



FRANKEL'S CUNCO PASSES CLASSIC TEST



Cunco takes Sandown's Classic Trial | Racing Post

What Sir Michael Stoute is to the G3 Gordon Richards S., John Gosden is to this Derby pointer, and it was his stable's apparent second-string Cunco (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) who emerged best to provide his trainer with an eighth renewal as his much-vaunted stablemate Monarchs Glen (GB) (Frankel {GB}) failed to hit the mark. A headline horse last May as the first winner for his sire, Cunco had shown useful form on more than one occasion thereafter, as when third behind Churchill (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in Royal Ascot's seven-furlong Listed Chesham S. in June and second to the fellow Gosden trainee Coronet (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the Listed Zetland S. over this trip at Newmarket in October. Signing off with a seventh in the hotly-contested G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in October, the bay came more into the reckoning the more that reports from the jockeys filtered back that the officially "good" ground had been over-watered ahead of Saturday's national hunt fixture.

Settled last of the quintet early by his regular work-rider Robert Tart with the impressive Kempton handicap winner Monarchs Glen proving too keen for Frankie Dettori in front, he was gradually wound up for his effort out wide as that 5-6 favourite began to tire. Intern (Ire) (Rip Van Winkle {Ire}) thrust between the other two sons of Frankel, Cunco and Frankuus (Ire), inside the final furlong, but in the final strides Cunco gained the advantage and held on in the bobber.

IMPROVING ULYSSES FIRES FOR STOUTE

Sir Michael Stoute's time-honoured role as a leading trainer of improving older horses has been done to death in the racing columns, but it serves as a continuous tale down the decades, with the grandly-named Ulysses (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) the latest to benefit from his particular craft, and he added a win in Friday's G3 Gordon Richards S. to his CV. It is no surprise that he was extending his record in this race, which serves as a re-entry point for upwardly-mobile types, a description that perfectly fits four of Freemason Lodge's seven prior winners in Singspiel (Ire), Ask (GB), Tartan Bearer (Ire) and Glass Harmonium (Ire), all of whom went on to prove themselves Group 1 horses. Ulysses, who was a leading Epsom Derby prospect following his eightlength success in a 10-furlong Newbury maiden last May, found the blue riband itself all too much at that stage of his career and trailed in a parish behind Harzand (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) in 12th but admirably came out the other side enhanced rather than intimidated by the experience.

Like the stable's former illustrious G3 Gordon S. winner Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}), the highlight of the Niarchos homebred's 3-year-old season was a win in that 12-furlong Glorious Goodwood staging post which offered a glimpse of what was to follow. Surprisingly beaten at 8-11 when a shorthead second to Chain of Daisies (GB) (Rail Link {GB}) in Windsor's G3 Winter Hill S. at this trip in August, it is a measure of his trainer's regard for him that he was tried in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita in November. Not helped by a slow break when fourth there, he was put away for the winter break, which promised to turn him from boy to man and he served early notice here that he was ready to make his mark in the best company this season.

Switched off with two behind by Andrea Atzeni throughout the early stages, the son of the G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Light Shift sported the sheepskin noseband which his trainer Sir Michael Stoute has called for on very few occasions in the past but notably with his free-going 2000 Guineas hero King's Best.

"I ride him every morning and he's very quirky and tricky, but he liked this good-to-soft ground," Atzeni said. Gosden added, "He'd been working nicely and wasn't here for fun. The form is solid and he outstayed them, whereas the other boy [Monarchs Glen] was not happy on the ground. Cunco is a first foal and not very big, but he has a heart as big as a lion and gives everything. He has plenty of stamina for this ground and wants a mile-anda- half already, so he may go to the [May 11 G3] Chester Vase, even with a penalty for this, as that track would suit him." Gosden added of Monarchs Glen, "Monarchs Glen was never particularly comfortable, changing his legs and hanging, so obviously the ground didn't suit him. It's a little bit different to bouncing off the Polytrack."

Pedigree Notes...

