

THUNDER SNOW TO MAKE NOISE IN MAROIS

Godolphin's **Thunder Snow (Ire)** (Helmet {Aus}) will on Sunday seek his third Group 1 win in France when he lines up in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. The bay—who has made 12 starts in four countries—won the G1 Criterium International at two and took Chantilly's G1 Prix Jean Prat last out on July 9. Thunder Snow began the year with wins in Meydan's G3 UAE 2000 Guineas and G2 UAE Derby, but caused a monumental scene at the GI Kentucky Derby when throwing a bucking fit just strides from the gate and being pulled up out of the race. The bay has since made a good account of himself back in Europe, however, finishing second in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and third in the G1 St James's Palace S. prior to his Prix Jean Prat win. He faces five rivals on Sunday, with Roly Poly (War Front) removed from the race on Friday.

"He's come back from his last run very well and seems fresh," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "He's in good form and his last piece of work was very good indeed."

Bin Suroor is, however, realistic about the colt's opposition.

"Obviously he won a Group 1 in France last time out, but this race looks even tougher," he said. "The quality looks really high, but I'm very happy with him. He's such a tough horse and he loves all the traveling."

BLACK CAVIAR DAUGHTER WINS

Three-year-old filly **Oscietra (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), the first foal from undefeated champion Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), displayed some of her mother's trademark speed to graduate at second asking over the Geelong synthetic surface on Friday. Drawn gate four, Oscietra—sent off the \$2.20 (6-5) second favourite—was first to break the line and led, albeit narrowly, into the turn in the 1000m test under Regan Bayliss. They stacked up to her outside to deliver their challenges, but Oscietra accelerated off the home corner and never looked like losing. The winning margin was 1 3/4 lengths ([video](#)). Trained by David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig of Lindsay Park for a partnership including breeder Neil Werrett, a part-owner of Black Caviar, Oscietra was a debut third in a 1000m Flemington maiden on New Year's Day. The winner of that race was Limestone (Aus) (Helmet {Aus}), who won the G3 Blue Diamond Preview next out and was second in the G2 Blue Diamond Prelude. Oscietra, named for a type of prized caviar, had turned in a couple of smart trials prior to Friday's return to the races. Black Caviar is the dam of the 2-year-old colt Prince of Caviar (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}), a yearling Snitzel (Aus) filly and is due to More Than Ready in 2017.

"It was a great relief for her to win today," Werrett told *Racing.com*. "David's got her in great order. She came out and did what we expected first race. I expect over the spring that she'll develop."

"I'm sure David's going to take her easily through her grades," Werrett said. "He'll pick out a race at Moonee Valley in three weeks' time, I think. It's very special; it was a great relief for the whole team here. It's been a while since she raced on New Year's Day. She's very fit; David spent a lot of time getting her ready, so we're very relieved."

Werrett also said Prince of Caviar would join the Lindsay Park stable in three to four weeks.

GALILEO FILLY WINS IVAWOOD S.

Two-year-old filly **Ballet Shoes (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) improved off a June 28 debut fifth going six panels at Naas to claim a one-mile maiden win at The Curragh last time on July 29, and stepped forward once again to register a career high in her black-type bow, Friday's Listed Ivawood S. at Tipperary. Stalking the pace in second after leading through part of the early exchanges, she was sent wide to race on the stands' side off the home turn and easily asserted under mild coaxing inside the final quarter mile to win with plenty in hand. "I liked her the first day I rode her and she stepped up to win her maiden the last day," said rider Donnacha O'Brien, who carried two pounds overweight aboard the winner. "Today was a stepping stone for her and it wasn't a case of just getting black-type, as I think she's a very smart filly. She'll get further than that and will stay 10 furlongs at least, but she has shown enough pace today to be effective over a mile."

Ballet Shoes is the leading performer, and one of two winners from as many foals to race, produced by G3 Naas Fillies' Sprint S. runner-up Emerald Ring (Ire) (Johannesburg), herself out of a winning half to G1 Grand Criterium-winning sire Jade Robbery (Mr. Prospector) and GSW sires Numerous (Mr. Prospector) and Chequer (Mr. Prospector). She shares her MGSW third dam Number (Nijinsky II) with GI Metropolitan H. hero Corinthian (Pulpit) and GSW GI Santa Anita Derby placegetter Desert Hero (Sea Hero) and is from a family which also features Nureyev (Northern Dancer), Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer), Tate Gallery (Northern Dancer), et al.

ARC OPTION FOR ZHUKOVA

Grade I-winning mare **Zhukova (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) could point towards the Oct. 1 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and also has option in North America, trainer Dermot Weld told *At The Races*. The 5-year-old notched her first top-level victory in Belmont Park's GI Man O'War S. on May 13, and was fourth when last seen in The Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S. on July 2.

"She put up a spectacular performance when she won the Man O'War for us and we're delighted with her," Weld told *At The Races*. "She's in great order and we'll speak with her owner and decide whether we train her for the Arc or go back to Belmont for the [GI] Turf Classic and then races like the [GI] Canadian International. All those great races are there in the fall for her. If I thought we were going to get a wet autumn, we'd definitely train her for the Arc."

