



WINTER'S DAY AT ROYAL ASCOT

Susan Magnier's Winter (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) lit up Newmarket's Rowley Mile when annexing last month's G1 1000 Guineas, repeating the dose more impressively when besting stablemates Roly Poly (War Front) and Hydrangea (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in the G1 Irish equivalent three weeks later, and she powered home in Friday's G1 Coronation S. as that trifecta was replicated at Royal Ascot. Allowed time to find a rhythm under cover in fourth after exiting the outside box, the 4-9 favourite cruised into contention off the home turn and dominated under urging once pouncing for control with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining to comfortably account for Roly Poly by 2 1/4 lengths, with Hydrangea a further neck away in third. "She was really impressive and did that really well," said Anne-Marie O'Brien. "She's really good and had to battle, but was by far the most superior there." Husband and trainer Aidan added, "She's a filly thriving from race to race. She travelled well, Ryan [Moore] had her in a lovely position and she came home really well. She's very classy, she gets the [one-mile] trip really well and gallops out strong when asked. [Former trainer] David [Wachman] thought the world of her last year and she's just getting better and better." Moore heaped further praise on the winner and continued, "She's very professional and only does what she has to do. It's a hard task to win two Guineas and then come here, but the trainer can do those magic things. She's beaten good horses from France and America, it's concrete form and she's a high-class filly." 
On a day when it was too hot even to break out of a walk, the Clive Cox-trained filly had her joyful owners sprinting for the winner's enclosure after her victory over favourite Happy Like A Fool (Distorted Humor) in the G2 Queen Mary S. on Wednesday.

"When we set this syndicate up six years ago, the whole idea was to get people into racing horses who wouldn't normally do so and perhaps couldn't afford to do so on their own but loved racing and loved going racing," said Lillingston. "I know the team behind Merriebelle Stable pretty well and I know that they came here full of confidence with Happy Like A Fool. Frankly, I thought that the best we could hope for was second, but two furlongs out I started to think it just might be our day." Cont. p13

Winter becomes just the second filly to complete the 1000 Guineas-Irish 1000 Guineas-Coronation S. treble, following Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) in 2004, and may tread a similar path to that trailblazer, who lost her perfect record in Newmarket's G1 Falmouth S. backing up her win here. "We might head to the [July 14] Falmouth in three weeks' time, but we will see how she is as she has had four quick races in not a lot of time," O'Brien revealed.

Reflecting on the performances of Roly Poly and Hydrangea, O'Brien continued, "We're delighted with them both and they have run crackers." Roly Poly's jockey Seamus Heffernan was in agreement and said, "It was a good run and they are three really good fillies." Hydrangea's rider Padraig Beggy was reading from the same script and opined, "Hydrangea has run a cracker, she does not know how to run a bad race and always tries her best. I got a little outpaced on that ground, but she tries her best and it doesn't really matter what the ground is. On that surface, she'd get a mile-and-a-quarter."

Winter is followed by two more sired by Galileo--the 2-year-old filly Snowflakes (Ire), who ran eighth in the G3 Albany S. earlier in the day, and a yearling filly. BARNSTORMER

It was billed by many as the race of the current Royal meeting, and Friday's G1 Commonwealth Cup did not disappoint, with Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) getting the better of the Godolphin pair of Harry Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel (Ire)) and Blue Point (Ire) (Shamardal) close home to provide the middle part of a Group 1 treble for Ballydoyle this week. Hardening into 5-6 favouritism despite the healthy respect shown to his opponents, Susan Magnier's unbeaten grey--who had given notice that he was back when powering to success in Naas's G3 Lacken S.--gave a moment of concern when rearing in the stalls before racing midpack as Harry Angel served it up on the front end. It took until the last 100 yards for last year's G1 Phoenix S. and G2 Coventry S. winner to get to the royal blue contingent, but at the line he had 3/4 of a length to spare with Harry Angel, who heroically held off Blue Point by a half-length. "He got into a good rhythm in the race and they were two very good colts leading him, so I had to wake him up to do it and it is hard to make up ground here today for whatever reason," jockey Ryan Moore explained. "It's the first time he's been asked a serious question and he was a bit unsure at first. Although they made him work, he picked them up well in the end. I think that was a fairly exceptional race and he beat two very good horses who weren't stopping. I think there is some more improvement in him."



