



# 'KINGDOM' A NEW STAKES WINNER FOR FRANKEL



Last Kingdom wins Wednesday's G3 Prix Daphnis | Scoop Dyga

Wednesday's G3 Prix Daphnis winner **Last Kingdom** (Frankel {GB}) ran into the future G1 Prix de Diane winner Senga (Blame) when two-lengths runner-up as the odds-on favourite for his second start in a Saint-Cloud conditions event over a mile in September, and that was the last time he tasted defeat. Returning at Maisons-Laffitte to beat the subsequent G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) third Empire of the Star (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) in a mile maiden on Apr. 10, the bay was sent back here to beat Normandy Spirit (Ire) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) by a length in a conditions event again at that trip on May 29 and continued his progress with this first black-type success on Wednesday. Settled in second early tracking **Neguev (Ire)** (So You Think {NZ}) as **Spotify (Fr)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) raced on his tail, he was sent to the front with 300 metres remaining and stayed on to deny the latter as they pulled away.

The winner is the first runner for Compelling, whose dam Damson was an English and Irish highweight 2-year-old as a result of her successes in the G1 Phoenix S. and G2 Queen Mary S. Her son Requinto (Ire) inherited her precocity and speed and the G2 Flying Childers S. and G3 Molecomb S. winner is having fair success as a sire. Also the dam of the G3 Curragh S. runner-up Independence Day (Ire) (Dansili {GB}), she is a half-sister to the G3 Prestige S. scorer Geminiani (Ire) (King of Kings {Ire}) from the Aga Khan family of the sires Tiangar (Ire) and Tiraaz. Last Kingdom has a 2-year-old half-brother by Smart Strike, a yearling filly by Kitten's Joy and a filly foal by Tapit. Cont. p2

#### RISING STAR DOUBT I'M DREAMING DEAD

'TDN Rising Star' **Doubt I'm Dreaming (Aus)** (Not A Single Doubt {Aus}) died on Tuesday at Mornington after suffering a suspected heart attack after track work, according to *Racing.com*. The 2-year-old colt earned the Rising Star distinction with a three-length win in the Listed Valley Pearl S. on debut at Moonee Valley on Mar. 24, and was third in Caulfield's Listed Thoroughbred Club Cup a month later for trainer John McArdle. Newgate SF and China Horse Club had bought into the A\$210,000 Magic Millions National Sale yearling following his debut and he had been considered an early favourite for the G1 Caulfield Guineas.

"I was watching him canter around quietly like he normally does and I turned my head away to watch another horse that was leaving the trotting ring to go out onto the track to gallop and when I looked back he'd stopped and become staggery and by the time I had run down to the horse he was on the ground and died shortly after," McArdle told *Racing.com*. Stepping up from a debut success over six furlongs at Fontainebleau on May 18, Rosa Imperial captured the Listed Prix Hampton over five furlongs here on June 10 and enjoyed another upturn with a game defeat of the vastly more experienced Son Cesio. Settled in third early, the bay comported herself with a professional air belying her lack of race-conditioning and when asked to extend managed to get the better of that battle-hardened rival inside the final 150 metres.

"We were delighted with the performance of Rosa Imperial, particularly as it was only her third start," Godolphin's Lisa-Jane Graffard commented. "We will see how she comes out of this race before making any plans, but she has plenty of speed and has done nothing wrong in her races so far."

#### **Pedigree Notes...**

The winner is a half-sister to last year's Listed Prix Dahlia scorer Rosental, who was third in the G3 Prix Fille de l'Air and fourth in last month's G2 Prix Corrida. The second dam Mannington was the winner of the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude and finished third in the G1 Blue Diamond S. and G1 Newmarket H. before producing the G1 Victoria Derby-winning sire Benicio (Aus) and the G2 Moonee Valley Fillies' Classic Oaks heroine Romneya (Aus) (Red Ransom). The third dam is the G1 Golden Slipper heroine and Australian champion 2-year-old Bint Marscay, who is also the dam of the G3 Blue Diamond Preview scorer Sheraton (Aus) (Woodman) and the G1 Coolmore Classic winner Bollinger (Aus) (Dehere). #### The Social Angle: With Jason Singh Cont.

