

RIBCHESTER OUT OF MAROIS, WILL GO TO QEII

Richard Fahey has withdrawn Godolphin's MG1SW **Ribchester** (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) from Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois on Aug. 13. Instead, the trainer has confirmed the G1 QIPCO Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot on Oct. 21 as his "first choice" target for his stable star, who finished runner-up to Minding (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the 2016 edition. Having already landed the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury and the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot this season, the 4-year-old was a warm order for the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood last week, but suffered a shock defeat, losing out by a neck to **Here Comes When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the soft going at Goodwood.

"He's absolutely fine after the race [at Goodwood]," said Fahey. "I might give him a break and wait for the Queen Elizabeth II S., but either way, Champions Day is the first choice. I haven't entered him for the [G1] Champion S,. as I think we're going to stick at a mile with him for the time being. Ribchester ran very respectably in the race last year against a filly who was something special and I honestly believe he is a better horse this year."

Regarding his charge's Goodwood experience, Fahey said, "Quite what happened at Goodwood I'm still not sure, but I suspect it was a mistake to try to make the running and that was my mistake. It was a horrible, horrible day, not just in terms of the going, but also with the weather."

VERANDAH NEW RISING STAR AT KEMPTON

By Cheveley Park's resident Medicean (GB) and a full-sister to one of his chief money-spinners in the GII King Edward S., GII Connaught Cup and GII Play the King S. winner Dimension (GB), MGSW-Can, SW & GSP-US, \$568,274, Verandah (GB) was sent off the 5-1 joint-second favourite and broke slowly before racing lazily in rear as Robert Tart strove to get her engaged. Once under cover against the rail, the homebred travelled kindly and when asked at the top of the straight produced an electric change of gear to strike the front 1 1/2 furlongs out. Eased heavily in the last 75 yards, the bay who is also a half-sister to the operation's 2009 G2 Windsor Forest S. winner and 2008 G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Spacious (GB) (Nayef), Hwt. Older Mare-Ire at 7-9 1/2f, MGSW & MG1SP-Eng, G1SP-Ire, \$695,671, still enjoyed a two-length advantage over Fille de Reve (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) who denied the winner's stablemate West Palm Beach (Ire) (Scat Daddy) second by a short head. Final Set (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), the 700,000gns TAOCT full-sister to the GSP Midnite Angel (Ire), was fifth after a tardy start. Cont. p3

"He may have just got sick of having the rain and the wind blowing right into his face up the straight," said Fahey. "They were proper extreme conditions. It was just one of those things and we all live to fight another day."

Ribchester is one of 48 entries for the QEII, which carries a total prize fund of £1.1million. A potential rematch with Here Comes When could be on the cards, with his trainer Andrew Balding also entering the fast-improving G3 Thoroughbred S. winner **Beat The Bank (GB)** (Paco Boy {Ire}).

Balding said, "The Queen Elizabeth II S. will come under very serious consideration for both of them. Here Comes When is absolutely bouncing after Goodwood--he's in great form and British Champions Day is attractive for him. He's better when lightly-raced and if he were to run at all before, it might be in a Group 2 race in Milan, where he doesn't have to carry a Group 1 penalty. Beat The Bank is only a 3-year-old and we have to be careful not to over-race him this year as there is lots to look forward to. But he seems versatile and Ascot will certainly be coming under consideration."

Aidan O'Brien has given the option to dual G1 2000 Guineas hero **Churchill (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and dual 1000 Guineas heroine **Winter (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), among others.

Saeed bin Suroor has entered Godolphin's **Thunder Snow (Ire)** (Helmet {Aus}), who was last seen landing the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly and is entered in the Jacques Le Marois on Sunday.

"He worked really well on Saturday and has been a star horse for me this year," said bin Suroor. "I would like to run him at Ascot on British Champions Day and we will look at both the Queen Elizabeth II S. and the [G1] Champion S. nearer the time. He has only run over a mile in Europe this year, but he saw out the extended nine furlongs strongly in the [G2] UAE Derby [on Dubai World Cup night in March] and I don't think stamina will be any problem over a mile and a quarter if we go for that race."

