



SIZING JOHN A GOLDEN FIRST FOR HARRINGTON

There was much pre-race publicity about Lizzie Kelly becoming only the second female to ride in the G1 Timico Cheltenham Gold Cup, but today's headlines will all hail another leading lady of the turf, Jessica Harrington, whose first runner in the race, Sizing John (GB) (Midnight Legend {GB}), posted a faultless display of jumping to snare the coveted cup for Ireland.

After Kelly's dreams were dashed at the second fence when the edgy **Tea For Two (GB)** (Kayf Tara {GB}) blundered at the rear of the pack, those still standing were taken along by Colin Tizzard's proven stayer **Native River (Ire)** (Indian River {Fr}), who vied for the lead for much of the race with the free-running **Champagne West (Ire)** (Westerner {GB}). As the latter dropped away and **Djakadam (Fr)** (Saint Des Saints {Fr}) challenged Native River at the head of affairs, Sizing John--who had been kept buried away on the rail by jockey Robbie Power--crept up to stalk the leading duo with the tempo quickening down the hill from three out. A mighty leap from the eventual winner at the second-last effectively sealed his fate, and the 7-year-old quickly went three lengths up on his pursuers, staying on strongly to give owners Alan and Ann Potts a longed-for success in steeplechasing's blue riband.

RECORD EIGHT-FIGURE HORSE TOPS HK INTERNATIONAL SALE by Alan Carasso

The annual Hong Kong International Sale is truly one of a kind, as it brings together 3-year-olds bred and sold in both hemispheres to be offered exclusively to members of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. On paper, the 2017 renewal of the auction, held under the lights in the parade ring at Sha Tin Racecourse Friday evening, would have plenty to do to compare with the previous get-together, which produced an HK\$8.5-million topper and a true contender for this Sunday's Hong Kong Derby in the form of Pakistan Star (Ger) (Shamardal). Only time will tell if the racetrack results match the sales sheets, but records tumbled Friday evening when a striking son of the late Hussonet eclipsed the eight-figure barrier when selling for HK\$10.5 million (£1,095,462/US\$1,352,222). The average of HK\$4.51 million was 7.8% ahead of last year's figure, while the median price jumped by 20%.

"We are very pleased with tonight's results which clearly exhibited the enthusiasm of our owners and their recognition of the quality bloodstock sourced by the Club from the world's top sales," commented Anthony Kelly, Executive Director of Racing Business and Operations for the HKJC.

With two late withdrawals, a total of 29 ready-to-run horses went under Tattersalls' auctioneer John O'Kelly's hammer, and it was at the sale's midpoint that things really took flight. Lot 16, whose sire had previously supplied G1 Hong Kong Mile winner Glorious Days (Aus) and Group 1 victor Contentment (Aus), was purchased by Mark Richards's team for A\$160,000 at the 2015 Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale just over two years ago. The October-foaled bay is a son of South Africa's champion stayer Almah (SAf) (Al Mufti), already the dam of GSW & G1SP Sensible Lover (Aus) (Good Journey) and a half-sister to South African GSW and Dubai GSP Zambucca (SAf) (Lundy's Liability {Brz}). The winning bidder was Peter Lau, chairman and CEO of International Housewares Retail Company Ltd. The hammer price bettered the previous record of HK\$9 million set by a son of Fastnet Rock (Aus) in March 2012. *Cont. p6*

The Jonjo O'Neill-trained Minella Rocco came from off the pace to deliver a withering late run, snatching second on the line from the tiring Native River, while Djakadam was less than a length back in fourth.

"This is quite unbelievable," exclaimed former three-day eventer Harrington, the most successful female trainer in the history of the Cheltenham Festival, whose previous stable stars include Champion Hurdle winner Jezki (Ire) (Milan {GB}) and Champion Chaser Moscow Flyer (Ire) (Moscow Society). "I've never had a runner in the race and I don't know when I'll come down to earth. This is the jewel in the crown--the race I've listened to and watched all my life."


"Sizing John has gone from two miles at Christmas to winning over three miles and two furlongs here," she continued. "He jumped like a buck and it is his jumping that has got him there the whole way. He was amazing. It's thanks to Robert really--he's the one who said at Christmas, 'he will stay."

Power, who has only recently fought his way back from a serious injury to his eye socket, joined an elite band of jockeys to have won both the Grand National and the Cheltenham Gold Cup. He said, "This is even more special as I was only 25 when I won the National and I'm 35 now. When you're 25 you think you're going to win everything but I don't quite think like that these days."