Whatever has been thrown at Caravaggio, he has dealt with with an admirable professionalism alongside his obvious class. Contending with rain-eased going when landing the Listed Marble Hill S. at The Curragh last May, he had those conditions again when also overcoming a draw which placed him away from the pace in this meeting's G2 Coventry S. the following month.

His 2-year-old farewell was a premature one, as after his stroll in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh in August he was ruled out of the G1 Middle Park S. with a setback and as he was prepared for his sophomore season there was talk of a Guineas bid, which only went away in the lead-up to the Poule d'Essai des Poulains. Set fair for a sprinting route which began with the G3 Lacken S. at Naas on May 21, Caravaggio beat the Coventry placegetter Psychedelic Funk by the same margin that he had at last year's Royal meeting, which showed he was at least where he was in 2016.

With Harry Angel blazing the trail up ahead, the much-vaunted pride of Ballydoyle was able to take his time in mid-division and move into the race just as the pace was becoming too hard to sustain. Despite Harry Angel having done too much early on, Caravaggio had to fight to get alongside the talented Clive Cox representative and the determined Blue Point with a half-furlong left, and it was only in the final drag to the line that he asserted his superiority. Interestingly, the Lacken third Mr Scarlet (GB) (Dandy Man {Ire}) was 6 1/4 lengths behind Caravaggio this time, having been 6 1/2 behind in the Lacken.

As if this success in such a strong renewal of this new contest was not enough, Aidan O'Brien was suggesting there was plenty to come. "We were treating it as a second-stage race, as he had a lovely race at Naas when he won last time," he said. "He was racing against 3-year-olds again today and after that, we thought he would be stepping up against older horses. He was just ready for his next step today. The lads had it in their mind to come here and then maybe somewhere like the [July 15 G1] July Cup [at Newmarket] and then somewhere else after that. The lads have a plan in their mind that he might go to Australia for The Everest [at Randwick on Oct. 14], so we have to be very conscious now if we want him to last for the autumn."

"I was very nervous as he was just ready to come through today--he was just ready as we hadn't really chased him but we always knew he was very brave," he said. "Ryan was super confident on him and put him to sleep in the race. He said he would have a look at halfway where everybody was and that is what he did. He had plenty to do at halfway behind two good horses and he only raced for two-and-a-half furlongs. He was very relaxed in himself before the race--he was very natural and there was no edge to him. He is a natural free sweater anyway, but I was surprised by how cool he was--he is a very calm horse. He is very quick, I would be happier at two furlongs than six furlongs with this fella. He is the fastest horse we have ever had. We felt that, because it was his second run back, we were afraid to do too much because we didn't want to lose that brilliance that he has.

I'd say there's plenty left, as he wasn't worked up to it in any way and we were letting him come along slowly." John Magnier added, "Every time we get a winner here, it always means something. We were unlucky to lose Scat Daddy a few years ago and this horse is his fourth winner at Royal Ascot this year.

Hopefully, this fellow will take his place. He is unbeaten so far, so fingers crossed. He is a better racehorse than Scat Daddy and it is a cross that we need. It's just fortunate for us that he has come at the right time, like the cavalry."

Harry Angel lived up to his billing and trainer Clive Cox was delighted afterwards. "It was a great run, a great horse race," he commented. "He wore his heart on his sleeve a little bit there, but when you take the blindfold off them and they jump that quick there's not a lot you can do about it. Adam [Kirby] has given him a great ride and it was a very, very special race. I don't think it will be long before he takes his revenge in a Group 1 race. We'll see how he comes back from this race, but we're just very pleased with this." Blue Point's trainer Charlie Appleby said of the third, "It was a great race to watch and it was billed as a great sprint, so none of them let it down. From my personal point of view, he needs to get on a flatter track as he has all the attributes for that. He travels very well and has got a turn of foot, so he has an array of options."

