



CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS: MARK JOHNSTON



As part of an ongoing series, the *TDN* caught up with trainer Mark Johnston to discuss some of the challenges facing the racing industry, and how they can be tackled.

What is the most pressing problem that needs to be tackled in racing, and how would you solve it?

MJ: The biggest problem facing racing in the UK remains the lack of prize-money. We differ from all other major racing nations in that we made the grave mistake of legalising bookmakers more than 50 years ago. In more recent times we had an opportunity to improve the situation significantly when picture rights became valuable to the betting industry at home and internationally but, bizarrely, the racecourses won the battle for the ownership of those rights and we now have a situation where the stadia, rather than the players, are the main beneficiaries of income from pictures.

Our BHA have made another breakthrough recently in that they have secured a new levy replacement deal which will require bookmakers, wherever they are based, to pay a percentage of their gross profits from British bets to our sport. This is expected to make a significant contribution to our prize-money, but we have a very long way to go even to allow us to compete with our near neighbours, France, let alone countries like Australia and Japan.

HEAT FORCES RANDWICK POSTPONEMENT

Saturday's meeting at Randwick Racecourse, which was to feature the return of Winx (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G2 Apollo S., has been postponed to Monday due to extreme heat in Sydney.

Racing NSW Chief Executive Peter V'landys said, "We have been in communication with the Bureau of Meteorology, who were extremely helpful with providing the most up-to-date and accurate predictions as to the likely conditions [on Saturday]. Racing NSW and the Australian Turf Club believed that animal welfare and the welfare of the participants should be the only consideration when making this decision."

ATC Chief Executive Darren Pearce added, "The ATC want to ensure that horses' preparation for the Autumn Carnival are not affected and, accordingly, the meeting will be programmed for Monday, Feb. 13."

Challenges and Solutions: Mark Johnston cont. from p1 How would you introduce a newcomer to the racing/breeding industry?

MJ: It was in Britain that horseracing earned its nickname 'The Sport of Kings' and that description is apt to this day. Those currently charged with the marketing of our sport and the task of finding newcomers are keen to shake off that image and attract a wider range of people from a much broader income band. I think they are barking up the wrong tree.

With prize-money in Britain still only returning around 25% of running costs, without factoring in the losses on capital value of the horses themselves, it remains an

extremely expensive sport. It is way beyond the means of most people and sharing the cost between a number of people doesn't make it any less expensive or make the percentage returns any better. In practice, it is the small owner with a single horse or a share that most needs a decent return. It is these owners that rapidly become disillusioned with the financial structure of the sport and it is amongst them that the churn of owners is, by far, the greatest. So, unless we see a quantum leap in prize-money (and that looks unlikely), we need more 'Kings'. Our racing and breeding

industries have been sustained for the last 30 years by foreign, mostly Arab, owners who have been willing to inject vast sums of money to keep and race the world's best bloodstock in Britain.

We need more like them and to attract them we must sustain and build on all the unique selling points--traditions, variety, quality of racing, the ownership experience, etc.--which have made British horseracing The

Sport of Kings.

SNOW APPEARS IN DUBAI

A field of 11 3-year-old colts goes forward in Saturday's G3 UAE 2000 Guineas at Meydan, with Godolphin responsible for four of those including Saeed bin Suroor's last-out Group 1 winner **Thunder Snow (Ire)** (Helmet {Aus}). The chestnut flashed his talent early last campaign, finishing second in the G2 Qatar Vintage S. and G2 At the Races Champagne S. before a creditable fourth in the G1 Dubai Dewhurst S., and he put it all together in the Oct. 30 G1 Criterium International to win by five lengths.

"He worked very well on Monday and has pleased us since arriving in Dubai," said bin Suroor. "He obviously has to prove himself on dirt and will improve for the run but should go well."

Fellow Godolphin trainer Charlie Appleby saddles the trial winner **Fly At Dawn** (Discreet Cat), and he said, "We were very pleased with his win in the trial," said Appleby. "The extra 200 metres should be in his favour and, hopefully, he is going to go very close." [cont. p5](#)

Winx, recently named the world's highest-rated mare and turf horse of 2016 by the IFHA, is set to face off against a top-class field in the Apollo, including G1 Turnbull S. winner Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}). The card also features the G2 Light Fingers S. for 3-year-old fillies, three additional Group 3s and the A\$250,000 Inglis Classic for 2-year-old graduates of the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale.

