Hillwood Stud's select annual consignment for Doncaster has already produced one of the yearling sale's most famous graduates in the shape of enduring sprinter Sole Power (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}), as well as a number of other future winners. So by the time Goffs UK's event gets underway Tuesday, there will have been plenty of interested parties scrutinising the five youngsters displayed by Charlie and Tracy Vigors and their Wiltshire operation.

"It's been a lucky sale for us," Charlie Vigors recalled. "You all dream they will end up as good as Sole Power, but you can never know. He was very small when we had him but his heart was obviously in the right place as he carried on for plenty of years."

"We've also had Extortionist (Ire) (Dandy Man {Ire}), who won the Windsor Castle at Royal Ascot, while Orvar (Ire) would be another Dandy Man that Tony Nerses bought. Mistress Of Venice (GB) (Bated Breath {GB}) has probably been our best from last year, I should think she's the highest-rated maiden in the country after finishing fourth in the Albany and the Duchess Of Cambridge S."

Situated just outside Marlborough, Hillwood has been home to the family for 12 years.

The British yearling sales season gets underway Tuesday and, while the name Goffs UK is slowly becoming regular parlance among the sales crowd, to many this week's Premier and Silver Sales in Yorkshire will simply always be collectively known as 'Donny'. Tuesday and Wednesday will feature those animals deemed to be in the premier category and it's safe to say that no other sale has so successfully carved a distinctive niche for itself. Spend time looking at foals or yearlings on farms and it won't be long before you hear someone say, "he's a real Donny horse", the translation for which reads strong and sharp-looking--the type that one might reasonably expect to be ready in time at two for the meeting which has become the holy grail for many owners, Royal Ascot.

Power Behind Hillwood Draft cont.

This tranquil corner is visited by some of Nicky Henderson's jumpers for their summer holidays, while that trainer's Cheltenham Gold Cup winner Bobs Worth (Ire) (Bob Back) even retired there and is now ridden by the Vigors's horse-mad children.

Mares and foals explore the paddocks, while other horses lodge in the stables and use the gallops in their pre-training regimes.

Right now, sales preparation is the most serious business and candidates have been sifted, sorted and brought up to standard.

"I think the typical Donny horse has changed over the last few years," Vigors added. "It's a great sale in so much as people still go there to look for the sharp, precocious 2-year-olds, but I think it's attracting more buyers who are looking for more than just that. A lot of people are looking for horses that will not only make 2-year-olds, but have the scope to progress after that."

Among the quintet are two more colts by Juddmonte's Bated Breath, but Vigors explains they are very different individuals.

"The Waitingonacloud (GB) [lot 349] would be a sharper, earlier type," he said. "Bated Breath has had plenty of 2-year-olds this year. There's plenty of stamina in the family, which goes back to Persian Punch (Ire), but when the second dam [Bourbonella {GB}] was bred for speed she produced Aqlaam (GB) and Nine Realms (GB). You're hoping you're going to replicate that again when breeding back for speed."

"The other Bated Breath [lot 39] out of Foxtrot Alpha (Ire) (Desert Prince {Ire}) would be a rangier, probably later-developing type. You wouldn't have called him a typical Doncaster horse in the past but he's a been very good mover on the lunge and will probably need a bit more time."

"There's a Camacho (GB) out of Foxtrot Pearl (Ire) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) [lot 40]. His pedigree shouts speed and precocity that's exactly what he looks like. He's out of a winning Bahamian Bounty mare and she's out of Nina Blini (GB) (Bertolini), who was third in the Queen Mary, so he's going to be an out-and-out 2-year-old."

Iffraaj (GB) has had a fine 2017 through the likes of Ribchester (Ire) and Jon Snow (NZ), and lot 326 could be one that flies fairly high. Dam Tesary (GB) (Danehill) has produced the prolific trio Verbeeck (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), Englishman (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) and Englishwoman (GB) (Acclamation {GB}).

"He's a nice colt," said Vigors. "Iffraaj can do no wrong at the moment and he ought to appeal to plenty of people. The mare has done well and again, he'll make a 2-year-old but has a bit of size about him as well."

Vigors is taking one filly in lot 69. By Showcasing (GB), she is the first foal of Heho (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who is from the close family of the top-class Domedriver (Ire).

There are plenty of notable examples among recent Goffs UK graduates, but one which perhaps perfectly encapsulates the 'Donny horse' is Gale Force Ten (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who topped the sale back in 2011 at €280,000 and went on to finish runner-up to Reckless Abandon (Exchange Rate) in the G2 Coventry S. before winning the following year's G3 Jersey S. You'll find seven of his first-crop yearlings for sale across the next three days.

Gale Force Ten's breeder Bob McCreery, who died in December, will be much missed at the sales this season, but his name very much lives on at the races through some notable graduates of his Stowell Hill Stud. McCreery enjoyed plenty of success with Richard Hannon, Sr over the years, and Richard, Jr has continued in a similar vein, coaxing impressively consistent form from the half-siblings **Billesdon Bess (GB)** (Dick Turpin {Ire}) and **Billesdon Brook (GB)** (Champs Elysees {GB}). Bob's wife Jeanette is continuing at the helm of Stowell Hill and, with the Pall Mall Partners, has enjoyed some good days out this summer. Not even the appalling weather at Glorious Goodwood could dampen the mood as 'the Billesdons' won on consecutive days at the meeting, and each has gone on to stakes glory. On Aug. 16, the 3-year-old Billesdon Bess won the Listed Upavon Fillies' S. at Salisbury, while on Saturday her year-younger brother returned to Goodwood to land the G3 Prestige S.

GOFFS UK PREMIER SALE GRADUATE

Harry Angel (Dark Angel)

The siblings can now boast seven wins from only 15 starts between them and, as first and second foals, are a real feather in the cap of the young Manduro (Ger) mare Coplow (GB), a daughter of the accomplished Stowell Hill matriarch Anna Oleanda (Ire), who is by one of the farm's most famous alumni, Old Vic (GB).

