NO DERBY FOR SALES-BOUND VIREN'S ARMY



Viren's Army has been entered in the Goffs London Sale | *Racing Post*

Middleham Park Racing's **Viren's Army (Ire)** (Twirling Candy) will not be supplemented to the G1 Investec Derby and is set to be entered in the Goffs London Sale June 13. The 3-year-old rose to prominence when upsetting the Listed Dee S. at Chester May 6, but Tim Palin, racing manager for Middleham Park, said the ownership group voted against putting up the £75,000 to supplement for the Derby.

"A few of the owners were undecided about supplementing, but they've had their vote and decided not to," Palin said. "It's a prohibitive figure and he's 25-1 to win. If he was around 6-1, the maths would probably stack up. There's the Italian Derby and the Irish Derby that he could in run, but there's only one Derby, I know."

Palin noted that Viren's Army holds entries Friday's Listed Cockeyed Hat S. at Goodwood and Sunday's G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh, but said the colt would take up neither engagement.

"His next date in public is at the Goffs sale on the eve of Royal Ascot and he has an entry in the [G3] Tercentenary S. [at Royal Ascot June 16]. We will test the waters and if he doesn't make his reserve, he will run in the Tercentenary," Palin said.

Viren's Army will be offered with his Tercentenary entry, so should he be sold, he will be eligible to run in his new owners' colours. [Cont. p2](#)

ASCOT DOUBTS FOR THE QUARTERBACK

G1 Newmarket H. winner **The Quarterback (Aus)** (Street Boss) is unlikely to make the trip to Royal Ascot, trainer Robbie Griffiths told *Racing.com's Racing Ahead*, but the conditioner noted the 5-year-old gelding could still punch his ticket if he performs admirably in Saturday's G1 Darley Goodwood S.


"It might be something we'd be better planning for next year on less runs, going to Ascot," Griffiths told *Racing Ahead*. "He's already had the five runs and no real time to spell. That's what'll be discussed after Saturday's performance. If we had to make a decision now, we'd be unlikely to go for sure. We have nominated, we have vaccinated, and we're all right to go if we feel his performance, and his recovery, is up to it."

The Quarterback has been out twice since his Newmarket win, finishing fifth in the G1 William Reid S. Mar. 24 and third in Caulfield's VOBIS Gold Sprint Apr. 16.

G1 1000 Guineas runner-up **Ballydoyle (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) eligible, as well as Listed Cheshire Oaks winner **Somehow (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). O'Brien trains six of the top seven current betting choices with Coral.

Third in the betting, and remaining eligible for the Oaks, is another Irish shipper, the Jim Bolger-trained **Turret Rock (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) (12-1). The most prominent British-trained filly in the betting, at 20-1, is Chris Humber's **Architecture (Ire)** (Zoffany {Ire}), second in Lingfield's Listed Fillies' S. May 7.

Keith Dalglish, former jockey with Mark Johnston, has been getting notable results throughout his short second career as a trainer and was due a decent horse to fly his flag higher, with Maleficent Queen stepping up to the plate. Beaten only once so far, ironically on debut by More Mischief in a mile maiden at Hamilton last May, the bay has made inexorable progress subsequently and after handicap wins also at a mile at Carlisle later that month and over this track and trip in September, she impressed on her return shouldering 10 stone at Pontefract at this distance Apr. 27. Held up in fifth early by a confident Phillip Makin, she moved easily to More Mischief passing the three-furlong marker and when committed a furlong later readily gained control. "She's just progressed with every run. We gave her plenty of time to get over each one and she keeps finding," Dalglish explained. "I thought she was up to this level, she was worthy, but when the rain came I was delighted, everything came right. She travelled smoothly and pricked her ears in front. We'll see how she comes out of it and I'll have a chat with the owner, we'll look for a group race over this trip."