Caravaggio is a half-brother to the GII Gallant Bloom H. winner My Jen, who descends from the stakes-winning and GII Black Helen H. runner-up Silver in Flight. She in turn is the second dam of the GIII Lexington S. and GIII Lawrence Realization H. winner and GI Secretariat S. third Sharp Performance (Kris S.). Silver In Flight's stakes-winning half-sister Stark Winter (Graustark) is the dam of the four-times Grade I-winning sire Bien Bien and the GIII Long Branch S. and GIII Royal Palm H.-winning sire Dr. Schwartzman. This is also the family of the GI Donn H. winner Spring At Last and the GI Las Virgenes S. heroine Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band), who was responsible for this stable's group performers by Galileo (Ire), Foundry (Ire) and Housesofparliament (Ire), the latter of which was third in last year's G1 St Leger. SOLID AS A ROCK

Permian (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) weakened to finish 10th in the June 3 G1 Epsom Derby after beating subsequent G3 Hampton Court S. hero Benbatl (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in last month's G2 Dante S. at York, and his aptitude for a battle was in evidence once again as he delivered another Royal winner for trainer Mark Johnston in Friday's G2 King Edward VII S. at Ascot. Positioned in a prominent second after William Buick steadily angled his mount across the track from a wide gate, the 6-1 chance was stoked up on the home turn to seize control at the top of the straight and he kept on ruggedly under a final-quarter drive to bravely hold Khalidi (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}) by a half-length, with Crystal Ocean (GB) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) becoming yet another placegetter for the Sir Michael Stoute team a further 1 1/4 lengths adrift in third. "Mark [Johnston] gave me a lot of confidence beforehand, in the sense that he just wanted the horse to go forward and get across," explained Buick after registering his third win of the week. "I wanted to go forward without asking him too much and the horse did exactly that. You don't want to be traveling too wide around here and he got a nice pitch when they steadied the tempo down. Mark and the team were surprised how bad he ran in the Derby and I wasn't any help as I had no explanation either. He certainly felt like a much better horse today and it was a good performance."

Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum's bay was second to Cracksman (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in Epsom's Apr. 26 Investec Derby Trial before adding the May 6 Listed Newmarket S. to a resume which now reads six wins from a dozen starts. He is not the first to bounce back from a 10th in the Derby to win this "Ascot Derby," as the feat had already been achieved by the Sir Michael Stoute-trained duo Papal Bull (GB) in 2006 and Across the Stars (Ire) (Sea the Stars {Ire}) last year.

Khalidi fared worse than Permian at Epsom, finishing 14th, and he too bounced back here. John Gosden was understandably delighted with his performance and said, "He ran a great race and I am thrilled with him. He's had a lot of racing, as has the winner, and both have run exceptional races for horses who have been so busy. We'll see where we are and where we go from here, but he's a real tough cookie. It was difficult in the race for Olivier [Peslier] to get where he wanted to get. The winner had first run on us, but Khalidi has run his heart out and done nothing wrong at all. It was a great performance." Peslier added, "He has run well, but we just could not get there and the line came too soon."

Sir Michael Stoute remains tied atop Royal Ascot's all-time leaderboard with Sir Henry Cecil on 75 winners after yet another placing this week, but he was nonetheless happy with the run of Crystal Ocean. "It was a good run and it shows he is consistent," said the Newmarket-based conditioner. "He is a horse with a lot of scope and will progress." Crystal Ocean's rider Andrea Atzeni added, "The pace was a bit to slow, but it was a good run and he is improving. He is a horse for the future."

LEAGUE OF HER OWN

Largely ignored at 20-1, **Different League (Fr)** provided her first-season sire Dabirsim (Fr) with a momentous result as she upstaged the 2-1 favourite Alpha Centauri (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in a thrilling finish to Friday's G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot. Last seen doubling her tally over this trip at Angers on May 23, the bay tanked her way to the front of the far-side group before the furlong pole under Antoine Hamelin. Kicking decisively passing the quarter pole, she was always holding the similarly unbeaten market-leader in the run to the line, where she held a neck advantage. "She's a great filly and this is a dream," Hamelin said. "Beforehand, I wanted to sit fourth or fifth, but she got to the front and was not at her maximum. The other filly just pushed me on."

Sent to the Maisons-Laffitte-based trainer Matthieu Palussiere after failing to make her reserve at Doncaster in August, Different League became the second winner for her Haras du Grandcamp-based freshman sire when scoring on debut over five furlongs at Lyon-Parilly on May 11 and 12 days later followed up by two lengths at Angers with the first two clear of the remainder. Showing the kind of natural pace expected of a Wesley Ward trainee throughout the early stages, she had that trainer's Fairyland (Scat Daddy) covered inside the last two furlongs as the chief American raider started to tire having led the stand's-side bunch. It was just the Irish sensation Alpha Centauri who could go with the filly who had raced solely in the French provinces as the line approached and although the runner-up never gave up the chase she never looked likely to get there.