JS: Tattersalls currently use Facebook, Twitter and Instagram for our social media and whilst the content on Twitter and Facebook is roughly the same, we use Instagram slightly differently. On Twitter and Facebook we try and use content that is original and different to what everyone else is posting. For example, if a horse we sell wins a nice race, it's good to be able to post some pics of them selling as a yearling or as was the case recently with the unbeaten Denaar (Ire), we posted a video of him doing his 'breeze' before he was sold at the Craven Breeze-Up Sale which seemed to get a positive response.

# TDN: What type of content do you post on Instagram, and why is it important for Tattersalls to be present there?

**JS:** We find that the users of Instagram are looking for different content than Facebook or Twitter. #### The Social Angle: With Jason Singh Cont.

**JS:** That's a very good question. Like a lot of marketing, it can be difficult to quantify and measure whether what you are doing is effective or not. However, social media is very good at giving you statistics on anything you do which is something that traditional media doesn't do nearly as well. With traditional print advertising, you might know how many papers are sold, but you don't know how many people saw your advert and or whether they paid attention to it. But with social media, you can see how many people saw it, how many clicked on it, engaged with it, etc. It provides a great deal more information. Whether it actually converts followers in customers I'm not sure, but it allows you to engage with lots of people and that can only be positive.

#### TDN: What are the biggest mistakes to avoid making?

**JS:** First of all, I think it's important to try to create content that isn't pure marketing. Followers tend to switch off a little if you are just banging your own drum. And whilst that is impossible to avoid completely, creating some original and fresh content is important too. And whilst we all have the ability to create decent content on social media, I think where possible, having someone dedicated to the role is important.

#### TDN: Going forward, what social media trends are you looking forward to?

**JS:** Well I think it's fair to say that it's difficult to know what the next big thing will be. Facebook, Twitter and Instagram are all very established at the moment and I think it will be difficult to break the hold that they have, but of course the next big thing is out there.

#### ALMANZOR TO RETURN AT YORK

Last year's Cartier Horse of the Year Almanzor (Fr) (Wootton Bassett (GB)) will make his seasonal debut in the G2 Sky Bet York S. on July 29, trainer Jean-Claude Rouget told Racing Post. Almanzor won five straight races last year at three, including the G1 Prix du Jockey Club and the G1 QIPCO Irish Champion S. and G1 QIPCO Champion S. over G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Found (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), but has not been seen yet this year after being caught up in an equine herpesvirus scare in his trainer's barn. Other runners stabled in the EHV 1-quarantined barn to have returned include Taareef (Kitten's Joy) and Zelzal (Fr) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), who finished one-two in the G3 Prix Bertrand du Breuil Longines on June 18; and Neguev (Ire) (So You Think {NZ}), third in Wednesday's G3 Prix Daphnis. Rouget said a tilt at the G1 Juddmonte International on Aug. 23 would follow the York S.

"That's still where I expect to go [with him] and, for now at least, all has gone according to plan," the trainer told Racing Post.

#### 'ANGEL' TO APPEAR IN JULY CUP

Godolphin's G1 Commonwealth Cup runner-up Harry Angel (Ire) (Dark Angel (Ire)) is one of 23 horses remaining at this entry stage in the G1 Darley July Cup on July 15. The £500,000 sixfurlong test will see the Clive Cox trainee pitted against older horses for the first time.

"I am delighted with the way that Harry Angel has come out of his Royal Ascot run and at this stage I am looking very positively towards sending him to the Darley July Cup," commented Cox. "The Commonwealth Cup was a very special race, I am sure that the first three are all top class Group 1 horses, and I have no concerns with taking on Caravaggio (Scat Daddy) again. However, Harry Angel only ran last week, so we will be keeping a close eye on him in the next few days before making any firm plans. He's never run at Newmarket before, but I don't see any reason why he wouldn't cope with the demands of the July Course as he's a very well-balanced colt."

He continued, "The Darley July Cup is bang up there as one of the world's iconic sprint races, even more so since the inception of the Commonwealth Cup as it brings together the older and younger generations of sprinters for the first time."

Coolmore's Caravaggio, who bested Harry Angel in the Commonwealth Cup, as well as the G1 Diamond Jubilee S. onetwo-three of The Tin Man (GB) (Equiano {Fr}), Tasleet (GB) (Showcasing {GB}) and Limato (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) are also signed on at this stage.

#### **QUEEN'S TRUST EYES NASSAU TITLE**

Queen's Trust (GB) (Dansili {GB}), runner-up in the 2016 G1 Qatar Nassau S. to Minding (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) before ending her year with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf in 2016, looks to go one better in this year's edition. One of 30 left in the field for the Aug. 3 feature at Goodwood, the Cheveley Park colourbearer was most recently fourth in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot.

