



FASTNET FILLY DAZZLES ON THE GOLD COAST

Book 1 of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale came to a close on Saturday with its customary evening session following the A\$10-million Magic Millions Raceday at the Gold Coast Turf Club. Just as it had all week trade remained as hot as the staggering Gold Coast temperatures, with the session headed by a A\$1.2-million daughter of Fastnet Rock (Aus) purchased by Coolmore's Tom Magnier to become the sale's fifth seven-figure lot.

At the conclusion of 3 1/2 days of trade, 649 yearlings were sold for A\$134,292,500 at a clearance rate of 87%. Last year, 592 yearlings were sold in Book 1 (from 70 fewer catalogued) for A\$115,806,000 at a clearance rate of 89%. The average climbed 5.8% to A\$195,618, while the median was up 6.7% to A\$160,000.

Redoute's Choice was the sale's leading sire by average, with 12 sold averaging A\$369,583, and he was followed by his son Snitzel (Aus), with 41 sold averaging A\$337,439. Arrowfield Stud was Book 1's leading vendor with 38 sold for A\$10,900,000. James Harron Bloodstock was leading buyer with 12 purchased for A\$4,915,000.

FINANCING BOOST FOR BRITISH RACING

The future financing of British Racing has been strengthened with the news that Tracey Crouch MP, Minister for Sport, Tourism and Heritage, has confirmed that the existing Horserace Betting Levy will be replaced with a new system that will capture all betting on the sport from April 2017. This new Levy replacement will be charged at a rate of 10% on a betting operator's gross profits on British racing and will provide a multi-million pound boost to the sport. In a tumultuous week for British racing that saw many divided opinions over the future potential closure of Kempton Park this development should receive unanimous support from horsemen. "I welcome today's announcement from Government regarding the implementation of the Levy replacement which will restore to racing a return from all betting on our sport at a fair and proportionate rate," said BHA chief executive Nick Rust. Reflecting on a busy week so far Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said, "The place was just heaving. There was that many people here--the tables were all full it was just a huge atmosphere."

"In the ring tonight the top price of \$1.2 million for a Fastnet

Rock filly closely related to Miracles of Life, it was a very good result and I wish Tom Magnier and his team the very best of luck."

Cox continued, "We are very happy, as I'd said before if we had have got somewhere near last year we would have been very happy as it was a great sale last year. But we have gone above that by quite a margin. We had more horses in Book One and our clearance rate was pretty much the same and our average has increased

and our turnover has gone up massively."

Magnier Gets A Fastnet Filly...

Barbara Banke of Stonestreet Thoroughbreds spent A\$400,000 on Dazzling Gazelle (Aus) (More Than Ready) at the Teeley dispersal at the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale in 2014, the same draft from which she purchased the mare's G1 Blue Diamond S.-winning daughter Miracles Of Life (Aus) (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) for A\$900,000. Banke bred Dazzling Gazelle to Fastnet Rock (Aus) later that year, and the resulting filly (lot 765) rewarded her investment when fetching A\$1.2-million from Coolmore's Tom Magnier on Saturday. Coolmore also consigned the September-foaled bay.

"Barbara Banke bought the mare at the sales and sent her back to Coolmore, and she's bred a fantastic beauty," said Magnier, who noted the filly was purchased for his father John Magnier and will go into training with David Hayes. "We've had a lot of success with Fastnet Rock; we've had [multiple Group 1 winner] Atlantic Jewel and we've had a lot of success with his fillies here. We just need a bit of luck now, but to be fair Barbara Banke did a great job breeding this filly, and we're hopeful for a bit of luck for the future."

Dazzling Gazelle did not produce a foal in 2016 after coming up barren to Snitzel.

Magnier also paid credit to the sale company itself, saying, "I'd just like to say that we give great credit to the Magic Millions. They get all these people down to Australia, and people come here because of what the Magic Millions put on. It's a credit to Katie [Page-Harvey] and Gerry [Harvey]. The whole world is watching this week and it's a credit to everyone at Magic Millions, Vin Cox and the whole team."

Sheikh Fahad Stocks Up On Stars...

Sheikh Fahad of Qatar Bloodstock has been in attendance at this week's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale for the first time, and through Book 1 signed for six yearlings in conjunction with Guy Mulcaster. Five of those are by first-season Zoustar

most expensive of
those acquisitions was
a filly purchased from
Widden Stud (lot 725)
for A\$550,000 on
Saturday evening. The

others were purchased for A\$510,000, A\$500,000, A\$450,000 and A\$400,000.

