



CARROLL FINDS SUCCESS, STABILITY IN NEW ROLE

His father, his brother and his nephew all turned out to be top riders, but David Carroll just wasn't blessed with the jockey gene. From County Meath in Ireland, he went into the family business and tried to make it as in the saddle. But there was a problem--a lack of talent.

"I was probably one of the worst jockeys in the history of riding," Carroll said. "When you are the son of a very successful rider and the brother of a very successful jockey there are a lot of expectations. With me, the apple fell very far from the tree."

Carroll's failure to succeed as a jockey in his native country led him in 1984 to come to America in search of opportunities in the U.S. racing business. Like most in racing, his career has been marked by peaks and valleys, but he has settled into a new position as an assistant to top trainer Mark Casse and says, "this move turned out to be one of the best things that's ever happened to me."

Had Carroll been a better jockey, he probably never would have left Ireland, but he said he grew disillusioned by the lack of opportunities there. Unsure what direction to take within racing, he enrolled in a course at the Irish National Stud, which sent its students to a similar program run by Taylor Made in Lexington, Kentucky. It was while he was with Taylor Made that he decided America was the place for him. Cont. p2

THE EAGLE DIGS DEEP FOR THIRD L'ORMARINS QUEEN'S PLATE by Liesl King

In front of a large blue-and-white attired crowd, **Legal Eagle (SAf)** (Greys Inn) produced probably the best and most heart stopping victory of his career to win the R1.5-million G1 WFA L'Ormarins Queen's Plate S. over 1600m at Kenilworth on Saturday. It was Legal Eagle's third straight victory in the race, and while their hearts may have been in their mouths, the crowd cheered their favourite home.

The early part of the race was uneventful as Legal Eagle with Anton Marcus in the saddle, slotted in on the rail from barrier two. From barrier nine, Corne Orffer was forced to bring **Captain America (SAf)** (Captain Al {SAf}) out wide, making his way around the field, before slipping in on the rail in front of Legal Eagle. Knowing Captain America is not blessed with a sprint finish, Orffer wasted no time idling in front and sent the strapping bay for home. With a quickly lengthening gap aided by an unusual tailwind, Anton Marcus had no choice but to give chase and Legal Eagle was forced to dig deep as he chased down his old nemesis.

Racing for the first time in the yellow and purple silks of Braam van Huyssteen, William Henderson and Hedley McGrath, Legal Eagle was closing the gap, but due to the fast pace, it was not as instantaneous as one would wish. Sail South (SAf) (Sail From Seattle) (Greg Cheyne) and Copper Force (SAf) (Royal Air Force (SAf)) (Lyle Hewitson) had also taken off and it looked as it Marcus had left his gutsy mount too much to do as the line loomed. Legal Eagle is certainly not the biggest, but with ears flat on his head and fire in his eyes, he literally threw himself at the line in a blur of horses. Marinaresco (SAf) (Silvano {Ger}), running over a distance far too short for him, finished a gallant fifth with less than a length covering the first five. It was the first Grade 1 victory for owner Braam van Huyssteen, who has owned and raced over 400 horses for nearly a decade.

"That was a great experience," he said. "I got to go racing and see American racing at its best at Keeneland and Saratoga. Racing was always in my blood and I really liked what I saw."

He still could have gone home and tried to reinvent himself in Ireland, perhaps as a steeplechase jockey. His father, Frankie, was a top jump rider whose big-race wins included the Thyestes Chase on Blue Moth in 1960 and on Hunter's Breeze in 1961 and the 1966 Galway Hurdle on Warkey. Or he could have given riding on the flat another chance, hoping that maybe things would click and he'd enjoy some of the success his brother Raymond had. Raymond's biggest victory was in the 1980 G1 Irish St Leger on the Vincent O'Brien-trained Gonzales. Raymond's son, Gary, was a champion apprentice rider in Ireland in both 2009 and 2010.

But Carroll was sold on America and took a job with trainer Shug McGaughey as an exercise rider. He was the regular trackword rider for 1989 GI Belmont S. winner Easy Goer, who also finished second to Sunday Silence in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S.