"I haven't spoken to Sir Michael [Stoute] since her run at Royal Ascot last week, but we have put her in and the race is very much an option for her," said Chris Richardson, Managing Director of Cheveley Park Stud. "She was slowly away at Royal Ascot and got pinned in on the rail. When she did get clear, she ran on well to the line. She certainly showed improvement from her first run this season at York and hopefully she can continue to do that throughout the year."

Recent G1 Coronation S. heroine Winter (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), who landed both the G1 1000 Guineas and the Irish equivalent, is also signed on for Ballydoyle, as is G1 Matron S. victress Alice Springs (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), 1000 Guineas and G1 Oaks bridesmaid Rhododendron (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) and 2016 G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Yorkshire Oaks scorer Seventh Heaven (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

#### **GOODWOOD CUP POSSIBLE FOR VAZIRABAD**

The newly upgraded £500,000 G1 Qatar Goodwood Cup could see the reappearance of HRH The Aga Khan's MG1SW Vazirabad (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}) on Aug. 1. The two-mile contest sees 29 stand their ground at this acceptance stage, with the Alain de Royer Dupre runner missing Royal Ascot after sustaining an injury in a winning effort in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Chantilly on May 28.

"We are going very slowly because it is not completely healed," his trainer commented. "The plan is to go to Goodwood but it depends on when we can get him back to normal training. The Gold Cup would have been a typical race for Vazirabad because when they have a lot of pace, he has a very strong turn of foot. Big Orange won well but Vazirabad has beaten him twice in the [G2] Dubai Gold Cup."

The first two finishers of the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot, Michael Bell charge **Big Orange (GB)** (Duke of Marmalade {Ire}) who saluted in last year's edition of the Goodwood Cup and **Order Of St George (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), are both in the current line up, as is 2016 G1 Epsom Derby second **US Army Ranger (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and Royal Ascot G2 Queen's Vase victor **Stradivarius (Ire)** (Sea the Stars {Ire}).

These amendments ensure the implementation of additional recommendations made by Christopher Quinlan QC in his recent review.

Areas affected by the new rules include: the formal handing over of responsibility for the judicial panel from the BHA to the judicial panel chairman; all disciplinary, licensing and appeal hearings will be chaired by a legally qualified person; and that the appeal board has the right to order that an appeal take place as a full rehearing of the case in exception circumstances. These changes go into effect on July 1.

"The BHA was very clear that it intends to adopt in full the recommendations from the Quinlan review," said Catherine Beloff, Director of Legal and Governance for the BHA. "Following the implementation of the revised Rules on 1 July we will have made good progress towards achieving this objective. The Quinlan review's recommendations were designed to ensure that the BHA's quasi-judicial system is in line with best practice in sports governance and to increase confidence among participants and stakeholders. They will allow the BHA's judicial functions to operate independently of its executive functions, which we hope participants and the public will find reassuring as it reduces the risk of potential conflicts of interest."

#### **BHA REVISES RULES**

The BHA published the necessary amendments to the Rules of Racing to reflect its new judicial structure, Wednesday. The Terms of Reference, for the disciplinary panel, licensing committee and appeal board were also published for the first time.

#### JUDDMONTE DAY FOR NEWMARKET

Newmarket's Sept. 30 card will feature the first-ever Juddmonte Day. The seven-race card will feature the G1 Cheveley Park S., G1 Middle Park S. and the G2 Royal Lodge S., all for 2-year-olds and all with Juddmonte as the title sponsor. Those three races will be worth  $\pounds 500,000$  this year, and that will rise to  $\pounds 675,000$  next year.

Amy Starkey, Regional Director, Jockey Club Racecourses East Region, said, "We are very pleased to confirm that Juddmonte will become the new sponsors of the Cheveley Park S. alongside their existing sponsorship of the Middle Park and the Royal Lodge S. until at least 2020. Through the growth of the partnership, which includes prize money increases across the Juddmonte-sponsored races, we can also announce that the Saturday of the Cambridgeshire Meeting will now be known as Juddmonte Day. Juddmonte is already a much-valued partner and this new agreement means that the Home of Horseracing and one of the most prestigious stud businesses in the world will be working together further to promote three of Britain's best-known juvenile races."