Incidentally, both Coplow and Trois Lunes (Fr), the dam of Haras de Saint Pair's Group 3 winner and Group 1-placed Trais Fluors (GB), are from the first crop of Manduro, a stallion we should expect to hear more about in the broodmare sire division in the coming years. Trais Fluors and Billesdon Brook are bred on very similar lines as sons of the full-brothers Dansili (GB) and Champs Elysees (GB).

Pivotal Week For Prescott Team...

Pivotal (GB) only ran six times in his life but he won four of those races, culminating in the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York in 1996 for the inimitable Sir Mark Prescott. In the intervening two decades, the Cheveley Park Stud stallion has grafted his way to become one of the most respected sires in Britain. His influence was felt last week on the Knavesmire through his grandson **Wells Farhh Go (Ire)**, an unbeaten son of the first-season sire Farhh (GB), who took the G3 Acomb S. for local trainer Tim Easterby. Another of Pivotal's sons who will be worthy of a stud place when he eventually retires is 6-year-old **Lightning Spear (GB)**, who on Saturday landed his second consecutive G2 Celebration Mile and has been a stalwart of the Qatar Racing team, with placed finishes this season in the G1 Lockinge S. and G1 Sussex S.

Twenty-one years after Pivotal's last hurrah, his trainer, the longest-serving member of his profession in Newmarket, claimed his second Nunthorpe trophy with the consistent **Marsha (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}), who rarely fails to give her many owners in the Elite Racing Club a proper run for their money. The 4-year-old's impressive record now stretches to seven wins—including two at Group 1 level—and seven places from her 16 starts. In a sad week for Rathbarry Stud, which lost its leading National Hunt sire Presenting (GB), Marsha was one of two group winners for another of the farm's resident stallions, Acclamation, whose son **Attendu (Fr)** won the G3 Prix Quincey Barriere.

Sir Mark wasn't on hand to collect the trophy himself, as he was in Ireland looking at yearlings, but he will have been proud of his Heath House team, led by his long-term assistant William Butler, who will one day succeed him as trainer. The yard very nearly pulled off a big-race double at York at opposite ends of the distance spectrum, with **Flymetothestars (GB)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) being beaten just a head by Nakeeta (GB) (Sixties Icon {GB}) in the valuable Ebor H.

The lightly raced 4-year-old is clearly held in high regard at Heath House, with Butler indicating after the race that Flymetothestars will now be stepping up in grade out of handicap company. In the meantime the Prescott team has another decent stayer with which to go to war in the form of **St Michel (GB)**, who is also by Sea The Stars and was beaten only half a length when third in the G2 Lonsdale Cup. He remains on course for Melbourne.

Leger Not In Mind For The Queen...

The Queen may not have enjoyed seeing Dartmouth (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) being beaten a nose by the fast-finishing Montaly (GB) (Yeats {Ire}) in the G2 Lonsdale Cup but a double dose of compensation came Her Majesty's way just 24 hours later. The William Haggas-trained **Call To Mind (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) posted a fine performance on just his fifth start when winning the Listed March S. at Goodwood, setting up a stakes-race double which was completed by **Fabricate (GB)** (Makfi {GB}) in the G3 Winter Hill S., a first group winner in the royal colours for trainer Michael Bell.

If the Queen had happened to be in residence at Windsor Castle, a good pair of binoculars would have allowed her to watch Fabricate's race without the need to venture out to her local course. She will doubtless have been delighted at a pair of

homebred stakes winners, but she will not be adding to her Classic haul this year. Call To Mind's Goodwood win sparked a hope that he may attempt to give the Queen a second St Leger victory 40 years after Dunfermline's memorable win in Silver Jubilee year. He is not, however, entered in the race, which takes place on Sept. 9.

Described by his trainer as still being "a shell", Call To Mind, a son of the G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Memory (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), will instead be a horse to look forward to for next year.

"We are not supplementing for the St Leger. If Call To Mind runs again this season, it will be in the G2 Prix Chaudenay at Chantilly on Arc weekend," Haggas told the *TDN* Monday. Call To Mind's win Saturday was the 99th of the season for Haggas. Winners number 100 and 101 were notched the following day at Goodwood and Yarmouth to make him one of only four trainers in Britain to have broken the 100-winner mark this season. The fact that Haggas has achieved this from 385 runners means that he has the best winning strike-rate of the bunch at an impressive 26%. Congratulations to all the team at Somerville Lodge. UPWARDLY MOBILE SALE UNDERWAY

TODAY by Emma Berry

In 2012, 396 horses were sold at what was then known as the DBS Premier Sale, exactly the same number as changed hands at last year's rebranded Goffs UK Premier Sale. What has changed in the intervening years is that the figures for turnover, average and median have all improved significantly. From £10,645,000 five years ago, last year's aggregate shot up to £17,455,000, while the average rose from £26,881 to £44,078 and the median from £20,000 to £34,000.

Also within that time have come two G1 Darley July Cup-winning graduates--**Harry Angel (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) and **Limato (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}), bought for £44,000 and £41,000 respectively--while **Barney Roy (Ire)** (Excelebration {Ire}), **Rajasinghe (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) and **Different League (Fr)** (Dabirsim {Fr}) provided the sale with a Royal Ascot group-race treble in 2017. All things considered, confidence among the Goffs UK team, now headed by affable Australian Tony 'Tubba' Williams, should be sky high as it prepares to tackle its most important three days of the year.

The bloodstock crowd has ignored the traditional British August Bank Holiday and has been hard at work in Doncaster since Saturday. From 470 catalogued for the two-day Premier Sale, which starts today at 10 a.m., 23 had been withdrawn at the time of writing.

Standing her ground is **lot 355**, a filly from the first crop of Shadwell's Mukhadram (GB) offered by Baroda & Colbinstown Studs.

