MASAR OUT; ECLIPSE OPENS UP

The mercurial 2018 season heads to Sandown on Saturday, with the G1 Coral-Eclipse sadly without 'TDN Rising Star' and G1 Epsom Derby hero Masar (Ire) (New Approach (Ire)) after he was scratched on Friday evening. In his absence, the race will fail to produce a totally satisfactory answer to the question as to who is the division leader and could yet add a further twist in a seemingly endless labyrinth of surprises this term. After the G1 2000 Guineas-winning performance of 'TDN Rising Star' Saxon Warrior (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}), the campaign already looked cut-and-dried but defeats in the G1 English and Irish Derbys mean that Ballydoyle's beau ideal now is almost cast in the role of underdog. His and Masar's old adversary Roaring Lion (Kitten's Joy), who was fifth in the Guineas and third in Epsom's blue riband, is now the likely favourite. Qatar Racing's grey is looking for a first win at this level. "I think the Guineas is the best form, so to that extent we've got it all to do but we know a mile and a quarter on top of the ground suits us," trainer John Gosden said.

Midweek, Saxon Warrior could be considered a surprise contender for this just a week after a display in the Irish Derby which was in contrast to his dynamic one over a mile at Newmarket.

SECOND RISING STAR FOR KINGMAN

Juddmonte's Horse of the Year and first-season sire Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) notched his third winner–and second 'TDN Rising Star'–when **King Of Comedy (Ire)** earned the badge at first asking at Sandown on Friday for Lady Bamford and trainer John Gosden. Gosden trained Kingman and also the stallion's first winner and 'TDN Rising Star', the subsequent G2 Coventry S. winner Calyx (GB).

King of Comedy dwelt slightly at the break, but recovered to track the leaders in fourth after the initial exchanges. Green when asked to go about business with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining, the 2-1 favourite quickened smartly for one flick of Adam Kirby's persuader to lead approaching the final eighth and lengthened in good style up the hill to easily account for Persian Moon (Ire) (Makfi {GB}) by 2 1/2 lengths. "We were hoping for a good run beforehand and are thrilled with that performance," said assistant trainer Thaddeus Gosden. "Like his sire, this fellow is pretty chilled at home, he'd hopefully stay a mile and might step up in trip next time."

Masar Out; Eclipse Opens Up

With Masar knocking himself on Friday, that decision now looks inspired and perhaps the "monster" talked about in the spring is only just coming to himself. Many of Aidan O'Brien's have seemed to be going the right way in the last few days and he must have bounced out of his Curragh effort to even be in this line-up. His trainer is keeping a close eye on his progress towards the race. "Obviously he hasn't done anything since [the Irish Derby] and we'll watch him closely all the way up to the race, but he seems to have taken it well," he explained. "We won't really know until we run him, but he seems very well."

The last big name to come here so soon after the Irish Derby was Sir Ivor in 1968 and he was only third, but the Saxon Warrior we saw on Guineas day looked one who could specialise in the sphere outside of the norm.

According to Charlie Appleby, Masar returned sore after his routine work at Moulton Paddocks on Friday. "Mid-way through the morning, it became clear that he was sore," he explained. "His off-fore was inflamed and we feel he must have knocked himself at exercise. I have discussed it with His Highness Sheikh Mohammed, who agreed that he should miss the race. It is a blow. But it is the right decision considering what has happened. Masar will remain under veterinary supervision for the time being. Hawkbill will still run for Godolphin in the Eclipse, and Will Buick will switch to him."

No filly has won this since Kooyonga (Ire) (Persian Bold {Ire}), but it is rare for a 3-year-old to try and **Happily (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) has already shown she is capable of holding her own against the colts when beating the subsequent G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Olmedo (Fr) (Declaration of War) and Masar in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere staged on soft ground at Chantilly on Arc day.



Her runs this term when third in the G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas and fourth in the G1 Prix de Diane back at Chantilly June 17 suggest she is progressing back to that standard and she is a relative of the millennium Eclipse hero Giant's Causeway. "Happily is in good form. She had a very good run the last day and we're looking forward to seeing her run," O'Brien said.