"Once I finished my course with Taylor Made and got the opportunity to work for Shug, all I really wanted to do was train," he said. "I got be around horses like Personal Ensign, Seeking the Gold, Easy Goer. The only thing in my mind was to be a trainer."

Carroll left McGaughey and went out on his own in 1992. He never had a particularly big stable but established a reputation as an excellent horseman and one who knew how to manage a good horse. He won 17 graded stakes races, including the 2010 GI Spinster with Acoma (Empire Maker). But as time went on, he saw the numbers in his barn start to dwindle and no longer was he getting the type of quality horses he wanted to train.

"Having to give something up I did for so long was one of the hardest things I've ever had to do," he said. "It was very stressful financially. My son just graduated from the University of Kentucky and my daughter is a senior in high school. The expenses just kept adding up and the caliber of the horses I was getting was going the other way. I couldn't really understand why. The harder I worked the fewer horses I got. The bigger stables kept getting bigger. And it just got to be a point where financially it was too stressful for me and my wife. I didn't want to wake up one morning knowing I had a handful of maiden claimers with everybody telling me how good a horsemen I was, but those same people not giving me any horses."

In March, 2016 he left to work for Casse. It was a lot better than just your average assistant trainer's job. Casse runs and wins all over North America and has one of the top stables in the country.

"For me, it's not just the job itself," Carroll said. "Mark is the most unbelievable person you could ever be around. I have so much respect for him as a person. He is a great horse trainer, but I have even more respect for him as a person, as a human being. That makes my job so much better because you are working for the type of person where every day you wake up and say how can I do a better job than I did yesterday? That's a great way to go about your job, to go about life." Cont. p3

Carroll is in charge of the day-to-day training of Casse's division that rotates between the Fair Grounds in New Orleans and the Kentucky racetracks.

From the time he came to the U.S., he has never looked back or regretted the move. But when asked if he would advise young horsemen in Ireland to do today what he did over 30 years ago, he said he would hesitate to tell them to make the move. When Carroll came to the U.S. most top trainers typically had no more than 30 or 40 horses in their barns. That was before the advent of the super trainers, people like Chad Brown, Todd Pletcher and Bob Baffert. They may have over 200 horses under their care and they win with a high percentage of their starters. Owners flock to them.

Carroll believes that's the primary reason his training business suffered, that mid-level trainers in the U.S. have a very difficult time attracting owners because they all want to go with the superstars of the sport.

"There is an opportunity for Europeans to become trainers in America, but not to the extent that there was when I came here," he said. "Now, if you start off with 10 horses some people can actually make it. But you see a lot of trainers starting off and they're out of business before you know it. Financially, it can be such a stress. Bigger owners are going to the bigger trainers and very few people want to give young trainers an opportunity.

"It's harder than ever and this can be a brutal business. But having said that, I love this game with all my heart and I love the thrill of winning. I always will."

CHRISTY ROCHE RETIRES FROM TRAINING

Cheltenham Festival-winning trainer and Classic-winning jockey Christy Roche has called time on his career in racing at the age of 67.

The Tipperary native enjoyed a near 30-year career in the saddle and was crowned champion jockey in his homeland on seven occasions.

Roche hung up his riding boots in 1998, having taken over a licence to train a couple of years earlier, and has enjoyed numerous big-race victories with the likes of Grimes, Joe Mac, Youlneverwalkalone and Like-A-Butterfly, all of whom carried the colours of his main patron JP McManus. Cont. p4

Roche has handed the licence over to his son, Padraig, who told The Irish Field: "Dad is taking a step back but everything else stays the same.

"The owners have been good enough to leave the horses with me and there's room for a few more.

"I might have the first runners in my own name next weekend."

As a jockey Roche won the Irish Derby three times, the Irish 2.000 Guineas on four occasions and was a three-time winner of the Irish 1,0000 Guineas.

His Classic triumphs were not just confined to home soil either as he also partnered the David O'Brien-trained Secreto to a memorable short-head success over El Gran Senor in the 1984 G1 Epsom Derby and won the 1991 G1 Epsom Oaks aboard Jim Bolger's 50-1 outsider Jet Ski Lady. He also landed the G1 French Derby in 1982 on David O'Brien's Assert.