Power added, "The one thing about Sizing John is you can rely on his jumping. Every jockey dreams of winning the Gold Cup but at this stage of your life you don't think it's going to happen. But I had a lot of confidence in this horse. Since the first day I rode him behind Douvan, I felt that all he did was stay. I went to plenty of Cheltenham preview nights and people were saying it was a bad Gold Cup--I was kind off insulted because every good Gold Cup winner has Grade 1 form over two miles. He had it over two miles behind Douvan and he has that bit of speed."

Douvan (Fr) (Walk In The Park {Ire}), who has been found to have a stress fracture to his pelvis following a below-par run in Wednesday's G1 Queen Mother Champion Chase, has indeed been something of a nemesis for Sizing John, who has finished placed behind him on seven occasions, including being runner-up in last year's G1 Racing Post Arkle Trophy at the Festival when trained by Henry de Bromhead.

The Gold Cup was the second Cheltenham winner this week for the Harrington-Power-Potts team after the regally-bred Supasundae (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) won Wednesday's G3 Coral Cup.



But it wasn't the end of the run of success for trainer and jockey, who also won the final race of the Festival, the G3 Johnny Henderson Grand Annual Challenge Cup, with **Rock The World (Ire)** (Orpen).

While Djakadam couldn't quite secure a dream ending to the week for Willie Mullins in the showcase race, the trainer did continue his momentum with a final-day double courtesy of **Arctic Fire (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) in the G3 Randox Health County Hurdle and **Penhill (GB)** (Mount Nelson {GB}) in the G1 Albert Bartlett Novices' Hurdle. This time around it wasn't Ruby Walsh in the saddle, with Mullins's superb second jockey Paul Townend enjoying deserved success in consecutive races.

Despite his late charge, Mullins couldn't hold off Gordon Elliott in the race to be leading trainer at the Festival. Elliott fired in **Champagne Classic (Ire)** (Stowaway {GB}) to win the Martin Pipe Conditional Jockeys' Handicap Hurdle--the race named after his mentor and the former champion jumps trainer. In so doing, he claimed his sixth winner of the week to tie with Mullins but he won the title on countback to placed runners. Champagne Classic was described rather gracelessly by Michael O'Leary as "the worst horse I own," but he will have a special place in the heart of young jockey JJ Slevin, a cousin of Joseph O'Brien, who secured his first Festival winner.

CHAMPIONS COMBINE IN TRIUMPH HURDLE

G1 JCB Triumph Hurdle winner **Defi Du Seuil (Fr)** (Voix Du Nord {Fr}) may have been ridden to victory by champion jockey Richard Johnson, but the 4-year-old was also co-bred by a champion jockey, the French Flat champion Pierre-Charles Boudot, in partnership with his mother Catherine and sister Marie-Gabrielle.

"I was a passenger all the way," declared Johnson, who sealed the sole win of the week for west country trainer Philip Hobbs in the colours of JP McManus. Hobbs was brought to tears by the victory and added, "It's a relief. He's been favourite all year and it's great when it goes right. He's such a fantastic horse. He has always jumped well--there have been one or two little hiccups, but overall his jumping is mustard."

Three French-bred horses filled the podium for Britain's top juvenile hurdle contest, with AQPS Defi Du Seuil winning by five lengths from the Niarchos Family's **Mega Fortune (Fr)** (Soldier of Fortune {Ire}) and Maurice Rohaut-Leger's **Bapaume (Fr)** (Turtle Bowl {Ire}).

The winner was bred in Burgundy by Catherine Boudot, whose late husband, the Lyon-based trainer Marc Boudot, died in 2008. Their son, France's reigning champion jockey Pierre-Charles, couldn't make it to Cheltenham as he was too busy riding a winner at Fontainebleau only seconds before Defi Du Seuil struck at Cheltenham. *Cont. p4*

Catherine Boudot was a first-time Festival visitor and was overwhelmed by the atmosphere. "It is great to be here today. I wasn't too worried about the result because we have had such a good day anyway but Defi made it look easy," she said. "His family traces back to my late husband's parents' bloodlines. Le Seuil is the place where we breed our horses, like Catamaran du Seuil (Fr), who is also running today and is an uncle to Defi."

Boudot added, "We sold Defi to the Papot family just after he was weaned and they raced him before he was exported to Britain. Taquin du Seuil (Fr), who was second in the Coral Cup on Wednesday, was bred by Marc. He was a great fan of his sire Voix du Nord. We kept on sending mares to him after Marc's passing, and that's how Defi came along."