AUTOCRATIC TO BLOOM AT HAYDOCK

Ruled out of last month's G2 York S. when the rain came, Cheveley Park Stud's **Autocratic (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is at Haydock on Saturday bidding to provide Sir Michael Stoute with the outright record of four winners in the G3 Betfred Rose of Lancaster S. Successful in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. over just short of this trip at Sandown on May 25, the 4-year-old half-brother to the sire Evasive (GB) faces better opposition this time. Of the fellow older horses, last year's Cambridgeshire H. winner **Spark Plug (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) showed he has not stood still in the interim when winning Sandown's Listed Gala S. last time on July 7, while Godolphin's **Francis of Assisi (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) returns after wins in the Oct. 26 G3 Bendigo Cup and Nov. 5 G3 Queen Elizabeth S. at Flemington by a combined margin of 13 lengths. "Francis of Assisi has been training well and I am looking forward to his first start of the year," Charlie Appleby said. "He is coming back in trip slightly but that shouldn't be a concern, especially with ease in the ground. He won over an easy mile and a half out in Australia and a stiff mile and a quarter should be fine."

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum has won this five times, including with his stellar performer Nayef in 2001, and his unbeaten 3-year-old colt **Laraaib (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) has an intriguing profile. Having beaten the subsequent King George V H. winner Atty Persse (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) over this course and distance on May 26, the bay followed up in slick style in Ascot's London H. last time on July 15 and is likely to start favourite here.

CHARM OFFENSIVE

From 2009 to 2013, Godolphin dominated Newmarket's G3 German-thoroughbred.com Sweet Solera S. and the operation have a fascinating contender for the latest edition on Saturday in **Poetic Charm (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}). Off the mark on debut in a course-and-distance maiden on July 15, the half-sister to Teofilo (Ire) has to improve against some experienced rivals, but trainer Charlie Appleby is hoping she can make the step up. "Poetic Charm came out of her debut well and the form of that race looks strong," he said. "We have a couple of drying days in Newmarket, so I am anticipating that the ground will not be too soft on Saturday. I am hopeful that she can take the next step up in grade."

Third behind Clemmie (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Nyaleti (Ire) (Arch) in the six-furlong G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. here on July 14, **Mamba Noire (Fr)** (Wootton Bassett {GB}) returns with the best form in the book and trainer Ken Condon is confident she will be hard to beat. "Our filly will be stepping up to seven furlongs on Saturday, but the way she's finished her last two races is very encouraging," he commented. "If there's a bit of ease in the ground I think that would suit her. Nyaleti has obviously come out and won very well and I know the boys at Ballydoyle hold Clemmie in very high regard. She looks a Classic filly in the making."

Another with winning form here is Cheveley Park Stud's **Dance Diva (GB)** (Mayson {GB}), who followed a success in the six-furlong Listed Empress Fillies' S. at the start of last month with a second to Nyaleti in Ascot's G3 Princess Margaret S. on July 29. The owners also have the July 28 Thirk novice scorer **Juliet Capulet (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) and the stud's managing director Chris Richardson said, "Dance Diva was still a little bit green at Ascot. She didn't want to come under the arch and was a little bit edgy and on her toes in the parade ring beforehand."

She's obviously a good filly and a very good filly beat her on the day. We think the penny is dropping with her and the way she finished at Ascot would suggest stepping up to seven furlongs will suit." Richardson added of the stable's other runner, "Juliet Capulet is a progressive filly and John [Gosden] is very sweet on her. We bought her to run in races like this and it will be interesting to see how she performs."

In a strong-looking renewal, Team Valor's recent purchase **Capla Tempress (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) is unbeaten and an unknown quantity whose trainer Marco Botti holds in high regard. "This is a step up in class, obviously, but she was quite impressive the other day and after two runs and two wins she's entitled to take her chance," he said. "I don't think she's ground-dependent, but being by Lope de Vega, she probably handles cut in the ground better than others." Richard Hannon saddles Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Listed Star S. winner **Tajaanus (Ire)** (Arcano {Ire}) and Al Shaqab Racing's Newbury maiden winner **Mayyasah** (More Than Ready). Harry Herbert, racing manager for Al Shaqab Racing, said, "Richard is quite buzzed up about her. She did a piece of work this week that left everyone quite excited."

The February foal was bred by Yuzo Tanimizu, who raced Vodka to defeats of males in the 2007 Tokyo Yushun (2400m), the G1 Yasuda Kinen (1600m) in 2008 and 2009 and the 2009 G1 Japan Cup. Named champion 2-year-old filly of 2006, Vodka was also Japan's champion older mare of 2008 and 2009 and retired in 2010 with 10 wins from her 26 career starts and earnings of ¥1.3 billion (US\$13.1 million).