Cunco is the second group winner of the season for Frankel, for whom he was also the first foal to be born, and evidence that his stock possess stamina as well as his inherent speed. Gosden was a close watcher of the great horse on the Newmarket gallops and added, "There is no doubt that Henry always let Frankel know who was boss and he was always settled in behind in his work. The Frankels are amazing athletes and most want to run like the wind and have a wonderful wildness in them." Cunco was led out unsold at 280,000gns at Tattersalls, which has proven a blessing for his breeders and instant justification for their purchase of the G3 C.L. Weld Park S. and G3 Park Express S. winner and G1 Pretty Polly S. third Chrysanthemum for 800,000gns, who was carrying this colt at the time of her offering at Tattersalls December. The third dam Saintly Speech had the speed and precocity to win the G3 Princess Margaret S., while her own dam Eloquent Minister (Deputy Minister) also possessed abundant pace as an Irish highweight sprinter who also captured the Garden City Breeders's Cup S. Chrysanthemum's 2015 colt is by Galileo (Ire) and he is named Cassini (Ire), while the following year she produced a filly by Australia (GB). Despite the less-than-exacting pace set by Deauville, the chestnut was always comfortable and traveled notably strongly into contention in midstraight. Delivered wide to reel in Ballydoyle's rail-running long-time leader approaching the furlong pole, Ulysses stayed on powerfully to assert for a convincing success, with last year's winner My Dream Boat providing a benchmark for the form in third. "The pace was quite slow but he settled, which is the most important thing," his rider said. "He's a different horse this year--much bigger and stronger and more mature, so he's a horse with a bright future. He's got a high cruising speed, but picks up well and hit the line quite strongly there. The ground is definitely good-to-soft and was not ideal for him, but he did everything right."

That former Sir Henry Cecil trainee still managed to beat Daylami (Ire) in the 1999 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and finish runner-up in that year's G1 Champion S. and third in the 2000 G1 Eclipse S., but she was later outshone by the family's multiple Grade I-winning champion Main Sequence (Aldebaran). 

Whether under the care of Michael Bell, David Nicholls or now Ruth Carr, Sovereign Debt has retained a relish for racing which has seen him hold a virtually uninterrupted level of form that has resulted in a runner-up finish in the 2013 G1 Lockinge S. and a win in Tipperary's G3 Concorde S. two years later. Bringing up a fifth black-type success in Leopardstown's Listed Knockaire S. last October, the grey was sent to Doha to beat Cougar



Mountain (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) in the Feb. 24 Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cup over this trip before finishing third for his new yard in Kempton's Apr. 1 Listed Magnolia S. over 10 furlongs at the start of the month. Bouncing back to annex Lingfield's Apr. 14 All-Weather Championships Mile last time, he gave his customary uncomplicated performance again here, which proved enough to yield his most high-profile score at a veteran stage. Always happy in second, he was committed approaching the final furlong and drew away to settle the race before the similarly evergreen Gabrial could find his top stride. "It's a big day for us, our first runner in a group race and it's a winner," Carr said. "Jimmy [Sullivan] kept the ride on him after Lingfield and it's a big day for all the team. He might be eight, but he's not getting worse. Plan A was Lingfield so where we go next I don't know, we had a choice of coming here or Leicester [for the Listed King Richard III S. on Saturday], but there was twice as much prize money here and it wasn't a much harder race, so that's why we came."

GRASSROOTS SERIES EXPANDED

The Jockey Club's Grassroots Flat Series, which provides opportunities for horses below the highest level to compete for substantial prizemoney, has added a Nursery Handicap Series. It also runs a Sprint and a Middle Distance series. The opening qualifiers for the Sprint and Middle Distance series' will be on

May 13 at Nottingham, while the first Nursery series qualifier will be held at Haydock on July 7.

The finals for the three series' will be held at Nottingham on Oct. 4, offering a £70,000 prize pot. The Nursery Handicap Series will culminate with a final worth £20,000, added to the existing finals at £25,000 each. To qualify, runners must have run in a minimum of one qualification race throughout the season, of which there are a minimum of 18 staged across Jockey Club Racecourses.