Her recent updates have come from half-brother Beckford (GB) (Bated Breath {GB}), who added a runner-up finish in the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. to his victory in the G2 Railway S., while Poet's Word (GB) (Poet's Voice {GB}), a half-brother to the filly's dam Whirly Dancer (GB) (Danhill Dancer {Ire}), won the G3 Glorious S. at Goodwood.

Denis McDonnell of Parkway Farm sold his homebred treble Group 1 Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) at Doncaster for £65,000 back in 2011 and returns this year with two yearlings, including a filly by the perennially popular Kodiak (GB) (lot 383). The half-sister to four winners has plenty to recommend her beyond her racing days, too, as she is from a strong Aga Khan family which includes the top-class stayer Alandi (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and former champion 3-year-old Aliysa (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), a full-sister to the filly's granddam.

Meanwhile, Parkway Farm's most famous son, the Haras de Bouquetot-based Olympic Glory, has seven of his first-crop yearlings on offer this week. Among them is lot 246, a colt out of River Test (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}) who is offered by Coulonces sales and is eligible for French premiums. Though the mare was unraced, she hails from a talented Kingsclere Stud family and is a half-sister to 10 winners, seven of whom notched black-type, headed by the Group 2 winner Passing Glance (GB) (Polar Falcon).

The story of former sale-topper Gale Force Ten (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) is recounted in The Weekly Wrap and his Invincible Spirit half-sister (lot 250) is included on behalf of her breeder Stowell Hill Stud among a strong draft from Paul and Sara Thorman's Trickledown Stud, which last year consigned both the aforementioned Royal Ascot juvenile winners, Rajasinghe and Different League, while other previous graduates include the dual Guineas winner Cockney Rebel (Ire) (Val Royal {Fr}). Another of the filly's half-brothers, Eynhallow (GB) (Nathaniel {GB}), has won twice this year for Roger Charlton and is rated 92. Like Olympic Glory, Gale Force Ten is among a sizeable batch of first-season sires with yearlings on sale this year and has seven catalogued this week.

With the exploits of Society Rock (Ire)'s progeny having boosted him to the head of the first-season sires' table in Europe, members of the late stallion's second crop are destined to sell at a premium and there are seven up for grabs this week. Tally-Ho Stud, which stood Society Rock and bred his first Group 1 winner Unfortunately (Ire), offers three of the septet, including lot 312, a colt out of the unraced Whipper mare Suffer Her (Ire) who has produced four winners from her first five foals.

Another freshman riding high is Darley's Farhh (GB), who recorded his first group winner at York last week courtesy of Wells Farhh Go (GB). The son of Pivotal (GB) has had relatively small crops to date and only one yearling has made his way into the Goffs UK sale. Lot 130, from Lynn Lodge Stud, will be well worth a look as not only is he French-bred and thus eligible for valuable owners' premiums, but he is the first foal of treble winner Little Shambles (GB), a daughter of Shamardal whose profile as a broodmare sire is rising steadily.

On the subject of premiums, it's worth remembering that Sheikh Fahad Al Thani developed a lucrative scheme along the lines of the French system upon the retirement to stud of his beloved multiple Group 1 winner Dunaden, who was himself bred in France. The Overbury Stud resident has just two first-crop yearlings catalogued this week--lot 176 in the Premier Sale from Tinnakill House and lot 511 from Catridge Farm Stud in Thursday's Silver Sale. Both are eligible to earn a 64% bonus of any prize-money they earn on the racecourse at two and three.

PLUS 10 DEADLINE REMINDER

European breeders should be aware that the deadline for registering foals for the Plus 10 bonus scheme is this Thursday Aug. 31. The 'Foal Registration' fee of £150 must be paid by then in order for a foal to be registered for the scheme and to have the opportunity to win a £10,000 bonus once it commences racing in Britain and Ireland. Up to the end of July over £10 million in bonus money had been paid out so far in the scheme which expands in 2017, with the addition of about 30 3-year-old Class 5 Maiden races over 11f+, providing a significant increase in opportunities for horses within the scheme. Another amendment sees breeders who register a foal for Plus 10 being guaranteed a £1,000 bonus if that horse goes on to win a Plus 10 race, even if subsequent registration payments are not made. Also any horse paid up to the foal registration stage will be flagged as Plus 10 on individual pedigree pages within sales catalogues, providing a marketing advantage in the sales ring. To register foals, breeders must complete a registration form available [online](#) and pay the fee of £150 per foal by Aug. 31.

Weir worked both **Black Heart Bart (Aus)** (Blackfriars {Aus}) and **Tosen Stardom (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) as they complete their preparation for Australia's first Group 1 of the season, the G1 Memsie S. at Caulfield Saturday. "Both horses worked really well," Weir told *Racing.com*. "Tosen Stardom is never a great track worker, but I thought his work over a strong half mile with Black Heart Bart was good." Both horses are closely matched on racecourse form with only a nose separating the pair when Black Heart Bart got the better of his stablemate in the G1 Futurity S. at Caulfield last February and both horses enter the Memsie off the back of promising seasonal debuts when they finished third and fifth to Hartnell (GB) (Authorized {Ire}) in the G2 P.B. Lawrence S. at Caulfield Aug. 19, when Black Heart Bart again finished the more prominent of the duo. Weir says each horse has come forward since his seasonal debut and is expecting a bold show at the weekend. "We're really happy with Black Heart Bart and, as normal, the first-up run has brought him on. Both horses have definitely come on, although Tosen Stardom probably still has a bit more to come." Saturday's A\$1-million contest over seven furlongs has attracted a classy and full field of 16, with four emergencies. Also in line to start are fellow Group 1 winners **Le Romain (Aus)** (Hard Spun), **Jon Sow (NZ)** (Iffraaj {GB}), **Yankee Rose (Aus)** (All American {Aus}), **Hey Doc (Aus)** (Duporth {Aus}) and **I Am A Star (NZ)** (I Am Invincible {Aus}).