Palussiere was entirely surprised by the result, which marks a watershed moment in his career. "I was confident of a very good run, but to win I didn't know," he said. "I was a little worried as she jumped out, but she has a great temperament and is very professional. After two or three furlongs I was confident--the jockey knows her well. Her first start was just an educational, but her performance at Angers on her second start was exceptional. We were always going to come here for this. She has many options now, we have a few ideas in our heads." Palussiere, who previously spent 18 years in Ireland, including four with the Aga Khan Studs and four with trainer Michael Halford, was reflecting on a pinnacle of that period. "It means everything to me, I have always wanted to win a big one in England--at Royal Ascot or Cheltenham, as I have a few jumpers too," he added. Bansha House Stables maestro Con Marnane was on hand for the celebrations and said.

"We picked her up for eight grand, but we couldn't sell her as a yearling--we had her in at Doncaster Sales last year, but couldn't sell her. Nobody wanted her, but I am glad they didn't--she's an absolute beauty. We'd love to put her away for the Breeders' Cup, if failing that returning after the summer for some of the autumn Group 1s."

Jessica Harrington was unperturbed after Alpha Centauri's first defeat. "The other filly just got first run on her," she commented. "She's never had to race that hard before, she's done everything very easily. The further she was going, the more she was putting her head down. Another couple of strides, she might have got it."

Phoenix Thoroughbred Limited's Take Me With You (Scat Daddy) managed to gain third place and come out best of the stand's side, but trainer Jeremy Noseda had his own ideas about a track bias. "I'm just infuriated by watering policies," he said. "Why are they watering this ground? Why 4mm of water last night? The whole bias of the track has changed. The watering in this country has become absurd and ridiculous and I'm frustrated. I've never encouraged anyone to water the track. Watering of these racecourses has come to a point where it's absolutely ridiculous. If the Clerk of the Course, by his watering, wants to make results, then make results. But watering is changing results, it's not natural. Watering is not creating fair racing."

CALLING THE TUNE

Royal Ascot's G2 Queen's Vase has been the exclusive domain of Sir Michael Stoute, Saeed bin Suroor, Mark Johnston and Aidan O'Brien this century, but it was the turn of John Gosden-who registered his sole success in 1992 with Landowner (Ire) (Kris {GB})--to crash the party as the Bjorn Nielsen homebred **Stradivarius (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) outstayed his rivals to prevail in Friday's latest edition. Fresh from an Apr. 19 10furlong handicap score at Beverley and a last-out second upped to an extended 12 panels around Chester's tight turns last time on May 10, the 11-2 chance was buried under cover along the fence in seventh as Johnston's Time to Study (Fr) (Motivator (GB)) bounded along on the front end. Andrea Atzeni remained unflustered when caught in traffic off the home turn and weaved a passage to the front with 100 yards remaining, driving out his mount to assert by a neck from Count Octave (GB) (Frankel {GB}) as **Secret Advisor (Fr)** (Dubawi {Ire}) ran on from the rear to finish two lengths back in third. "We planned this race for some time after Chester, Andrea's ridden him beautifully from an outside draw and saved ground all the way," Gosden explained. "He slipped here, he slipped there, wriggle, wriggle, and found his way through. He's not a big horse and won it in good style. He's a [G1] St Leger type, he's improving all the time and has a great attitude."

Reduced in distance from two miles and upgraded to Group 2 status for the first time this year, the contest is an ideal trial for Doncaster's Sept. 16 G1 St Leger, notwithstanding Leading Light (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire})'s victories in both four years ago. John Gosden confirmed the world's oldest Classic as the chestnut's target and said, "He enjoyed the distance and all being well, we will point him to the St Leger. I think he might just have one more run before then. He is a light-framed horse and I want to keep him fresh. He doesn't need over-racing so he can just have a prep run and then go."