Grimes was the stable flag bearer in the early part of Roche's training career, winning nine races including the 2001 Galway Plate.

Roche enjoyed his first Cheltenham Festival success when saddling Khayrawani to land the 1999 Coral Cup and he went on to add to his tally at Prestbury Park with Youlneverwalkalone in the 2003 William Hill Handicap Chase and Like-A-Butterfly, who won the 2002 Supreme Novices' Hurdle.

Like-A-Butterfly won 12 of her 17 races overall, with her notable victories also including a thrilling success over Limestone Lad in the 2003 Irish Champion Hurdle at Leopardstown.

SUNLIGHT FIRMS FOR MM 2YO CLASSIC

The Tony McEvoy-trained **Sunlight (Aus)** (Zoustar {Aus}) is now the \$4.50 (7-2) joint-second favourite for next Saturday's A\$2-million Magic Millions 2YO Classic following a barnstorming 4 1/2-length victory in an 1100-metre handicap Saturday. It was her second straight overwhelming victory at the Gold Coast.

An A\$300,000 graduate of last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast sale, Sunlight debuted with a solid third in the Marybyrnong Trial S. (LR) up the Flemington straight Oct. 7 and was crushed into \$1.50 (1-2) for this on the heels of an all-theway success in a 900m test at the Gold Coast Dec. 23. Cont. p6

McEvoy promised after that effort that Sunlight would need one more run ahead of the 2YO Classic, and the bay made light work of the field, leading soon after the start and widening away in the final furlong and a half (video). Sunlight covered the distance in 1:02.48 over a 'good 4' track in the same race used by Houtzen (Aus) (I Am Invincible {Aus}) en route to victory in the 2YO Classic 12 months ago.

"It was an easy watch and she's a high-class filly," McEvoy said. "That will bring her on now for next week."

McEvoy explained the rationale for the reasoably quick backup.

"It's a hard race to win for southerners, that's why I gave her two starts at the Gold Coast," he said. "By race time I wanted her to think she was a local."

Sunlight shares second favouritism with **Ef Troop (Aus)** (Spirit of Boom {Aus}), with the undefeated **Jonker (Aus)** (Spirit of Boom {Aus}) remaining the \$4 (3-1) choice.

ABLE FRIEND HALF-BRO LANDS BELATED

Able Engine (Aus) (Dalakhani {Ire}), a half-brother to former Hong Kong Horse of the Year Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal), made the most of his belated introduction to the races with a narrow success Saturday afternoon at Ipswich.

Sent off the 5-2 second choice, Able Engine jumped on terms and was with the leaders through the opening exchanges before easing back into a stalking third. The 3-year-old gelding lost a bit of ground at the five-furlong marker, but was back into the bridle and on the attack down the side at the 800m.

Pulled out to deliver his challenge in earnest entering the final 300 metres, Able Engine had his head cocked noticeably to the left and hit the front with a sixteenth of a mile to go, then managed to find the wire first despite racing greenly late (video).

Whereas Able Friend was bred in Queensland, Able Engine was bred in New South Wales by C. Lawlor, who acquired the siblings' dam Ponte Piccolo (NZ) (Volksraad {GB}) in foal to Manhattan Rain (Aus) for A\$35,000 at the Inglis Easter Broodmare Sale in 2013. Able Engine was consigned to the 2016 Inglis Easter Yearling Sale by Fairview Park Stud and was hammered down to Magus Equine on behalf of Hong Kong owner C H Ngai for A\$200,000.

Anton Marcus, who was recording his seventh Queen's Plate, was full of praise for his long time partner.

"I've got a lot of respect for Captain America. It's a fine line--you can't reach him too early, but if you let him slip you're not going to get to him at all," he said. "He's such a courageous and gutsy horse so I did had my reservations. But I was sitting on a very, very special horse."

Trainer Sean Tarry was justifiably emotional after the roller coaster with the Markus Jooste debacle and thanked the new owners for allowing him to keep his stable star.