If the antiquated weight-for-age system is correct, then Hawkbill (Kitten's Joy), Cliffs of Moher (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Forest Ranger (Ire) (Lawman (Fr)) have a small chance of winning. If it is incorrect, their prospects are less than slim as it is difficult to imagine any of that trio giving 10 pounds to the best 3-year-old colts around and 13 pounds to one of the leading fillies of that age. One of racing's biggest issues is how it still relies largely on something devised by Admiral Rous in 1866 when deciding how the older horses should compare with the Classic generation. Cliffs of Moher was favourite last year, while Hawkbill was successful in 2016, but this edition has a deeper feel than either of the previous two whose form is held down by the proximity of the longshots Countermeasure (GB) (American Post (GB)) and Desert Encounter (Ire) (Halling). The idea that a colt of the physical substance of Saxon Warrior should be handed almost a stone in weight from a stablemate that has been found out in group 1 company on seven occasions after his Epsom Derby second is ridiculous.

While he was unlucky when fourth here 12 months ago, Cliffs of Moher is looking thoroughly exposed by now and Aidan O'Brien is one of few who still believe that he can produce something in this company. After two runs at Royal Ascot which yielded a non-threatening fourth in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and third in the G2 Hardwicke S., it takes a leap of faith to see him playing a major role here. "Cliffs of Moher ran well in Ascot last time and we still think we haven't seen the best of him yet," the Ballydoyle handler said. "He's been in good form since then."

Forest Ranger beat Deauville (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in Newmarket's nine-furlong G3 Earl of Sefton S. Apr. 18 before upstaging another of Ballydoyle's B-list celebrities in War Decree (War Front) in the newly-promoted G2 Huxley S. at Chester May 11. His size is one of his prime assets and the gelded 4-year-old is one of the race's unknown quantities, but trainer Richard Fahey is under no illusions as to the task he faces here. "He should be a 20-1 shot and that probably reflects his chance, but he goes on any ground and we hope he is an each-way player," he commented. "Forest Ranger is in excellent form. He needs to step up on what he has achieved during his career so far, but he has won well on both of his starts this year. It's a big ask, but whatever happens on Saturday, we'll be finding out a bit more about him."

Elsewhere on Saturday, Haydock's G2 bet365 Lancashire Oaks features a quartet of promising 4-year-old fillies from major yards headed by Cliveden Stud's **Horseplay (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}). She was runner-up to the subsequent G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud runner-up Coronet (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G2 Middleton S. over an extended 10 furlongs at York May 17 and trainer Andrew Balding is hoping this extra distance will bring out her best. **Cont. p4**

"The York form looks strong and it was a deliberate move to wait for this race," he said. "The step back up to a mile and a half certainly shouldn't be a problem and she looked to the handle the quicker ground well at York. She seems in great form and her work has been good, so hopefully she'll be very competitive." Quick ground casts a doubt over St Albans Bloodstock's **God Given (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}), who faces a second outing on such a lively surface after her course-and-distance win in the G3 Pinnacle S. four weeks ago. "She's in good form, I just hope the ground isn't too firm," Luca Cumani said. "She did win on good-to-firm last time, but it looks a tougher race on Saturday. Everything has gone very smoothly since her last run."

SWIPE TO TAKE SWEDEN TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Ever wondered what happened to Swipe? Despite only winning once, Swipe became the second highest-rated 2-year-old in the U.S. in 2015. The son of Birdstone emerged as one to follow after a black-type victory and two placings in his early 2-year-old campaign. He then ran into another talented juvenile called Nyquist (Uncle Mo).

In his next four starts, of which three were Grade Is, Swipe found himself the runner-up behind Nyquist. That included the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Keeneland, where Swipe was less than half a length behind the future Kentucky Derby winner.

It was a frustrating time for Swipe's trainer Keith Desormeaux and the owner partnership headed by Big Chief Racing, but very lucky for the Swedish couple Ivan and Berit Sjoberg. Had the winning post at Keeneland been a little further away, Swipe would not be residing at a stud farm in Sweden right now.