ATTY PERSSE (IRE) (c, 3, Frankel {GB}--Dorcas Lane {GB} {SW & MGSP-Eng, GSP-Fr, \$120,205}, by Norse Dancer (Ire)), who was acquired by Godolphin after posting a course-and-distance debut win in his only prior start on Sept. 14, occupied a prominent pitch until bumped back a few spots approaching halfway in this Esher Cup. Asked to close on the leaders with three furlongs remaining, the 6-4 favourite was caught in all manner of traffic inside the final quarter mile, but somehow managed to weave a passage and get up to deny Mucho Applause (Ire) (Acclamation (GB)) by a short head on the line. "It was a tough race and he got bashed round the bend and squeezed out," said winning trainer Roger Charlton. "He battled and did it well, but I don't know where he will go yet. I will talk to John Ferguson and see what he wants to do. Godolphin do not buy horses to run in handicaps so, if we can step him up in grade, something like the [May 12 Listed] Dee S. [at Chester] might be a possibility." The June 3 G1 Epsom Derby entry is the only racecourse performer, to date, for the stakes-winning G2 Ribblesdale S. and G2 Lancashire Oaks placegetter Dorcas Lane (GB) (Norse Dancer (Ire)), who is out of a half to G1 1000 Guineas victress Harayir (Gulch) and to the dual stakes-placed dam of G1 Jebel Hatta scorer Tryster (Ire) (Shamardal). Regaining a slight advantage with a furlong to race, the 2-1 favourite stayed on to win by a short head from Apphia (Ire) (High Chaparral (Ire)). Love Conquers (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), the full-sister to Deep Brillante (Jpn), was hampered by a disastrous start and after showing some ability to briefly threaten in the straight tired to be last of nine. The winner is a full-sister to the G3 Musidora S. scorer Liber Nauticus (Ire) and a half-sister to Lucciola (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}), SP-Aus, \$269,896, and to the G2 Rockfel S. runner-up Thetis (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Serres, whose 2016 colt is a son of Dansili (GB), is a half-sister to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, G1 St Leger and G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S.-winning champion and sire Conduit (Ire) and the G2 Great Voltigeur S. scorer Hard Top (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) and the dam of the class acts Glass Harmonium (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}) and Arab Spring (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}). Nurlan Bizakov's Hesmonds Stud successfully acquired a share in the Haras de Bonneval-based Siyouni (Fr) on Argana Online and as a consequence was handed two nominations for the 2016 breeding season. 'BLACK' VS 'DIAMOND' IN TENNO SHO

Last year's JRA Horse of the Year Kitasan Black (Jpn) (Black Tide {Jpn}) has compiled a nearly impeccable record since taking the G1 Japan Cup last November, and the 5-year-old puts his reputation on the line once again when attempting to defend his title in Sunday's G1 Tenno Sho Spring. Second in the G1 Arima Kinen on Christmas Day following his Japan Cup score, the bay took the newly minted G1 Osaka Hai on seasonal debut on Apr. 2. Trainer Hisashi Shimizu said, "It was a great win last time, and I was relieved that all went well, given the status of the horse, and the expectations of the fans. He came out of the race well, and we just gave him an easy three or four days. I'm looking forward to taking on Satono Diamond, and I just hope all goes smoothly leading up to the race."

The 4-year-old Satono Diamond (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) rides a four-race win streak into the Tenno Sho. He won the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger) last October before besting Kitasan Black in the Arima Kinen, and he started out his season with a win over **Cheval Grand (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the G2 Hanshin Daishoten on Mar. 19. Assistant trainer Yuki Iwasaki said, "He's worked well with his training partner recently, recording a good time in the last furlong. I think having had the one race this year, he's open to a lot more improvement."

Cheval Grand has been knocking on the door at the highest level, having been third in this race last year as well as the Japan Cup. It remains to be seen whether he can find enough to turn the tables on the top two, but trainer Yasuo Tomomichi said, "He ran well last time, and was slightly unlucky in being marked a lot of the way by the eventual winner. We didn't send him to the farm after that, like we did last year, as he has a tendency to gain weight. His training has been fine so far."

The 4-year-old Sciacchetra (Jpn) (Manhattan Café (Jpn)) has been rising through the ranks as of late and could be getting good at just the right time. He has won four of six starts and has never been off the board. He most recently scored in the G2 Nikkei Sho at Nakayama on Mar. 25 in his second outing of the year. Trainer Hisashi Shimizu said, "It was a great win last time, and I was relieved that all went well, given the status of the horse, and the expectations of the fans. He came out of the race well, and we just gave him an easy three or four days. I'm looking forward to taking on Satono Diamond, and I just hope all goes smoothly leading up to the race."

OBS APRIL ANOTHER RECORD SETTER

OCALA, Florida - The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training produced a record average, median and gross as it concluded with a fourth session in Central Florida Friday.

"It was exciting because we had strength from beginning to end and in different price ranges," said OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski. "April has proven itself to be the one-stop shop of 2-year-old sales. And it seems to grow every year. I think it has to do with the success of the horses we've seen around the world. Horses that come out of here have proven themselves on the track and I think people appreciate that. Ultimately, they want to go where they can go where they can buy a good horse."

Through four sessions, OBS sold 678 horses for \$61,185,900. The average of \$90,245 was up 14.3% from a year ago, while the median was up 2.1% from the record 2016 figure of \$47,000. The buy-back rate was 17%.

A year ago, 659 horses sold for \$52,010,500. The average was \$78,923.