Runner-up Count Octave is also a St Leger possible, according to trainer Andrew Balding, and may take in that race's traditional stepping stone, York's Aug. 23 G2 Great Voltigeur S., en route to Doncaster. "This is only his fourth career start, he's still learning and we're delighted with him," Balding said. "He's a horse for the future and is a lovely stayer going forward. He might just be a Leger horse this year, but he wouldn't want the ground too soft as he's a top-of-the-ground horse. I think York would suit him very well as a track. Obviously we've got to discuss it with Sheikh Fahad, but to me it would be the obvious place for him." Cont. p11

Charlie Appleby was equally pleased after Secret Advisor made up ground from rear in the straight to get up for third nearing the line. "I am delighted with that," he said. "We always felt he'd improve with stepping up in trip and he is a nice horse for the future. This is only the fourth race of his career and he should improve more. Staying is going to be his game, that is what he is bred to do." Rider William Buick added, "It was a good run, but he wasn't really travelling early on so I had to settle at the back. They didn't go a great gallop, he made up great ground at the end and is one for the future."

JUBILEE OF SPEED

Royal Ascot's action goes out with a bang on Saturday as Limato (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) heads a heavyweight cast in the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. While he has his downturns, on his day he is the finest older sprinter in Europe as he proved when running away with last year's G1 July Cup at Newmarket and G1 Prix de la Foret at Chantilly in October. Owner Paul Jacobs and trainer Henry Candy have no doubts that the easy ground scuppered his chance when 10th in the G1 Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan on Mar. 25, and he has needed all of the subsequent time off to regain his verve. "Hopefully it will still be good, fast ground on Saturday," Candy said. "If we don't get too much rain, it should be perfect. I've never seen him more depressed than when he got home from Dubai. I was surprised how much it did affect him. We had to force him a lot to get him as near fit as we could for World Cup night, then the ground was atrocious. He couldn't get any purchase on it and he pulled a lot of muscles and I think that is what got to him.

It has just been a case of giving him plenty of time. It has taken us a long time to get him back to his old self, but he seems to be there now. He is full of cheek and full of fun and he is working well, so I'm happy."

Fred Archer Racing's **The Tin Man (GB)** (Equiano {Fr}) returns to the scene of his career-best win in the G1 Qipco British Champions Sprint S. in October and he was carrying a penalty when fifth on his return in the G2 Duke of York S. at York on May 17. The clear-cut winner of that rain-affected contest was Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Tasleet (GB) (Showcasing {GB}), but he has vastly contrasting ground conditions to deal with as he bids to uphold his 2 1/2-length success from Magical Memory (Ire) (Zebedee {GB}). Tasleet's trainer William Haggas would prefer some rain after that performance, but he remains open-minded about the reason for the 4-year-old's sudden improvement. "He'd struggled on soft ground as a 2-year-old, so if anybody listened to me before he went to York I sadly put them off," he explained. "I'd always tried to avoid it, but he looked to relish it at York. I wouldn't mind a bit of give, but I think the drop back in trip suited him more."

Kennet Valley Thoroughbreds's **Magical Memory (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB}) was fourth when favourite for this race staged on unsuitable good-to-soft last year and although he may have won had the rain not arrived he was seventh behind Limato in the July Cup and now has something to prove. The owners' racing manager Sam Hoskins is keeping the faith. "Charlie [Hills] is very happy with the horse and I think we've got to be delighted with the draw in stall 18," he commented. "He ran a cracker in the race last year to be beaten only half a length and we were really happy with his reappearance at York. Hopefully he should get much closer to Tasleet and hopefully that will be good enough to put him right in the mix."

King's Stand S. cont.

There was only a nose between **The Right Man (GB)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) and **Long On Value** (Value Plus) when Limato flopped in the Al Quoz Sprint and although the betting suggests they will only be bit-players this time, The Right Man is already on the road for a \$1-million Global Sprint Challenge bonus and Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott is saddling his first runner at this meeting in the possibly aptly-named Long On Value. His son and assistant Riley Mott said, "Since we've brought him back in distance he's been coming from well off the pace in his races. With him it's just a matter of getting him relaxed, whether he is up close or further back to allow him to find his stride."





STRONG CURRENTS

The Queen's Royal Ascot fortunes have taken a major upturn in recent times and last year's G2 Hardwicke S. was a notable moment for the monarch as **Dartmouth (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) prevailed in a thriller to send the meeting's faithful home fulfilled. Subsequently third in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and runner-up in the GI Canadian International at Woodbine in October, he was back in rude health to win the May 19 G2 Yorkshire Cup and Ryan Moore has been released by Coolmore to retain his partnership. "He's in good shape and he knows his way around the track," commented Sir Michael Stoute, who already boasts a record-breaking 10 wins in this. "He loves the track--he's solid."