"We don't have the resources to buy a Group or Grade I winner. Instead, we must be clever and try to find a horse that has been racing just below top level," says Ivan Sjoberg, who together with his wife purchased Swipe as a stallion prospect after his short racing career.

Swipe landed in Sweden at the end of 2016, and covered around 30 mares in his first year, a rather large book in a country which only produces around 200 Thoroughbred foals per year.

Sjoberg said he is hoping that the American recruit will help bring the domestic Thoroughbred breeding industry one step forward, and what he has seen so far is very encouraging.

"We could not be happier with his first foals. Swipe himself is a big, strong horse, a typical American dirt horse, and you can see much of this in his first foals. They are absolutely correct, muscular, and with a good attitude. Many of them are real copies of their father."

"Swipe mainly covered mares with American pedigrees, so we have produced some all-American foals here in Sweden. One of our best mares, Day To Shine (Aldebaran), from an old Darby Dan family and sister to Grade I-winner Time And Motion (Tapit), got a fantastic filly. And Swipe covered mares by Monarchos, Orientate, Stormin Fever, Speightstown, and Fusaichi Pegasus."

The Sjobergs' farm Ravdansens Stuteri has been crowned champion breeder in Sweden on numerous occasions, including five times in the last six years.

With more than 20 mares of their own and another 10 boarding mares, the couple run one of the biggest Thoroughbred breeding operations in the region. And with four stallions on the roster, they have also become the busiest Thoroughbred stallion stud in Scandinavia.

"I suppose we are quite Americanized," Sjoberg said. "We have spent a lot of time in Kentucky, and I'm fascinated by the American bloodlines. Since Swedish racing reminds much more of American than British racing, with the bulk of races on the dirt, it makes sense to look at American bloodlines."

However, their two oldest residents would be better known among Japanese racing fans.

The Sjobergs stand the Japanese pair Eishin Dunkirk (Jpn) and Philomatheia (Jpn), both 21 now, and also have some young Japanese blood on their roster with Barocci, a son of the worldwide sensation Deep Impact.

"There are plenty of well-bred, non-raced stallion prospects on the market, but unfortunately, that has never been an option for us," said Sjoberg. "But one day, Naoya Yoshida [of Winchester Farm in Kentucky] rang me and said that there would be a horse called Barocci offered at the 2014 Keeneland November sale. Barocci met all our requirements: he had a top-class pedigree and had competed against the best horses of his generation, but failed to win the big races."

"Barocci ran in the best races for 3-year-olds in France. He ran very well in the French 2000 Guineas, finishing sixth despite a very wide draw and getting hampered in running. If he would have been placed we would never have been able to afford him, so we're quite happy about that," said Sjoberg.

His first crop, born in 2016, consists of almost 20 foals. The 2-year-old season has just kicked off in Scandinavia, and Barocci's first barrier trial runner impressed in Stockholm on Saturday.

"The 2-year-olds look fantastic," said Sjoberg. "He marks them a lot; he is almost black himself, just like Sunday Silence, and most of them look just the same."

Taking Swedish Breeding To The Next Level...

The four stallions are enjoying the Swedish summer in their paddocks at Ravdansen. With more than 250 acres of pasture, the Sjobergs make sure that both their stallions and broodmares thrive, and that the youngsters get a head start in life.

"We have a lot of pasture compared to the number of horses," Sjoberg said. "We have large paddocks and try keep the horses out as much as possible."

"Swedish breeders are just as knowledgeable as breeders in other countries. And there is nothing wrong with the climate. It gets as cold in Kentucky as it gets here. We just don't have the bloodlines. We need better mares and better stallions. But we can't afford to purchase the top-class mares for \$500,000, or \$50,000 for that matter. Raising the level is a very slow process, but we are working on it."

Keen to always improve the quality of their stock, the couple is often seen at the bloodstock sales in Britain and Ireland, and occasionally the U.S., trying to source good-value mares from established pedigrees to bring back to their farm.

