



# AL SHAQAB BUYS STAKE IN BRAMETOT



G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains contender Brametot | Scoop Dyga

**Brametot (Ire)** (Rajsaman {Fr}), beaten only once in five starts and currently joint-favourite for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, will run in the colours of Al Shaqab Racing on Sunday following the news that Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's operation has purchased a 50% share in the colt.

As first reported in *Jour de Galop*, Gerard Augustin-Normand, who previously raced the colt in partnership with Elisabeth Vidal, will retain his share in the impressive winner of the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau. Augustin-Normand also co-owned last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner La Cressonniere (Fr) (Le Havre {Ire}) in partnership with Antonio Caro, and both horses are the offspring of stallions standing at the owner-breeder's Haras de la Cauviniere. Brametot is not, however, a homebred, having been bought as a foal by Sylvain Vidal for €26,000 from his breeder Jorge Cardemil de Rurange.

"Sylvain and Elisabeth Vidal have sold their share in Brametot and M. Augustin-Normand is very happy to be racing him with Al Shaqab," confirmed Haras de la Cauviniere's Mathieu Alex. "It's an arrangement that worked very well for them both previously with Ectot (Ire)." He continued, "It is again a very exciting weekend for us. Le Havre had [dual Classic winner] Avenir Certain (Fr) in his first crop and this is a very good horse for Rajsaman. Jean-Claude Rouget is very excited about him and we just hope he can improve again."

#### AMERICAN FILLY AIMING FOR EPSOM

This year's G1 Investec Oaks looks likely to have an American challenger, with trainer Kenny McPeek mapping out a plan to the June 2 Epsom Classic for his GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up **Daddys Lil Darling** (Scat Daddy). The news was first reported in *Racing Post* and confirmed by McPeek on Wednesday.

Daddys Lil Darling won last year's GII Pocahontas S. and has been second in three Grade Is on the dirt, with a GI Ashland S. runner-up finish preceding her Kentucky Oaks effort in the Churchill Downs slop last Friday. The Normandy Farm homebred has tried the turf just once, finishing sixth in the GIII Florida Oaks in March, and McPeek said he was pleased with the way she trained over the turf gallop at his Magdalena Farm in Lexington on Wednesday. "She galloped over my grass course here at the farm today," he said. "We have to make shipping arrangements and we also have another stage of the nomination getting ready to come on May 18." McPeek continued, "I spoke to [Normandy Farm owner] Mrs. [Nancy] Polk today and she's going to come out and watch her train one day on the grass, so right now we're moving forward."

"She's pretty adaptable," the trainer added. "She actually seems to relax a whole lot more on the turf gallops at my place. We can to some extent emulate a European grass course here."

In addition to her affinity for the grass, McPeek said the Investec Oaks plan was prompted by the lack of Grade I opportunities for 3-year-old fillies in the U.S.

"I think there's more upside to giving this a run than downside," he said. "The other thing is that none of the runners have ever run at Epsom, so to me in some ways it's a wide- open race."

While Daddys Lil Darling will be an unknown commodity to European punters she certainly has a pedigree angle to fall back on, being a daughter of Scat Daddy, who has excelled with his European runners which have included Group 1 winners No Nay Never and Lady Aurelia and G2 Coventry S. winner Caravaggio in the last two years. She is out of Miss Hot Salsa (Houston), a stakes winner going 1 1/16 miles on the turf, and is a half-sister to a pair of stakes winners, including the 2015 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Mongolian Saturday (Any Given Saturday).

#### DABYAH OUT OF FRENCH GUINEAS

G3 Fred Darling S. winner **Dabyah (Ire)** (Sepoy {Aus}) has been ruled out of Saturday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches after an unsatisfactory scope.

Bruce Raymond, racing manager for owner Abdullah Saeed Al Naboodah, said, "Unfortunately she scoped quite dirty this morning and she's not going to be able to run on Saturday. It's a shame, but these things happen and you couldn't send her to France after scoping badly. I think it's better to leave her at home."

Trained by John Gosden, Dabyah is three for four, her lone defeat coming when third, beaten a length, in last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. Raymond confirmed the bay would target Royal Ascot's G1 Coronation S.