Twelve months ago, Moore was on Exospheric (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) instead of the runner-up Highland Reel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and this time he deserts that Ballydoyle luminary's full-brother **Idaho (Ire)**. Despite that move, the feeling is very much that 'TDN Rising Star' Idaho is a good horse waiting to happen and this could be the moment his luck turns around. Unseating today's rider Seamie Heffernan in the home straight in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September, last year's G1 Irish Derby runner-up, G1 Epsom Derby third and G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner was slowly away when fifth in the Canadian International and needed his comeback when sixth behind Highland Reel in Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup on June 2.

Lady Bamford's **Wings of Desire (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) split Highland Reel and Dartmouth in the King George and may have found the G1 Juddmonte International coming too quick when ninth in that contest in August. Not seen since, the homebred faces a tough reintroduction as he prepares for another tilt at next month's showpiece event here. St Albans Bloodstock's **Dal Harraild (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}) relished an extra two furlongs when winning York's Listed Grand Cup on May 27, but is threatening to mature into a serious pattern-race performer while last year's G2 King Edward VII S. winner **Across the Stars (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}) needs to find marked improvement off his return fifth behind Hawkbill (Kitten's Joy) and My Dream Boat (Ire) (Lord Shanakill) in the G3 Aston Park S. over this trip at Newbury on May 20.

Lillingston added, "Clive [Cox] has always thought that she just might be special but he had measured our expectations very well from the start."

Doubtless cheering every bit as heartily as the Hot To Trot members were the filly's breeders, Chris, Nicky and Ed Harper of Whitsbury Manor Stud, who currently lease two fillies to the club.

"Whitsbury Manor Stud have leased us fillies right from the very start which has been a huge help to us as it's not always easy to lease horses that you want to lease," Lillingston added, explaining that all seven of the club's horses in training are leased from breeders. "We started this year thinking that this was the best group we'd ever had but none of that could make us imagine what has happened today. We've had some very loyal owners over the years and our share of winners but today puts the cherry on top of the icing on the cake. Fifty-two members of the syndicate were at Ascot so it was quite a thrill for us all."

For Ed Harper, now director of the Hampshire stud which has become synonymous with breeding classy sprinters, the leasing arrangement works well. He said, "We've leased five fillies to Hot To Trot in total and all of them have won as 2-year-olds. We're proud of that record and the pressure is on to keep it up as Sam and I are good friends."

"The system works for us as we get the fillies back as future broodmares," he added. "We try to put up fillies with nice pedigrees that we think could be good and we're already thinking about what we might have for next year."

Christophe Clement made the move from France to the U.S. in 1991 and quickly established himself as a top turf trainer. He has churned out top grass runners, such as three-time champion Gio Ponti; MGISWs Voodoo Dancer, Winchester and Hard Not to Like; and Grade I winners Rutherienne and Discreet Marq.

In 2014, Clement proved his talent also extended to dirt runners when Tonalist captured that year's GI Belmont S., ending now four-time Eclipse winner California Chrome's bid for Triple Crown glory. The "TDN Rising Star" also provided his conditioner with back-to-back victories in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and closed out his career with an exciting score in the 2015 GI Cigar Mile.

While Tonalist has since retired to Lane's End, Clement still has a Grade I-winning dirt horse in the barn in **Yellow Agate** (Gemologist) and, as always, is loaded with top turf horses.

• BEST PERFORMANCE (f, 2, Broken Vow)

West Point Thoroughbreds and Tango Uniform Racing's Best Performance donned cap and gown on debut at Belmont May 17 (video) and followed up with a game second in that venue's Astoria S. June 8.



Winner of the 2016 GII Honey Fox S. and GI Just a Game S. for previous owner Phaedrus Flights and trainer Bill Mott, Celestine was purchased by Moyglare Stud Farm for \$2.55 million at the Keeneland November sale and transferred to Clement to race another season. Kicking off her 2017 season for these connections with a victories in the Mar. 4 Sand Springs S. and Apr. 1 Honey Fox at Gulfstream, the dark bay was a disappointing fifth when attempting a title defense in the Just a Game June 10.

"She was a little jarred up after the Just a Game and a little bit stiff, but very manageable. She's getting a little bit of a break and then we will bring her back. I'm not sure where at the moment. We will put her well being first, then work her, then go from there."