Also postponed to Monday is Grafton's Country Championships meeting originally schedule for Sunday, and Kembla Grange, also scheduled for Saturday, has been abandoned.

Also reopposing from the trial is the second-placed **Cosmo Charlie** (Stay Thirsty), a winner on debut at Meydan in December. “We were delighted with that run in the trial,” said trainer Doug Watson. “The extra 200 metres should suit him and the extra experience he gained then can only be in his favour.”

CONFRONTATION LOOKS TO DEFEND

Godolphin’s **Confrontation** (War Pass) made a big impression when winning last year’s G3 Firebreak S. on his local debut last year, and the 7-year-old gelding looks to make it back-to-back renewals on Saturday. Confrontation made just one subsequent start last season for trainer Kieran McLaughlin, finishing a well-beaten sixth in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, and he makes his first trip to the post for Saeed bin Suroor on Saturday.


“Obviously he won this race last year so conditions suit him,” said bin Suroor. “This has been his first target all year and he has been working well. That said, I do think he will improve for this first run since March.”

Mike de Kock saddles **Lindo Amor (Arg)** (Dynamix), who was third on his local debut over this trip in the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge R1 on Jan. 5, but dropped back to seventh over 1900 metres in Round 2 on Feb. 2. Satish Seemar sends out two runners, including the progressive **North America (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the winner of his last three starts over this course and distance.

DUBAI ONE STEP CLOSER FOR DEBT

Hammered down into \$8 (3-5) favoritism for his 2017 debut, reigning Singapore Horse of the Year **Debt Collector (NZ)** (Thorn Park {Aus}) picked up right where he left off with a spectacular 1 1/4-length success in a Kranji ‘A’ event over 1400 metres Friday night.

Making his first trip to the races since a narrow success in the Oct. 30 Raffles Cup (1800m) that took his overall winning streak to seven, the 4-year-old bounced away alertly from the gates, but took himself back, as is his custom, and trailed as they hit the turn. He began to improve his position and was maneuvered to the outside of his rivals about three furlongs from home and had nothing but clear sailing entering the straight. Shaken up by his regular rider Michael Rodd nearing the furlong marker, he accelerated sharply and raced over the top for a cosy tally ([video](#)). [cont. p6](#)

“That was his softest win yet, but again, he is the type who is more switched on at the business end,” said Rodd. “He obviously would like to have more ground, but he’s got that amazing turn of foot he can sustain for a long time. He was switched off and running very relaxed in the first 1000m, but once I slapped him up, he switched on and got into second gear. I could really feel him coming back underneath me. It’s just amazing how he does

that. As he tracked up so nicely, I let him creep up closer and his turn of foot was just exceptional in the end, though he did pull up on me close home.”

Friday’s test was the first of a two-race preparation in Singapore for Debt Collector, who is penciled in for a start in the US\$6-million G1 Dubai Turf should he perform up to expectations. He is tentatively scheduled to have his final local appearance in a 1600m heat Mar. 3.

“Dubai is still a long way to go. He will now run in a mile race in three weeks’ time,” said trainer Cliff Brown, who paid NZ\$130,000 for Debt Collector at the 2014 NZB Ready to Run Sale. “He’s a lovely horse and it’s great to see him win first-up. It’s a big team effort from all the boys at the stable, including the syce who really takes good care of him.”

Royal Delta (Empire Maker--Delta Princess, by A.P. Indy), a three-time Eclipse Award winner and twice victorious in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, has died in Ireland from foaling complications, as first reported by *The Paulick Report*. Her Galileo (Ire) foal survived.

Bred in Kentucky by Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments NV, Royal Delta became a **'TDN Rising Star'** in a single appearance at two for trainer Bill Mott and won the Alabama S. and her first Breeders' Cup ([video](#)) in 2011 en route to the Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old filly. Four days after her victory at Churchill Downs, Royal Delta became the focus of an epic bidding duel between Frank Stronach and Besilu Stables' Benjamin Leon at the Keeneland November sale. Leon ultimately emerged victorious on a final bid of a sales-topping \$8.5 million ([sales ring footage](#)).