Trained like Vodka by Katsuhiko Sumii, Tanino Frankel is the fourth live produce for Vodka, each of which has been foaled in Ireland. Her best runner thus far has been the consistent Tanino Urban Sea (Ire), a daughter of Sea the Stars (Ire), the half-brother to Tanino Frankel's paternal grandsire Galileo (Ire). Tanino Urban Sea has three wins from 12 starts and has been out of the top three just twice. Vodka is also the dam of an yearling Irish-bred filly by Invincible Spirit (Ire) and produced a full-brother to Tanino Frankel just over two months ago in Ireland.

Tanino Frankel, trading ante-post as the 2.1 (11-10) favourite and will be ridden by Mirco Demuro for his debut run. He has drawn gate 13 in a field of 15 in the day's fifth race.

Frankel is the sire of four winners from nine runners in Japan, including champion Soul Stirring (Jpn) and 'TDN Rising Star' and GSW Mi Suerte (Jpn).

Deauville galloping down to post in the Meld | *Racing Post*

Deauville (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) made a pair of trips to the U.S. last summer, first taking out the GI Belmont Derby, an effort that would almost certainly have made him the one to beat in the GI Secretariat S. Instead, he was given a crack at his elders in the GI Arlington Million and gave an excellent account of himself, racing prominently before going down narrowly in third to Mondialiste (Ire) to complete a 1-3 finish for his all-conquering stallion. The bay is back in Chi-town Saturday afternoon and is the 7-2 morning-line favorite in this country's original seven-figure race, a "Win and You're In" qualifier for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

Whereas last year's Million was the final of just four sophomore appearances for Deauville, he will be making his seventh trip to the races while visiting a seventh different venue this term. Though he was well-beaten in the G1 Dubai Turf to kick off the season, he has been a model of consistency since with a win in the G3 Huxley S. around the tight turns of Chester ([video](#)), Group 1 thirds in the one-mile G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot ([video](#)) and in a soft-turf renewal of the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at this trip ([video](#)). He was a latest head second when trying to make all in the G3 Meld S. at The Curragh July 20 ([video](#)).

'BRUJA'-HA EXPECTED IN BEVERLY D.

Though the day's main event will follow, Saturday's GI Beverly D. S. shapes in many ways as the race of the meeting, with horses already proven at Grade I level facing some more unexposed types who look to have major upside.

Dona Bruja (Arg) (Storm Embrujado {Arg}) won eight of her 10 starts at San Isidro in Buenos Aires, including a Group 1 going the metric mile and a quarter, but it was still a bit difficult to gauge exactly how talented she was when she entered the gate as an 11-2 chance for Churchill Downs's GIII Mint Julep H. June 10. She announced her arrival on these shores with a smooth 1 1/2-length success for jockey Declan Cannon and was on trial for this in the GIII Modesty S. over course and distance July 8. Given a supremely confident ride from second-last behind no pace whatsoever, Dona Bruja shaded 17 seconds for her final furlong and a half en route to a one-length defeat of **Prado's Sweet Ride** (Fort Prado). **Cont. p5 (Click here)**

Deauville will exit gate five beneath Ryan Moore, who--somewhat surprisingly--is in search of a first Million success. In addition to Mondialiste, Galileo is also the sire of the Aidan O'Brien-trained Cape Blanco (Ire), who won the 2011 Million in the colors of Mrs. Fitri Hay. O'Brien's first Million came courtesy of Powerscourt (GB) (Sadler's Wells) in 2005.

If it is not a son of Galileo who gets his picture taken Saturday, perhaps it will be his half-brother Sea the Stars (Ire) to supply the winner. Al Shaqab Racing's **Mekhtaal (GB)** was the runaway winner of last year's

G2 Prix Hocquart and struck from close range to score by a neck in the G1 Prix d'Isphahan at Chantilly May 28 (video). The racy chestnut was further off the pace in the June 21 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot (video) and finished well, but the €300,000 Arqana August yearling grad could do no better than a never-nearer sixth, beaten 3 1/2 lengths to Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo

{Ire}). Drawn widest here, he is likely to be ridden positively by Frankie Dettori and feels a better stayer than the favorite.

'**TDN Rising Star**' **Beach Patrol** (Lemon Drop Kid) looks to join the likes of Awad (1993/1995) and Marlin (1996/1997) as winners of the Secretariat to follow up in the Million. Runner-up in four Grade I tries thereafter, including a half-length defeat at the hooves of **Divisidero** (Kitten's Joy) in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic May 6, the dark bay was third to upset-minded **Ascend** (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Woodford Reserve Manhattan S. June 10 and filled the same slot after cutting out a demanding pace in the 11-furlong GI United Nations S. at Monmouth Park July 1. Joel Rosario takes over for Florent Geroux, who has the call atop Turf Classic third **Oscar Nominated** (Kitten's Joy). **Cont. p4**

The Illinois-bred makes his third start off a November layoff and exits a 1 1/2-length defeat in the GIII Stars and Stripes S. July 8. The turnback from 12 to 10 furlongs will help, but he'll need things to fall just right.

The waters are obviously deeper, but Dona Bruja may be equal to the task and she could very well drift up from her morning line of 7-2.