A number of top contenders for next Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby turned in official works Friday as they prepare for the "Run for the Roses."



The April sale, which had two previous million-dollar sales in its history, produced three seven-figure transactions, including the sale-topping \$2.45-million colt by Tiznow consigned by Bobby Dodd and purchased by M.V. Magnier.

Buyers found plenty of competition this week in Ocala, particularly in the middle market which has been weak at recent auctions.

"I think the market is very strong," said Linda Rice, who signed the ticket at \$850,000 for Friday's session-topper, a filly by Creative Cause (hip 999). "Everybody wants a nice horse. It's a bit chicken or feathers, but I see a lot of horses that I would have considered middle-market horses that the buyers are really interested in picking up. What I am seeing is that there is a lot of enthusiasm for racing."

Bloodstock agent David Meah was busy on both sides of the ledger and found it hard to buy many of his picks.


"I think it was tough for buyers," Meah said. "You come here looking for a \$100,000 or \$150,000 horse and you have to pay \$250,000 to \$300,000. The market was strong, it was tough for buyers. You had to be strong. And you had to get your clients willing to maybe overspend a little bit for horses, which is tough to do. It's that or go home empty-handed."

The sale's leading consignor was Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables with \$4,085,000 collected on 36 sold.

Wojciechowski is hopeful the tough competition this week will lead to a strong renewal of the company's June sale

"There were certainly a lot of people who said it was difficult to buy here this week," he confirmed. "And as they left, they said, 'I'll see you in June.' So I believe it will help us for June."

Another OBS Score for Solana Beach

A year ago, Solana Beach Sales, a pinhooking partnership led by Billy Koch, put a colt by Broken Vow through the sales ring at the OBS April Sale. The youngster, purchased at the Keeneland

September Yearling Sale for \$105,000, was the April topper when bringing a final bid of \$1.2 million from Breeze Easy. The partnership returned to Ocala Friday with a filly by Creative Cause. That chestnut, a \$100,000 purchase at Keeneland last fall, sold for \$850,000 to the bid of trainer Linda Rice. She was consigned by Tom McCrocklin.

"She had a lot of interest, but you just don't know," Koch said. "You don't know what to expect and you don't want to set your expectations

too high. Tom and his team deserve all the credit."

Asked about the filly's appeal as a yearling, Koch said, "We just loved her and we took a shot with Creative Cause."

Out of stakes winner Santina Dond (El Prado {Ire}), hip 999 has blossomed in Florida this winter, according to Koch.

"She just grew into a beautiful filly and people had trouble faulting her," he explained. "The key is the last six months she spent with Tom and his team here in Ocala. She turned in a wonderful breeze (:21 flat) and she is just an absolutely

beautiful filly. I'm just so happy for the people who invested in her."

Koch, founder and managing partner in the Little Red Feather Racing Club, which has campaigned Grade I winners Singletary, Egg Drop and Midnight Storm, said the Solana Beach Sales partnership is another way to get investors involved in the industry.

"We are trying to get into different parts of the business," Koch explained. "We really want to be a place where you can come if you want to do a stallion share or if you want to do a pinhook or if you

want to buy a racehorse, or do a crowd fund, we can do all of that. That's how we're trying to build our company."

The pinhooking opportunity has proven popular with his investors. **Cont. p5**

Rice Wins Out on Creative Cause Filly

Trainer Linda Rice had been keeping a relatively low profile through the first three days of OBS April, but she made her presence known during Friday's closing session, coming out on top of a spirited bidding war with bloodstock agent Donato Lanni to take home a Creative Cause filly for \$850,000.

The New York-based conditioner, who tied with Rudy Rodriguez for leading trainer of Aqueduct's spring meet, signed the ticket for hip 999 on behalf of Kaitar Racing. That name also appeared on the ticket of \$900,000 2015 OBS April grad Seymourdini (Bernardini), who romped by 12 1/4 lengths in his seasonal bow for Rice at Laurel Mar. 25.

"She's a big scopey filly, good size, good shoulder," commented Rice, who did her bidding on the phone from one of the OBS offices. "She went in :21 flat and galloped out terrific. She looks like a two-turn filly with speed. She had a good presentation at the barn."

Rice expected the filly to command a big purchase price. Her \$850,000 price tag was the highest yet for an offspring of Creative Cause.

"Honestly, I wasn't [surprised] based on what I saw here this

week," the conditioner offered.
"Yesterday we tried to buy a
Union Rags colt [Hip 899] that
brought a million. People want a
nice horse clearly."

