



TWO-TIME CHAMPION TEPIN RETIRED

Tepin (Bernstein--Life Happened, by Stravinsky), a graded winner on the dirt at two who went on to thrash the boys in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and became the first American-based winner of the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot, has been retired from racing, owner Robert Masterson told the *TDN* Tuesday.

"Tepin is being retired. There is nothing physically wrong with her. She just isn't interested in running any more," Masterson told the *TDN*. "There are no plans to breed her this year. It's too late, and we've not made any decision on her future."

Bred in Kentucky by Machmer Hall, Tepin was a \$140,000 purchase by Masterson out of the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale and broke her maiden at second asking over the Keeneland Polytrack before closing nicely to win the GIII Delta Downs Princess S. in November 2013. Switched to the grass midway during her sophomore season, Tepin was runner-up in the GII San Clemente H., but blossomed at four, leading throughout to annex the GII Distaff Turf Mile S. on the 2015 Kentucky Derby undercard before rallying from slightly off the pace for a maiden Grade I victory in the Just a Game S. on Belmont S. day (video). The bay endured tough-luck losses in the GI Diana S. and in the GII Ballston Spa S., but relished easy ground when romping home by seven against her peers in Keeneland's GI First Lady S. (video) before a 2 1/4-length tally in the Breeders' Cup Mile (video). Cont. p3

'MO MONEY' TO WAIT FOR PREAKNESS

Conquest Mo Money (Uncle Mo), the GI Arkansas Derby and GIII Sunland Derby runner-up who would have had to be supplemented for \$200,000 in order to run in the GI Kentucky Derby May 6, will instead wait for the GI Preakness S. two weeks later May 20, announced owners Tom and Sandy McKenna at a press conference held at Sunland Park Tuesday afternoon. "This was one of the hardest decisions I've ever made in my life, and I've made lots of them," Tom McKenna said. "I made the choice based on what I think is best for the horse. That's the only reason we're here today. I do the same thing if it's a \$5,000 claimer or a million-dollar stakes horse--we haven't had many of those, this is the first one. We believe the best choice for Conquest Mo Money is the Preakness, and that's what we're going to do." Cont. p4

Tepin Retired cont.

Tepin picked up in 2016 where she left off, with soft wins in the GIII Endeavour S. and GII Hillsborough S. at Tampa, a barnstorming five-length tour-de-force in the GI Jenny Wiley S. (video) and a successful defense of her title in the Distaff Turf Mile. Having overcome all challenges on these shores, connections readied Tepin for a start in the Queen Anne, the first race of the Royal Ascot meeting. Never far from the front over ground on the heavy side of soft, she surged to the lead in the final 100 yards and had a half-length on Belardo (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) at the wire (video).

Originally penciled in for a return to action in last year's Ballston Spa, Tepin ultimately missed that engagement and was instead trained up to the GI Woodbine Mile, where she called on all her class to prevail by a half-length

(video). Not quite able to reel in loose-on-the-lead Photo Call (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in defense of the First Lady, Tepin settled for second there and concluded her career with a gallant and toughtrip second behind Tourist (Tiznow) when in search of a second Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita last November (video).

With an eye on a return trip to the United Kingdom this spring, Tepin returned to training in early 2017, but was ruled out of this year's Endeavour in February after a minor colic attack, also dashing any plans of an appearance in the G1 Dubai Turf in late

March. Tepin refused to break off into a work at Palm Meadows Mar. 27 and was subsequently relocated to Churchill Downs, but after mulling over their options since, the decision was made to retire the mare.

"After she refused to work at Palm Meadows, she was moved to Churchill to see if a change of venue would improve her attitude towards racing, and she basically has no interest in it any more," Masterson explained. "She was always an enthusiastic worker, and enthusiastic in the mornings and about racing, and she is not any more.

> "It's time to let her retire. She's done so much for us. She's done everything she can possibly do. I think she's been one of the greatest turf mares that has ever been. She doesn't owe us anything. It's all about the horse. She owes us nothing, and if that's what she

wants to do, that's what we're going to let her do. I appreciate all the fan support she's had over the last few years, the joy she brought to people, her way of running and the successes that she's had."

Trained throughout her career by Mark Casse, Tepin retires with a record of 23-13-5-1 and earnings of \$4,437,918. --Additional reporting by Sue Finley

The McKennas, who race as Judge Lanier Racing, must still make a \$150,000 payment in order for Conquest Mo Money to start in the Preakness. They paid \$8,500 for the New York-bred colt as part of the Conquest Stables dispersal at last year's Keeneland November sale. The Miguel Hernandez trainee, who annexed Sunland's Riley Allison S. and Mine That Bird Derby in January and February, respectively, has earned \$508,900 to date.

Added Sandy McKenna, "We've raced him very cautiously, and he's always performed very well. To put him on this trail where it's three weeks to the Derby, [two] weeks to the Preakness and three weeks to the [GI] Belmont S. is asking a lot of any horse ... Even though it would be wonderful to say, 'I've been to the Derby,' it's just a lot more logical to take this horse and go to the Preakness."

With the defection of Conquest Mo Money, **Cloud Computing** (Maclean's Music) now has a starting spot in the Derby. Should his connections also decide to skip the race, **Untrapped** (Trappe Shot) will get in.

TRAINING TIME

The preps are done, and as of today we're 2 1/2 weeks out from one of the most open-looking editions of the GI Kentucky Derby in recent years. The win by **Classic Empire** (Pioneerof the Nile) in last Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby makes him one

of three (more or less) joint favorites as of now (with apologies to T.D. Thornton's excellent review yesterday, click here), along with GI Xpressbet Florida Derby winner Always Dreaming, from Bodemeister's first crop, and GII Wood Memorial winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Irish War Cry, by Curlin.