Chad Brown has won the last two runnings of the Beverly D. and three overall, and sends out three chances Saturday. Though clearly the less accomplished of the duo, **Grand Jete (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) has not set a foot wrong in three starts on these shores, showing a devastating turn of speed to win the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth and a July 14 Belmont allowance. **Dacita (Chi)** (Scat Daddy) won the GI Diana S. last summer, but has found the Arnaud Delacour-trained **Hawksmoor (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}) too tough in their last two meetings in the GIII Beaugay S. in May and again in the GII New York S. the following month. **Rainha Da Bateria** (Broken Vow) dead-heated for the win last time in the GII Dance Smartly S. at Woodbine July 2, but must show she can mix it at Grade I level.

SEXTET SET FOR SECRETARIAT

The 11th-hour withdrawal of the pre-entered dual graded-stakes winner Frostmourne (Speightstown) has left a short, but sweet field of six turf sophomores--three domestically based and three European-trained--for Saturday's GI Secretariat S.

Amerman Racing Stables' **Oscar Performance** (Kitten's Joy) will try to defend the Secretariat for America and is likely to start a mild post-time favorite. The homebred overcame post 13 of 14--no small feat going a mile at Santa Anita--to best European raider Lancaster Bomber (War Front) in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and has bounced back into top form with victories in the GIII Pennine Ridge S., defeating subsequent

GII Jim Dandy S. winner Good Samaritan (Harlan's Holiday), and the GI Belmont Derby in his two most recent trips postward. His lone sub-par run this year came in the GII American Turf S. where he tailed off badly after setting the early pace. He raced with Lasix for the first time that day, but had not prior to that effort and has been off the medication since.

Permian (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) will challenge Oscar Performance for favoritism off exceptionally strong European form. Convincing winner of a main Epsom Derby prep when supplemented for

the May 18 G2 Dante S. at York ([video](#)), he tired up the hill in the big race to be 10th. Back on less than three weeks' rest for the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot ([video](#)), he turned in a strong staying performance

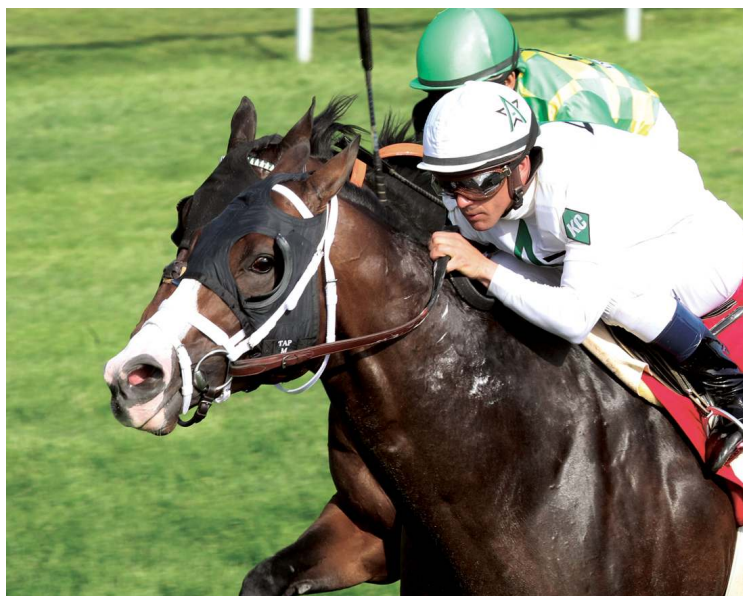

If the two chief market rivals happen to cancel each other out on the front end, the progressive **Afandem (Fr)** (Zoffany {Ire}) should find himself in a position to capitalize late. Winner of his first three career trips to the post, including the Listed Prix Ridgway at Compiègne in June ([video](#)), he stalked the pace from third in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte ([video](#)), took over a furlong from the wire and was outfinished for the win.

Afandem's form is similar to that of Bayrir (Fr) (Medicean {GB}), who came into the 2012 Secretariat with three wins from four starts, including a win in the Eugene Adam, and stormed home an easy winner.

Saratoga's Fourstardave H. enters its second year as a Grade I event and the \$500,000 race did not disappoint, drawing a diverse field of six entrants in the main body of the field set to contest a grassy mile. When WinStar Farm's **American Patriot** (War Front) was last seen on American turf, he stormed down the stretch at Keeneland to capture the GI Maker's 46 Mile in April, and following an 11th-place effort in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, the 4-year-old is set to make his Saratoga debut Saturday for trainer Todd Pletcher. American Patriot was a shade over 10-1 when he upset the Maker's 46--which featured a lively pace--and he will likely need to keep a closer eye on the pacesetters in this compact field.

“He came back from Royal Ascot in good form and he's been pointing for this since then,” Pletcher said. “He's been training well. He seems happy, and he's getting back to what he's best at, which is a two-turn mile.”

Donegal Racing's progressive **Ballagh**

Rocks (Stormy Atlantic) was a close fourth behind American Patriot in the Maker's 46 and enters the Fourstardave off a tally in the GIII Poker S. at Belmont June 18.