Rice added, "There was a nice Creative Cause filly, hip 262, that went for \$575,000 that was sold by Eddie Woods. She was really magnificent as well. We tried to bid on her also, but didn't get her bought."

Hip 999 was bred by Brereton and Bret Jones, whose Airdrie Stud stands her young sire Creative Cause for a fee of



\$15,000 this term. His first crop is currently 3-year-olds, including two-time stakes winner Twisted Tom, victor of last weekend's Federico Tesio S. at Laurel.

Rice purchased five other horses this week and two of them were colts by Creative Cause. She went to \$320,000 for Hip 392, who worked in :10.2 and hails from the family of undefeated GISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Mastery (Candy Ride {Arg}) and GSW/GISP sire Jump Start (A.P. Indy). The daughter of late pinhooking pioneer Clyde Rice also signed the \$200,000 ticket on Hip 25, a :10.1 breezer out of GSP Visavis (Indian Charlie).

"I was beaten in the Federico Tesio last week by a Creative Cause named Twisted Tom and I bought two colts by the same stallion, not by intent, frankly," Rice remarked. "They just presented themselves well at this sale. I am trying to buy horses that look like two -turn horses, Classic distance colts. Obviously this is a filly, but she looks like she will definitely run two turns."

She continued, "[Creative Cause] is from a nice family. He's a full-brother to [MGSW and GI Belmont S. runner-up] Destin, so I think it is a good female family."

Consigned by Tom McCrocklin, the chestnut filly is out of Santina Dond (El Prado {Ire}), who raced in Poland. This is also the family of GSW and GISP millionaire Zivo (True Direction) and GSW Patton's Victory (Patton). She was purchased by Solana Beach for \$100,000 at last term's Keeneland September sale.

'Awesome' Filly Brings Things Full Circle for **Brogden**

A mare named Rivertown Belle (Bellamy Road) made a lasting impression on Carrie Brogden when she sold her as a weanling, so much so that she just had to buy her daughter by Awesome Again as a weanling. That filly became so special to the horsewoman that she stayed in on the youngster when she was resold as a yearling and the dark bay (Hip 968) brought things full circle for Brogden when selling for \$525,000 to trainer Jeff

Mullins, who was bidding on behalf of Michael Cannon.

"Her price has overwhelmed me," an elated Brogden said after thanking Mullins. "I thought she'd bring \$300,000. Quincy and Jenn [Adams, who consigned the filly through their Q Bar J Thoroughbreds LLC] did a fantastic job as always. They told me the whole time she was the real deal."

Brogden continued, "The way she moved and the way

she carried herself, sometimes I am wrong, but she was just special. Quincy calls in February and says, 'You aren't going to believe this, but I think the best filly in our group is the Awesome Again filly.' She represented exactly what she was here today and exactly what her mother was. It's amazing how it all comes full circle."

Pro Partners, a weanling to yearling pinhooking partnership headed by Brogden, purchased the :10 flat breezer for \$135,000 as a Keeneland November weanling.

"We sold [Rivertown Belle] as weanling [for \$25,000] for breeder Deann Baer and she went on to be a stakes winner," recalled Brogden, who operates Machmer Hall Farm with her husband Craig and mother Sandy Willwerth and is also a partner in Kentucky-based Select Sales. "The mother was gorgeous and she comes back into the [Keeneland] November sale in foal to Awesome Again and I was the underbidder when Tom Ryan bought her [for \$170,000] for SF [Bloodstock]. Then I see the foal and I'm like, 'Oh my God, the foal is incredible.' I bought her [as a weanling] as part of our foal partnership."

Brogden liked the filly so much that she put together a new partnership to buy the then-yearling for \$100,000 when she went through the ring at Keeneland September the following year.

"She was our last horse to sell from our group at the yearling sale and I knew she didn't have the action to kick off of [weanling price]," Brogden explained. "I sent my client at Haymarket Farm a text and said, 'There is a filly here off my farm that I think is going to be one of the most special horses I've ever raised. She's selling as a yearling tonight and she has to sell. Do you want to buy her and I will retain a piece?' He said yes. I took 40% and our partners Dan and Jane Hoffelin, who have raced successfully with Jerry Hollendorfer, were the only ones from the original weanling to yearling partnership who stayed in."