"We've taken the position that they're going to be good," said Mulcaster. "They're good types and we're really happy with this one. We thought she was a gorgeous filly and the one yesterday we bought, (lot 714) we're really happy with both of them."

Mulcaster said Zoustar is throwing a type.

"They're just like peas in a pod," he said. "Good, strong horses and they look like they want to do it. Their attitudes have been faultless and we're really happy with them."

The six yearlings will go into training with Chris Waller, who trained Zoustar to wins in the G1 Coolmore Stud S. and G1 Golden Rose.

Zoustar ended Book 1 as the sale's second-leading first-season sire by average, with 32 sold for an average of A\$265,156. Just edging him was Dundeel (NZ), with 10 sold for an average of A\$272,500.

'Excel' lent Results...

Darley sire Exceed and Excel (Aus) enjoyed a productive sale with 12 sold for an average of A\$335,417, good for fourth by average among sires with three or more sold through Book 1, and his Saturday evening haul was headed by lot 805, a chestnut colt from Bhima Thoroughbreds hammered down to syndicator Julian Blaxland of Blue Sky Bloodstock for A\$550,000. The pedigree page reveals some of the obvious appeal of the colt; he is out of the G1 South Australian Oaks and G1 Australasian Oaks winner Episode (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}), making him a half-brother to G1 Flight S. winner First Seal (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and G2 Tulloch S. winner Book Of Kells (Aus) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}). Invincible Filly Makes Late Appearance...

Segenhoe Stud's <u>lot 99</u>, a daughter of I Am Invincible (Aus), had been one of the more anticipated lots for the sale's opening session on Wednesday, but had been unable to take her turn in the ring after developing a foot abscess. Recuperated on Saturday, the daughter of the stakes-winning Hooness (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was the first horse put through the ring, and she got the evening off to a fast start when hammered down to Craig Rounsefell of Boomer Bloodstock for A\$540,000. Her popularity in the ring certainly couldn't have been hurt by the fact that her red-hot sire had provided the Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner just a couple hours earlier.

Flower Picks Another Snitzel...

Damion Flower of Jadeskye Racing and his partners in Chauffeur (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) earned A\$370,000 for that colt's second-place finish in Saturday's Magic Millions 2YO Classic, and a few hours later Flower was back across the street at the sales grounds reinvesting in Lot 722, a daughter of Snitzel from Yarraman Park Stud, for A\$340,000. The bay filly is the second

foal out of the stakeswinning City Of Song (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}).

Flower, who raced Snitzel and buys plenty of his progeny at the sales, paid a sale-topping A\$1.6million for Chauffeur in the same ring a year ago, and he said of the bay's fast-finishing second, "We thought his run was

terrific today. It was a win getting him into the race but just the way he finished it was exactly what we thought he'd do. Just the way his demeanour is, he's always looking for six furlongs. He's actually a miler; today, the way he finished off--we're excited." Flower also paid credit to the winner, Houtzen (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}). "The filly was really good," he said. "That filly, she jumped, she ran, she led them, and she was entitled to stop and she didn't stop. She is a very, very good filly."

Flower noted Chauffeur could target the longer juvenile races like the 1400 metre G1 Sires' Produce S. and the 1600 metre G1 Champagne S.

"I think in [trainer] Gerald [Ryan]'s eyes he's more of a Sires', Champagne-type horse," Flower said. "We'll take him home, Gerald will go over him and whether he thinks he makes it to the Slipper first or not, we'll just leave that to Gerald."

Another well-bred Snitzel featured among the top lots of the evening when <u>lot 775</u>, Kitchwin Hills's half-brother to the four-time Group 1-winning mare appearance, was hammered down to trainers Peter and Paul Snowden for A\$450,000.

Speedway Adds To Stable...