#### **'QUEST' RETIRED**

Last year's French highweighted stayer **Quest For More (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}--No Quest {Ire}, by Rainbow Quest) has been retired, reported *Racing Post* Wednesday. Racing in the colours of HRH Sultan Ahmad Shah, the 7-year-old gelding triumphed in the 2016 G1 Qatar Prix du Cadran over MG1SW Vazirabad (Fr) (Mandero {Ger}), as well as in the G2 Lonsdale Cup at York that term. The Roger Charlton trainee finished runner-up in an additional three Group 2 events, including the G2 Doncaster Cup and G2 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup, both in 2016 and the G2 Goodwood Cup the year prior. Quest For More retires with a mark of 30-8-7-4 and earnings of \$905,474.

"We've been disappointed with the way he ran in his last couple of races and decided he doesn't deserve to go on any more," Charlton told *Racing Post*.

Quest For More was unplaced in his two 2017 efforts, finishing 12th last out in Royal Ascot's G1 Gold Cup on June 22.

#### STRONG START TO DERBY SALE

The Tattersalls Ireland Derby Sale got off to a strong start on its first of three days on Wednesday. With a slightly larger catalogue than last year, 181 lots were sold for €9,674,000, compared to 152 sold for €7,175,500 last year. The average climbed 13% to €53,448, while the median was up 25% at €45,000. The clearance rate also improved at 86% compared to 82% last year.

The top-priced lot of the day was the €220,000 3-year-old gelding Kap Ocean (Fr) (Kapgarde (Fr)) (lot 62). He was one of two six-figures lots purchased by Malone, who said, "He is a lovely individual. I've been thinking about him so much that I even woke up the other night thinking about him after I'd seen him. He is a lovely horse, a special horse out of a black-type mare and from a proper pedigree. I am delighted to get him."

The only other offering to surpass the €200,000 mark on the day was an unnamed 3-year-old gelding by Stowaway (GB) (lot 102) bought by Aidan O'Ryan for €205,000.

Joseph O'Brien was busy on the day buying four in total, the dearest of those being a 3-year-old gelding by Presenting (GB) (lot 200) for €135,000.

#### PAYNE TESTS POSITIVE FOR BANNED SUBSTANCE

G1 Melbourne Cup-winning jockey Michelle Payne has been stood down from riding after she tested positive for a banned substance at a meeting at Swan Hill racecourse on June 11. Payne has been called to attend a Racing Victoria inquiry on Thursday after results of a urine sample found in her system traces of an appetite substance that is prohibited under Australian rules of racing.

A statement issued by Racing Victoria read, "Stewards have received a report from Racing Analytical Services Limited (RASL) confirming the presence of phentermine, an appetite suppressant and banned substance in accordance with Australian Rule of Racing 81B, in the sample provided. Upon receipt of the report, Ms Payne was advised of RASL's findings and stood down from riding in races and track-work by stewards on June 23, 2017."

Payne has only just returned to Australia after she rode Kaspersky (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) into fifth place in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last Tuesday. The 31-year-old made history in 2015 when she became the first female jockey to win the Melbourne Cup with Prince Of Penzance (NZ) (Pentire {GB}).

# FARM LABOR REFORM: A NEVER-ENDING CHORE

This is the first in a two-part installment about labor problems facing Thoroughbred farm owners.

When America's food growers want to hammer home the point that United States agriculture is facing an ever-worsening labor crisis because there aren't enough workers to tend our nation's fields, they illustrate the plight by providing photographs of row upon row of unpicked crops dying in the dirt.

Dairy farmers, dealing with the same trouble, have begun repeating the dire threat that if America doesn't figure out a way to import more workers, the country will soon have to resort to the unthinkable practice of importing milk instead.

And in the stabling areas of Thoroughbred racetracks all across the nation, it's become an all-too-familiar tale how trainers can't find and retain capable, reliable hands-on horse workers, let alone entry-level laborers willing to shovel manure and scrub water buckets.

There is anecdotal evidence that willing foreign workers are avoiding Thoroughbred-related employment because of the palpable vibe that U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officials could swoop in for a raid at any moment--an uneasy feeling validated by the fact that ICE is reportedly arresting 400 undocumented foreigners daily nationwide.

Such a crackdown (16 arrests) just happened in Saratoga Springs, New York, in early June, a little more than a month before the country's highest-profile Thoroughbred race meet is scheduled to begin in that city.

According to the *Washington Post*, the nationwide haul of 41,318 immigrants taken into custody over the first 100 days of President Donald Trump's administration represents a 37.6% increase over the same period last year.