Spacious was herself an impressive four-length winner on her juvenile debut prior to taking the G2 May Hill S. and her next start was when beaten a half-length in the 2008 Newmarket Classic by Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}). Placed on four more occasions at the highest level, she is related to the two smart fellow James Fanshawe-trained mares in Portal (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), who was third in the G2 Lancashire Oaks, and Ice Palace (GB) (Polar Falcon). The former went on to produce the G3 Bahrain Trophy and G3 Gordon S. runner-up Windshear (GB) (Hurricane Run {Ire}), while the latter was responsible for the dual listed scorer Queen of Ice (GB) (Selkirk). Palatial, who was a four-time winner and just shy of listed class, also has a yearling filly by Dutch Art (GB) named Edifice (GB).

EBF FUTURE STAYERS PROGRAMME RETURNS AT YARMOUTH

The first of 11 in a series of staying races for maidens, developed between the British Horseracing Authority and the British European Breeders Fund, was won by Barford (Ire) (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) at Yarmouth Racecourse Wednesday. The series, restricted to progeny of staying stallions that won over 10 furlongs or farther with European Breeders Fund eligibility, was created in 2015 in response to a review by the BHA Flat Racing Committee following a lack of opportunities for staying types and to help meet a goal of further enhancing the stayers' program. All of the races will have a minimum fund of £10,000, with several offering purses of £12,000.

EBF Future Stayers' Programme Cont.

"As part of the ongoing project to encourage the breeding and buying of a greater number of future stayers, the BHA will seek to grow the number of races, over the next three to five years, for the progeny of either sires or dams who have won over a distance of 10 furlongs or more, with a small number of races being offered for those progeny who won over 12 furlongs or further," said Ruth Quinn, Director of International Racing and Racing Development for the British Horseracing Authority. "These races should be viewed as an investment for the future and will hopefully act, as part of our wider package of enhancements for the stayer, as an incentive for people to invest in horses with certain bloodlines and which are more likely to demonstrate an aptitude for stamina. We are delighted that the British EBF is keen to extend its support for these races and to invest in the programme for future stayers."

The chestnut homebred is the first scorer out of Listed Prix du Carrousel runner-up Last Born (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}), herself a half to three black-type performers headed by G1 Melbourne Cup hero and dual European chapion stayer Americain (Dynaformer). Tackled by Korevsky (Ire) (Intello {Ger}) in midstraight, the 6-4 joint-favourite was driven to beat that other market-leader by 3/4 of a length.

The winner is the last known foal out of a half to the listed-placed Mogadishio (Fr) (American Post {GB}) whose second dam is a half to the stakes-placed Skatesheba (Fr) (Green Tune). OSCIETRA DRAWS BARRIER FOUR AT GEELONG FRIDAY

Oscietra (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}), the first foal out of the undefeated Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), has drawn barrier four in the third race over the Geelong synthetic Friday, reported *racenet.com.au*. The 1000-metre feature is the second race for the Neil Werrett-bred filly, who ran third in the New Year Plate to subsequent G3 Blue Diamond Preview S. heroine Limestone (Aus) (Helmet {Aus}) at first asking over the grass at Flemington on New Year's Day. Trained by David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig, Oscietra most recently won an Aug. 4 jump out at Flemington.

"She worked well on Tuesday morning and importantly has been eating well since the jump-out," David Hayes told racenet.com.au. "She's matured and thickened and we're really looking forward to Friday."

LINDSAY PARK TRIO TRIAL WELL

Dorrington Farm's G1 Blue Diamond S. heroine Catchy (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) ran third to Lindsay Park stablemates Formality (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), who won the G3 Chairman's S. and was third in the Blue Diamond, and G3 Magic Night S. victress Tulip (Aus) (Pierro {Aus}) in a 1000-metre trial at Cranbourne Tuesday, reported racenet.com.au. A neck separated the trio of David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig runners, with Catching pointing to the G3 Quezette S. at Caulfield on Aug. 19. Coolmore's Formality will target the 1400m G1 Golden Rose on Sept. 23, while 'TDN Rising Star' and G1 Golden Slipper S. third Tulip, who races for an ownership group headed by Coolmore, will be prepared toward an intended start in the Sept. 30 G1 Flight S. over 1600 metres at Randwick.