"At Goffs last year, we bought a Tapit mare in foal to Helmet from Godolphin, and a Dubawi mare in foal to Harzand, and got two beautiful foals this spring. Royal Crystal, the Tapit mare, is now in foal to Swipe, and La Reine de Pearls, by Dubawi, is in foal to Barocci."

With a Breeders' Cup runner-up and sons of Deep Impact, Mr. Prospector and Danzig on the stallion roster, the Sjobergs seem to be well on their way to the next level of Thoroughbred breeding in Sweden.

LONGINES HKIR DAY PRIZE MONEY INCREASED

The 2018 Longines Hong Kong International Races will feature total prize money of HK\$93 million (£8.9 million/ \in 10.1 million/A\$16 million/US\$11.8 million), a 10% rise over 2017 and the anchor of substantial across-the-board increases in purses for the 2018/2019 season.

The richest of the four International races is the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup, which will see its purse rise to HK\$28 million, a 12% hike from last year and helping to maintain its status as one of the world's two richest races over the metric mile and a quarter. The G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile and G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint remain the most lucrative Group 1 events at their respective distances and will offer respective prize money of HK\$25 million (up by HK\$2 million) and HK\$20 million, an increase of 8.1% from last year. The G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase has seen its purse rise by 11% to HK\$20 million.

"The Longines Hong Kong International Races rank as one of the world's greatest racing carnivals," said Andrew Harding, Executive Director, Racing, at the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "The December flagship is also one of Hong Kong's most elite and globally recognised major events. It is important that the prize money for these races is at the level consistent with their status at the pinnacle of the sport and their significance to Hong Kong's international status as a major events host."

There will be no changes to purses for Champions Day in the spring. The G1 QE II Cup will continue to offer HK\$24 million, the G1 Champions Mile HK\$18 million and the G1 Chairman's Sprint Prize HK\$16 million.

Over the course of 88 meetings during the 2018/2019 season, a total of HK\$1.22 billion will be offered, representing a 5% increase over the previous season. The increase applies to races at all levels in Hong Kong, notably an 8% bump for Group 3 races to HK\$3.25 million and a 6% kick for Group 2 races to HK\$4.25 million.

"It is very important to the Club that we support owners, who have consistently taken up the challenge of providing Hong Kong with the high-quality racehorses that are the backbone of our world-class racing," Harding said of the broader purse hikes. "Maintaining high prize money recongises owners' continuous efforts to purchase some of the best horses in the world, and that is vital for the ongoing strength of Hong Kong racing within a competitive global market."

ANALYZE IT & CATHOLIC BOY REMATCH IN BELMONT DERBY

'TDN Rising Star' Analyze It (Point of Entry) looks to return to winning ways in Saturday's \$1.2-million Belmont Derby after losing his perfect record by a neck to Catholic Boy (More Than Ready) last time in Belmont's GIII Pennine Ridge S. June 2. A dazzling debut winner in Elmont in October, Analyze It followed suit with decisive victories in the GIII Cecil B. DeMille S. at Del Mar Nov. 26 and the GIII Translyvania S. at Keeneland Apr. 6. Stalking the aggressively ridden Catholic Boy throughout the early stages of the Pennine Ridge, the bay overtook his rival in the stretch and attempted to shake loose, but Catholic Boy determinedly re-rallied to post a narrow upset.

"I thought he ran into a really good horse in Catholic Boy in the Pennine Ridge," Chad Brown told the NYRA notes team. "He ran very well. Our horse had no excuse. He might've had a little time between races where I could've had him a little better. It's not an excuse, he had every chance to win, but I believe this horse can move forward now that he has some recent fitness in him."

Winner of the grassy GIII With Anticipation S. last term, Catholic Boy spent the first half of his sophomore season on the dirt after closing out 2017 with a dominant score in the GII Remsen S. on the Aqueduct main track in December. Runner-up in the GIII Sam F. Davis S., the Jonathan Thomas pupil finished a lackluster fourth in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 31, after which he was successfully switched back to the turf in the Pennine Ridge. *Cont. p3*

LOADED FIELD SET FOR BELMONT OAKS

A group of 10 talented sophomore fillies are scheduled to line up Saturday for a salty renewal of the \$1-million GI Belmont Oaks. La Signare (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}), Significant Form (Creative Cause) and 'TDN Rising Star' Mighty Scarlett (Scat Daddy) finished one-two-three in the GIII Wonder Again S. June 7, which is considered the local prep for this event. Breaking her maiden in France, La Signare was privately purchased and transferred to Brian Lynch, finishing second to the reopposing Toinette (Scat Daddy) in her debut for that barn at Keeneland Apr. 11 prior to her front-running upset score in the Wonder Again.