But while racetrack-related labor woes have been spotlighted in recent months (*read TDN's most recent take on the subject here*), there are parallel problems with different consequences playing out on the nation's Thoroughbred farms.

Over the past several weeks, as the breeding and foaling seasons morphed into the yearling prep season, *TDN* surveyed a selection of owners and managers of different-sized farms around the country and spoke with elected and appointed officials to find out what long- and short-term help they can offer constituents. This article will attempt to give a snapshot of the varying degrees of problems articulated by owners; Part 2 in Friday's edition will examine potential solutions.

"Look, this is the worst-kept secret, both on the farm on the backstretch," said Chauncey Morris, executive director of The Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders organization. "The labor issue is challenging. We needed immigration reform in this country

probably five years ago, but we don't have that. So is there a labor shortage currently? Yes, there is, because the economy has increased in a lot of places, including here in central Kentucky where the unemployment rate is very, very low."

Morris--like everybody interviewed for this story--was adamant that the day-to-day, basic needs of Thoroughbreds are not what gets compromised when there is a shortage of farm labor. "As far as reducing the level of care on horses where it becomes a welfare problem, that's not an issue," he said.

What generally happens is that maintenance and upkeep suffers, and non-horse components that are vital to running a successful farming operation slide to the bottom of the to-do list, fueling a mentality of workplace triage.

Fred and Nancy Mitchell's Clarkland Farm in Lexington compensates for the labor shortage in the heart of the Bluegrass by taking an all-hands-on-deck family approach. The Mitchells have a more vested interest than most owners in the future of their broodmare farm, because the property has been in their family since the 1700s.

A staff of seven cares for the 70 to 75 horses that reside on the Clarkland property. Fred Mitchell said that number includes the Mitchells themselves, ("but we're getting up there in years"), a "workaholic daughter," a triathlete son-in-law who handles all the mowing when he's not in training for or competing in Ironman races, and three Mexican guest workers (two who live on the property, with the other housed nearby). **Cont. p4** 



"It's not easy to find good workers anymore," Mitchell said. "The best hands that we can get now are the Mexicans. And if

you can get a good one, you've really got a good one. But anyone local? You might as well just forget about it. They don't want to work. They don't have to work. The government is taking too good care of them."

The foreign guest workers have either been employed at Clarkland a long time, Mitchell said, or different workers rotate to Lexington from the same small Mexican community as the seasons change. If one of them has to remain at home for whatever reason, Mitchell

added, they are quick to send another family member or friend. Mitchell said he does not handle the Clarkland bookkeeping, but he believes they are all paid above \$10 hourly.

McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, located five minutes away from the Saratoga Race Course backstretch, is another husband-and-wife founded breeding farm. Joe McMahon knows the employment totem pole from the bottom up: He began

working as a groom, hotwalker, and exercise rider at age 16; met his eventual wife, Anne, on the backside several years later when she was a Skidmore College student, and the two started with 100 acres (the property has since quadrupled) and a couple of broodmares in 1971.

When TDN cold-called to ask about the employment snapshot in his region last week, Joe McMahon immediately cited figures that showed the farm was down to only 15 employees at a time of year when they

usually carry 20 to care for their 260 broodmares, foals, and yearlings. Yet the farm's payroll has spiked upward in 2017 compared to the last two years. **Cont. p5** 



"We're paying more, and that's a conscious thing we're doing to keep our better people," McMahon said. "Pretty much anybody you talk to, that's the first thing they say is they've got labor problems. It's hard to get good people who are responsible and they show up. We have to pay up, is what I think. And it's hard to do when you get a shrinking participation level from [horse] owners.

"But to pay up, you've got to raise people's board," McMahon continued. "Who wants to raise board when [the industry] is in

kind of a contraction mode? So we're trying to do other things. We want to keep everybody that's already in the business in business. We don't want to drive anybody away. We want to do other things better. In fact, we want to run the whole place better, more efficiently. That's our answer to it, because we feel we have to pay up. So we're willing to do that if we can get the money out of the business [in other ways]. It's just working smarter, I guess. But it sure isn't easy."

McMahon cited the overall

Thoroughbred marketplace as a factor in his business decisions.