One striking thing about this year's race is the dominance of Florida form among the contenders. Four of the last five winners were trained in California, but this year the Florida form looks best going in, with probably the top five in the betting having wintered in Florida and having run there at least once. The British bookmakers love novelty bets, like who will be the favorite in the 40-runner Grand National, and this year they could just about create a market for who will go off Derby favorite. There are quite a few probable runners who could be classified as 'live longshots', which we'll get to in a minute, but first let's look at the likely top six betting choices as of now.

The year 2000 was the last time the Wood Memorial winner (Fusaichi Pegasus) went on to win the Kentucky Derby, whereas the Florida Derby has produced five winners since then, including Nyquist (Uncle Mo) last year and Orb (Malibu Moon) in 2013. That statistic would suggest that Always Dreaming should edge Derby favoritism over Wood winner Irish War Cry and Classic Empire, winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile (has produced Derby winners Street Sense 2007 and Nyquist 2016) and Arkansas Derby (Derby winners Smarty Jones and American Pharoah have won it since 2000). With 2 1/2 weeks to go, but no prep races left, the two factors which could still affect the betting are the dreaded injuries and how horses are reported as training in Louisville, especially the last 10 days before the Derby. Three-year-olds improve in the spring and sometimes one or two horses will just thrive at Churchill and train 'lights out'; that can, and probably should, affect the odds. But for now:


Always Dreaming (Bodemeister): Won the best prep, the Florida Derby, decisively. Beyer Speed Figure: 97. Predicted Odds: 5-1.

Classic Empire (Pioneerof the Nile): Won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (Beyer 102), then rebounded from his well-documented troubled winter to score decisively in the Arkansas Derby last Saturday, time 1:48.9, but came back only a Beyer 94. Predicted Odds: 6-1, but if he looks great on the track he could get hot on the tote too.

Irish War Cry (Curlin): Ran the best last-race major prep Beyer (101) in the Wood. Showed he didn't have to have the lead, which will be a big plus. Predicted odds: 13-2 (6.5-1).

McCraken (Ghostzapper): The unbeaten Derby favorite until running third in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S., but, as has been widely mentioned, including by us, trainer Ian Wilkes's mentor, Carl Nafzger, won the Derby with Street Sense after losing the Blue Grass. The 'TDN Rising Star''s best Beyer is a 93 in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. Predicted odds: 10-1.

Gunnevera (Dialed In): Second in the GII Lambholm South Holy Bull S., he won the GII Xpressbet Fountain of Youth S. (Beyer 97), and was a closing third in the Florida Derby. Very significantly, Javier Castellano sticks with him over GII Rebel S. winner, Arkansas Derby close fifth and 'TDN Rising Star' Malagacy (Shackleford). Besides Castellano, this colt has the advantages of plenty of seasoning and ran in the Florida Derby like he would get that 10th furlong no problem; but he was taking a long time to get there. Predicted odds: 10-1. Cont. p6

Girvin (Tale of Ekati): He merits respect as the winner of both the GII Risen Star S. and the GII Louisiana Derby, though his best winning Beyer going two turns is a 93. Predicted odds: 12-1.

What makes this such an intriguing Derby is there are a number of other colts who aren't very far behind the top six, which means there could be some massive exotics payoffs with horses you look at afterwards and say, yeah, that could have happened: GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Gormley** (Malibu Moon), who ran a 93 Beyer winning the GIII Sham S., but ran only an 88 Beyer in winning the Santa Anita Derby; Blue Grass winner **Irap** (Tiznow), Beyer 93; GIII Sunland Derby winner **Hence** (Street Boss), whose winning Beyer was upgraded to 97 after GI Preakness S. bound Conquest Mo Money (Uncle Mo) ran second in the Arkansas Derby; **State of Honor** (To Honor and Serve), who placed in all three Florida Classic preps (Beyer 91); **Practical Joke** (Into Mischief), who's run second in both the Fountain of Youth and Blue Grass (Beyer 92); and Santa Anita Derby runner-up **Battle of Midway** (Smart Strike) (Beyer 87).

That's another six, discounting Conquest Mo Money, whose connections opted to pay \$150,000 to supplement to the Preakness instead of \$200,000 for the Derby. Throw in Blue Grass also-rans **Tapwrit** (Tapit) and 'Rising Star' J Boys Echo (Mineshaft); as many as three more Pletcher possibles in Rebel winner and Arkansas Derby (close) fifth Malagacy, Wood Memorial second and fellow 'Rising Star' Battalion Runner (Unbridled's Song), and Louisiana Derby bridesmaid Patch (Union Rags); possibly Royal Mo (Uncle Mo) and Iliad (Ghostzapper) out of the Santa Anita Derby; and two or three others I haven't mentioned, and you'll understand why I am going to be seriously looking for angles in the previous couple of races so I can hit the 'All' button in the Derby.

Nothing is more important to second-crop sires than Classic form, and naturally horses which have been winning Classic preps are putting their sires at the top of the second-crop lists. In the year-to-date North American list, Malagacy's win in the \$900,000 Rebel shot Darby Dan's **Shackleford** to the top of the list (click here), and he maintains a lead of nearly \$300,000 over WinStar's **Bodemeister** (sire of Always Dreaming), with Darby Dan's other \$15,000 second-crop sire, Dialed In (sire of Gunnevera), third by 2017 progeny earnings. Lane's End's Union Rags has moved up to fourth now--the top four all with 2017 earnings over \$1 million--and though Louisiana Derby runner-up Patch is his only possible Derby colt, Paradise Woods became his third Grade I-winning filly a couple of weeks ago in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and could give him a big boost in the earnings race if she contests the May 5 GI Kentucky Oaks. Besides those, Gainesway's **To Honor And Serve** is the only other second-crop sire to have a 'live Derby longshot' in State of Honor.