"I am just so thankful that they allowed me to keep him. I had a lot of confidence in him today. I felt the least pressure that I've ever felt with this horse because everything just went so smoothly." Cont. p7

OH SUSANNA STUNS ALL IN CARTIER PADDOCK STAKES by Liesl King

Oh Susanna (Aus) quietly slipped into the lineup for the R1-million G1 WFA Cartier Paddock S., a Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' race over 1800m Saturday at Kenilworth. Her presence was barely noticed or even commented on--when one sees a maiden winner lining up in a Grade 1 race packed with star performers, you can be forgiven for not taking much notice.

Though she was exiting a good second in the G1 Cape Fillies' Guineas Dec. 2, Oh Susanna was at best an unlikely entrant for the Paddock S., believing that trainer Justin Snaith was either being very optimistic, or just giving the youngster another run.

Goodtime Gal (SAf) (Royal Air Force {SAf}) led from the jump, setting fast early fractions with Nother Russia (SAf) (Tiger Ridge) a couple of lengths behind. Entering the home straight the field caught up with the long-time leader and it seemed as if a cavalry charge for the line was inevitable. Then the blue-and-white colours of Drakenstein Stud broke ranks, as Oh Susanna under a driving ride by Grant van Niekerk, popped out of the melee. The chasing pack, with most carrying a hefty 60kgs, could only watch as Oh Susanna, with a mere 54kgs on her back, achieved lift off, courtesy of the strong tailwind.

Van Niekerk is not known for his quiet demeanour and he was a long way from home when the celebrations started. With 50m to go it was time to turn and smile for the cameras, before performing a standing-in-the-stirrups-while-waving-my-whip salute. Van Niekerk knows only too well that the stewards do not take kindly to any celebrations before the line, but such was the occasion that he simply and quite rightly did not care. He was winning a Grade 1 and winning comfortably on a filly bred and owned by the Festival sponsor.

"She's a lovely filly, a filly who's very close to my heart because I ride her all the time at work. She gives me a tough time but we work well together - we're both a bit 'dilly'", commented Van Niekerk. "I said earlier in the day that if I win this one for Mrs Rupert, my day is made," he added.

Behind the unlikely victory lies a tale of a well-travelled mare and her offspring that spans continents, from America to South Africa with a slight detour via Australia. Sharp Susan, who raced for her breeder WinStar Farm, IEAH Stables and Pegasus Holdings Group Stables in the States, was purchased in foal to Street Cry for A\$1.05 million by Mrs Rupert at the Inglis Easter Broodmare Sale in 2012. Sadly the mare lost her foal and Mrs Rupert was very kindly offered a replacement service to Street Cry. And the result of that service? Oh Susanna, of course.

The dam of the 2-year-old colt Signore Fox (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), Sharp Susan produced a Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly in 2016. Oh Susanna is the 20th Group 1/Grade I winner and 115th black-type winner for the late Street Cry. Cont. p8

MCKINZIE DOMINANT IN THE SHAM

'TDN Rising Star' McKinzie (Street Sense), a controversial winner via disqualification in the GI Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity Dec. 9, had his mind on business against five overmatched rivals in Saturday's GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita.

Taking blinkers off this time, the 1-5 favorite kept the early leaders within his scope on the outside from fourth through opening fractions of :23.69 and :47.73. The Watson/Pegram/ Weitman colorbearer, named for the late, long-time Los Alamitos executive Brad McKinzie, hit the gas with a three-wide sweep on the far turn and leveled off nicely down the lane under minimal urging to score by 3 1/2 lengths. Pacesetter All Out Blitz (Concord Point) was second; My Boy Jack (Creative Cause) was third.

"He came back to run like we hoped," Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert said. "I was happy. Everything went smooth; that's what you want. I don't have to work him that much before the next one. I don't know [which race it will be]. It could be the [GII] San Felipe [Mar. 10]. We'll try and get two [races] into him. I think he showed more maturity today."

A jaw-dropping debut winner going seven furlongs in Arcadia Oct. 28, he crossed the wire 3/4 of a length behind stablemate Solomini (Curlin) in the Los Al Futurity. Hall of Famer Mike Smith has been aboard in all three of his career starts.