FIFTEEN POTENTIAL RIVALS FOR WINX

It blocks out 20% of the sound and she will still hear 80%." Assuming Winx comes through her test Saturday as everyone anticipates, she will then contest the G1 George Main S. two weeks later at Randwick Sept. 16.

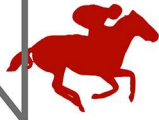

VALERIO HOPING FOR ANOTHER 'WONDERFUL' RESULT AT THE SPA

Bloodstock agent Kim Valerio has picked out a lot of top horses in the dozen-plus years that she's been in the racing business since transitioning over from show jumping, including the likes of Grade I winners Scat Daddy (Johannesburg), The Factor (War Front), Grace Hall (Empire Maker) and Gozzip Girl (Dynaformer), but she's shown a noteworthy affinity for runners by one sire in particular: Tiz Wonderful.

First came **My Happy Face**, who Valerio scooped up for just \$35,000 on behalf of leading New York owner **Michael Dubb** at the 2011 Keeneland September Sale. Turned over to trainer Rudy Rodriguez, the chestnut broke her maiden by a jaw-dropping 21 1/4 lengths second out at Saratoga the following August. A no-brainer '**TDN Rising Star**' off of that performance, she just missed in Belmont's GI Frizette S. next out before annexing the GIII Tempted S. My Happy Face would go on to hit the board in two more Grade I races for Dubb and then Rockingham Ranch when that California-based outfit bought into her, bankrolling more than \$583,000 in the process. She eventually sold to Clearsky Farm for \$625,000 at the 2014 Keeneland November sale.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS: PRACTICAL JOKE

To the question, "Which stallion is going to be the next big thing in American breeding?" I guess quite a few people would nominate Into Mischief. One fully paid-up member of the Into Mischief fan club is Garrett O'Rourke, judging by the fact that nine of Juddmonte's 2017 American foals are by the up-and-coming Spendthrift stallion. The 12-year-old son of Harlan's Holiday also has eight Juddmonte mares in foal this year, including five daughters of Empire Maker.

The stallion's admirers can point to the 3-year-old **Practical Joke**, winner of Saturday's GI H. Allen Jerkens S., as a fine example of Into Mischief's talents. Indeed, Into Mischief's entire 2014 crop--which runs to 170 foals--has helped highlight the stallion's potential.

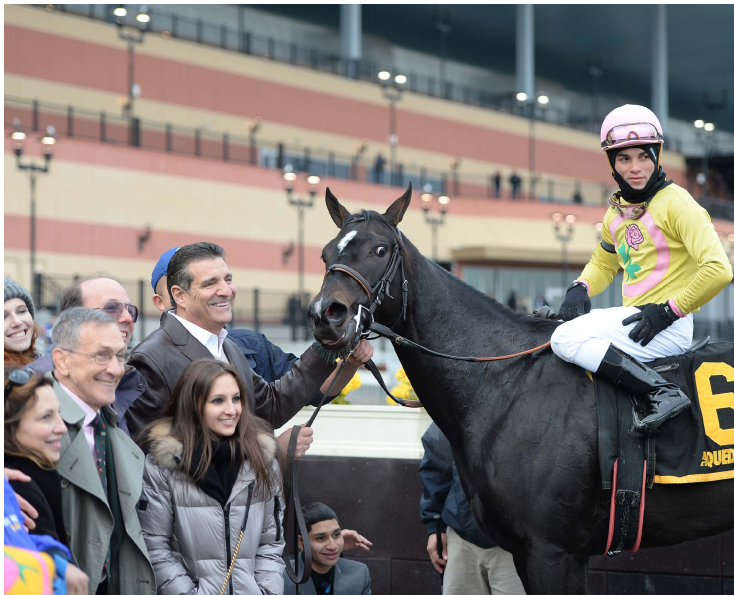

Valerio Hoping for Another 'Wonderful'

Shortly after My Happy Face finished third, beaten only a neck, in the GI Test S. at three, Valerio returned to Keeneland and found another bargain buy by the then Spendthrift resident. Acquired for \$72,000, **Condo Commando**, a daughter of MGSW Yearly Report (General Meeting), was risked for a \$75,000 tag first out at the Spa in August of 2014 by Rodriguez, Dubb, Bethlehem Stables and the Elkstone Group, but aired by 12 sharp lengths. She handled the step up in class with aplomb to romp in the GI Spinaway S. later that month, and added two more open-length graded tallies en route to \$758,600 in career earnings. She sold for \$1.5 million to Japan's Katsumi Yoshida at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton November Sale.

Tiz Wonderful, himself a flashy debut winner at Saratoga who earned 'Rising Star' status, was sold to the Korean Racing Authority in 2014, and his final U.S.-sired runners are 2-year-olds of this year. One of them is **Lady Ivanka**, who Valerio purchased for \$80,000 at this year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training sale after a :21 2/5 breeze. Let go at 7-1 for her Aug. 9 unveiling, the Rodriguez pupil leveled off powerfully in the lane to blow away a well-backed firster by eight lengths and also receive the 'Rising Star' nod.

Owned in partnership with Mike Caruso's Bethlehem Stables and Michael Imperio, Lady Ivanka will look to become the third Spinaway heroine for Dubb Saturday, following in the hoofsteps of the aforementioned Grace Hall and Condo Commando.

When asked what caught her eye about Lady Ivanka at the sales, Valerio said, “I liked her at the yearling sale [\$11K RNA at KEESEP], but there was something at the time that I wasn’t crazy about, so I figured I’d just wait and see how she came along... I would say the one reason why everybody overlooked her at [Timonium] was that she was carrying a lot of weight. When I saw her up at Belmont [about a month before the start of the Saratoga meet], Rudy was getting the weight off of her and she was really starting to take shape.”

Valerio also saw shades of My Happy Face and Condo Commando in Lady Ivanka.