Disco Partner (Disco Rico) and **Sassy Little Lila** (Artie Schiller) undoubtedly represent the two most intriguing storylines in the Fourstardave. The former, a Patricia Generazio homebred conditioned by Christophe Clement, has gone on a three-for-three tear in 2017, highlighted by a world record-establishing performance when he ran six furlongs in a blistering 1:05.67 in the GIII Jaipur Invitational S. at Belmont June 10. Disco Partner navigated a one-mile trip with flying colors in the July 15 Forbidden Apple S. at Belmont, but is still in search of his first success around two turns. Sassy Little Lila, meanwhile, endured a pair of narrow defeats at the Grade I level when second in both the Dec. 31 American Oaks and June 10 Just a Game S. The 4-year-old filly takes on male rivals

Saturday and looms squarely as the one to catch on the front end.

“Obviously, there's a couple angles we're hoping work out,” said Sassy Little Lila's trainer, Brad Cox. “We get a weight break as a filly facing the boys, she likes a mile, and she likes this course up here. It's an ambitious spot, but she's doing well, so we think she's up for the challenge.”

Juddmonte Farms' **Time Test (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) shortens up in distance after competing exclusively at distances nine furlongs and longer in the past year and a half. The 5-year-old was a four-time Group stakes winner in Europe, but has yet to break through since arriving to the barn of trainer Chad Brown. Time Test enters off a pair of runner-up efforts in both the May 6

“She’s 2-for-2 so far and doing well,” Pletcher said of Pure Silver. “We were originally thinking about waiting for the Seeking the Ante [for state-breds Aug. 25], but she’s training well and this looks like a relatively compact field, so we are going to take a shot at open company. She’s been very good so far, very straightforward. She’s a precocious 2-year-old.”

Pletcher will also be represented by **Stainless** (Flatter), a distant third in the opening day GIII Schuylerville S. after missing the break and spotting the field nearly 10 lengths.

Sagamore Farm has a pair of entrants for the Adirondack in July 21 local maiden winner **Southampton Way** (Into Mischief) and first-out July 9 Laurel graduate **Proportionality** (Discreet Cat). The former responded well to the addition of blinkers in her recent win and posted a four-furlong drill over the Oklahoma training track in the interim, while the latter figures to be a pace factor stretching out from five furlongs.

“Southampton Way came out of her race in real good order,” said Sagamore’s trainer Horacio De Paz. “She stayed here after the race, it’s a quick turnaround, but she recovered after that race really good, so we’ll move forward. We thought highly of her as a weanling, a very grand-looking filly...[Proportionality] is doing good off of that win down there in Maryland. I think 6 1/2 furlongs is a little too far for her, probably three quarters would be her game.”

Michael Dubb and trainer Rudy Rodriguez sent out Wednesday maiden winner and ‘**TDN Rising Star**’ Lady Ivanka (Tiz Wonderful) and look to build on that success with **Wall of Compassion** (Jimmy Creed), who enters off a six-furlong debut victory at Belmont July 7. **Limited View** (Freedom Child) and **Di Maria** (Data Link) complete the field.

MANY CHANCES IN PUCKER UP

The GIII Pucker Up S. closes out Saturday's blockbuster card at Arlington and there is no shortage of options for gamblers who still have cash in their pockets.

LNJ Foxwoods's **Sensitive** (Divine Park), a \$475,000 Keeneland September acquisition, posted a modest Laurel maiden win at second asking last October, but could not reproduce the effort on two weeks' rest when only ninth of 12 in Belmont's Chelsey Flower S. Transferred from Michael Dickinson to Brad Cox this term, the bay returned with a vengeance, as she made ground from well back, swung out about five wide at the top of the stretch and came home nicely to annex a July 2 Ellis allowance in near track-record time. The shape of this race would seem to flatter her running style and she figures a live chance at bettable odds.

Dontmesswithjoanne (Pioneerof the Nile) may have been the best despite her fifth-place effort. PLETCHER TRAVERS HOPEFULS WORK

Trainer Todd Pletcher confirmed he has several horses possible for the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. after three members of his team worked Friday morning over the Oklahoma training track. The trio included May 6 GI Kentucky Derby winner **Always Dreaming** (Bodemeister); **Tapwrit** (Tapit), victorious in the June 10 GI Belmont S.; and July 28 Curlin S. scorer **Outplay** (Bernardini).

Always Dreaming, who worked in tandem with Outplay, carved out an opening quarter in :25 1/5 and rounded out the four-furlong move in :48.83. The pair galloped out five eighths in 1:01 4/5.

“Both of them worked well enough to come back and work next week and see how they continue to prepare,” said Pletcher. “But I think the Travers is very much in play for both of them and Tapwrit, also.”

Pletcher continued, “I thought both horses worked very well. I was very happy with the way Always Dreaming settled nicely and relaxed early. It was an excellent work from both horses.”