She trained on at age four while still under Mott's tutelage and won the GI Beldame S. ([video](#)) and her second Ladies' Classic ([video](#)) and was named that year's champion older mare. The lanky dark bay romped by better than 10 lengths in the GI Delaware H. ([video](#)) and added the GI Personal Ensign S. ([video](#)) in 2013 before falling short in her three-peat attempt in the Ladies' Classic. With a third straight Eclipse in hand, she was retired with 12 wins from 22 starts and earnings of \$4,811,126.

Mott paid homage to Royal Delta Friday.

MCCRAKEN BEGINS DERBY TRAIL AT TAMPA

Whitham Thoroughbreds' **'TDN Rising Star'** McCracken (Ghostzapper) capped a perfect three-for-three juvenile campaign with a score in the Nov. 26 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs, and the bay returned to the worktab less than three weeks later at trainer Ian Wilkes' winter base at Palm Meadows Training Center. McCracken has trained steadily over the past two months and kicks off his road to the GI Kentucky Derby in Saturday's GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay Downs. The Davis is a newly minted Derby qualifying points race, with the winner receiving 10 points towards a spot in the starting gate. With that in mind, Wilkes said he hopes to use the race as a stepping stone towards his ultimate goal.


"As long as we get a good race and are moving forward, that's the important thing," Wilkes said in an interview with the Tampa Bay Downs media team. **Cont. p4**

“It’s a bit premature, it’s unfortunate,” he lamented. “It’s very special whenever you have a horse like that to basically head the

stable. She was a three-time champion at three, four and five, and was always that special horse that everyone had to look forward when they go into work in the morning. She gave us a lot of thrills in the afternoon. It is a lot of responsibility to look after one like her, but of course she left us quite gratified

when it was all over.

“Tough. She was very tough,” Mott added when asked what Royal Delta was like to be around. “She was very forward in her training and she had a very special presence about her around the barn. You could just sense that she was the queen. There are just horses that have that look and she had that look and that presence. It really didn’t take a trained eye to see that there was something a bit different about her. I’m sure she isn’t the only one that has ever given off that vibe, but she sure had it.”

Besilu Stables also owns and raced Royal Delta’s ‘TDN Rising Star’ half-sister Crown Queen (Smart Strike), a \$1.6-million purchase as a weanling from the 2011 Keeneland November sale and winner of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup. Crown Queen is due to Empire Maker in 2017.

According to *The Paulick Report*, Royal Delta was sent to Ireland to be bred to Galileo in 2014, but did not get in foal. She was able to conceive the next season, but ultimately aborted. Royal Delta was mated to Galileo again in 2016.

Stablemate Tapwrit (Tapit) was acquired for \$1.2 million by the partnership of Bridlewood Farm, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Robert La Penta as a FTSAUG yearling, and took a step toward delivering on his potential with a win in the off-the-turf Pulpit S. Dec. 10 at Gulfstream. Although the colt completed the mile over a sloppy strip in a time three-fifths of a second slower than Fact Finding that day, both Pletcher trainees were awarded a Beyer Speed Figure of 78. Unlike Fact Finding, Tapwrit brings prior two-turn experience to the Davis, having annexed a one-mile maiden heat at Gulfstream Park West in November.

The presence of locally based Chance of Luck (Skipshot) and Breeders' Futurity third-place finisher Wild Shot (Trappe Shot) should ensure an honest pace in the race. The latter was last seen putting away his pace rivals and holding on to check in a good second behind McCracken in the Kentucky Jockey Club, while the former adds blinkers after notching a win in Tampa's six-panel Inaugural S. Dec. 3 prior to a runner-up effort in the seven-furlong Pasco S. Jan. 21. Six Gun Salute (Colonel John) was a non-threatening fifth in the Pasco and stretches back out to a route of ground for trainer Eoin Harty.

The Mark Casse stable will be represented by a pair of Ontario-breds in recent Mucho Macho Man S. runner-up State of Honor

(To Honor and Serve) and two-time stakes winner King and His Court (Court Vision), who will make his first start over conventional dirt Saturday.