U.S.-based agent Marette Farrell traveled to Magic Millions last January and purchased a Snitzel filly for A\$320,000 for Peter Fluor and KC Weiner's Speedway Stables--the first horse for the Texas-based businessmen in Australia. The filly, now named Debonairly (Aus), gave Speedway an excellent introduction to

racing Down Under when winning on debut at Warwick Farm in December and earning 'TDN Rising Star' status for trainers Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott. Farrell returned to Magic Millions this week and picked up two more fillies for Speedway: lot 600, a More Than Ready filly out of stakes winner Absolutelyfabulous (Aus) (Langfuhr) for A\$325,000

on Friday, and <u>lot 769</u>, a Sebring (Aus) filly out of a half-sister to that sire's dual Group 2 winner Bring Me The Maid (Aus), for A\$320,000 on Saturday night.

Farrell explained that Fluor and Weiner were keen to expand their stable after Debonairly's debut win.

"They were so excited about her win; in fact, Peter said the win felt like Hard Not To Like's [GI] Diane win in Saratoga. It was an awesome feeling for them," Farrell said. She noted that buying fillies was the original business plan.

"They like to zone in on fillies because of the residual factor," she explained. "I think that's a great game plan and that's one that was set up by John Adger initially. Peter and KC are very much business people and they like to have a focus on something that will work."

Highclere Active On The Gold Coast...

Highclere, which has enjoyed success in Australia with the likes of Group 2-winning stayer Libran (Ire) (Lawman {Fr}), has been active at this week's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale, signing for a pair of fillies. The first, lot 239, is a daughter of Smart Missile (Aus) out of the Group 3-winning Miss Vandal (Aus) (Don't Say Halo {Aus}), already the dam of Group 2 winners Miss Marielle (Aus) (Encosta de Lago (Aus)) and Eurozone (Aus) (Northern Meteor {Aus}), as well as the dam of Group 1 winner Peeping (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}). Highclere Australia later acquired lot 639, an Exceed and Excel (Aus) filly out of the Grade III winner Ashley's Kitty (Tale of the Cat). The Smart Missile filly will go into training with Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott, while David Hayeses team at Lindsay Park will handle the Exceed and Excel filly.

Highclere will further bolster its Australian racing stable for the 2017 autumn carnival, with Libran to be joined by stayers Regal Monarch and Foundation, as well as 3-year-old gelding Knighthood and 2-year-old filly Pageantry (Aus).

These views were echoed by Tracey Crouch who commented, "This move will help secure the future of horseracing in Britain by making sure that gambling firms pay a fair return to support the sport. Horseracing has a strong heritage in this country, employing thousands of people and is enjoyed by many almost every day of the year. This new approach to the Horserace Betting Levy will help sustain and develop the sport."

While no doubt it is good news for racing, bookmakers were naturally unenthusiastic about the proposed change which, before implementation will be required to meet state aid approval from Europe. Speaking to The Racing Post a spokesman for Ladbrokes-Coral said they had agreed to the principle of paying on their offshore business "some time ago" but that the rate remained an issue. "On its own, people may think it looks fair but in the round, with cost escalation in the levy, shop pictures, streaming rights and advertising, the sport is in danger of pricing itself out of friends," he said.

JENNIES JEWEL RETIRED

Jennies Jewel (Ire) (Flemensfirth), hero of last years Ascot S. at Royal Ascot has been retired from racing. The 10-year-old was one of the most popular, durable and versatile racemares this decade and her victory over subsequent G3 Geelong Cup winner Qewy (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}) at Ascot last June capped a 50 race career that saw her also register wins over hurdles and fences.

Having won five times over jumps including a G3 chase at Clonmel in 2014, Jennies Jewel was a relatively late recruit to flat racing and she registered the first of her three wins on the level in a Qualifed Riders race at Galway in 2015. Kildare

trainer Jarlath Fahey produced her in fine shape for Royal Ascot and on her favoured soft ground she made all the running in the marathon event under Ronan Whelan to fend off all challengers to win by a neck. Paying tribute to his stable star Fahey said, "She was a great mare for me, she was so tough and consistent. I'm just delighted that she has retired in one piece."