“She looked a lot like my past good Tiz Wonderfals,” Valerio said. “She had that same feel. I like long-bodied horses with big shoulders, and she for sure had that... They all have heart. Every one of them that I’ve had has had heart. My Happy Face is just so beautiful--out of all of them, she’s the most beautiful. Condo Commando is the most fierce. Lady Ivanka is really built like a cross between the two of them.”

Valerio admitted to being devastated when the news broke that Tiz Wonderful was to be sent to Korea.

“I cried,” she admitted. “I called Mr. Dubb and asked him if it would be ok if I called and tried to buy him and he said yes, but they weren’t going to do it--they had already signed the contract.”

Among Valerio’s other final Tiz Wonderfals to perform well on the track is the well-named **Splashtastic**, a 4-year-old colt who earned back-to-back 101 Beyer Speed Figures for a pair of runner-up efforts in optional-claiming company downstate. The \$40,000 KEESEP yearling’s moniker is an homage to legendary NYRA announcer Tom Durkin’s last call ([video](#))--“splashtastic” was how he described Condo Commando’s performance over a very wet track in the Spinaway.

Valerio’s buying strategy involves targeting young, under-the-radar sires. That’s how she found Tiz Wonderful, and she hopes freshman Jimmy Creed might be her next go-to stallion. The Grade I-winning son of Distorted Humor also stands at B. Wayne Hughes’s Spendthrift.

“I love those guys [at Spendthrift],” she said. “Those are my guys. My Happy Face was from them, and so was Condo Commando. They’re my good luck charm. B. Wayne Hughes, I love that guy. He’s awesome.”

Valerio paid \$85,000 on behalf of Dubb and partners for **Wall of Compassion** (Jimmy Creed) at last year’s Keeneland September sale. The bay filly donned cap and gown by a nose in a muddy, rained-off MSW in Elmont July 7, and was third at 23-1 in the Gil Adirondack S. Aug. 12. Valerio believes she still boasts major upside.

“I think she wants more distance,” Valerio said. “She doesn’t have a lot of speed. I think she needs to go two turns and develop--she’s looked a little heavy to me still, but she’s a beauty.”

And Valerio would know. From her time in the show-jumping world to her ever-growing list of standouts on the track, the daughter of prominent drag racing figure Mike Valerio has demonstrated her keen eye for a horse year after year.

“This is my 13th year of runners,” she said. “My horsemanship has gotten me everywhere. Those guys [in show jumping] were paying a million dollars for horses that didn’t win any money, so they had to last for a long time, because it was really hard to replace them.”

Valerio might not have wanted to have to find a replacement for Tiz Wonderful, but there’s little doubt that she’ll find one in no time--if she hasn’t already.

Sired at an increased fee of \$20,000, this crop produced 37 individual juvenile winners, of which six enjoyed black-type success. They earned Into Mischief the title of champion sire of two-year-olds, ahead of War Front, Pioneer of The Nile, Tapit, Scat Daddy and Harlan’s Holiday.

Practical Joke was comfortably the best of them, as he showed with his victories in the GI Hopeful S. in his second start and the GI Champagne S. in his third. He rounded off his first season with a respectable third behind Classic Empire in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile. These efforts earned Practical Joke a figure of 122 on the Experimental Free H., just 4lb below **Classic Empire**.

This year has shown that Practical Joke--like Into Mischief’s previous GI winner Goldcents--is much more than just a 2-year-old. Victories in the GIII Dwyer S. and the GI H. Allen Jerkens S. have seen him remain unbeaten around one turn, and his efforts around two turns haven’t been too shabby either, as he showed with his close third behind **Girvin** and **McCraken** in the GI Haskell Invitational.

Practical Joke’s recent efforts drew fulsome praise from trainer Chad Brown, who pointed out that “he’s so versatile. It was his third race in seven weeks. He’s our iron horse.”

It’s still early days for this year’s 2-year-olds, but Into Mischief currently ranks a close second behind Scat Daddy among the sires of juveniles, with 15 winners already in the bag. Two have enjoyed black-type success and there’s good reason for thinking there are more to come. Although this crop was also sired at a fee of \$20,000, it achieved an average of \$212,104 at this year’s 2-year-old sales, where his best price for a colt was \$600,000, with his fillies selling for up to \$450,000.

The demand for his best stock was also evident at Saratoga a few weeks ago, with colts selling for \$850,000, \$500,000 and \$320,000, even though they are off a fee of only \$35,000. This suggests there could be fireworks at the upcoming Keeneland September Sale, where Into Mischief has three youngsters in Book 1 and 36 in Book 2.

Needless to say, Into Mischief hasn’t always enjoyed this type of popularity. I mentioned earlier that his 2014 crop was sired at

\$20,000, but he was priced at only \$7,500 when Spendthrift originally announced its stallion fees for 2013. But then his first-crop 2-year-olds began to shine. November 2012 saw Goldencents land the rich Delta Downs Jackpot, and the last month of the year saw the smart Vyjack record the first of his stakes successes, while Sittin At The Bar won a couple of Louisiana stakes races. This propelled Into Mischief into a close third place among the freshman sires.

Demand for Into Mischief's services grew so great that Spendthrift took the unusual step of revising his fee, firstly to \$10,000 and then to \$20,000. Of course, Into Mischief's profile was also benefiting from the exploits of his remarkable half-sister Beholder. This daughter of Henny Hughes recorded the first two of her 11 Grade I victories in 2012, when she landed both the Del Mar Debutante and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. It is worth mentioning that the sires of Into Mischief and Beholder were

both grandsons of Storm Cat.

Then there was the fact that Into Mischief's sire Harlan's Holiday, who was to die towards the end of 2013, was 2012's champion sire of 2-year-olds. The end result was a 2013 book of 210 mares for Into Mischief, which was in marked contrast to his first four seasons. Having started with a book of 61 in 2009, he covered 44 mares in 2010, 54 in 2011 and 50 in 2012. In other words, Into Mischief covered one more mare in 2013 than he had done in the whole of the previous four years. His new-found popularity has endured, with Into Mischief continuing to rank among America's busiest stallions (218 mares in 2016).