Although Manila Selection had 10 tries before producing a black-type performer in this improving filly, her granddam is the MSW Wendy's Ten (Tentam), responsible for the GSW Montjoy (Manila), who was also third in the G1 Champion S., SW and GIII Arlington Oaks runner-up Instinct (Thunder Gulch). **Click for the [Racing Post result](#). Reddam Racing's **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo), campaigned by the same connections who conquered the 2012 GI Preakness S. with I'll Have Another (Flower Alley), will look to take his record to a perfect nine-for-nine from post position three in Saturday's second leg of the Triple Crown at Pimlico Race Course in Baltimore. The bay colt became just the second horse in history to complete the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile/GI Kentucky Derby double when holding out his rallying arch-rival **Exaggerator** (Curlin) by 1 1/4 lengths at Churchill Downs May 7 and is the first 2-year-old champion to emerge from the Derby unbeaten since Seattle Slew in 1977. Trainer Doug O'Neill knows that he has a horse that puts himself into his races with a quick first step and he's happy to leave the decision making to jockey Mario Gutierrez. "I think with his gate speed, the post position draw wasn't as important. **Uncle Lino** (Uncle Mo), who's a really talented horse with a lot of speed, is right inside of us, so, hopefully we both break good and we'll see what happens. 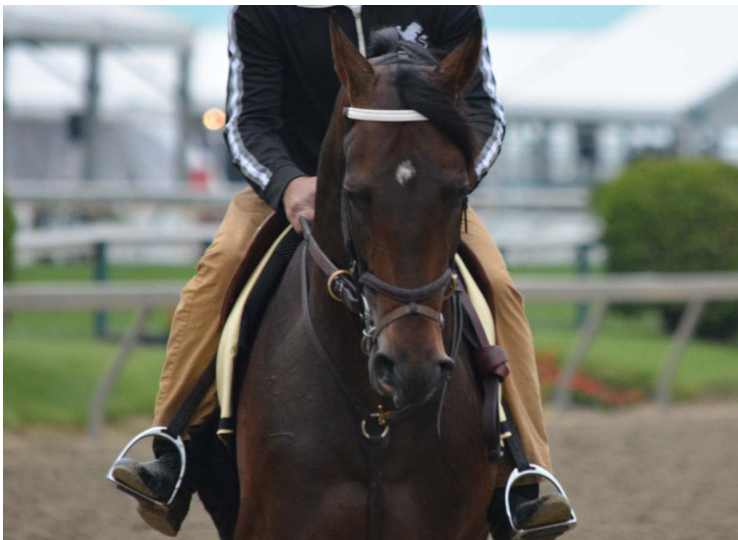

While Nyquist was ridden positively in the Derby and ultimately sat a stalking trip outside of Danzing Candy (Twirling Candy) and Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}) on a faster-than-expected pace, there appears to be even more speed in the Preakness. While it seems more than likely that Gutierrez will elect to get Nyquist to settle behind the speed this time, Exaggerator will be found towards the back of the pace. The Big Chief Racing Runner, who came from 15th and made up most of a 17-length deficit in the Run for the Roses, found a bit of trouble on the turn, but finished full of run. That he has a sixteenth of a mile less real estate cannot be in his favor, but a Saturday forecast that calls for significant precipitation could well slide the needle--and possibly the toteboard--in his direction.

"I guess we have to call it a non-issue for us where most horses have not run on an off or sloppy or a quagmire, like Santa Anita was that day [victory in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 9]," trainer Keith Desormeaux explained. "At least we know we can do it, so if you want to call that an advantage, we'll take it."

But can Exaggerator reverse form?

"We have to respect Nyquist for what he's done," said Desormeaux, who will give a leg up to former Maryland star jockey, his brother Kent. "The only thing we can do to perhaps turn the tables is that Exaggerator is such a quick-recovering horse. The two-week turnaround is going to play to our advantage instead of to most horses' disadvantage. We're confident we can turn the tables."

While those two are expected to dominate the market, 'TDN Rising Star' **Stradivari** (Medaglia d'Oro) was somewhat surprisingly installed the 8-1 third choice on the morning line despite being the only one of the 11 entrants with nary a stakes appearance. That being said, talent can overcome inexperience, and if able to reproduce the form that saw him dust a solid Keeneland allowance field by some 14 1/2 lengths Apr. 17, he cannot be ignored, though he will have some work to do from the widest in post 11.

