



## HISTORY MAKER AT THE HEART OF IRISH RACING

On Dec. 18, without fanfare, a small but significant footnote in the history of Irish racing was recorded when Meta Osborne became the first female Senior Steward of the sport's regulatory body, the Turf Club. There are few, if any, nations where the sport of horseracing and business of Thoroughbred breeding are regarded more passionately and seriously than in Ireland. In that respect, Osborne can be seen almost as an embodiment of the twin pursuits. A commercial breeder with husband Dermot Cantillon through their Tinnakill House operation, and born to a family steeped in Thoroughbred lore, she retains the enthusiasm for racing of a genuine fan, even if these days it means carrying a notebook with her to the races.

She says, "People assume that as the Senior Steward I'm at every race meeting but the role is more like the government—making the legislation—so we oversee racing and make sure the rules are fit for purpose. I do go racing regularly though and I find there's often someone who comes to me to ask me about something, so I make a note to remind myself to look into it."

Such a meticulous mind, not to mention her 'day job' as a vet specialising in equine fertility, has clearly helped in Osborne's rise though the sport's political ranks. Her Turf Club role means that she is also on the board of Horseracing Ireland (HRI--the body which oversees racing's administration and finances--and for the last year she has chaired the 16-member Anti-Doping Task Force, which was set up by the Turf Club and HRI in the wake of trainer Philip Fenton's ban for administering banned substances to his horses.

The Task Force published its far-reaching recommendations, including lifetime bans for horses which have been given prohibited substances, Feb. 4.

Despite such influential roles in the sport, the mother of four maintains a defiantly down-to-earth outlook on her situation.

"I never envisaged being Senior Steward. I've been a member of the Turf Club for 10 years and growing up I probably never even thought I'd be that. The first female member of the Turf Club was Sonia Rogers and that was only 31 years ago," says Osborne, who served as Deputy Senior Steward to Neville O'Byrne for two years and now has fellow owner-breeder Harry McCalmont as her deputy. "I liken it to being a member of a tennis club. It's no good just complaining about the state of the nets and the courts. If you want to improve things, you get yourself on the committee to try to get things done."

Her practical approach will almost certainly ensure that Osborne makes her mark during her two-year tenure and is a notable Senior Steward beyond simply being female. However, she is quick to deflect credit for the recent Anti-Doping Task Force report.

"Its publication came six weeks into my term as Senior Steward and people seemed to think that I had got so much done in my first few weeks, but in actual fact we first met last February," said Osborne. "It was a long process and it just so happened that it came out last

week. It was a really interesting process because, certainly in Ireland, it was the first time that all the stake-holders were round the table, so you had breeders, owners, trainers, the regulation authority, the promoter of racing, sales companies. They were all there, and all with well expressed views, not always sharing the same views but there was lots of robust discussion."

She adds, "What was really gratifying was that we asked that the details of our meetings were kept confidential and that was really well adhered to. I think when people came to meet us they really felt that they could speak freely."

Almost a year after the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) published its enhanced anti-doping policy with a zero-tolerance approach to anabolic steroids, Ireland's rules are in similar vein, though there is an exemption option for therapeutic anabolic steroid use in exceptional circumstances by application to the Turf Club, and a harsher penalty for any horse found to have been administered banned substances.

Osborne comments, "We had the advantage of being able to consider the BHA's guidelines and being able to look at them in an Irish context and maybe adapt them slightly. Everyone around the Task Force table wanted it to be right for Ireland and not just a reaction. I'm pleased it got to where it is now. One of the most important things is that the Task Force reconvenes as an exercise to see how we got on and how it has evolved."

She continues, "I describe it to people as a road map not a destination. We're not just going to put the report on the shelf and say 'there you go, that's anti-doping'. It's a series of recommendations which everyone around the table has bought into but of course the devil is in the detail and we have to put the protocols in place to make sure it works."

Osborne's primary role as an equine vet--an occupation she shares with her late father Michael, the former Manager of the Irish National Stud and revered racing administrator, as well as her brother John, the current Chief Executive of the Irish

> National Stud--doubtless helped in tackling the complex issues dealt with in the report.