"I thought they were all good and it's just confirmed what I've always through, there's not much between them," said David Hayes. "I thought bringing them down here, getting them out of their normal routine was ideal, but today is the only time they'll see each other in the spring. All of them are still wintry in the coat and they'll be better in September and then be peaking in October."

Later in the season, the Oct. 14 G1 Thousand Guineas at Caulfield is on the cards, but the G1 Caulfield Guineas the same day is also an option if Catchy's form warrants it.

"She's beaten them in the Blue Diamond and it's double the money," Hayes said. "If she is the dominant filly I would be recommending to [owner] Rob Crabtree to go up against the boys."

BACK TO BUSINESS

Now, I wasn't there to see the bidding myself, but I need to have a word with that canny David Loder about that \$995,000 bid which bought the sale's only War Front colt right at the end of Tuesday night's session at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga; couldn't you just have rounded it up? It wouldn't have made any difference to War Front's average, no (it would have been \$712,500 for two sold rather than \$710,000), but it would have taken the sale's gross receipts to exactly \$53 million instead of \$52,995,000, which means myself and all other reviewers are going to have to say this hot sale grossed "almost" \$53 million every time we refer to it.

And a hot sale it was, too: with an 11% smaller catalogue, exactly the same number (156) sold as last year, which meant one of my favorite metrics, the clearance rate from the catalogue, improved by a massive 7.7%, from 61.9% last year to 69.6% this year--almost 70% for a select yearling sale, that doesn't happen much these days. With the exact same number sold, the nearly \$53-million gross and \$339,712 average were each up 16% over 2016. Our own projections beforehand were that the number sold would likely be in the 140's, that the sale would gross between \$45 and \$50 million, and that the average would be around \$300,000, so in all those categories the sale ran about 10% ahead of our projections. It doesn't take too much slicing and dicing of the numbers to see it was a strong sale.

ONTARIO GOVERNMENT OK'S WOODBINE

CASINO by Perry Lefko

Although there is no timetable for when it will happen, Woodbine Entertainment Group will finally have a full-fledged casino--something it has wanted for several years--following a decision by the Ontario government to privatize gaming in the province.


WEG CEO Jim Lawson told *TDN* Wednesday that having a casino that includes table games and an expansion of its slot machines is a game changer in terms of creating employment and economic activity on the site. Most importantly, he said, it will expose more people to the sport of horse racing.

"Our only mandate as a corporation--and I think this is worthwhile in saying--is to promote horse racing, and so the way we're looking at this is, does this really help horse racing?" Lawson said. Cont. p6 (click here)

From the desk of...

This is an elite sale, no doubt, so making projections based on 156 horses selling is always dangerous, but there's certainly reason to be optimistic rather than pessimistic about the next 10,000 or so yearlings which will go through the ring in the next three months.


Our mantra throughout the year so far has been "compare to 2015," because last year did drop from 2015 highs. The North American and European auction market as a whole made a big recovery in 2013, but has remained relatively stagnant since. In Saratoga's case, its big recovery had actually been delayed until 2015. From 165 catalogued and 114 sold (a healthy 69.1%) in 2014, for the 2015 sale the number catalogued jumped 26%, to 209, of which 145 sold, a 27% gain over 2014 while still sustaining a 69.4% clearance rate from the catalogue. So a big win, as the gross jumped by 40%, from \$33.2 million to \$46,755,000. The average also gained 10% (to \$322,448), but actually what was more important was that Fasig-Tipton proved they could sustain an average of plus-or-minus \$300,000 even while increasing the numbers, essentially by a quarter (see the Weekly Sales Ticker for detail).

So, yes, once again, compare to 2015: that year, 209 catalogued, 145 sold (69.4%); \$46,755,000, average \$322,448. This year: 224 catalogued (+7% compared to 2015), 156 sold (+7%, and 69.6% of those catalogued); gross \$52,995,000 ('almost' \$53-million, and + 13%), average \$339,712 (+ 5%). Throughout this year so far, when we've done those comparisons to 2015, the two years have been pretty similar, marginally up or down.