#### LIMATO ON TRACK FOR BIG SPRINT DATES

Limato (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) is on the mend from torn muscles sustained in Dubai in March and is on target to defend his title in the G1 Darley July Cup on July 15. The 5-year-old gelding, who also won last year's G1 Prix de la Foret, rounded out his season with a sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He beat just two home when 10th in the Mar. 25 G1 Al Quoz Sprint in his season opener over ground that was unsuitably soft.

"Limato had his first leg stretch on the grass since he travelled back from Dubai [on Tuesday] morning," said trainer Henry Candy. "To be honest, he was in a bit of a mess with pulled muscles when we got him back home and it has been a long process putting him back together."

Candy said the Paul Jacobs silkbearer has a planned appearance in Royal Ascot's G1 Diamond Jubilee S. prior to the July Cup. Cont. p3

"I have just given him plenty of rest and he looks back to his old self now," the trainer noted. "He did not work with anything at all special yesterday but the manner that he did it, and his general attitude, made me think that he is back in good form. I plan to run him next in the Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and, unless anything goes wrong, the Darley July Cup is where we will then be heading. I think that he put up a career best when he won the race last year. It's a very important race--any Group 1 is fantastic, but the July Cup is one of the best, if not the best, sprints of the year, and it's a wonderful race to win."

When the weanling later to be termed **Declarationofpeace** went through the ring at Keeneland November in 2015, M.V. Magnier was the determined beneficiary at \$2.6 million for the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency-consigned colt who is tantamount to equine royalty. Descended from the Hall of Famer Serena's Song, the bay who has grown into an imposing type was a must-have for Magnier.

"We've had a lot of luck with Serena's Song in the past," Magnier said at the time. "He's a nice horse and comes from a great farm."

Sent off the 13-8 favourite for his debut over six furlongs at Navan Apr. 24, he was third there behind the Ken Condon trainee Romanised (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and began this Polytrack bow at 1-4 to have made the necessary progression in the interim. Stalking the leading duo throughout the early stages, the half-brother to the GII American Turf S. and

GIII Pilgrim S. winner and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up Noble Tune (Unbridled's Song), MGSW & GISP-US, \$492,222, and to the GI Metropolitan H. and GI Whitney S.-winning sire Honor Code (A.P. Indy), Ch. Older Horse & MGISW-US, \$2,518,260, took control with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. Drawing away under hand riding from Seamie Heffernan, Declarationofpeace finished off powerfully to score by six lengths from Qatar Racing's newcomer Treasuring (GB) (Havana Gold {Ire}).

Aidan O'Brien is planning a trip to the Royal meeting next month. "He's a fine big fellow. He has a lot of speed," he told *Irish Racing.com*. "We'd be thinking of Ascot and if we could get another run into him it would be a help. We could look at the [Listed] Marble Hill [S. at The Curragh May 27] or the [Listed] Rochestown [S. at Naas May 21] for him."

Aside from boasting Noble Tune and Honor Code as her first two foals, Serena's Cat has also thrown the stakes-placed Lady Serena (Bernardini). Her triple stakes-winning dam Serena's Tune also produced the G3 Tetrarch S. and G3 Greenham S. winner Vocalised who stands at Jim Bolger's Redmondstown Stud and has two classy mares to his name now in Steip Amach (Ire) and Vociferous Marina (Ire). Serena's Song's legendary status was assured with a remarkable 11 Grade I victories under the tutelage of D. Wayne Lukas, including the Haskell Invitational and Mother Goose S. and her exploits as a broodmare are also highly significant. Her Grand Reward built on a solid campaign at Ballydoyle to capture the GII Oaklawn H., with fellow graded-stakes winning sires Schramsberg and Harlington complementing Sophisticat (Storm Cat), the impressive winner of the G1 Coronation S. who later produced the listed-winning and graded-stakes placed Sefroua (Kingmambo) and the G1 Cheveley Park S. third Pursuit of Glory (Ire) (Fusaichi Pegasus). #### RATIOCINATION RISING STAR AT CHANTILLY