TRAINERS CLEARED OF COBALT CHARGES

Australian trainers Mark Kavanagh and Danny O'Brien have won in their appeals to be cleared of charges relating to cobalt positives. A Victorian tribunal ruled on Friday that Racing Victoria did not follow standard testing protocols in the cases, and that the trainers were unaware their veterinarian had administered the cobalt.

Last January, O'Brien was handed a four-year ban and Kavanagh a three-year ban after runners under their care-four trained by O'Brien and one by Kavanagh-returned levels of cobalt above the legal limit while racing in 2014. Both trainers had used veterinarian Dr. Tom Brennan, and the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal ruled that Kavanagh and O'Brien-who have continued to train during their ongoing casewere unaware the vet had administered the cobalt through a pre-race drip, and that they were not at fault for Brennan's actions. Brennan was banned last year for his involvement.

Kavanagh and O'Brien are two of a string of Victorian-based trainers that have been involved in cobalt charges over the last two years. A year ago champion trainer Peter Moody was banned six months for unintentional administration of cobalt to a horse in his care, and walked away from training altogether. The father and son training team of Lee and Shannon Hope were banned three and five years, respectively, for cobalt charges in 2015.

Kavanagh was critical of Racing Victoria after being cleared, telling radio station RSN 927, "This has been ridiculous the amount of time it's taken and it's just unfortunate that RVL [Racing Victoria] had to play the game they did. While we were standing up there being called liars and drug cheats the whole time, it was actually the RVL integrity board who were lying and cheating and using testing outside of the requirements. They have defamed us and ruined our businesses--it's as easy as that."

Kavanagh's son, former Sydney-based trainer Sam Kavanagh, was banned nine years and three months in late 2015 for cobalt and other drug-related charges. He too dealt with Brennan.

O'Brien told *Racing.com*, "To stand here today 26 months later [after initial investigations] and have Justice Garde affirm that [they had done nothing wrong], he's been very clear that neither Mark or I had any intention of cheating or to try to break any rules of racing, and that we are completely innocent of all charges. And he has also thrown a light on the behaviour of Racing Victoria, the breaches of the rules that they in fact have engineered throughout this process, and that's probably been the most disappointing thing. The bullying and vilification of both Mark and I and our families by [chief steward] Terry Bailey and his integrity department has been quite incredible."

Giles Thompson is serving as acting Chief Executive Officer of RV after David Moodie stood down in December for providing Peter Moody information on investigations, and Thompson told Racing.com, "Throughout this issue, our fundamental concern has been to take appropriate steps to protect the integrity of Victorian Thoroughbred racing and to protect the welfare of horses. Where the rules of racing are breached, it is our job to take the appropriate action to enforce the rules. It is important to remember that we took action because the horses involved returned cobalt readings that were excessively above the legal threshold that was set to protect both the integrity of the sport and the welfare of the horses."

SOLID TRADE AT INGLIS MARCH SALE

Inglis's March Thoroughbred Sale of mixed offerings at Oaklands in Melbourne enjoyed solid trade on Friday, with increases in both average and median. The number offered and sold was down on last year (142 of 156 offered sold compared to 172 of 185 last year), meaning the gross dipped slightly to A\$1,254,350, and the buyback rate was a healthy 9% (it was 7% last year). The average climbed 14.4% to A\$8,833, while the median was up 66.7% to A\$5,000.

The top-priced lot of the day was the 3-year-old gelding Barjeel (Aus) (Foxwedge {Aus}) (lot 153), a dual winner. He was bought by Tasmania's Fairlands Thoroughbred Breeding and Racing for A\$58,000. Yu Long Investments was the sale's leading buyer, with 17 lots purchased.

Inglis's Victorian Bloodstock Manager Simon Vivian said, "As always, I would like to thank both the vendors and the purchasers for their support of the sale. It was a pleasing and enjoyable sale."

Holy Roman Emperor (Ire) has for years been the leading sire with his Hong Kong-based gallopers, including the likes of Designs On Rome (Ire), Rich Tapestry (Ire) and Beauty Only (Ire) to name but a few. With that in mind, it was little surprise that lot 24, a French-bred son of Lapland (Fr) (Linamix (Fr)) would be one of the most coveted lots when knocked down to Liu Yu Wen for HK\$9 million. Wen also signed the ticket on Jing Jing Win (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}), the aforementioned HK\$8.5-million topper from last year's sale. An €55,000 purchase as a weanling out of the 2014 Argana December Sale, the Feb. 24 foal was scooped up by the HKJC for €200,000 at the 2015 Goffs Orby Sale.