"Yearling sales have been pretty tough the last couple of years, even though they've been fairly good here in New York," McMahon said. "That's probably part of the problem. There aren't as many people buying inexpensive horses as there used to be. You look at the 2-year-old sales, the stratification is incredible. I mean there's nothing in the middle or the bottom, although this year was maybe slightly better across the board. So that affects it."

McMahon said that for entry-level workers, he pays on par with what convenience and fast-food stores pay around Saratoga, which is about \$15 hourly.

"We have one girl at \$10 an hour, but she gets housing with it," McMahon said. "So she gets a home, and she gets a contribution towards her [health insurance], 50%. It's hard to get good people, plain and simple. We're fortunate that we've had some people who have been with us for a long time, and they're kind of filling the gaps. But for just labor people? It's real

tough."

Asked if the shortage is constraining his operation's growth, McMahon said, "We don't want to grow any more. We're as big as we want to be. But I guess this spring we're just noticing that we're farther behind on those maintenance kinds of jobs--painting, weed whacking, and mowing and fixing fences. We seem to have a harder time getting those sorts of things done. And that's because everybody who works here has horse skills, and we can't take them away from the

horse part of it to do stuff that we used to have abundant people to do."

In Ocala, Florida, Roger Brand, the vice president and general manager of the Double Diamond Farm stallion facility and training farm, said that while his operation is not in as desperate an employment position as farms in other geographic areas, he sees a different delineation between the availability of skilled horse help versus general laborers than McMahon does in New York. **Cont. p6**

"Getting people that have horse experience, I think there's a shortage of that," Brand said. "I don't know that it's a shortage of people that come in to apply for jobs, but [there is a shortage of] people who are qualified to work with horses. I think most of those people who are familiar with the business are gravitating towards the track, not farms. It used to be easier to get people with horse experience. But from the labor side of mowing and things like that, I don't think there's a shortage."

Brand's opinion is reflected by his employees-to-horses ratio, which is lower than other interviewees for this story: He said he has between 42 and 46 workers on the payroll for a farm that usually houses 100 horses, depending on the season.

"I think the horse business itself--you know, you're either in or you're out of the world of horses," Brand said. "I think the amount of people in the horse business is not what it used to be. If you grew up in it and your family was in it, you probably are still involved. But I don't think other people are gravitating to it."

Brand said that he pays hands-on horse workers \$12-15 hourly and riders get \$12-15 per mount. Yet he believes in paying unskilled laborers roughly the same amount, "because, believe it or not, you get what you pay for."

That wage breakdown contrasts with what Pete and Evelyn Parrella of Legacy Ranch in Clements, California, pay their workers. But it's important to consider that north-central California horse farms are located in an ultra-competitive agricultural jobs market.

"Right now it's difficult," Pete Parrella said. "Up here, at this

time of year you've got cherry-picking and grapes, and those operations pay piece work. It's sometimes difficult for us to keep employees because they can make more money on piece work than they can hourly, so that's been a challenge for us."

Legacy Ranch offers breaking, training, lay-ups, sales prep, breeding, and foaling. Parrella said a staff of 35 tends to the 400 horses, and that he pays \$11-15 hourly to lure general laborers, but will go above \$20 hourly to retain skilled horse workers.

"To keep people we're having to pay well over the minimum wage for physical labor for stall cleaners and manure pickup and stuff like that. It's a problem for horse farms. I don't know how you can hold [boarding] rates. Rates are going to have to go up,

and some of the clients are going to have to pay new rates for us to keep employees," Parrella said.

"Finding qualified people in the horse industry is a challenge.

But there are people out there, and if you're fortunate enough to find them, then you have to pay the price. If you're looking for quality over quantity, your clientele has to appreciate that, and clients have to make a choice where they want to go," Parrella said. "We're really not looking for bodies. We're looking for people in the industry that have a concept of what a good horseman is. That's what we look for."

The farm operators

The farm operators interviewed from Kentucky, Florida, California, and New

York represent the top four Thoroughbred producers by state. But drift farther down that list, and it seems evident that the more removed you are from the top of the breeding hierarchy, the more difficult it gets to find qualified horse farm workers. **Cont. p7**

Barbara and Ron Rickline founded Xanthus Farm in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, in 1983. The full-service breeding farm, which bills itself on its website as "one of Pennsylvania's leading commercial stallion establishments," usually houses 150 horses, and about half of them are new foals each year.

Yet Barabara Rickline said she only is able to retain four or five full-time employees and a handful of rotating part-timers. Her best staffers are older locals in their 50s who are life-long horse handlers, and one intensely equine-enthused 15-year-old girl who is a tireless worker. The average starting wage, she said, is \$8-9 hourly.