Ratiocination (Ire) (Excelebration (Ire)), a debut winner in a course-and-distance firsters' heat last time Apr. 16, was positioned in a stalking second from the outset of this one. Nudged along approaching the final quarter mile, the 2-1 favourite quickened to the fore with 300 metres remaining and surged clear under mild urging to easily best Soaring Eagle (Fr) (Cape Cross {Ire}) by an impressive four lengths. The homebred bay is a son of G1 Prix Marcel Boussac-winning highweight Denebola, herself a daughter of MG1SW French highweight Coup de Folie (Mr. Prospector), whose three stakes performers include Listed Prix Imprudence victress Glia (A.P. Indy), who in turn is the granddam of MGISW Emollient (Empire Maker). Denebola is also a half-sister to GSW G1 Prix Morny third Loving Kindness (Seattle Slew), and to the dam of MG1SW sires Bago (Fr) (Nashwan) and Maxios (GB) (Monsun {Ger}). Her granddam is GSW blue hen Coup de Folie (Halo), whose progeny includes Machiavellian (Mr. Prospector) and Exit to Nowhere (Irish River {Fr}).

#### **COVETED VASE**

Now re-established as a significant Derby pointer, Thursday's G3 MBNA Chester Vase is high on the wishlist of Aidan O'Brien and he saddles a quartet as he bids for a fifth consecutive success and eighth in total. It is notable that Ryan Moore is on the least-proven of the stable's runners, but what the Apr. 20 Tipperary maiden scorer Venice Beach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) lacks in form substance he more than makes up for on breeding as a half-brother to the Arc and King George heroine Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}). The Anvil (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who was runner-up in the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Newmarket in September, and the Apr. 28 G3 Sandown Classic Trial scorer Cunco (Ire) (Frankel {GB}) are the standard-bearers to aim at, while another unexposed maiden winner who promises much is Godolphin's Tamleek (Hard Spun). He was powerful in the finish of a 10-furlong contest at Newmarket on Apr. 20 and trainer Saeed bin Suroor is hopeful he can make into a Classic contender.

"Tamleek won well at Newmarket and has been working nicely," he said. "This is another step forward and will tell us which direction to take in the future with him."

#### AIMING FOR DEAUVILLE

With Royal Ascot looming, Thursday's G3 sportingbet.com Huxley S. at Chester offers the opportunity for the G1 Prince of Wales's S. hopefuls to step up and last year's GI Belmont Derby winner **Deauville (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will be a tough nut to crack. Showing he retained all his ability when a length second to Ulysses (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in the G3 Gordon Richards S. over this trip at Sandown on Apr. 28, he has an ideal draw and the drying ground he favours. Ulysses's trainer Sir Michael Stoute has won this a record six times and puts forward Poet's Word (Ire) (Poet's Voice {GB}), who earned a tilt at this level when winning a 10-furlong handicap at Chelmsford on Apr. 13. The owner's racing manager Bruce Raymond said, "He's working nicely and we feel he will improve for his run at Chelmsford, where he won quite tidily. Everyone has been very happy with him since then and I think he's a typical Sir Michael Stoute improving 4-year-old. It does look a tough race, so he'll have to be useful if he's going to win it."

Godolphin's G1 Jebel Hatta and G3 Earl of Sefton S. runner-up Folkswood (GB) (Exceed and Excel (Aus)) is another who would not need to progress markedly to be in the mix and his trainer believes this ever-turning circuit could bring out the best in him. "I think the track will suit him," Charlie Appleby said. "He showed in Meydan he can be very effective on the turn when he gets on the rail and although it's only a small field, it's nice he's got a good draw in stall two. It's a trappy little race, but he's in good order and hopefully he'll run very well."

Enable went unseen until the epilogue of last term's juvenile campaign and opened up with a Nov. 28 one-mile score atop Newcastle's Tapeta surface. She ran into the 'TDN Rising Star' performance of Shutter Speed (GB) (Dansili {GB}) when a fast-finishing third behind that stablemate in a hot 10-furlong Newbury maiden making her only other start on sophomore return Apr. 21, and was the beneficiary of astute tactics from Frankie Dettori to dominate this black-type bow. Stalking the pace in second until sent to the front with just under three furlongs remaining, the homebred bay was kicked into a decisive lead rounding the home turn and stayed on powerfully in the short straight--as even-money pick Alluringly gave vain chase--to claim this stepping stone to Epsom's June 2 G1 Investec Oaks.

"She's a very nice filly and is improving all the time," said Dettori. "I like the way that she quickened and, from 2 1/2 [furlongs] out, she showed a good turn of foot. I saw a bit of daylight and didn't know how well Alluringly was going so, when I got to 2 1/2 to go, I thought it was time to go. I know she stays so I kicked first and she won well. She's a very smart filly."

Racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe added, "Frankie thought they were never going a great pace and she was always very comfortable. She travelled particularly well, she quickened and quickened up again. We're pretty confident she'll stay a mileand-a-half, it looked like she could at Newbury and I would think she'll head to Epsom. This was pretty much the plan, to come here and get her learning and educated. She started off [the season] at Newbury in really encouraging style, in what was a pretty smart race, and the way she has developed is very pleasing."

# DERBY WINNER TAKES FIRST SPIN AROUND OLD HILLTOP



Always Dreaming gets a feel for Pimlico Wednesday | MJC/Jim McCue

Just four days removed from his comfortable victory in the GI Kentucky Derby and a little more than 12 hours after settling into his stall at Pimlico Race Course, **Always Dreaming** (Bodemeister) made his first trip to the racetrack Wednesday morning as he begins his preparations for the GI Preakness S. Saturday, May 20.

Partnered with exercise rider Nick Bush, the \$350,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase took one tour of the main track at around 6:30 a.m. (drone footage), jogging the 'wrong way' in the company of a pony and under the supervision of assistant trainer Ginny DePasquale, for two decades an employee of the Todd Pletcher stable.

"He looked good. He was bright, alert, checking things out, jogging with the pony," said DePasquale, who has been employed by the Pletcher stable for 20 years. "He was ready to go. The pony had to hang on to him, because he wanted to do a little more. We're happy with the way he went this morning (video)."

Always Dreaming, whose sire set all the pace in the 2012 Preakness before being tagged on the wire by Derby winner I'll Have Another, has come out of the race well, according to DePasquale (video).

"The race, I think, took nothing out of him. We're happy. He bounced back almost immediately," she said. **Cont. p3**



#### **Bush Enjoying the Ride...**

When Todd Pletcher saddled Super Saver (Maria's Mon) to his Derby victory in 2010, Nick Bush had been associated with the team for about three years, but never sat on the colt. When Always Dreaming was exhibiting tempestuous behavior during his first few days at Churchill Dows, Pletcher added a set of draw reins and reached out to Bush. The 30-year-old reflected on the events of last weekend with the Pimlico notes team Wednesday morning (video).

"It's special. It's a dream come true," he explained. "As a kid, it was the race I wanted to win. Working with Todd for 10 years, we finally got it done. I was here for [2010 Derby winner] Super Saver, but I wasn't the rider. To be the rider of this one is very special."

And Bush, who grew too big to be a jockey, is happy to ply his trade as an exercise rider for one of the nation's top trainers.


"I enjoy the animal. A lot of people make a lot of money doing jobs they don't like, but I love this job, because of the horses," he said. "The horses have taken me to a lot of places--Dubai, California--lot of places I wouldn't be going if I was just having a normal job. This is me. Horses are me.

"I get along with horses better than I get along with a lot of people," Bush joked. "So, it worked out great."

#### In other Preakness news:

- Owner Tom McKenna has paid \$150,000 to supplement GII Arkansas Derby runner-up **Conquest Mo Money** (Uncle Mo) into the Preakness and is relishing the opportunity to contest a Triple Crown race. "It's a dream come true. I never thought I would be here," McKenna said. "Everybody dreams about it that gets in the horse business, whether you have one horse, two horses or three horses. If you ask anyone what their dream is, they would say, 'I hope to get to the Kentucky Derby.' Everybody tells you that. Did I ever think I would get there? I hoped so. Lo and behold, I'm there."
- Trainer Brendan Walsh has announced that Joel Rosario has the call aboard **Multiplier** (The Factor) in the Preakness. James Graham rode the colt to victory in the GIII Illinois Derby Apr. 22, but has elected to go in a different direction. "He's an experienced rider and a fantastic rider," Walsh said. Though minus a Preakness win, Rosario piloted Ride On Curlin (Curlin) and Take of Verve (Tale of Ekati) to runner-up efforts in 2014 and 2015, respectively.

• Royal Mo (Uncle Mo), who failed to draw in off the alsoeligible list for the Derby, went to the Pimlico main track for the first time Wednesday morning under 17-year-old exercise rider Taylor Leatherman. "[Trainer John Shirreffs] just wanted me to give him a good first day to get him used to everything, just try to keep him collected and make him use himself," she said. "It was a good first day for us to get used to each other."