In Other News...

There was a lot of it last weekend, too. Here are a few highlights. French sires: Haras de Colleville's Kendargent had his first decent-sized crop, after early successes, in 2013. Mme. Fabre bred to him that year and the resulting colt, Soleil Marin, who is therefore from Kendargent's sixth crop, won his fourth in a row, and his first in Godolphin colors, when upstaging my former G1 Epsom Derby fancy, Akihiro, in Monday's G3 Prix Noailles at Chantilly. The significance: this was 2100m (10 1/2 furlongs), establishing that, now given the chance, Kendargent is more than just a sire of precocious sprinters and milers. On the same card, the Le Havre team's Haras de la Cauviniere's Rajsaman, a/k/a 'The Last Linamix', had the winner of the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, an important prep for next month's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains--French 2000 Guineas in Brametot (click here to read Andrew Caulfield on Rajsaman yesterday). Third in the race was Spotify, from the first French crop by champion Australian sire **Redoute's Choice**, when he stood at the Aga Khan's Haras de Bonneval. It takes a little working out, but he has had eight winners from that crop this year, also including Goldikova's half-sister, the G3 Prix Vanteaux winner, Gold Luck. His crop's 2017 progeny earnings would rank him ninth among European second-crop sires if he were included on that list, which is headed by Darley's **Helmet**, sire of G2 UAE Derby winner Thunder Snow, and Juddmonte's **Frankel**.

Attention knockers of War Front: did you notice his new 4-year-old Grade I winner at Keeneland last Friday, American Patriot in the GI Maker's Mark Mile? Pedigree Alert: most impressive winner of the whole weekend might have been last year's G2 Queen Mary and G1 Prix Morny winner Lady Aurelia in the 5 1/2-furlong Giant's Causeway S., against older fillies and mares on the Keeneland turf. She did not break on top and didn't have the cleanest trip, but once Velazquez got her wound up and pointed in the right direction, she shot by those fillies like they were standing still. She will be a huge player for Stonestreet and partners and trainer Wesley Ward in the G1 King's Stand at Royal Ascot. As you know, she is by the late great Scat Daddy and is inbred 4x3 to Storm Cat, as she is out of a Forest Wildcat mare. Also by Scat Daddy and inbred 4x3 to Storm Cat: Melody's Spirit, the dam of Whitmore, who is by Pleasantly Perfect and placed in the GIII Southwest, GII Rebel, and GI Arkansas Derby last year, but is now unbeaten in five starts at six furlongs after cruising in the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. on the Arkansas Derby undercard. FIVE SHARE FASTEST FURLONG AT OBS

Five juveniles shared the fastest furlong time of :9 4/5 and a pair of youngsters shared the bullet quarter-mile time of :20 4/5 during second session of the under-tack show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's April Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Tuesday in central Florida.

The :9 4/5 time, which equaled the standard set by a Wildcat Heir filly Monday, was turned in by colts by City Zip (hip 211) and Jimmy Creed (hip 259), as well as by fillies by Curlin (hip 216), Munnings (hip 345) and Friesan Fire (hip 375).

Julie Davies consigns and is co-owner of hip 259, a colt from the first crop of multiple Grade I winner Jimmy Creed. The chestnut is out of stakes winner Chitka (Jade Hunter).

"He has been a pleasure to train from day one," Davies said of the colt. "He has just taken everything in stride and every time he breezed, he did it with ease and he showed us more and more potential."

Of the youngster's :9 4/5 work, Davies added, "I knew he had the ability to do it, it was just a question of the stars aligning and it happening on the day. And it did."

Davies and Sarah Sharp purchased the colt for \$33,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October Yearling Sale.

"I liked him the first time I saw him," Davies said. "Sarah and I liked him physically and we thought he could jump through all the hoops at a 2-year-old sale. He just looked the part."

A native of England, Davies has been consigning under her own name for the last five years. She came to Ocala by way of south Florida, where she served as an assistant trainer at Calder Racecourse.

"I started out just working the sales," Davies recalled. "I had some horses of my own and I was selling them with other people and I thought, 'Why don't I just give this a try by myself?'"

Of the decision to go out on her own, Davies admitted, "It's stressful, but days like today make it all worth it."

Davies, who sold a Gemologist colt (hip 171) for \$300,000 after a :9 4/5 work at last year's March sale, has primarily consigned at OBS, but she will be making her debut at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale with two offerings next month.

Blue River Bloodstock, which sent out a colt by Wildcat Heir to work the under-tack show's fastest quarter of :20 2/5 Monday, was represented by the co-fastest quarter-mile time Tuesday when hip 234, a filly from the first crop of multiple graded stakes winner Prospective, covered the distance in :20 4/5.

A colt from the first crop of Grade I winner Violence (hip 377) also worked in :20 4/5 Tuesday. The juvenile, consigned by Top Line Sales, is out of the unraced Dying to Dance (Street Cry {Ire}). Cont. p8

"We don't fully prep them or hammer down on them, so needless to say that :20 4/5 was not expected," admitted Top Line's Torie Gladwell. "We knew he would work well, but we didn't know he'd work that well. And he galloped out huge. He has a big stride and he covers a lot of ground. He did it easy."

Of the decision to work the colt a quarter-mile, Gladwell

added, "If we worked him an eighth, we thought he might go:10 flat or 10 1/5, but we knew he would put in a good effort to go a quarter. He is super fit. The horse has never worn a

bandage, never had a day off. He is just a good, balanced, fit horse."

The bay colt was a \$33,000 purchase at last year's Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale and Top Line sells on behalf of a pinhooking partnership.

"We sell a couple of horses for these guys every year and we take a little piece of the horse," Gladwell explained.