There are some parallels between the careers of Into Mischief and of the one-turn-specialist Practical Joke. Into Mischief ventured beyond seven furlongs only once during his six-race career, when he defeated Colonel John to take the GI CashCall Futurity over 1 1/16 miles.

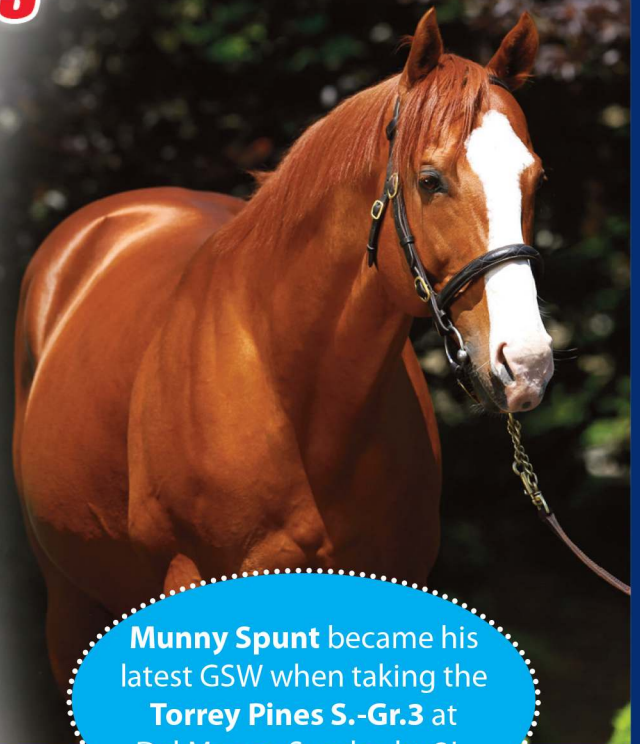

It could be argued that Practical Joke's career is more similar to that of his grandsire Harlan's Holiday. A four-time stakes winner during his six-race juvenile campaign, Harlan's Holiday trained on so well that he won the Florida Derby and Blue Grass S., to move to the top of the Kentucky Derby betting. There were times, including in the Derby, when Harlan's Holiday's stamina didn't seem to stretch to a mile and a quarter, and Practical Joke also ran out of stamina in the final stages when fifth in this year's Derby. Practical Joke may be best at up to a mile, but it is possible to argue that he stays a mile and an eighth--the distance of several of Harlan's Holiday's best wins, including all three of his Grade I successes.

With Practical Joke's future stallion career in mind, it is encouraging that his sire and both of his grandsires, Harlan's Holiday and Distorted Humor, did well enough to multiply their original stud fee. His broodmare sire Distorted Humor is another who was at his most successful over seven furlongs and a mile, even though he stayed a bit further.

Distorted Humor is making his name as a sire of broodmares, with his daughters also being responsible for Arrogate and for the Florida Derby and Donn H. winner Constitution, in addition to the Grade I-winning fillies New Money Honey, Book Review, Molly Morgan and Elate (recent winner of the Alabama S.).

Practical Joke's good looks helped him sell for \$240,000 as a yearling. His second dam Gilded Halo was bred along similar lines to Moment of Hope, a smart sprinter-miler who was good enough to win at Grade II level and to finish second in the GI Vosburgh S. UNIQUE ATMOSPHERE, FULLER FIELDS

BUOY TIMONIUM *by T.D. Thornton*

Buoyed by brisk betting business over the three-day opening weekend of racing at Timonium, officials at the Maryland State Fair and Agricultural Society, Inc., are hoping to parlay the strong start into a similarly solid finish over the final four programs of the meet, which runs this Friday through Labor Day Monday.

Longer-term goals based on a rejuvenated revenue stream at the five-furlong throwback oval include possible upgrades to the facility and the desire to grow the state's Thoroughbred fan base through up-close interactions with the Thoroughbreds that compete there.

"You know, we're the last survivor of a fair circuit that used to be in effect, and we're the last one east of the Mississippi River. So it's kind of a unique thing," said Bill Reightler, the fair's coordinator of racing operations, in a Monday interview. "Our handle for the first three days is up over a million dollars. Our attendance is up almost 10%. We have another four days of the meet left, and we're hoping the numbers will hold up and that we've made some significant gains here."

Timonium can't be classified as a "boutique" upper-crust race meet the way Saratoga Race Course or Keeneland Race Course are. But Maryland's racing industry regulators and participants respect that a healthy niche still exists for mid-level racing at an offbeat, few-frills facility that draws the type of demographic-- namely, thousands upon thousands of potential new fans--that marketing executives at commercial tracks nationwide covet, but can't always attract.

"As Bill and I stand here, we're looking at a Ferris wheel that's right on the far turn of the racetrack at the head of the stretch," said Bill Marlow, chairman of the fair's racing committee. "And we realize that every day we have between 50,000 and 75,000 people that come into the fair and midway area. We don't know of any other racetrack that has that opportunity to have all of those potential new racing fans that close. All they have to do is

walk 150 steps, and they can see a live horse, and live racing. That's where we stand with fitting in and returning something to the industry."

Timonium management attempts to convert newcomers into casual fans by holding "Thoroughbred 101" seminars about handicapping and horse ownership. On the midway side of the property, an exhibit called Horse Land features educational materials and prize giveaways in which the winners must go to the track grandstand to redeem their freebies, which results in a bump up in foot traffic to the racing side of the facility. Timonium staffers also spontaneously pick children out of the crowd to allow them to become honorary paddock judges for each race, allowing them to get close to the horses and holler

"Riders up!" to the jockeys.