• DISCO PARTNER (h, 5, Disco Rico)

Patricia Generazio homebred Disco Partner is two-for-two so far in 2017. Kicking off this term with a win in the Elusive Quality S. at Belmont Apr. 29, the gray set a new world record for six furlongs on the turf with a sizzling victory in the GIII Jaipur S. in 1:05.67 on the GI Belmont S. undercard June 10 (video).

"He trained very well before the race and he was actually very impressive when came back going 7/8ths at Belmont this year. We are going to train him for a race called the Forbidden Apple [S. July 15] in New York. We are going to try and stretch him to a mile or more. Obviously he stays a mile, we will have much more choices, and if he doesn't, I will bring him back to sprinting afterwards."



PURE SENSATION (g, 6, Zensational)

Three-time graded winner Pure Sensation finished a respectable third in last term's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint and checked in fourth in his seasonal bow in Churchill's GIII Twin Spires Turf Sprint S. May 5. Sent off as the second-choice in the Jaipur, the Generazio homebred could not hang on after setting very sharp fractions early and finished fourth to his stablemate.

"I think he was very unlucky in the Jaipur. He got into a speed duel and they went too quick, but he still had a good race and only got beat in the last sixteenth of a mile. He is set to work this weekend with Kendrick Carmouche and if he is doing well, the plan would be to run him in the [GIII] Parx Dash [July 8]."


• FROSTMOURNE (c, 3, Speightstown)

Winner of the Awad S. last term, Green Lantern Stables homebred Frostmourne checked in second in Aqueduct's Woodhaven S. Apr. 22 and returned to winning ways with his first graded success in the GIII Penn Mile June 3 (video).

"Frostmourne came out of the Penn Mile in very good shape and is training forwardly. The plan is to run him in the [GIII] Kent [S. July 15] at Delaware, but he is still possible for the [GI] Belmont Derby [July 8]."

• LULL (f, 3, War Front)

Winner of the Juvenile Fillies S. at Kentucky Downs last term, Lull finished second to the highly-regarded La Coronel (Colonel John) next out in Keeneland's GIII Jessamine S. and closed out 2016 with a fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf Nov. 4. A disappointing seventh behind La Coronel in the GIII Appalachian S. in Lexington Apr. 13, the Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider homebred missed by just a nose when second in Belmont's Soaring Softly S. May 20 and is entered in Saturday's Wild Applause S. over that course.

"Lull is doing great. She is supposed to run tomorrow. I just hope the weather cooperates. She is a much better filly on firm than on soft. I have always liked her a lot. I think she is a tremendous filly and she trains like a very nice horse. I know she got beat last time, but I don't think she lost anything in defeat. Let's see what happens tomorrow and we will go from there."

• SQUEEZE (f, 4, Lemon Drop Kid)

Robert Evans' Squeeze opened her account with a win at Keeneland in April 2016 and was tabbed a "TDN Rising Star" after an impressive allowance score at Belmont last June (video). Sidelined after that victory, the dark bay is scheduled to return

in the third race at Belmont Saturday.

"She is coming off a long layoff and also a major soft tissue injury as a 3-year-old, but she seems to have healed well. Her works have been satisfactory and I guess the next step is to run her."

YELLOW AGATE (f, 3, Gemologist)

China Horse Club's Yellow Agate followed up on her debut win at Belmont last September with a victory in the GI Frizette S. a month later. A disappointing

10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 5, the bay made her seasonal bow at Laurel June 17, finishing fourth in the Alma North S.

"I thought the first race back was actually better than it looked. To finish fourth is a disappointing performance, but the winner was very impressive. I thought she went okay to tell you the truth. She was not 100%. She will be 100% next time. I have not yet pinpointed a race that I like. Maybe it will be to go a mile somewhere and we will go from there."

• PORTMAGEE (f, 4, Hard Spun)

Capturing a Gulfstream optional claimer Mar. 19, Waterville Lake Stable's Portmagee made it two in a row with a victory in Belmont's License Fee S. Apr. 30 at odds of 7-1 (video). She led every step of the way in Belmont's GIII Intercontinental S. June 8, but was run down late and finished third, beaten less than a length.

"She's a nice filly, an improving kind of filly. Six furlongs is great for her. Obviously, 7/8ths is pushing it a little bit and she's not a miler. She will run in another sprint stakes somewhere."