"We start them out kind of cheap because most of them don't stay anyway," Rickline said. "I've already tried paying people more money, and it just doesn't help. I know that sounds kind of cheap, but that's the reality of it.

"This area is big for apple farming. We used to always have available help that would do both kinds of work, in the orchards and then they'd pick up work on the horse farms. But now that the immigration thing got kind of tough, everybody has disappeared. I used to always rely on a couple of Mexicans who did good work and liked to be with horses. But they all went back to Mexico. They're too afraid they're going to get picked up."

Rickline continued: "I hate to say it, but [American] kids don't want to do this stuff. They don't do physical labor. You can't even get people with horse experience. You have to teach them everything. The basic horse stuff gets done on my farm. But the extra seasonal upkeep things don't get done as much as you'd like. It's making me want to cut my business back. I'm even trying to reduce my number of horses because you can't find good help.

"And when I say 'good help,' I mean people that just show up," Rickline emphasized. "It doesn't mean that their work is good. And that's bad, when their best quality is they just show up." --@thorntontd

Bushwood Stables' multiple Grade I winner Better Talk Now (Talkin Man--Bendita, by Baldski) was euthanized Tuesday night at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center due to complications from intestinal surgery resulting from colic. He was 18 years old.

A staple in American turf racing for the better part of a decade, the dark bay, almost black, gelding won nine graded stakes over five seasons from ages four to eight. His defining score came in a 27-1 upset of Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}) in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star, giving trainer Graham Motion and jockey Ramon Dominguez their first Breeders' Cup victories (video). His last graded triumph came in the 2007 GI Manhattan H., but he also placed in multiple Grade I's at ages nine and ten before being retired to due a hind suspensory injury in September of 2009 with earnings of \$4,356,664.

"He displayed the same toughness fighting his final battle as he did when showing his special talents on the track that won him so many fans in the racing world," owner Brent Johnson said in a statement. "We want to thank Better Talk Now for giving us and our families some of the greatest and most joyous experiences

## A 'STAR' IS BORN

Albaugh Family Stable's **Hollywood Star (Malibu Moon)** took solid late money to be off as the 3-2 favorite in a strong-looking Churchill maiden Wednesday afternoon and overcame a tardy dispatch to earn '**TDN Rising Star**' status.

A 9-2 chance on the morning line, the racy dark bay was backed into 3-1, touched 9-5 and was back out to 2-1 before firming another half-point in the dying minutes before post. Off slowly beneath Robby Albarado, Hollywood Star looked to exchange bumps with the well-related 5-2 second choice Arrival (Tapit--Alittlebitearly), the half-brother to GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Bayern (Offlee Wild), and that duo raced at the tail of the field for the opening 100 yards. Hollywood Star tugged his way up into about midpack while a couple of paths away from the fence and was traveling well right in the slipstream of 14-1 Bourbon Resolution (New Year's Day) into and around the turn. The \$550,000 Keeneland September acquisition, the most expensive colt of his sire's 44 yearlings to sell last year, accelerated sharply four deep off the final corner and was joined to his inside by Bourbon Resolution to settle it late, but the chalk did slightly the better--and more professional--work to take it by a half-length. Bourbon Resolution drifted in under a left-handed stick late while finishing a highly promising second. Ebben (Trappe Shot) was third, while Arrival weaved his way greenly through stretch traffic and finished with interest to be fourth.

Hollywood Star is a full-brother to Miss Hollywood, SW, \$130,860; and a half to the mare's first foal, Hoorayforhollywood (Storm Cat), MSP, \$212,819.

"Korea is always looking for opportunities to improve the country's breeding program," said Park. "These stallions are a wonderful addition to Korea's stallion roster, and we are excited to be able to offer them to Korean breeders."

Archaracharch, winner of the 2011 GI Arkansas Derby, has been represented by five black-type winners to date and the winners of nearly \$6 million to date, headed by Toews On Ice, victorious in the 2015 GIII Bob Hope S.

Tizway completed the GI Met Mile/GI Whitney H. double in 2011 and is the sire of nine stakes winners, including top earner Coasted, runner-up in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Tizway's 4-year-old son Buhwarui Banseok ( --Aim For the Moon, by Deputy Minister) has won six of 15 starts in Korea for earnings of nearly ₩560 million (about US\$490,000). Cont. p2