In addition to the five horses who worked furlongs in :9 4/5 Tuesday, 13 horses shared the second-fastest time of :10 flat.

Top Line sent out seven horses to work Tuesday and Gladwell felt the track has been consistent throughout the first two sessions of the six-day breeze show.

"I think there were a couple more :9 4/5 and 10 flats today and it's probably just a difference in horses," Gladwell said. "Yesterday, for us in particular, we only had two and both of them breezed just like we thought they would and today we knew we had some faster horses. We had a great tack show [Tuesday]--we started with a :10 1/5 and we ended with a :10 1/5, so we can't complain."

She added, "There were a lot more :9 4/5s in March, but when this track heats up when the weather gets hot, it gets a little slower, so I think that's why we're seeing a little slower times this week."

Gladwell is looking for a deeper buying bench at next week's April sale.

"The middle market at the March sale was a little slack, so I am hoping there will be a lot more middle-market buyers here and if there are, which I expect there will be, it will be a good sale," she said.

The under-tack show for the April sale continues through Saturday with sessions beginning daily at 8 a.m. The auction will be held next Tuesday through Friday.

The bay 'TDN Rising Star' clicked off splits of :12.60, :24.60 and :36.40 before galloping out five furlongs in 1:00 flat and three-quarters in 1:13.40. The move was McCraken's first major activity since finishing third as the favorite in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 8 at Keeneland, his first career defeat.

"He felt great," Hernandez said after the breeze. "Once he was a little settled going to the pole, he worked great. His gallop-out was very nice and he's right back home at Churchill where he likes it."

McCraken captured Churchill's Street Sense S. and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. as a juvenile and started his 3-year-old campaign with a score in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. Feb. 11 at Tampa before his Blue Grass setback. Trainer Ian Wilkes, who plans to work his colt two more times before Derby day, was pleased with Tuesday's spin.

"The main thing is I wanted to see him finish, but finish without riding himself while doing it," Wilkes offered. "I got everything I wanted to see today."

Sue Finley and her staff are giving our industry an amazing gift with the magazine *TDN Weekend*.

When I look back on 40-plus years in this industry, there is a lot of heart-pounding excitement from racehorses, but it is the people, sights, sounds and tastes that remind me how wonderful it is to experience Thoroughbred life around the world.

TDN Weekend is a rich, elegant celebration of what draws people into racing and breeding at the highest level.

No major sport is more closely allied to luxury goods and services than Thoroughbred racing. According to Bain & Company, luxury is a \$1 trillion market. But, the makers of luxury goods are not major sponsors of racing. Why?

In my career I've handled international media rights for equine events and sought advertisers and sponsors for a racing show Tom Hammond and I had on ESPN. When you have to sell this sport, you learn the truth. Racing targets men who gamble, however, the primary consumers of luxury goods are women.

Perhaps it is time for our sport and the makers of luxury goods to take a fresh look at how they can partner for a bright new future together.

Every sport has a bellwether event establishing the maximum viewership of that sport in each country. In the U.S., the Super Bowl is the top football event; the Masters the top golf event; the NBA Finals the top basketball event, etc. Only the Super Bowl consistently beats The Kentucky Derby in viewership.

NBC, producer of The Kentucky Derby, is not interested in several thousand racing veterans who want hard-boot information about the race and odds. NBC is focused on improving the telecast beyond the 16 million viewers its sponsors pay to reach. By the way, the fashion segments they added now deliver an audience that is 51% female.

In a recent interview, Craig Bandoroff of Denali Stud lamented how wealthy girls get into riding and minor horse sports, but as they grow up, they don't get into racing. Maybe the reason is most racing telecasts do not connect with them, and importantly, racing does not connect with their peers.

This is not about everyday racing. This is about the opportunity to use our major racing events to add a new revenue stream into the sport.

If the objective is to provide racing entry into the \$1 trillion market for luxury goods and services, it cannot be faked. It has to be real and authentic, designed for the consumers of luxury goods and services.

In the telecasts of major racing events, instead of the producer saying, "We're here to boost gambling," the producer should say, "We're here to boost this event." That means the telecast is to capture everything we enjoy at major racing events. If NBC can capture the look and feel of a Derby Day experience, everyone wins: the sponsors, the industry, Churchill Downs and the little girls Craig wants to grow up liking our sport.

Maybe, just maybe, we should realize women are central to the future of this sport.

Luxury is an enormous market and it is fiercely competitive. Last year, it was stagnant and perhaps that provides an opening for the brands to find new ideas to gain market share.

If Chanel, Hermes, or Louis Vuitton wanted to reach an international audience of luxury goods consumers, what sport would best deliver such an audience? Football? Soccer? Hardly. No international sport targets women, however, a new brand of international racing can fill that void.

Luxury goods are international. They need an international sport that is designed to appeal to the consumers of their products. They need a sport with the natural, universal attraction of horses.

Today people gamble on every sport, but the major sports do not talk about gambling on their telecasts, where sponsors are paying billions of dollars to be associated with them. Technology today provides the gambler instant access that is separate from the telecasts. That might provide the way to make a new international program a reality.

Every attempt at an international racing series has failed because the racing authorities in each country cannot agree on wagering splits. With more revenue in media rights and sponsorship than wagering, a partnership with luxury goods can grow and develop the image of racing around the world. It will raise all boats. **Cont. p10**

A new, non-gambling brand of international racing that is focused on the sport, fashion and lifestyle of the Thoroughbred industry just might provide entry into China, a country that prohibits gambling and is the leading consumer of luxury goods. What would that be worth to our industry?

Luxury goods also need for Thoroughbred racing to reestablish itself as a real sport. Hermes was founded on craftsmanship in saddlery and their brand would benefit greatly when racing has new relevance and credibility with future generations.