• After starting three horses in the Derby, Brad Kelley's Calumet Farm will be double-handed in the Preakness, with the announcement Wednesday that **Term of Art** (Tiznow), winner of the rained-off GIII Cecil B. DeMille S. last year, will take his place in the field. "We think he's a talented colt who deserves a chance in this big race," O'Neill said. "We think he has classic-type ability and we're going to roll the dice." Steve Asmussen will saddle Calumet's GIII Sunland Derby hero **Hence** (Street Boss), who exits an 11th-place effort beneath the Twin Spires.

The Chus' remarkable recent fortunes could be chalked up to fantastic luck. But attributing their achievements solely to fate would be a disservice to the determination and perseverance that enabled their entry into the sport. How many newly inspired Thoroughbred owners are willing to fly cross-country to cold-call, in person, one of the preeminent trainers in the game to seek help in starting a racing stable from scratch? How many owners have the very first racehorse they purchase win a graded stakes race on the Triple Crown prep trail? Or have the second crop they buy at auction yield both a Derby starter and an eventual Breeders' Cup race winner? Or see the first foal from their first broodmare approach seven figures at a Saratoga select yearling sale?

"Horses aren't just a business for us. They are really so much more," Chu said quietly but emphatically during a two-hour interview over cups of steaming, exotically fragrant Taiwanese tea in the tidy, welcoming office of her equine management firm 30 miles north of Boston. "The joys that our horses bring us today, we will have for life."

Since immersing herself in the world of Thoroughbreds five years ago, Chu, 51, is both geographically and culturally far removed from her homeland and upbringing. Not only is there no organized horse racing in Taiwan, but Chu had never even come within touching distance of a live horse until after she married Charles, now 52, and had her first two children, Vicky, 25, and Leo, 23.

Three decades ago, Charles made his mark in Asia as a self-driven entrepreneur with a knack for transforming his engineering and design expertise into highly marketable global-positioning satellite technologies. The income he earned from those products afforded their young children an opportunity to experience some special, out-of-the-ordinary Taiwanese activities, like horseback riding. It was quite a trek, Chu recounted, to drive up into the misty mountainous region of the island just to get to where the few horse farms were, but her kids enjoyed riding so much once they tried it that soon they were going every weekend.

"I was so impressed the first time I saw a horse in person," Chu marveled, her expressive features giving way to an easy smile at the recollection. "I had done nothing related to horses--never in my life! I never even thought I could touch a horse. But then I would always touch the horses, pet them--I just loved it."

In those early years, Chu remained "just the driver," content to act as a motherly chauffeur for Vicky and Leo and as an occasional treat-feeder to the docile mixed Taiwanese breeds known locally as "parent-child" horses. But even though the Chus enjoyed a "very good life" and had big families on both sides, Charles wanted to do better. He had a vision for expanding his company to America and had a willing partner in Boston, so as the 21st Century neared, the Chus made the difficult decision to relocate. Charles applied for citizenship, and as Susan tells it, he cleared immigration within six months "probably because Charlie has such a strong background" in technology. The Chus felt relief tinged with apprehension when a government official concluded a final interview with Charles by saying, "I want to welcome your whole family to the United States."

# ET TU? CONTESSA STRIKES AGAIN WITH CHILEAN IMPORT

Much was said and written about several performances on the GII Wood Memorial S. card Apr. 8 at Aqueduct. Irish War Cry (Curlin) appeared to stamp himself as a leading GI Kentucky Derby contender with a convincing victory in the Wood and Miss Sky Warrior (Sky Mesa) stole the show with a 13-length romp in the GII Gazelle S.

Earlier, in what looked on paper like an unremarkable renewal of the GIII Excelsior S., a pair of older males locked horns in a thrilling stretch battle. An entertaining race to be sure, but its significance wasn't made apparent until that night, when the Beyer Speed Figures for the day were released.