Bred by SF Bloodstock, hip 968 traces her lineage back to Horse of the Year Holy Bull and GISW Sweet Symphony. She is the first foal out of Rivertown Belle, who was most recently bred back to Awesome Again. --@CDeBernardis

Hip 1205, a colt by Scat Daddy, was the third-to-last horse through the ring Friday at OBS, but proved worth the wait when selling for \$400,000 to Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International. The bay juvenile, who worked in :10 flat, was a \$100,000 buy for California-based B G Thoroughbreds at last year's Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"I think it was a good result," bloodstock agent David Meah, representing the sellers, said after the transaction. "Anytime you turn \$100,000 into \$400,000 in seven or eight months, it's a good result. So we're happy with that."

The colt is out of Trusty Lady (Deputy Minister) and is a half to graded stakes-placed Trendy Lady (Unbridled's Song). He was consigned by Harris Training Center.

Of the colt's appeal as a yearling, Meah said, "It's the last season of horses by Scat Daddy and this one looked like a horse that would go and look like a good horse in April. We thought we might send him to March, but we thought he could be a star in April. He trained really well over the winter and never had a setback. I think he was really well bought for \$400,000."

The colt was one of three targeted for the April sale, according to Meah.

"I bought three for them to come here," Meah said. "This is the only one who made it through the process, but he paid for the whole thing, so we'll go back to September and do it all again." --@JessMartiniTDN

Casse's other Derby hopeful, GI Xpressbet Florida Derby runner-up **State of Honor** (To Honor and Serve), worked later in the morning. He was credited with a :48.80 (34/84) spin.

"He worked spectacular this morning," Casse offered. "He tries really hard. I thought his last race when he got caught up on the rail, Julien [Leparoux] had all kinds of horse and by the time he got out, **Always Dreaming** (Bodemeister) had already left. It's not easy to run him down."

• Speaking of Always Dreaming, the Florida Derby winner produced the consensus most impressive drill of the morning--a :59.60 bullet (1/35). Pilot John Velazquez was up for the move, which included internal fractions of :13, :24.40, :35.80 and :47.60 with gallop-outs of 1:12.60, 1:25.60 and 1:40.

"I thought it was a powerful work; exceptional," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He's full of himself. It was a good work with a great gallop out. He galloped out past the [track] kitchen [at the half-mile pole]."

Two of Pletcher's other two Derby hopefuls--'TDN Rising Star' Patch (Union Rags) and GII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby hero Tapwrit (Tapit)--drilled in company with an official time of 1:00.20 (3/35) for five panels.

"That was a good work for Tapwrit," Pletcher said. "He handled the track better than he did at Keeneland [when fifth in the GII Blue Grass S.]. I was very pleased with it. It was a typical work for Patch. He tends to idle a bit when he works, but he was better this morning." **Cont. p10**

Fellow 'Rising Star' Battalion Runner (Unbridled's Song) struggled a bit to keep up with MGSW turfer Made You Look (More Than Ready) and stopped the clock in :48.40 (24/84).

"He seemed to wrestle with the track," Pletcher noted. "I thought the work was OK; it was not a bad work. A lot of times, the track you get a week before the Derby is not the same one you run on Derby Day. We will watch him the next week and see how he does."

'Rising Star' Malagacy, winner of the GII Rebel S. but fifth in the Arkansas Derby, galloped Friday as his connections mull over a Derby start.

"He just galloped this morning because we have not committed to run," Pletcher said. "I will talk with the owner [Oussama Aboughazale] and tweet [the decision]. If he is on for the Derby, he will breeze Saturday and if not we will look at Friday to prepare for the [GI] Preakness."

• GII Xpressbet Fountain of Youth S. hero **Gunnevera** (Dialed In) also turned in his final major drill for the Derby--he went in an easy 1:03.60 (35/35) under the Twin Spires.

"I liked it," trainer Antonio Sano said. "It is all maintenance now. He galloped out well. All is good here."

• Practical Joke (Into Mischief), second in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S. in his final Derby prep, was equipped with blinkers for his work Friday. The Grade I-winning juvenile breezed alongside talented stablemate Bobby on Fleek (Frost Giant) in 1:01.60 (19/35).

"He worked well with the blinkers," trainer Chad Brown said. "He wasn't too aggressive but he seemed a little more focused through the lane. He got away from his workmate in the gallop out, willingly, which we wanted to see. I was really pleased."

Brown said Practical Joke will likely race for the first time with blinkers in the Derby.

• Irap (Tiznow), who upset Practical Joke and others in the Blue Grass, had his final Derby work over at Keeneland, covering a mile in 1:44.20 (1/1). Julien Leparoux was in the irons. (Video)

"[Today's work] was very similar [to Irap's last work], just kind of a good leg stretch," offered trainer Doug O'Neill. "Having him finish up good and getting a good mile work with a good gallop in and good gallop out was what I was hoping for and that's what I saw. So I'm very happy."