Longines is one luxury goods company that is making a push by sponsoring racing around the world and it has a monthly show on CNN International called The Winning Post, with Ally Vance. Like TDN Weekend, it is a welcome, elegant presentation about horseracing around the globe.

While a Thoroughbred lifestyle show is good, it lacks the heart-pounding excitement and the mass media power that only live, major sporting events deliver. It's the difference between an audience of thousands and one of many millions.

The Kentucky Derby, Melbourne Cup, Epsom Derby, Japan Cup and The Arc are bellwether events. If you total up the major racing events in each country, the total viewership would be exceeded only by soccer.

Bringing sponsors into international racing means the telecasts will need to be produced on a level their consumers expect in sports like soccer. New revenue can drive state-of- the-art production, with new techniques that capture racing in ways we never imagined. The better our racing events look, the more sponsors will want to be associated with them.

Every business calculates return on investment in advertising and promotion. Finding a good fit is difficult these days because of social media, online sales and the fragmentation of media. Sports are very efficient for many sponsors, but not personal luxury goods. Thoroughbred racing can provide a new partnership with brands of luxury goods and services that no other sport can deliver.

The racing product that luxury goods makers need does not exist today. It must be designed. How would it be different in content from current racing telecast? Can we bring a new look of elegance and style to racing telecasts that women, men and sponsors will embrace?

What do women want to change about racing telecasts? I've commissioned extensive consumer research on racing in the U.S. and some of it is reflected in this piece. But before designing a new international racing program that is focused on the consumers of luxury goods, we need to ask the sponsors and representative groups of those consumers.

The major stakeholders in international racing and breeding make up a very short list of individuals. Like the top brands in luxury goods, they are fiercely competitive. They have always taken whatever the racing authorities have offered in purses from gambling, but now they should consider how the future of racing should be expanded far beyond the single revenue stream of gambling. There are already signs of innovation.

Arrogate has now won more than \$17 million and little of that money came from gambling. Thanks to The Stronach Group and Sheikh Mohammed, innovative means were found to fund the races he won. Belinda Stronach just announced the 2018 Pegasus Cup purse would blossom to \$16 million.

There can be a new brand in international racing that celebrates the excitement of the sport and the lifestyle of Thoroughbred racing.

TDN Weekend provides us a taste of how international racing can attract a new economic model and provide the families in this industry an unbelievably bright future.

CLASSIC EMPIRE, LA CORONEL TOP OXLEYS' GOLDEN WEEKEND by T.D. Thornton

"Inside the Winner's Circle, Presented by Keeneland" is a new series showcasing graduates of the Keeneland September sale that have gone on to achieve success on racing's biggest stages.

Owner John C. Oxley and his wife, Debby, celebrated two important graded stakes wins this past week that have them looking ahead to the future. But they were also recognized for past accomplishments at Keeneland Race Course, as the Apr. 13 score by La Coronel (Colonel John) in the GIII Appalachian S. earned the couple a Keeneland Tray for eight lifetime graded stakes wins at the Lexington track.

There was also a Keeneland connection to **Classic Empire** (Pioneerof the Nile)'s win in the

GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 15 [video], as the juvenile champion sold for \$475,000 at the association's September 2015 yearling sale [click for video].

La Coronel Dominates in Appalachian...

La Coronel was bottled up behind fillies at the top of the stretch in the Appalachian before punching through assertively and extending her stride to win by 3 1/4 empathic lengths.

"She's just really a wonderful filly," Oxley said via phone Monday. "She has a tremendous turn of foot. So being in traffic and behind horses wasn't so much of a problem so long as she can find a seam to run through. She just really opened up when she was clear, and she won rather easily."

Oxley said he and trainer Mark Casse are keeping open minds about the filly's next start.

"We're looking seriously at racing against the boys, against 3-year-old colts on [GI Kentucky] Derby weekend [in the GII American Turf S.]," Oxley said. "That's under consideration. It

might be a stretch, but we're looking at all options. I might say further that we've been invited to Royal Ascot in June. We'd love to go over there to race against 3-year-old fillies on the turf."

Classic Empire Eyes the Roses...

Oxley expressed both relief and optimism that Classic Empire seems to have pushed past his physical and psychological setbacks that caused missed training and races earlier in the season as the Casse-trained colt heads to Louisville for the GI Kentucky Derby May 6. He, too,

had to wait for racing room before being fully unleashed in the Arkansas Derby, which he won by a determined half-length.

"Going into the Arkansas Derby, we didn't know if he would be fit enough, really," Oxley said. "We hoped he would be. But he proved that he's a great horse. I don't know if he's peaked yet. I hope not--I hope he peaks on Derby Day. But I think he's really coming along well because he's lightly raced, and he's going

into the Derby

relatively fresh--and yet coming off a mile-and-an-eighth win--so I like our position right now.

"At Oaklawn, he was just a model of confidence with a perfect demeanor, a real gentleman," Oxley continued. "When he's right, I think he has great confidence in himself. He likes the race itself, he doesn't particularly think he needs to take time to train. But in the afternoons, he's ready to run at any time. I'm not concerned about him at Churchill, really. I think he'll be well-mannered, and he's going in with a win, which is a confidence builder."

Part of a Rich Tradition...

Oxley is just the 20th owner to win eight graded stakes and receive a Keeneland gold trophy Tray. As part of Keeneland's Milestone Trophy program, graded-stakes winning owners receive an engraved Trophy Cup. After the eighth graded stakes win, the Tray--which holds the eight Trophy Cups--is awarded.


Another eight Trophy Cups earns the owner a Keeneland Pitcher. Eight more graded stakes wins equates to a Keeneland Bowl. Yet another eight graded stakes victories means the owner will receive the newest Milestone piece, the Keeneland Vase, unveiled last October. All of the pieces are hand-crafted by Tiffany & Co.