"We'll see what the pace scenario is," Lynch said. "If there's no pace, I don't think we'll try and get too creative. We'll let her do her thing again. I don't know if they'll let her get away with pedestrian fractions like she got away with in the first half [in the Wonder Again]. But if there's a bit more pace, I wouldn't be surprised if she can sit off of them a little bit anyway." *Cont. px*

"We were really proud of his effort," said Thomas. "Javier [Castellano] was able to execute a plan we had put together in the paddock at the last minute, and we were thrilled with the result. Analyze It is a nice horse. Obviously, it was an oddly run race, and the verdict is still out on where [Catholic Boy] will be positioned [in the Belmont Derby]. He's a mentally relaxed horse and everything we see from him in the mornings and afternoons makes me think he'll appreciate the distance."

Hawkish (Artie Schiller) was tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' after making an eye-catching late run to graduate in his career bow at Gulfstream Jan. 6. Fourth next out to the re-opposing Maraud (Blame) in the GIII Palm Beach S. Mar. 3, the gelding returned to winning ways in an Apr. 15 Aqueduct optional claimer and charged home a three-length victor in last time in the June 2 GII Penn Mile, which has produced three Grade I winners in its six years in existence, including Belmont Derby hero Force the Pass (Speightstown) and GI Belmont Oaks heroine Catch a Glimpse (City Zip).

"We know he's a top miler and that's the unknown factor here, if he can get the mile and a quarter, but we'll find out," trainer Jimmy Toner said. "He gallops a mile and a half every day. I think the key is being rateable. If he isn't too aggressive early and settles in, I think you're okay. So far, he's shown that he's okay with everything."

International superstar Aidan O'Brien saddles a strong contender in **Hunting Horn (Ire)** (Camelot {GB}). Third in both the G3 Classic Trial Apr. 27 and the G3 Chester Vase May 9, the Coolmore colorbearer checked in sixth in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club June 3 and returned to winning ways with a 4 1/2-length stalk-and-pounce success in the G3 Hampton Court S. at Royal Ascot June 21.

The Pia Brandt-trained Kingstar (Fr) (Evasive {GB}) also makes his Stateside debut in this test. A first-out winner at Chantilly in September, the chestnut was second in the G3 Prix de Conde S. there Oct. 7 and won a Longchamp conditions test last time June 2.

Another runner of interest is GIII Southwest S. and GIII Stonestreet Lexington S. winner My Boy Jack (Creative Cause), who gets back on turf for the first time since finishing seventh to Mendelssohn (Scat Daddy) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The dark bay, making his first start since running on well to be fifth in the GI Kentucky Derby, broke his maiden on the lawn last year and won the grassy Zuma Beach S. at Santa Anita in October.

Both fillies are conditioned by two-time Eclipse winner Chad Brown, who won three of the last four renewals of this event since the name was changed from the Garden City to the Belmont Oaks in 2014. Winner of three of her four races, the Neil Drysdale-trained Toinette came flying late to take down Brown's previously undefeated GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Rushing Fall (More Than Ready) last time in Churchill Downs' GIII Edgewood S. May 4.

The always-dangerous Aidan O-Brien ships in Athena (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) for a shot at Grade I glory. Breaking her maiden two back at Fairyhouse May 31, the Coolmore runner was fourth in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and returned on short rest to complete the trifecta in the Curragh's G1 Pretty Polly S. just six days ago.

Fellow European invader Capla Temptress (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) already has a top-level win in North American on her resume, having captured the GI Natalma S. at Woodbine Sept. 17. 