Leparoux rode Irap in the Blue Grass, but Mario Gutierrez will seek his third Derby winner with O'Neill and Reddam Racing aboard the colt next Saturday.

• Further out of town was 'Rising Star' Battle of Midway (Smart Strike). The game GI Santa Anita Derby runner-up drilled six furlongs in 1:13.40 (5/13) under Flavien Prat. His workmate Mangita (Cyclotron) was credited with a five-furlong workout.

"I wanted to have his last work here rather than at Churchill Downs," Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer noted, "because I've had different kinds of results from working horses at Churchill earlier on in that meet. I think I got what I needed here, and he'll just gallop into the race down there."

WITH DUNCAN TAYLOR

With California Chrome among the most popular horses in decades, Taylor Made and True.Ink, are looking to get the man on the street involved in one of his offspring. All involved believe connecting "The People's Horse" campaign to California Chrome and Taylor Made will take the project to the next level.

Taylor Made President Duncan Taylor tells Bill Finley of the TDN more about the project:

TDN: Where did this idea come from? Who approached whom?

DT: I don't know who Geoff Gray talked to, but he said that he went around Kentucky and asked people who might like to get involved in this sort of project and he said he kept hearing Taylor Made, talk to Duncan Taylor, he is someone who might do it. So when he came to me I told him that I thought this was a great idea and the timing was perfect because we have California Chrome and he is the ultimate 'People's Horse.' So we worked on the idea together. We bought quite a few mares to breed to Chrome and there were three of them that we bought on our own that we didn't have any partners. So we picked those three and we're going to let the people vote on which mare they want us to breed to Chrome, which mare they want to have a foal out of. That will be 'The People's Horse.' We'll then follow through and see if we want to race him or sell him.

TDN: Considering all the fun and excitement the partners will have enjoying watching the horse run, I'm a little surprised to hear you say you might sell him?

DT: We plan on racing the horse. That said, in the horse business you never know what might happen. If for some reason there's not enough interest in this or not enough people get involved, we can't rule out selling the foal. But we don't see that happening and the plan is to race the horse.

TDN: The mares people will vote on are Colerful Bride (Munnings), Barbara Orr (Tale of the Cat), and Sixtyfivenorth (Midshipman). If it were up to you, which one would you chose?

DT: I bought all three of the mares because there were certain things that I liked about all three. Colerful Bride is by Munnings and is out of an Unbridled's Song mare and she is a stakes winner. [California Chrome's sire] Lucky Pulpit and Unbridled's Song share three-quarter sisters, so I like that mating. Barbara Orr, she's already produced a stakes winner. With Sixtyfivenorth, I really like Midshipman for that same Unbridled's Song factor. She is a young mare and I like her too. I like all three of them.

TDN: What kind of input have you gotten from Geoff?

DT: What's cool about Geoff is that he brings to the table more of an outsider's view of how to entertain the people and how stuff people like you and I may not understand is important. We were talking about whether we want a fetal sex or not want a fetal sex on Sixtyfivenorth, who is already in foal. He said, 'Let's do it; the people will think that's cool.' He wants us to get videos of the vet ultrasounding the mare and show them to the people. These are things we take for granted, but things an average person would want to experience if they owned a horse. They'll be able to experience almost everything a normal horse owner gets to experience, feel like they are part of the horse community, and do so at very little cost.

TDN: Geoff already has 440 people signed up for The People's Horse project. Will this endeavor be open just to those people?

DT: It's certain that all 440 will stay in. The great thing is that in a digital world we can serve an unlimited number of people and give them all the same experience. Then if we have a barbecue or something at the farm they can all come and meet each other. It really lends itself to being able to entertain a lot of people.

TDN: Then how many people would you like to get involved with "The People's Horse?"

DT: I don't know if there is a perfect number. I'd like to see as many as possible get in. It exposes the horse business to that many more people. One of things I thought when we were giving money to the V Foundation from Chrome's earnings was the good we could do. When somebody is in the hospital suffering from any disease, there is a lot of stress, and that's a big factor. They also have so little to look forward to. We never really got it worked out, but I was telling the V foundation that I would like to send Art Sherman to do weekly interviews at some hospital to talk about Chrome. The patients could have then followed him and when he runs they could have watched the race and cheered for him. Because he was already running for cancer, we could have exposed all the patients and their loved ones to the joy horses bring people.