From the 1952 fall meet, when the program was inaugurated, through 1993, Keeneland presented a Trophy Cup to the

winning owner of almost every major stakes race. Over time, the number of Cups required to win each Milestone Trophy has increased from six to eight to reflect the increased number of graded stakes races.

"I began to buy yearlings in the 1970s at Keeneland. It's been

so long that I don't even remember all of my horses from back then," Oxley said with a laugh. "But what does stand out in my mind is that Keeneland has always been old-world. It's class, and the way all racing should be, if it could. In some ways other tracks have not kept up. They have with money, but not with the courtesies and

traditions. I know that many owners, as well as Debby and me, appreciate these considerations and the quality of the presentations at the track."

As for the next Keeneland stakes milestone--the Pitcher--Oxley said, "That's eight stakes wins away. Hopefully we'll stay healthy and need to find a spot for that one."

"The decision to move the Super Derby to

"We felt that the surface switch would result in a larger field size for the Super Derby and attract a deeper and more competitive field. The Super Derby will always be a valued signature race at Louisiana Downs; this restructuring will enable us to offer a higher quality overall meet for our horsemen and horseplayers."

Louisiana Downs's 84-day meet begins May 6 and concludes Sept. 27. Its 14 stakes races offer purses of \$950,000.

INTELLO COLT HEADS INTENSE CRAVEN TRADE

Newmarket, UK--The tone was set from the first horse into the ring on Tuesday evening, as six-figure lots peppered the bid-board during a frenetic first session of the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-up Sale.

Just shy of 7 million gns was traded for 49 horses in three hours, a near doubling in turnover from the corresponding session of 12 months ago when only 37 lots found buyers. If Wednesday's trade continues in similar vein, the sale is well on target for a record average, with the first day's figure rocketing by 48% to 141,939gns, and the median up 83% at 60,000gns. As ever, the market at this level was selective, and the clearance rate remained virtually unchanged from last year at 74%.

A new name was out in front after the dust had settled with Intello (Ger), who has split the first few years of his new career between Cheveley Park Stud and Haras du Quesnay, passing a solid test in the commercially-driven arena of 2-year-old sales when his first-crop son of the listed winner Marika (GB) (Marju {Ire}) elicited a bid of 575,000gns from John Ferguson. The Godolphin chief was chased to the line for lot 26 by the husband-and-wife team of Jeremy Noseda and Kerri Radcliffe. Cont. p2

ANOTHER STAR FOR RAVEN'S PASS

Cholet is not accustomed to welcoming future stars, but the venue in western France had already played host to the eventual G3 Prix Noailles winner Soleil Marin (Ire) (Kendargent {Fr}) in September, and it may be that another will emerge on the glory trail as Midnight Fair (Ire) (Raven's Pass) created a lasting impression on debut on Tuesday, earning the 'TDN Rising Star' tag and becoming the second Rising Star in 10 days for her sire following Tocco d'Amore (Ire) at Naas on Apr. 9. A daughter of the late Gita Weld's runaway G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Nightime who fetched 450,000gns as a TATOCT yearling, Midnight Fair was slowly out of the gates and anchored in last by Pierre-Charles Boudot initially prior to being taken across to the far rail to loop the entire field before halfway. In a clear lead when brought back from there, the 2-1 favourite raced markedly greenly but was in a totally different league all the way as she delivered a tour de force to win by eight lengths from Mont Dore (Ire) (Kendargent {Fr}). With a physique that suggests Derby over early juvenile races, the long-striding chestnut has half-siblings who have won listed races in France and Australia, and hails from the further family of Godolphin's G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner and Derby fourth Best Of The Bests (Ire) (Machiavellian). He failed to find a buyer in the same ring during Book 1 of the October Sale, bought back by breeder Shutford Stud at 100,000gns.

"He's beautifully athletic," said Ferguson of the colt who was prepared for the breeze by one of the stand-out consignors in his field, Brendan Holland.

"For a horse with as much scope as he has to have breezed the way he did is a major plus. These sales are proven to produce some really good racehorses. The team all really liked this one and Sheikh Mohammed was keen to have him."

Ten lots later, Ferguson returned to the chute to buy a Kyllachy half-brother to Del Mar Grade III winner Belvoir Bay (GB) (Equiano {GB}) from the Mocklershill draft (lot 36) for 230,000gns.

Another stallion with his first runners this year made a splash at Park Paddocks when lot 53 became another high-priced 2-year-old for Adena Springs's Point Of Entry. Following the \$675,000 sale of a colt at the OBS March Sale, the son of Dynaformer struck again, with Angus Gold of Shadwell going to 390,000gns for another of Point Of Entry's sons who won't turn two until May 5.

Sheikh Hamdan has already enjoyed success with the family as he owns his half-brother Taareef (Kitten's Joy), winner last year of the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein and G3 Prix Daphnis, but who is unfortunately one of the horses currently in quarantine following an EHV-1 outbreak at Jean-Claude Rouget's stable. The colt was bought under the name of Wycombe House at Keeneland September for \$140,000 and consigned at Tattersalls by Malcolm Bastard.

The proven names of Darley stud-mates Exceed And Excel (Aus) and Shamardal provided another two of the most expensive



individuals of the evening. Blandford Bloodstock agent Richard Brown was pushed to 370,000gns for lot 40, the Exceed And Excel son of G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Please Sing (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}). It is a family he knows well and which also includes the Kyllachy colt bought earlier in the evening by Godolphin, who is out of Please Sing's half-sister Path Of Peace (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}). as the top-priced distaffer, with jockey John Egan outlasting Ibrahim Araci on behalf of Alliance Bloodstock at 320,000gns.

"I've ridden her in Ireland and she breezed very well," said Egan, who added that the filly would likely be trained in England for his Middle East-based clients.