"That's one of our selling points to the industry. The Timonium State Fair's role is to help grow new fans," Reightler said. "I have heard three instances in the last month of prominent national horse owners saying, 'When I was a kid, my dad brought me to the races, and I was hooked.' So it all starts from that. Have you ever realized how much we, as adults, revert back to these experiences we've had in our childhoods? That's what our mission is here at Timonium for the horse industry."

Of course, the newbie fans aren't the ones driving the betting, at least not yet. Reightler attributed the opening-weekend boost in handle to a concerted effort to pay purses closer to the daily averages elsewhere in the competitive mid-Atlantic region, thus making for a more compelling betting product. At the fair's request, the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association earlier this summer approved hiking daily average Timonium purses to \$185,000, up from \$160,000 a year ago, an increase of 16%.

"Once we got the purse increase, we worked to do other things," said Reightler. "Increase marketing, [do] a lot of one-on-one work with the trainers to make sure they knew we had our purse increase, and [establish] our first stakes race run here in nine years. In fact, that \$110,000 stakes is the highest [purse] that we've had in the 139-year history of the fair."

That stakes, the \$75,000 Coalition S., had its base purse augmented with \$25,000 in bonuses paid to Maryland bred/sired horses, and an additional \$10,000 bonus would have been paid if the winner was a Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale graduate. The Aug. 26 race drew 43 nominations, a field of nine started (10 starters is the maximum at Timonium), and Maryland-breds ran 1-2-3.

Other incentives to horsemen include a \$20,000 points-based trainer award, a separate \$5,000 trainer bonus for the trainer with most earnings during the meet, and a \$50 groom award in every race for the best turned-out horse.

“We have a [national] problem,” Reightler said. “We’re down another thousand foals [in the projected crop]. We have a horse shortage, yet we’ve really increased our field sizes so far. Now I’m probably speaking a little early, but we’ve all put a lot of work into this, and I’m optimistic it will bear fruit.”

Racing at Timonium dates to 1887, and a robust fairs and summer-through-autumn “leaky roof” circuit once existed from the mid-Atlantic region up into New England. Maryland’s two other racing fairs, Hagerstown and Marlboro, ceased operations in 1970 and 1993, respectively.

A major reason that racing at fairs died off is safety. “Bullring” tracks measuring four or five furlongs in circumference hosting bottom-level Thoroughbreds often resulted in equine and human carnage that simply doesn’t pass muster in today’s more welfare-centric era of the sport.

“The [Timonium] track is very safe,” Reightler said. “First and foremost, this track is only used for two things, the state fair meet and the Fasig-Tipton 2-year-olds-in-training sale in May. The rest of the time, the surface is skinned back and the base is opened. So key to the safety of the track is a very consistent base. The turns are banked at four degrees, and we have a track superintendent that really has a passion for it.”

Despite the precautions, three horses failed to finish in Timonium races over the weekend, including a heels-clipping

incident that resulted in a jockey spill in the very first race of the meet.

As for the future of the fairgrounds, Reightler and Marlow expressed optimism but did not want to discuss specifics. The site has been mentioned in published news reports for years as a possible location for a casino or electronic slots gaming facility.

When the fairgrounds partnered with the Maryland Jockey Club to open an off-track-betting (OTB) location there in early 2016, the project faced vociferous resistance from a group of neighborhood residents who cited fears that the OTB would escalate vehicle traffic and attract unsavory characters.

The controversy has since died down, and Reightler said the Timonium OTB is now “the highest-grossing OTB in the state.”

In terms of the immediate future though, Reightler’s main concern is making sure the opening weekend momentum carries forward through the Labor Day conclusion of Timonium’s annual seven-day meet.

“That’s going to give us the energy to move forward here and talk to our board about putting in some more resources,” Reightler said. “We have some plans with our facility, turning it into more of a park-like atmosphere, and just continuing to grow it.”

Equestricon embraced that fact by hosting multiple panels on the subject, having a world-renowned keynote speaker discuss her experiences with off-the-track Thoroughbreds, and featuring the TAA prominently in the exhibit hall with its Aftercare Hub.



“It has given us momentum,” said Stacie Clark, the TAA’s operations consultant. “We received some donations, and it was also good for us in our current networking situation. I think it made the TAA a more current conversation in the industry at large across the country right now. It became a big thing outside of Kentucky, which is important.”

The convention kicked off with an aftercare keynote address from Soledad O’Brien, who has spent more than 25 years in the media. She became a household name as an anchor on both CNN and NBC, and in 2013, she started her own company, Starfish Media Group. Additionally, she has had a lifelong passion for horses.

As a child O’Brien mucked stalls in return for riding lessons. Now, she owns two off-the-track Thoroughbreds, although she is the first to admit she wasn’t sure a Thoroughbred was the right breed for her.

“I became involved in aftercare because I live near Akindale Thoroughbred Rescue,” said O’Brien. “When I was thinking seriously about getting my own horse some 30 years after I started my lessons, it was suggested I take a look at retired racehorses. I thought that might be the most insane suggestion ever. I am a mediocre to okay-ish mom rider. Who would tell me to go look at a Thoroughbred racehorse?”

Akindale, in Pawling, N.Y., is one of 64 organizations accredited by the TAA. O’Brien worked with the rescue to find the right horse, and now horses, for her and her family.

“I thought I knew Thoroughbreds,” said O’Brien. “Now, I often encourage people to think about Thoroughbred rescue if they are thinking about a horse already.”

After telling her own story, O’Brien moderated a panel entitled “OTTB Success Stories” and then later, Gulfstream Park’s Acacia Courtney moderated the “Aftercare Pathways” panel. Both panels were presented by the TAA, and a number of the participants were affiliated with TAA accredited organizations. The first panel aimed to profile specific equines who demonstrate the value of retraining racehorses once they are ready for a new career, while the second focused on the various ways horses can be put to use or cared for once their racing days are done.