WEEKLY SALES TICKER



The clearance rate of those sold from the number catalogued in Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga's Select sale had been 69% in 2014 and 2015 but dipped to 62% last year. This year it was back at 69%, as the gross and average each gained 16% over last year's figures. The gross of 'almost' \$53-million was 13% higher than the 2015 gross, and other indicators suggest the market has finally moved forward, about 10% based on this limited but probably significant sample, from 2015. The combined Fasig July plus Saratoga Select gross is up almost \$8-million from last year, though by only about 4% compared to 2015. Fasig's New York-bred sale is this weekend and has averaged plus or minus \$80,000 each of the last three years.

For us the really significant figure is that the number sold from the catalogue went back to 69% and change, while sustaining a 7% rise in the number catalogued and sold, plus a 5% increase in average. Given the 13% rise in gross, it's probably not being over-optimistic to say the Saratoga sale was up around 10% from its previous 2015 post-Crash highs. If the next 10,000 or so yearlings to sell could do that, we'd be justified in calling it a strong, and very good, marketplace.

As far as sires go, when the market is strong you have to be a little careful not to fall into a "rising tide lifts all boats" scenario where everything looks good; even when the market is strong, some do look even better. Though none of the top five on average after Fasig July and Saratoga had more than four sold, nonetheless the right names are at the top. Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** has been the number three sire in North America, behind

Gainesway's Tapit and Claiborne's War Front, for most of this decade, and while a clear third in a field of a few hundred is very good form, nonetheless it's good to see him hit the number one ranking once in a while, and right now Medaglia d'Oro's \$756,250 average (4 sold) tops both War Front (\$710,000, as you know, 2 sold) and Tapit (\$600,000 average, 4 sold). "Medaglia" had the \$1-million sale-topping Fasig July filly, and colts which sold for \$900k, \$575k, and \$550k at Saratoga. Click here to see the

top 50 North American sires by yearling average after the two Fasig sales.

One of the best ways to make money in the horse business is to guess right about young sires, and four of those are among

the top eight North American sires by average thus far. Hill 'n' Dale's Curlin stood at Lane's End for \$35,000 in 2015, and his four sold have averaged \$587,500 so far, topped by the \$1-million Saratoga colt--though he has had 11 through the ring. WinStar's **Pioneerof The Nile**, who had 3-year-old Cairo Prince and 2-year-old American Pharoah by the end of 2014, stood for \$60,000; three of his six offered so far have averaged \$458,333. Coolmore Ashford's Scat Daddy stood what turned out to be his final season for \$35,000, and not surprisingly nine sold, of 11 offered, for an average of \$396,666; and the same firm's **Uncle** Mo, whose first yearlings had just sold, stood for \$25,000 in 2015. He's already had 23 through the ring, of which 18 have sold, for an average of \$332,500. Spendthrift's Malibu Moon was of course long since established (he stood for \$95,000 in 2015), and he's had seven sell for an average of \$433,571 so far, ranking him sixth on this list.

A total of 15 sires have had two or more sell for an average of \$300,000 or more so far. Established sires which stood for \$50,000 or more in 2015 among these included: Lane's End's Candy Ride (Arg) (2 fillies offered and sold, average \$355,000); and WinStar's Tiznow (4, \$332,500) and More Than Ready (6, \$318,333). Two sires who have made good starts with their first 2-year-olds made this list: Claiborne's Orb, who has averaged \$336,428 with 14 sold from 15 offered--everybody loves Orb; and Darley's Animal **Kingdom**, with two black-type

winners already, had four sell, of five offered, for an average of \$326,250.

WinStar's **Super Saver** (that's four WinStar sires in the top 15) had three average \$311,666; and Spendthrift's remarkable **Into Mischief** had 10 sell (of 17 offered) for an average of \$305,000, off his 2015 stud fee of \$35,000.

Five sires with their first yearlings rank among the top 50 on average. Three Chimneys figured to have the top first-crop yearling sire in 2013 champion 3-year-old Will Take Charge, who has had nine sell (of 11 offered) for an average of \$274,444, which by the way is over nine times his \$30,000 stud fee. They probably didn't expect to have the exacta, but with an \$825,000 Saratoga filly, the 2013 GI Hopeful S. winner Strong Mandate claims second spot, with five sold, for an average of \$263,400--over 26 times his \$10,000 stud fee! Airdrie's Cairo Prince, whose foals have been wowing