SARRASIN BEGINS AMERICAN ODYSSEY IN

BIG APPLE by Alan Carasso

A plan launched over two months ago bears its first fruit Saturday afternoon at New York's Belmont Park, when Australian Racing Stables's Sarrasin (GB) (Monsun {Ger}) takes on a one-mile (1600m) allowance race, the first of a series of tests connections hope will translate into an appearance in America's year-end championships, the Breeders' Cup at Churchill Downs.

Last seen finishing a decent fifth to the classy Gailo Chop (Fr) (Deportivo {GB}) in the G1 Ranvet S. at Rosehill in late March, Sarrasin was given a pair of 1200-meter trials at home, finishing off well to take a May 21 hit-out at Warwick Farm (video) before finishing a solid third at Randwick June 12 (video).

Less than two weeks later, Sarrasin was on a New York-bound jet, a trip that would take 30 hours via Shanghai and Anchorage. Despite the arduous journey and a recent spate of hot and muggy weather, the 6-year-old has settled in well, so much so that a projected stateside debut in the Forbidden Apple S. (1600m) July 14 was scrapped in favor of Saturday's heat.

"I think by the mere fact that we've pushed forward this first run tells you that he's settled in as well as we could have hoped," trainer Richard Freedman said by phone Friday morning. "He's handled the heat well--for horses in Australia, 35-degree (Celsius, mid-90-degree Fahrenheit) heat isn't that big a deal. Humidity is a little more stressful for them, but it hasn't worried him terribly much. He's been eating, he's coped with the travel very well and he's felt good on the track."

In typical fashion for Australian-trained horses, Freedman views Saturday's race as a stepping-stone to the 11-furlong (2200m) GII Bowling Green S. July 28 at Saratoga and the 1 1/2-mile (2400m) GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. four weeks later. The latter event offers a fees-paid berth into the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.

"In Australia, we take a slightly different attitude to races," Freedman explained. "The horse will certainly be trying his hardest, but we will be using this race as a warm-up run, as a part of his training program to the longer races. It's a distance short of his best, but we'd like to see him running on strongly at the end.

He continued, "He won't be contesting the lead, that's not his style of racing. He'll be giving some start away to those horses and hopefully his strength at the end will let him take some ground from them. If he can win, he'll win. We look forward to the next two races. That's where we start to reach distances that I think are right in his range. Those distances are in his zone."

In a stroke of good luck, Aussie jockey Regan Bayliss has been riding track work in New York and has the call Saturday.

"We had Luis Saez on standby for the Forbidden Apple, but he wasn't available when we shifted gears," Freedman said. "Regan was already in New York, and it's just an easier assignment for us to explain how this horse needs to be ridden to someone who rides in Australian-type races all the time, rather than trying to explain to someone not as familiar."

Bayliss's world travels will continue in England next weekend, where he is scheduled to reunite with Redkirk Warrior (GB) (Notnowcato {GB}) in the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket.

In the meantime, Freedman will be watching with nervous anticipation from halfway around the world when Belmont race three loads at 4:45am Sunday morning.

"What will relax me is if the horse runs and runs well," Freedman said. "I'm not concerned if he wins or doesn't win, but if he runs well and shows us that he's on track to go to these next races, then I'll start to believe a little bit more. Fingers crossed."



INCREASED PURSES & NEW PURSE DISTRIBUTION FOR 2018 SARATOGA MEET

All maiden and allowance races, as well as some claiming races, at the 2018 Saratoga meet will get a \$2,000 across-the-board purse increase. Maiden special weights will now have a purse of \$85,000 and first-level allowance optional claimers will carry a \$95,000 purse.

The 2018 meet will also have a new purse distribution allocation. With the exception of any stakes with awards specifically stated in the condition book, all races going forward

will pay out as follows: 55% of the total purse to the winner, 20% to second place, 12% to third, 6% to fourth, 4% to fifth, with the remaining 3% divided among the remaining runners.

The new purse distribution will be adjusted from the current breakdown of 60-20-10-5-3% to the top five finishers, respectively, with the remaining 2% divided among the remainder of the field.

