-year-old Macho Macho (Macho Uno). Saltendipity is the dam of 2-year-old Cloud Nova (Fusaichi Pegasus), and was purchased by the Don Alberto Corp. for \$220,000 in foal to Congrats at Keeneland November in 2013 as part of the Golden Eagle dispersal. 