“There’s no question there has been a huge wave on the topic, but there have been a lot of owners and trainers all along who have taken care of their horses with no fanfare required,” said trainer Rick Violette, who is the president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen’s Association and served as one of the panelists. “That wasn’t good enough. A pivotal moment was after Eight Belles in 2008. That fall, there was a congressional hearing, and all the major players were at the hearing. The question Rep. Whitfield asked at the end from everybody was ‘What are you doing for your retired horses?’ It was frankly very

embarrassing because we weren’t doing a unified, good job. However, if we are invited back, there is a great story to tell now. Everybody has rallied and is taking this very, very seriously.”

Across the two panels, other speakers included Anna Ford (New Vocations), Bev Strauss (MidAtlantic Horse Rescue), Diana Pikulski (Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation), Joell Dunlap (Square Peg Foundation), Drs. Yuval Neria and Prudence Fisher (Man O’ War Project), Anita Motion (Herringswell Stables), Lisa Molloy (ReRun Thoroughbred Adoption), Jack Wolf (Starlight Racing, past TAA board president), Michael Blowen (Old Friends), and Nicole Walker (Stronach Group).

Beyond preparing for a life in the show ring or as a trail horse, different groups showed how Thoroughbreds can and are being used for a wide variety of things. These different paths ranged from helping to rehabilitate prisoners to serving as therapy for children with Autism and also included ground-breaking scientific research from Columbia University on how horses can help treat PTSD in veterans.

That research is part of the Man O’ War project, which was founded by racehorse owner Earl Mack and aims to make the first-ever standardized manual for treating veterans through equine therapy.

“This is a wonderful venue, and it is certainly a great achievement of the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance that we are all here,” said Mack during Equestricon. “I think people will be fascinated by some of the work that is going on to save the animals that are near and dear to us.”

In addition to creating a platform for the cause at large, it also built a sense of community among those who are at the forefront of taking care of racehorses after their time at the track is over.

Between the various events, 18 of the TAA’s accredited organizations were represented in person, which facilitated an exchange of ideas, an understanding of the different ways the organizations function, and a platform to discuss the versatility of the Thoroughbred.

The value of being together in one place was so apparent during Equestricon that the TAA is already planning on a future gathering for its accredited organizations.

“Next year, the Hall of Fame is going to let us have an event, a small-networking situation, for our organizations to get together,” said Clark. “I think that is big. Moving forward, Equestricon has opened a lot of doors for us with other entities in the racing industry, and it has broken down some of the barriers of competition between the organizations. We are all in this together.”

SALLY LUNDY PASSES AWAY

Longtime horsewoman, Sarah Ann Lundy, known to her racetrack peers as Sally, passed away after a long battle with cancer. She turned 63 years old the day she died. Sally was the first woman to saddle a GI Belmont S. starter when she sent Minstrel Star out in 1984.

Sally grew up in the Pennsylvania-Delaware region and took to galloping horses and riding steeplechase races in her late teens. She worked for Burley Cox and Bruce Miller in her early riding years. Later on, she took a job with David Whiteley and galloped one of the stable's top runners, Instrument Landing. She traveled out to Southern California with the stable and went to work for Willard Proctor upon Whiteley's return to the East Coast.

Sally became a great part of the Proctor barn as exercise rider galloping some foundation mares such as Belair, who was a multiple graded stakes winner.

Upon completion of her stay with the Proctor barn, she married former trainer Richard J. Lundy and they began training privately for Virginia Kraft Payson at Payson Park and in New York.

Lundy traveled to Japan with Salem Drive, who won the Fiji S. in Tokyo, a prep for the Japan Cup.

During her time with Lundy, she was instrumental in the careers of a long list of stake horses such as Blushing John, Green Barb, Bello Horizonte, Jade Hunter, Carr De Naskra and many others.

After separating from Richard J. Lundy, Sally continued her public stable at Belmont Park. From 690 career starts, Sarah Lundy won 85 races. Among her successes, were back-to-back wins in the Ashley T. Cole H. at Aqueduct in 1990 and 1991 and the 1991 Kingston H. at Belmont. Training in Florida during the

winter months, she won the Sam F. Davis Stakes and the Tampa Bay Derby at Tampa Bay Downs in 1993. She trained numerous stake winners such as Marco Bay, Audio Cassette, Kate's Valentine and Lilac Star.

Due to her early California connections and respected work ethic, Sally's barn became the home away from home for many trainers such as Charlie Whittingham, Bobby Frankel, Rodney Rash and Ben Cecil when they shipped in for stakes in New York and Florida. Sunday Silence was most notable resident of the Lundy stable.

When Lundy retired from training, she took a job as an assistant to Frankel and stayed with him until his passing in 2009. Recently, Sally was working for Carla Gaines as her barn secretary.

Funeral arrangements are pending, while a Celebration of Life is currently being planned for late September or early October in Southern California. She is survived by two brothers, Steve and John Caldwell.

Hieroglyphics took over in the final sixteenth and held on late to upset the Monday featured Better Talk Now S. at Saratoga.

A fifth-out winner May 27 at Gulfstream, the \$450,000 OBS March buy captured a course-and-distance allowance July 29 and was let go as the fourth choice in this stakes debut. Tracking the pace while saving ground from fourth through splits of :23.28 and :47.13, the bay split horses at the three-sixteenths marker and surged past dueling leaders a furlong after that. Small Bear launched a bold bid from last to make it close, but Hieroglyphics found the wire first by a long neck.

Victorious pilot John Velazquez added, "We talked about strategy before the race and we were hoping to just sit off the front. When it unfolded at the break, I was able to do just that and get towards the rail, which was perfect. I got to bide my time there and make sure they saw me behind the other horses. When I tipped him out, he was electric and full of run. It played out perfect. We couldn't plan it any better. It's just the way we wanted things to happen."

The winner is the first foal out of an unraced dam whose subsequent produce is a juvenile colt by Majesticperfection and a yearling To Honor and Serve colt.