> She says, "The welfare aspect was something that I was very strong on. I think we have a responsibility to the animals under our care and in how we look after them. We live in a bubble but it's a transparent bubble and we don't want people looking from the outside thinking instantly of racing and drugs. We need to be pro-active and say,

Osborne has a serious rival for the number of different roles held in Irish racing and breeding from within her own household. Dermot Cantillon is not only hands-on at the home farm of Tinnakill House, but also oversees the Smurfit family's Forenaghts Stud, is a board member of Goffs and Chairman of Naas Racecourse, as well as being a past Chairman of both the Irish Thoroughbred Breeders' Association

"Dermot is always very involved on the Tinnakill side of things," says Osborne. "I'm maybe not as involved as much at the moment as I'd like to be but we have a really good manager in Ian Thompson and the place runs like clockwork thanks to him. On the veterinary side I've just taken on a second assistant. At Tinnakill we're foaling around 30 mares and we have a number of maiden and barren mares so there's plenty going on. We're revamping the website and I really love writing the blog for that."

The couple's four children, Jack, Lily, Tom and Rose, have steered a different path on the professional front but have done so en masse. Cont. p3

"Two have graduated with law degrees and the other two are in college studying law," says their mother. "But they have always followed racing and enjoyed it. Jack started the Trinity College Horseracing Society, Lily was on the committee and Tom and Rose are now on the committee, and Tom and Lily have both been tour guides at the Irish National Stud as a summer job."

Despite grappling with key racing issues on a daily basis, Osborne's conversation is regularly punctuated by laughter. It's not that she doesn't take her multi-faceted role seriously, more that she has an infectious and natural sense of fun which is aided by the contentment of a life being lived to the full.

"I'd like to have more time to go to the cinema and art galleries and to read but I still manage to fit it in and I love all of this," she offers. "I always say that working in racing is a way of life rather than a lifestyle but if you're enjoying it, it's not difficult."

Chapple-Hyam continued, "I think it's a very good move. The Craven is run over the same course and distance as the Guineas so this makes it the perfect Guineas trial."

Chapple-Hyam reports Marcel to have wintered well and the Craven would be discussed should he need a prep run.

"Marcel is only cantering at the moment but I'm very happy with him in every way--he has done fantastically over the winter," added Chapple-Hyam. "It is definitely the plan to aim him for a Guineas, but if he has a trial beforehand is a different matter. If we do decide to give him a prep race, the Craven will come under strong consideration."

The Chris Waller-trained Kermadec (NZ) (Teofilo {Ire}) looked on good terms with himself in a 900-metre barrier trial at Rosehill Monday. The dual Group 1 winner--in the G1 Doncaster Mile and G1 George Main S. both in 2015--was runner-up

behind Group 3 winner Dothraki (Aus) (Mossman {Aus}). Having sat third on the rail, Kermadec moved up smoothly entering the straight under a tight rein before Dothraki was urged along by his rider to assert close home.

Waller is hoping to start Kermadec back in the G1 Canterbury S. over 1300 metres Mar. 5, with an eye to the G1 George Ryder S. Mar. 19, followed by a title defense in the Doncaster Mile during The Championships at Randwick. The 4-year-old colt was last seen finishing 13th behind stablemate Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G1 Cox Plate last October.

#### Two Colts Share Top Billing at Perth Cont.

Two colts shared top honours when selling for A\$135,000 each, and it was lot 3 that established the early high-water mark. The colt, by first-season sire Your Song (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and offered by Western Breeders Alliance, was sold to Trevor Andrews. Out of the winning Jestceny (Aus) (Real Jester {Aus}), the bay is a half to the SP Jestpatim (Aus) (Patronize {Aus}) and recent Magic Millions WA 2yo Classic winner The River (Aus) (Magnus {Aus}).

"He's obviously pretty attractive because we've got the half-brother [The River (Aus)] and I like quite a few lots late tomorrow so I thought I better strike early otherwise I could miss out on a couple of the others," said Andrews. "He's an easy horse to sell. I've pretty much got him sold now. He'll be an upand-running style Magic Millions horse for next year and I'm pleased to get hold of him."