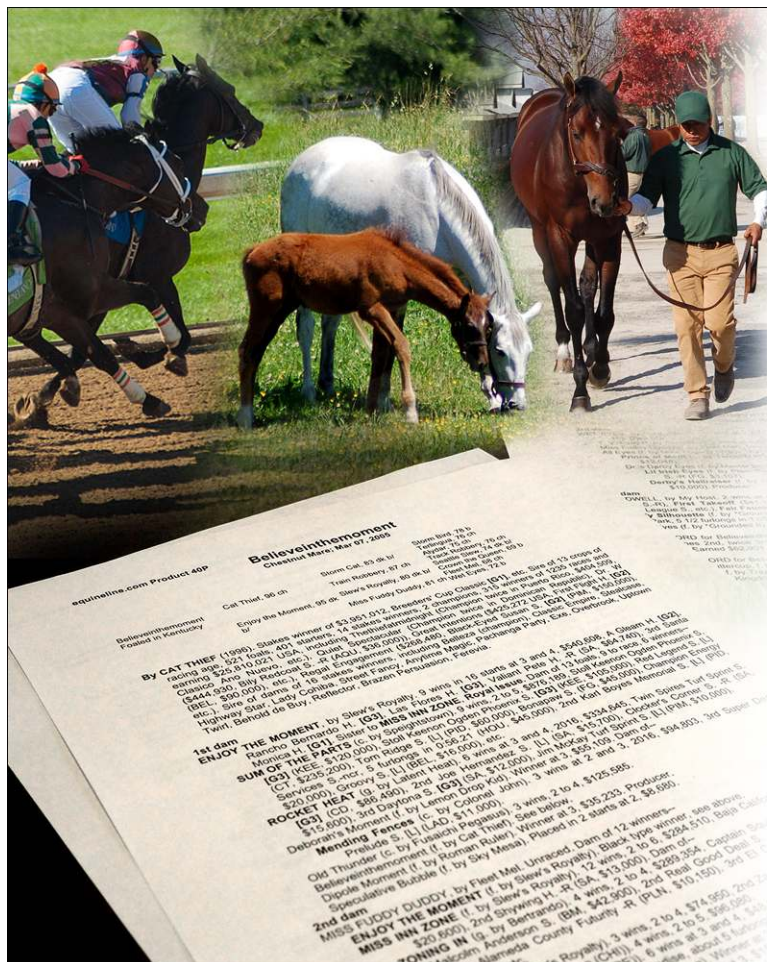
BROWN BRINGING TWO FOR GP TURF

Leading the way is Paul Pompa and J Stables’ **Tommy Macho** (Macho Uno), a recent much-the-best winner of the trip-and-track GIII Hal’s Hope S. Jan. 14 after stumbling in traffic on the turn. A three-time graded stakes winner, the 5-year-old will be joined in the starting gate by fellow Todd Pletcher trainee **Zulu** (Bernardini), who returned from an eight-month layoff to annex the restricted seven-panel Tamarac S. in Hallandale Dec. 18.

The 2016 GII Fountain of Youth S. runner-up has worked on a weekly interval following that effort and seeks his first graded stakes success for the Coolmore partners.

Glencrest Farm and JSM Equine’s **Blofeld** (Quality Road) exits the Pletcher barn and makes his first start for trainer Rusty

Arnold returning from a July layoff. The gray captured this race in 2016, but went off form in three subsequent appearances before being sent to the sidelines.

The pace in the race will likely come from the outside of

the starting gate, with Gelfenstein Farm’s GIII Pat Day Mile S. hero **Sharp Azteca** (Freud) and Jacks or Better Farm’s **Awesome Banner** (Awesome of Course)--second and fifth, respectively, in the Dec. 26 GI

Malibu S.--seeking to cross over and establish early position. Sharp Azteca is a perfect three-for-three at Saturday’s one-turn mile trip and has posted a series of swift workouts over the sometimes fickle Gulfstream Park West strip for trainer Jorge Navarro in recent weeks.

Odds-on favorites giveth, and odds-on favorites taketh away. **Classic Empire** was a bad third at 2-5 in the Holy Bull, but hopefully he has a good excuse. Bob Lewis: thankful to score some points in this dreadful race with runner-up **Irap**. \$1,000 "wagered", -51% ROI. **Bankroll: \$490. Cont. p8**

GIII Sam F. Davis S. - The Sam F. Davis was supposed to be my coming out party about how clever I could be. Sure I picked heavy chalk last week, but I was holding a trump card. I knew McCracken was waiting as a bet against this week. Unfortunately, now it just looks like I'm "reaching" after going down in flames at 2-5 last week, but I'm going to stick with the plan even if Classic Empire didn't.