After the first lot in the ring, Lynn Lodge Stud's first-crop son of Declaration Of War, had been knocked down at 180,000gns to Jamie McCalmont for Michael Tabor, he was swiftly followed by a 300,000-guinea son of popular WinStar veteran Distorted Humor (lot 3). Dr Johnny Hon is the colt's new owner, with Charlie Gordon-Watson bidding on his behalf.

"He'll go to Ed Dunlop," confirmed the agent. "He's a very nice horse who did a very good breeze and he looks like one you could really get on with nice and early."

The \$120,000 short yearling at Keeneland January, who failed to sell in September, was bought in Kentucky by Marco Bozzi and consigned through Tally-Ho Stud. He's the first foal of winning 3-year-old In Bloom (Discreet Cat), a grand-daughter of Listed Chou Croute S. winner Gracious Granny.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club continued its rare breeze-up spending, which started last week in Doncaster, with the purchase of a colt from the debut crop of dual Derby winner Camelot (GB) (lot 12) for 250,000gns.

Browne's Mocklershill operation, which ended the evening as leading vendor with five sold for 1,073,000gns, was also responsible for lot 14, a Dark Angel (Ire) filly who is closely related to the high-earner Sovereign Debt (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), winner this year of the ITM Cup in Doha and the All-Weather Mile

Championships on Good Friday to bring his tally of victories to 12 for £658,345. Alastair Donald purchased the daughter of Lady Duxyana (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}), a full-sister to Sovereign Debt's dam Kelsey Rose (GB), who will be trained by Andrew Balding for an undisclosed client.

Buying through both Peter and Ross Doyle and Nicolas de Watrigant, Al Shaqab Racing added three juveniles to its string, including two bought

for 220,000gns. Lot 60, Brown Island Stables's daughter of Kitten's Joy--a sister to GII Mrs Revere S. winner Emotional Kitten--represented another good pinhook for the vendor of G3 Acomb S. winner Syphax (Arch), Johnny Collins, who bought the filly privately when she failed to sell at \$45,000 at Keeneland.

Al Shaqab also bought the most expensive Epaulette (Aus) 2-year-old of the sale, lot 37, a half-sister to two multiple winners from the family of decent juvenile Presto Vento (GB) (Air Express {Ire}), who was bought by Anthony Bromley of Highflyer Bloodstock for €32,000 at Goffs and sold through Tally-Ho Stud for 220,000gns. Three youngsters by the Darley freshman sold in the session for an average of 128,333gns.

Less than a week ago at Goffs UK the star pinhook badge went to Jim McCartan, who turned a \$5,000 More Than Ready yearling into a £200,000 juvenile. So far this week the badge can be worn by John Kilbride, who also uncovered an incredible bargain at Keeneland when buying a first-crop son of Violence for \$7,000 on behalf of Star Bloodstock. That team's preparation transformed the son of the unraced half-sister to Elusive Quality and Rossini (lot 46) into a 210,000gns breezer. Stephen Hillen was the buyer and the half-brother to Horse Fly (Mineshaft) will be trained by Kevin Ryan.

CLASSIC POINTERS IN NELL GWYN

It is 11 years since Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) went on to 1000 Guineas glory after winning the G3 Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn S., but it would be no surprise to see Wednesday's edition at Newmarket throw up a Classic heroine with some proven and potential class acts in attendance. Last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. first and second Brave Anna (War Front) and Roly Poly (War Front) are back at headquarters from Ballydoyle, while Sunderland Holdings's Sea of Grace (Ire) (Born To Sea {Ire}) appears the leading British-trained representative and 'TDN Rising Star' Pamplemousse (Ire) (Siyouni {Fr}) comes in from France with a weight of expectation behind her. The latter made a striking impression on debut when successful by 4 1/2 lengths over 6 1/2 furlongs on the Polytrack at Chantilly on Apr. 4 and hails from the in-form Andre Fabre stable. If successful, she will become the first French-trained filly to prevail since Flying Water (Fr) (Habitat) in 1976. Hugo Lascelles, racing manager for owner Lady Bamford, said, "She was very good first time out and has come out of the race very well. She has travelled down to Newmarket fine, but we are very much on a fact-finding mission with her. Andre really wants to find out which way to go with her in the long term, but he has been very pleased with her progress."





"Finally, a hot sale not in Australia: Goffs UK (ex Doncaster) 2-year-old sale last week. They sold a Kodiac colt for £360,000, a sale record, but even more impressively, the gross was up 50% from last year, the average up by 37%, to £45,025, and the median was up 36%, to £30,000, with an unheard-of (for a 2-year-old sale) 79% of those catalogued listed as sales. For whatever the reasons (we know it's not the prize money), it shows what a difference it makes when there is true demand in a middle five-figure market. The overall NA/EU 2-year-old market is up by double digits in gross and average so far this year, though the clearance rate from the catalogues is exactly 50%: enter one in a 2-year-old sale, and it's even money whether it will eventually sell in the ring."

Classic Pointers in Nell Gwyn Cont.

Last seen finishing ninth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita in November, she also comes from a stable which has started 2017 with a flourish. Trained in Ireland last term, Sea of Grace drops back from a mile after winning the G3 Flame of Tara S. at The Curragh in August. "I am excited getting Sea of Grace on to the track and if she has any pretensions to being a 1000 Guineas candidate, she will need to run a good race," her new handler William Haggas said. "I have had her since November and she is in good shape, she's a very straightforward filly. She was a group winner as a 2-year-old, so her form is fine and I know that she was held in high regard by Mr. Oxx. It looks to be a strong enough race, as you would hope a proper trial would be, and we should find out if she is a genuine Classic contender. I am keen to run her at Newmarket to see how she handles the course, although I am convinced that she will be better at a mile. She could stay a bit further, so I have put her in both the Prix de Diane and the Prix Saint-Alary so that we have options over a mile and a quarter."