The dam, who has a 2-year-old filly by Bated Breath (GB), is a sister to the operation's G1 Grand Prix de Paris, GI Arlington Million, GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic and GI Manhattan H.-winning sire Beat Hollow (GB) and a half to the GIII Tanforan H. scorer Yaralino (GB) (Caerleon). Also under the G1 Irish Oaks-winning second dam Wemyss Bight (GB) (Dancing Brave) is the MGS stayer Glaring (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}) and last year's G2 Royal Lodge S. runner-up The Anvil (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)). DAVIDOFF ON THE MOVE

French stallion **Davidoff (Ger)** (Montjeu {Ire}) will transfer From his original base at Haras de la Kammerholtz in Lorraine to Haras de Saint Arnoult at the heart of Normandy. The 13-year-old stallion has been in the headlines recently through the exploits of his Willie Mullins trained son **Saturnas (Fr)** who won the G1 Future Champions Novice Hurdle at Leopardstown over Christmas. His owners, the Van Haaren family, who had been

using him for their own mares almost exclusively since 2010 explained, "We wanted to keep this stallion in France, because he has an exceptional pedigree and breeders here are more and more looking to use already proven jump sires. On the other hand, our stud is way

too far away for most breeders, so we wanted to stand him at a stud in Normandy, at a more popular location. We are very pleased to have been able to strike a deal with the Haras de Saint Arnoult for the 2017 covering season. Larissa Kneip, the owner of the farm, was precisely looking for a jump sire to add to her existing band of stallions."

Seralia is a half to the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Shaka (GB) (Exit to Nowhere) and also Serandine (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) who is the dam of the G3 Prix d'Arenberg scorer Sorciere (Ire) (Orpen). Still to come from Sailor Moon is a yearling filly by Dabirsim (Fr) named Smart Sister (Fr). Lifetime Record: 3-2-0-1, €32,350. Video, sponsored by Fasig-Tipton.

Houtzen settled down on the front as she led Shadwell's **Madeenaty (Aus)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) around the turn, and she appeared full of run at the top of the lane. We talked about riding her differently but we thought that if we took her out of her regular pattern it might not work so we'd just let her roll and see what happens."

He added, "The Magic Millions for us is everything because it's our home town carnival and all of the guys in this horse are Gold Coasters except for a couple of outsiders."

Houtzen is the second foal out of her dam, who has a Magic Albert (Aus) yearling filly and was barren for 2016 after being bred once again to that sire.

There were four runners in the field eligible for the Racing Women's bonus, which splits A\$500,000 between the first four all female-owned runners across the line in the 2YO Classic. Taking the top bonus prize of A\$325,000 was eighth-placed Real Princess (Aus) (Real Saga {Aus}), followed by 14th Falconic (Aus) (Nicconi {Aus}) (earned A\$100,000), 15th Saxton Rock (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}) (A\$50,000) and 16th Cellargirl (Aus) (More Than Ready) (A\$25,000).

CHROME MAKES HIMSELF AT HOME IN FLORIDA

Superstar California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) attracted plenty of attention Saturday morning as he turned in his first work at Gulfstream Park in preparation for a final career start in the \$12-million GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational Jan. 28. With regular rider Dihigi Gladney up and many observers lining the rail, the champion chestnut covered five furlongs in 1:00.72 (15/46) with a six-furlong gallop-out in 1:13 1/5 (video).

"I'm really happy with that work," offered Alan Sherman, assistant trainer to his father Art. "The track was a little deep, and he covered the ground well. I couldn't be happier with him. He just goes about his business. He loves to train."

Gladney said of North America's highest-earning Thoroughbred of all time, "This horse has a lot of supporters. I looked out there before the track closed for the break and I saw the people piling in. I said, 'Look at this.' The Chrome Community is strong everywhere. They love this horse everywhere we go."

Last seen airing by 12 lengths in the Winter Challenge S. at his Los Alamitos Racecourse home base Dec. 17, California Chrome will have his final work for the Pegasus next Saturday. Later that night, it will be announced whether he or GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) was voted 2016 Horse of the Year. Arrogate is expected to take on California Chrome again in the Pegasus before the latter heads off to stud duties at Taylor Made Farm. Cont. p3

Todd Pletcher trainees **Keen Ice** (Curlin) and **Neolithic** (Harlan's Holiday) each put in their penultimate works for the Pegasus Saturday at Palm Beach Downs. The former, winner of the 2015 GI Travers S. and third behind Arrogate and California Chrome in the Breeders' Cup Classic, covered five panels in 1:00.80 (2/19) alongside GISW Greenpointcrusader (Bernardini). Neolithic, a nine-length allowance romper Dec. 14, was credited with the same time in his drill with MGSW Madefromlucky (Lookin At Lucky).

"Both of them worked very well. I was pleased with both of them. Everything seems in good order," Pletcher said. "Everything's gone according to plan. We're satisfied with the way they've been training, so hopefully they have another good two weeks."