GUCCI FACTOR (g, 4, Gio Ponti)

Shelved after finishing ninth in a nine-panel test on the dirt at Saratoga Aug. 26, Castleton Lyons' Gucci Factor returned from a 10-month layoff to run away to a 16-length graduation going a mile in Elmont June 15 (video).

"He's got talent. He won very impressively. We will probably for Saratoga and find a race over there. The idea at the moment would be to find another race going 7/8ths or a mile. I'd probably prefer to go 7/8ths at the moment."

GOVERNOR MALIBU (c, 4, Malibu Moon)

Runner-up in last term's GII Peter Pan S. and GII Jim Dandy S.,

Jump Sucker Stable and Oak Bluff Stables' Governor Malibu checked in third in the NY-bred Commentator S. May 29 and returned just 12 days later to be fourth in the GII Brooklyn S. June 10.

"The Commentator and the Brooklyn were only 12 days apart. We will give him a little time now. There is a New Yorkbred stake coming back up July 2, but we are not in a hurry to run him right back, so we may wait."

LUBASH (h, 10, Freud)

Hard-knocking, New York-bred veteran Lubash has 12 black-type wins to his credit, including three graded stakes. Closing out 2016 with a victory in the GIII Tropical Turf H. Nov. 26, the Aliyu Ben J Stables homebred was third in the GIII Miami Mile S. Apr. 29 and completed the trifecta agin in the NY-bred Kingston S. last time May 29.

"Lubash is doing great. I wanted to run him last weekend, but we know he doesn't like soft and he is 10-years-old. He can compete on soft, but his best form has been on firm. He is another one that could run in the Forbidden Apple or we could find another spot."

• BLACKTYPE (FR) (g, 6, Dunkerque (Fr))

Victorious in the GII Commonwealth Turf Cup S. last term, Jumpe Sucker Stable's Blacktype checked in fifth in the GI Maker's 46 Mile at Keeneland Apr. 14 and was third last time in the GII Longines Dixie S. at Pimlico May 20.

"Blacktype got sick. He had a high temperature on Belmont week, but he is in good order now. He is another horse that could come back in the Forbidden Apple if we need to."

The guy always wanted to be a champion jockey. Presently in the race for top rider of the five-day Royal Ascot meeting, he is tied with Ryan Moore. They both had two winners Friday, so Saturday will be the showdown at the Queen's corral.

Young Buick rode a few races for Todd Pletcher in the winter of 2007 at Gulfstream, but did not win from that handful of longshot mounts. It was during that season that Angel Cordero, Jr. tried to talk him into coming to New York as an apprentice. No dice.

Walter sired three sons, but only Will is a rider. Martin is an assistant to the racing manager for the Niarchos family, and Andrew works in the financial industry in London.

Remember "Ussery Alley?" That far-outside part of the far turn at Aqueduct where Bobby Ussery showed us he could go faster by going farther, taking his mounts to the banked part of the track on the outside fence. Then off the turn he would cut to the inside and seemed to always find himself in the one-path and on the lead.

Well, Seamie Heffernan tried to do that with Wisconsin in Friday's Queen's Vase S. at one mile and six furlongs. Seamie covered two miles with his mount, and had the lead at two calls during the race, but the mount was difficult to handle, and faded badly. No Heffernan alley here.

In the feature race of the day, the G1 Coronation S., trainer Aidan O'Brien continued to absolutely dominate the training standings, finishing first, second and third. Winter, the winner, followed home by Roly Poly and Hydrangea.

I saw Mark Casse in the car park after the races, and even though his terrific filly, La Coronel was unplaced in the Coronation, he was all smiles.

"What a beautiful day!"



THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

June 24, 1893...The field for the American Derby at Washington Park was held at the post for 1 hour and 40 minutes, the longest pre-race delay in history. Boundless, with "Snapper" Garrison aboard, won the \$49,500 race, which was witnessed by a crowd of 48,000. Garrison and three other riders were each fined \$250 for bad conduct at the start.

June 24, 1950...Competing in the Golden Gate H., Noor II defeated Citation for the fourth and final time. "We just can't beat that horse!" Citation's jockey Steve Brooks said of Noor following the race.

June 24, 1952...Jockey Eddie Arcaro rode his 3000th career winner at Arlington Park, becoming the first American-born rider to reach the mark.