Not to be left out of equations is the G3 Oh So Sharp S. scorer Poet's Vanity (GB) (Poet's Voice {GB}) and trainer Andrew Balding said, "She's quite a big filly and I think this run will do her the power of good. She looks very well and has trained very well, but this is a prep run for what lies ahead later in the season. I think she will come on a great deal for it."

Nightime's first black-type performer was the listed-placed Weld homebred Sleeping Beauty (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), but she was followed by a genuine class act in Zhukova (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), Hwt. Older Mare-Ire at 9 1/2-11f, MGSW-Ire, \$239,313. Still in training at Rosewell House seeking a surefire Group 1 win in 2017, she has demonstrated well-above average ability when winning the G3 Kilternan S. and G3 Blue Wind S. on her favoured testing ground. This filly's purchaser, John Ferguson, also won the bidding war at €1,100,000 for the dam's 2015 colt by Dubawi (Ire) at the Goffs November Foal Sale, while she also has a yearling filly by Zoffany (Ire).

Still a recognised trial for the 2000 Guineas, although without a winner to go on to glory in that Classic since 1991, this race's protagonists are weighted according to their positions in the 2016 Thoroughbred Rankings. Topping the list and therefore setting the standard is Whitecliffsofdover, who was second when Sir Dancealot was third in the G3 Tattersalls S. over this course and distance in September and third in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp on Arc day. 'TDN Rising Star' Seven Heavens remains of interest despite his flop in the G1 Dewhurst S. also over this track and trip in October, but he will have to prove more amenable to restraint than he was when last of seven there.

Off the mark with authority at the third attempt in a mile maiden at Goodwood in August, Khalidi followed up in a competitive nursery at that trip at Doncaster the following month before returning to the latter venue to be third attempting to give upwards of eight pounds to the useful Godolphin pair Bin Battuta (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and First Nation (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in an extended 10-furlong handicap Apr. 2. With that experience up his sleeve, he was primed to give the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere runner-up and G1 Racing Post Trophy third Salouen something to think about and he duly proved the one to subdue that rival and book a rise in class. Racing towards the back of the field initially after being baulked at the start, the bay gradually crept into contention out wide and, after gaining the upper hand over the favourite passing the furlong pole, stayed on to secure a first black-type success.

"That was probably his Derby day," trainer John Gosden revealed, suggesting he is not cut from the same cloth as the stable's previous winner Golden Horn (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}). "He ran very well at Doncaster, trying to give weight away to unexposed horses as he's only a little guy. We knew he'd love the ground today and I don't think it was a vintage Feilden, to be honest, so it seemed like the right race to go for. I think we should step him up in trip and avoid soft ground and I'm all for going straight over a mile and a half now. He's a genuine colt, but very diminutive and I think we can have a look at Chester now and be bold."

The first foal out of a dual listed winner in Italy, Khalidi is bred to stay at least a mile and a half being connected to the G3 Geelong Cup winner and G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up Bauer (Ire) (Halling). SWIPE NOMINATED TO BREEDERS' CUP

Swipe (Birdstone) has become the first Swedish-based stallion to be nominated to the Breeders' Cup. As such, all foals by Swipe will be automatically nominated to the Breeders' Cup.

Swipe was North America's second-highest rated 2-year-old of 2015 behind only Nyquist (Uncle Mo), to whom he ran second four times, including three times in Grade I company. One of those was the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

Swipe, who was bred by Lou Oppenheim, stands at Ivan Sjoberg's Ravdansen Stud for \$2,000. Oppenheim's husband, pedigree expert Bill Oppenheim, said, "Sweden has a lot of dirt racing, and breeders need to have every opportunity open to them to market their horses. Ivan has quite a few mares with dirt pedigrees and from American families, including the dam of last year's Svensk Derby second Ramstein, who is by Summer Bird, like Swipe a son of Birdstone. We agreed that nominating Swipe to the Breeders' Cup would give Scandinavian breeders a shot at the American market, since when selling a horse to America having Breeders' Cup eligibility is a big plus. Also Lou and I are breeding a mare to Swipe ourselves and Ravdansen is supporting him strongly, so we might well decide to send his produce to race there ourselves."

PAKISTAN STAR TRIALS TOWARDS QE II

'TDN Rising Star' Pakistan Star (Ger) (Shamardal), a latest second to Rapper Dragon (Aus) (Street Boss) in the lucrative BMW Hong Kong Derby (2000m) Mar. 19, tuned up for his next appearance in the Apr. 30 G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup with a smart six-furlong barrier trial over the Sha Tin all-weather track

Trained by Tony Cruz, Pakistan Star has had his fair share of trouble getting away from the gates in his brief career, but jumped alertly and settled in fourth position and in the clear for the opening 800

metres. Steered out wide off the home turn while still being quietly ridden by Matthew Chadwick, the bay showed a quick turn of foot entering the final eighth of a mile and skipped clear to 'win' the trial by 2 3/4 lengths with something in reserve in the smart time of 1:09.66 (video). Eroico (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}), a reliable Class 1 winner on dirt, was second.

"The way he trialled last time and this time, the main difference was his acceleration," Chadwick told the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Andrew Hawkins. "Before the Derby, I was saying to the boys that I don't think he can open up in those 21-second sectionals anymore. After that trial--and again, it is 2000m, so it depends how it plays out--but there's a good chance he will be able to finish off in the low-22s, that's how he feels."

Chadwick rode Pakistan Star to wins in his first two career trips to the post, but Silvestre de Sousa, who was in the irons for all three legs of the 4-year-old series, is set to fly in from England for the QE II.