In other Saturday Pegasus news, James McIngvale's Argentinian MG1SW **Eragon (Arg)** (Offlee Wild) put in an easy breeze in Hallandale, for which he was credited with four furlongs in :49.93 (65/99).

"I thought he worked fine," offered trainer Laura Wohlers. "He hadn't worked in a long time--since Dec. 17 in Argentina. He worked an easy seven-eighths. [Saturday] was the fastest he's gone in a month--since being stuck in quarantine. I'm happy with it and he seems to be cooling out good. He was blowing a little bit, but he caught his breath back pretty quick."

"She's just gotten so good," said Mike Smith. "They've done such a good job of getting her to relax. She's really come around. I got on her when she first got here and she was nothing like this. She was very rank and very aggressive. To see her now, it's a complete turnaround. She's so calm and cool. She went out there with a lot of confidence, a lot of class. She's doing well right now and climbing the ladder."

An Argentinian Group 1 winner at two, Vale Dori gave a good account of herself in two tries for Mike de Kock at last year's Dubai World Cup Carnival, finishing a close second in the G3 UAE Oaks and fourth beaten just 1 1/2 lengths by Lani (Tapit) in the G2 UAE Derby. Sent to this barn thereafter, she was a neck second to GSW Gloryzapper (Ghostzapper) in a Del Mar optional claimer in August before returning 28 days later to annex the Tranquility Lake S. A distant third behind champions Stellar Wind (Curlin) and Beholder (Henny Hughes) in the GI Zenyatta S. over track and trip Oct. 1, she thrashed optional claiming foes by 10 1/4 lengths Oct. 28, and was last seen taking the GII Bayakoa H. by three lengths in San Diego Dec. 3.

Hall of Famer Bob Baffert added, "They sent her to me to get a Grade I into her and have some fun with her so I'm just glad that they kept her in training. They were thinking of breeding her so this is good to have. These good fillies are hard to get. She's

improving... She's come a long way. It was tough to get a bridle on her before. She was tough. She's improving and we see it. I'm just glad she's doing well. We'll get her ready for the big guns."

Referring to superstar Songbird (Medaglia d'Oro), who Smith rides, Baffert quipped, "I wonder if Mike will stay on [Vale Dori]."

Flatlined, a two-time winner and never off the board in four prior outings on the Gulfstream sod, upended the likes of GISW Divisidero and MGSW Heart to Heart (English Channel) to score a 15-1 upset and earn his first graded win.

A romping winner of a rained-off Ellis optional claimer in July, Flatlined lit up the tote at 12-1 in the restricted Old Friends S. at Kentucky Downs in September. He settled for eighth in Laurel's GII Commonwealth Turf Cup Sept. 24, and fifth in a Keeneland allowance Oct. 15 won by GSW Coalport (Kitten's Joy). Cont. p6



Second under the Twin Spires Nov. 11, the 5-year-old was a neck second to Heart to Heart in the 7 1/2-furlong El Prado S. here Dec. 17.

Steadied from the gate along with Almanaar, Flatlined tugged

to take slightly closer order to the backstretch before checking again off heels. Hugging the fence turning for home, he sliced through horses in upper stretch, avoiding an incident behind him in which Copingaway (Brother Derek) went down. Almanaar produced a similar run inside of him and Divisidero kicked on over the top, but Flatlined sprinted hardest to get the job done narrowly. Copingaway was euthanized due to injuries sustained when he fell.

"I learned a lot off his last race and I think that is what got us into the

winner's circle today," said Joe Bravo, who piloted Flatlined for the first time in the El Prado last out. "Any time you ride a horse for the first time and they have little antics, you learn, and it got us the win today."

Hall of Fame rider Edgar Prado said of Divisidero's race, "It wasn't the greatest trip. Horses were coming in a little bit and I had to check a little bit at the beginning of the race. Then I sat at the back of the pack just biding my time. Around the turn I was

looking for a place to go and there was nothing. It was very tight. He started to make a run and I had to make a decision whether to go around, and when I turned him loose he gave me a beautiful kick. He switched leads and kept going and I thought I got it. Unfortunately, there's a lot of good horses in this race and you can't afford to lose ground."

Flatlined shares a sire with fellow Scooter Dickey trainee Flat Out, who won the 2011 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at age five while in the veteran conditioner's care.