Yes, McCracken can win this race, but my feeling on him is he's a better Kentucky Derby prospect than he is a Sam F. Davis threat as the favorite. He'll start the race from the outside and he'll start his run from far back, and neither of those things are ideal going 1 1/16 miles at Tampa Bay Downs. **Fact Finding** is the play off his field-best 101 Brisnet Speed Rating as well as being the only horse with a triple digit late pace rating while also being able to run a 90+ early pace rating. He's ideally drawn to sit behind the pace and get first run on main threats No Dozing and McCracken. **Selection: #3 Fact Finding (9-2).**

DiDonato: Last Week - **Irish War Cry** broke out in a big way in the Holy Bull. Do I still get to take credit if I said he wanted to come from off the pace and he ended up going gate to wire? The scratch of **Fact Finding** kind of changed the complexion, in fairness... **Royal Mo** also got the job done on the front end in a riveting renewal of the Bob Lewis... **J Boys Echo** ran an ok third in the Withers. Can't win them all, but more importantly, just glad to guarantee that I won't be losing them all. Come and catch me, guys. **Bankroll: \$1160.**

GIII Sam F. Davis S. - **McCracken** is really good--he definitely deserves to be towards the top of Derby lists at this point and I'm a big fan. But he certainly doesn't need to win Saturday and, coming from someone who decided to play Tampa seriously this meet, it's pretty tough to predict how a horse might perform on that main track unless you've got a tide chart, ouija board and tomorrow's *TDN* handy. **No Dozing** has the benefit of works over the strip for a trainer in Arnaud Delacour who does very well here. He was impressive in his first two outings, and endured a very wide trip when fourth behind **Classic Empire** in the GI Breeders' Futurity in October. Wide again when second to '**TDN Rising Star**' **Mo Town** in the GII Remsen last time, he earned a Thoro-Graph number for that race that is significantly faster than anything the expected favorite has run so far. **Selection: #9 No Dozing (4-1).**

Sherack: Last Week - Couldn't have been more disappointed with my Withers pick **Fillet of Sole**, who I was very high on and never fired at 10-1, but nice to get on the board with the very well-supported **Royal Mo** in the Bob Lewis. After the late scratch of **Fact Finding**, decided to play it safe and take **Classic Empire** in the Holy Bull. That, apparently, did not work out too well for me. **Bankroll: \$590.**

GIII Sam F. Davis S. - McCracken certainly seemed like the real deal last season and I was also very impressed with the races that **No Dozing** ran in defeat in his last two. While I'll be keeping a close eye on those two going forward this spring, I'll stick with my Holy Bull pick from last weekend here, the unbeaten **Fact Finding**, who should enjoy a nice tactical advantage over that aforementioned pair while negotiating two turns for the first time. Pletcher continues to send out nothing but live 3-year-olds this winter in Florida and he has done very well in the Derby preps at Tampa in recent years, including a 2016 Sam F. Davis-Tampa Bay Derby double with **Destin**. **Selection #3 Fact Finding (9-2).**

“There’s a little bit of a trick with him in that if you want him to breeze fast, you put a pair of blinkers on him,” Summers said.

“The transformation of him in the afternoons came with the addition of blinkers, and it’s the same when he works in them. He’s not going to work next week, so this will be his last work going into the race and because of that today, we wanted to put a little more speed in him and get something out of it.”

Summers said the timing of the Gulfstream Park Sprint is such that it would allow him and his partners to decide if they wished to bring Mind Your Biscuits to Dubai to run in the \$2-million G1 Golden Shaheen Mar. 25.

“As far as pointing to the Gulfstream race it’s just the perfect spot to start our season,” Summers said. “We’ll use this race as a stepping-stone to our next stop, either Dubai or the [G] Carter [S.]. Dubai is one of those things where it’s an event. We’ve never been afraid of the moment and we will never be. We look at something like that as it could be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.”

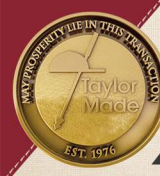

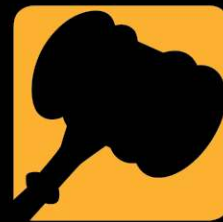