for an average of \$172,777--itself more than 17 times his entering \$10,000 fee (since raised to \$15,000 due to overwhelming demand), with Ashford's **Verrazano** fourth at this point, five sold averaging \$169,400. WinStar's Fed Biz, like Cairo Prince a market darling from last year's foal sales, ranks fifth among first-crop yearling sires with two or more sold (Hill 'n' Dale's Atreides has had one sell for \$135,000), with eight sold, for an average of \$119,375--nearly 10 times his entering \$12,500 stud fee. Saratoga is of course a boutique sale, and most sires' averages will fall a good bit as thousands more yearlings arrive in the marketplace, but what's significant about the averages so far is we see what prices the top individuals can command. "If we can get 10-12 million visitors, which is the estimate that everyone is giving once you start getting into some potential institutional use and sports fields, I think it leads to so many more people on the site," Lawson continued. "It would be great if we could have all these people coming on to

our property and then we can sell out our dining rooms and march horses around. We can really promote our sport. It would be great to have all of that right in the backyard of a horse racing track."

The Ontario government announced Tuesday that Great Canadian Gaming Corporation and Brookfield Business Partners won the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation's bid to expand and operate three gaming facilities in the Greater Toronto Area, notably

Woodbine has made its intention known for several years to have a full-fledged casino on its property to compete with companies in surrounding areas that have casinos with slots and gaming tables, but don't offer horse racing. OLG indicated in its announcement that Woodbine could potentially have 5,000 slots machines--double its current amount--and 400

gaming tables.

Because there are various regulatory conditions that must be

made before any construction begins at Woodbine, there is no specific timetable for when the casino will open. Lawson is hoping the regulatory hurdles can be cleared in a year's time from now, adding that a casino is part of WEG's plans to make Woodbine a total destination for entertainment that could also include a hotel and concert hall.

"That's something we're still

keen on doing and we're moving ahead with," he said.

"If you assume this new gaming expansion is going to bring millions of visitors to the site, then the success of a music venue is, in part, tied to that," Lawson added. "The announcement [several years ago] of an entertainment venue by Woodbine was separate from this announcement, although we acknowledged all along this gaming development had to go ahead as a catalyst to put the entertainment venue in. I think this gives us a much better chance now for the entertainment venue to move ahead now that we know who we're dealing with and now that we're moving ahead."

The announcement of a casino is the latest news regarding changes to Woodbine, which was built by E.P. Taylor and opened in 1956. WEG announced in June plans to move its harness racing division full-time to its plant at Mohawk Racetrack in 2018, thereby making Woodbine solely a Thoroughbred track. There are also plans to turn the harness track into a second turf track.

Lawson said the addition of the casino will provide the financial resources needed to operate Woodbine as a world-class horse racing facility.

"For the benefit of our horsemen and for the benefit of the sport, we want this to be a vibrant district of entertainment and residential and institutional uses," he said.

"Not many racetracks in North America enjoy the two training tracks that we have. Just for the quality of our grounds and the backstretch, we need the cash flow from the use of the land to maintain all those things for our horsemen." (Click to return to p1)

TRAVERS COMMITMENTS TO FIRM UP AFTER WEEKEND BREEZES

GI Kentucky Derby hero Always Dreaming (Bodemeister) and GII Jim Dandy S. winner Good Samaritan (Harlan's Holiday) will be among a handful of contenders for the Aug. 26 GI Travers S. to breeze this weekend as the field for the Mid-Summer Derby begins to take shape.

Always Dreaming, the convincing Derby winner, backed up to finish eighth in the GI Preakness S. and set the pace before fading to be third in the Jim Dandy July 29. He will be joined on the worktab this weekend by GI Belmont S. winner Tapwrit (Tapit) and Curlin S. victor **Outplay** (Bernardini) as trainer Todd Pletcher hopes to make a more informed decision about which of his charges he should enter in the Travers.

"I think that'll help clarify things," Pletcher told the NYRA notes team. "I'll work those two and Outplay probably at the same time and continue them all on a path that could lead to the Travers." Cont. p8

Pletcher also reported that 'TDN Rising Star' Patch (Union Rags) exited his fourth-place finish in the GIII West Virginia Derby "fine," saying, "We'll give it a couple weeks and see where we're at. I wouldn't say [he's] completely out of consideration [for the Travers], but I would think he's maybe more likely for the [GI] Pennsylvania Derby or something like that."