TDN: When someone puts up money to get involved in the project are they more or less just joining a fan club or will they have equity in the horse?

DT: I know that, at the very least, at the \$500 level, Geoff is planning to offer these people a chance to buy in if they want to. I think the later we let this go the better because the longer they wait the better chance they'll have of knowing how the horse will turn out. So, we haven't really picked a time when equity will be offered. There's a lot in this area that we still have to figure out.

TDN: Will the horse be named The People's Horse? It looks like that name is out there and available?

DT: Well, Geoff already has The People's Horse. When he started the concept he went around the country with a big fiberglass horse that was The People's Horse. He would go to places like the Derby and people would come and sign the horse and he would then go to the next big race. The idea, in its infancy, people were going ahead and signing up and paying to be part of the 'People's Horse' project. But if the name for the real horse is available, I don't see any reason why we wouldn't want it.

TDN: You seem very enthusiastic about what this project can accomplish.

DT: I am. I've really enjoyed aligning ourselves with the Horse Country tours and having people coming out and touring the farm. The people come and they get to enjoy the horses. It gives me joy watching people be happy around horses and seeing how cool they think it all is. I think this new experience is going to bring many of the same benefits. I've been involved with horses

my whole life and, for me, it's just a way of life. It's so nice to see someone else come and really enjoy the horse and this is an extension of that same thing.

Someone told me other day that Darwin said that the horse was the best animal to use to study genetics. It was amazing to think that Darwin was talking about horses. There are three stallions and 30 mares they all trace back to. And we all know what Churchill said about the outside of a horse is good for the inside of a man. Horses have been such a big part of human activity throughout time and I think that's one of the reasons people just innately love horses.

TDN: Speaking of the Horse Country tours at Taylor Made, how are they going now that you have a big time celebrity in the house?

DT: Great. We basically have limited the tours to 25 a day and have been sold out for the last three months.

Bewitch S. cont.

Given little chance by the bettors at nearly double the price of the next-longest shot on the board, Quiet Business rallied down the lane late to reel in pacesetter Daring Duchess in what was a fitting result. Historic Calumet Farm campaigned Hall of Famer Bewitch, and the runner-up was bred by Kennelot Stables, a subsidiary of Calumet.

Biding her time in last along the rail past the stands for the first time, the dark bay inched slightly closer approaching the final bend behind a mile in 1:40.39. Daring Duchess looked to be giving them the slip in upper stretch, but Quiet Business kept on chipping away at her advantage and reeled her in in the late stages.

Quiet Business broke her maiden fifth out in a sloppy off-theturfer at Churchill Downs last May, and her only other prior victory was a grassy marathon allowance win back under the Twin Spires Nov. 18. She had last been seen checking in seventhbeaten 2 1/2 lengths--at Gulfstream Mar. 12.

"We learned a lot about this filly last fall with how she wanted to run," said pilot Brian Hernandez, Jr., referring to an eighth-place finish here in October. "We kind of rushed her into the race and she didn't care for that so much. When we got her back to Churchill, we made her wait and from the three-eighths pole home that day she ran home really, really good. So that was our plan today. We wanted to get her in a nice rhythm and make sure that last three-eighths of a mile to have her running. She showed today that's what she wants to do."

Conditioner Rusty Arnold admitted that this wasn't the spot he had in mind of Quiet Business originally.

"This is just fate. We got lucky," he said. "We entered her in an allowance race that didn't go and forgot to nominate her [to the Bewitch. Keeneland Racing Secretary] Ben [Huffman] told me, 'Supplement her.' I didn't want to do it, [but] when it came up a small field, we did it."

Pedigree Notes:

Calumet Farm principal Brad Kelley's Bluegrass Hall acquired Indy Business for \$335,000 in foal to Giant's Causeway at the 2011 Keeneland November sale, and sold the resulting filly-eventual GSW and GISP turfer Itsonlyactingdad--for \$270,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. Indy's Business's 3-year-old half-sister Fashion's Crossing (English Channel)--a \$175,000 FTSAUG grad herself--was a debut second at Tampa Mar. 5 for trainer Shug McGaughey, Gainesway Stable and Andrew Rosen. Indy Business's most recent produce is a 2015 Oxbow filly. She is a half-sister to 2001 GII Fair Grounds Oaks winner and GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up Real Cozzy (Cozzene), and hails from the female family of Real Quiet (Quiet American). Quiet Business is bred on the reverse of the popular A.P. Indy--Quiet American cross responsible for such standouts as Bernardini.