Later in the evening Singapore based owner Constance Cheng also went to A\$135,000 to secure the joint-sale topper lot 117 from Amelia Park Racing and Breeding. Flanked by trainer Steven Crutchley, Cheng was delighted to have secured the Snitzel (Aus) (Redoute's Choice (Aus)) colt, who is the sixth foal out of the stakes performer and eight-time winner Royale Harvest (Aus).

Amelia Park Racing and Breeding also supplied the day's third top lot with a Sebring (Aus) (More Than Ready) colt lot 38 out of Group 3 winner Madame Shinko (NZ) (Shinko King {Ire}), who was knocked down to Morton Racing for A\$120,000.

"I just thought he was a cracking colt," commented trainer Danny Morton. "He's off a good farm and we were trying to buy horses like that at the Gold Coast a few weeks ago and we couldn't get near them, so I'm happy to have him. Sebring is a superstar sire and he's a real athlete and he's very well grown already. He's just going to make into a lovely athletic style of horse."

"It's been a pleasing start," said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. "With the blended results of last year, the average was about A\$37,000 and we're sitting just above that at about A\$38,000 and a gross just shy of A\$4 million, so it's a very good start. The way the cards have fallen means there's some high profile lots coming in on Tuesday, so we anticipate we can build on the good numbers already."

### NYQUIST RETURNS IN STYLE



Reddam Racing's Nyquist (Uncle Mo), named Eclipse champion juvenile after an unbeaten 2-year-old campaign last season, picked up just where he left off with a stylish 1 1/2-length victory in the GII San Vicente S. Monday at Santa Anita. Off since capping his championship campaign with a win in the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Nyquist was sent off the 2-5 favorite while facing just four rivals. The bay colt broke sharply from the rail and battled Sheikh of Sheikhs (Discreetly Mine) through fractions of :22.50 and :44.49. He took control nearing the stretch just as GIII Delta Jackpot S. winner Exaggerator (Curlin) was ranging up three wide, while stablemate Denman's Call (Northern Afleet) was sneaking through an opening along the rail. Denman's Call was first to fold and Nyquist repulsed a game Exaggerator and was well in control while cruising under the wire in a sparkling 1:20.71-third fastest in the seven-furlong race's history.

"Exaggerator is a nice horse, and for him to hold him off the way he did showed you how talented he is," said winning trainer Doug O'Neill. "There were some anxious moments when I saw the fractions, and you're better off on the outside tracking than on the inside being tracked. The post [one] wasn't an advantage at all and I think we got pushed by the bottom horse [Sheikh of Sheikhs] a little bit early. But Mario [Gutierrez] is smart. He knew what he had. I really was impressed with the gallop out. He galloped out great."

#### SUDDENBREAKINGNEWS BEST IN SOUTHWEST

Suddenbreakingnews (Mineshaft), off since finishing second in the Dec. 13 Springboard Mile S., stormed down the center of the track to record a dramatic 2 3/4-length victory in Monday's GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park. Breaking from the outside bar one in the 14-horse field, Suddenbreakingnews was taken in hand and angled to the rail at the back of the field going into the first turn. He was well back as Siding Spring (Warrior's Reward) took the field through fractions of :23.10 and :47.06. American Dubai was first to overtake the pacesetter, inheriting the lead after three-quarters in 1:12.30 as favored Collected (City Zip) was tipped out three wide for his bid in upper stretch. The favorite flattened out and Whitmore (Pleasantly Perfect) surged past American Dubai, but it was Suddenbreakingnews flying down the center of the course who soared to the lead in the final sixteenth and powered clear. Reddam added, "When we talked about it at the beginning of the year, we said we'd go to the San Vicente and the Florida Derby because we liked the timing.

"I think Doug will change his mind a couple times between now and then, because there's the temptation to stay home," Reddam continued. "We love Santa Anita. But we'll see. We just want to take it in stride. It was a good first step."


As a graduate of Fasig-Tipton's Florida sale last year, Nyquist is in line for a \$1-million bonus should he win the Florida Derby.