The way he ran, it looks like he'll have no problem with two turns, either. Very professional. Second start, he handled himself perfect in the paddock and has a wonderful mind on him. Exciting horse."

The 7-5 favorite went straight to the front beneath Javier Castellano and led comfortably through easy early fractions of :24.43 and :48.13. The \$685,000 KEESEP buy began to let it out a notch on the far turn and was never seriously asked for run in the stretch, winning by a geared-down 6 1/4 lengths.

Smith added, "He was a bit too aggressive last time. Today, he seemed to relax early, then he jumped when I asked, so taking the blinkers off today, I thought we might as well try it and I think it was a great move. He's getting better as he matures."

Mask was a three-length maiden winner in his previous trip to the post going 6 1/2 furlongs at Belmont Park Oct. 20. The runner-up that day Navistar (Union Rags), a \$900,000 OBSMAR graduate, resurfaced to earn his diploma in Hallandale Dec. 16.

"Both starts weren't a surprise, but we were impressed again," Brown said. "I was surprised [to see him on the lead], but not disappointed. I was hoping he'd break well, and when I saw that first fraction, I knew he'd be pretty tough to beat at that point because he's been training with really good horses in the morning and he's been galloping out particularly strong in his works. The only thing left to see midway through the race was, was the layoff going to hit him the last eighth or not and it didn't. He just widened."

Brown also trains GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero and Eclipse Award finalist Good Magic (Curlin). What's next for Mask?

"No plans yet," Brown replied. "I really wanted to just see what happened today, what he got out of this race, how he handled the mile and everything. So far, I couldn't be more pleased with

everything. We'll see how he comes out of the race and go from there. I do want to try the horse two turns in his next start and find out where we stand as far as putting him on the Derby trail, but right now, he looks like he's firmly on that path."



On paper, Sunday's GII Santa Ynez S. goes through Gary Barber and John Oxley's Win the War (War Front), who brings a perfect two-for-two record into the seven-furlong test. But it isn't as if there aren't questions to be answered as she tries a

conventional dirt surface for the first time and faces several promising locally based gallopers.

A \$700,000 acquisition by the high-powered duo at the 2016 Fasig-**Tipton Saratoga** sale, Win the War endured a wide trip

and overcame her inexperience to narrowly land her six-furlong debut over the Woodbine turf Oct. 20. Taking the next logical step in the Nov. 19 Glorious Song S. on the synthetic, she was the only other horse in the market at 9-2 behind 'TDN Rising Star' and 1-5 chalk Grace and Dignity (Animal Kingdom) and took advantage of a wicked early pace involving the favorite to romp in by 11 1/2 lengths. The surface switch is an obvious concern, but her half-sister Dixie City (Dixie Union) won the GII Demoiselle S. on the main and another stakes-placed half-sister Union City (Dixie Union) produced MGSW & G1SP 'TDN Rising Star' Unified (Candy Ride {Arg}).

Midnight Bisou (Midnight Lute) remains a maiden after two starts, but has earned this crack at graded stakes level. The dark bay belied debut odds of 21-1 to just miss behind future GISW Dream Tree (Uncle Mo) while pulling some seven lengths clear of Allianna (Flat Out) going six furlongs over this track Oct. 27. She ran a similar race behind that Bob Baffert trainee when last seen in the Nov. 18 Desi Arnaz S. at Del Mar, missing by a nose, and picks up the services of Mike Smith Sunday.

Just a Smidge (Into Mischief) earned the 'TDN Rising Star' distinction for a smooth debut success July 19 at Del Mar, but things haven't gone to script since. A deceptively good third behind front-running Artistic Diva (Munnings) and Steph Being

A bit overlooked at 10-1, the gelding hopped at the start and saved ground near the back of the large field through opening fractions of :23.80 and :49.23.

Swung out five wide in search of running room turning for home, the bay unleashed a furious late turn of foot down the center of the lane, inhaling the field in a matter of strides to win by a half-length. Mufasa (Malibu Moon) and Funny Duck (Distorted Humor) dead-heated for second.

There was also a significant increase from in-state handle, from \$408.6 million to \$442.1 million. Wagering on racing at Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course has been up year-over-year since 2015 and is up \$216 million since 2014.