"He's generally a good gate horse and that gives [jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] the ability to break and survey things inside and see where he wants to hopefully position him going into the first turn," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "The good thing is you can kind of dictate things instead of them being dictated to you when you're on the outside like that."

Since 2000, only three horses (Red Bullet, 2000; Bernardini, 2006; and Rachel Alexandra, 2009) have won the Preakness absent a start in the Derby. Including Stradivari, fully eight of Saturday's entrants will try to add to that record. Trainer Bob Baffert has hoisted the Woodlawn Vase on six occasions since 1997 and is represented by under-the-radar **Collected** (City Zip), last-out winner of Keeneland's Gill Lexington S. Another interesting California-based entrant is Uncle Lino, one of four in the race for his sensational young sire whose progressive form includes a distant third to Exaggerator in the Santa Anita Derby and a very tough half-length success in the inaugural California Chrome S. at Los Alamitos Apr. 30.

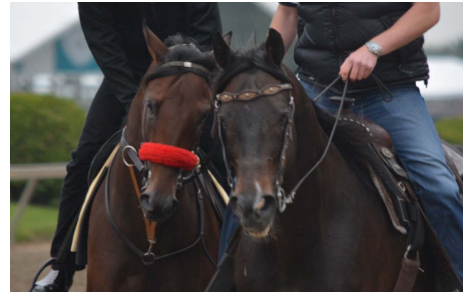

After a very quiet hour or so on the backside, things quickly began to pick up once **Nyquist** (Uncle Mo) headed out to train at 7:35 a.m. With the maiden of five career starts **Laoban** (Uncle Mo) already on the track jogging with a pony, the Derby winner began his two-mile jog alongside popular O'Neill stable pony Satire. Equipped with his customary red shadow roll, Nyquist

displayed his usual even-keel demeanor and was on his toes nicely with his ears up as fans lined the rail to get a closer look at the champ.

Laoban, sporting a blue bridle and matching Southern

Equine saddle pad, was fourth after setting a hot pace in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland last time Apr. 9.

The energetic Derby runner-up **Exaggerator** (Curlin), meanwhile, was also out on the track and proved to be a bit of a handful for his exercise rider during his first circuit around the track--even playfully bucking a couple of times in the stretch--before settling down and jogging nicely for the duration.

"He was feeling good," trainer Keith Desormeaux said during his presser later in the morning. "The kids were running around on the grandstand, and that usually gets him stirred up, any horse stirred up. He handled it well. It's not a dangerous energy. Some horses, their energy can be used in dangerous ways. His is just a happy energy."

The top two from the Derby are both looking and feeling quite possibly better than ever as they prepare to lock horns for the fifth time Saturday.

The always entertaining Eric Guillot held court with reporters while Laoban was getting cleaned up back at the barn. The native of Louisiana clearly didn't mind the cool weather, sporting his usual racetrack attire of shorts and sneakers.

O'Neill met with the media by the nearby podium while Speedway Stable's **Collected** (City Zip) quietly made his way back from galloping following the break. **Cont. p6**

"He went great," O'Neill said of Nyquist's trip to the track. "As planned, we jogged him two miles. I know I sound like a broken record--[he showed] great energy and he looked great. We're just looking for him to continue what he's been doing since he's been here in Baltimore and just keep his appetite up and stay injury free and stay loose. I'm very happy. It was a really good morning."

Continuing his training schedule of alternating days of jogging and galloping, Nyquist is scheduled to gallop at 8:30 a.m.

LANI TUNES UP FOR PREAKNESS

Prepping for Saturday's race, Japanese raider **Lani** (Tapit) worked five-eighths of a mile in 1:01 2/5 over the Belmont main track, galloping out six furlongs in 1:15, according to track clockers.

Ninth to Nyquist (Uncle Mo) in the GI Kentucky Derby May 7, the Koji Maeda homebred walked once around the 1 1/2-mile

circumference of the track, then jogged up to the five-furlong pole to begin his work in earnest. He clocked his opening quarter-mile in a leisurely :26 flat and, although he failed to switch his leads in the lane, finished his final three panels in :35 2/5.