Nyquist's performance drew praise from connections of runner-up Exaggerator.

Let go at 4-1, Nyquist overcame a bump at the break and a wide trip to win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile by a half-length.





Campbell S. to go for graded glory in Laurel's President's Day feature, and the choice proved fruitful as the remarkably consistent gelding delivered the 16th victory of his career. Page McKenney's success also added to a win streak that has now reached four in a row.

A stalwart on the Mid-Atlantic circuit in recent years, Page

McKenney was claimed for \$16,000 by trainer Mary Eppler for co-owner Adam Staple in the summer of 2013 and has since become a millionaire with nine stakes triumphs. Second in the GIII Pimlico Special and third in the GII Charles Town Classic and GIII Cornhusker H. in 2015, he closed out the season with a pair of wins within an 11-

day span in the Richard W. Small S. here Nov. 14 and Penn National's Swatara S. Nov. 25. He was last seen capturing the 1 1/16-mile Native Dancer S. at Laurel Jan. 2.

Sent off as the second choice for this cutback to seven furlongs--the shortest distance he has navigated since March 2013--Page McKenney showed good speed from the outset and established position tracking the pace along the rail as speedy Green Gratto (Here's Zealous) reeled off a quarter-mile in :23.30. The 6-year-old was steered out to the four path turning for home and rallied past favored Majestic Affair in deep stretch to earn the narrow victory.

"He had been training great even better than before, although he wasn't able to train very much this week because of the [cold] weather," said Eppler. "He is amazing. He likes to run on any surface. In fact he set a track record on the turf. I didn't expect him to be that close today, but he wanted to run. Even if he did get beat, I would have been so proud of him for trying so hard."

Eppler added that although her trainee passed the sprint test, he will likely be pointed to the nine-furlong Harrison Johnson Memorial S. Mar. 19 en-route to races like the Charles Town Classic and Pimlico Special in the spring.

#### TEPIN EYEING START AT ROYAL ASCOT

**Tepin** (Bernstein) has been invited to compete in the G1 Queen Anne S. at the Royal Ascot meet, an invitation owner Bob Masterson is eager to accept. The invitation came after the 5-year-old mare kicked off her 2016 campaign with an easy win Saturday at Tampa Bay Downs in the GIII Endeavour S.

"We had been thinking about taking her to Ascot way back

after she won the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last year," Masterson said. "Now, they've reached out to us and asked us to come. That, alone, is quite a thrill and an honor."

The Queen Anne will be held June 14, which gives Masterson plenty

of time to make a final decision, but he said that if his mare remains in top form in the months ahead that he would "love to go."

"Sometimes in this sport you have to do the sporting thing," he said. "She might just be a once-in-a-lifetime horse and when you get a horse like that you need to take advantage of the opportunities. I think it would be a great thrill to go over there and compete in a race as prestigious as the Queen Anne."

Trainer Mark Casse said after the Endeavour that Tepin may have one more start before one of her main goals for the year, the GI Maker's Mark Mile Apr. 15 at Keeneland. The Maker's Mark is looming as her first test against males this year and her first against the boys since she won the 2015 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. The Breeders' Cup win helped Tepin wrap up an Eclipse Award as the nation's leading turf filly or mare.

The Queen Anne is also open to males and is contested at Tepin's preferred distance of one mile. The race is the first on the opening-day card of Royal Ascot. In 2015, its purse was worth roughly \$541,000.

Masterson said he has already mulled his options concerning jockeys and will stick with French native Julien Leparoux should Tepin go to Ascot.

"If her regular rider were a John Velazquez or Javier Castellano, I would definitely replace them with a European rider," he said. "But it's an entirely different story with Julien because he's European and he's very used to riding at the type of tracks they have over there, Ascot included."