ARCHAIC ENTRY RULES HAVE TO GO

By Bill Finley

Small fields are among racing's most serious problems. Too many five-horse races, too many heavy favorites and too many bettors keeping their money in their pockets every time such a race comes up. With the foal crop at its lowest levels since 1965, the problem is only going to get worse.

You also have the proliferation of partnerships, where one person might own 20% of one horse in a race and 25% of another in the same race. That means more examples of common ownership of horses in the same race and, yes, more entries.

Like most things that are wrong with racing, there is no magic bullet when it comes to small fields. There is, however, an obvious, no-brainer solution that would make things better. Get rid of coupled entries, in all races, in all states, in every situation. Every entry takes away a betting interest. Every time a betting interest is taken away the race becomes less appealing and the handle on it goes down.

At least most tracks no longer couple horses trained by the same person, but with different owners, and most tracks also no longer have entries in stakes races. That has made the situation better and you'll usually find no more than one or two entries on any card. The point is there shouldn't be any.

Entries were created with the aim of protecting the betting public. The idea being that the trainer or owner could try to cash a bet by stiffing the stronger half of the entry and making sure the lesser half is ready to fire on all cylinders. They bet the longshot. Perhaps, once upon a time, that may have happened, but it's a rule more fitting for the movie "The Sting" than the modern racetrack. No one in 2018 is sitting in a smoke-filled room with dodgy characters in the back of a candy store deciding to pull Glow Worm so they can cash a bet on Rocket Boy. It's a rule that might have made sense in 1968, but is now doing a lot more harm than good.

On June 1 at Belmont, **J S Bach** (Tale of the Cat) and **Splashtastic** (Tiz Wonderful) were coupled in the wagering in an allowance. The pair was sent off at even-money and both finished off the board. J S Bach is wholly owned by Michael Dubb and trained by Jason Servis. Splashtastic is trained by Rudy Rodriguez and is owned by Dubb, Bethlehem Stable LLC and the Elkstone Group LLC. That makes Dubb the only connection between the two. *Cont. p13*

According to the realdeal.com, Dubb's Beechwood Organization, the largest developer of residential housing on Long Island, had \$205 million in revenue in 2015. So Dubb's horses needed to be coupled so that a multi-millionaire wasn't tempted to cash a bet on a horse that might have paid \$8 to win and if he bet enough he could have pocketed, oh, maybe \$10,000? Please.

It happened again Sunday at Belmont in the seventh race. Owned by Chester and Mary Broman, **Heavy Meddle** (Medaglia d'Oro), who is trained by Bill Mott, was coupled with the Broman's **Mr. Buff** (Friend Or Foe), who is trained by John Kimmel. Because of the entry, there were seven betting interests instead of eight and the Broman pair was sent off as the even-money favorite.

Had they been separate betting interests Mr. Buff probably would have been about 9-5 and Heavy Meddle 6-1. What's a better betting race, an eight-horse field with a 9-5 favorite or a seven-horse field with an even-money favorite? The answer is obvious.

(For those betting on the entry, it didn't matter. Neither finished in the money).

We often talk of how European racing does just fine without Lasix. The same is true when it comes to entries. With the exception of France, there are no entries in any major racing countries in Europe and France only couples horses for win wagering. If an entry runs one-two, you only collect on an exacta if you bet the individual horses in the entry to finish first and second.

Fortunately, the situation is getting better. Racing secretaries, desperate to have as many betting interests as possible, keep telling state racing commissions that these antiquated rules have to go. Many have listened. New Jersey is the latest state to have done away with entries, a policy that began at the beginning of the Monmouth Park meet. Oddly, there are still entries in harness racing in New Jersey.

There are no longer entries in Florida, California, Ontario, Illinois, West Virginia or Maryland.

But some important states remain behind the times. There are still entries in New York, Arkansas, Kentucky, Louisiana and Pennsylvania. It's not uncommon at Parx to see entries in three or four races on a card.

Common sense doesn't always come into play when you're talking horse racing, but this is just that--common sense. Entries are something out of the past, no longer needed, certainly not helpful.