Always Dreaming returned from his fourth-consecutive victory in the Derby to finish eighth in the GI Preakness S. May 20

before a recent third-place effort in Saratoga’s GI Jim Dandy S. July 29. Campaigned by MeB Racing Brooklyn Boyz, Teresa Viola, St Elias, Siena and West Point, the bay had been breezing solo of late.

“All of his works after the Preakness were by himself and I wanted to see where we were in terms of how the race settled him down and how he was going to respond to being in company,” said Pletcher. “I thought he rated very kindly.

Johnny [Velazquez] said he was very agreeable with whatever he asked him to do.”

Added Velazquez, "He was so much better; he allowed me to get him up to [Outplay]. He normally would be fighting me to there, [but] he was really good. It went very nice. He galloped out very good. The plan was for me to stay a little bit off him and give my horse a bit of a chance. Separately, we jogged him, and I let [Outplay] start out in front, he got a little too strong, but as soon as he started picking up in front of me, he came back to me and I had him. I didn't think it was going to work out but it did. I'm very happy with it. I like the way he did it. He actually settled the first part, so that's the most important thing."

Tapwrit, who also took the GII Tampa Bay Derby earlier this spring, breezed earlier in the morning, working in company with 3-year-old Uncle Mojo (Uncle Mo). The Bridlewood, Eclipse and LaPenta runner went five furlongs in 1:01.22 with regular jockey Jose Ortiz in the irons.

"I thought he did great," said Pletcher. "He worked 1:01 and change, but more importantly than that, I thought he galloped out fantastic, going 1:27 and change for the seven-eighths, pulled up the mile in 1:42. [His] fitness level was very good; it seemed like he was doing it easily in hand. I was very happy with it."

FAYEQ REMAINS ON TARGET FOR TRAVERS

Shadwell Stable's **Fayeq** (Malibu Moon) gave trainer Kieran McLaughlin reason for optimism after registering a bullet four-furlong work over the Oklahoma training track in preparation of a start in Saratoga's GI Travers S. Aug. 26. The 3-year-old, who was working in company with sophomore maiden Last Stage (Tapit), easily putting away his workmate to complete the move in :47.36 under jockey Luis Saez. The work was the fastest of 51 recorded at the distance. NYRA clockers caught the half-brother to Hall of Famer Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) galloping out five furlongs in 1:01 1/5.

"He worked fabulous and galloped out great," said McLaughlin. "We're pointing for the Travers."

Fayeq has won both of his appearances in New York, including the latest when winning by 3 1/2 lengths in a 1 1/8-mile allowance July 26. Both wins have come with Saez in the saddle.

"We just wanted [Saez] to sit on him because he doesn't switch leads in the afternoon, but he does in the morning," explained McLaughlin. "So, we were wanting them to get together and somehow [get him to] switch in the afternoon."

The decision to take a shot in the Travers with Fayeq took root following the upset of the favorites in the GII 2 Jim Dandy and GI Haskell Invitational, both contested July 29.

"We have to take a chance because of his pedigree and because he's a really nice horse," explained McLaughlin. "We want to give him a try. It's a big step up, but we feel like he deserves the chance. It's tough, there's some good horses out there but we want to try it. He's well-bred, a brother to Rachel Alexandra. He's a beautiful horse with a great mind. And if we can get him to switch leads, that would help us a lot."

F-T NYB SALE STARTS SATURDAY

The Fasig-Tipton New York-Bred Yearlings Sale kicks off its two-day run Saturday evening at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga with the first of 295 catalogued offerings scheduled to go through the sales ring at 6:30 p.m.

The New York sale follows on the heels of Fasig-Tipton's record-setting select sale, which produced the highest-ever median and second-highest gross and average in its history earlier in the week. During a frenetic day of showing at the sales grounds Friday, consignors said they were looking for the energy from that auction to carry into Saturday.

"There are a lot of nice horses on the grounds and the success of the main sale should continue on here," said Paramount Sales' Pat Costello. "There are quite a few buyers from the main sale who have stayed on for this sale. You'll have a certain amount of different clientele, but there will be good carryover from last week."

Danzel Brendemuehl of Royal Bloodstock agreed.

"I think some people didn't get things bought at the first sale and their expectations are to get something at this sale," Brendemuehl said. "There has always been good traffic here, but today people were waiting in line to see horses."

Dodging the odd raindrop throughout the day at the sales grounds was a varied mix of owners, trainers, pinhookers and bloodstock agents. Larry Best, whose OXO Equine has been a major presence at recent sales, was in attendance, as well as Stonestreet's Barbara Banke, Bridlewood Farm manager George Isaacs and legendary former NFL coach Bill Parcells.

Mark Hennig, Linda Rice, Ken McPeck, Chad Brown and Rick Violette were among the trainers jockeying for position in the crowded barn area and the pinhooker population included Bobby Dodd, Raul Reyes, Ciaran Dunne, Cary Frommer, Nick deMeric, Tom McCrocklin, Randy Bradshaw, Steve Venosa, Randy Hartley, Jim Crupi and Eddie Woods.