"The Flatters just get better with age, like I had with Flat Out," Dickey said. "If they don't go wrong, they're at their best at four or five years old. I thought if he ran the race he had last time, he'd have a chance."

What do you want to win and where do you want to win it?

No stallion had more 2016 G1 horses on dirt than Bernardini.

Only Curlin and Tapit could match his total of seven – and they don't stand for \$100,000.

Tommy Macho overcame a fair bit of adversity in the run and powered home to stamp himself as a potentially important middle-distance horse in 2017 in Saturday's GIII Hal's Hope S. at Gulfstream Park.

A later-maturing 3-year-old of 2015, the interestingly bred bay finished a distant third to Frosted (Tapit) in the GII Pennsylvania Derby before rolling home to best age-restricted company in the GIII Discovery S. He defeated stablemate Stanford (Malibu Moon) in the course-and-distance GIII Fred W. Hooper S. last February and made two-starts following knee surgery--a fifth to now-retired barn companion Ancho Down (Tapit) in the GII Kelso H. Oct. 8 and a fourth in Laurel's Richard W. Small S. Nov. 19.

Favored in this 5-year-old debut, Tommy Macho raced handy enough to the pace set by Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro)'s half-brother Dolphus (Lookin at Lucky) and Bird Song down the backstretch. Chalk bettors would have been pawing the dirt midway down the back, as Luis Saez was having to keep after Tommy Macho to stay in touch, and things looked bleaker still when he either clipped heels or took a bad step of his own accord around the three-eighths and lost some momentum. But the incident served to embolden Tommy Macho, as he jumped back into the bridle, bulled his way between Bird Song and Realm in upper stretch and kicked clear while racing on his incorrect lead for most of the final two furlongs.

"I think when he felt a little bit in the middle of horses, he felt a little intimidated, and he started to back up," Saez explained. "That's why the horse on the rail stole my position and I came out and I almost clipped heels. Then I hit my horse and he started running. He came back and beat them like nothing happened."

Pedigree Notes:

From the deeper female family of 1992 GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Fraise (Strawberry Road {Aus}), Tommy Macho is out of a seven-time winning dam, whose sire--intriguingly--is a GI Breeders' Cup Classic-winning half-brother to Tommy Macho's sire, himself victorious in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile three years prior. The winner's Super Saver half-brother fetched \$70,000 as a Keeneland January short yearling 12 months ago before realizing \$225,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale last August. Starstream failed to produce a foal to Majesticperfection last year and was most recently bred back to Macho Uno.

Sandiva, the defending champion in this race, seemed to be at the mercy of her stablemate Isabella Sings's pace advantage and was 3-1 on the morning line to that one's 9-5 quote. The bettors saw it differently and correctly, however, and Sandiva earned

her first victory here since visiting the winner's circle 12 months ago.

Away alertly, Sandiva was taken in hand to sit midpack one off the fence as Isabella Sings opened up a five or six-length advantage while seemingly going very

Sandiva was joined by Sea Coast to her inside as they chipped away at the leader's margin, and kicked past Isabella Sings with little to no resistance to earn the victory.

"She's a very straightforward classy horse who improves every year," offered Castellano. "She never gets lazy. She does her own thing and enjoys herself. Todd [Pletcher] has done a phenomenal job bringing her back every single year. I liked the way she did it today. I had a perfect trip. It set up good because there was a lot of speed in the race."

Second in the GII Royal Delta S. on the local main track after her score in this event last season, Sandiva was third behind subsequent GI Just a Game S. heroine Celestine (Scat Daddy) in April's GII Honey Fox S. Ninth in the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 23, the 6-year-old was last seen checking in a close second in the South Beach S. here Dec. 17.

"She had a solid campaign and she seemed like she was just a touch off form and we knew that she loves Gulfstream," Pletcher said. "We kind of intentionally freshened her up with these races in mind."

Pedigree Notes:

Sandiva will be bred this season to last year's GI Donn H. winner and fellow Al Shaqab colorbearer Mshawish (Medaglia d'Oro). "We'll get with team Al Shaqab to see if she will have one more run or go on to be bred," Pletcher noted. She has a newly turned 2-year-old half-sister named Chilled White (Ire) (Dawn Approach {Ire}), and a yearling half-brother by Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}). She hails from the extended female family of Grade I/Group 1 winners Braiswick (GB), Sir Percy (GB), et al.