Team Valor International and Gary Barber have purchased an interest in graded stakes winning sophomore Riker (Include), while the colt's breeders Carlo and Lou Tucci have retained a 25% interest. Riker opened his career with four straight victories, including wire-to-wire scores in the Colin S., Swynford S. and GIII Grey S., for trainer Nicholas Gonzalez. He suffered his first defeat when sixth behind Nyquist (Uncle Mo) after setting the pace in the Oct. 31 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Riker, who most recently worked four furlongs at Gulfstream Feb. 9 in :48.03, will be transferred to the barn of trainer Mark Casse.



#### RISEN STAR RUNNERS TUNE UP

Gun Runner (Candy Ride (Arg)) tuned up for Saturday's GII Risen Star S. with a four-furlong work at Fair Grounds Monday in :50.40. The chestnut is coming off a close-up fourth-place effort behind fellow Risen Star contender Airoforce (Colonel John) in the Nov. 28 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S.

"He's a nice horse and [exercise rider] Carlos [Rosas], as always, does a great job," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "He has a lot of talent. I thought that it was an excellent running of the Kentucky Jockey Club and while I hoped for a different result, I thought he ran very well. I feel good about his work and obviously I feel very fortunate to get to train the kinds of horses I do. Saturday is going to be a very exciting day."

Also working Monday ahead of the Risen Star was LeeAnn Ohanesian's Bistraya (Haynesfield), who went an easy five furlongs in 1:04.60 at Santa Anita.

"He's doing very well," trainer Ricky Agarie, a former assistant to Jack Van Berg, Carla Gaines and Kathy Walsh, said. "He did his last breeze today and it was a little slow, which is all right. He was just stretching his legs. He's really coming into his own. Down at Del Mar when we ran him the first time, we had a muddy track and he didn't like it. The next time I thought he was good enough, so we threw him in the [GII Best Pal] S. [where he finished fourth as a maiden], but a bug boy rode him and got intimidated by another jock. I thought he ran pretty well, but he would have been closer at the end."

Bistraya is coming off a front-running maiden victory going one mile at Santa Anita Jan. 24. "He doesn't necessarily need to be on the lead, unless we break and he can go :24 or :25," Agarie said. "I'm trying to teach him to rate, especially if we want to get him to the Derby, but I expect him to be close to the lead. We're looking for [Kentucky Derby] points."

Laoban (Uncle Mo), third as a maiden in the GIII Sham S. last time out, was scratched from the Risen Star Monday.



#### HARRY MEYERHOFF PASSES AWAY

Harry Meyerhoff, who campaigned champion Spectacular Bid, passed away last Thursday due to complications of a stroke. He was 86. Born and raised in Baltimore. Meverhoff and older brother Robert Meyerhoff were successful in residential real estate development. He began to develop his passion for racing in the early 1970s and reached the pinnacle of the sport when Spectacular Bid captured the 1979 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. Campaigned with his son Tom, Spectacular Bid was named champion at two and three and Horse of the Year at age four. Meyerhoff also campaigned stakes winners Dispersal and Sunny Sunrise.

Four days after his death, Meverhoff was provided a fitting tribute at Laurel Park when Marengo Road, campaigned with his son Tom, captured Monday's Miracle Wood S. "Racing really lost a hero," trainer Michael Trombetta said in the winner's circle. "He was a wonderful man."

Meyerhoff was pre-deceased by his wife Mary Jo, who passed away in 2013. He is survived by his brother Robert, sons Tom and Jack, daughter Karen Sweet and stepson David Williams, as well as five grandchildren and three step-grandchildren.

## PEDIGREE INSIGHTS by Andrew Caulfield



#### DEE MAJESTY ON CLASSIC TRAIL

Spring is around the corner and the sap is rising, and so too are the expectations of the Classic generation. Last week saw Classic hopefuls put to the test in the U.S., Dubai and Japan. But which of these races can be relied upon to act as a

stepping stone to Classic success?

Well, the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas has a record complicated by the fact that many of its winners have been bred in the Southern Hemisphere and are therefore ineligible for the Northern Hemisphere Classics. The last four Northern Hemisphere-bred winners--Maftool, Kinglet, Splash Point and Desert Party--didn't add significantly to their achievements subsequently. Of course that doesn't mean that last week's easy winner, Market Rally, won't go on to better things, but this son of Unbridled's Song and a Mr. Greeley mare has a pedigree far better suited to dirt than those of most of his rivals.