"He's not the best switching leads, but in the

straight, it was ok," said trainer Mikio Matsunaga, who arrived in New York Tuesday to oversee the drill. "We don't have a breeze partner. If he had one here, it would be best, but in this situation, I understand it's difficult to do that. Going by himself, this is the best we could have wanted."

Lani, who is scheduled to travel by van to Pimlico Thursday, has reportedly settled down since the Derby and has not displayed the same cantankerous behavior he did in the days leading up to the Derby.

"He likes the barn and the track since arriving here, so the training is on plan," said Matsunaga. "He's been better behaved since he's been here."

HARLAN'S HOLIDAY COLT FASTEST AT F-T MIDLANTIC SHOW *by Jessica Martini*

TIMONIUM, Md - A colt by Harlan's Holiday was the fastest furlong worker of Wednesday's second session of the under-tack preview for next week's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale when he tied the mark of :10 flat set by two workers in Timonium during Tuesday's first session.

[Hip 371](#) is out of the unraced Awesome Maneuver (Awesome Again), a half-sister to

graded stakes winners Cat Fighter (Storm Cat) and Ishiguru (Danzig), and recorded his [:10 flat](#) work during the day's first set.

The dark bay colt is consigned to the sale by Justin Casse's Casse Sales on behalf of

Fletcher Mauk's Small Batch Thoroughbreds. Small Batch purchased the youngster for \$100,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

It was the second bullet breeze of the under-tack show for Casse, who sent out [hip 6](#), a colt by Shackleford, to work in [:10 flat](#) Tuesday on behalf of Kinsman Farm. While obviously enjoying the double bullet, Casse was quick to give credit to his clients.

"Fletcher bought the Harlan's Holiday and the horse has been training with Jimbo and Torie Gladwell in Ocala," Casse said of the Wednesday's bullet worker. "The horse prepped well before he left the farm and he prepped well here the other day. So after the horse yesterday, who was trained at Kinsman Farm, I thought this horse had a good chance of going equally fast."

Casse added, "I can't take credit for what these horses did here because they have only been under my care for seven days. It's just a blessing to work with very good horsemen."

Also working early in Wednesday's session of the under-tack show, [hip 310](#), a colt from the first crop of GII Louisiana Derby winner Mission Impazible (Unbridled's Song), earned the quarter-mile bullet when he worked in [:21 3/5](#). Consigned by Sergio Centeno's Blue River Bloodstock, the New York-bred is out of stakes-placed Voodoo's Argument (Closing Argument).

"I expected he would work good because he's shown me a lot of talent at the farm," the Florida-based Centeno said of the \$20,000 OBS August yearling.

Centeno has been consigning under the name Blue River for about 10 years, but this year's sale will mark his Midlantic debut.

"This is the first time I'm selling in Maryland," Centeno, who pinhooks some 35-40 juveniles a year both for himself and for clients, said.

"I've got some New York-breds and this is the right place to sell New York-breds. I'm just trying something different. I've been selling in Ocala and I thought I would go out of town and try my luck."

Blue River consigned subsequent stakes winner Conquest Whiplash (Hear No Evil) to the 2013 OBS April sale, where she sold for \$370,000 to Conquest Stables.

Wicked Rich Proving Wicked Fast

One of the surprising stars of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic under-tack show so far is the little-known stallion Wicked Rich (Yes It's True). South Carolina-based consignor Wes Carter brought six juveniles by the sire to Timonium and, of the five to breeze so far, three have gone in :21 4/5 and one ([hip 85](#)) shared Tuesday's bullet time of [:21 3/5](#). All were bred by Carter in New Jersey.

Carter purchased Wicked Rich, on behalf of Carolyn Vogel's Crossed Sabres Farm, for \$120,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. The bay RNA'd for \$150,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale before winning two of nine starts under the Crossed Sabres colors.