The outstanding dual-hemisphere sire More Than Ready, who will be represented by 2016 G1 Queensland Derby winner Eagle Way (Aus) in the Hong Kong edition this weekend, supplied the day's joint-third top-priced offering when lot 7 was sold to Brian Leung for HK\$7.5 million. The Sept. 1 foal was an A\$450,000 Inglis Easter yearling graduate. Lot 21, hailing from the penultimate crop of Street Cry (Ire), matched the price tag for lot 7 when hammering to fashion designer Wong Ling Ling.

Hailing from the family of G1SW and G1 Golden Slipper runner-up Snitzerland (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}), the bay was another of the half-dozen purchases by the HKJC at the 2015 Easter sale.

Added Kelly: "The Hong Kong International Sale has continued its growth as an elegant event for our Owners. This is a unique setting for a thoroughbred sale and the exciting journey of ownership begins anew tonight. Last year's International Sale produced a BMW Hong Kong Derby runner in Pakistan Star, who has already made a profit in a racing career spanning just nine months and represents the promise of any purchaser anywhere. 'DRAGON' BREATHING FIRE INTO HONG KONG DERBY by Alan Carasso

It is the one race any number of Hong Kong owners want to win, even more so than the International Races. Accordingly, Sunday's BMW Hong Kong Derby carries prize money of HK\$18 million, making it more valuable than the GI Kentucky Derby, for example, and a far cry from the HK\$30,000 owners were playing for at the beginning of the 'professional' era in Hong Kong in the early 1970s. Because all horses are exported into the region, the Derby is restricted to 4-year-olds from either hemisphere; all carry 126 pounds, despite the fact that runners bred in Australia and New Zealand, have--in theory--a maturity advantage.

The former Gai Waterhouse-trained **Rapper Dragon (Aus)** (Street Boss) will start in the vicinity of even-money for Sunday's featured event over the 2000 metres, having won the Hong Kong Classic Mile and the Hong Kong Classic Cup (1800m) in decisive fashion. The chestnut, rated some 14 points clear of his closest rivals and as many as 29 better than the bottom-rated runner, drew gate four and will take all the beating. *Cont. p8*

Trainer John Moore realizes these races are not run on paper, but remains sufficiently bullish on the chances of Rapper Dragon, one of six in the race aiming to give the Aussie his third win in four years and sixth overall. Joao Moreira has the call in search of his first win in the Derby.

"To win all three legs of the series is very hard, we've seen horses go close before but they have come up short in the Derby, but there is something about this horse," Moore told the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Andrew Hawkins. "It is a different race, because they have the short run to the first turn, but he should be able to lay up and he should be able to steal enough of a break on his main rivals."

'TDN Rising Star' Pakistan Star (Ger) (Shamardal) caught the imagination of fans all over the world with a pair of sensational victories to begin his career, and while he's visited the winner's enclosure just once in six subsequent tries, he hit the line hard when runner-up in the Classic Cup last time and the stretch out to 10 furlongs should hit him right between the eyes. His dropout, run-on style mitigates his draw in gate 13, as does the fact that four of the last six winners of the Derby have won the race from 10 or higher, including a pair from stall 14.

Though Rapper Dragon and Pakistan Star should really dominate the market, neither is bulletproof and this year's Derby field has a depth of quality not seen in some time. The following is more a roadmap and less an exercise in handicapping, so as to familiarize our readers with each of the Derby entrants without investing a lot of effort. The BMW Hong Kong Derby is carded as race eight on a 10-race program Sunday at Sha Tin and jumps at 4:35 p.m. local time (4:35 a.m. ET/9:35 a.m. BST).

OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS IN WILD REBEL

Due to its large purse and the increasing popularity of the Arkansas 3-year-old prep schedule, the Grade II, \$900,000 Rebel S. was bound to be a race with significant impact for the GI Kentucky Derby. A rash of recent injuries and poor performances by highly regarded colts, however, has left a much murkier hierarchy in the division, and a fascinating group of 11 sophomores will contest the 1 1/16 miles of the Rebel, each looking for a definitive breakout performance in a crop suddenly littered with question marks.