Send It In (Big Brown), an honest New York-bred campaigner for Paul Pompa, Jr. who had never run higher than a 104 previously, earned a gigantic 119 Beyer for his half-length win, a figure matched only by the world's highest-rated racehorse Arrogate (Unbridled's Song) in the past six months. But it was the horse Send It In collared late, **Tu Brutus (Chi)** (Scat Daddy), who really opened eyes, setting a blistering pace for the slow track and 10-furlong distance of :23.40, :47.20 and 1:11.19, and holding on gamely to be 14 lengths clear of third, posting a 118 Beyer of his own. The Excelsior was the chestnut's first start in over four months and his first North American outing after running 16 times in his native land.

Many scoffed at these monster numbers, maintaining that they were aberrations and neither horse could actually hold a candle to Arrogate. No one's laughing now though. Not after Tu Brutus returned to post a front-running, 11-length romp in Sunday's Flat Out S. at Belmont, earning a 109 Beyer with speed to spare and stamping himself as a major player in the older male division.

Tu Brutus's trainer, Gary Contessa, has shown a keen eye for picking out a Chilean import. Turco Bravo (Chi) (Caesarion {Ire}), transferred to Contessa's barn from Chile in the fall of 2014, earned back-to-back upset scores in Aqueduct's Stymie S. in 2015 and 2016 and added a victory in the Birdstone S. last August. The success of the now 8-year-old gelding, who was a distant fourth behind Tu Brutus Sunday, gave Contessa the backing to take another stab in Chile.

"It helped, because now people think I know what I'm doing looking at a South American horse," the lifelong New Yorker said of buying and campaigning Turco Bravo. "People look to me and they think, 'well he got it right the first time, maybe lightning will strike twice,' and sure enough, it did. From the moment I got Tu Brutus, I knew he was a better horse, he was a different kind of horse than

Turco. Turco is a good horse, but this horse trains like he could be something special. So far, he hasn't disappointed."

Contessa was approached by native Chilean and Hall of Fame former jockey Jose Santos last fall to take a look at a horse he thought might be an upgraded version of Turco Bravo. The colt had made some waves on turf in Chile, winning a Group 3 at Valparaiso in December of 2015 (video) and running third at 45-1 in the G1 El Derby (video) there two months later. But Tu Brutus fully blossomed once switched to dirt during the Chilean winter, reeling off four consecutive easy victories by a combined 26 1/4 lengths.

"I sat there watching all the replays and every race he wins, he wins with something left," Contessa recalled. "And it's every distance, every imaginable kind of race, every direction. He's really an amazing horse. I loved his body language, and I got Winning Move [Stable] to watch the replays also. [Managing partner] Steve Sigler loved his body language as well and he said, 'OK, I'm in.'"

Contessa cobbled together a partnership of six owners, including longtime clients Winning Move and Leonard Green, and purchased Tu Brutus for \$175,000. The horse shipped to Miami in January and was put through quarantine, a harrowing experience according to Contessa, before joining the conditioner's Florida string.

"He did not take the quarantine well," Contessa said. "In quarantine, they don't let the trainers in there, they don't let your veterinarians go in there, they handle everything. I don't know what they feed them, but they don't exercise them, they stay in a stall and they're monitored. It's not a very nice thing. But then I took him to my barn at Palm Meadows and he rebounded guickly. I would say within a month or so, he was really training well, with enthusiasm. He was starting to look good and he put back on the weight he had lost."

By mid-March, Contessa had Tu Brutus ready to run, but that became another ordeal, one that makes his Excelsior effort all the more impressive.

"I had a race picked out for him at Gulfstream in the middle of March, I entered him and the race didn't go," Contessa relayed. "So I want to run him now, I've got him ready to run, and I van him from Gulfstream to Laurel for a stake race. Then it snows and they cancel racing. So then I van him back to my barn in New York and we miss like a week of training. I really wanted him to have one under his belt before I ran him in the Excelsior, so my feeling was he was maybe 75-80% ready and boy, he ran his eyeballs out. It was a really, really good race, but he's a good workhorse. He's the kind of horse you can bring to the races on works, because he gives you a lot in the morning."

Now, with Tu Brutus having legitimized the Excelsior effort with his Flat Out romp, Contessa and his partners can start to dream big. And there's no bigger dream than taking on the big horse on the block.

"I actually look forward to the day when we get to run against Arrogate," Contessa says. "Will we? I don't even know. Maybe in the Pegasus, maybe in the Whitney, I don't know what his plans are. But yeah, there's a gaping hole [in the older male divison] after Arrogate, and let's not forget [Send It In], he ran a big race too. I'm sure we're gonna meet him again shortly and I really think that my horse is a better horse than he was when he ran in the Excelsior. More than likely, this is the best horse I've ever had. I think the sky's the limit for him."