There is also reason to be optimistic about Destin, winner of the GIII Sam F. Davis S. After all, this son of Giant's Causeway is

the product of two Grade I-winning parents and he is a brother to Creative Cause, a Grade I winner who ran respectably in the first two legs of the Triple Crown four years ago. The Sam F. Davis S. has been won by the likes of Bluegrass Cat, Any Given

Saturday and General Quarters--all future Grade I winners--but none of the last six winners has so far risen to that level.

The GIII El Camino Real Derby has the complication that it is contested on a synthetic track and none of its recent winners has enjoyed Grade I success subsequent to their Golden Gate Fields success. Once again, though, it would be risky to dismiss the latest winner Frank Conversation. As a May 13 foal, sired by the 16.3-hand Quality Road, he has every right to continue improving--especially when he is out of a sister to two Grade I winners.

However, the trial winner with arguably the best chance of developing into a Classic winner is the Japanese colt Dee **Majesty**. The style of his victory over a mile and an eighth in the G3 Kyodo News Service Hai suggests that this son of Deep Impact is destined to shine as the distances lengthen, and so does his classy pedigree.

Further encouragement is provided by the Group 3 race's roll of honor. Last year's race saw Real Steel, another son of Deep Impact, win by a half-length from Duramente. These two went on to finish first and second, in reverse order, in the G1 Japanese 2000 Guineas (Satsuki Sho). Duramente went on to add the G1 Japanese Derby (Tokyo Yushun), while Real Impact failed by only a neck to win the G1 Japanese St Leger (Kikuka Sho).

The 2014 winner Isla Bonita went on to win the Satsuki Sho, as did the quirky 2012 winner Gold Ship. The latter, of course, developed into one of the stars of Japanese racing, with the Kikuka Sho, G1 Tenno Sho and G1 Arima Kinen among his victories. Admire Moon,

another winner of the Kyodo News Service Hai, went on to win the G1 Japan Cup and G1 Dubai Duty Free.

Dee Majesty could well develop into a contender for all three legs of the Japanese Triple Crown. His sire Deep Impact figures among the

seven colts which have succeeded in winning the Triple Crown, along with Narita Brian--a colt sired by Dee Majesty's broodmare sire, Brian's Time. This winner of the GI Florida Derby was by Roberto, which means that Dee Majesty is inbred 4 x 4 to Hail To Reason.

Brian's Time was responsible for a total of three Japanese Derby winners in Narita Brian, Sunny Brian and Tanino Gimlet. That puts him one ahead of Deep Impact, whose successes came with Deep Brillante in 2012 and Kizuna in 2013, but Deep Impact is still only 14, so should have plenty of opportunities to overtake Brian's Time. Deep Impact himself was one of six Japanese Derby winners by Sunday Silence, winner of the first two legs of the American Triple Crown. Cont. p10

There are also plenty of Classic connections to be found in connection with Dee Majesty's female line, as his third dam is none other than the blue hen Doff the Derby.

This daughter of the GI Preakness winner Master Derby was born on May 13, 1981, becoming the last foal produced by the celebrated mare Margarethen. Although Margarethen's five years on the track saw her contest 64 races, Doff the Derby never raced and was soon heading for the breeding shed. Indeed she was covered by the GII California Derby winner Jaklin Klugman at around the time of her actual second birthday in 1983. The resultant filly, Windy Triple K., became a stakes winner as a 3-year-old in 1987, by which time Doff the Derby had become part of the broodmare team at David and Diane Nagle's Barronstown Stud.

Nagle once told me--if I remember correctly--that, while on a flight, they had been browsing through a catalogue for a comparatively obscure sale when they spotted Doff the Derby. The young mare's attraction was that she was a half-sister to the top French racemare Trillion. Doff The Derby's price at the 1985 California January sale--\$82,000--proved a wonderful investment, as her progeny were to excel both on the track and in the sales ring.