The race's headliner and morning line favorite is **American Anthem** (Bodemeister). Owned by the partnership of WinStar Farm, S F Bloodstock and China Horse Club, the \$435,000 OBS March buy won at first asking Dec. 3 at Del Mar, beating a field that included four return winners, including GII San Vicente S. victor Iliad (Ghostzapper) and California Derby hero So Conflated (Eskendereya). He followed that with a narrow, game second to the more seasoned Grade I winner Gormley (Malibu Moon) in the sloppy GIII Sham S. Jan. 7 at Santa Anita. Ranked third in the most recent WinStar TDN Derby Top Twelve, American Anthem is trained by Bob Baffert, who has won a record six of the past seven renewals of the Rebel.

'DORI' VS. 'CITY' IN SANTA MARGARITA

Vale Dori (Arg) (Asiatic Boy {Arg}), a victress of three consecutive Grade II events, will go for her first top-level score in the Grade I Santa Margarita S. at Santa Anita. Standing in her way is Finest City (City Zip), champion female sprinter of 2016, who stretches out to nine furlongs on dirt for the first time in her career. The two 5-year-old mares will line up side-by-side in the starting gate and are likely to eyeball each other several more times before the result is decided.

Owned by Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum and trained by Bob Baffert, Vale Dori was a Group 1 winner in her native Argentina in 2015 before running second in the G2 UAE Oaks and fourth against males in the G2 UAE Derby last term. The bay has won five of seven starts since coming Stateside in the summer, but finished a distant third behind champions Stellar Wind (Curlin) and Beholder (Henny Hughes) in the GI Zenyatta S., her lone U.S. Grade I try, Oct. 1. She has reeled off comfortable scores in the GII Bayakoa H., GII La Canada S. and GII Santa Maria S. so far this winter. **Cont. p5**



Actually, that's caused him to pick up a lot of added pressure. We're excited about him and he's trained really well for this race. Hopefully, he'll run well. But, we still need racing luck. I hope when we turn for home, he's there."

American Anthem shows a string of strong workouts for this first engagement in 10 weeks, capped off by a six-furlong bullet in 1:11 3/5 (1/15) Mar. 11 at Santa Anita.

A pair of fleet-footed 'TDN Rising Stars' inject plenty of early

speed, creating the potential for a pace meltdown should they go after each other. Malagacy (Shackleford) was a no-brainer Rising Star call after blowing away the competition in a 15-length debut rout Jan. 4 at Gulfstream. "Malagacy is a surprisingly nice horse and it's nice to have those," Pletcher assistant Adele Bellinger said. "He's always done everything right, but that first race was a 'wow' race. He hasn't gone that far yet, but he hasn't showed any desire to slow down. I think this will be a very telling race. We're excited about him."

Malagacy likely will have to grapple with Harry Rosenblum and Bob LaPenta's **Uncontested** (Tiz Wonderful), who backed up his **Rising Star** nod with a blowout victory in the local Smarty Jones S. Jan. 16. The dark bay, trained by Wayne Catalano, will look to rebound after finishing a disappointing sixth as the 11-10 favorite in the GIII Southwest S. Feb. 20.

Jerry and Ann Moss's **Royal Mo** (Uncle Mo) will try to compensate for a letdown performance from stablemate Gormley, who finished a distant fourth in the GII San Felipe S. last Saturday. The bay, sitting 11th in the *Derby Twelve*, captured his stakes debut with a 3 1/2-length tally in the GIII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 4 at Santa Anita.

Late runners **Lookin At Lee** (Lookin At Lucky) and **Silver Dust** (Tapit), third and fourth in the Southwest, respectively, would benefit if the expected fast pace materializes.

Michael Langford's <u>Rising Star</u> Untrapped (Trappe Shot) makes his local debut after running second in both the GIII Lecomte S. and GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds.

GII Rebel S. - Only one race this week, and I really like Malagacy to keep the good times rolling in Hot Springs for trainer Todd Pletcher. Sure, Baffert has won this race three times in a row and six of the last seven years, and American Anthem merits respect, but between his 2-1 morning line (versus Malagacy's 4-1), and Gormley's dud last week, there's enough here for me to prefer the up-and-comer here for a trainer who's already shipped in this type and won a graded stakes at the meeting, and I think Malagacy is even better meant here than One Liner. Selection: #6 Malagacy (4-1).

DiDonato: Last Week - Iliad picked each of us up some place money, but he was simply no match for the brilliant Mastery in the San Felipe. Very unfortunate what happened to the latter... I'm not sure exactly how much it mattered, but Beasley never saved an inch of ground in the Tampa Bay Derby. According to Trakus, he went an extra 30 ft. (approx. 3 1/2 lengths) more than the winner; 44 ft. more than State of Honor (5+ lengths); and 40 ft. more than Wild Shot (about 4 3/4 lengths). Bankroll: \$1330.