Tu Brutus, who will be pointed next to either the GII Brooklyn Invitational S. June 10 or the July 8 GII Suburban H., has already made one thing certain for Contessa. In the future, when he wants to import a Chilean runner, he won't have much trouble finding owners to take that leap of faith with him.

Monmouth Park opens for its 72nd season of racing Saturday and, while the state's racing and breeding industries continue to face significant challenges, track officials remain optimistic about the sport's future and are committed to presenting fans with a memorable experience at the Jersey Shore.

"We continue our efforts to create a fan-friendly facility coupled with top-class racing in New Jersey," commented Dennis Drazin, advisor to Darby Development LLC, which has operated the track for the last five years. "Our goal of bringing alternative gaming to the racetrack remains paramount. We are surrounded by states with casino-fueled purses, which has put us at a distinctive competitive disadvantage."

While the battle for sports betting, currently under appeal to the United States Supreme Court, is ongoing, Monmouth Park has found other ways of attracting fans to the historic oval. The track has teamed up with well-known local eateries and will offer patrons a wide range of food and beverage options at reduced prices.

"It's an exciting new time, not just for Monmouth Park, but more importantly for our fans," said Thomas Barone, vice president of food and beverage. "From the parterres to the picnic area and everywhere in between, there are entirely new menus, food prices, drink specials and dining options."

Among the new stands will be Shore staples Max's Famous Hot Dogs--favorite local hangout for trainer Bob Baffert when he's in town--and Strollo's Lighthouse Homemade Italian Ice. Lexingtonbased Kentucky Ale will set up shop at the north end of the grandstand and New Jersey Craft Brew and 'Que will be located just outside the paddock and will feature classic barbecue items and a selection of craft beers.

"We want to give the fans what they want," Barone explained. "This is a summer facility and our new concessions and menu choices will reflect that. We're certain these changes will be just as well received and we are excited about bringing them to the racetrack."

Fans will also be treated to lower concession prices--the cost of beer will be down nearly 50% from 2016--as Monmouth Park's food and beverage department will be run in-house for the first time in 2017.

"It's been a great five years so far," Drazin said. "But certainly no time to rest on our laurels. We are proud of our accomplishments and the hard work that has brought them to fruition, we know much work needs to be done. We will continue our job of ensuring a bright future for Monmouth Park and racing in the Garden State for many years to come."

Monmouth's 2017 season runs from May 13 through Sept. 10.

A Louisiana-bred filly from the first crop of three-time Grade I winner Flat Out (Flatter) fetched a final bid of \$110,000 from Keith and Ginger Myers' Coteau Grove Farm to top Tuesday's Equine Sales Company of Louisiana Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age in Opelousas. The topper represented a new record price for the auction, which also saw the average increase by 37.1% to \$20,300, while the median price of \$13,000 represented a 13% gain.

Al Pike's Pike Racing consigned eight horses as agent and offered the sale's top three juveniles. The Myerses, who have built a formidable operation in a short period of time at Coteau Grove, were extended to \$110,000 for hip 29, the first foal out of Langsyne (Langfuhr), a daughter of MSP New Hope Seven

(Carson City) and a half-sister to Requite (Warrior's Reward), a stakes winner and runner-up in the GII Amsterdam S. The further female family includes prominent sire Hard Spun (Danzig).

Flat Out is already the sire of Keeneland maiden winner Flat Drunk and has been represented by an additional three sixfigure horses at this year's juvenile sales.

Coteau Grove is the breeder of the day's second-dearest lot, a first-crop colt by Vioence, who was hammered down to Bowling Bloodstock for \$100,000. The Myerses acquired the colt's stakes-winning dam for \$67,000 carrying hip 45 in utero and paid that bill when reselling the foal to Albert Davis for \$85,000 at Keeneland November in 2015. The colt's second dam was a half-sister to the talented turf runner License Fee (Black Tie Affair {Ire}).

"I think we have continued to improve the quality of this sale and that shows in the results this year," said Foster Bridewell, sales director. "We are very pleased with the results and are looking forward to our consignor select and open yearling/mixed sales later this year."