"The activity so far at the barns has been busy," said consignor Archie St George. "We've been showing all day since 7:30. So you'd have to think it's positive, but you still have to have the horse to attract buyers."

In addition to the success of the select sale earlier in the week, St. George pointed to a strong Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale as cause for optimism going into the New York-bred sale.

"Based on the July sale and the select sale--which was one of the strongest sales I've been to in a while--you'd have to be positive," he said. "At the end of the day, it seems like there are a lot of people from Kentucky selling up here and the sire power and the pedigrees seem to keep improving every year."

The locally based RFHF consignment teamed by Chris Bernhard of Hidden Lake Farm and Elaine Peck of Rhapsody Farm was a flurry of activity between barns one and three Friday.

"There is a lot of traffic and, off of the momentum from the early sale, I think we are in good shape," Bernhard said. "I feel

like we are seeing more buyers who have been buyers in the upper end of the select sale and are staying along here probably a little more. We have more Kentucky-sired New York-breds and New York-breds are competing in graded stakes--it's kind of a no-brainer."

Among its 20-horse offering, the RFHF consignment features a bevy of yearlings by Kentucky-based sires as the farms look to remain competitive with the major

operations in town from the Bluegrass.

"We've been looking at cover sire and produce trying to upgrade what we are doing each year and I think this is a pretty good indication with some of the sires we've brought here--between Uncle Mo, Bodemeister and Cairo Prince--that we can be competitive with the Kentucky operations. We have to give them a run for our own money."

During last year's New York-bred sale, held in one continuous session after a major storm led to the cancellation of night one, 177 yearlings sold for \$13,672,500. The average was \$77,246 and the median was \$60,000. Twelve horses sold for \$200,000 or more, including the \$450,000 sale-topping colt by Uncle Mo. Purchased by Cheyenne Stables and now named Mo Diddley, the dark bay was a debut winner at Churchill Downs in May for trainer Mark Casse. The **'TDN Rising Star'** will contest Sunday's GII Saratoga Special S.

The New York-bred sale continues Sunday with a second and final session beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Royal Bloodstock Back for Year Two

Danzel Brendemuehl may be best known on the sales scene as a consignor of 2-year-olds, but the Ocala horsewoman, along with partners Sandra Lombardo and Britt Wadsworth, will be making their second appearance at the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred sales consigning yearlings under the Royal Bloodstock banner.

“We sold with other people three and four years ago in this sale,” Brendemuehl said. “Then we decided to form our own bloodstock agency and we’ve done great.”

She continued, “I’m 61 years old, so it’s time for me to stop doing as many 2-year-olds in training sales. I’m still doing them, but we are also concentrating on some weanling to yearling [pinhooks] and I actually have some broodmares—I’ve been breeding in New York. You just have to embrace all of it and diversify.”

In addition to its consignment at the Fasig New York Sale, Royal Bloodstock will also be consigning at the OBS October Yearling Sale and the Fasig-Tipton November sale.

“We will have a lot of homebreds in the November sale,” Brendemuehl said. “We will have an Honor Code, a Liam’s Map, a Carpe Diem, and a Cairo Prince—weanlings by really nice stallions. We’ve reduced our numbers and raised our quality.”

As part of a partnership for the commercial broodmare band, Brendemuehl purchased multiple graded stakes winner Gitchee Goomie (City Zip) ([hip 623](#)), in foal to Carpe Diem, for \$100,000 at the Fasig-Tipton February Sale.

“We have her Carpe Diem colt and he is lovely,” Brendemuehl said. “And we bred the mare back to American Pharoah.”

Royal Bloodstock will offer eight horses at the two-day New York-bred sale.

“We’ve got an Itsmyluckyday ([hip 379](#)) who is outstanding, there is a lot of buzz on him,” Brendemuehl said. “The Midshipman filly ([hip 460](#)) has been out a lot and everyone loves her and there are a couple of Flashbacks ([hip 346](#) and [hip 473](#)) who have been popular too.”

ON NBC, RACING BROADCASTS ARE FLOURISHING *by Bill Finley*

The horse racing industry is happy with the coverage it is receiving on the NBC family of networks and NBC is thrilled with the ratings its broadcasts are receiving and the momentum it is seeing when it comes to televising the sport. The marriage between horse racing and television has often been a rocky one, but a new chapter is being written and the storyline is nothing but positive.

Not only has NBC widely expanded its coverage of racing, a sport that was all but abandoned by ESPN, but is reporting that ratings are climbing. The recent broadcast of the GI Whitney S. received the highest rating for any Breeders’ Cup Challenge race broadcast on NBC since the upset of American Pharoah in the 2015 GI Travers S. and the ratings for the Breeders’ Cup have risen 26% since NBC took over from ESPN. Those are just two of many statistics NBC is reporting that present a rosy outlook for racing coverage on NBC.

“We think the sport is thriving,” said Jon

Miller, who is the president of programming for the NBC Sports Group. “The numbers are up dramatically on every single one of our horse racing properties. Last week, for example, the Whitney on NBC did 1.1 million viewers, which is a huge number. We’re seeing it everywhere with racing.”