"I bought him for Carolyn Vogel's Crossed Sabres Farm," Carter confirmed Wednesday. "He raced four or five times with Seth Benzel in New York to start with and then we sent him to Kenny McPeck and he won two races at Churchill Downs. Then he came back to New York to run and in his second work, he had a bullet work and after the wire he fractured his cannon bone, got a condylar fracture. We put screws in it and Ms. Vogel just wanted someplace for him to go and she gave him to me."

Wicked Rich was originally scheduled to begin his stud career in New York, but after that deal fell through, Carter went to Plan B.

“I’ve been looking to get a few of them out there racing before I stood him,” Carter explained. “Being that he only made \$70 grand, I didn’t figure anyone would be wanting to pay much of stud fee.”

By Yes It’s True out of an Affirmed mare, Carter thinks Wicked Rich has an ideal pedigree for a stallion prospect.

“What I like about him as a stallion is that he doesn’t have any Mr. Prospector in him,” Carter said. “And he has Northern Dancer, but it’s like his fourth dam’s sire. He’s Bold Ruler and he crosses really well with all the popular breeding.”

Carter admitted he “backed into” the mares he bred to Wicked Rich. The dam of hip 85, Mom’s Honor (Hold That Tiger), was given to him by a friend. [Hip 269](#) is out of Swimmer (Rock Slide). “I raised Swimmer and she didn’t get to do anything at the races and her momma had two foals and they’re just kind of farm pets,” Carter admitted. And of Waiting to Connect (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), the dam of [hip 312](#), Carter said, “The guy couldn’t pay the training bills, so we ended up with her.”

“I just bred him to the kind of cross that I needed,” Carter said. “So Mr. Prospector or some Storm Cat that is popular, but is too concentrated in horses today. The biggest soundness issues with horses today is that they are inbred so badly. And Richie, he’s an outcross. He’s Bold Ruler line on top a couple of times. And he’s Bold Ruler on the bottom. He’s got Raise a Native on the bottom, but it’s far enough back that he gets a little bit of inbreeding to Mr. Prospector, but not overly so. And Northern Dancer on his very bottom side where it’s not overloading on Northern Dancer.”

Wicked Rich had 10 foals in his first crop, now three, led by Asheepoo, a maiden winner out of Waiting to Connect. Carter’s Midlantic draft is the stallion’s entire current crop of juveniles. Carter sees some similarities between the sire and his progeny.

“They are quite like him,” he said. “He had a lot of speed, but he won at a mile and a mile and a sixteenth on the turf. These babies have his intelligence and they are showing all kinds of speed. And they are doing it handily. They’re just fast and they stay sound. They have a lot of heart—they’ll run their guts out and I like that about a horse.”

Carter is hoping his consignment will lead to bigger and better things for Wicked Rich.

“Once I get these guys out there and people can see how they run, then I can send him to New York and stand him for \$5,000 or \$6,000,” Carter said. “I figure if people see how these babies perform with not much momma, they’re going to really want to send the good mares to him. If he can get some good mares, then he’ll really set the woods on fire.”

Rising Star Stable III and Howard Belvoir's **Barkley** (Munnings) took his record to a perfect four-for-four with a narrow score in Sunday's Auburn H. at Emerald Downs. The blaze-faced chestnut, who is also trained by Belvoir, has been campaigned exclusively at the Auburn oval and exited Sunday's contest in good form.

"He came out great," a pleased Belvoir told the *TDN* Wednesday morning. "Everything's good. He will stay here probably the rest of the meet. There's only about three more races for him here. Then I'll have to decide [where he goes next]."

One possibility is the one-mile Coca-Cola S. June 5 that has the potential to renew the fledgling rivalry between Barkley and the previously undefeated 2015 Washington champion 2-year-old male **Mach One Rules** (Harbor the Gold), who was

making his sophomore bow in the Auburn.

Despite the temptation to look farther afield after the Emerald Downs meet wraps up Sept. 11, Belvoir is determined to take a patient approach, adding he will look at "Just one race at a time," for his stable star.