Doff the Derby became one of those very rare mares with more than one Classic winner to her credit, thanks to Horse of the Year Generous (G1 Derby and G1 Irish Derby) and Imagine (G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and the G1 Epsom Oaks). Four of Doff the Derby's other progeny sold extremely well as foals, including a brother to Generous which sold for 2,500,000gns in 1997.

Dee Majesty's second dam, Shinko Hermes, ran only once in Japan, but she was a sister not only to the dual Classic winner Imagine but also to Strawberry Roan, runner-up in the Irish 1000 Guineas.

Shinko Hermes started her broodmare career in Japan, where her Sunday Silence filly Er Nova was placed at local Group 1 level, but was later based largely in Europe, as part of the Darley broodmare band. She has several useful performers to her credit, the latest being last year's tough 2-year-old Sixth Sense. Shinko Hermes' sister Imagine hit the Group 1 target as a broodmare via her Danehill colt Horatio Nelson (G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere).

Another branch of this family produced the outstanding French sprinter-miler Moonlight Cloud, who retired with six Group 1 successes to her credit. But then we have become accustomed to seeing some extraordinary fillies emerge from this family, others being Trillion, Triptych and Treve. Odeliz, another recent Group 1 winner descending from Margarethen, sold privately for 1,000,000gns at Tattersalls last December even though she is by a disappointing stallion. The same, of course, could have been said of Doff the Derby, a daughter of Master Derby.

Owner/breeder Jim Karp has been involved in horse racing for over 30 years, but the Kentucky native admitted to a few extra nerves when his homebred Patterson Cross went postward for

the first time in Sunday's 10th race at Gulfstream Park.

"It's kind of a crazy thing when you name a horse after a friend," Karp said Monday. "It's not the smartest thing in the world because you never know whether they are going to run or not."

Patterson Cross, of course, is named after Karp's long-time friend and best-selling author James Patterson.

"Alex Cross is his number one character," Karp explained.
"We're good friends and Patterson's been to see the horse at
Claiborne. Seth Hancock really thought it was crazy. The horse
was a weanling and Seth said, 'What kind of friend are you to
name a horse after a friend? It's an awful thing to do.'"

Karp had little to worry about, however, as Patterson Cross put in a more-than-credible effort, overcoming a slow start and plenty of traffic to finish a late-closing second in the nine-furlong turf race.

"You never know with [trainer] Bill Mott--he never gets up or down," Karp said. "He just kind of stays in the middle all of the time. So I had no expectations. Yesterday all this was building up and it was such a relief for me. We were riding back from Gulfstream and Patterson said, 'Were you just being negative just to keep the expectations low? You really thought the horse was going to do well. And I just laughed and said, 'No.'"

Patterson Cross is a full-brother to Newsdad and Karp said the sophomore's debut was reminiscent of that multiple graded stakes winner's early efforts.

"Newsdad, in his first race, I think he was fifth and he didn't know how to get out of the gate," Karp recalled. "He started the exact same way this horse did yesterday. He loafed along and finally got his stuff together towards the end of the race."

Karp, founder of RxCrossroads and Kaden Company, maintains a small broodmare band of two or three head and breeds specifically to race. Co-owner of 1997 GI Manhattan H. winner Ops Smile, he currently has a racing stable of some 10 horses.

"I'm from Kentucky and lived around horses my whole life," Karp explained. "I was 40 years old when I partnered with a guy and my very first horse--which is the worst thing that could have happened--he won. And Bill Mott trained. Maybe seven or eight years ago, I asked him if he would train some horses for me again. I said, 'I hope they are good enough for you.' And one of them turned out to be Newsdad."

Karp said Sunday's experience in Hallandale turned out to be a positive one.

"I rented a van and drove a bunch of my entourage down there and Patterson was there and his wife was taking all kinds of pictures," he said. "They had never been in the paddock before. So all of it was a fun experience."

Karp added laughingly, "They think that it's like that all the time--they don't realize a lot of the times you're saying, 'Can you believe our horse came in last?'"

Looking ahead, Karp said, "Patterson Cross is fine so far. We'll see what the next step will be. The horse hasn't won yet, so we have to be a little reserved."