NBC re-entered the picture when it comes to racing in 2011 when it began broadcasting the Triple Crown races. At the time, it showed just 23 hours of racing a year. That number is now up to 85 and there is at least one race on an NBC network every month of the year but December and February. It has also expanded to overseas racing, including the Dubai World Cup and the Royal Ascot meet.

“There are a lot of things working in our favor,” Miller said. “Racing has done a really great job of marketing and promoting itself with different organizations working really well. When we first came on board all we had was the [GI] Kentucky Derby, the [GI] Preakness and the [GI] Belmont. Since then we have added the Breeders’ Cup and the Breeders’ Cup Challenge races and they have really been the thread that has enabled people to stay engaged with horse racing from time the Belmont ends in June until the Breeders’ Cup in November. Plus, I think the sport is so well produced. We are blessed to have the single best horse racing producer that has ever done the sport in Rob Hyland.”

NBC cont.

NBC has seen ratings gains with virtually all of its racing coverage. The three Breeders' Cup Challenge telecasts so far this year have averaged 992,000 viewers, up 4% over last year. Last year's Breeders' Cup coverage on NBC and the NBC Sports Network reached over 5 million unique viewers. The Friday broadcast did particularly well, showing an 8% increase from the year before. And expectations are high for this year's Breeders' Cup, which will consist of 25 1/2 hours of coverage, up from just 8 1/2 in 2012.

NBC has certainly done its part to get the word out about its racing broadcasts, cross promoting them among its many other sports telecasts. Miller noted that during the Giants-Eagles Sunday night football game last year, which was played five days prior to the Breeders' Cup, the announcers made several references to the upcoming racing.

"Sunday Night Football is the number one show in all of television, not just sports, but all of television," Miller said. "Last year, during that Eagles-Giants game, which was one of highest-rated Sunday night football games of the year, we ran an in-program 'green sheet' where Al Michaels talked at length about the Breeders' Cup and that was immediately followed by a 30-second spot promoting the Breeders' Cup and telling people to tune in the following Friday and Saturday. Together all of that is worth over \$1 million street value, but when you consider the actual delivery because of how high that game rated and because of the position in game the Breeders' Cup was discussed, and because we imbedded it within the broadcast, its worth was a multiple of \$1 million. Something like that is hugely valuable."

One of the challenges to producing racing is that the actual race takes up only a few minutes, while a football broadcast, with the exception of commercial breaks, consists almost exclusively of live action. Miller believes NBC has managed to turn the down time into an asset. It has incorporated celebrities into its broadcasts and also relies on human interest features.

"We do the Olympics every two years and the Olympics is an unbelievably spectacular event," he said. "It's not a sporting event, it's just an event. But it lends itself to great storytelling. In order to do a good job with the Olympics, you have to tell stories because you don't know who a lot of these athletes are. There was a time when no one knew who Michael Phelps or Lindsey Vonn were. The story telling is what made them so popular. We take those principles, which are in our DNA, and we apply them to horse racing. If you have 12 horses in a race you might have 36 great stories."

NBC is also looking to improve its broadcasts through technology. Jockey cams will be tested during the running of the GI Pacific Classic S. next Saturday and if there are no bugs they will be incorporated into the Breeders' Cup broadcast. Miller said drones could also be used to provide unique angles of the races and that the NBC team is exploring the idea of implementing augmented and virtual reality into the broadcasts.

Narrowing the gap between himself and the leading rank through a half in :44.79, the seven-year-old was within striking distance as the tiring leader retreated and Loose On the Town moved to the fore. Head to head with that game rival midstretch, Stallwalkin' Dude and Loose On the Town

battled all the way home with the former holding the narrow advantage at the wire. Weekend Hideaway rounded out the trifecta.

"He likes to make it exciting sometimes, and he sure did that today," said winning trainer David Jacobson. "When I saw the fractions, he was a little farther back than what we had planned, but I knew he'd be right there. He's a real pleasure to train, and he's very easy to train. After a close up second in the GIII Fall Highweight H. at the Big A Nov. 24, Stallwalkin Dude rounded out the season with a win in a muddy renewal of the Dec. 18 Gravesend S. On the board in this winter's GIII Toboggan and GIII General George, the typically consistent gelding had to settle for sixth when ambitiously spotted in the G1 Golden Shaheen at Meydan in March. Back in the winner's circle while annexing his second Diablo at Belmont May 17, the bay finished runner up in Belmont's GII True North H. June 9. Most recently, he finished fourth--beaten 9 1/4 lengths--by Golden Shaheen winner Mind Your Biscuits (Posse) in the GII Belmont Sprint July 8. **Cont. p2**

He came from how far out of it to get up? You have to love the old man he’s a warrior.”

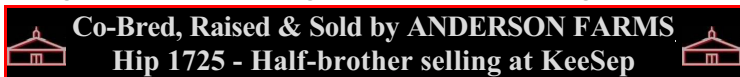

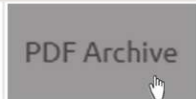