GII Rebel S. - Out-of-town invaders Malagacy and American Anthem are each undeniably talented and borderline brilliant, but when you put them together on the track with the very speedy future graded stakes-winning sprinter Uncontested and front-running Bob Lewis hero Royal Mo, a meltdown seems all but imminent. Silver Dust feels like the right closer--I thought he ran a better race in the Southwest than Lookin at Lee, though that one seems to have a bit of a fan club. Silver Dust never really never got a clear run in the stretch last time while stuck down inside, but he galloped out very strongly. The well-bred, but somewhat immature colt might improve from that learning experience and a more outside post, and could be sitting on a breakout performance at a nice price. Selection: #8 Silver Dust (15-1).

Sherack: Last Week - Wild Shot (Tampa Bay Derby) and Iliad (San Felipe) both ran solid races in defeat while hitting the board, but it wasn't enough to keep me in the lead... Swinging for the fences this week. Bankroll: \$1480.

GII Rebel S. - There's every chance that I still may be a bit sleep deprived after a hectic week in Ocala, but I like a major longshot here. The maiden of eight starts **Sonneteer** has been on my watch list for quite some time now after making several flashy moves over speed-favoring surfaces in Southern California.

The stretch-running son of Midnight Lute finally ships out of town and will get more than enough pace to close into in this ambitious spot. This wouldn't be the first time that trainer Keith Desormeaux has pulled off a huge upset in a race like this either. Selection: #3 Sonneteer (30-1).

El Areeb worked in the company of Winter (Awesome Again), a recent dual stakes winner who makes her next start in the GII Top Flight Invitational H. at Aqueduct Apr. 3.

Former TOC President Van de Kamp Dies:

John Van de Kamp, who served as the president and general counsel for the Thoroughbred Owners of California from 1996 through 2004, passed away at his Pasadena home Mar. 14 following a brief illness. He was 81 years old.

A graduate of Stanford Law School in his early 20s, Van de Kamp served in the military briefly before being appointed an assistant U.S. attorney. The top prosecutor in Los Angeles County, Van de Kamp was ultimately appointed the Attorney General for California in the 1980s.

As the second president of

the TOC, Van de Kamp was known for his strong leadership and helped give the horse owner a bigger voice in the California Thoroughbred industry.

"I learned early in my tenure that if industry progress was to be accomplished, nearly every element of the industry had to be on board," said Van de Kamp upon his retirement. "When divided, we would fall short."

In the late 90s he was instrumental in obtaining license fee and tax relief that meant an additional \$20 million a year in purses to owners; and in 2004 he successfully worked for the passage of AB 701, which provided workers' compensation relief. *Cont. p4*

He strengthened funding for the organization by obtaining an increase from 1% to 1-1/2% of purse revenues for TOC and CTT. Also during his tenure, he oversaw the implementation of the Cal-bred Bonus Program and expansion of simulcast wagering. He also served as a member of the NTRA board.

"I was privileged to work with John during his years on the NTRA board," said TOC President and CEO, Greg Avioli. "He was a brilliant lawyer and always a strong advocate for horsemen. He was well known for his integrity, honesty, and professionalism. Our industry has lost a great man."

Van de Kamp is survived by his wife, Andrea, and daughter, Diana. Funeral services are scheduled for Thursday, Mar. 30 at 3 p.m. at St. Andrew's Catholic Church, Pasadena.

Ryan Book Award Finalists Announced:

Six finalists were announced Friday for the Dr. Tony Ryan Book Award, a competition which attracted a near-record number of entries in 2016.

Since its founding in 2006 by Dr. Ryan, the award has annually recognized the best in book-length race writing published during



the previous year. Past honorees have included globally known writers and journalists, including a National Book Award recipient, multiple Eclipse Award winners, and a Pulitzer Prize nominee. The \$10,000 winner's check remains one of the most lucrative literary awards offered anywhere, equal to that of the Pulitzer for Literature and National Book Award. The two runner-up

finalists for the Dr. Ryan Award each receive \$1,000, while all three top authors take home Tipperary Crystal replicas of the farm's iconic tower.

The Longshot Horse, the Great War, and the Making of an American Hero", by Eliza McGraw; "The Kentucky Derby", by Bill Doolittle; "Mr. Darley's Arabian: High Life, Low Life, Sporting Life", by Christopher McGrath; and "Old and New Friends" by Barbara Livingston.