Belvoir caught the racing bug early, as by the time he was a teenager, he was already a backstretch regular as a groom.

"I have been here since I was 13 years old," the Kansas native and Washington Racing Hall of Fame member continued. "[I was a] groom at 13, that was back when you could groom early, you know. My dad [R. H. Belvoir] was in [the game]. So I've been in it a long time, 54-58 years."

Belvoir first hung his shingle in 1963 at Exhibition Park in Vancouver and, 53 years later, has reached the 2,000-win milestone, with 2,020 victories from 15,547 starters through Tuesday. The R. H. Belvoir-bred Fairlyonest (Recur) was Belvoir's first winner and raced in the silks of R. H. Belvoir and sons. Two of Belvoir's three sons (Heath, Vann and Clay) with first wife

Mary Taylor, followed their father into horse racing. Heath works as a chart caller at Saratoga Race Course, Fair Grounds and Lone Star Park; while Vann, a former jockey, followed in his father's footsteps and trains on the Southern California circuit. Vann recently celebrated his first graded stakes win when Rocket Heat (Latent Heat) captured the GIII Twin Spires Turf Sprint S. ([video](#)) on the GI Longines Kentucky Oaks undercard May 6. The speedster wheels back in Friday's Jim McKay Turf Sprint S. at Pimlico.

The first foal from Numero d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), who is a half-sister to the SP Ice Lady (Cat Thief), Barkley's second dam is the MSW Numero Uno (Afleet), who was runner-up in the GII Chula Vista H. and the GII Bayakoa H. during her racing days. French champion juvenile filly Silver Cloud (Dan Cupid) is his fourth dam. Barkley's year-younger half-brother Class Won (Caleb's Posse) ([hip 84](#)) sold for \$110,000 at the Fasig-Tipton

July Sale in 2015. Numero d'Oro was covered by Bodemeister later that year.

The elder Belvoir credits Vann with acquiring Barkley ([hip 3240](#)) for \$21,000 out of Book Five of the 2014 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Auburn-based Rising Star Stable III syndicate principle Vicki Potter signed the ticket for the January foal from the Denali Stud consignment.

"Vann bought him for us back there [in Lexington]," continued Belvoir. "I read the [Keeneland Sales guide] and it was meant to

be. I was here [at Emerald] training and he was back there and somebody was looking on the computer at the sale and I was talking to him and Vann happened to call back. This one on the computer was a cute little thing. He vetted out good and so, I said 'Well, just go 21 [thousand] for him and see if you get him.' I give more credit to Vann [for picking him out]."

Barkley came to hand rapidly for Belvoir, airing by 3 1/4 lengths going 4 1/2 furlongs last June and doubled up with a half-length tally in the Emerald Express S. going three-quarters of a mile a month later. When asked why he stopped on Barkley after his July start, Belvoir was realistic.

"[I gave him] time to mature, he was a smaller colt and he had little 2-year-old shin problems," explained Belvoir. "I just gave him the whole winter. We have a short meet up here. We go from April to September. They have to have a rest sometime. He'd run twice and I said that's enough for him. I have good owners that listened to me." **Cont. p2**

Shelved until a two-length allowance tally Apr. 17, Barkley was primed for a big effort Sunday. Only \$379 separated 6-5 favorite Mach One Rules and Barkley at post time for the Auburn. In the end, Barkley prevailed by a head over his foe in a sharp 1:14.21 for the 6 1/2 furlongs, good for a career-high 84 Beyer-Speed Figure.

"He's great," said Belvoir. "He's a great smart horse. Good to be around. Little bitey still, but he's a stud. He's a great little guy."

Belvoir, who has tasted graded-stakes glory in the 2008 and 2009 editions of the Gill Longacres Mile--first with homebred and Washington champion Wasserman (Cahill Road) followed by Assessment (Jump Start)--was justifiably proud of his charge. The veteran is keeping it all in perspective, however, and refused to compare Barkley with any of his past stars.

"I can't answer that, it's too tough," Belvoir concluded. "He's an awful good colt. I mean for around this area anyway. He's a nice horse." --Heather Anderson