Good Samaritan, the upsetter of the Jim Dandy, has continued to train well since that effort and is on course for the Travers, according to trainer Bill Mott.

"He's been good and we will probably work over the weekend," Mott said. "But he's been galloping every day. He went to the gate today, stood well and backed out."

Chad Brown's duo of Preakness winner Cloud Computing (Maclean's Music) and 'TDN Rising Star' Timeline (Hard Spun) are also slated to work this weekend, dependent on weather.

"I'm not sure where either of them will go yet. They'll both breeze here this week and hopefully it'll bring us closer to a decision," Brown said, before adding that GIII Dwyer S. winner and GI betfair.com Haskell Invitational third Practical Joke (Into Mischief) remains on target for the seven-furlong GI H. Allen Jerkens Memorial on Travers day.

In non-Travers news, Christophe Clement said Wednesday that his MGSW Frostmourne (Speightstown) will not make an expected trip to Arlington Park for this Saturday's GI Secretartiat S. after missing a planned workout earlier this week.

"The horse is doing just fine, I just thought he wasn't training as well as he should be," Clement offered. "So, he missed the work and he won't be able to go to the Secretariat. He's having an easy week and then we'll regroup sometime this weekend to decide what to do."

The dark bay colt, who has annexed the GIII Penn Mile and GIII Kent S. so far this season, could instead be pointed to the GIII Saranac S. at Saratoga Sept. 2, the next major stake for 3-year-old turf horses on the calendar.

"At the moment, everything is a possibility as long as the horse is fine," Clement said. "We'll just see how he is during the week and go from there."

IN SHARPER FOCUS: SUNSET RIDGE

Jon Clay's Alpha Delta Stables and trainer Chad Brown appear to have another nice one on their hands after New York-bred **Sunset Ridge** (Algorithms) made it a perfect three-for-three in 'TDN Rising Star' fashion at the Spa Wednesday afternoon.

"We were really excited with her performance," Clay's advisor Reynolds Bell Jr. said by phone from Saratoga. "She came into the race with a couple of good wins and Chad's been trying to get a race into her for about 10 days to two weeks, but nothing's filled. It's nice to be able to get her over there today and see her move forward. She ran very well."

A stakes race will likely be on the horizon for the Alpha Delta homebred, but Bell preferred the wait-and-see approach before naming possible targets. Saratoga's New York Showcase Day is a little over two weeks away on Aug. 25.

"I think Chad will see how she comes out of this race and make a plan from there," Bell said. "I know a couple of things have been discussed. Depending on how she comes back, we may look for some black-type for her next start."

Clay also raced Sunset Ridge's dam, the Fusaichi Pegasus mare Cades Bay. The half-sister to GSW & MGISP Voodoo (Petionville), a \$90,000 KEESEP yearling purchase, won two of eight career

starts for trainer Christophe Clement, including a grassy allowance at Aqueduct.

"Mr. Clay was in the market to buy a few yearlings and she fit the profile of what we were looking for and had some pedigree in her family, too," Bell said. "She had ability--but just had a little soundness issue with her knee and didn't quite get the black-type that we wanted."

The 11-year-old's previous two foals--R Y Squadron (Stormy Atlantic) and Nevisian Sky (Sky Mesa)--have also both won for Alpha Delta and Brown with the latter just coming up a nose short in a recent optional claimer upstate earlier this month. Cades Bay is also represented by an unraced 2-year-old gelding by Stormy Atlantic and had a filly by First Samurai earlier this year. Cades Bay brought \$17,000 from Southern Oak Farm while in foal to First Samurai at the 2016 KEENOV sale.

Other recent standouts for Clay and Brown include: 2016 GII Lake George S. heroine Ancient Secret (Kantharos); 2017 GIII Bay Shore S. winner Long Haul Bay (Quality Road); and three-time graded winner and GI Kentucky Oaks third Lewis Bay (Bernardini).

"We put the mare back through ring because we had this filly as a possible replacement for her," Bell said. "Mr. Clay wasn't here [at Saratoga] unfortunately, but obviously he's very excited. We'll see what the future brings." -- @SteveSherackTDN
